DAILY SITREP FOR 06 NOV 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. IN SECTOR 4A, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT ABOUT 18 LOCALS AND 5 RPA SOLDIERS FROM MBASA (GR 5410) KILLED A SHEPHERD IN CYAFURWE (GR 5317) ON 051514B NOV 94. THE GROUP THEN STOLE 39 COWS AND 31 SHEEP THAT HAD BELONGED TO THE DEAD MAN.

B. IN SECTOR 4A A YOUNG MAN WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ATTACKED AND KILLED BY UNKNOWN ASSAILANTS BETWEEN KIBEHO (GR 5007) AND RWAMIKO GR 9913 AT 052000B NOV 94. INVESTIGATION ONGOING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT ROUTINE DAY AND NIGHT FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN MAJOR TOWNS AND VILLAGES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 3, TAC HQ REPORTED THAT AN RPA PATROL ARRESTED AN RPA SOLDIER WHO HAD ESCAPED FROM CUSTODY. THE MAN WAS ARRESTED IN BUTARE AT 060955 NOV 94 AFTER A WARNING SHOT HAD BEEN FIRED.

(2) MILOBS IN SECTOR 3 INVESTIGATED REPORTS THAT RPA SOLDIERS HAD ROBBED A SHOP IN NTONGWE (GR 9157) ON 05 NOV 94. RPA PROVOST TROOPS HAVE ARRESTED AN RPA SECTION COMD IN CONNECTION WITH THE OFFENCE.

B. RGF NTR.

C. MILITIA MILOBS HAVE REPORTED THAT 2 MEN WERE WOUNDED IN AN ATTACK IN KABURANERA (GR 6111, SECTOR 3). THE ATTACK IS SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN CARRIED OUT BY THE MILITIA.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. FC MET ON SATURDAY WITH UNHCR REP MR URASSA TO DISCUSS THE DIFFERENT REFUGEE CRISIS. HE ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH A CHURCH DELEGATION FROM GABKAYE TO DISCUSS THE SITUATION OF OVER 400 ORPHANS CURRENTLY LIVING IN THE GABKAYE CHURCH. HE WAS REASSURED BY THE CLERGY THAT THE CHILDREN WOULD NOT BE MOVED BEFORE SUITABLE REPLACEMENT ACCCN FOUND. HE ALSO TALK WITH THE NEW HEAD OF UNREO MR. RANDOLF KENT. THE FC BROUGHT MR KENT TO DATE ON THE UNAMIR SITUATION AND ROLE.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). CARRIED OUT PTLs AND MAINTAIN SECURITY WITHIN BYUMBA AND KIBUNGO AREA. 20 ADULTS AND 6 CHILDREN CROSSED INTO RWANDA THROUGH RUSOMO BORDER POST. A NUMBER OF LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE AT NICOY MEDICAL CENTRE DURING THE PERIOD.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY ). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY).

(1) CONTINUED TO MAN CHECK POINTS WITHIN AOR. MALICOY ASSISTED INVESTIGATIONS INTO A ROBBERY INCIDENT INVOLVING SOME RPA SOLDIERS. ONE LOCAL REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS ROBBED A SHOP ON 05 NOV 94. THE SHOP OWNER AND SOME CUSTOMERS WERE BEATEN UP DURING THE ROBBERY. A PTL WENT TO THE SCENE AND FOUND 5 PEOPLE STILL UNDER RPA CUSTODY INCLUDING THE SHOP OWNER AND



HIS 2 CHILDREN. ALL OF THEM WERE WOUNDED. AN RPA SECTION LDR HAS BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE THEFT FOR QUESTIONING BY RPA PROVOST.

(2) SECTOR COMD WITH OPS OFFICER WENT TO BIMAWA GR 7063 WITH A PRIEST OF GITARAMA TO VERIFY SUITABILITY FOR SHIFTING ORPHANAGE FROM KABGAYI GR 7468 TO BIMANAS SISTERS SCHOOL.

(3) SECTOR COMD ALSO WENT TO KIBEHO GR 5007 TO LIAISE WITH GHANBATT FOR NIGHT PATROL COORDINATION. THE SECTOR COMD THEN VISITED PANDA GR 5607, RUNYINYA GR 6002 FOR RECCE FOR THE DEPLOYMENT OF MALAWI PLATOON.

(4) A TOTAL OF 364 REFUGEES CROSSED FROM BURUNDI TO RWANDA VIA KANYARU DURING THE PERIOD.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN AO. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT JOINT PTLS WITH ZAMBATT IN NORTHERN SECTOR OF AO.

(2) PROVIDED GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CYANIKA GR 5530. MAINTAINED DEPLOYMENT OF 1 X MECH SECT EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES.

(3) CONTINUED MANNING ROAD BLOCKS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI. BRITISH AND AUSMED TEAMS CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MED ASSISTANCE TO THE LOCALS AT KIBEHO.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH ZAMBATT. CONDUCTED PTLS IN THE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY AND PROVIDED GUARD AT THE CYANIKA FOOD DISTRIBUTION POINT.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFATT). MANNED CHECK PTS AND CONDUCTED PATROLS IN KIBUYE, BIRAMBO, KARONGI GR 2768, CROSSROADS GR 2756, BABANZA, GAFUMBA GR 3377. ONE TEAM ALSO CARRIED OUT HELI PTL FROM KIBUYE TO NYAMBUYE GR 2880, RUBYIRO GR 2169, GISORO GR 1867, GASHURA GR 1761, RUBOREZA GR 1158, GITSIMBWE GR 1052 AND KILIMBI GR 1069. THEY ALSO OBSERVED THE LOCALS CONDUCTING THEIR NORMAL ACTIVITIES.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT MOBILE AND FOOT PTLS IN AOR. MANNED PERMANENT CHECK POINTS AT PINDURA GR 1426, GISHOMA GR 8411, KIBINGO GR 9038, MURURU DPs CAMP GR 7021, AND NYAGATARE GR 8024.

(2) DEPLOYED 1 X MECH SQUAD AT KAMEMBE AIRPORT GR 7827. 1 X MECH SQUAD AT ICRC STOCK GR 7826. 2 X MECH SQUADS AT MDM HOSPITAL GR 7826. 2 X MECH SQUADS AT STADIUM STOCK GR 7725

(3) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AND SECURITY AT NGOS INSTALLATIONS, OFFICES, RESIDENCES AND FIVE DP CAMPS WITHIN THE SECTOR.

(4) DEPLOYED TROOPS AT DPs CAMPS AS FOLS, 1 MECH PL (WITH 4 APC's) AT MURURU DPs CAMP GR 7521. 1 MOTORISED PL AT KIRAMBO DPs CAMP AT GR 0444. 1 MOTORISED PL AT CYIMBOGO DPs CAMP AT GR 7619 AND THE COY HQ. 2 MOTORISED PLS AT NYARUSHISHI DPs CAMP GR 8622.

(5) CO AND 2IC VISITED CYANGUGU TO ASSESS SECURITY SITUATION OF THE AREA. RECOVERED 100 RDS OF AK47 AND 8 DIFFERENT WEAPONS FROM THE DWELLERS AROUND KAMEMBE GR 7826.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED IN FOLLOWING AREAS: NEMBA GR 7619 NYARUTOVU GR 7518, MATABA GR 7110, NTUNGAMO GR 7300, GASIZA GR 7296, KAVUMO GR 7697, BUSTREKA GR 7896, DAOONDU GR 8396, GITEME GR 9596, GITABA GR 8795, BWENDA GR 8897 AND MUNONDO GR 8700. PTL REPORTED THAT ON 26 OCT 94 ONE MAN WAS KILLED AND TWO OTHERS WERE INJURED BY MILITIA AT NGEGE GR 62330. RPA ARRESTED 9 PERS IN KIDINGO GR 6766.

J. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS AND OBSERVED THAT THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS CALM.

(1) BORDERS

(A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO ALL TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA) REMAINED OPENED TO ALL TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(C) RUSIZI BORDER POST IN SECTOR 4C WAS ALSO OPENED TO TRAFFIC.

(D) GISENYI AND CYANIKA BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(2) MILOB GP HQ PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS CARRIED OUT DURING THE PERIOD. ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO UNREO AND NGOS.

(3) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. MILOB TEAM CONDUCTED PATROLS AT BYUMBA, RUKOMO AND GATUNA AREAS AND REPORTED SITUATION CALM.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. MILOBS PATROLLED AND MONITORED ACTIVITIES ALONG THE RWANDA/TANZANIA AND RWANDA/BURUNDI BORDERS AND REPORTED SIT CALM. PTLs ALSO COVERED SANKE, GASHORA, RUTETE, NGENDA AND NYAMATA. THE SECTOR WAS GEN CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. THE SIT IN THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM WITH INCREASED INFLUX OF RETURNEES. MILOB TEAM PATROLLED KIBEHO GR 9007, BIMAWA GR 7063, KABGAYI GR 7468, NTONGWE GR 9157 AND NUGINA GR 9267. THE SIT IN THESE AREAS WAS REPORTED CALM.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. THE SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOBS CARRIED OUT BORDER PATROLS, MONITORING AND INVESTIGATION DURING THE PERIOD. PTLs COVERED KADUHA AND RUKONDO AREA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. MILOBS CARRIED OUT HELI PATROLS IN KIBUYE, NYAMBUYE, RUBYIRO, GISORO GR 1867, GASHORA GR 1761, RUBEREZO GR 1158, GITSIMBWE GR 1052 AND KILIMBI GR 1049. MANY CANOES WERE OBSERVED ALONG SHORES OF LAKE AT KILIMBI. SIT IN THESE AREAS WAS CALM.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOB TEAM CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS WITHIN SECTOR. UNHCR PERS VISITED THE SECTOR HQ. THEY LEFT SOME FOOD ITEMS WITH MILOBS TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO TRANSIT REFUGEES.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. SITUATION STILL TENSE IN SOME AREAS IN THE SECTOR DUE TO MASSACRE AND RECENT ROBBERY CASES. MILOBS PATROLLED THE GEN AREA OF GISENYI AND BORDER POSTS, NYUNDO GR 248117, RUHENGARI, CYANIKA GR 7153, KINIGI GR 5540, BISOKE GR 449393 AND MAROKE AND REPORTED AREA CALM AFTER ESCALATION OF ROBBERY AND MURDERS. OTHER PTLs COVERED NYARUTOVU GR 7718, MATABA GR 7110, NTUGAMO GR 7300, GASIZA GR 7296, KAVUMO GR 7697 AND OTHER AREAS WITHIN THE SECTOR.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) THE SITUATION IN KIGALI AND ITS SUBURBS REMAINED CALM. RPA INTENSIFIED THEIR ROUTINE FOOT AND MOBILE PTLs AND MOUNTED SNAP ROAD BLOCKS IN THE CAPITAL ESPECIALLY AT NIGHT.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED UNHCR TRUCKS WITH A TOTAL OF 49 DPs FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO AND ESCORTED 41 DPs TO KIGALI. ANOTHER TEAM OF MILOBS ESCORTED 5 UNHCR TRUCKS WITH 207 DPs TO NYAMATA AND NGENDA.

K. AUSMED. THE AUSMED SPT FORCE PROVIDED MED SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(1) AUST FORCE AT CHK TREATED 11 PATIENTS. CURRENTLY HOLDING 7 IN PATIENTS.

(2) TROOPS OF THE TSG CONDUCTED A RESUP/ROTATION WITH KIGALI BASED ELMS. PREPARATIONS FOR THE RETURN OF THE TSG TO KIGALI HAVE COMMENCED. DENTAL ELM HAVE ALREADY

RETURNED TO KIGALI.

(3) RIFLE COY ELM CONDUCTED SECURITY OPS AT THE MIL BKS AND BELGIAN VILLAGE. RIFLE COY ELM ALSO PROV RRF.

(1) 63 AB CS SON RLC. DAY SPENT SERVICING VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT. IN ADDITION, PREPARATION FOR RECCES FOR THE BRITCON WITHDRAWAL WHICH WILL START IN DETAIL THIS WEEK.

(4) ENGINEER. THE EOD TEAM COMPLETED ONE TASK TODAY.

(5) 23 PFA. THE FST AT KIGEME HOSPITAL CARRIED OUT 2 SURGICAL PROCEDURES TODAY INCLUDING AN OPERATION ON A 21 YR OLD MALE CASEVACED FROM KIBEHO WITH A GUN SHOT WOUND TO THE SHOULDER. IT IS BELIEVED THIS WAS SUSTAINED WHILST RUNNING AWAY FROM THE RPA BUT NO FURTHER DETAILS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE MOMENT. DURING THE LAST 24 HRS 2 CAS WERE TREATED AND WITH 10 IN PATIENTS.

(5) 10 AB WKSP REME. ONE JOB COMPLETED WITHIN LAST 24 HRS, 51 JOBS IN HAND AND 10 VEHS STILL AWAITING SPARES FOR REPAIRS.

DAILY SITREP FOR 05 NOV 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. IN SECTOR 5, KABALI, A LOCAL MAN HAS REPORTED THAT A TEAM ARMED WITH RIFLES AND MACHETES KILLED ONE WOMAN, CUT ONE OTHER WOMAN'S LEG AND INJURED ANOTHER MAN IN KINIGI GR 5440.

B. AUSMED REPORTED AN INCIDENT WHICH OCCURRED BETWEEN AN RPA SOLDIER AND AUSMED DRIVER IN BUTARE. THE RPA SOLDIER ALLEGED THAT THE AUSMED DRIVER DROVE DOWN A STREET IN FRONT OF THE RPA BKS, IN THE WRONG DIRECTION. THE SOLDIER INITIALLY DEMANDED THAT THE AUSMED DRIVER WITH THE VEH COME WITH HIM TO RPA HQ. HE THEN DEMANDED THAT THE VEH BE HANDED OVER TO HIM. ALL SUCH DEMANDS WERE REFUSED AND THE TSG RRF WAS CALLED FOR. THE SOLDIER BECAME AGITATED WHEN ASKED FOR HIS NAME WHICH HE REFUSED TO PROVIDE. THE SITUATION WAS EVENTUALLY RESOLVED AND AUSMED TROOPS HAVE BEEN INSTRUCTED NOT TO TRAVEL IN THAT DIRECTION ON THAT ROAD.

C. THE LOCAL RPA COMD OF KIBUNGO INFORMED THE MILOB SECTOR COMD OF SECT 2 THROUGH A LETTER THAT THE DRIVER OF THE FUEL TANKER WAS RELEASED ON 05 NOV 94. HOWEVER, THE FUEL TANKER WOULD NOT BE RELEASED TILL INVESTIGATIONS WERE OVER. THE OWNER OF THE TANKER IS PERCEIVED BY THE RPA AS AN ENEMY. NEGOTIATIONS IN PROGRESS TO OBTAIN CONTENTS FOR UNAMIR'S USE.

D. THE BOURGMESTER OF GISHOMA GR 8211 (SECTOR 3) HELD A MEETING WITH LOCALS OF NYENJI GR 7907. TENSION IS STILL PREVAILING IN THE SECTOR DUE TO RECENT MASSACRE AND ROBBERIES.

E. IN SECTOR 4C, IT IS REPORTED THAT MISS CAROL TRICOCHÉ (HSF CO-ORDINATOR) RECEIVED A LETTER FROM A RWANDAN NATIONAL TO HOSPITAL STAFF THREATENING WITH A POSSIBLE ATTACK ON THE HOSPITAL ON 10 NOV 94. THE HSF CO-ORDINATOR HAS SINCE COMMUNICATED TO CO ETHIOBATT, LOCAL RPA COMMANDER AND LOCAL UNREO STAFF ABOUT THE SITUATION.

F. TAC HQ BUTARE AND SECTOR 3 GITARAMA REPORTED ON NOTICEABLE INCREASE IN VEHICULAR MOVEMENT OF TROOPS TO AND FROM KIGALI AND GIKONGORO AND THROUGH BUTARE TOWARDS BURUNDI BORDER INDICATING ROTATION OF UNITS AND REINFORCEMENTS OF UNITS IN PERCEIVED THREATENED AREAS.

A. MR O'MAHONEY WAS STILL IN CUSTODY AT 1800 HRS ON 03 NOV 94. ALL ATTEMPTS BY HEAD REP OF CONCERN TO MEET WITH GENDARMERIE COMMANDER TO NEGOTIATE RELEASE OF MR. O'MAHONEY WAS FRUITLESS. HAC WAS HOWEVER INFORMED THAT MS WONG, REP OF THE IRISH GOVT, HAS STEPPED IN.

B. THE TWO JOURNALISTS, WHO WERE ARRESTED BY RPA ON 27 OCT 94 HAVE BEEN SUBSEQUENTLY RELEASED AND LEFT URMULI HOTEL, GISENYI AT ABOUT 1730 HRS ON 02 NOV 94 FOR KIGALI.

ALL ATTEMPTS BY HEAD REPRESENTATIVE OF CONCERN TO MEET WITH GENDARMERIE COMMANDER TO NEGOTIATE RELEASE WERE UNSUCCESSFUL. HAC WAS INFORMED THAT A MS WONG WHO REPRESENTS THE IRISH GOVERNMENT HAS ATTEMPTED TO OBTAIN RELEASE OF THE PRISONER WITH UNAMIR RPA LO. AS THIS INCIDENT HAS NOW REACHED THE DIPLOMATIC LEVEL, CONCERN HAS BEEN ADVISED THAT HAC CONSIDERS THE CASE CLOSED AT HAC LEVEL.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. RPA CONTINUED TO MAINTAIN THEIR PRESENCE IN RUGABANO GR 4266 AND BIRAMBO GR 4763. THEY CONDUCTED PATROLS IN SECTION AND PLATOON LOTS IN THESE AREAS. ONE MR. MUCOVE ELIEL ACCUSED OF BEING AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF INTERAHAMWE WAS ARRESTED NI OF 29 OCT 94.

B. MR. SILAS NYANDWI FROM BUGARAMA GR 4329 REPORTED THAT HIS 20 YEAR OLD SON, THEOGENE MPORWIKI, WAS ARRESTED AT GIKONGORO MARKET BY SOME ELEMENTS OF RPA ON 26 OCT 94. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS ON REASONS FOR THE ARREST AND WHEREABOUT OF SON.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG MET THE COMMISSION OF EXPERTS FOR THE INVESTIGATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN RWANDA. HE INFORMED THEM OF DISCUSSIONS REGARDING THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, AND CONVEYED HIS IMPRESSIONS FROM HIS RECENT VISIT TO REFUGEE CAMPS IN NGARA. IN A SUBSEQUENT MEETING WITH THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA, MR. TWAGIRAMUNGU, THE SRSG DISCUSSED THE RETURN OF REFUGEES, EMERGENCY AID AND THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL. HE ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, MR. KACYURU, FOR PURPOSES OF DISCUSSING THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL AND THE FORTHCOMING VISIT OF THE UNDER-SECRETARY GENERAL FOR LEGAL AFFAIRS, MR. HANS CORELL. A MEETING WAS HELD BETWEEN THE SRSG AND THE AMBASSADOR OF GERMANY OF RWANDA, H.E. MR. HUMMEL, TO DISCUSS THE SRSG'S PROPOSED VISIT TO GERMANY. THE SRSG ENDED HIS DAY BY MEETING MR. CLARENCE, CHIEF OF OPERATIONS FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, TO DISCUSS HUMAN RIGHTS ISSUES IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED 4 PERSONS AT RUBONA GR 1022. NAMES OF PERSONS AND CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING ARRESTS UNDER INVESTIGATION.

(2) AT KIRAMBO GR 0444, A RPA SOLDIER WAS REPORTED TO HAVE SHOT AND KILLED A CIVILIAN ON THE BANK OF LAKE KIVU ON 01 NOV 94.

(3) RPA IN SECT 5 CONTINUED TO SHOW STRONG PRESENCE IN RUTAGARA AREA GR 2019 AND INCREASED PATROL ACTIVITIES.

(4) RPA TROOPS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED AND BEATEN ONE MSF WORKER AT KANAMA GR 2713 ON 01 NOV 94.

(5) RPA ARRESTED 3 UNIDENTIFIED PERS IN THE NDAHO AREA IN SECTOR 3 FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

C. MILITIA NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FC MET WITH MR. B. SMITH DIRECTOR FOR NEED THE CHILDREN ORGANISATIONS IN RWANDA. MR. SMITH INDICATED THAT HIS ORGANIZATION'S TEAM WAS COMING AND THEY WOULD BE LEAVING RWANDA ON 27 NOV 94. THE FC MET WITH COL. DEBRA CINDA AND MR. SMITH.

CONTROL OF HIS ORGANISATIONS IN RELATION WITH UNAMIR HQ. THE PLANNED MEETING OF THE FC AND SRSG WITH THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE DID NOT TAKE PLACE DUE TO THE UNAVAILABILITY OF THE MINISTER. THE FC FORMALLY REQUESTED IN WRITING FOR THE MTG TO TAKE PLACE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THE FC DECORATED TWO SOLDIERS, ONE FROM BRITCON AND ONE FROM CANADA, WHO ARE BEING MED EVAC IN A FEW DAYS TIME. THEY SUSTAINED THEIR INJURIES IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). RPA CONTINUED TO MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS AND CONDUCTED PTL IN SECT 1 AND 2B. NICOY REPORTED THAT ITS PTL TEAM CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLS AND MAINTAIN SY WITHIN BYUMBA AND KIBUNGO ENVIRONS. 51 LOCALS WERE GIVEN SPECIAL ASSISTANCE IN OWN MED CENTRE. UNHCR BUS WITH REG UNHCR 20102 LOADED WITH REFUGEES RAN INTO A DITCH IN KIBUNGO GR 762493 AT ABOUT 021815B, NOV 94. THERE WERE NO CAS. 360 ADULTS AND 168 CHILDREN RETURNED TO RUSUMO BORDER RWANDA.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY).

(1) SECTOR COMD AND ONE TEAM WENT TO KANYARU - HAUT/HASS GR 6392 IN KIGEMBE COMMUNE TO RECCE A SUITABLE AREA FOR THE DEPLOYMENT OF MALAWI COY. THEY WERE INFO BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT THE LOCALS HAD ORGANISED THEMSELVES INTO VIGILANTE GROUP AGAINST MILITIA AND BANDIT ATTACK. FIGURES OF REFUGEES COULD NOT BE OBTAINED DUE TO ABSENCE OF LOCAL RPA LOCAL COMMANDER.

(2) SENT PATROLS TO KIVUMU GR 7442, RUHASHYA GR 7026 AND KIGEME GR 7092.

(A) KIVUMU GR 7442, SIT IN THE AREA WAS CALM. THOUGH MANY PEOPLE HAVE NOT YET RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES. PEOPLE IN THE AREA ARE BUSY FARMING IN THEIR FIELDS.

(B) RUHASHYA GR 7026, SIT IN THE AREA WAS CALM AND THE PEOPLE ARE BUSY CLEARING THEIR FDS. THE PTLS WERE REFUSED ACCESS TO THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNE OFFICE BY THE BOURGMESTER. HE DEMANDED A CLEARING LETTER.

(C) KIGEME GR 7092, SIT IN THE AREA WAS CALM BUT MANY INHABITANTS OF THE AREA HAVE STILL NOT RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT, FOOT AND MOBILE PTLS IN AO IN BOTH SE AND SW RWANDA. PROVISION OF GDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CHANDE GR 5530. DEPLOYED 1 X NECH SECT EACH AT KATA AND KIBUNGO. FACTORIES CONTINUED.



MANNING OF ROAD BLOCKS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI CONTINUED. ELEMENTS OF PLATOON CO-LOCATED WITH OWN D COY HQ DESPATCHED TO RUKONDO GR 5538 AND MUSEBEYA GR 3933. 53 DPs GIVEN MED TREATMENT BY OWN MED STAFF AT MURAMBI GR 5128. PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ICRC RELIEF DISTRIBUTION AT KIBEHO GR 5007, MUNINI GR 4800, BUSANZE GR 4491 AND FOR CARITAS TO DO SAME AT KIRAMBI GR 6233.

(1) 07 RPA ELEMENTS TRIED TO ENTER DPs CAMP AT KADUHA BUT WERE DENIED ENTRY BY THE DPs WHO THREW STONES AT THEM. THE RPA PERS SOUGHT REFUGE IN FRAFATT PL LOC.

(2) AT 0030 HRS RPA PTL ARRIVED AT DPs CAMP AT BIRAMBO TO CONVINCE THEM TO MOVE TO THEIR HOMES. INFO RECEIVED INDICATED THAT THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE HAS BEEN REPLACED. CONDUCTED CHECK POINTS AND FOOT PATROLS AT MABANZA, MUFUMBEZI GR 2975, KIBUYE, KARONGI GR 3021, MUBUNGA AND MUGONERO GR 1958.

(3) 53 ORPHANS AT RUGABANO NEED ASSISTANCE BY WAY OF FOOD AND MEDICINES. THE CARETAKER OF THE ORPHANS HAS BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA WHO HAVE ALLEGED THAT THE CARETAKER WAS AN INTERAHAMWE. FRAFATT PL IN LOC IS LOOKING AFTER THE ORPHANS.

G. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). RPA HELD A MEETING WITH LOCAL ELDERMEN AT MURURU DPs CAMP AND LATER SEARCHED AND CONFISCATED 3 PAIRS OF MILITARY BOOTS, 1 MILITARY CANTEN AND 2 MILITARY UNIFORMS. TRANSPORTED 178 DPs FROM NYARUSHISHI TO GISAKURA, GAFUNZO, CYANGUGU BY OWN TRUCKS. MEDICAL TEAM TREATED 17 RWANDAN DENTAL PATIENTS AT KAMEMBE. CONTINUED MOBILE AND FOOT PATROLS DAY AND NIGHT IN AO. MANNED PERMANENT CHECKPOINTS AT PINDURA GR 1426, GISHOMA GR 8211, GAKINIST 8727, KIBUNGO GR 9638, MURURU DPs CAMP GR 7521 AND NYAGATARE GR 8024. 1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. THE TWO JOURNALISTS WHO WERE ARRESTED BY RPA ON 27 OCT 94 ARE STILL BEING HELD AT URMULI HOTEL, RUHENGARI.

B. COMMENCING FRI 04 NOV 94 AND SUBSEQUENTLY ON EVERY MONDAY, WED AND FRI, 400 REFUGEES WILL BE UPLIFTED BY UNHCR FROM BURUNDI TO KIBUNGO (SECTOR 2B). THESE ARE TUTSI REFUGEES DISPLACED BEFORE THE RECENT WAR.

C. UNHCR REP IN BUTARE REPORTED TO TAC HQ THAT THE LOCAL BURGERMASTER AND 10 RPA SOLDIERS HAD GONE TO MUKO CAMP, IN THE MORNING ON 01 NOV 94. INFORMATION GATHERED INDICATED THAT THEY WANTED SOME DPs FROM KIBUYE, WHO HAD JUST ARRIVED, TO LEAVE THE CAMP.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG SPENT MOST OF THE DAY VISITING REFUGEE CAMPS IN NGARA, TANZANIA. HE SPOKE WITH OFFICIALS FROM VARIOUS UN AGENCIES AND NGOS OPERATING IN THE CAMPS IN AN EFFORT TO EVALUATE THE SITUATION. UPON HIS RETURN TO KIGALI, HE MET WITH MR. URASA, MR. VAN HOVELL AND MR. MCCALLIN FROM UNHCR TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON THE CURRENT REFUGEE SITUATION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) LOCALS OF NDAGO GR 5201 COMPLAINED OF CONSTANT HARASSMENT BY RPA. THEY REPORTED ON SIX PEOPLE KILLED AT RUKO GR 5200. UPON INVESTIGATION BY A PTL FROM MALAWI COY, IT WAS CONFIRMED 4 PEOPLE WERE KILLED, ONE MAN WAS SEVERELY BEATEN WHILST HIS HANDS WERE TIED AND ONE 10 YEAR OLD BOY WAS SHOT IN THE ARM. THE INJURED BOY WAS TAKEN TO BRITCON CLINIC. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT TWO RPA SOLDIERS IN UNIFORM ATTEMPTED TO ABDUCT THE WIFE OF ONE OF THE DECEASED AND TWO CHILDREN BUT FLED INTO THE HILLS AFTER AN ANGRY CROWD FROM THE DPs CAMP TRIED TO ATTACK THEM. LOCALS IN THE CAMP VOWED NEVER TO RETURN TO THEIR VILLAGES AS LONG AS RPA REMAIN IN POWER AND THAT THEY WILL DEAL WITH ANY TUTSIS THEY SEE IN THE AREA.

(2) ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAD HELD A MEETING WITH LOCALS AT NORTH OF AIRPORT GR 7828 IN CYANGUGU ON 31 OCT 94 WHERE THEY WERE URGING THE PEOPLE NOT TO BE AFRAID OF THE RPA.

(3) NICOY REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE INCREASED IN STRENGTH AT ROAD BLOCKS.

(4) MILOBS REPORTED THAT AN RPA OFFICER CUT OFF POWER LINES WITHIN BUTARE AT GR 6913 FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

(5) A PATROL FROM MALAWI COY ESCORTING ELECTROGAZ WORKERS REPAIRING POWER LINES WITHIN BUTARE WAS STOPPED AT GR 6913 BY AN RPA OFFICER, HE TOLD THE PATROL NOT TO ESCORT NGO'S CLOSE TO RPA LOCATIONS, THEY SHOULD TRAVEL ON THEIR OWN:

COMMENT: UNAMIR TROOPS WILL CONTINUE TO ESCORT UN AGENCIES AND NGOS AS REQUIRED.

(6) REFERENCE INCIDENT AT RUTAGARA AREA GR 1919 ON NIGHT 29/30, RPA HAS ASKED LOCALS TO MOVE 1 KM INSIDE THE COUNTRY FROM THE BORDER LINE IN SECTOR 5. HOWEVER, PEOPLE WERE ALLOWED TO WORK IN THE FIELD BUT NOT

B. RGF NTR.

C. MILITIA MILOBS REPORTED THAT A LOCAL POLICE FROM BYAKABUYE WAS ARRESTED AND IMPRISONED. HE WAS PREVIOUSLY ARRESTED FOR BANDITRY AND IMPRISONED BUT LATER ESCAPED FROM PRISON WITH HELP FROM FELLOW POLICEMEN.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

HE LATER PAID A VISIT TO A LOCAL ORPHANAGE IN KABKAYE AND GITARAMA.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). SENT PTL TO KISARO 10 KM SW OF BYUMBA. ALCORD RELIEF (NGO) WERE OBSERVED DISTRIBUTING SOAP TO ABOUT 15000 LOCALS IN THE AREA. AN OFFICIAL CONFIRMED VARIOUS RELIEF MATERIALS WILL BE DISTRIBUTED IN THE AREA OVER THE NEXT WEEK. COY COMD VISITED BDE COMD AT MURAMBI TO DISCUSS POSSIBILITY OF DEPLOYING OWN TPS AT NYAGARARE, GATUNA AND MURAMBI GR 378570, GR 027422 AND GR 486013 RESPECTIVELY. BDE COMD SAID AUTHORITY FOR DEPLOYMENT OF TPS CAN ONLY COME FROM RWANDA, MINISTRY OF DEFENCE. NICOY ALTERNATIVE CAMP SITE RECOMMENDED BY RPA IS UNSUITABLE FOR DEPLOYMENT. 40 REFUGEES WERE BROUGHT TO KIBUNGO BY UNHCR FROM ZAIRE AND 103 REFUGEES WERE BROUGHT IN FROM TANZANIA. 66 LOCALS WERE GIVEN MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN OWN MEDICAL CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY ). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLS AND ASSURING SECURITY OF THE AREA OF OPERATION. MALAWI COY STILL MANNING UNAMIR CHECKPOINTS AT TAC HQ BOTH DAY AND NIGHT. PATROLS SENT TO FOLLOWING AREAS:

(1) BUSORO GR 9148 LOCALS ARE BUSY WORKING IN THEIR FIELDS ALTHOUGH STILL A GOOD NUMBER HAVE NOT RETURNED. THE SITUATION IS CALM AND THE LOCALS HAVE CONFIDENCE IN THE RPA. THERE ONLY MEDICAL FACILITY HAS NO DRUGS AND REQUIRES THEM URGENTLY.

(2) MURAMA GR 6648 THE SITUATION IS CALM AND LIFE IS GRADUALLY RETURNING TO NORMAL. THERE ARE STILL PLENTY OF VACANT HOUSES. CIVILIANS SEEM CONFIDENT WITH THE RPA'S SECURITY.

CONTINUED MANNING CP AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBA, RWAMIRO AND KITABI. LIFE IN NYAMATA GR 1061 IN SE RWANDA REPORTED BY PATROL TO BE NORMALISING. 72 DPs RECEIVED MED TREATMENT FROM GHANBATT MED STAFF AT MURAMBI. PROVIDED SECURITY FOR RELIEF DISTRIBUTION BY FEED THE CHILDREN AT GATOVU GR 4033 AND NYARUSIZA GR 5220.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFATT). PTL SENT OUT TO KIBUYE GR 674317, GISOVU, RUSHISHI AND KARONGI. 9 UNHCR TRUCKS WHICH ARRIVED IN KADUHA TO CARRY DPs LIFTED ONLY 18. THE OTHERS REFUSED TO BE MOVED. UTENSILS WERE DISTRIBUTED AT MOKO. BOURGMESTER WARNED DPs FROM GISOVU TO RETURN HOME.

KIBUYE. IT WAS REPORTED THAT 04 PEOPLE WERE KILLED AND  
MANY OF THEM WERE ARRESTED AT RUKON GR 526000 ON 31/01  
NOV 94. THE LOCALS BLAMED THE RPA FOR THE INCIDENT.  
MORE REPORTS TO FOLLOW. IT WAS REPORTED BY THE LOCALS  
ON 31 OCT 94 AT AROUND 1000 HRS 4 RPA SOLDIERS CAME TO  
KIBARA AND ARRESTED MR UWIMANA. ACCORDING TO THEM THE  
SAID PERSON WAS BROUGHT TO CYARATSI GR 6735 AND WAS  
KILLED THERE IN THE AFTERNOON ON THE SAME DAY.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT IN AND AROUND THE SECTOR, SECURITY SITUATION FOUND NORMAL. MILOB TEAM ESCORTED A CONVOY OF 10 TRUCKS FROM GIKONGORO TO KIBUYE.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. THE MDM VEHICLE NO IT 5249 STILL DETAINED BY RPA. THE ORGANIZATION INSIGNIA HAD BEEN SCRAPED OFF AND THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE WAS USING IT. THE FMO AND HIS DELEGATION WERE ESCORTED TO RUSIZI BORDER POST AND DIFFERENT LOCATIONS OF THE SECTOR.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT AT RUHENGERI, CYANIKA AND DIFFERENT BORDER POSTS, SECURITY SITUATION NORMAL. PIO, HR TEAM, NGOS AND PREFECT OF RUHENGERI HELD MEETING AND DISCUSSED ON HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR. (10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. A CONVOY OF 09 TRUCKS OF B AND R WAS ESCORTED FROM KIGALI TO KIBUYE. MILOB TEAM ESCORTED 40 DPs FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO AND RETURNED WITH 9 DPs. ANOTHER TEAM ESCORTED 18 DPs FROM KIGALI TO MUVUMBA (BYUMBA COMMUNE).

J. AUSMED. THE AUSMED SPT FORCE PROVIDED MED SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(1) AUST FORCE AT CHK TREATED 48 PATIENTS AND 7 DENTAL. CURRENTLY HOLDING 9 IN PATIENTS. PRI 2 CASEVAC CONDUCTED FROM GITARAMA. TROOPS OF THE TSG AT BUTARE TREATED 452 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 4 DENTAL PATIENT. CLINIC WERE CONDUCTED AT KIBEHO. WARD ROUNDS AT BUTARE HOSP ALSO CONDUCTED. IMMUNIZED 300 CHILDREN AND STAFF OF CARE AS ORPHANAGE FOR MENINGITIS. (1) MILOBS REPORTED THAT 3 FAMILIES WERE KILLED ON THE NIGHT OF 30 OCT 94. THE ATTACK HAPPENED IN THE VILLAGE OF RUTAGARA (GR 1920). A TOTAL OF 36 PEOPLE WERE KILLED BY PEOPLE WHO CAME FROM THE ZAIRIAN SIDE OF THE BORDER.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) FC WAS VISITED BY THE CANADIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER TO KENYA. HER EXCELLENCY MRS. LUCY EDWARDS. SHE WAS BRIEFED ON THE CURRENT STATUS OF UNAMIR, VISITED SECTOR 5 AND TOURED THE CANADIAN INSTALLATIONS AT THE AMAHORO STADIUM.

(3) FC HELD A MEETING WITH UNIT/SECTOR COMDS. EACH SECTOR COMD PRESENTED THEIR ASSESMENT OF THE SITUATION IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS. THEY HAVE ALL REPORTED INCREASED TENSION BETWEEN THEMSELVES, THE RPA AND THE POPULATION.

(4) FC HAD A WORKING LUNCHEON WITH MR. MEDILLI TO DISCUSS CURRENT STATUS OF HIS VISIT AND REVIEW THE

RECOMMENDATIONS HE WILL BE MAKING TO CAO STAFF.

(5) FINALLY, FC HELD A MEETING WITH THE COMMISSION OF EXPERT ON HUMAN RIGHTS AND DID PRELIMINARY WORK ON UPCOMING MEETING WITH THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). OWN PTL WENT TO MANYAGIRO AND KIVUYE GR 674317 AND GR 263355. AT MANYAGIRO'S CLINIC, PATIENTS WERE LYING ON THE FLOOR. THE DOCTOR CONFIRMED NON AVAILABILITY OF DRUGS AND BEDS. HE MENTIONED THAT THE MOST COMMON DISEASES IN THE AREA ARE MENINGITIS, CHOLERA, DIARRHEA, MALARIA AND SKIN DISEASES. AT KIVUYE, THE PTL MET WITH THE CHAIRMAN WHO CONFIRMED THAT APPROX TEN THOUSANDS RETURNEES ARE IN THIS AREA AND DUE TO THE NUMBER THEY HAVE MET WITH PROBLEMS OF ACCOMODATION AS MOST OF THE BUILDINGS WERE DESTROYED DURING THE WAR. THERE IS ALSO A SHORTAGE OF FOOD SINCE RELIEF MATERIALS HAVE NOT BEEN DISTRIBUTED THIS MONTH. THE CHAIRMAN ALSO CONFIRMED THAT ONLY ONE SCHOOL OUT OF FOUR WAS OPEN. MO DID AN EMERGENCY SURGERY ON A WOMAN WITH A RUPTURED UTERUS AT THE AMREF CLINIC. 162 LOCALS WERE GIVEN MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY ). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLS AND ASSURING SECURITY OF THE AREA OF OPERATION.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN AO IN BOTH SE AND SW RWANDA. A STANDING PTL DETAILED AT REMERA BORDER GR 4192. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CYANIKA GR 5530. MAINTAINED DEPLOYMENT OF 1 X MECH SECTION EACH AT THE MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. CONTINUED MANNING CP AT GIKONGORO, BURAMHA, RWAMIRO AND KITABI. PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ICRC RELIEF DISTRIBUTION AT MUNINI GR 4800, ALSO FOR AICF AND FEED THE CHILDREN AT CYANIKA GR 5530 AND GATOVU GR 4033.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFATT). CONTINUED FOOT PTL AND MANNED CHECK PTS. MSF CARRIED OUT VACCINATION CLINIC AT NUBUGA. MEDICAL STAFF ASSISTED A PREGNANT WOMAN. AFTER X-RAY AND FIRST AID SHE WAS TRANSPORTED TO GISEYNI HOSPITAL.

G. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT MOBILE AND FOOT PTLS IN AOR. MANNED CHECK PTS AT PINDURA GR 1426, GISHUMO GR 8211 AND ICIBINGO GR 9638. ALSO MANNED NEW CHK PTS AT MURURU DPs CAMP GR 7521 AND NYAGATARE GR 8124. CO ATTENDED FC CONFERENCE IN KIGALI. TRANSPORTED 267 FROM BUGARAMA GR 9007 TO NYAGATARE GR 8024 WITH UNIT TRUCKS. ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 197 DPs FOR BUTARE, FROM NYAGATARA GR 8024 TO KITABI GR 3520. THREE DPs DIED IN MURURU CAMP. DEPLOYED 1 X MECH PL AT MURURU DP CAMP GR 7521. 1 X MOTORIZED PL AT NYAGATARA CAMP GR 8024, 1 X MOTORIZED PL AT KIRAMBO DP CAMP GR 0444, 1 X MOTORIZED PL AT CYIMBOGO DP

CAMP GR 7619 AND COY HQ. TWO MOTORIZED PL AT NYARUSHISHI DP CAMP GR 8522. CONTINUED PROVISION OF GUARDS FOR UNREO GR 7724, CLOSE OBSERVATION OF HSF, MSF AND UNHCR OFFICES AND RESIDENCES.

H. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTL AND PROVIDE SECURITY IN AOR.

I. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS. SIT WAS GENERALLY CALM. HOWEVER, AUTOMATIC AND SINGLE RDS SMALL ARMS FIRE WERE HEARD IN CERTAIN SUBURBS OF KIGALI DURING NIGHT HOURS.

(1) BORDERS ALL BORDERS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD. THREE FAMILIES RESIDING IN RUTAGARA GR 1920 AND GR 1913 NEAR ZAIRE BORDER WERE MASSACRED ON NI 30/31 OCT 94 BY ARMED PERS FROM ZAIRE SIDE OF THE BORDER. 4 MEN, 6 WOMEN AND 26 CHILDREN WERE KILLED IN THE ATTACK PRESUMABLY BY THE MILITIA.

(2) MILOB GP HQ PLANNING, COORDINATING AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF MILOBS SECTORS CARRIED OUT.

(3) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. MILOB PATROLLED THE SECTOR AND REPORTED NORMAL ACTIVITIES IN THE VARIOUS COMMUNES.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. PTLs WERE CARRIED OUT TO RUSUMO BORDER POST. GASHORA, RUBAYA, RURENGE, SAKI AND KIBUNGO. SIT IS REPORTED CALM.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. MILOB PATROLS COVERED MASANGO GR 6254 MUKINGI GR 7181 AND MUGUSA. MILOBS VISITED GITARAMA PRISONS AND OBSERVED THAT THE NUMBERS OF PRISONERS HAS INCREASED FROM 1155 TO 1238. MILOBS MONITORED CONDITION OF ORPHANS IN MUGUSA AND REPORTED THAT 39 ORPHANS IN THE AREA NEED FOOD AND CLOTHING.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED BORDER PTLs AND ROAD RECCE IN RUNYOMBI GR 4892 AND OTHER PARTS OF THE SECTOR. MONITORED OP HOMEWARD AT KADUHA WHERE 9 TRUCKS WERE PROVIDED BUT ONLY 8 PERS WERE EVAC DUE TO RUMOURS THAT RPA ARE KILLING RETURNEES.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOBS PATROLLED GISOVU AREA AND REPORTED THAT SCHOOLS IN AREA WERE OPENED. LOCAL WERE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE RPA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. MILOB PATROLLED AREA OF GIKUNDAMBURA GR 9309 AND REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF APPROX 3000 REFUGEES FROM CIBITOKE PROVINCE OF BURUNDI. THEY HAVE FLED THE FIGHTING IN BURUNDI INTO RWANDA. THEY ARE HOWEVER IN DESPERATE NEED OF FOOD AND TENTAGE.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. PTLs WERE CARRIED OUT IN THE SECTOR. ONE TEAM INVESTIGATED AN AP MINE INCIDENT IN WHICH A 15 YEARS OLD BOY WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED ON BOTH LEGS. THIS INCIDENT HAPPENED 10 KM NORTH OF MUKAKA GR 7522. POSSIBILITY OF MORE MINES IN AREA.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CITY WAS RELATIVELY CALM. ALTHOUGH AUTOMATIC AND SINGLE RDS SA FIRE WERE HEARD IN SOME SUBURBS DURING THE NIGHT. SECT MILOBS ESCORTED 2 X UNHCR TRUCKS WITH 78 DPs TO KIBUNGO AND EVACUATED 4 AND 37 DPs FROM THE KIBONGO AREA TO RUSORORO. TWO OTHER MILOB TEAMS ESCORTED UNHCR TRUCKS WITH 8 AND 39 DPs TO NYAMATA AND GASHORA RESPECTIVELY. THE NYAMATA TEAM ESCORTED 15 DPs FROM NYAMATA AREA TO KIGALI.

J. AUSMED.

(1) AUST FORCE AT CHK TREATED 30 PATIENTS AND 8 DENTAL. CURRENTLY HOLDING 8 IN PATIENTS. TSG AT BUTARE TREATED 208 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 1 DENTAL PATIENT. CLINIC WERE CONDUCTED AT KIBEHO AND SAVE. WARD ROUNDS AT BUTARE HOSP AND VACCINATION FOR MENINGITIS AT CARE ORPHANAGE WERE ALSO CONDUCTED.

(2) COL WALLACE AND TEAM FROM TSG BUTARE WILL VISIT SOUTH AND WEST RWANDA TOMORROW. AN RPA OFFR WAS DENIED ACCESS TO OUR BKS YESTERDAY. (3) THE RRF WAS DEPLOYED TO AN INCIDENT IN KICUKIRO AREA REPORTED BY A MILOB. AFTER BEING STOP AND DELAYED AT A ROAD BLOCK, THE RRF DROVE THROUGH IT TO GAIN ACCESS TO THE AREA OF THE INCIDENT. THE RRF WAS NOT ABLE TO LOCATE THE MILOB AND BECAME SURROUNDED BY THREE RPA VEH AND APPROX 30 TROOPS WITH TWO RPG. SIT WAS TENSE AND THE RPA REFUSED THE VEHICLE TO MOVE UNTIL RPA LO ARRIVED.

K. BRITCON. THE MASS GRAVE AT CYANICA CONTINUE TO CAUSE CONSIDERABLE CONCERN AND A SIGNIFICANT HEALTH RISK. SOIL EROSION CONTINUES, EXPOSING MORE AND MORE HUMAN REMAINS WHICH ARE NOW BEING ATTACKED BY DOGS. WE ARE STILL AWAITING PERMISSION FROM HRFO AND BBGNU TO PROCEED WITH NEUTRALIZING THIS SITE WITH LIME AND SOIL.

DAILY SITREP FOR 30 SEP 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. AT 0300 HRS THIS MORNING APPROXIMATELY 12 SHOTS WERE HEARD IN THE AREA OF THE PRISON IN BUTARE. THE RPA CLAIM THAT THEY PREVENTED AN ESCAPE AND THAT THERE WERE NO DEAD OR WOUNDED.

B. THE PROBLEM OF TAC HQ GAINING ACCESS TO THE MSF HOSPITAL IN BUTARE YESTERDAY HAS BEEN PASSED TO THE RPA LO AND HE HOPES TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

C. A UNHCR VEHICLE WAS STOPPED AND SEARCHED AT AN RPA CHECKPOINT EAST OF GIKONGORO. THE VEHICLE WAS ALLOWED TO PROCEED. THE RPA LO AT TAC HQ SPOKE TO HIS HIGHER FORMATION IN GIKONGORO ABOUT STOPPING UNHCR VEHICLES SO THE PROBLEM MAY BE RESOLVED.

D. THE BORDER CROSSING POINTS INTO UGANDA, TANZANIA AND BURUNDI WERE ALL OPEN TO UNAMIR TRAFFIC. THE BORDER CROSSING POINT GISENYI-GOMA INTO ZAIRE REMAINS CLOSED TO UNAMIR.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION MET WITH THE PRIME MINISTER TO DISCUSS THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA AND TO OFFER ASSISTANCE FOR HIS UPCOMING VISIT TO CANADA. THE

FORCE COMMANDER AGREED TO TRANSMIT THE LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE OF THE PRIME MINISTER'S ITINERARY.

B. HE THEN MET WITH A FRENCH DELEGATION LED BY MR. JACQUES COURBIN, CHEF D'ANTENNE DIPLOMATIQUE, IN KIGALI TO DISCUSS THE POLITICAL, MILITARY AND HUMANITARIAN SITUATION IN RWANDA.

C. THE FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH UNREO AND UNHCR AND OTHER UN AGENCIES AND NGOS TO ENCOURAGE A SPIRIT OF TEAMWORK AND COOPERATION AMONG ALL WORKING IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA

(1) THE RPA REPORT INSECURITY IN THE RUHENGARI AREA. THE RPA ARE STILL SEARCHING FOR FORMER RGF TROOPS IN THE AREA AND ARE ARRESTING ABOUT 15 SOLDIERS PER WEEK. TO DATE 2 FORMER RGF HAVE BEEN KILLED BY THE RPA WHEN THEY OFFERED ARMED RESISTANCE.

(2) GHANBATT REPORT THAT THE RPA HAVE HELD MEETINGS WITH CAMP LEADERS IN KIBEHO (GR 5007) AND WITH LOCAL PEOPLE IN MUGANZA (GR 4305). IT IS ASSESSED THAT THESE MEETINGS ARE ATTEMPTS BY THE RPA TO CALM THE FEARS OF THE LOCAL POPULATION IN ORDER TO PERSUADE THEM TO STAY IN THEIR HOMES AND TO TRY TO PERSUADE THE OCCUPANTS OF THE CAMPS TO RETURN HOME.

(3) IN PREPARATION FOR A PARADE AND RELATED FESTIVITIES TO COMMEMORATE RPA ENTRY INTO RWANDA ON 01 OCT 1990, AT 0600 HRS THIS MORNING AN RPA CONVOY, WAS SEEN MOVING FROM EAST TO WEST ALONG AVENUE DU LAC MUHAZI IN THE AREA OF THE PARLIAMENT BUILDING. THE CONVOY CONSISTED OF 7 VEHICLES: 2 X PANHARD M11 RECCE VEHICLES, 4 X ASSORTED LORRIES AND 1 X TRACTOR. THE VEHICLES WERE TOWING 1 X D30, 1 X MULTI BARRELLED ROCKET LAUNCHER, 1 X 120MM MORTAR. IN ADDITION 2 OF THE LORRIES WERE FITTED WITH ZPU-2 ANTI AIRCRAFT GUNS.

B. RGF. FORMER RGF TROOPS LOCATED AT CAMP KITALI CREATED UNREST AND HARRASSMENT OF NGOS AND REFUGEES. UNCONFIRMED REPORTS OF SHOOTINGS AND DEATHS. ALL NGOS HAVE LEFT THIS CAMP REPORTEDLY FOR UGANDA AND RWANDA

C. MILITIA NOTHING OF SIGNIFICANCE TO REPORT.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. STAFF BRIEF WAS CONDUCTED AT 0800 HRS.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS UP TO MULINDI, GATUNA BORDER AND BYUMBA AREA. RECEIVED THE VISIT OF NIGERIA JOURNALIST. RPA CONTINUED TO PTL AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS WITHIN THE AREA. NGOS OBSERVED DISTRIBUTING RELIEF AID AT RURENBO.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBAT AND ONE PL CANCON). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY). CONDUCTED SECURITY PATROLS IN SECTION STR AROUND MUYIRA GR 8639 AND NTYAZO GR 8231. IT OBSERVED THAT THE AREA WAS QUIET ALTHOUGH THERE WAS ONE REPORT OF THEFT. THE CULPRITS CAPTURED AND HELD AT AN RPA CAMP GR 8631. THE PTLs ALSO REPORTED THAT THE INHABITANTS FELT MORE SECURE SEEING UNAMIR FORCES IN THE AREA AND THAT THE AREA REQUIRED FOOD AND MED AID.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED A SECTION ESCORT AND GUARDS FOR RPA MEETING WITH CAMP LEADERS AT KIBEHO GR 5007. MINISTER OF INDUSTRIES VISITED KITABI TEA FACTORY.

(2) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND RELIEF DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA, GR 5630. MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES CONTINUED TO BE GUARDED BY 1 X MECH SECTION EACH. CONTINUED TO MAN PERMANENT ROAD BLOCKS AT GIKONGORO GR 5127, RURAMBA GR 3717, RWAMIKO GR 4913 AND KITABI GR 3520.

(3) LOCALS OF SEKERA GR 4234 AND NYAMIYANGA (NEAR SEKERA) REPORTED GREN EXPLOSIONS AT 292000B AND 292100B SEP 94 RESPECTIVELY. THERE WAS NO CASUALTY. INVESTIGATION ONGOING.

(4) 115 DPs GIVEN TREATMENT BY OWN MEDICAL STAFF AT MURAMBI GR 5128. PROVIDED SY FOR ICRC RELIEF DISTRIBUTION AT NDAGO GR 4402 AND KAMANA GR 5197.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONDUCTED PATROLS AND ROAD BLOCKS WITHIN AO. HUMANITARIAN OFFICER OF FRAFBATT HELD A MEETING WITH MILOB, NGOS AND PREFECT OF AREA. NEW BOURGMESTER OF KIBUYE HAS ARRIVED, NAME WILL BE SENT ON NEXT SITREP.

G. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS AT NYARUSHASHI GR 8522, SHARA GR 9010, BUGARAMA GR 8907, KAMEMBE GR 7826, GAFUNZO GR 9035, GISAKURA GR 9829, NYAMASHAKI GR 9871, KILIMKI GR 1047 AND KITABI GR 3120. PROVIDED ESCORT AND SECURITY AROUND GISAKURA TEA FACTORY FOR THE VISIT OF THE AGRICULTURE MINISTER. OWN MED STAFF TREATED 14 DENTAL PATIENTS. TRANSPORTED 110 REFUGEES FROM BUGARAMA TO THE NEW TRANSIT/NYAGATARE WITH OWN TRUCKS AND FED ABOUT 60 DPs IN SAME AREA.

(2) IN SECTOR 2, MILOB CARRIED OUT PTLs AND MONITORED THE SIT ALONG THE TANZANIA BORDER. MOVEMENT OF FEW PERS IN AND OUT RWANDA WAS OBSERVED. ONE MILOB TEAM CONDUCTED PTLs TO RILIMA GR 6125 AND GASHORA GR 2756.

(3) IN GITARAMA AREA, MILOBS ESCORTED 77 RETURNEES FROM BUTARE AND HANDED OVER TO GITARAMA MILOBS WHO CONTINUED TO KIBUYE. PTLs ASSESSED CONDITION OF ROAD BUTARE - GISHAVU GR 6505 AND CONDUCTED INITIAL RECCE FOR THE SALVATION ARMY RELIEF TEAM.

APART FROM KIBUYE AND GISHYITA ALL SCHOOLS IN THE AREA WERE REPORTED CLOSED. 73 DISPLACED PERSONS WERE ESCORTED FROM BUTARE TO GISHYITA. SECTOR COMD HELD A MEETING WITH ALL NGOS OPERATING IN THE AREA AND 59 RPA BN COMD, ISSUES DISCUSSED WERE NGO OPS, SECURITY AND HUMANITARIAN OPS. MR MUSFILI JEROME HAS BEEN APPOINTED THE NEW BOURGMESTER FOR GITESI COMMUNE.

(6) IN CYANGUGU AREA, PTLs CONDUCTED AT YAMASHEKE GR 9841 AND KIRAMBO AREA. 1,200 DPs REQUIRE TRANSPORT FROM KIRAMBO GR 0444 TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES. IT WAS OBSERVED THAT MOST OF THE DPs ARE LIVING UNDER VERY DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS DUE TO LACK OF TENTAGE. ONE MILOB TEAM SUPERVISED REPATRIATION OF 86 REFUGEES FROM BUGARAMA TO CYANGUGU.

(7) IN GISENYI, CARRIED OUT PTLs ALONG GISENYI BORDER POST, RUHengeri, CYANIKA, KIDAHU GR 7247, BUTARO GR 8243, KIRAMBO GR 8335, BUSHOKA GR 7223, NYARUTOVU GR 7718, TARE GR 9109, SHYRONGI GR 9894, GISENYI REFUGEE

CAMP IN THE FOREST NATURELLE GR 3809 AND MUKAMIRA GR 4521.

J. AUSMED. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MED SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SUPPORT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA. FORCES AT CHK TREATED 149 PATIENTS AND 5 DENTAL CASES. TROOPS AT THE TSG BUTARE CONDUCTED CLINICS AT SAVE TOWNSHIP AND KIBEHO CAMP TREATING 734 PATIENTS AND 25 DENTAL PATIENTS. MED TEAM VISITED KIBUNGO AND RIFLE COY ELM CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT MIL ACADEMY (BKS), BELGIAN VILLAGE AND KING FAISAL HOSP. ENGR ELMS CONDUCTED EOD TASKS AROUND KIGALI.

K. BRITCON.

(1) TEN BEDFORD TRUCKS WERE TRANSFERRED TO TUNBATT CONTROL AT THE REQUEST OF UNAMIR HQ. 5,000 BLANKETS MOVED FROM KIGALI TO RUHENGIRI FOR THE AID AGENCY CARE. EIGHT TONS OF AID WAS DELIVERED TO GIKONGORO FOR UNICEF.

(2) ENGINEERS. THE WORK TO LAY WATER PIPING TO THE MUKONO CLINIC IN THE BYUMBA PREFECTURE CONTINUES AND A FURTHER 20M WAS LAID TOWARDS THE RESERVOIR TANK HILL. ROUTINE TASKS IN THE 23 PFA AREA OF OP ARE ONGOING WITH ONE SECTION ON ROUTE MAINTENANCE, SECTIONS RUNNING A STANDARD WATER PURIFICATION UNITS AT KIBEHO AND CAMP 204, ONE SECTION ON SANITATION AND FENCING DUTIES AT CYANIKA AND PLANT WORKING ON M113 LOADING RAMPS FOR GHANBATT. EOD TEAM HAS NOW COMPLETED TASK AT THE PROPOSED HQ LOC FOR TUNBATT IN GISENYI. THE UXOs ALSO PERFORMED THE FOL TASK, 87 X MOR VARIOUS, 27 X SHELLS VARIOUS, 1 X M26 RIFLE GREN AND 50,000 X SAA WILL BE DUMPED IN LAKE KIVU.

(3) WORKSHOPS. DURING THE PERIOD, WKSP COMPLETED 5 JOBS, 63 OTHER JOBS IN HAND AND 16 VEHS STILL AWAITING SPARES FOR REPAIRS.

(4) RPTR SP TO SECTOR 5 (CH 10) AND FRAFBATT BOTH WENT N/S LATE LAST NIGHT. IN THE CASE OF FRAFBATT, IT IS NOW THE FIFTH TIME THAT THE RPTR SP THIS PARTICULAR UNIT HAS TO BE FIXED OR REPLACED. WHILE OTHER RPTR SEEM TO PERFORM FINE (CH 7, 12, 14, ETC) OTHERS ARE PLAGUED WITH MALFUNCTIONS.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. HAC ARRANGED RETURN OF TWO MERCEDES 911 TRUCKS TO THE NGO SOLITARITE IN GIKONGORO. THE TWO TRUCKS HAVE BEEN CEASED BY RPA 8 DAYS AGO. 1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. MOVEMENT OF DISPLACED PEOPLE (DPs) FROM SECTOR 4 CONTINUE TO STALL AND THE SITUATION IS BECOMING MORE TENSE WITH ANTI-RPA PROPAGANDA EMANATING FROM RADIO BROADCASTS AND RUMOURS GROWING IN CAMPS.

B. UNHCR VEHICLES HAVE RECENTLY BEEN A VICTIM OF HARASSMENT ACTION AT RPA CHECK POINTS IN SECTOR 4.

C. RPA ACTIVITIES IN SECTOR 4 CONTINUE TO INCREASE AND MANY DPs CONTINUE TO BELIEVE THEY WILL NOT BE SECURE IF THEY MOVE OUT OF THEIR CAMPS.

D. THE BOURGMESTERS IN SECTOR 4A ARE APPREHENSIVE OF RPA ARRESTS OF OTHER BOURGMESTERS. IT IS BECOMING DIFFICULT TO FIND THEM WHEN NEEDED.

E. SCHOOLS CONTINUE TO OPEN IN KIGALI AND MANY PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE GOVERNMENT CONTINUE TO OPEN SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY (KIGALI, RUHENGARI) WITH THE SUPPORT OF UNICEF. UNAMIR HAS ALSO PROVIDED ASSISTANCE TO THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION IN THIS REGARD.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA. CONTINUED TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN KIGALI AND IN MANY PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. CONDUCTED PATROLS ALONG RWANDA-ZAIRE AND BURUNDI BORDERS.

(1) RPA GDS AT KIGEME GR 7093 STOPPED MILOB TEAM FROM BUTARE ON ITS WAY TO KANYARU-BAS AND INDICATED THAT THERE IS A MILITARY CAMP ON THE WAY WHICH IS OUT OF BOUNDS TO UNAUTHORISED PERSONNEL.

(2) AT 291940 HRS RPA COY COMD IN SECTOR 4C WAS REFUSED TO CONDUCT SEARCH IN CAMP FOR DPs AT RUGABIRO GR 4268. DPs WHO REFUSED THE SEARCH WERE ARMED WITH MATCHETES.

(3) A PASTOR NAMED BEA AND TWO OTHER MEN WERE ARRESTED AND WILL BE TRANSPORTED TO KIBUYE. ACCORDING TO BOURGMESTER OF GISOVU THE PASTOR WAS HIDING IN NYUNGWE FOREST AT GR 2345.

(4) MR GARY BENNET OF BAPTIST MISSION IN KIGALI REPORTED THAT HIS NIGHT GUARD WAS TAKEN AWAY FROM HIS HOME BY RPA ON NIGHT OF 5 SEP 94. HIS FAMILY HAS NOT SEEN HIM SINCE.

(5) AN RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED IN THE LOWER RIGHT LEG AT 292120B SEP 94 BY A BLAST SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY A BOOBY-TRAP. HE HAS SINCE BEEN AMPUTATED ABOVE THE KNEE AT KIBUNGO IMC HOSP.

(6) A SECTION OF RPA IN MUGANZA (GR 4305) WERE FORCED TO FIRE WARNING SHOTS TO EXTRICATE THEMSELVES FROM A CROWD WHEN THEY ATTEMPTED TO ARREST A FORMER RGF SOLDIER. 1 WOMAN WAS INJURED IN THE SHOULDER AND THE FORMER SOLDIER ESCAPED.

(7) 3 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED BY RPA ON 16 SEP 94. THE VEH IN WHICH THEY WERE TRAVELLING, IS NOW BEING USED BY RPA IN CYANGUGU GEN AREA. THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE ARRESTED PERS IS UNKNOWN.

(8) A UNHCR CONVOY TRAVELLING FROM CYANGUGU TO BUTARE WAS STOPPED BY AN RPA CHECKPOINT IN THE VICINITY OF GR 4725. THE RPA AT THE CHECKPOINT STATED THAT THEY HAD SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS TO SEARCH UNHCR VEHICLES. A THOROUGH SEARCH WAS CARRIED OUT AND THE CONVOY WAS ALLOWED TO PROCEED.

(9) RPA GUARDS AT THE MSF HOSPITAL IN BUTARE REFUSED ACCESS TO TAC HQ PERSONNEL ON TWO OCCASIONS YESTERDAY.

TAC HQ WILL ATTEMPT TO CLARIFY THE REASONS FOR THE REFUSAL OF ACCESS.

B. RGF. IT HAS BEEN REPORTED THAT RGF TROOPS FORMERLY IN THE GOMA AREA HAVE NOW MOVED TO BUKAVU. ANOTHER REPORT STATES THAT THE FORMER RGF TROOPS HAVE MOVED FROM THE CAMPS FURTHER INTO ZAIRE WHERE THEY HAVE ESTABLISHED THEIR OWN CAMPS IN AN EFFORT TO QUALIFY FOR HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE.

C. MILITIA. THE MOVEMENT OF THE RGF FROM THE CAMPS HAS LED TO THE STRENGTHENING OF THE POSITION OF INTERAHAMWE WITHIN THE CAMPS. WHEN UNHCR ATTEMPTED TO MOVE A GROUP OF REFUGEES FROM SCHOOL BUILDINGS, BEING USED AS ACCOMMODATION, INTERAHAMWE LEADERS STARTED A RIOT BY CLAIMING THAT THE PEOPLE WERE TO BE TRANSPORTED TO RWANDA. 4 PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN THE RIOT.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. STAFF BRIEF WAS CONDUCTED AT 0800 HRS.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS ALONG THE AREA RUTARE, NYAWSENGE, RWANKUBA, MURAMBI, KIZIGURO. SCHOOLS CONTINUED TO OPEN FOR CLASSES. DISPENSARY IN RUTARE IS REPORTED TO HAVE RUN OUT OF DRUGS AND THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF WATER IN THE AREA. 65 TROOPS ARRIVED AT KIA AT 291600B SEP 94. ICRC AND CRS DISTRIBUTED FOOD AT RUSHAKI AND RUTARE RESPECTIVELY.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBAT AND ONE PL CANCON). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY). PROVIDED TRUCKS AND ESCORTED 30 AND 40 DPs FROM GITARAMA TO MASANGO GR 6154 AND KIBUYE RESPECTIVELY. CONTINUED TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CONDUCT PATROLS IN AREA OF OPERATION.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN AOR.

(1) SIX CRIMINALS SUSPECTED OF MURDER AND OTHER ACTS OF BANDITRY WERE ARRESTED AND HANDED OVER TO THE PREFECT OF GIKONGORO.

(2) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND RELIEF DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA, KAMANA GR 5197 AND NDAGO GR 4402. MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES CONTINUED TO BE GUARDED BY 1 X MECH SECTION EACH. CONTINUED TO MAN PERMANENT ROAD BLOCKS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI.

(3) BN 2IC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO NEW PLATOON LOCATION AT RILIMA GR 2561 IN SOUTH EASTERN RWANDA.

(4) 116 DPs GIVEN TREATMENT BY UNIT MEDICAL STAFF AT



MURAMBI GR 5128. A SECTION OF RPA FIRED SHOTS IN THE AIR TO EXTRICATE THEMSELVES AFTER THEY HAD FAILED TO ARREST A FORMER RGF SOLDIER. THE SOLDIER HAD ESCAPED AFTER AGREEING THAT HE WOULD JOIN RPA.

(5) AT MUTOVU GR 4103 A MAN SUSTAINED INJURIES AFTER A GREN WAS LOBBED INTO HIS HOUSE BY AN UNIDENTIFIED PERSON. THE VICTIM HAS SINCE BEEN SENT TO KIGEME HOSP.

G. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS. 1 X GREN WAS RECOVERED IN A FIELD NEAR STADIUM AT GR 7725. ONE IOM VEH WITH 33 REFUGEES WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT AT BUNAZI GR 8728 RESULTING IN 20 REFUGEES BEING INJURED, TWO OF WHICH WERE SERIOUS CASES. THEY WERE EVACUATED TO KAMEMBE HOSP. PROVIDED SECURITY TO GUARD ACCIDENT VEH. TRANSPORTED 256 REFUGEES FROM BUGARAMA TO A NEW TRANSIT CAMP AT NYGATARA. UNIT MED STAFF TREATED 14 RWANDESE DENTAL PATIENTS. SOUND OF SHOTS WERE HEARD IN BUKAVU IN ZAIRE.

H. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT NOT YET ARRIVED). SEE MILOB REPORT.

I. MILOB GP. CMO PAID STAFF VISIT TO KIBUNGO TO SEE THE DEPLOYMENT OF MILOBS. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS.

TPS OF THE TSG CONDUCTED CLINICS AT BUSORO TOWNSHIP AND KIBEHO CAMP TREATING 822 PATIENTS AND 16 DENTAL PATIENTS. RIFLE COY ELM CONDUCTED SECURITY OPS AT THE MIL ACADEMY (BKS), BELGIAN VILLAGE AND KING FAISAL HOSP.

K. BRITCON.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) IN SECTOR 4A APPEAR TO BE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT RETURNING TO THEIR HOMES DUE TO RUMOURS CIRCULATING WITHIN CAMPS AND RADIO BROADCASTS POSSIBLY EMANATING FROM BURUNDI ASKING DPs NOT TO GO BACK HOME.

B. APPREHENSION CONFIRMED BY UNHCR BURUNDI THAT ABOUT 1,800 PEOPLE HAVE CROSSED INTO BURUNDI FROM GITARAMA AND BUTARE SINCE LAST FEW DAYS. NO REASONS FOR MIGRATION HAVE BEEN DETERMINED. HOWEVER SENSE OF UNEASE WITH THE RPA AND THEIR ABILITY TO PROVIDE SECURITY APPEAR TO BE THE MAIN ISSUES.

C. INFORMATION RECEIVED INDICATES THAT BOURGMESTERS IN SECTOR 4A ARE BECOMING SCARED, FOLLOWING THE ARREST OF THE BOURGMESTERS OF RWAMIKO GR 497128 AND NSHILI GR 396965. BOURGMESTERS ASSIST IN THE DAILY ADMINISTRATION OF THEIR AREAS AND RPA MUST BE CAREFUL NOT TO BREAKDOWN LOCAL ADMINISTRATION.

D. OP HOMEWARD LOST MOMENTUM COMPLETELY AS A RESULT OF RUMOURS OF RPA ACTIVITIES OUTSIDE AND INSIDE THE SECTOR. THE OPERATION WAS SUSPENDED ON 28 SEP 94 AS SURVEY ON 27 SEP 94 IN ONE SELECTED CAMP TO DETERMINE PEOPLE WISHING TO BE MOVED DID NOT SHOW A POSITIVE RESULT. HOWEVER THE OPERATION MAY RESUME ON A SMALLER SCALE ON 29 SEP 94 WITH THE HELP OF UNHCR.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS WERE DEPLOYED TODAY IN KIBUNGO, GITARAMA AND BUTARE. THE UNAMIR PROVIDED THEM WITH LOGISTICAL SUPPORT, AND MILITARY OBSERVERS IN THE FIELD WILL PROVIDE THEM WITH THE ASSISTANCE AS REQUIRED.

B. THE UNHCR RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE AND THE UNHCR DEPUTY



SPECIAL ENVOY HAD DISCUSSION WITH UNAMIR SENIOR OFFICIALS, INCLUDING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ON MODALITIES FOR INCREASED COOPERATION AND EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION BETWEEN UNAMIR AND UNHCR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS AND SNAP ROAD BLOCKS IN KIGALI AND ALL THE SECTORS:

(1) RPA TPS IN SECTOR 2A WANT CLEARANCE FROM HIGH COMMAND BEFORE UNAMIR TPS WILL BE GRANTED FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT IN THE SUB SECTOR.

(2) RPA ACTIVITY IN SECTOR 4C WAS REPORTED TO BE INCREASING; THESE ACTIVITIES INCLUDE INDISCRIMINATE SEARCH AND ARRESTS, SEIZURE OF PROPERTY, INTIMIDATION AND HARASSMENT OF THE LOCAL POPULATION. THE LOCALS ARE SCARED OF THE MYSTERIOUS DISAPPEARANCE OF PROMINENT MEMBERS OF THEIR COMMUNITIES. ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL ACTIVITIES HAVE ALSO BEEN DISRUPTED BY RPA ACTIONS IN SOME AREAS.

(3) RPA BN COMD LT COL TURAGARA ADDRESSED ABOUT 6,000 LOCAL PEOPLE AT THE KIBUYE STADIUM. HE EXPLAINED GOVT POLICY AND USED THE OCCASION TO ATTEMPT TO INSTILL CONFIDENCE IN THE POPULATION. MED TEAM TREATED 13 DENTAL PATIENTS.

H. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT NOT YET ARRIVED). SEE MILOB REPORT.

I. MILOB GP. COORDINATION, MONITORING OF MILOBs ACTIVITIES AND ASSISTANCE TO NGOS AND UNREO WERE CARRIED OUT. ROUTINE PTLs AND ESCORT DUTIES WERE ALSO CARRIED OUT IN ALL SECTORS. MILOB PTLs MONITORED RPA MEETING WITH LOCALS AT KIBUYE STADIUM. MILOBs SECTOR COMD OF SECTOR 4A AND THE HAT ATTENDED THE REGULAR WEEKLY MEETING WITH NGOS WORKING IN THE SECTOR. DPs AT MUGANZA GR 4303, GISORORO GR 4816, KIVU GR 4410 MURAMBI 4408 LEAVING IN SCHOOLS HAVE BEEN MOVED TO MUNINI CAMP GR 478998. MILOB SECTOR 5 CONTACTED THE SECURITY DIRECTOR OF THE ADVENTIST UNIVERSITY MUTURA GR 3022 AND RECEIVED PERMISSION FOR TUNBATT TO DEPLOY ONE COMPANY WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS. TWO MILOB TEAMS IN SECTOR 5 CARRIED OUT RECCE/INVESTIGATION IN THE AREA OF NYAMYUMBA GR 2000 AND KIMUVU GR 2303 FOR CHECKING THE ROADS FOR A POSSIBLE EVACUATION IN THIS DIRECTION AND INVESTIGATED REPORTS ABOUT KILLINGS IN THAT AREAS. ICRC WILL DISTRIBUTE FOOD IN NKUMBA AREA ON 30 SEP 94. A TOTAL OF 48 RETURNEES ENTERED RWANDA VIA CYANIKA, ANOTHER 539 RETURNEES ENTERED RWANDA VIA BORDER POSTS 1, 2, 3 AND AROUND GISENYI. ONE MILOB TEAM CONTACTED THE BOURGMESTER AT MUYRA GR 8639 AND MANAGED TO SPEAK TO SOME OF THE RETURNEES WHO HAD TRAVELLED AS PART OF OP HOMEWARD. THEY SEEMED TO HAVE INTEGRATED WELL. HOWEVER THERE IS A NEED FOR

HUMANITARIAN AID. REPORTS INDICATED THAT CIVS WORKING WITH NGOS AND OTHER AGENCIES REFUSE TO WORK FOR FEAR OF RPA HARASSMENT AND POSSIBLE ARREST IN SOME AREAS.

J. AUSMED. AUS MED SUPPORT FORCE PROVIDED MED SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SUPPORT THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA. AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 67 PATIENTS AND 6 DENTAL PATIENTS AND CURRENTLY HOLDING 13 IN PATIENTS. TSG AT BUTARE CONDUCTED CLINICS AT RARANZIGI, SAVE TOWNSHIP AND KIBEHO CAMP TREATING 635 PATIENTS AND 23 DENTAL PATIENTS. RIFLE COY ELMS PROVIDED SECURITY OPS AT MILITARY ACADEMY (BKS), BELGIAN VILLAGE, KING FAISAL HOSP. DURING THE PERIOD 5 X CIV CAS AND 5 X GUARDIANS MOVED FROM BUTARE TO CHK. AUSMED HAS BEEN WAITING FOR 13 TONS OF STORES FROM NAIROBI FOR THE LAST TWO DAYS . THESE STORES HAVE BEEN PRIORITIZED TO ENSURE THAT VITAL MEDICAL STORES ARE AVAIL FOR OUR SURGEONS. CURRENTLY THEY DO NOT HAVE NEEDLES TO SEW UP A CHEST THAT HAS HAD TO BE OPENED, NOR CAN THEY REPAIR A GUNSHOT WOUND TO A LUNG, AS TWO EXAMPLES. GEN OPINION IS CIV NUMBERS ARE DECREASING IN CAMP SINCE RPA BUILD UP IN AREA.

ROOF REPAIRS AT THE AUSCON HOSP CONTINUED. CURRENTLY AWAITING MASTIC TO FINISH TASK. RECCE OF POTENTIAL TUNBATT LOC AT GISENYI IDENTIFIED THE FOL UXOs FOR DISPOSAL PRIOR TO THEIR OCCUPATION OF THE SITE, 100 MOR VARIOUS, 40 SHELL VARIOUS AND 50,000 SAA. CANCON SUPPLIED 50 LBS OF C4 TO ASSIST WITH EOD AND THE FOL UXOs WERE RECOVERED FOR SUBSEQUENT DEMOLITION, 1 X TS50 AP MINE, 1 X M26 RIFLE GREN AND 1 X HE GREN.

WORK ON MASS GRAVE AT CATHOLIC CHURCH AT CYANIKA GR 5629 CONTINUES. THE AREA WAS FUMIGATED BY BRITISH ENGR TEAM AND SOME MED STAFF. SUPERFICIAL LEVELLING OF THE SITES OF THE MASS GRAVES REVEALED MORE HUMAN REMAINS THAT PREVIOUSLY ESTIMATED. THE MAJOR PROBLEM FACING 23 PFA GP IS THE LACK OF TOPSOIL COUPLED WITH THE LACK OF LIME TO MAKE THE GRAVES SAFE. CAMP 4A/35 WAS HANDED OVER TO THE NGO, MERLIN. A SECTION FROM AUSMED IN BUTARE HAS BEEN WORKING ALONGSIDE BRITCON IN KIBEHO ALONG WITH THE NGO AUSTRALIAN CARE. THE AIM OF THIS IS TO ENSURE THAT THERE IS A GRADUAL HANDOVER/TAKEOVER OF THE CAMP SO THAT THERE IS NO VACUUM WHEN BRITCON LEAVES THEATRE.

L. CAN SIGS. ONE GRIZZLY (WITH CREW OF THREE) REMAINS UNDER COMD D & S PLATOON AS WELL AS ONE SUPPLY TECH REMAINS UNDER COMD RHQ IN SECTOR 2B. SUPPORT TO UNAMIR HQ AND TAC HQ CONTINUED. CONTINUED ERECTING MICRO-WAVE ANTENNA AT UNAMIR HQ AS PART OF ASSISTANCE TO FD SVCS IN ESTB UNAMIR'S RURAL TEL NET-WORK. DEPL OF RPTR IN SECTOR 2 (KIBUNGO GR 2660) WAS POSTPONED AS RPA ESCORT DID NOT HAVE ACCESS TO THE RWANDA TEL FACILITY THAT ARE PLANNING TO USE TO MOUNT ANTENNA AND HOUSE EQPT. MAJ CAMILLE (RPA SIGS) WILL LIAISE WITH RWANDA TEL AND WILL PROVIDE ESCORT FOR THE TRIP. IN THE MEANTIME, INSTALL THE RPTR TO SP SECTOR 2 ON MT JARI GR 6791 TO PROVIDE AN INITIAL CAPABILITY AND "OCCUPY THE GRD". TEN NEWLY PROGRAMMED MOTOROLA BASE STN ARE BEING PREPARED TO REPLACE THE ONES PREVIOUSLY ISSUED TO FRAFBATT AND WHICH FREQ PAIR IS INTERFERING WITH CH 7. THESE NEW BASE STNS WILL BE ISSUED TO FRAFBATT SIG O ON TUE 04 OCT 94 AND WILL INCLUDE BOTH CURRENT FRAFBATT FREQ PAIR AND A NEW PAIR WHICH WILL BE ACTIVATED ON 141200B OCT 94 (BY REPLACING THEIR RPTR). DAILY SITREP COVERING THE PERIOD 270600B TO 280600B SEP 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. OP HOMEWARD STALLED AS ONLY 27 DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) WERE MOVED FROM SECTOR 4 TO SECTOR 3. DPs EXPRESSED FEELING OF LACK OF SECURITY. RADIO STATION EMITTING TRANSMISSIONS PROBABLY FROM BURUNDI CONTINUED TO SEND MESSAGES ACCUSING RPA OF KILLING REFUGEES AND LOOTING THEIR BELONGINGS. THIS SEEMS TO IMPACT NEGATIVELY ON EFFORTS TO MOVE DISPLACED PEOPLE TO THEIR HOMES. SCHOOLS CONTINUED TO OPEN IN MANY PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. TWO MASS GRAVES IN THE SOUTH WEST OF THE COUNTRY WHICH ARE MONTHS OLD WERE DISCOVERED AT NYARUBUYE GR 837588 ALLEGED TO CONTAIN OVER 400 BODIES. ANOTHER 100 BODIES WERE DISCOVERED IN A CLASSROOM NEAR A CHURCH IN THE SAME AREA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED CONTACTS WITH THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND THE DIRECTOR OF RWANDA INFORMATION OFFICE IN ORDER TO OBTAIN BROADCASTING LICENSE AND FREQUENCY ALLOCATION FOR THE UN RADIO IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN KIGALI AND THE REST OF THE COUNTRY. A PLATOON PASSED THROUGH KARAMA GR 5531 AND RUKOMO GR 5538 TOWARDS MWOGO GR 6240. A WOMAN WAS REPORTED SHOT AT MUGAZA GR 4305 BY RPA SOLDIER. THE VICTIM IS BEING GIVEN MEDICAL ATTENTION BY A BRITISH MEDICAL TEAM AT RUNYOMBYI GR 4893.

CARITAS CONTINUED MED ASSISTANCE TO DPs WHILST SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND DISTRIBUTED FOOD TO NURSING MOTHERS AT RURAMA GR 4716. MINISTER OF EDUCATION VISITED GIKONGORO AND HELD A FORUM AT MBUGA GR 4124. MR UZALIBARA EZECKIEL, EX-LOCAL POLICEMAN FOR SAKA COMMUNE NOW AT CYANIKA CAMP, HANDED OVER 2 X PAIRS OF TROUSERS, 3 SHIRTS, 1 X COAT, 1 JERSEY PULLOVER, 1 X BERET, 1 X PAIR OF BOOTS AND 1 X BELT. 197 DPs GIVEN MED TREATMENT BY OWN MED STAFF AT MURAMBI GR 5128.

C. MILOB GP. MOST PRIMARY SCHOOLS HAVE OPENED AT BYUMBA PREFECTURE. 492 ORPHANS OF RUTARE ORPHANAGE GR 1908 MOVED TO KIGALI ON 27 SEP 94. MR JEAN DE DIEY HABAKURANA OF KIGALI WAS ASSISTED BY MILOBS TO FIND OUT HIS FAMILY FROM A VILLAGE NAMED MULIZA GR 055225. 19 PERS ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH BURUNDI BORDER WHILE 51 PEOPLE ENTERED THROUGH TANZANIA BORDER CROSSING POINTS. 55 DPs WERE TRANSPORTED FROM KABGAYI TO NASAWGO GR 6153 WITH THE HELP OF MALAWI COY. 37 PERS WERE MOVED FROM KIZI TO BUTARE WHILE ANOTHER 283 WERE TRANSPORTED FROM THE SAME PLACE TO OTHER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. AT GIKONGORO, OP HOMEWARD CONTINUED WITH VERY LOW SUCCESS. THE REASONS BEING THAT THE PEOPLE IN GENERAL WERE SCARED TO GO BACK TO THEIR COMMUNE BECAUSE AN UNKNOWN RADIO STN HAS ADVISED PEOPLE NOT TO RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES AS THEY WOULD BE KILLED BY RPA. THE RADIO ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT FORMER GOVT FORCES WOULD ATTACK THE COUNTRY SOON. DAILY SITREP COVERING THE PERIOD 250600B TO 260600B SEP 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) AND REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. UNAMIR IS CURRENTLY ORGANISING OF HOMEWARD TO REPATRIATE A LARGE SCALE OF DPs TO THEIR HOMES FROM VARIOUS AREAS OF SECTOR 4. RPA URGING LOCAL POPULATION IN SECTOR 4 TO HAVE CONFIDENCE IN NEW GOVERNMENT FOR THEIR SECURITY AND RETURN HOME.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE PRESIDENT SUMMONED THE FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION, ALONG WITH TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF UNHCR, TO PROTEST THE ALLEGATION MADE BY UNHCR REGARDING MASSACRES ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED BY RPA SOLDIERS. HE CONSIDERED THESE ALLEGATIONS MISCHIEVOUS AND UNFOUNDED AND ASKED FOR MORE SUBSTANTIVE PROOF AS WELL AS FOR THE METHODOLOGY USED IN COMPILING THE REPORT.

B. THE PRESIDENT ACCUSED UNAMIR OF KNOWING ABOUT THE REPORT WITHOUT INFORMING THE GOVERNMENT. HE ADDED THAT THIS PUTS THE FUTURE OF UNAMIR'S CONTINUING OPERATION IN RWANDA IN QUESTION. THE FORCE COMMANDER DENIED HAVING ANY PRIOR KNOWLEDGE OF THE REPORT.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. RPA HUMANITARIAN LIAISON OFFICER IN SECTOR 4B ACCOMPANIED A CONVOY OF 7 TRUCKS CARRYING 395 DPs FROM GITARAMA TO KIBUYE. 6 PERSONS WHO HAD LEFT MEMBERSHIO GR 5435 SOME WEEKS AGO TO RETURN TO THEIR COMMUNE OF MUYIRA HAD BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS IN THE COMMUNE FOR UNSPECIFIED REASONS. THEY WERE TIED AND BEATEN BUT THE RPA COMPANY COMMANDER APPARENTLY SAVED THEM. THE FREQUENCY OF CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS BY THE RPA HAS INCREASED OVER LAST FEW DAYS IN SECTOR 3 AND 4. THIS ACTION HAS RESULTED IN SOME REPORTS OF LOCALS LEAVING THEIR HOMES AT NIGHT AND MOVING TO UNAMIR UNIT LOCATIONS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. FC HELD STAFF BRIEF AT 0930 HRS. DFC STILL

IN ZAIRE FOR A SPECIAL MISSION ON JOINT ZAIRE/UN COMMISSION ON THE SITUATION IN THE RWANDESE REFUGEES CAMPS IN ZAIRE.

B. GHANBATT. POPULATION COMPLAIN OF INSECURITY FOLLOWING CORDON AND SEARCH OPS AND ARRESTS OF SOME LOCALS BY THE RPA. DR RWAYITARE ETIENNE OF KIGEME HOSP ARRESTED AT CHECK PT BETWEEN GIKONGORO AND KIGEME BY RPA. WHEREABOUTS OF THE MENTIONED DOCTOR AND REASONS FOR ARREST IS NOT KNOWN. CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT PTLs IN AOR. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA. CONTINUED TO DEPLOY 1 X MECHANISED SECTION EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. PERMANENT ROAD BLOCKS MANNED AT GIKONGORO GR 5127, RURAMNA GR 3717, RWAMIKO GR 4913 AND KITABI GR 3520. 5 X M113 TRANSPORTED TO PLATOON LOCATION IN RILIMA GR 2561. PROVIDED SECURITY AND SUPERVISED ICRC RELIEF DISTRIBUTION AT MUNINI. 19 MEMBERS OF BRITISH MED TEAM ARRIVED AT RUNYOMBYI GR 4893. THEY INTEND TO STAY AT THE MENTIONED AREA FOR 4 DAYS.

C. MILOB GP. CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PTLs IN ALL SECTORS. SECTOR 2 COMMANDER ALONG WITH CHC WENT TO KIBUNGO FOR RECCE. THEY MET THE BOURGMESTER OF KIBUNGO WHO ASSURED THEM OF TWO HOUSES FOR MILOB ACCOMMODATION IN THE SECTOR. MEANWHILE MILOBS WILL BE ACCOMMODATED IN TENTS UNTIL A SUITABLE ACCOMMODATION IS OBTAINED. ONE GHANIAN PLATOON ALSO DEPLOYED AT KIBUNGO. MILOB ESCORTED 395 DPs FROM KABUAYI CAMP GR 7269 TO KIBUYE PREFECTURE WITH THE HELP OF MALAWI TPS. WFP PERSONNEL REPORTED THAT TWO OF THEIR STAFF, JEROME HAIZIMANA AND EUGENE NDATIMANA WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA WHEN A WPN WAS FOUND IN THE CEILING OF THE HOUSE THEY WERE OCCUPYING DURING A SEARCH OPERATION BY RPA ON 19 SEP 94. THEY ARE STILL IN CUSTODY AT GIKONGORO. APPROX 200 DPs WERE TRANSPORTED FROM BUGARAMA TO CYANGUGU. 22 DPs ENTERED RWANDA VIA CYANIKA WHILE 1,326 ENTERED THROUGH BORDER POST 1, 2 AND 3.

D. BRITCON. A MED SECTION DEPARTED KITABI FOR A 4 DAY TOUR OF REFUGEE CAMPS IN THE SOUTH AND WILL BE JOINED BY ANOTHER MED SECTION TOMORROW. EH TEAM HELD A MEETING WITH NGOS AND FORMULATED A PLAN FOR WATER/SANITATION FACILITIES AT CAMP 4A/11 GR 5107. IN PATIENTS WERE VISITED AT CAMPS 4A/11 AND 4A/35. THE REMAINDER OF 23 PFA CONDUCTED MAINTENANCE TASKS ON EQUIPMENT AT KITABI. WORK ONGOING AT THE SISTERS OF MERCY ORPHANAGE TO INCLUDE PREPARATION OF PERMANENT SITE OF THE ODA GENERATOR AND BUILDING MAINT. THE MUKONO CLINIC, GEHENI HOSP AND MANUYAGIRO WATER SUPPLIES ARE ALL SCHEDULED FOR REINSTATEMENT NEXT WEEK. THE COMMAND ELMS OF BRITCON LOG SP ARE NOW ESTB IN BUTARE TO COORD THE TRANSPORT FOR OP HOMEWARD BOUND WHICH WILL COMMENCE ON 260800B SEP 94.

E. CAN SIGS. ALL SYSTEMS IN ALL SECTORS ARE OP. ONE GRIZZLY (WITH CREW OF THREE) REMAINS UNDER COMD D & S PL AS WELL AS ONE SUPPLY TECH REMAINS UNDER COMD RHQ IN SECT 2B. SP TO UNAMIR HQ AND TAC HQ CONTINUED. PREP FOR RECCE OF RPTR SITE IN SECTOR 2. TASK IN SECTOR 2B CONTINUES. TWO U-

CRTTZ GRID COMPUTERS ARE BLR. THERE ARE NO MORE SPARES IN THEATER. REQ THAT TWO SPARES BE IOR'D AS NEXT N/S GRID COMPUTER WILL REMOVE ONE U-CRTTZ FROM THE NET. UNAMIR'S RELIANCE ON U-CRTTZ HAS INCREASED WITH THE INMARSAT,S FAX BECOMING LESS AND LESS RELIABLE AND REFUGEE MOVEMENT GENERATING LENGTHY MSG AND SITREPS. UN PLANNED V-SAT DEPL IS AT BEST STILL TWO MONTH AWAY AND OP ORDER 20, WHEN ISSUED, WILL CREATE ONE MORE SECTOR HQ FOR WHICH NO U-CRTTZ IS AVAILABLE FOR DEPL. KEEPING ALL U-CRTTZ OPERATIONAL IS THEREFORE CRITICAL TO UNAMIR'S COMMS. AT 0610 HRS 25 SEP 94, RPA VEH CARRYING 3 RPA SOLDIERS WERE FIRED AT BY UNKNOWN ARMED ELEMENTS APPROX FIVE KILOMETERS FROM BUKOBA GR 8737. A CANADIAN PTL IN THE VICINITY OF THE INCIDENT CONVEYED 3 WOUNDED RPA SOLDIERS TO KIBUNGO FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT.

F. AUSMED. THE MILITARY WING OF CHK CONTINUED TO TREAT IN AND OUT PATIENTS. THERE ARE CURRENTLY 7 UNAMIR IN PATIENTS AT CHK. TSG AT BUTARE CONTINUED TO CONDUCT CLINICS.

G. ETHIOBATT. ROUTINE STATIC DUTIES WERE CARRIED OUT. TROOPS AROUND GISAKURA MET WITH 150 DWELLERS OF NYAMAHARI TO FOSTER GOOD RELATIONS BETWEEN UNAMIR TROOPS AND THE LOCAL POPULATION. 205 REFUGEES REPATRIATED FROM ZAIRE VIA RUSIZI AND BUGARAMA. THEY ALSO ESCORTED 289 RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE BORDER TO CYANGUGU.

H. MALAWIAN COY. CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PTLs IN AOR. ESCORTED 7 TRUCKS TRANSPORTING 395 DPs FROM KABUAYI CAMP GR 7269 TO KIBUYE PREFECT.

K. AIR OPS. A TOTAL OF 26 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

DAILY SITREP COVERING THE PERIOD 240600B TO 250600B SEP 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) AND REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. RPA OFFICERS IN SECTOR 4 ARE URGING PEOPLE TO HAVE CONFIDENCE IN NEW GOVERNMENT FOR THEIR SECURITY AND RETURN HOME. UNAMIR IS CURRENTLY ORGANISING OP HOMEWARD TO REPATRIATE A LARGE NUMBER OF DPs TO THEIR HOMES FROM VARIOUS AREAS OF SECTOR 4.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. RPA COL CHARLES VISITED SECTOR 4, HAD MEETING WITH LOCALS AT NDABA, URGING THEM TO HAVE CONFIDENCE IN NEW GOVERNMENT AND RETURN HOME. IN GIKONGORO, A LOCAL INFORMED RPA SOLDIER THAT HE LOCATED A MAN WHO ALLEGEDLY MURDERED HIS FAMILY DURING THE WAR. RPA APPROACHED THE MAN AND CONFRONTED HIM OVER THE ISSUE. THERE WAS AN ARGUMENT WHICH RESULTED IN ONE RPA SOLDIER THROWING A GRENADE AT THE MAN. THE BLAST KILLED 2 X MEN AND WOUNDED 4 X CIV. MATTER UNDER INVESTIGATION BY RPA. AFTER CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN GASARENDA GR 4122 A DOCTOR MUNYANTARE SEBASTIAN WAS ARRESTED. HE WAS ACCUSED BY HIS 5 X CHILDREN OF BEING CAUSE OF THE DEATH OF THEIR TUTSI MOTHER DURING THE WAR.

B. RGF. RADIO STATION FRANCE ANNOUNCED THAT RGF WERE ABOUT TO ATTACK ANY MOMENT IN SECTOR 4.

C. MILITIA. IN SECTOR 2 RPA REPORTED TO OUR PATROL THAT ARMED INTERAHAMWE WERE CROSSING THE RIVER IN BUKOBA TO STEAL GOODS IN RWANDA. SOME INTERAHAMWE ACTIVITY WAS ALSO REPORTED IN AREA OF ZAZA GR 440620.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE CONDUCTED. 2 OFFRS AND 45 MEN NOW DEPLOYED IN SECTOR 2A.

B. GHANBATT. 9 X PATROLS OF RPA PASSED THROUGH RUKONDO GR 5538 TOWARDS THE RIVER MWOGO GR 6240. RPA ARRESTED DR MUNYANTARE SEBASTIAN IN VILLAGE OF GASARENDA GR 4122 ACCUSED BY HIS CHILDREN OF KILLING HIS TUTSI WIFE DURING THE WAR. DEPLOYED 45 PERS AT RILIMA GR 2561 IN SECTOR 2A. 64 CHILDREN AND 2 BABIES ACCOMPANIED BY 15 TEACHERS ARRIVED AT GIKONGORO SOS VILLAGE FROM BIYUMHURA.



C. MILOB GP. ONE RPA COY ARRIVED AT RUGABANO GR 4368. OPS CONFERENCE WAS HELD AT SECTOR TWO HQ FOR SECTOR COMD. IN GITARAMA SECTOR, HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TEAM ATTENDED PREFECTURE MEETING OF 15 NGOS REPS CHAIRED BY PREFECT MAJ GEORGE. IT WAS AGREED THAT NGOS SHOULD PRESENT LETTER OF INTRODUCTION ON ARRIVAL IN AREA AND THE MEETING BE HELD TWICE A MONTH. THE PREFECT SUGGESTED NGOS SUBMIT COPY OF REPORT ON FOOD DISTRIBUTION TO HIM. MASS GRAVES CONTAINING APPROX 140 BODIES DISCOVERED AT CYANGUGU. 22 OTHER GRAVES CONTAINING ABOUT 5 X BODIES EACH WERE ALSO DISCOVERED IN SAME AREA. LOCALS REPORTED THAT MASSACRE OF THESE PERS TOOK PLACE IN MAY 94.

D. BRITCON. FOLLOW UP ACTION ON OP PEGASUS RAID TOOK PLACED 24 SEP 94 AFTER APPROX 500 DPs WERE DROPPED OFF IN THE GASHORA AND NGENDA COMMUNES. OPS OFFR MET WITH THE PREFECTS OF BOTH COMMUNES TO DISCUSS PROBLEMS FACING RETURNING DPs. THEIR MAIN CONCERN BEING PROVISION OF FOOD AND MED TREATMENT. THE PREFECT HAD A COMPLETE LIST OF DPs IN SECTOR 2 THAT WISH TO MOVE TO SECTOR 3 AND 4. THE PLANNING OF OP HOMEWARD IS NOW COMPLETE AND COMMAND AND CONTROL ELEMENT WILL BE DESPATCHED TO TAC HQ TODAY. THE TRANSPORT FLEET CONSISTING OF 13 BRITCON AND 18 ZAMBATT VEHs WILL WORK A SHUTTLE RUN TO MOVE DPs OUT OF CAMPS IN SECTOR 4. PAEDIATRIC STORES WERE PROVIDED BY UNICEF BUT RESUPPLY IS STILL A CONCERN. THE LAYING OF PIPELINES AT MUKONA CLINIC IS GOING WELL. WATER PRODUCTION AT KIBEHO DP CAMPS IS ONGOING AND REPAIRS TO THE HOSPITAL ROOF IN CAMP IS ALSO PROGRESSING WELL.

E. CAN SIGS. ALL SYSTEMS IN ALL SECTORS ARE OP. TWO U-CRTTZ GRID COMPUTERS ARE BLR. THERE ARE NO SPARES IN THEATER AND REQ THAT TWO SPARES BE IOR. UNAMIR RELIANCE ON U-CRTTZ HAS INCREASED SINCE INMARSAT'S FAX ARE BECOMING LESS RELIABLE. UN PLANNED V-SAT DEPL IS AT LEAST STILL TWO MONTHS AWAY. KEEPING U-CRTTZ OPERATIONAL IS THEREFORE CRITICAL TO UNAMIR. SECTOR 2B REPORTS VERY LITTLE RPA ACTIVITY IN AREA. RPA MANNING 3 X ROAD BLOCKS ON THE WAY FROM KIBONGO TO BUKOBA. BRIDGE AT BORDER AT BUKOBA NOW GUARDED BY RPA PL. RPA ALSO HAS TWO OPs ON HIGH GROUND OVERLOOKING THE BRIDGE. INFO RECEIVED INDICATE THAT 500 - 1,000 REFUGEES CROSS THE BORDER DAILY.

F. AUSMED. THE MILITARY WING OF CHK CONTINUED TO TREAT IN AND OUT PATIENTS. THERE ARE CURRENTLY 7 UNAMIR IN PATIENTS AT CHK. TSG AT BUTARE CONTINUED TO CONDUCT CLINICS.

G. ETHIOBATT. FOUND A MASS GRAVE WITH 12 BODIES IN GISHOMA GR 8212 AND ANOTHER WITH 250 BODIES IN CYANGUGU GR 7725. 232 REFUGEES REPATRIATED FROM ZAIRE, 229 REFUGEES LEFT FOR ZAIRE.

H. MALAWIAN COY. AT MUGUSA, ICRC, MSF AND WFP ARE DISTRIBUTING 600 TONS OF FOOD AND SEEDS FOR PLANTING. THEY INTEND TO SUPPLY 20 COMMUNES AND THIS WILL BENEFIT 6,500 PERS. 560 RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED AT KIZI CROSSING POINT.

K. AIR OPS. A TOTAL OF 36 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

5. UNCIVPOL. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT TRAINING OF THE GENDARMERIE.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. AS OF THE END OF THIS WEEK 35,000 DPs TRANSPORTED BY UNHCR AND OTHER AGENCIES. BRITCON AND UNREO HAVE MOVED 5,000 DPs. 1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) AND REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN. SCHOOLS ARE REOPENING IN MOST SECTORS WITH MORE GIRLS REPORTING FOR CLASSES THAN BOYS. ZAIRE BORDER AT GOMA/GISENYI IS REPORTED CLOSED BY ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES TO UN PERSONNEL. NO REASON HAS BEEN GIVEN. 1 WFP TRUCK ON RELIEF DUTIES IN SECTOR 4C WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT THAT RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF ITS DRIVER NAMED CORTIEA MOHAMMED ALLI. ARRANGEMENTS UNDERWAY TO EVACUATE DEAD BODY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. A JAPANESE DELEGATION HEADED BY THE MINISTER OF DEFENSE, MR. T. TAMASAWA VISITED KIGALI TO ASSESS JAPAN'S POTENTIAL CONTRIBUTION TO HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS IN RWANDA. THE DELEGATION HELD BILATERAL MEETINGS WITH THE PRESIDENT, AND WITH THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENSE. THE DELEGATION ALSO MET WITH THE FORCE COMMANDER AND OFFICER-IN-CHARGE, MAJOR-GENERAL TOUSIGNANT, AS WELL AS WITH THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DR. KABIA. THE VISIT OF THE MINISTER OF DEFENSE COINCIDED WITH THE DISPATCH OF THE FIRST JAPANESE TROOPS TO REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE.

A. FORCE HQ. A PL GP OF CANCON TPS DEPLOYED AT SECTOR 2B. ANOTHER PL GP CONSISTING OF GHANBATT TPS TO BE DEPL IN SECTOR 2A TODAY. STAFF BRIEF WAS CONDUCTED AT 0800 HRS. WPNS CONFISCATED BY UNAMIR FROM LOCALS HANDED OVER TO RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERIOR.

B. GHANBATT. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND NIGHT PTLs IN AREA OF OPERATION. PREPARATIONS FOR DEPLOYMENT INTO SECTOR 2B CONTINUED. LOCALS OF MUGANO CAMP GR 5621 REPORTED THAT AT 212030 HRS SEP 94 RPA SOLDIERS ARRESTED SOME INMATES OF THE CAMP BUT FAILED TO TAKE THEM AWAY AS LOCALS GROUPED IN LARGE NUMBERS AND RAISED AN ALARM. RPA FIRED IN THE AIR AND LEFT WITHOUT ARRESTING ANYBODY. 2 LOCALS WERE KILLED AND 4 OTHERS SERIOUSLY INJURED IN A GRENADE ATTACK BY AN RPA SOLDIER IN GIKONGORO. THE SOLDIER ALLEGED THAT THOSE INVOLVED WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR DEATHS OF HIS FAMILY MEMBERS. AT MAMERESHIO GR 5435 A LOCAL REPORTED TO PATROL ABOUT 30 DPs WHO RETURNED HOME IN MWYIRA COMMUNE BUTARE PREFECTURE WERE ATTACKED AND KILLED BY LOCAL BANDITS. 6 OF THEM ESCAPED AND ARE BACK AT THE CAMP AT MAMERESHIO. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA GR 5530. 9 X M26 HAND GREN, 1 X PRC STICK, 1 X 40MM HE ROCKET, 2 X RIFLE FRAG GREN AND 2 X TEAR GAS DML BY EOD TEAM AT GIKONGORO. 148 DPs GIVEN MED TREATMENT BY OWN MED STAFF AT MURAMBI GR 5128. DISTRIBUTED COMPO RATION TO THE DPs AT GATARE GR 3535 AND NGANZO GR 3335. PROVIDED SY AND SUPERVISED RELIEF DISTRIBUTION BY ICRC AT MUNINI GR 4800 AND RURAMBA GR 3717.

C. MILOB GP. DCMO PAID A STAFF VISIT TO SEC 4A AND 4C. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS. IN BYUMBA DISPENSARY WHICH WAS LOCATED AT KIVUYE HAS MOVED TO BUNGUCA GR 975344, THIS HOSP IS RUN BY RPA. 5 VEHS WERE BROUGHT FROM KABALE TO KIGALI BY UNMOS. IN GITARAMA ONE TEAM VISITED SCHOOLS AND FOUND 300 STUDENTS AND 5 TEACHERS AT RULI GR 7569 PRIMARY SCHOOL, 1,756 STUDENTS AND 17 TEACHERS AT BYINANA GR 7062 PRIMARY SCHOOL AND 200 STUDENTS AND 6 TEACHERS AT CAV GR 7370 PRIMARY SCHOOL. IT WAS NOTICED THAT MOST OF THE STUDENTS WERE FEMALE ESPECIALLY IN THE HIGHER CLASSES. IT IS BELIEVED THAT MOST MALE STUDENTS HAVE EITHER JOINED THE RPA OR HAVE DIED DURING THE WAR. IT IS REPORTED THAT MOST THE SCHOOLS HAVE NO TEXT BOOKS AND STATIONERIES. THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION ADDRESSED THE STUDENTS AND TEACHERS OF BUTARE SCHOOL AND ANNOUNCED THAT SALARY OF TEACHERS WOULD BE PAID SOON. HE ALSO ADDED THAT MORE TEACHERS WOULD BE BROUGHT FROM BURUNDI TO AUGMENT THE PRESENT STRENGTH.

F. AUSMED. THE MILITARY WING OF CHK CONTINUED TO TREAT IN AND OUT PATIENTS. THERE ARE CURRENTLY 7 UNAMIR IN PATIENTS AT CHK. TSG AT BUTARE CONTINUED TO CONDUCT CLINICS.

G. ETHIOBATT. CO VISITED BUGARAMA. ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY WITH 840 REFUGEES PROCEEDING TO GITARAMA AND KIGALI. WFP VEH OVERTURNED AT GISAKURA AND DRIVER OF THE TRUCK DIED. 38 REFUGEES WERE TRANSPORTED FROM BUGARAMA TO CYANGUGU. RPA TROOPS TOOK 4 PERS FROM NYARUSHISHI AND CYMBOGO BELIEVED TO BE CRIMINALS. 585 REFUGEES WERE REPATRIATED FROM ZAIRE TO RWANDA THROUGH RUSIZI 1 AND BUGARAMA. 100 REFUGEES LEFT FOR ZAIRE THROUGH RUSIZI 1.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. RETURN OF DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) CONTINUES ALBEIT AT REDUCED LEVELS. LIFE IN THE CAPITAL AND AS WELL IN RWANDA APPEARS TO BECOMING BACK TO NORMAL. SCHOOLS ARE OPENING IN MOST OF THE SECTORS. RPA ARE CONDUCTING DAILY PATROLS AND MANNING ROAD BLOCKS IN AND AROUND KIGALI. REPORTS OF DISCOVERY OF MASS GRAVES WERE RECEIVED FROM RUBAVU AND KAYONE. UNCONFIRMED REPORT RECEIVED ABOUT 10 BODIES ALLEGEDLY KILLED BY RPA IN THE BEGINNING OF AUGUST. A JOINT TEAM OF BBGNU MINISTERS, UNAMIR, UNHCR, AND HUMAN RIGHTS REPS VISITED SECTOR 2 AT RUSUMO AND RUTONDE IN AN ATTEMPT TO INVESTIGATE THE ALLEGATIONS CONTAINED IN THE RECENTLY ANNOUNCED REPORT COMMISSIONED BY UNHCR. FINDINGS WERE INCONCLUSIVE; A SEPARATE REPORT WILL BE MADE BY THE SRSG IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. A TEAM MADE UP OF BBGNU MINISTERS OF INTERIOR, YOUTH AND SPORTS AND HIGHER EDUCATION AS WELL AS REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE UNAMIR MILITARY, THE OFFICE OF THE SRSG, THE OFFICE OF THE UN COORDINATOR FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, AND THE UNHCR TRAVELLED TO RUSUMO (BETWEEN KIBUNGO AND THE TANZANIAN BORDER) AND RUTONDO (NEAR RWAMAGANA) IN SECTOR 2 TO INVESTIGATE INFORMATION IN THE RECENTLY-RELEASED UNHCR REPORT. ALTHOUGH THE TEAM INTERVIEWED ABOUT FIFTEEN PEOPLE, IT WAS UNABLE TO VERIFY OR DENY ALLEGATIONS OF ATROCITIES IN THESE AREAS. THE TEAM HAD NOT SEEN THE UNHCR REPORT.

CHECK PTS PERMANENTLY MANNED AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBI RWAMIKO AND KITABI. APPROX 460 DISPLACED WERE EVACUATED FROM MBUGA.

C. MILOB GP. COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT. ALSO CARRIED OUT PTLs AND ESCORT DUTIES IN ALL SECTORS. PTL FROM SECTOR 4B LOCATED NEW RPA CHECK PTS AT GR 276700 AND 464631. MILOB TPT ONE MOTOR CYCLE ACCIDENT CAS FROM RUHENGARI TO KING FAISAL HOSP. BRITCON TRUCKS TPT A TOTAL OF 450 RETURNEES FROM GISENYI TO RUHENGARI AND KIGALI. MILOB ALSO TPT MRS MUJAWAMARIYA CATHERIN AND TWO CHILDREN TO KIGALI. PEOPLE IN THE MUREHE AND NZIGE AREAS NEED FOOD AND MEDICINE, AT THIS MOMENT NO NGOS ARE PRESENT. LOCALS AT TUMBA GR 978218 REPORTED LIKELY PRESENCE OF MINES IN THE AREA AND VOLUNTEERED TO DIRECT MILOBS TO SUSPECTED MINE AREAS.

D. BRITCON. ALL AGENCIES WITHIN RWANDA NOW CRITICALLY SHORT OF PAEDIATRIC MED STORES. UNAMIR HAVE BEEN TASKED WITH PROVIDING 23 PFA WITH THESE SPECIALIST ITEMS BUT HAVE REFUSED ON THE GROUNDS THAT THEY DO NOT SUPPLY THE HUMANITARIAN EFFORT DIRECTLY. WORK CONTINUES IN BYUMBA AREA INCLUDING THE START OF THE DISMANTLING OF THE OLD GATUNA BRIDGE. RESOURCES SECT PURCHASED A GENERATOR IN KABALI, UGANDA FOR THE CLINIC AT MUKONO. THE ODA GENERATOR, PLEDGED BY BARONESS CHALKER MP, ARRIVED TODAY. IT HAS BEEN INSPECTED AND WILL BE FITTED ONCE A SITE HAS BEEN PREPARED. THE EOD TEAM DISPOSED OFF THE FOL: 1 X 82MM MOR BOMB, 2 X 60MM MOR BOMB, 1 X HE GREN, 1 X M26 RIFLE GREN, AND 1 X 105MM HE SHELL. THE WORKSHOP DURING THE PERIOD COMPLETED 5 JOBS AND HAD 70 JOBS IN HAND. STILL AWAITING SPARES FOR 21 VEHs FOR REPAIRS. CONVOY WAS SENT TO UGANDA TO COLLECT

75 TONS OF SEED FOR CONCERN. 16 TONS OF ENGR STORES WERE DELIVERED TO KITABI. 380 REFUGEES RETURNED IN THE LAST 24 HRS.

E. CAN SIGS. NOW HAVE TWO INMARSATS BEYOND LOCAL REPAIR (ONE EACH A AND B) AND ANOTHER ONE IN SECOND LINE. THERE ARE NO SPARES AVAL AND NOW RE-ALLOCATING MACHINES BASED ON PRIORITY. SO FAR, THE TAC HQ HAS LOST ONE OF HIS TWO INMARSAT AND SECTOR 1 AND SECTOR 3 HQ HAVE BOTH LOST THEIRS. HAVE COMMENCED PREPARATIONS FOR THE PATROLLING TASK IN SECTOR 2 WILL INCL ONE QRR (CREW OF THREE) ATT UNDER COMD TO D & S PL, ONE RAD DET (CREW OF THREE) TO LINK UP WITH THE FORCE COMD NET AT PLHQ AND ONE SUPPLY TECH. K. AIR OPS. A TOTAL OF 38 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA. UN539, C-130 OF CANADIAN ARMED FORCES WAS ARRANGED TO CARRY THREE HUMAN REMAINS DELIVERED BY THE BELGIAN EMBASSY. DAILY SITREP COVERING THE PERIOD 210600B TO 220600B SEP 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. RETURNEES AND DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) ARE RETURNING DAILY. LIFE IN THE CAPITAL IS COMING BACK TO NORMAL. SCHOOLS ARE STARTING TO OPEN IN MOST SECTORS. RPA ARE CONDUCTING DAILY PATROLS AND MANNING ROAD BLOCKS IN AND AROUND KIGALI. THE DELEGATION FROM UNHQ DEPARTED KIA ENDING TWO DAYS VISIT.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE USG FOR DPKO VISITED KIBUYE, CYANGUGU AND GIKONGORO, ACCOMPANIED BY THE FORCE COMMANDER, BEFORE LEAVING FOR NAIROBI.

B. THE SRSG MET WITH AMBASSADOR DILLON TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF SECURITY IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS. HE ALSO MET WITH THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR, MR. SENDASHONGA, AND THE MINISTER OF YOUTH AND SPORTS, MR. PATRICK MAZIMHAKA, TO DISCUSS SECURITY ISSUES.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. CONDUCTED PTLs AND MANNED ROAD BLOCKS IN MOST OF THE COUNTRY. TWO SOLDIERS IN RPA UNIFORMS IN SECTOR 1 TRIED TO ACQUIRE MILITARY UNIFORMS, AND UNAMIR INSIGNIA AND HEADGEAR. IN SECTOR 3, RPA REPORTED DEPLOYED IN GEN AREA OF TONGWE GR 8957. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS IN GIKONGORO. ONE SECTION OF RPA TROOPS WITH PERSONAL EFFECTS SEEN IN A TRUCK AT RWAMIKO HEADING IN THE DIRECTION OF KIBEHO, FINAL DESTINATION UNKNOWN.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. THE UNDER SECRETARY GENERAL FOR PEACE KEEPING OPS VISITED SECTOR 4B, 4C AND DEPARTED KIA EARLY IN THE AFTERNOON WITH HIS PARTY.

B. GHANBATT. NIGHT PTLs OBSERVED MOST HOUSES DESERTED AT BUZARZE GR 4591 AND REMERA GR 4192. MOST LOCALS FEARING FOR

THEIR SECURITY VACATE THEIR HOMES TO PASS THE NIGHT IN SECURE AREAS. SOME LOCALS IN GIKONGORO SPENT THE NIGHT AT DPs COMPOUND NEAR BNHQ AT MURAMBI AND WENT BACK HOME IN THE MORNING. THIS IS OBSERVED TO BE THE TREND SINCE THE ARRIVAL OF THE RPA IN THE ZONE. 7 X LOCALS ARRESTED AS SUSPECTS FOR MURDER AND OTHER ACTS OF BANDITRY IN AO, HANDED OVER TO THE PREFECT AT BUREAU DE PREFECTURE IN GIKONGORO. MR ANNAN VISITED TROOPS AT GIKONGORO.

C. MILOB GP. IN GIKONGORO THE PREFECT HELD A POLITICAL RALLY AT THE MARKET PLACE TO EXPLAIN THE REASONS FOR CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS CARRIED OUT BY RPA ON 20 SEP 94. RPA REP HELD MEETING WITH DPs AT NDABA AND RUGABANO TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO RETURN HOME. 2 X TEAMS WERE SENT ON RECCE TO KIBUNGO AND FOUND SITUATION TO BE NORMAL. THEY MET THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO TO COORDINATE THEIR PERMANENT DEPLOYMENT WITHIN THE TOWN. THE PREFECT'S RESPONSE NOT ENCOURAGING. A PTL ON A RECCE MISSION TO BUSORO GR 6605 DISCOVERED A DAMAGED BRIDGE AT GR 6000. APPROX 600 DPs WERE FOUND AT GITISH GR 7254. 943 REFUGEES ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH BORDER POST NO 1, 2 AND 3. SOME OF THE SCHOOLS IN GISENYI AREA HAVE RE-OPENED AND CHILDREN ATTENDING SCHOOL.

D. BRITCON. MED SECTION CONTINUED TO VISIT CAMPS. THE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH TEAM VISITED CAMPS 4A/03 WHERE ADVICE WAS GIVEN TO NGOS ON THE SEVERE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH PROBLEMS THERE. THE BULK OF THE INTERNAL WORK AT THE MUKONO CLINIC IS NOW COMPLETE. RUNWAY AT CYANGUGU FIT FOR USE BY C-130 AND WITHIN BRITCON ENGR CAPABILITIES TO REPAIR, LIMITING FACTOR BEING LACK OF RELEVANT STORES. EOD TEAMS DESTROYING UNEXPLODED ORDINANCES AROUND MILOB HQ IN SECTOR 1. OP PEGASUS RIDE NOW COMPLETED AND A TOTAL OF 1,088 DPs WERE MOVED FROM CAMP 4A/21 TO THEIR HOMES.

E. CAN SIGS. U-CRTTZ AT MILOB HQ MOVED TO TAC HQ IN SUPPORT OF OP HOMEWARD. REPLACED FEED HORN AND INSTALLED PROTECTOR AT NYAANZA INTELSAT STN. LACK OF SPARE PARTS FOR COMPUTERS GRID IN U-CRTTZ AND INMARSAT COULD BECOME CRITICAL IF ACTUAL EQPT BECAME BLR.

F. AUSMED. THE MILITARY WING OF CHK TREATED 83 PATIENTS AND 8 DENTAL PATIENTS. THE TSG AT BUTARE CONDUCTED CLINICS AT SAVE AND KIBEHO TREATING 779 PATIENTS. EOD TEAM ALSO CONDUCTED CLEARANCE OF TWO SITES. I. FRAFATT. RPA CONDUCTED MEETING TO ENCOURAGE DPs TO GO BACK HOME, BUT HAVE EXPRESSED FEARS ABOUT THEIR SECURITY. 135 DPs OF NUSANGE WERE TRANSPORTED TO KIGALI BY UNAMIR AND 51 TOWARDS GITARAMA.

J. NIGERIA COY. CAPT DR MARK OF RPA VISITED NICOY HQ TO COORD MED ACTIVITIES AND HUMANITARIAN PROCEDURES IN SECTOR.
