

1. It is observed in the Team Director's report of the 1 April 1946, that a party of Polish ex prisoners of war have been admitted to the Camp. It is not clear whether these are in fact discharged RAMPS, or prisoners of war. If they are the former, we should be glad to know that Gen. Morgan's requirements in regard to admission of discharged RAMPS have been complied with; if the latter an explanation as to why it was necessary to admit this party, and their present status, would be appreciated.
