Le Ministre des Affaires étrangères de la République du Congo présente ses compliments à Monsieur le Chargé de la Mission des Nations Unies au Congo et, se référant aux conversations qui se sont déroulées à Léopoldville du 1^{er} janvier au 1^{er} février 1964, au cours des réunions de la commission tripartite créée sur la demande du Gouvernement congolais et chargée d'arrêter les modalités de la reprise - remise des bases de Kamina et du Bas-Congo, a l'honneur d'exposer ce qui suit.

Le Ministre porte à la connaissance de Monsieur le Chargé de la Mission que le Gouvernement congolais est parvenu avec le Gouvernement du Royaume de Belgique à un accord au sujet de ces bases et les installations y érigées, accord qui est constitué par un ^{accord} ~~convention~~ signé le 1^{er} février 1964, ainsi que par l'échange de lettres portant la même date.

Le Ministre confirme, en outre, son accord, et ce qui est des modalités de la reprise - remise des bases et des installations, que l'Organisation des Nations Unies se dessaisisse de l'administration temporaire des bases, qu'elle assume actuellement, en faveur de la Belgique et que cette dernière remette les bases immédiatement au Congo.

Le Gouvernement Central a fait savoir publiquement et à maintes reprises, qu'il entendait faire pleine et entière lumière, non seulement sur la mort de feu Patrice Lumumba, mais aussi sur tous les assassinats perpétrés au cours de mois tragiques pendant lesquels le Congo s'est débattu dans une crise dramatique, due notamment à la trahison de certains de ses enfants qui n'ont pas hésité à nier l'existence de la République et à prétendre tailler son territoire en régions étrangères les unes aux autres.

Cette volonté de faire surgir la vérité et de poursuivre les crimes, le Gouvernement Central l'a concrétisée en ouvrant en 1961 une enquête sur la mort de feu Patrice Lumumba et de Maurice ^oMplo et Joseph Okito. Une action judiciaire avait même été ouverte contre Tshombe et consorts supposés du meurtre de ces trois personnes.

L'enquête et l'action judiciaire ont été entravées par la volonté délibérée de sabotage du Procureur Général Janssen d'Elisabethville qui, obéissant visiblement aux maîtres de la sécession katangaise, refusa

obstinément d'entreprendre les actions qui lui étaient demandées par le Ministère congolais de la Justice et par le Parquet Général de Léopoldville, actions qui entraient cependant dans les devoirs de sa charge. Une correspondance qui se trouve aux mains du Gouvernement Central prouve clairement ces faits et établit la mauvaise foi du Procureur Général Janssen et surtout de ses commettants katangais. La volonté de ces derniers d'étouffer la vérité, en faisant la vérité, en faisant obstacle à l'enquête, jette un jour particulièrement accablant pour eux dans cette affaire.

En dépit de cette obstruction, la justice congolaise a pu cependant réunir un certain nombre de pièces. Il existe notamment ce que l'on ignore, en général, un interrogatoire de Moïse Tshombe fait en 1961 et dont il ressort que jamais celui-ci ne reçut du Président Kasa-Vubu ni d'un Ministre du Gouvernement Central, la moindre instruction ou suggestion de procéder au meurtre de Lumumba et qui souligne qu'en arrivant à Elisabethville les trois prisonniers se trouvaient en bonne santé. Cet interrogatoire prouve aussi que les autorités katangaises de la sécession avaient décidé de conserver sur leur territoire - à quelle fin, on le sait aujourd'hui - les trois détenus.

Les conditions de la fin de la sécession katangaise, et la volonté du Gouvernement Central de respecter l'amnistie et la réconciliation demandées par Moïse Tshombe et ses amis, et surtout recommandées par l'Organisation des Nations-Unies, le désir des autorités de Léopoldville d'observer, jusqu'au scrupule, les décisions de la plus haute instance internationale, ont empêché, depuis janvier 1963 jusqu'au aujourd'hui, le Gouvernement Central de rendre publics les éléments de ~~l'enquête de~~ l'enquête que ses magistrats ont pu réunir et de poursuivre l'action judiciaire.

Aujourd'hui que Moïse Tshombe lui-même a décidé de parler publiquement de l'assassinat de feu Patrice Lumumba et de ses amis, aujourd'hui qu'il a la tragique imprudence de rejeter la responsabilité du meurtre sur le Gouvernement Central, ce dernier se sent libéré des entraves que lui imposait le respect des recommandations des Nations-Unies et a décidé de reprendre l'enquête et l'action judiciaire déjà entamées.

Si Tshombe est ^{innocent}, comme il le proclame, il ne lui sert à rien d'agiter la presse internationale. Il lui suffit de rentrer au Congo et de mettre à la disposition de la justice les éléments dont il dispose pour éclaircir celle-ci.

Que lui-même et ses amis songent, en tous cas, que désormais la justice congolaise est en marche et que rien ne pourra l'arrêter et l'empêcher de condamner les coupables qu'ils soient sur le territoire de la République ou à l'étranger.

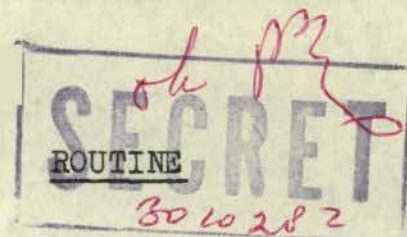

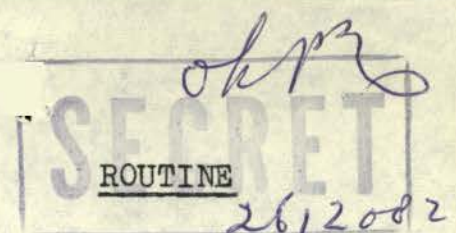

Rescue operation was put under command of UN/ANC Liaison Officer who together with eleven men of 1 Bn Nigerian Army for safeguarding purposes during the evacuation operation left LEO for TSHIKAPA (GR 2076 0639) in the morning 24 Jan .

Operation was successfully carried out and in addition to the nine missionary people three religious sisters were also rescued .

1. AS MENTIONED IN D-29, MULELE JEUNESSE HAVE BEEN CAUSING UNREST IN KWILU RECENTLY. SITUATION HAS NOW FURTHER WORSENER AS JEUNESSE BECOME BOLDER IN TERRORIST ACTS AND ANC SEEM UNABLE TO CHECK THEM. STATE OF EMERGENCY WAS PROCLAIMED 21 JANUARY AND ANC REINFORCEMENT NOW AMOUNT TO ABOUT TWO COMPANIES, BUT SO FAR TERRORISM CONTINUES UNABATED.

2. AMERICAN EMBASSY INFORMED 23 JANUARY AMERICAN MISSION STATIONED AT KANDALE BURNT BY JEUNESSE AND THEY REQUESTED OUR ASSISTANCE TO RESCUE NINE AMERICANS INCLUDING TWO CHILDREN, STRANDED THERE IN PRECARIOUS CONDITIONS. AFTER EXAMINING CAREFULLY SITUATION, WE DECIDED TO UNDERTAKE RESCUE OPERATION. COL MAYER INSTRUCTED TO CARRY OUT OPERATION WITH ONE OTTER AND TWO HELI.
