Note to Mr. Michel

ICTR Fugitives in the DRC and Kenya

1. Thank you very much for your note dated 12 March on the above-mentioned topic.
2. Regarding your request to receive the record of the discussions that took place between the Secretary-General and Presidents Kibaki and Kabila, I am informed that no meeting took place with President Kabila in Addis Abeba. The note on the meeting with President Kibaki is not ready for distribution yet, but I am told that the issue of the fugitives was not discussed during the meeting. We will nevertheless ensure that a copy of the note is shared with you once it is finalized.
3. Regarding the suggestion for a personal intervention by the Secretary-General, I would encourage you to explore other ways, such as a direct interaction between Mr. Jallow and the relevant Congolese authorities, with DPKO's and the SRSG's support if required. I support the intervention of the Secretary-General, if a particular initiative would have an impact. In this case, I would need your guidance on when and in what form this intervention could take place.
4. I also understand that DPKO discussed this issue with Mr. Doss, who is amenable to supporting Mr. Jallow and to raising this issue with Congolese authorities.
5. This matter is of high interest to the Secretary-General, and I appreciate your keeping me informed of developments.
