Subject : Sale of Title II supplies

Please refer to your recent cables on this subject, in particular that containing Mr. N'Sele's additional suggestions of importers who should share in the purchases of the Title II supplies.

... Taking account of these suggestions, and after consultation with Mr. Moore, I have prepared the attached list of shares for the various importers, in respect of soyabean oil, cotton-seed oil, beans, whole corn and corn-meal, and flour. Unless you have any objections, I propose that you should treat this as a final and irrevocable list, and inform all concerned that these are your instructions from Leopoldville.

Regarding corn meal, I should explain that we have not taken Mr. N'Sele's suggestions into account but have confined ourselves to the traditional importers. As regards milk, I suggest that you offer up to a total of 200 tons to the following firms:-

INTERFINA, WOODIN, SALVARIS (Kamina), VAF, MINOTERIES DU KATANGA, CONLONBARITSIS (Jadotville) PIET VAN NEER, LAGANIS (Kolwezi), ROBIOGLIO.

As regards the rest of the milk, I suggest that you consult Mr. Senn, and if he sees no objection, you hand it over to the Congolese Redcross, which seems to have successfully re-absorbed "The Katangese Redcross". This would, of course, be after you have fulfilled any promises to voluntary agencies, as mentioned in your cable CIV ELI 113 (In this connection, if you have received no further requests from voluntary agencies, I suggest that you treat this as a final list and accept no further requests).

You may be surprised by the relatively small percentage of flour allocated to INTERFINA. The reason for this is that INTERFINA will shortly be receiving an advance shipment of 500 tons of flour under Title I.

I shall be interested to hear what progress you are making in establishing wholesale prices, and would appreciate receiving a cable on this as soon as you have anything to report.

Subject : Stocks of food in LOBITO

...

With reference to my cable CIVELI 196, I attach photocopy of the letter which we received from AMI regarding stocks of milk, cotton oil and maize held up in LOBITO.

The simplest way to deal with these costs will probably be the same as that we have adopted for the transport costs of the stocks in EVILS, namely charge them to the Counterpart Fund against the eventual proceeds of sale.

This is a special arrangement to deal with costs already incurred. For future supplies arriving at LOBITO, we will proceed as originally planned, namely sell at the port and let the purchasers be responsible for all charges, including transportation. I will be sending you a memorandum about this very shortly.

Reference is made to the Title II Program to be operated in the Province of Katanga by the United Nations.

It is the understanding of USAID/Leopoldville that UNOC, having accepted the responsibility for the operation of this program by the signature of the Transfer Authorizations, will assure the transportation of these goods from the port of Lobito to the territory of the Katanga. These costs, along with any other costs accruing to UNOC, i.e., storage costs, will be reimbursed to UNOC after the sale of the Title II commodities by UNOC to importers in the Katanga. This reimbursement could most easily be made by UNOC deducting from the proceeds of the sales the amounts disbursed by UNOC for transport and storage costs.

By this letter I wish to confirm the agreement of USAID/Leopoldville to the above procedure and at the same time express the appreciation of USAID/Leopoldville to you for your cooperation in this program.

Subject : Transportation charges on Title II stocks in EVILLE

We have recently taken over some US Title II food stocks in EVILLE, at the request of US AID, from the Seventh Day Adventist Welfare Service (SAWS). We shall sell the bulk of these stocks and the proceeds will be credited to the Counterpart Fund.

In the meantime, transportation charges, amounting to one million seven hundred and fifty five thousand Belgian francs and seven hundred thousand Congolese francs, have been incurred in bringing the stocks from LOBITO to EVILLE. The Agence Maritime Internationale (AMI) has asked for a letter of guarantee of payment by ONUC of these charges. I have consulted Mr. WEST, the Director of US AID, and he has agreed that these charge can be debited to the counterpart fund against the proceeds of sale of the stocks. In these circumstances, I believe that we can authorize Mr. AMONOO, Acting Deputy Civilian officer in EVILLE, to issue a letter of guarantee to AMI. I attach a draft cable on these lines for your clearance.

I should add that this would be a special arrangement relating to stocks already in EVILLE or en route from LOBITO. As regards Title II supplies arriving in future at LOBITO, these are the subject of a separate memorandum which Mr. THOMPSON is addressing to you.



Subject : Commercialization of Title II stocks. SOUTH KATANGA

Our original plan to sell the Title II stocks to a consortium consisting of WOODIN, INTERFINA and the MONOTERIES du Katanga was based on the understanding that these are the only firms with an adequate distribution network to ensure that supplies would reach all parts of South Katanga in the next 2½ months (i.e., before Title I supplies start to arrive).

This plan has now been attacked in EVILLE on the grounds that it would give a monopoly to the large firms; also the charge has been made that "ONUC is in the hands of the Société Générale".

Mr. MOORE of US AID has proposed an alternative distribution that would include a number of other firms in EVILLE.

Unless it can be shown that these firms have adequate distribution network throughout the province, I believe that we should stick to our original plan and explain our reasons to our critics. It should be made very clear that this plan is of an emergency character and will have no bearing whatever on the subsequent arrangements made by the Americans for Title I supplies.

The only modification I would suggest in our original plan is that cotton seed oil should be sold entirely to HUILCO, since I understand that all importers agree that HUILCO has always been the sole importer of this commodity. Although this appears to be supporting another monopoly, it is understood that the refining of the oil by HUILCO will keep some 150 people in employment.

PROPOSED DISTRIBUTION OF TITLE II STOCKS FOR THE SOUTH KATANGA

Inasmuch as the original distribution made by UNOC has caused a great deal of resentment among various importers in the E'ville area I feel that the matter should be studied again to insure as equitable a distribution as possible among a small number of importers which will avoid any possibility of monopoly. Another important consideration is the price level of the present food stocks, which, though climbing, should be maintained as far as is possible.

In working out the present distribution plan, I have tried to make as broad a distribution as possible and at the same time have attempted to limit the number of importers. However, by limiting the number of importers to only three, both AID and UNOC have come in for a great deal of criticism. I believe we can avoid this criticism by making a new and somewhat larger distribution. I do not believe that this new distribution will appreciably increase the workload of UNOC E'ville.

The following percentage breakdown I believe has the following advantages over the original distribution plan:

1. Avoiding monopolization by the large firms.
2. Encouraging competition between the large and smaller firms. The smaller firms who take charge of the goods in Lobito have much lower invisible charges, called frais generaux, frais forfaitaires, etc, which will force the larger firms to be more competitive than they otherwise might be. Although the original three firms agreed to sell the goods "at cost", this cost would also include such above mentioned "frais" and would therefore push the prices up for the others.
3. Avoiding the criticism that the UNOC is in the hands of the Societe Generale - a criticism which I have heard often in the recent past.
4. Avoiding any precedents which the Big Three might try to use to obtain the lion's share of the Title I program.

Powdered Milk: Since there are large quantities of thi item available, and since the consumption has always been rather low (maximum 60 MT permonth) I believe that a number of importers should be allowed to buy the stocks (but that none should be able to buy excessive quantities) and that the International Red Cross should be contacted to see if they wuld be willing to act as the UN distributing agent to schools, hospitals, maternities, etc.

Note on Proposed Arrangements for
Distribution of U.S. Title 2 Relief Supplies

Mr. G. C. Senn of the International Red Cross reckons that the only areas in Katanga (South and North) still needing free distribution of foodstuffs are the following:-

- (1) Distress Areas, i.e., the region of Albertville, Nyunzu, Kabongo and Malemba - Nkulu
- (2) Mission schools and hospitals throughout the whole of the former Katanga province.

As regards distress areas, he recommends that distribution should be made through missions of all denominations having the necessary facilities, who could collect supplies from ONUC in Elisabethville. The same applies to mission schools and hospitals, where supplies made available should be based on actual records of distribution.

Hitherto, the Seventh Day Adventist Welfare Service (SAWS) has acted as distributing agent for Title 3 supplies, using transport warehousing facilities (Musée Léo II) provided by the Katanga Ministry of the Interior. SAWS has also made supplies available to other private relief agencies, including Caritas, League of Red Cross Societies, Presbyterians, Methodists, Friends Service Council, International Committee of the Red Cross, and Katanga Red Cross.

U.S. AID IN Léo is arranging with Washington that, from now on, ONUC should take over responsibility for storage and distribution of existing stocks and new supplies for Katanga under Title 3, which for this purpose will be converted to Title 2.

On the basis of my talk with Mr. Senn, I believe that ONUC

/should

take the following action in order to fulfil the responsibilities it has undertaken in respect of these supplies:

(a) Take over the stocks at present held in Eville by SAWS, amounting to 1363 tons, as well as smaller stocks in Jadotville and Kolwezi, also occupancy of the SAWS warehouse in Eville. An inventory of all these stocks should be made before the transfer.

(b) Obtain estimates of three-months' requirements from each of the various relief agencies and missions (including SAWS - see Annex) on the basis of submitted records of actual distribution.

(c) Set aside enough stocks in the Eville warehouse to meet the needs referred to in (b) above.

(d) Arrange to commercialise the rest, timing this, so far as possible, to meet the needs of the market. To avoid delays, allocations of supplies to local firms should be determined in consultation with Mr. Ileo rather than, at this stage, referring the matter to Leopoldville.

(e) Establish staff requirements in connection with the warehousing, on the assumption that about 10,000 tons of supplies will pass through our hands.

The possible need for ONUC to help the relief agencies with air transport to isolated places should be borne in mind.

Mr. Harrington, assisted by Mr. Pichler and other staff as necessary, will be responsible for these arrangements, for keeping records of relief distribution, and for providing the Eville Finance officer with the information needed for billing firms which buy commercialized supplies.

With completion of the above operations within the next three months, ONUC's responsibility will be ended, as US supplies, thereafter will be coming in as part of the Table I imports for the whole of the Congo.

I would like to congratulate you on the successful completion of a difficult assignment. I am very sorry that my work here prevented me from visiting you in KONGOLO and seeing the operation in action.

As regards the sale of the remaining relief supplies, it would be useful, if possible, to have the proceeds broken down according to the various items. This is because the proceeds from US Aid supplies have to be credited to a Counterpart Fund, whereas the proceeds of sale of clothing, etc., should be credited to the Air Missions suspense account, to which their cost was originally debited.

I am glad that you were able to reactivate the bakery with the Catholic Relief Service Flour and fully support your initiative in obtaining margarine, salt and yeast. I note that the Representative of the Relief Committee for Liberated Areas agreed that these items should be invoiced to the Committee.
