### SECRETARY-GENERAL TO PAY OFFICIAL WORKING VISIT TO FRANCE AND TO ATTEND ACC MEETING IN GENEVA

The following statement was made today by the Spokesman for Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar:

At the invitation of the French Government, Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar will pay an official working visit to Paris from 23 to 25 April.

During this visit, the Secretary-General will meet with President François Mitterrand; the President of the French Senate, Alain Poher; Prime Minister Laurent Fabius; President of the French National Assembly, Louis Mermaz; and the Mayor of Paris, Jacques Chirac.

The Secretary-General will also have talks with Foreign Minister Roland Dumas, and participate in a hearing of the National Assembly's Foreign Relations Commission.

On Tuesday, 23 April, the Secretary-General will address a dinner given in his honour by the United Nations Association of France and the French Diplomatic Academy.

On Wednesday, 24 April, the Secretary-General will receive an honorary degree from the University of La Sorbonne.

On Monday, 22 April, and Tuesday, 23 April, the Secretary-General will preside over the regular meeting of the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination (ACC) at the Palais des Nations in Geneva. During his stay in Geneva, the Secretary-General will also address the United Nations Association of Switzerland and the University of Geneva.

The Secretary-General will return to New York on Thursday, 25 April.
