S E C R E T CIV401 GARDINER FROM ENGLUND

HAD A DISCUSSION LAST NIGHT WITH FRANCOIS SABITI WHO REPORTED THE FOLLOWING A MOTION OF CENSURE WAS LODGED MAY 24 BY 29 DEPUTIES AGAINST PRESIDENT LOSALA MINISTER KAISALA AKANGAY SWALEHE YALEKO AND SOGBE FOR INCAPABILITY, CORRUPTION AND EMBEZELEMENTS. THE MOTION WAS SAID TO BE NEGLECTED BY KELEHKO. SABITI FURTHER CONSIDERED THAT THE SESSION HAD BEEN DELIBERATELY CLOSED BY KELEHKO AND GOVERNMENT TO AVOID FURTHER DISCUSSIONS REGARDING THE WORK OF THE GOVERNMENT. A LETTER HAS BEEN SENT BY SABITI TO PRESIDENT CHAMBER WITH COPIES TO PRESIDENT SENATE, PREMIER AND MINISTER INTERIOR REPEATING THE COMPLAINTS OF THE MOTION AND ACCUSING KELEHKO OF ABUSING HIS AUTHORITY, OF BEING DICTATORIAL, OF HAVING COMMITTED DIFFERENT CRIMES AND OF PROTECTING THE ABOVE GOVERNMENT MEMBERS. REFERENCE IS ALSO MADE TO THE MANZIKALA AFFAIR IN WHICH KELEKHO IS CONSIDERED TO BE INVOLVED. SABITI WANTED TO SEND A CABLE TO PRESIDENT CHAMBRE, SENATE, PREMIER AND MINISTER INTERIOR BUT WAS SURE IT WOULD BE STOPPED AND THEREFORE WAITED FOR YOU TO TRANSMIT IT TO THE ADDRESSEES. THE TEXT TO TELEGRAM AS WELL AS THE MOTION OF CENSURE AND THE LETTER TO PRESIDENT CHAMBRE WILL BE POUCHED TOMORROW. SABITI CONSIDERED THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD SENT FALSE REPORTS TO LEO ABOUT SITUATION AND HE WANTED AN ASSEMBLY DELEGATION TO GO TO LEO TO REPORT. HE URGED THE NEED OF A COMMISSAIRE EXTRAORDINAIRE.

SABITI SHOWED A TELEGRAM SENT TO HIM ON MAY 23 BY MANZIKALA, QUOTE ARRIVERAI VRAISEMBLABLEMENT LUNDI SAUFM DECISION CONTRAIRE PREMIER ET MININTERIEUR. SITUATION FAVORABLE COURAGE MANZIKALA UNQUOTE SABITI SEEMS TO BELIEVE THAT MANZIKALA IS APPOINTED COMMISSAIRE EXTRAORDINAIRE. SABITI IS A STAN DEPUTY AND THE FORMER MINISTER BUDGET CONTROL. HE IS ONE OF THE LEADERS IN THE OPPOSITION AGAINST KELEHKO AND THE GOVERNMENT AND A SUPPORTER OF FIRST VICE PRESIDENT SCHOMBE WHO PHONED LAST NIGHT TO SUPPORT SABITI, AS USUAL TOLD BOTH SABITI AND SCHOMBE IN TERMS NOT SUBJECT TO MISUNDERSTANDING THAT THEIR DISPUTE IS AN INTERNAL CONGOLESE AFFAIR WHICH THEY WILL HAVE TO SOLVE THEMSELVES AS POLITICIANS IN AN INDEPENDANT COUNTRY. S E C R E T CIV 399 GARDINER FROM ENGLUND.

CHIEF OF MISSION WAS CALLED TO COUNCIL OF MINISTERS THIS AFTERNOON. THE PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, MINISTERS KIGOMA SWALEHE, AGANGAY, LUMUMBA, BAIKPON AS WELL AS MAJOR LOSSO AND LOSALAS CHEF DE CABINET AKUNDA WERE PRESENT. MINISTER OF INTERIOR BAIKPON WHO RETURNED FROM LEO TODAY REPORTED THE FOLLOWING, YESTERDAY HE AND LEUGEMA WERE CALLED TO GBENYE WHO TOLD THEM THAT THE PARLIAMENTARIAN COMMISSION THAT WAS HERE IN APRIL BECAUSE OF THE MANZIKALA AFFAIR HAD SUBMITTED A REPORT TO THE CHAMBER OF REPRESENTATIVES. IN THE REPORT IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT A STATE OF EMERGENCY SHOULD BE DECLARED IN P.O. AND THAT COMMISSAIRE EXTRAORDINAIRE SHOULD BE APPOINTED FOR THE PROVINCE WITH AUTHORITY TO NEUTRALIZE THE PROVINCIAL GOVT AND THE ASSEMBLY BAIKPON WAS CONVINCED THAT THE REPORT WOULD BE APPROVED BY THE CHAMBER. BAIKPON WHO SHOULD HAVE STAYED LONGER IN LEO WAS URGED BY GBENYE TO INTERRUPT HIS WORK IN LEO AND TO RETURN IMMEDIATELY IN VIEW OF THE SITUATION THAT GBENYE CONSIDERED AS URGENT. COMMISSAIRE EXTRAORDINAIRE IS EXPECTED HERE IN ABOUT A WEEK. ON BEHALF OF THE COUNCIL, PRESIDENT LOSALA EXPRESSED HIS GREAT CONCERN AT THE MEASURES PROPOSED ACCORDING TO THE REPORT AND HE FEARED TROUBLES IN THE PROVINCE UPON THE ARRIVAL OF THE COMMISSIONER THAT SHOULD UPSET THE TRANQUILLITY IN TOWN AS WELL AS IN THE INTERIOR. GBENYE WHO SEEMED TO HAVE BEEN DISCOURAGED

REQUESTED BAIKPON TO ALERT THE POPULATION AND TO URGE IT TO KEEP THEIR HEADS COOL. LOSALA FURTHER MENTIONED THAT THE PROVINCE HAS ALL THE TIME BEEN WORKING FOR RECONCILIATION AND THAT A PROOF HAD BEEN GIVEN ON THAT WHEN MOBUTU AND THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR WERE HERE. BOTH WERE WELL RECEIVED AND THE PRESIDENT HAS RECEIVED A LETTER OF ACKNOWLEDGEMENT BY THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR. LOSALA FURTHER COULD NOT UNDERSTAND HOW THE PARLIAMENT CAN DECIDE TO TAKE SUCH SERIOUS MEASURES ONLY BECAUSE OF I MAN MANZIKALA, WHO ACCORDING TO HIM WAS ILLEGALLY NOMINATED AS PRESIDENT. HE ASKED CHIEF OF MISSION TO REPORT TO HIS HQ AND TO ASK THE HQ TO CONTACT THE CENTRAL AUTHORITIES FIRST OF ALL PRIME MINISTER TO TRY TO HAVE THE DECREE OF STATE OF EMERGENCY ~~EXEMPTED~~ AND THE NOMINATION OF THE COMMISSAIRE EXTRAORDINAIRE CANCELLED. THE SITUATION IN TOWN AND THE INTERIOR IS QUITE CALM, NO INCIDENTS ARE REPORTED. FROM THAT VERY POINT OF VIEW THE MEASURES NOW PROPOSED SEEM TO BE UNNECESSARY AND PROVOCATIVE. IN OUR OPINION IT SEEMS TO BE TOO LATE TO TAKE MEASURES BECAUSE OF MANZIKALAS DISMISSAL THAT HAPPENED ABOUT 7 MONTHS AGO. SINCE THAT TIME THE GOVT HERE HAS PROVED ITSELF TO BE AS GOOD AS ANY OTHER PROVINCIAL GOVT IN THE COUNTRY, AND FACT REMAINS THAT GENERAL SITUATION HAS IMPROVED CONSIDERABLY SINCE JANUARY. THE ASSEMBLY CLOSED ITS SESSION TODAY UPON ORDER OF MINISTER OF INTERIOR KAMITATU WHO REFERRED TO LOI FONDAMENTALE REGARDING THE DELAY OF THE SESSION. VICE PRESIDENT TCHOMBE AN ITURIAN MEMBER HAS LODGED A MOTION OF CENSURE AGAINST THE GOVT. THE ASSEMBLY HAS NOT VOTED AS THE MOTION WAS NOT CONSIDERED TO BE IN CONFORMITY WITH LOI FONDAMENTALE.

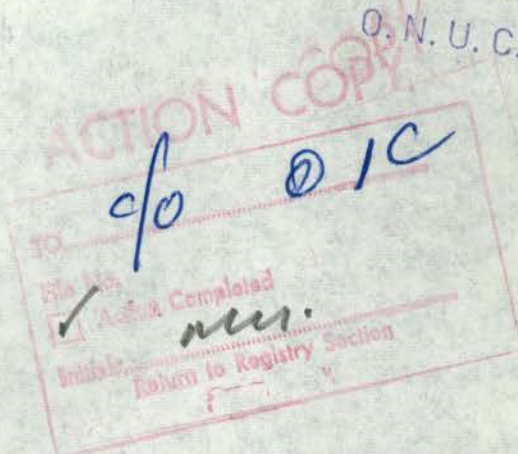
