



SUBJECT : REVIEW OF MANPOWER AND LOGISTIC REQUIREMENTS, SUB SECTOR 3A

DATE : 05 APR 95

1. After experience of operating in the new organisational format of Sector 3 for a little over a week some issues have arisen which it is felt need consideration at the higher HQ. These are submitted for consideration in the subsequent paragraphs.

2. While appreciating the need for enhanced manpower and logistic support to Sector 4b (Butare), it is felt that if this is done entirely at the cost of Sub Sector 3A (Kibuye), it would have a telling effect on the operational effectiveness of the sub sector. What perhaps could not be appreciated earlier is that with move of the new Malawi Coy to Kibuye and its constraints in availability of vehicles the overall information gathering apparatus will be so adversely affected. If the strength of MILOBS and vehicles is simultaneously reduced from the present levels the capabilities of the sub sector towards information gathering will be further diluted. As you are already aware from the daily sitrep of Sector 3, the situation in Kibuye Prefecture is perhaps at the worst level since the war and is continuously deteriorating. Being a border prefecture, open to forays across the lake, and with the current wave of arrests across it, we need to ensure that the level of information gathering is maintained so that a gap does not exist between what is available here and the quantum and quality of information available in Giseyni and Cyangugu Prefectures which lie to the North and South of it respectively. The attitude of the officials is also most intransigent and requires mature handling since the best of relationships does not exist between the officials and UNAMIR.

3. In view of the above I feel there is a need to review the manning and logistic pattern of MILOBS while simultaneously addressing the vehicle problems of Malawi Coy. I would like to recommend the following:-

(a) No change be effected in the command of the sub sector and the present incumbent (Lt Col Abul Bashar) be allowed to continue till his DDM, which is 08 Jun 95. A suitable relief (English speaking) be groomed to relieve him.

(b) The MILOB manpower increment of Sector 4B be more equitably shared by other sectors. Some reduction in strength


of the sub sector is inevitable. Perhaps this can be effected progressively over a period of time.

(c) The sub sector be allowed to retain the organisational pattern of staff as applicable to a sector. An Ops O and a Log O are absolutely essential, considering its distance and nature of ops.

(d) The sub sector needs to retain an office complex because of the above recommended structural modifications to the existing pattern of sub sectors all over Rwanda.

(e) The distance from Kigali and the state of roads in Kibuye Prefecture as they exist are have a telling effect on vehicle availability - the down time being much more than normal. As such the minimum requirement of vehicles (runners) is 5 and this should not be reduced.

4. Finally it is my sincere belief that Sub Sector 3A does not deserve to be looked upon as just any other sub sector. The situation existing here and the state of communications merit special attention at all times. The command and control may continue to lie with Sector 3 Gitarama due to the fair similarity of problems but within this arrangement consideration for the problems of Sub Sector 3A may be required on a special basis.

SUBJECT : SPECIAL SECURITY INSTRUCTIONS

1. The Govt of Rwanda is planning to celebrate the first anniversary of the genocide from 07 to 14 April 95, which as you know has caused apprehensions in the minds of the majority of the population and the international community. This occasion is likely to evoke strong sentiments in the local population and may result in outbreak of violence and general degeneration of law and order in the country.

2. Although there are no confirmed indications that violence may break out in the above mentioned period, it is felt that certain additional personal security measures must be observed by UNAMIR personnel from 04 April 95 till further orders to the contrary, so as a preventive and cautionary measure. These measures are as follows:

- a. Do not travel alone in a vehicle whether by day or by night. Restrict your movement to essential travel such as from your place of residence to the place of work and back only. Keep your movement to the minimum.
- b. Always inform someone as to where you are going and when you are likely to return.
- c. Never leave your place of residence or work without your radio.
- d. Do not travel at night unless absolutely necessary, and if you have to, travel in pairs.
- e. Avoid travel to the city and the market as far as possible. Stock upon your foodstuff and other essential household goods for a fortnight before 04 April 95.
- f. Avoid travel on dirt roads that are not frequently travelled on by others. Do not drive in potholes.

g. Do not move out of your respective AORs till further orders, without permission.

h. Avoid entering large crowds, demonstrations or gatherings unless prearranged security elements are in place.

i. Be aware of the procedure to call for help in case of an emergency.

3. The above measures are by no means comprehensive and complete. Your attention is drawn to our letter on Security Awareness forwarded vide our letter no 3000.12 (Ops) dated 25 Mar 95.

Subject: Security at UNAMIR Headquarters

To enable check unauthorized entry into UNAMIR HQ, it has been decided to introduce with immediate effect the following procedure to control the traffic in and out of UNAMIR HQ:

- (a) All vehicles and personnel entering and leaving the HQ between 1800 hours and 0700 hours the following day are requested to register the vehicle number and the driver's UNAMIR ID number in the log book kept at the Entrance Gate.
- (b) In the case of NGO's, Embassy staff and other UN agencies, a pass will be issued at the gate from 1800 hours to 0700 hours. The driver is requested to deposit his/her identification with the security at the entrance, which will be returned on exiting the HQ. A specimen copy of pass is attached herewith as Appx.
- (c) Visitors to the RPA Liaison Office will be accompanied by the UNAMIR security person during any visit that takes them beyond the confines of Liaison Office on the ground floor. This is applicable both during day and night.

2. Taking into consideration the security of personnel, property and vehicles at UNAMIR HQ, I am sure you will appreciate the measures being taken and will cooperate with us.




SUBJECT: TEMPORARY ABSENCE FROM DUTY STATION

- C: This Office letter on Conduct of UNAMIR Military Personnel dated 09 Jan 95.

1. Recently, there has been an increase in the number of incidents involving UNAMIR Military Personnel and civilians in avoidable controversial circumstances. Though there is a need by formed troops and Milobs to maintain constant liaison and interaction with the local population to instill mutual confidence and create a secure environment, these relationships should not degenerate into altercations at public houses involving local women under the pretext of excessive drinking or other excuses.

2. It must be remembered by all that such incidents tarnish the image of UNAMIR and are totally counter-productive to the overall mission and aim of UNAMIR. All contingent, sector and unit/sub-unit Commanders will ensure that their Command remains fully disciplined and does not indulge in any activity, be it drinking in public places, prostitution or selling of UN rations, goods meant for troops.

3. The Government of Rwanda and the RPA in particular are keenly waiting for opportunities to defame UNAMIR and would exploit every occasion presented to them. In order to guard against such attempts, contingents and units are requested to forward factual and accurate incident reports or special reports immediately on occurrence, to enable this HQ to counter adverse implications.

Subject: Administrative Control of CIVPOL in the Sector

As you are aware the UN Civilian Police Monitoring teams are deployed in all the prefectures in Rwanda to carry out tasks according to UNAMIR mandates.

2. These tasks are :

- (i) To monitor the activities of the Communal Police and National Gendarmerie.
- (ii) To investigate any cases of violations in conjunction with the local authorities.
- (iii) To monitor the process of return of Rwandan refugees/displaced persons and their resettlement.
- (iv) To assist in the establishment and training of communal police and National Gendarmerie.
- (v) To assist the prefects in law and order maintenance.
- (vi) To maintain liaison with local authorities.
- (vii) To assist Milobs and ground troops in police matters.

3. To perform these tasks, CIVPOL Headquarters and CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors need close cooperation with military observers, ground troops, UN and other Agencies, and local authorities. CIVPOL is now in evolution stage and is co-located with milobs.

4. Before CIVPOL reach its authorised strength of 120 observers and in order to facilitate its operations, it is decided to place CIVPOL monitoring teams in sectors under the administrative control of Milobs Sector Commanders.

5. By this arrangement, I expect a good working cooperation between the chief of CIVPOL Monitoring teams and Milobs Sector Commanders.



- 6) In the event that the meetings may turn out negatively, it is most urgent for the MALAWICOY to find a new site for their needs ASAP (for info, its question of 10 days) .

Subject : RECCE OF PRISON AT NYANZA AND KIBUYE FOR ENGR TASK

1. Recce of prison at Nyanza and Kibuye was conducted on 30 Mar 95 and details are as given in succeeding paras.

2. Work at Nyanza Prison. As per the requirement projected by the prison authority, following work is required to be done at Nyanza Prison.

(a) Demolition of two masonry wall of size 18'x20'x50 cm and reconstruction.

(b) Repair of one metal door.

(c) Four metal doors of size 2m x 0.9m each with complete accessories have to be fixed.

(d) Window grills of four window have to be strengthened. Size of window is 2.5m x 0.6m.

(e) Fencing of entire area of prison of size 400m x 300m. Total perimeter is 1.4 Km and minimum height of fencing to be 2.5 m.

3. Details of work at Kibuye Prison. As per the requirement projected by prison authority at Kibuye, following work is to be done.

(a) Seven metal doors of size 2m x 0.9m with complete accessories have to be fixed.

(b) Four metal doors of size 2m x 0.8m with complete accessories have to be fixed.

(c) Three metal doors of size 1.8m x 0.7m with complete accessories have to be fixed.

(d) Fencing of prison area of size 250m x 250m Total perimeter is 1 Km and minimum height of fencing required is 2.5 m.

(e) Minimum 12 Nos of security lights are required.



Subject : RECCE OF BROKEN BRIDGES IN SECTOR 3A

1. Reference your letter No 1001.1(FEO)/OPS/1 dated 21 Mar 95.

2. Recce for broken bridges in Sector 3A (Kivumu commune) was conducted on 27 Mar 95 and details are as given in succeeding paragraphs.

3. One log bridge on Kivumu - Kibanda (Sq 5475) needs to be repaired. But 1 KM ahead of the log bridge, a wet gap exists which measures about 12 m and for this a 40 feet bailey bridge is to be launched. On both the sides of the bridges approaches have to be prepared since the road is in the state of disuse for quite some time.


4. It is gathered that road is not at all being used by UN personnels and even locals are not using it frequently. If the road is to be made useable both bridges have to be made operational.

5. Requirement of stores for repair of bridges is as follows :-

(a) For log bridge

(i) Wooden planks 4.5m x 12" x 2" - 30 Nos

(ii) Nails 3" - 4 Kgs

(b) For gap of 11.5 m - Bailey Bridge of 40 feet is required.

SUBJECT: Responsibility for communications equipment

1. Safety of portable communications equipment issued to UNAMIR personnel is the sole responsibility of the individual to whom issued, until it is returned in good order to the Communications Section.
2. In instances where stationary communications equipment, and generators are installed at military, MILOBs, CIVPOL or other UNAMIR locations, the responsibility for security of the equipment rests with the senior official in charge at that position. It is, therefore, incumbent upon those officials to institute secure handover procedures in order to establish control and ultimately accountability, of UNAMIR communications equipment assets.
3. Similarly, security of UNAMIR vehicular radio installations rests with the staff member to whom the vehicle is assigned. Here it is also important that officials establish a secure handover procedure to ensure safety of equipment.
4. Any loss of, or damage to, communications equipment must be reported without delay via the attached Incident Report form. A copy of this form will also be placed in each radio equipped vehicle's Trip Log Book.
5. Prior to replacement of communications equipment or of ancillary attachments (control head, microphone, antenna) due to loss, or theft, etc., an Incident Report outlining in a great detail as possible the circumstances under which the item(s) disappeared, will be required before any replacement action is initiated.

SUBJECT: SECURITY AWARENESS BULLETIN OF CURRENT SITUATION VOL. 3

The current security situation has necessitated the production of this news bulletin in order to appraise staff members of the over all security situation in Kigali, and Rwanda in general. It is hoped that UNAMIR personnel will take this information to heart and adjust their movements accordingly.

1. GENERAL:

The overall security situation in Rwanda although is relatively calm, but is still of serious concern, particularly with the rising tension experienced over the last two of weeks. Incidents of hostility in the Refugee camps still continue unabated, and UNAMIR military positions in some of the sectors have come under grenade attacks resulting in serious injuries to UNAMIR military personnel.

Aid Agencies are also undergoing searches at RPA check points as they travel to the sectors. UN personnel are regularly stopped and searched at these check points without consideration for their status as United Nations personnel. UN Laissez-passers, UNAMIR ID cards, and United Nations marked vehicles do not exempt them from these searches. Vehicles, bags, personal belongings, official documents, and even diplomatic bags are all subjected to these searches. The frequency and degree of search is now far beyond the search for weapons. The most common areas are between Gisenyi and Cyangugu, and Kibungo and Rusumo.

Arriving and departing perssangers at the Kigali International Airport are also equally subjected to similar searches, and most often, asked to pay custom duties on personal effects.

The office of the SRSG is fully aware of the situation and "NOTE VERBALES" on the issue have been sent to the Foreign Ministry as letters of protest, but to no avail.

2. KIGALI:

The security situation in Kigali and its environs had remained calm for quite sometime. However it seems to have deteriorated in the last two weeks with threats against UN personnel and hijacking of UNAMIR vehicles being reported. The following are highlights of some of the incidents.

- (a) There has recently been an increase in the number of road blocks and check points mounted by the RPA around the city, particularly at night, sometimes starting at 1900 hrs. As usual, these road blocks are put up in most cases with empty crates and are not lit to be seen from afar. Again, UN vehicles do not escape the searches at these check points. Intensified routine foot, and mobile patrols around the city however continue at night as well.
- (b) In sector 5, Tunbatt HQ. in Ruhengeri came under grenade attack from unidentified gunmen, and 8 military personnel were injured, 4 seriously.
- (c) On the night of Sunday March 5, Nibatt HQ in Byumba also came under grenade attack by unknown persons in which 2 Nigerian military personnel sustained minor injuries. The cause for the attack is unknown.
- (d) On Sunday 26, February 1995 at about 5.15 pm, 3 UNAMIR International Civilian staff driving in a UNAMIR vehicle were fired upon with an automatic weapon by an unknown person, on the Ruhengeri/Kigali road, less than 10 km from Kigali. The front tire exploded as the bullet pierced through it, but the staff members never stopped. The gunman in desperation continued shooting at the vehicle as they sped away. Fortunately there were no injuries.
- (e) On Wednesday March 8, one Nigerian Civpol Officer was physically attacked by three unidentified armed men at his residence between 1900 and 1930 hrs. The location was Kiyovu Rugenge in Kigali. His vehicle UNAMIR # 1144 was taken away with his motorola radio, a wrist watch and US\$300 in cash.
- (f) Another UNAMIR International Civilian staff of the Transport Section was attacked by 3 RPA soldiers at his residence in Remera, at about 1930 hrs on 14 March, 1995.

At gunpoint, he was blindfolded and all his personal belongings taken away. For some strange reason, they did not take his vehicle. Losses were estimated at US\$4885. The matter is being investigated by the military police.

- (g) Another UNAMIR International civilian staff was chased a few days ago by 4 unidentified men in a small red jeep all around Kigali at night. The chase started from the foot of the hill at Chez Lando Hotel and continued through the city. The staff member made a series of evasive moves and confirmed. He however decided to make his way back to Chez Lando hotel, and as soon as he entered the car park, his assailants drove off.
- (h) On Saturday 18 March Human Rights Land Cruiser # 1926HR was reported stolen outside a UN house in Kimihurura.
- (i) On Sunday evening, 19 March, 3 armed men attempted to steal Human Rights vehicle # 1907HR from the Human Rights house at Rugenge in Kigali. The attempt was foiled when the vehicle broke down. The incident was witnessed by the local guard.
- (j) The latest incident was in Byumba in the early hours of Monday 20 March 1995, between 0100 and 0130 hrs, when a Nigerian Guard on sentry duty shot and killed an attacker, while the second one was arrested by the duty officer. Both were later identified to be local staff members of Brown & Root working in Byumba.

3. ARREST OF UNITED NATIONS LOCAL STAFF MEMBERS:

There has been an increase in arrests of UN local staff members by the RPA, all held on charges of genocide. The number has increased from 4 in February in Kigali central prisons to 6, with 3 more held in the gendarmerie stations in the city. In addition to the above, a UNAMIR translator was arrested and finally released.

4. KANOMBE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT - KIGALI:

The Rwandese airport authorities have expressed their growing concern over the number of UNAMIR staff members attempting to enter the airport. Airport rules and regulations must be followed, and no unauthorised vehicles are allowed inside the airport.

Entering the airport without the appropriate ID cards, and vehicles passes, driving on the ramp to meet aircraft, driving across the runway without permission from the control tower, as well as receiving VIPs and baggage are to cease immediately.

Searching of personal effects of UN staff members with valid UN Laissez-passer, to the airport authorities, is a routine exercise, though its a violation of the status mission agreement between the UN and the Rwandese Government.

5. ROAD ACCIDENTS:

Vehicle accidents are on the increase. UNAMIR personnel should drive with extreme caution at all times.

The RPA drivers are contributing factors who have little or no regard for traffic rules. Nearly all road accidents that involve UN vehicles, the UN staff member is always held responsible even where he/she is not at fault. The investigations and findings are always one-sided, and in which case the staff member has no redress. All staff members are advised to be very careful on the roads, obey all road signs, and have due concern for all road blocks and the officers manning them; and above all, to observe speed limits. Remember the MPs are on the roads, and have been empowered to impound vehicles flaunting the rules. PLEASE ALSO REMEMBER THAT IF YOU DRINK, DON'T DRIVE.

6. THE ISSUE OF UNAMIR ID CARDS

The issue of UNAMIR ID cards has come under serious criticisms by the Rwandese authorities hence the curtailing of our privileges and immunities by them. In order to streamline the issuing of ID cards, the SRSG has decided that the following action be taken;

- (a) That UNAMIR will cease issuing ID cards to the following:
 - (i) All UN Agencies except for the Human Rights and members of the International Tribunal;
 - (ii) All Foreign Embassies in Kigali
 - (iii) All Registered Contractors with UNAMIR, except for the International Contract staff in the interim.
- (b) That all the existing UNAMIR cards will be withdrawn by the respective Agencies/Contract Companies as soon as they have devised their own system, and return them to the ID card section at UNAMIR HQ.

7. STANDARDS OF CONDUCTS:

In order not to lose sight of our moral code of conduct as International civil servants, all staff are reminded of the Administrative Instructions issued in August 1994, and recently reproduced by the Chief of Administration on 9 March, 1995 including the following headlines;

Local Laws, Regulations and Customs
Currency Regulations
Photography
Privately Owned Weapons
War Souvenirs
Hunting and Shooting
Contact with Local Population
Handling of Information
Consumption and disposal of Drugs
Consumption of Alcohol
Driving

8. SECURITY:

Having gone at length to remind staff members of the deteriorating security situation that is currently prevailing in Rwanda as a whole, I would like to conclude by strictly warning all members of staff to restrict their movements particularly at night, to keep off the streets, and to be at their residences not later 8 pm.

For the benefit of our new staff members I would like to reproduce our Security Guidelines recalled from our earlier edition of the Security Awareness bulletin, most of which is also found in the Security Pamphlet issued to you on your arrival;

SECURITY GUIDELINES:

- (i) Carry your ID card with you at all times. If you are issued with a Motorola Radio, you are advised to carry it with you as well.
- (ii) Avoid going out on your own and staying out too late at night. It is advisable that you go out in groups of two or more and where possible, go in convoys of two or more vehicles.
- (iii) Avoid driving at night in remote and isolated areas in the city. Know safe streets and routes.
- (iv) Avoid using local taxis and privately owned cars particularly at night, except if you know the private car owner. Should you be forced to use a local taxi, you must always be in the company of somebody you know and trust too well. Relying on Registration number plates of taxis is not enough.

- (v) Should you be attacked, you should always try to be calm and firm, and courteous. Never show signs of stress and intimidation, even though you may feel intimidated.
- (vi) It is always in your best interest to yield to the demands of your attackers and where possible establish some kind of rapport with them.
- (vii) Stop only at established road blocks/check points, and avoid giving lifts to non UN personnel. Do not stop at hand signals of any kind at night, especially in suspicious circumstances and areas.
- (viii) Should you be trailed at night, avoid heading for your residence especially if it is a distance away from you. You should always try to head for Public houses especially where there is crowd and call for help on your radio describing your exact location.
- (ix) Above all, please do not discard "COMMON SENSE" as it will assist you to appreciate the situation on the ground, make sensible deductions and take decisions in your best interest. REMEMBER YOUR LIFE COMES FIRST.

SUBJECT : SPECIAL SECURITY INSTRUCTIONS

1. The Govt of Rwanda is planning to celebrate the first anniversary of the genocide from 07 to 14 April 95, which as you know has caused apprehensions in the minds of the majority of the population and the international community. This occasion is likely to evoke strong sentiments in the local population and may result in outbreak of violence and general degeneration of law and order in the country.

2. Although there are no confirmed indications that violence may break out in the above mentioned period, it is felt that certain additional personal security measures must be observed by UNAMIR personnel from 04 April 95 till further orders to the contrary, so as a preventive and cautionary measure. These measures are as follows:

a. Do not travel alone in a vehicle whether by day or by night. Restrict your movement to essential travel such as from your place of residence to the place of work and back only. Keep your movement to the minimum.

b. Always inform someone as to where you are going and when you are likely to return.

c. Never leave your place of residence or work without your radio.

d. Do not travel at night unless absolutely necessary, and if you have to, travel in pairs.

e. Avoid travel to the city and the market as far as possible. Stock upon your foodstuff and other essential household goods for a fortnight before 04 April 95.

f. Avoid travel on dirt roads that are not frequently travelled on by others. Do not drive in potholes or on fresh

moved/dug ground..

g. Do not move out of your respective AORs till further orders, without permission.

h. Avoid entering large crowds, demonstrations or gatherings unless prearranged security elements are in place.

i. Be aware of the procedure to call for help in case of an emergency.

3. The above measures are by no means comprehensive and complete. Your attention is drawn to our letter on Security Awareness forwarded vide our letter no 3000.12 (Ops) dated 25 Mar 95.



Subject : RECCE OF BROKEN BRIDGES IN SECTOR 3A

1. Reference your letter No 1001.1(FEO)/OPS/1 dated 21 Mar 95.
2. Recce for broken bridges in Sector 3A (Kivumu commune) was conducted on 27 Mar 95 and details are as given in succeeding paragraphs.
3. One log bridge on Kivumu - Kibanda (Sq 5475) needs to be repaired. But 1 KM ahead of the log bridge, a wet gap exists which measures about 12 m and for this a 40 feet bailey bridge is to be launched. On both the sides of the bridges approaches have to be prepared since the road is in the state of disuse for quite some time.
4. It is gathered that road is not at all being used by UN personnels and even locals are not using it frequently. If the road is to be made useable both bridges have to be made operational.
5. Requirement of stores for repair of bridges is as follows :-

(a) For log bridge

- (i) Wooden planks 4.5m x 12" x 2" - 30 Nos
- (ii) Nails 3" - 4 Kgs

(b) For gap of 11.5 m - Bailey Bridge of 40 feet is required.

UNAMIR Investigation Into Byumba Shooting Incident

KIGALI, RWANDA -- An ongoing United Nations military police investigation into the shooting incident which took place at the Nigerian Battalion Camp at Byumba on March 20 has uncovered new testimony resulting in a Nigerian soldier being placed into custody.

It is understood that the soldier and a Rwandan civilian were involved in an argument which took place at a local bar in the evening of 19. The investigation has revealed that the soldier and a Rwandan civilian were involved in a quarrel which took place within the perimeter of the camp. During a brief struggle between the two men, the Rwandan was fatally wounded by a single shot fired by the Nigerian soldier.

At this point in the investigation, it is not clear how the Rwandan came to be within the confines of the camp, nor are the reasons for the altercation evident. However, it has been confirmed that both the soldier and the Rwandan were involved in an argument which took place earlier in the evening at a local bar.

A full investigation of the incident involving UNAMIR military police, the Rwandan Patriotic Army and the local Gendarmerie is in progress. Complete disciplinary action will be taken as warranted by the results of the investigation.



Subject: SECURITY AWARENESS

1. The aim of this instruction is to appraise all military personnel of the prevailing security situation in Rwanda, with a view of creating a sense of security awareness in the hearts and minds of all concerned.

General

2. The overall security situation, although it remains relatively calm, is of serious concern. Incidents of armed robberies directed against UN personnel, accidents involving UN vehicles, hijacking of UN vehicles and altercations between the RPA and formed troops is generally on the increase. Therefore, there is a need to make all uniformed personnel of UNAMIR aware of the procedure to call for help in any adverse situation. Some of the emergency situations which may occur are as under:

- a. Detention by the local authorities.
- b. The victim of a robbery of any kind, at home or elsewhere.
- c. The victim of an assault.
- d. Involvement in a vehicle accident and in need of assistance, an ambulance or a tow truck.
- e. Witness to a situation which would include any of the preceding.

3. It should also be noted that within Kigali, there is a **Ready Reaction Force (RRF)** available 24 hrs a day to react to any adverse situation in which the extrication of UN personnel warrants the use of armed troops. The RRF can be contacted through the UNAMIR duty officer on channel 4 or telephone # UNAMIR extn 11150 or Rwandatel 84265. The duty officer is responsible for monitoring the channels for emergencies and have access to all the military and civilian information/assets that may be needed in case of emergency, including the RRF, civilian police, military police, tow trucks, ambulances as well as medivac and casevac procedures.

Vehicle/Travel

4. All travel must be authorised prior to your departure from your unit and you must carry your UN ID and license permit at all times. When travelling by car, keep the doors locked and **avoid travelling alone at night**. Generally, hijackers are less likely to inflict serious injuries when two or more persons are in a vehicle. **You must not pick up non - UNAMIR personnel** and do not stop for broken down vehicles which are not UNAMIR. Finally, keep your vehicle parked in a safe, guarded, well lit area at night and do not leave valuable items in a parked vehicle.

5. Action at Road Blocks. When approaching a road block/check point drive slowly and put your car lights in the 'park' position. Turn on the interior light and act in a calm and polite manner in your conversation. Milk crates, branches, metal parts of a chair, witches hats and string may be used as road blocks in Rwanda. Please ensure that you observe them and drive very carefully as they are manned by armed soldiers.

Road Accidents

6. The UNAMIR Military Police (MP) Company Headquarters is located 500 meters East of the old UNICEF Building on the main Airport road (GR 125836). The Kigali Detachment operates on channel 7, call sign "**ESCORT ZERO**". You can contact the MP Desk Officer, day or night, on telephone # UNAMIR extn 11249. All road accident must be reported to the UNAMIR MP Coy HQ.

Personal Security

7. You must keep abreast of the current situation and developments in Rwanda. Particularly in the areas in which you live, work and frequent. Familiarise yourself with your work and residential locations. To enhance your personal security you should:

- a. get to know who your nearest UN neighbour and where the nearest UN vehicle is parked at night;
- b. know the phone number and/or the radio call sign to us in case of emergency (these are included at Annex A);
- c. inform your superior of all your travel plans in and out of the country;
- d. eat and drink in secure locations. There is safety in numbers! Never let the spirit of the moment cloud your judgement with regards to your personal safety;
- e. not travel at night outside your duty station;
- f. lie flat on the floor if you hear explosives or shooting near your residence. Do not look outside and stay away from windows. Try to crawl to a corridor which has no windows;

- g. maintain a week's supply of food and water in your residence;
- h. avoid setting a routine, ie. alternate your route and/or timing to and from home or office; and
- i. try to minimise unnecessary movements and where possible avoid travelling alone and after dark.

How to React to Attack

8. If you are attacked try to remain calm and do not panic (this may be very hard). In general, it is best to comply with the demand of the attackers or captors you are less likely to be harmed. Do not become aggressive and try to establish some type of compromise with your captors. Contact your Security Officer or superior as soon as possible.

Security of Personal Effects

9. You should update your inventory of personal effects, furniture, household effects, automobiles and valuables whenever necessary and submit the revised copy to the Security Officer.

Residential Security

10. Inform the designated Official/Unit Security Officer of any change of address/telephone during your stay in Rwanda. Contact your neighbours to ensure cooperation between the guards in your neighbourhood.

11. You should install curtains on your windows, especially in your bedroom and don't leave keys in a hidden place outside your house (under mats, flower pots, door ledges, etc.). Prior to retiring for the night you should ensure your home is secure by checking all doors and windows. Finally, don't give duplicate keys for your house to domestic help and keep your house keys separate from your vehicle keys.

Hotels

12. When staying in a hotel, familiarise yourself with fire safety instructions and know where the nearest emergency exit is located. Always lock your door after you enter or leave your room. Ensure that no money, jewellery, cameras, or other valuables are visible when leaving your room and, if possible, use a safe deposit box to store your valuables. Always ensure that you lock all suitcases left in the room.

Domestic Help

13. You should request references/recommendations from any locals that you hire as domestic help. Furthermore, ensure that you ascertain their exact residential address in Kigali. Once hired you must ensure that they are issued the proper security pass when hired through Brown and Root. Create a bonus/incentive on top of their salary in case of privately hired help. However, be strict with them and allow no visitors in your residence without your permission.

Guards

14. If you employ a guard, ensure he is issued with a whistle and a flash light. Establish a signal with him so that he will open your gate immediately (For example you might sound the car horn three times at 100 meters from your residence). Avoid waiting in front of your gate. Give your guard clear instructions such as:

- a. Your gate must always be locked (chain with padlock).
- b. Never authorise visitors to enter without your permission.
- c. Patrol every morning and evening to inspect the fence or wall.
- d. Report all incidents (window left open, exterior light not working, etc).

Security Guidelines Summary

15. There are certain important security guidelines which need to be followed by all personnel in uniform. These are as follows:

- a. Carry your ID card with you all times. If you are issued with a Motorola Radio, you are advised to carry it with you as well.
- b. Avoid going out on your own and staying out too late at night. It is advisable that you go out in groups of two or more, and where possible go in convoys of two or more vehicles.
- c. Avoid driving at night at remote and isolated areas in the city. Know safe streets and routes.
- d. Avoid using local taxis and privately owned cars particularly at night time, except if you know the private car owner. Should you be forced to use a local taxi, you must always be in the company of somebody you know and trust. Relying on Registration number plates of taxis is not enough.
- e. Should you be attacked, you should always try to be calm and firm, and courteous. Never show signs of stress and intimidation, even though you may feel intimidated.
- f. Avoid all forms of arguments with your attackers even where you have your right.
- g. It is always in your best interest to yield to the demands of your attackers and where possible establish some kind of rapport with them.
- h. Stop only at established road blocks/check points, and avoid giving lifts to non - UN personnel. Do not stop at hand signals of any kind at night, especially in suspicious circumstances and areas.
- i. Should you be trailed at night, avoid heading for your residence especially if it is a distance away from you. You should always try to head for public houses specially HQ where there is a crowd and call for help on your radio giving your exact location.
- j. Above all do not discard "Common Sense" as it will enable you to appreciate the situation on the ground, make sensible deductions and take decisions in your best interest. Remember your life comes first, and thereafter, all other things shall be added unto it.

EMERGENCY CONTACT NUMBERS/CHANNELS

1. For incidents occurring after 1800 or on the weekend: switch your radio to channel 8 or channel 4 and call callsign " Zero ". Callsign Zero is the Military Duty Officer in the UNAMIR HQ Ops Room. You may also call for help on following Callsigns and channels:

- a. **Channel 11 - " Sierra Oscar 9 " HQ Civilian Security Officer - between 0830 and 1800 hrs. Monday -Saturday.**
- b. **Channel 8 - Callsign " Zero " - Military Duty Officer - 24 hrs.**
- c. **Channel 7 - Callsign " Escort Zero " - Force Provost Marshal.**
- d. **Civilian Security Officer - Telephone # 84268 Ext. 11073/11135.**
- e. **Military Duty Officer - Channel 4 - call sign "Zero" or telephone # 84268 Ext. 11150 or # 84265.**

2. Standard procedures and discipline must be observed if radio communication is to be used successfully for security purpose. Messages should be planned in advance. Long difficult messages should be avoided as they can be misunderstood. In case of a shooting, do not panic, use your radio to call for assistance. Speak in a calm even voice and give the following information:

- a. Clearly state your callsign.
- b. Give your location and describe the incident that has taken place. This is the most important piece of information and could save vital minutes in time it takes for assistance to reach you.
 - (1) All personnel should know the grid reference of their place of residence as well as that of homes or other places that are frequently visited.
 - (2) You should also know their location at all times in relation to prominent reference location (the Meridian, Chez Lando, Mille Collins, The Parliament Building are examples of such locations).
 - (3) Which way is north, south, east and west in Kigali..
 - (4) If the situation permits, the person calling for assistance should go to an easily identifiable rendez-vous point to meet the person(s) sent to provide assistance.
 - (5) End the message with " I need emergency assistance right away ."

Shooting Incident At Byumba Camp

KIGALI, RWANDA -- At approximately 0130 hours on March 20, a shooting incident occurred at the Nigerian Battalion Camp at Byumba. An unauthorized intruder had trespassed into the camp compound after having bypassed the camp's perimeter fence. The intruder approached the camp sentry post at which point he was verbally challenged by the sentry on duty. After failing to stop, the intruder was fatally wounded by a single shot fired by the sentry.

At this point, it is not clear as to the reason why the trespasser, who has been identified as a Rwandan civilian, had entered the camp.

An investigation into the incident is now in progress and is being conducted by United Nations military police.

The Byumba Camp was the scene of a recent grenade attack that took place in the evening of March 5 in which two grenades were thrown near the sentry post at the camp. Two Nigerian soldiers were injured in that incident.





1. PLEASE REFER TO YOUR MEMO - INFO COLLECTION 002, ACCORDING TO WHICH INFORMATION IS REQUIRED FOR FC BY 27 MAR 95.


2. SINCE THE SUBJECT OF REFUGEE OUTFLOW FROM RWANDA INTO BURUNDI HAS BEEN RAISED, I CONSIDER IT PERTINENT TO POINT OUT SOME OBSERVATIONS ON THIS AS AN INTERIM REPORT.

3. THE MOVEMENT OF REFUGEES FROM RWANDA INTO BURUNDI IS OF TWO TYPES. FIRSTLY THE MOVEMENT OF RWANDESE NATIONALS INTO CAMPS IN BURUNDI, ACROSS THE BORDER. THIS MOVEMENT IS NOT REGISTERED BY UNHCR WITHIN RWANDA AND IS ILLEGAL MOVEMENT ACROSS THE BORDER AS A RESULT OF THE SECURITY SITUATION AT ANY GIVEN TIME. THE REFUGEES ARE REGISTERED WHEN THEY ENTER CAMPS IN BURUNDI. THERE ARE 5 SUCH CAMPS LOCATED AT KAYANZA, NGOZI, KIRUNDO, MUYINGA AND CIBITOKI. THE SECOND IS MOVEMENT OF REFUGEES OF BURUNDI ORIGIN WHO HAD SOUGHT REFUGE IN RWANDA OVER A PERIOD OF TIME SINCE AS EARLY AS 1972. THESE REFUGEES ARE BEING REGISTERED BY THE UNHCR AND ARE BEING TRANSPORTED BACK TO BURUNDI. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT A TOTAL OF 3000 SUCH REFUGEES ARE STILL UNREGISTERED BUT LIVING IN RWANDA AS FREE LIVERS.

4. AS PER INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM UNHCR, A TOTAL OF 8865 REFUGEES OF RWANDESE ORIGIN HAVE ENTERED THE 5 CAMPS ACROSS THE BORDER IN THE 11 WEEKS OF 1995 THUSFAR. THIS MOVEMENT IS CONSIDERED TO BE UNDETECTED AND TAKES PLACE ACROSS THE STRETCH OF BORDER AND MOSTLY AT NIGHT AND IS THUS DIFFICULT FOR UNAMIR FORMED TROOPS AND MILOBS TO DETECT. PERHAPS IT IS THESE FIGURES OF MOVEMENT WHICH HAVE BEEN REFERRED TO BY THE UN AGENCIES AND NGOS IN THEIR REPORTS. THIS APPEARS TO BE AUTHENTICATED BY THE FACT THAT IN MARCH 95 ALONE 3797 SUCH REFUGEES HAVE BEEN REGISTERED IN THE CAMPS IN BURUNDI.

5. MILOBS GP HQ ONLY. A COPY OF FHQ MEMO IS ATTACHED FOR REFERENCE SINCE IT DOES NOT APPEAR TO HAVE BEEN ADDRESSED TO YOU. IT MAY BE USEFUL TO SEND A COPY OF THE SAME TO ALL MILOBS SECTOR HQ SINCE THIS TYPE OF INFORMATION IS FAIRLY EASILY AVAILABLE WITH THEM.



PROVISION OF ESCORTS FOR BROWN AND ROOT CONVOYS

1. A meeting on the above mentioned subject was held at UNAMIR HQ on 10 Feb 95 to discuss the modalities for providing escorts to Brown and Roots supply convoys within UNAMIR AOR.

2. It was generally agreed that the security situation in Rwanda has greatly improved and the current threat to UNAMIR supply convoys was very minimal. In fact, it was pointed out that, since July 94, there has only been one instance when a fuel tanker which was supplying UNAMIR was impounded by the RPA and that was because the owner of the vehicle had been declared wanted by the RPA. It was also agreed that MILOB escorts of supply convoys did not serve any security purpose since MILOBS were not armed.

3. In view of the above, tasks will be allocated as follows:

a. 95 FLSG and INDBATT. 95 FLSG will be primarily responsible for providing escorts to all supply convoys originating from SECTOR 6. When 95 FLSG is unable to undertake all the escorts tasks, INDBATT will be warned in good time to provide the necessary escort.

b. Formed Troops. Formed troops will provide escorts to supply convoys within their respective sectors when the security situation in their sectors is assessed as unfavourable by UNAMIR HQ.

c. UNAMIR HQ. When formed troops other than INDBATT are involved in Brown and Roots convoy escorts, UNAMIR HQ will coordinate convoy timings and RVs for change over of escorts between sectors.

B. ETHIOBATT. Due to reported acts of banditry in the area of NYUNGWE Forest, ETHIOBATT will escort supply convoys for Cyangugu, from Gikongoro through the Nyungwe Forest and back to Gikongoro on order by Force HQ.



COMPTE-RENDU DE LA REUNION DES ONG TENUE EN DATE 27 JANVIER 1995
SOUS LA PRESIDENCE DU PREFET DE KIBUYE

Ordre du jour :

1. Approbation du procès verbal de la réunion du 16 décembre 1995;
2. Tour d'horizon sur les activités des ONG;

1. Monsieur le Préfet a ouvert la réunion en s'exusant du retard et a remercié les participants d'avoir répondu massivement à l'invitation. Il leur a souhaité les meilleurs voeux pour l'année 1995. Il a par la suite passé la parole à Mr HABA Michel représentant du Ministère de la Réhabilitation et de l'Intégration Sociale pour la lecture du procès verbal de la dernière réunion du 16 décembre 1994.

Après la lecture du compte rendu, on a passé aux commentaires. Il a été décidé que le HCR soit le coordinateur des ONG au niveau de la préfecture et que les rapports mensuels de chaque ONG soient remis au Préfet. Le représentant du Ministère de l'Agriculture et de l'Elevage a souhaité de changer le jour de la réunion qui était le dernier vendredi de chaque mois par un autre jour. Les participants ont été unanimes à ce que le dernier mercredi de chaque mois soit le jour de la réunion. Donc la prochaine réunion aura lieu le 22 février 1995.

2. Tour d'horizon sur les activites des ONG.

a) Enfants du Monde:

Le Représentant a tenu à souligner que le centre qu'il gère n'est pas un orphelinat mais un centre d'accueil pour enfants non-accompagnés. Cent quatre-vingt treize (193) enfants sont au centre actuellement dont 88 sont scolarisés. Depuis août 1994, 486 enfants ont transités par le centre, dont 42 ont regagné leurs communes d'origine, 88 sont scolarisés et 163 en réunification familiale. Le seul problème qui se pose est celui de l'accès au centre.

b) Save the Children:

Vient juste de s'installer à Kibuye et travaille avec le centre géré par Enfants du monde, le centre AMIZERO. Elle est encore dans la phase d'enregistrement des enfants. Le représentant a tenu à rappeler que l'objectif de l'organisation est dans une première phase l'enregistrement ensuite la recherche des familles de ces enfants, la réunification et enfin le suivi. Ils ont enregistré jusqu'à présent 210 enfants.

c) Association pour les personnes défavorisés "A.D.P":

.../...

Cette association couvre deux communes dont Mabanza (4 secteurs) et Gitesi (5 secteurs). Elle gère un centre à Bubasi pour enfants non-accompagnés, aux personnes rapatriés et à la réhabilitation des routes. Elle a déjà reçu des aides de Caritas, de MSF et Aide Suisse en cas de catastrophe. Son problème actuel est qu'elle n'a pas de moyens financiers, du personnel, etc...

d) Solidarité:

Cette ONG n'a pas encore commencé ses activités à Kibuye. Elle attend toujours l'autorisation des autorités rwandaises. Toutefois elle va mettre à la disposition des ONG's 3 camions de 5 a 7 tonnes pour le transport , à la distribution "des non food items" et aussi à la réhabilitation des centres nutritionnels.

e) RWRC:

Elle a commencé ses activités au mois d'octobre 1994. Elle fait de la distribution des houes, des semences, et des vivres "Foof for work" pour la réhabilitation des routes (45 km pour 2680 bénéficiaires). Son objectif est de favoriser la création des coopératives et élaborer des stocks pour les communes. Le seul problème actuellement est l'insécurité qui règne à la commune de Rwamatamu.

f) "CRS":

Pas de projet pour l'instant mais il sont entrain de faire une évaluation sur le terrain.

g) Aide Suisse en cas de catastrophe:

Le représentant tenait à préciser que ASC n'est pas une ONG mais un programme. ASC fait des distributions des houes et des semences. Dernièrement, elle a fait une étude sur l'élevage où 80 % du bétail a été décimé. Ainsi, elle a mis en place un programme avec des éleveurs de bétail notamment par la mise à la disposition des Ong locales, des médicaments vétérinaires et encourager les éleveurs à la reproduction du bétail en leur réservant une prime symbolique. Elle intervient dans 6 communes.

h) "Caritas":

Depuis le mois de Septembre, Caritas faisait la distribution des vivres dans toutes les communes. Elle gère un orphelinat à Mubuga de 149 enfants actuellement transféré vers la commune de Mwendo. De ces 149 enfants 4 sont décédés, 81 ont été transférés et 62 ont rejoint leurs familles. Le projet actuel est la réhabilitation des centres de santé notamment, la pharmacie de caritas et aussi un programme de réhabilitation des centres nutritionnels avec le concours de solidarité.

i) COOPI:

REFERENCE : YOUR MESSAGE OF 23 JAN 95

1. THE SUBJECT PROPOSAL HAS BEEN CONSIDERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH DIRECTION CONTAINED AT REF.

2. THE SHORT ANSWER TO THE QUESTION OF FEASIBILITY IS THAT NIGHT PATROLS ARE, OF COURSE, PHYSICALLY CAPABLE OF GOING WHEREVER PATROLS NOW GO BY DAY. THE VIEW HERE, HOWEVER, IS THAT CERTAIN ASPECTS REQUIRE FURTHER CONSIDERATION AND CLARIFICATION. SPECIFICALLY :

A. IS THE PURPOSE OF THESE PATROLS TO GATHER THE SAME INFORMATION WE NOW GATHER BY DAY? IF SO, NIGHT PATROLS WOULD APPEAR TO BE COUNTER-PRODUCTIVE. ON THE ONE HAND LITTLE, IF ANY, INFORMATION CAN BE GATHERED AFTER DARK OWING TO RESTRICTED VISION AND A LACK OF PERSONS WITH WHOM TO SPEAK. ON THE OTHER, ANY TEAM PATROLLING BY NIGHT WILL NOT THEN BE AVAILABLE TO PATROL BY DAY WHEN INFORMATION IS AVAILABLE;

B. IS THE PURPOSE OF THESE PATROLS TO " SHOW THE FLAG " ? IF SO, THE REASONING USED ABOVE PERTAINS;

C. IS THE PURPOSE OF THESE PATROLS TO DETER CRIME, AGGRESSION, ETC.? IF SO THEN ONE MUST SERIOUSLY QUESTION THE RATIONALE. MOST CRIMES IN WHICH UNAMIR SHOULD BE INTERESTED (MURDER, SABOTAGE, KIDNAP, ETC.) ARE COMMITTED BY PERSONS, BE THEY MERE CRIMINALS, "INTERAHAMWE", FORMER GOVERNMENT FORCES OR WHOMEVER, WHO SEEM USUALLY TO BE ARMED AND IN GREATER STRENGTH THAN THE AVERAGE MILOB PATROL. ADD TO THIS THAT THE LOSERS OF THE RECENT WAR HAVE REASON TO BLAME UNAMIR FOR THEIR LOSS AND THAT MILOBS IN "ATTRACTIVE" VEHICLES CAN REASONABLY BE PRESUMED TO POSSESS VALUABLE PERSONAL BELONGINGS (WATCHES, RINGS, CASH, ETC.). THE UNFORTUNATE RESULT MAY BE THAT THE PATROLS BECOME TARGETS RATHER THAN DETERRENTS. WHILE THIS DILEMMA IS EASILY SOLVED BY THE PROVISION OF AN ARMED ESCORT FROM THE RESIDENT UNAMIR UNIT, IT BEGS THE QUESTION OF JUST WHO IS PROTECTING WHOM? IN SHORT, IF ARMED TROOPS ARE REQUIRED TO PROTECT MILOBS, WHY NOT CONDUCT NIGHT PATROLLING WITH ARMED TROOPS ONLY, THEREBY FREEING MILOBS FOR THEIR PROPER FUNCTION OF INFORMATION GATHERING?

D. LASTLY, IT MUST BE BORNE IN MIND THAT NIGHT OPERATIONS ARE NECESSARILY CONDUCTED AT A SLOWER PACE THAN DAYLIGHT OPERATIONS DUE TO REDUCED VISIBILITY AND THE DANGERS OF NIGHT-DRIVING ON HILLY, TWISTING AND UNPAVED ROADS. WHITE-LIGHT VEHICLE PATROLS CAN SAFELY COVER ONLY RELATIVELY SHORT DISTANCES WHILE COVERT STATIC OR OBSERVATION PATROLS WOULD REQUIRE NIGHT VISION DEVICES TO BE EFFECTIVE.

3. IN SUMMARY, IT IS DIFFICULT TO SEE HOW MILOBS OPERATING ALONE AT NIGHT COULD SERVE A USEFUL PURPOSE IN THE PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES. EITHER THE INFORMATION-GATHERING AND PRESENCE-DEMONSTRATION TASKS WOULD SUFFER OR THE MILOBS WOULD BE PUT UNNECESSARILY AT RISK. INDEED, THE LATTER WOULD BE THE CASE REGARDLESS OF THE ORIGINAL PURPOSE OF THE PATROL. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS SUGGESTED THAT ARMED ESCORTS WOULD BE REQUIRED FOR ANY PATROLLING UNDERTAKEN BY MILOBS AT NIGHT.

4. IT IS REQUESTED THAT THE QUESTION OF NIGHT PATROLLING BE CLARIFIED AND RECONSIDERED IN LIGHT OF THE ABOVE REASONING. IF THE PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED PATROLS IS OTHER THAN THOSE CONSIDERED, IT IS REQUESTED THAT THE PURPOSE BE MADE KNOWN IN ORDER THAT A MORE DEFINITIVE STUDY MAY BE UNDERTAKEN BY THIS SECTOR.

* Over the last several weeks, there had been an increase in the number of violent acts such as machete killings, attacks, beatings and threats in and around the Kibeho and Ndago camps of south western Rwanda. Although UNAMIR troops are mandated to protect displaced Rwandans in Camps and that they actively patrol these areas, criminal elements monitor UN movement and rarely commit violent acts in our presence.

* UNAMIR therefore decided to be pro-active and disarm and arrest possible criminals by occupying the camps and by conducting a cordon and search operation from 4:30 a.m. wednesday, Dec 14 to 8:00 a.m. on Dec 15, 1994. UNAMIR confiscated over 1 000 war like weapons of all kind and arrested 43 potential criminals, in a non violent fashion. All suspected criminals were interviewed and registered with relevant humanitarian agencies.

* A total of 1552 United Nations Assistance Mission in Rwanda troops, military observers and support staff participated in operation Hope.

* UNAMIR has reason to believe that some criminals were informed well in advance that this operation was to take place and therefore left the camps prior to our arrival.

* "The operation was successfully completed without any violence. The camps have been cleansed of the intimidatory influence of the extremists", reported the SRSG, Ambassador Shaharyar Khan to UNNY."

* UNAMIR intends to maintain a presence in those two camps in an attempt to create a climate of confidence and security among the displaced and discourage criminals from returning.
