

4. Please advise if this task can be completed using UNAMIR resources.

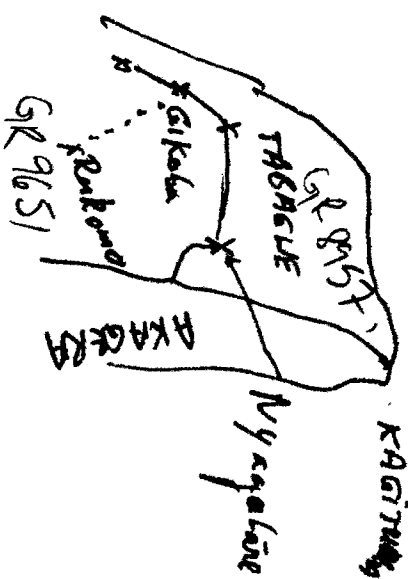





WFP are pleased to be able to support your project as per the proposal issued last week, subject to the following conditions :-

- 1) Approval for the project is gained from the Prefecture Project Vetting Committee.
- 2) MINITRAPE and UNIMIR agree to fund the non food items (Cash payments for supervisory staff and Tools respectively) as per the proposal.
- 3) MINITRAPE agree to provide any transport for the food as deemed necessary.
- 4) MINITRAPE provide a monthly and final report to WFP giving details of work completed and food distribution, along with a general description of the achievements of the project.
- 5) It is understood that WFPs' contribution is limited to that stated in the proposal, i.e. a maximum of
6.400 MT Maize Grains
4.000 MT Beans
0.960 MT Vegetable Oil
- 6) While WFP will make every effort to supply this food it cannot guarantee it, as conditions may intervene beyond its' control.
- 7) Deliveries of food ex-store at a minimum interval of two weeks, taken from the start of work.

Final approval to be given on receipt of agreements by the above mentioned parties.

SECTOR 1 MILOB HQ (BYUMBA)
BREIF ON HUMANATARIAN ACTIVITIES
FOR CHAO MEETING ON 03 MAR 95

INTRODUCTION

1. Sector 1 has been the most peaceful and calm sector for quite sometime. This sector saw the maximum influx of NGOs helping out people in the DP camps prior to the war, after the war this sector has been relegated to the background as other sectors shot into prominence and now the focus of all is towards the sectors affected by OP RETOUR. This does not neccessarily mean that all is well within the sector and the requirement of Humanitarian aid has diminished.

2. There are many areas requiring Humanatarian Aid, as well as many NGOs providing all types of help. The prefect of Byumba has in fact called a meting on 10 Mar of all the NGOs working within the area to firstly decide on their usefulness and secondly to coordinate their activity. The areas identified for provision of aid are outlined in the underlying paras.

AREAS REQUIRING HUMANATARIAN ASSISTANCE

3. **INFLUX OF RETURNEES.** There is a constant inflow of returnees from Uganda across the Gatuna, Tabagwe and Kagitumba border check posts, and from Tanzania from across the Akagera river affecting a crossing at an unmanned point named Namunemura (B 5371). The average daily influx at Kagitumba is 800 persons and 1000 heads of cattle whereas those coming across Gatuna average around 20 daily. The number crossing over from Tanzania is not known. This creates the following problems. Reception centres have been set up jointly by ADRA and UNHCR at Matimba and Nyagatare to receive these returnees. The problems encountered are as under :-

(a) **Kagitumba Border Outpost.** The border outpost needs the following :-

- (i) Tent or shelter for the returnees from rain and sun while they await transportation.
- (ii) A bladder be placed there and replenished with drinking water when required to cater for approx 1000 persons daily.
- (iii) The sector has tied up with Nicoy to provide trucks biweekly on Mondays and Fridays, but the UNHCR can augment this by running a bus for transporting returnees on a daily basis from the border to the Reception centres and from the centres to the communes.

(b) **Matimba Reception Centre.** The daily registration is around 80 families of 800 persons collecting their " welcome home " food package , out of these approx 400 returnees especially women and children stay at the centre . This centre of late has seen a vast improvement in the basic infrastructure after the visit by the HAC himself which resulted in vaccination campaign by MSF, provision of drinking water by UNHCR . The Min of rehabilitation has decided to close down this centre to prevent the increase in farming and squatting inside the National Park area. The closure deadline has however been extended now by a month.

(c) **Nyagatare Reception Centre.** The daily registration is around 1000 persons. The Min of rehabilitation has decided to have this as the only centre and to increase the size of this camp to accomodate almost a 1000 families . A medical centre is also proposed to be opened in this camp by Norwegian Refugee Trust. The basic infrastructure provided in this camp is much better than Matimba.

(d) **Veterinary Care.** The cattle crossing over from Uganda is being allowed inside Rwanda only after the production of an inoculation certificate . The cattle crossing over from Tanzania across the unmanned crossing is not inoculated against contagious bovine diseases. This cattle is in turn affecting the cattle stock of Rwanda . **Action NORD Sud** has been carrying out inoculations against **Contagious Bovine Pluero Pneumonia (PPCB)**, till date it has inoculated 114,749 heads of cattle within Byumba prefecture, but it needs more vaccinations.

(e) **Settlement Within National Park Area.** Increasing number of nomads are settling down inside the park area. Shanty towns with UNHCR plastic roofing is springing up within the park . These nomads are settling down with their herds of cattle and are creating problems of overgrazing and poaching . The govt has decided to settle returnees within the area West of the road to Kagitumba. This needs to be done systematically and will need lot of coordinated help from NGOs.

4. **MEDICAL SERVICES.** The medical services within the sector is amongst the best in Rwanda . All medical and sanitary posts that were functional before the war are functional now. The farthest one has to travel for medical aid is approx 12 Km , which may be a record for Africa. All medical aid is coordinated at a monthly meeting in the prefecture. The NGOs have been given communewise responsibilities. The last meeting was held on 22 Feb 95, wherein the salaries of the medical staff was discussed . The UNICEF rep thereafter requested the NGOs to provide refrigerators at med centres and to carry out inoculation of returnees. The overall shortfall is in drugs for treating treating diseases like TB , med eqpt , ambulances and electricity generators.

5. **SCHOOLS.** Primary schools in all communes are open and functioning . They however lack books , copies , teaching material and furniture. The buildings in most cases require repair of roofs. Secy schools are yet to open.

6. **FARMING ACTIVITIES.** The sector is producing food enough for the consumption of its population as well as surplus for other communes . They do not need food aid *per se* but need good quality seeds of the high yield variety. The returnees need seeds , farming implements and tools.

REQUEST FOR HELP FROM UNAMIR

10. **ENGR HELP.** The Refugee Trust Ireland has sought engr help from UNAMIR to repair the access road to Kyanza in Mugambazi commune. The work involved is dozer effort to fill in earth next to the berms at three places on the mountain track.

11. **FOOD FOR WORK.** The prefecture of Byumba initiated a feasibility study for community work on roads within Byumba Prefecture . amongst other agencies they approached UNAMIR to provide them with tools and implements through UNHCR . Food was to be provided by WFP.

CONCLUSION

12. We have been meeting all the NGOs with regular frequency and ironing out any kinks in the process that we detect from time to time . The requirement of such a meeting was long felt . This will enable us to coordinate our Humanatarian effort, and also give us an idea of what to expect from various NGOs. What is requested however is that a clear concept be formulated and guidelines given to coordinate the Humanatarian working in sectors.

CHAO

Again Sectors appear unaware of UNAMIR humanitarian capabilities. To get the equipment from UNAMIR would require the CAO to release funds to purchase the equipment demanded.


- The Rwandan Govt has been given monies from various govts and in this case they should be approached by the Ministry of Bridges and Roads for the necessary eqpt. If they cannot as a government provide the equipment then the Min of Rehab should approach UNDP/UNREO/SRSG for formal support including monies for salaries etc.



SUBJECT : REPORT ON MATIMBA AND NYAGATARE RECEPTION CENTRES

1. **BACKGROUND.** End Aug 94 the present Govt authorities granted permission to ADRA and WFP to establish reception centres in Northwest Rwanda. They were to distribute both food and non food items wef 01 Sep 94 to Dec 94. Food items provided by WFP and non food items by UNHCR. There has been a sudden increase in the inflow of refugees and now these reception centres are unable to cope with this.

2. **DISTRIBUTION PROJECT.** The initial assessment catered for 28,000 people upto 31 Dec 94. The actual figures on ground was 112,000 in 04 months time. At Nyagatare 05 centres with 47 distribution cells and at Matimba 03 centres with 20 distribution cells were formed for the purpose. The distribution was worked out on a 09 day cycle. 06 cycles from Nyagatare and 07 cycles from Matimba centre have been completed so far.

3. **SCALE OF ITEMS FOR DISTRIBUTION.**

(a) **Food Items (WFP)**

(i)	Maize Meal	360 gms per person (pp) X per day (pd)
(ii)	Maize Grain	400 gms pp X pd
(iii)	Beans	120 gms pp X pd
(iv)	Oil	125 ml pp X pd
(v)	Salt	005 gms pp X pd

(b) **Non Food Items (UNHCR)**

(i)	Kitchen set	1 per family
(ii)	Laundry soap	2 per family
(iii)	Jerry Can	2 per family
(iv)	Plastic sheet	1 per family

4. **LOCAL EMPLOYMENT.** 32 Local civilians were employed as distributors and paid 120 US\$ per month. For handling of Trucks and stores more were employed at 2 US\$ per day.

5. **TEACHERS FOOD FOR WORK PROGRAMME.** To rehabilitate Education in NE Rwanda, UNHCR and ADRA have undertaken a project for Teachers in NE Rwanda, 170 Teachers in 12 Schools are being benefited. Food is being given as salary, instead of money.

6. **TEMPORARY CLASSROOM.** Majority of schools were destroyed during the war. Temporary classrooms are being constructed by local help. Plastic sheeting is being used for roofing.

7. **RECEPTION CENTRES.** Reception centres were established at Nyagatare and Matimba in consultation with Ministry of Rehabilitation. The tasks of the centres are as follows :

- (a) Provide temporary accommodation, including latrines and kitchen.
- (b) Registration and identification of returnees.
- (c) Supply of 14 days ration by WFP.
- (d) Food items by UNHCR.
- (e) Coordinate movement of families to final destination in Rwanda by IOM and Ministry of Rehabilitation.
- (f) Supply water and firewood to returnees.

8. **INCREASE IN FLOW OF RETURNEES.** The increase in flow of returnees can be judged by the figures for month of Jan in respect of the Nyagatare Reception Centre.

From 01 to 07 Jan	890 Returnees
From 08 to 14 Jan	1090 Returnees
From 15 to 21 Jan	2344 Returnees
From 22 to 28 Jan	3375 Returnees


9. **DISTRIBUTION STATISTICS UPTO 01 JAN 95.**

10. **PRESENT STATUS.** The sudden increase in the flow of returnees has resulted in the reception centres being unable to cope with the situation . The problems faced by he returnees interned in these centres are as under :-

- (a) Lack of potable water.
- (b) Lack of sanitary facilities.
- (c) Lack of adequate Shelter.
- (d) Inadequate bedding.

11. **FUTURE PLANS.** Project in hand is in the form of Seed Protection Distribution Programme . This was to start in mid Jan but did not take off , it was anticipated that this would start by 07 Feb . The project had to be launched prematurely at Tabagwe and Shonga by 31 Jan 95 to cater for the last week of planting season for Shorgum seeds.



RELATED TO HEALTH-ADMINISTRATION AND TREATMENT

A. HEALTH

Mukarange Commune has two Health Centres; Mukomo, located in southeast of the Commune Office, at the border with Bwisige Commune and Kinyami. Both neighbouring Communes use this Health Centre. Mukarange does not take much advantage of this centre. Only few of its Sectors, MUKOMO (5585 inhabitants) and a part of Bushara and Nyabishamba, use this centre.

The Health Centre of Rushaki is located in the north of Mukarange, at the border with Kiyombe Commune. It is the population of this neighbouring commune which benefits much. The population living in the centre of the commune does not get medical cares.

A1. WISH

We are requesting with insistence a dispensary at the centre of the commune, next to the Commune Office, which would develop into a health centre. The population of Mushara Sector (5747 residents), Shangasha Sector (3692 residents), Mukarange Sector (6318 residents), part of Nyabishamba Sector (2722 residents), Mugina Sector and Bugwe (4604 residents), (about 25000 residents), would benefit from this centre easily. The two centres mentioned above do not serve much the population of the sheltering commune.

B. ADMINISTRATION

There is no Commune Office, i.e. it was destroyed by the war. The iron-sheets, doors and windows are very important. The Commune Staff (Bourgmestre, Vice-Bourgmestre, Secretary, Sector Counsellors) have not been payed their salaries since 3 July 1994. The Staff is patient, but the work is hard. The Commune Officials have no adequate means of transport (vehicle, motor-cycle, bicycle) which can easily help them to be on duty. The staff just walk from home to the office. There is no necessary equipment in the office (typewriters, stationery and alike).

Conclusion

Mukarange Commune is economically poor. It has nothing and needs financial assistance to cope with the current situation. We rely on your prompt understanding.




