



1. Aim. The aim of the patrol 'KHABAR -XIV' was to familiarise with areas bordering Sector 1 and 6 and study living conditions of the inhabitants and problems faced by them.

2. Tasks. The following tasks were assigned to the patrol :-

- (a) To gain information on the following :-
- (i) All kind of activities civil and military including DPs, movement and location of RPA etc.
 - (ii) Condition of roads and tracks.
 - (iii) Any other information of intelligence value.
- (b) Humanitarian Task .
- (i) School material. To distribute school material in Mugambazi and Mbogo communes.
 - (ii) Medical Aid. To provide medical aid in Mugambazi and Mbogo communes and to the orphans at Gat-sata orphanage.

3. Strength. The strength of the patrol was as under (Nominal roll attached as appx 'A').

- (a) Officers - Three (incl RMO)
- (b) JCO - One.
- (c) Other Ranks - Eleven (incl Nursing Assistant)
- (d) Interpreter (civil) - One.

5. Date and time.

- (a) Time out - 0700h 10 Mar 95
- (b) Time in - 1800h 10 Mar 95

7. Route. The route (Sketch 'P' attached) taken by the patrol was as under :-

- (a) Soaltee - GR 798830
- (b) Nyamugali - GR 709867
- (c) Gat-sata - GR 709872
- (d) Kabuye - GR 735913
- (e) Ngiriyi - GR 715956
- (f) Masoro - GR 732983
- (g) Rutongo - GR 718986
- (h) Mugambazi - GR 705997
- (j) Mbogo - GR 969040

8. Incidents, observations and Activities.

(a) RPA. The patrol encountered two road blocks enroute ie at the road junction at Nyacyonga in sq 7593 and at Masoro in sq 7398. The strength at each road block was between 8 to 10 soldiers with 3 to 4 soldiers at a time being at the road block. There was only one RPA soldier seen at Mugambazi commune. HQ whereas there were five at Mbogo commune HQ.

(b) FRGF & Militia. No activities seen/reported.

(c) Civil population. People have overcome the effect of war and resumed normal activities. The area is fairly well inhabited, those who were displaced during war are now returning.

(d) Govt Offices, Schools and dispensaries. The commune Headquarters were fully functional and all the officials were present. The Murambi ~~Sous~~-prefect HQ offices are also co-located along with the Mugambazi commune HQ offices. The buildings of offices are well built and in good condition. There was no effect/damage of war seen on the buildings. There is a hospital at Rutongo which is fully functional and is providing medical help to approx 50 to 100 patients daily. The details of schools, students and teachers in Mugambazi and Mbogo communes are attached as appces 'D' and 'E' respectively.

(e) Roads and Tracks. The national highway beyond the township limits is in good condition and the patrol did not notice any damage. The road from Nyacyonga to Mbogo is unmetalled fair weather road however is maintained well and in good state of use.

(f) Prisons. The patrol noticed prisons in both the commune HQ locations which were being guarded by RPA soldiers. There were 28 prisoners reported in Mugambazi commune HQ and 30 to 35 prisoners in the prison at Mbogo commune HQ. The prisoners were detained in small rooms. The prisoners were reported to have taken part in the genocide/robberies during the war. The authorities declined answering any questions about these prisons/prisoners.

9. Humanitarian Tasks. The following Humanitarian tasks were carried out by the patrol :-

(a) Distribution of school material. The patrol distributed school material in both the communes, details are attached as appces 'B' & 'C' to this report.

(b) Medical Aid. The patrol provided medical aid in both the communes which was highly appreciated by all. Medical aid was also provided to the orphans at the Gat-sata orphanage which is being run by "Communate Emmaus".

(c) Rations. Some rations which have been spared by troops by periodic fasting is being donated to the orphans at Gat-sata orphanage. The total strength of the orphans at Gat-sata orphanage is 61.

(d) Mass Graves. There are two mass graves in the campus of Gat-sata orphanage. There are about 50 to 100 bodies buried in these mass graves.

10. Problems. The locals brought out the following problems into the notice of the patrol :-

(a) Food. The locals requested for some help in terms of rations.

(b) Medical. The medical aid provided by the patrol was highly appreciated by the locals and requested that such help could be provided more frequently.

(c) Payment to teachers. It was requested if the case of long due salaries to the teachers and the staff could be processed.

(d) Employment. Lot of youth approached for employment in UNAMIR.

11. Conclusion. It has been noticed by the various patrols going to the remote areas of the various communes that the locals come forward to give information only when they are provided with some help in terms of rations, teaching materials, medical aid and by offering some employment opportunities. Since the patrols are an important source of information with reference to area familiarization, studying culture and habits of people and knowing their problems, it is recommended that more such resources be made available to the patrols to complete their tasks effectively.


