1. SITUATION

a. GENERAL

3. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

a. SECTOR HQ. Normal morning briefing was held at 0800 hours.

b. TEAMS.

(1) Two (2) teams carried out liaison and contact patrol to the UGANDAN border at KAGITUMBA and also visited the NYAGATARE transit camp to complete contingency planning towards any anticipated large influx of returnees from TANZANIA. The following observations were made :

(i) Border officials at KAGITUMBA are aware of the possibility of this large influx and were found very cooperative.

(ii) The transit camp at MATIMBA was found closed but the WFP facilities including a large tent is still in use.

(iii) The NYAGATARE transit camp under the auspices of UNHCR is ready to take up to 1,500 returnees at any time. At the moment it is housing only 228 returnees.

(iv) All NGO's including WFP, ARC and IRC are ready to register, administer and inoculate large influx of returnees and cattle.

(v) The main problems stem from transport, water, communication as well as lack of liaison offices for staff. Milobs Sect 2B is aware of these points and have covered same in its contingency plans.

(2) One team patrolled BIRENGA 5959 and RUSUMO 7550 communes and also visited the transit camps at BIRENGA and NYAKARAMBI. The situation was reported calm.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

One team arranged for and escorted medical laboratory equipment donated by Pharmaciens Sans Frontiers (PSF) and presented same to the University of BUTARE. The Director was very much thankful for the kind donation.

No information was obtained with regards to infiltration.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. The German NGO named GTZ is planning to build 5000 houses for old case loads in KIBUNGO area. The exact location where the houses will be built is not known so far. The project will be implemented under supervision of UNHCR. So far two model houses are under construction in the vicinity of the BIRENCA transit camp. Returnees who will be provided with houses will be given an option to select either of them.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. A meeting was held at RWAMAGANA 4884 as part of AIDS awareness day. The meeting was largely attended by the locals, prefecture officials and medical organizations of the prefecture.

b. TEAMS. Two teams together with GHANCOY representatives carried out long northwind patrol. Following tasks have been given: To monitor the progress on resettlement in the southern park area, to gain information on figures on cattle, to contact locals and to obtain information on alleged infiltrations through the park from across TANZANIA. Additionally teams were tasked to find out about security and road conditions. Increased settlement was observed in and around the area 6697 (approximately 300 people with some thousand cattle - two to three thousand?). Further to the north and east no further settlements or cattle could be found. No information has been obtained in reference to infiltration. All roads are usable but not recommended during rain.





4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

a. There are approximately 417 prisoners including 18 women in the cachot of MUHAZI. The Assistant Bourgemester requested for their transfer to KIBUNGO prison. As per ICRC, the transfer of prisoners from the communes to KIBUNGO prison is likely to commence from 04 Dec 95.

b. In KAYONZA Commune, the team met Assistant Bourgemester of KAYONZA Commune and was informed that besides the main road leading to KIBUNGO 5586, deforestation of eucalyptus trees for clearing of a large area for construction of five big makeshift shelters, two of them already covered by blue canvas for storage of mud bricks, has taken place. This is a project of WFP for construction of approximately 700 houses for returnees, widows and elderly people.

c. The widening of the track joining Birenga and the Kibungo water pump has been completed today by GHANCOY Engineer Section. This will enable the big water trucks to go right up to the water point.

- (3) There is no information available if prisoners from other prisons or cachets have been moved to this newly constructed prison. However information from various bourgenestres was received that communes are preparing statements and other necessary formalities to move their prisoners from their commune cachets to this prison.

4. No further information could be obtained so far.

5. It was observed that apart from few affluent persons, the majority of population does not possess transistors. Apart from the areas selected for resettlement of old case loads (Annex A) it has been observed that at KIREHE 7349 plots of lands were allocated to those old case loads who returned short after the war from UGANDA and who have occupied abandoned houses. No exact explanation for this step could be given. However, it was agreed that in future UNHCR and MILOBs will cooperate very close regarding statistics on returnees. Total figures on returnees for the month of October could be obtained.

b. TEAMS.

(1) One team patrolled RUSUMO Commune 7247 and visited CYUNUZI Sector 6346, MUSAZA Sector 6943, NYAKARAMBI transit camp and the Sous Prefecture of KIRENE 7349. At CYUNUZI approximately 25 people were observed repairing the road. They are employed by the MINIRESO and are paid 200 RF per day. At KIRENE 7349 a team of officials from the MINIRESO was seen taking measurements and allocating plots of lands for construction of new houses. The team was informed that this plots are for those old case loads who returned short after the war from UGANDA and who have

occupied abandoned houses. These returnees have to hand over their present houses to the original owners who are supposed to return in the near future and can construct houses on these plots allocated to them. The situation was found to be calm.

(2) One team patrolled SAKA Commune 4334 met the RPA Company Commander and visited a health center at JARAMA Sector 4348. The situation was reported to be calm.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

a. One team visited the MUSAZA health center 6943. This health center is looked after by MSF (Spain). Approximately 100 patients attend this center. The treatment is totally free. The most common diseases are malaria, skin diseases and malnutrition (especially those children who returned from Zaire). On 26 Oct 95 one patient died from cerebral malaria.

b. Own team visited NYAKARAMBI transit camp and counted only 30 returnees present at the camp. The UNHCR water tanker was found empty. However, IRC has repaired the water pump and tap water was available. It is expected that more returnees will arrive from Tanzania tomorrow.

c. One team visited the health center at JARAMA 4348. The center is run by IRC. The attendance is approximately 60 to 70 patients per day. There are only two beds for inpatients. However, serious cases are evacuated by the IRC ambulance to KIBUNGO hospital. The main problem is the lack of water. The center can only use collected rain water.

(1) One team patrolled RUSUMO Commune 7247, visited the BUKOBA border post and the resettlers at NASHO area 9465. The situation was found quiet.

(2) The team which went together with HR yesterday to investigate a reported incident of harassment by RPA to a family in CATI 4392 learned that the reported harassment has no RPA connection and the whole incident is a local case which needs a solution from local leaders. The family which was allegedly harassed by RPA lost their family head some four months ago reportedly killed by some RPA soldiers who were in league with a local woman. The body of the man was reportedly seen in the MUHAZI lake a few days later. It is not clear whether the body was retrieved or not. Before his death the man was reported to have a problem with the local woman, a returnee after the recent genocide. On arrival she accused the late man in question that one of her cows was taken by him. On inquiry it was found out that he had bought this cow from other sources, however he agreed to

pay some money as compensation. While this was being awaited the man met his death. After this incident the family was gripped with fear and twice the RPA stationed at GISHALI 4688 visited her to find out if there were any persons threatening her life. After a while the above mentioned local woman was reported to have organized some boys from KIGALI to harass and to threaten this family. Each time they pass near her place they threaten the wife that she will be killed like her husband and that the house she is building reportedly from UN money will be destroyed. Her main fear is that these boys are RPA soldiers and they may harm her family, especially that they are connecting their hatred to her daughter working with Brown & Roots. The team also discovered that the local leaders have not done anything concerning her fears despite her reporting to them. This case will be monitored and local leaders as well as RPA will be informed about this threat.

(3) The same team on their way back hit a man whose hand were tied and who was guarded by three other locals at KAYONZA 5884. The man threw himself obviously in an attempt to commit suicide on very short distance in front of the UNAMIR car. The driver managed to avoid a total crash but hit the man with the left mirror. No damage to the UN car occurred. The team learned from the three men guarding this person that he committed a crime and they have arrested him in an attempt to bring him to the commune cachet. The team carried the tied up man and the other three persons to the RWAMAGANA hospital to ensure that this man was not injured. The doctor at RWAMAGANA hospital gave a written statement that this person was not injured at all. The team informed the gendarmerie at RWAMAGANA who took over this case and released the team. A separate traffic incident will be forwarded on this incident.



a. At MATUNGO Sector 4847 in BIRENGA Commune it was found that still 10% of the houses are abandoned. An acute shortage of seeds was reported throughout the area.

b. Own team visited GAHINI hospital 5798 in RUKARA Commune 5601. The hospital was vandalized during the last war. It has been renovated to a habitable state and work is still going on to improve the situation. ITALIAN AID is supporting and running this hospital. The bed capacity is of now 120 but could be increased to 150. Approximately 80 inpatients and 100 to 150 outpatients are treated on a daily basis. The international doctor (Italian) is due to finish his contract in the near future and the second doctor (Rwandese national) will have to look after the patients on his own. In addition to the doctors are 30 nurses employed. The hospital has running water and electricity is supplied by a big generator which also supplies power to the neighboring two orphanages. Problem areas are: Shortage of medical staff, too less laboratory equipment, additional baby cots, isolation ward, fridge for the blood bank, ambulance, meningitis vaccination and detergents and general cleaning material.

a. SECTOR HQ. Normal morning briefing was held. MILOBs were trained in first aid by one doctor from GhanCoy. Actg Sector Commander accompanied by RPA Liaison officer and one MILOB went on patrol to the NASHO area at 9055 and 9465 and to MPANGA ranch 8773. The aim of the patrol was to check and follow up the situation of the resettlers. The situation of the resettlers was found satisfactorily, UNHCR has provided them with plastic sheets to cover the destroyed houses. Seeds have been distributed and resettlers have started planting on a small scale. AFRICARE is restructuring a hospital at NYABURA 9463, which is at the moment near completion and the dispensary is already functioning. The attendance is approximately 30 to 40 persons a day. RPA has deployed a company at RUKUMBO 9367 to provide additional security for the resettlers. The situation was found to be very calm and life seems to return back to normal.

b. TEAMS.

(1) One team patrolled MUGESERA Commune 4764 met the bourgemestre and visited on their return BIRENGA transit camp. The situation was assessed as calm.

At RUKOBA border post the team met UNHCR officials operating in TANZANIA and the Rwandese border authorities. They would appreciate and would provide any assistance necessary if MILOBs would also cross the border to liaise with officials and UNHCR on TANZANIAN side in respect of returnees.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

a. In 6 Secteurs of the MUGESERA Commune 619 plots have been acquired to accommodate expected returnees. Out of this number 395 plots have been demarcated. The water situation in the Commune is still unchanged, both water pumps providing water for this commune are out of order. IRC is assisting in the water supply problems but no positive result yet.

b. The water situation at NYAKARAMBI transit camp is still unchanged. The UNHCR water tanker was filled up but the water pump providing running water was not functioning. Concerning to information given by IRC it will take a few more days to solve this problem. However the water tanker is sufficient to supply enough water for the few persons in the camp. Most of the 507 new arrivals from TANZANIA will be transported to their communes by tomorrow.

c. The 945 prisoners at NSINDA prison who have been removed back to their old quarters because of electricity problems were removed back to the new tents. With the help of Electrogaz and ICRC a generator was installed and the problem should be solved now. No figures of new transferred prisoners could be obtained.

The health center at NYARABUYE could not function well today because most of the senior staff did not arrive at work due to the heavy rain.



a. SECTOR HQ. Normal morning briefing was held. NGO meeting was held at 0900 hrs. The NGO Liaison Officer briefed MILOBs and attending NGOs on the Conference which was held at GISENYI last week.

b. TEAMS.

(1) One team patrolled RUSUMO Commune 7548 and visited the NYAKARAMBI transit camp. Only 9 returnees were found in the camp. The rest of 292 persons were transported to their communes.

(2) One team patrolled RWAMAGANA Commune 4984, MUHAZI Commune 4590 and RUTONDE 4984. The team visited the RWAMAGANA hospital and held meeting with the bourgemestres of MUHAZI and RUTONDE Communes. The situation was reported to be calm.

(3) One team patrolled SAKE Commune 4354. The team was able to meet the bourgemestre and collected information to update the Commune file.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

a. The team which visited the SAKE Commune learned that the population at present is now 37507 compared to approximately 60000 before the war. SAKE Commune has no orphanage. All 1715 orphans are with 517 foster families. 22436 refugees have returned to this commune so far. The number of prisoners in the commune cachet is at present 238. Most of them are accused of having participated in the genocide.

b. The water pump providing NYAKARAMBI transit camp with running water broke down today. IRC was contacted and promised to repair this pump before the expected arrival of new returnees on next Wednesday. However the water situation in respect of the low occupancy today (only 9) returnees is not critical at all.

c. Own Team visited GISHALI health center 4692 in MUHAZI Commune. This health center is abandoned, however this center could be repaired and put into function with very few money. 

Because of the previous initiative of the bougemestres of RUTONDE 4984 and RUKARA 5601 150 tons of seeds had been initially obtained and distributed to these communes. NGOs and Ghan Coy were asked to assist in distribution and transportation of the EEC donated items to various communes.

d. Team visited a "maternity home" at GAHINI 5798. This center has been running since five months by an organization called "UMWIZERWA" and is directed by Mrs Beatrice Semana. The center covers the population of 11 secteurs and has an attendance of approximately 30 women per week. This organization is facing many problems e.g. there are only two beds available but at least ten beds would be required, Center is unable to meet rent of 6,000 RF per month and the building has no electricity.

e. Own team visited RUKARA hospital 5601 and was informed that the hospital delivered 300 blankets and 300 trousers donated by CARITAS to the commune cachet. This clinic also delivers small amount of raw food for every prisoner and provides medical care for them on a daily basis. This hospital is running a nutrition center which supplies food for 560 children per week.


