Dear Dr. Candau,

I have been discussing the Civilian Operations programme with Government authorities here and with the Chief of Civilian Operations, and the representatives of the Specialized Agencies.

.....

As a result of the discussions, and with the concurrence of the Secretary General, I decided to address a letter to the Prime Minister on the future financing of the operations. I enclose for your information a copy of the letter addressed by me to Mr. Adoula. The letter is self-explanatory. Messrs. Dorsinville and Ahmad later accompanied me to the Prime Minister's office in order to discuss with him the proposals made in the letter.

The Prime Minister in his talk with us on the proposals, expressed his serious concern over our financial difficulties and offered to collaborate with us in obtaining contributions to the Congo Fund. He stated, however; that we could not base our plans for the implementation of the programme on hopes of receiving additional contributions to the Congo Fund and, being anxious to ensure the continuation of the 'very helpful' work being done by the United Nations and the Specialized Agencies, he has assured me that the Congolese Government will be prepared to establish a Trust Fund for the purpose referred to in my letter.

The details relating to the Trust Fund will soon be discussed between us and the Government but as you will note from my letter to the Prime Minister, the fund will be limited to the financing of the operational services.

It is needless for me to point out that the finances of the Congolese Government are not very buoyant. This being so, the Prime Minister's decision to guarantee the deficit in the Congo Fund is evidence of his confidence in the work being done by the United Nations and the Specialized Agencies. I, therefore, hope that insofar as the programme of your organization is

I look forward to hearing from you in due course on the details of posts included in your current programme which can be financed by your organization in 1963 and 1964.
