General

Security Incidents - Verbal reports of 05 families returning to Kibeho direct from home communities (as a result of security / harassment) has not been confirmed by HQ UNAMIR.

Security Council. The 6 Mar informal consultations focused on Rwanda. A report of the mission was tabled as a result of the Council representative visit of 12/13 Feb 95. No action was required of the Council. In brief the Council concluded that the Rwandan Govt should intensify efforts (and continue the lead role) regarding security for refugees/returnees. The Rwandan representative also reminded the Council that Rwanda now had a multi-party National Govt, open to all except those guilty of humanitarian crimes. The Govt had also engaged, without assistance, some 3,000 former armed forces. Further to the Council report, concerns of National Security, return of refugees (not politically based); the judiciary (lack of qualified persons); properly rights (new and old case refugees claims) and the arms embargo (restricting security capabilities) were highlighted as major concerns of the Govt. France further developed judicially discussion, suggesting international assistance to provide French-speaking magistrates and court officers.

Administration

IOC Staffing. The MINIREGIS full time representation is now six staff with another Ops member commencing training today.

Information Acquisition - AUGMED (Med Ops) has released data bases for use by IOC and will continue to provide regular updates. WHO are expected to release their complete information base this week.

Transport Cell - The Transport Cell Meeting in Gisenyi has resulted in another meeting to be conducted in Kigali on Tue 14 Mar 95 with MINIREGIS staff. Focus will be on Refugee repatriation. Details of both meetings will be forwarded.

The Bourgmestre could not give the population figures for the Commune. However, he stated that more returnees are settling in the Commune. The Commune does not have an ORC. The returnees prefer going straight to their homes. The returnees without houses are kept at Muyongoro sector before they are rehabilitated. Presently, there are 84 families (387 people) awaiting resettlement. The Bourgmestre expressed concern that some people preferred staying in DP camps because they were involved in genocide and NGOs provide them with all basic requirements.

HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITY.

10. The bourgmestre Mr Phillipe Ngambara complained that Milobs have not been visiting the Commune since December, 94 because through such visits he could have been asking for assistance.

In Huye Commune the NGOs operating there are Caritas which distributes Agriculture implements and food, and Terre Des Hommes responsible for the orphanage. There are 250 orphans at Sovu sector. The Commune does not have a clinic. Patients have to be treated at Matyazo sector in Ngoma Commune.

Farming activities are progressing on very well. People are expecting some good yield during harvest. However, people who are returning from DP camps will not have anything, and therefore, there is a requirement to forecast on how to assist them.

STATE OF ROADS AND BRIDGES.

11. Most of the Roads and Bridges are trafficable. However, the condition becomes bad during rainy season. Voluntary work is quite in progress in maintaining the roads and bridges.

CIVIL AFFAIRS.

12. A. Before the war Six Primary schools were functional, but now only Three are open. There is a serious shortage of teaching materials.

B. The Commune does not have electricity now because the electrical lines were damaged during the war and have yet to be repaired. The water system was also disrupted during war. Meanwhile, people collect water from streams.

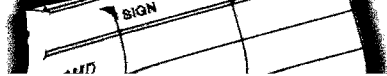

i. DETENTION OF UNAMIR VEHS AFTER GETTING INVOLVED IN ACCIDENTS. THE COMMANDER ASSURED THE MILOBS TO WORK JOINTLY WITH UNAMIR CIV POL TO SORT OUT THE MISUNDERSTANDINGS IN SUCH CASES.
