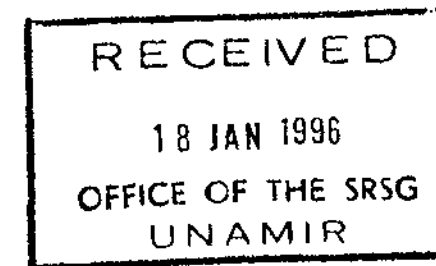

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 314. ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE 646 CAME FROM BURUNDI ON 16 JAN 96. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT H.E. THE PRIME MINISTER CONTINUES HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO VARIOUS EUROPEAN COUNTRIES> HE WAS RECEIVED IN SWITZERLAND BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE CONFEDERATION WITH WHOM HE DISCUSSED THE NECESSITY TO REINFORCE SWISS COOPERATION FOR RWANDA> IT WAS DECIDED THAT IN EARLY FEBRUARY A SWISS DELEGATION WILL VISIT RWANDA SO AS TO PREPARE A REPORT TO BE PRESENTED TO THE SWISS FEDERAL COUNCIL WHICH ORGAN WILL DECIDE ON THE MODALITIES OF FUTURE COOPERATION

B. THE BIMONTHLY INDEPENDENT MAGAZINE "RENAISSANCE" DEDICATES ITS FRONT PAGE OF ITS JANUARY/FEBRUARY EDITION TO UNAMIR WITH A HEADLINE THAT READS "UNAMIR: WHEN IT IS HERE WE ARE CONTENT, WHEN IT GOES WE ARE HAPPY". UNAMIR IS THE SUBJECT OF THE EDITORIAL AND OF A FULL PAGE ARTICLE, WHICH APPEARS TO BE BALANCED AND GIVE A MORE POSITIVE IMAGE OF UNAMIR THAN WHAT IS THE NORM FOR SOME OTHER MEDIA IN THE COUNTRY. WHILE STATING THAT PART OF THE POPULATION CANNOT FORGIVE UNAMIR FOR WHAT THEY CONSIDER ITS PASSIVITY IN CONTEMPLATING HOW THE GENOCIDE WAS CARRIED OUT THE IMPORTANT ROLE OF UNAMIR IN PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO THE RECONSTRUCTION OF RWANDA IS ACKNOWLEDGED BY GIVING A LIST OF SOME OF THE ACHIEVEMENT OF THE MISSION.

C. A SEMINAR ON " CULTURE FOR PEACE" ORGANIZED BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION WITH SUPPORT FROM UNESCO IS CURRENTLY BEING HELD IN KIGALI. PARTICIPANTS AT THE SEMINAR WILL DEBATE OVER THE ISSUES OF EDUCATION GEARED TOWARDS CULTURE FOR PEACE. INFORMATION COMMUNICATION AND DEMOCRACY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IN GASEKE COMMUNE (GR 4904), LOCALS REPORTED THAT ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA FOR ALLEGEDLY INQUIRING WHY A FRIEND OF HIS WAS ARRESTED EARLIER ON.

B. FRGE/MILITIA/BANDITRY. IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AT GORA (GR 2712) IN THE COMMUNE OF KANAMA, ONE MAN WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED BY SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE ON 15 JAN 96. NO FURTHER DETAILS AVAILABLE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE ACTING FC HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE LEGAL TEAM WHICH ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 17 JAN 96.

5. HUMANITARIAN.

A. 651 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM BUTARE AND NAKAMIRA. 17 RETURNEES DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 665 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS AND A PICK UP TO KIBUNGO PRISON AUTHORITIES TO SHIFT 90 PRISONERS FROM RUSUMO COMMUNE CACHOTS TO KIBUNGO PRISON.

C. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH FOR REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMP SITE IN BUTARE. IT ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FUEL WOOD.

D. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FUEL WOOD.

C. MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 132 MEDICAL AND 14 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS NTR.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL. IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), THE THIEVES WHO BROKE INTO ZAMBIAN/NIGERIAN MILOBS HOUSE ON 16 JAN 96 HAVE NOW BEEN IDENTIFIED. LOCAL AUTHORITIES ARE MAKING EFFORTS TO APPREHEND CULPRITS.

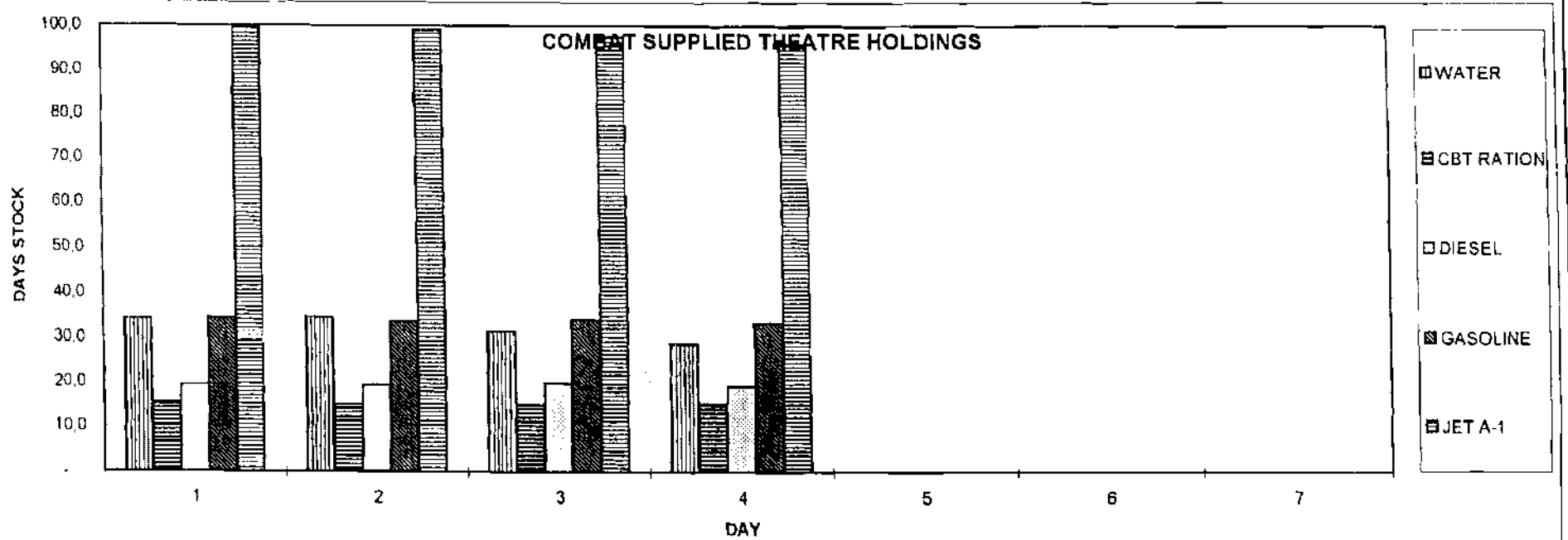

1. HIGHLIGHTS

THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 676. 316 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND, 360 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 09 JAN 96 TO 15 JAN 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES AT A NORMAL SCALE.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 3637 OUT OF WHICH 2247 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 1266 FROM BURUNDI AND 124 FROM UGANDA. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 11 JAN 96, THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED JUDGE GOLDSTONE TO MEET WITH THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA. THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR PAID A COURTESY VISIT TO THE SRSG AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS.

B. ON 11 JAN 96 RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA HAD REVEALED THREE NAMES OF GENOCIDE SUSPECTS, CURRENTLY DETAINED IN BELGIUM. THE SUSPECTS ARE THE FORMER BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGANZA COMMUNE, MR ELIE NDAYAMBAJE, THE FORMER BOURGEMESTRE OF NGOMA COMMUNE, MR JOSEPH KANYABASHI AND MR ALPHONSE HIGANIRO A FORMER MINISTER OF THE HABYARIMANA GOVERNMENT.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 12 JAN 96 THAT THE US SENATOR NANCY KASSEBAUM MET THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENSE MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME AND DISCUSSED PROBLEMS OF JUSTICE, BILATERAL COOPERATION, THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA AND THE REPATRIATION OF OLD AND NEW CASELOAD REFUGEES.

D. ON 14 JAN 96, RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT H.E PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU CLOSED A SEMINAR FOR THE BOURGMESTRES WHICH LASTED A WEEK. THE CLOSING SESSION WAS ATTENDED BY HIGH PERSONALITIES SUCH AS H.E THE PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, H.E THE VICE-PRIME MINISTER AND VARIOUS REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS ACCREDITED TO RWANDA. THE SEMINAR ISSUED VARIOUS RECOMMENDATIONS GEARED TOWARDS INCREASING THE ROLE OF THE COMMUNES AND THEIR BOURGMESTRES IN THE POST-WAR ADMINISTRATION IN RWANDA. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU'S CLOSING

REMARKS CENTERED ON SIX MAIN POINTS, THE RECONSTRUCTION AND REHABILITATION OF THE COUNTRY, THE FUNCTIONING OF THE JUSTICE SYSTEM, SECURITY, NATIONAL RECONCILIATION, PROBLEMS POSED BY PROPERTY ISSUES AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE COUNTRY. THE ROLE OF THE BOURGMESTRE AS THE LINK BETWEEN THE STATE AND THE CITIZENRY WAS EMPHASIZED, WHICH LEADS TO AN EXIGENCY FOR ABSOLUTE TRANSPARENCY IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE COMMUNES.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AT MUHANDA GR 2419, A JUDGE IN THE FORMER GOVERNMENT WAS ARRESTED ON 08 JAN 96 FOR REASONS NOT YET KNOWN. HR INFORMED.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA IN KARAGO COMMUNE (4516) FOR REFUSING TO GIVE AWAY HIS LIVESTOCK TO RPA AUTHORITIES. IT WAS REPORTED THAT RPA HAS RESORTED TO BEATING LOCALS WHO REFUSE TO SURRENDER THEIR COWS TO THE RPA. IN THE SAME COMMUNE, TEN PERSONS WERE ARRESTED ON ROBBERY CHARGES AND NINE FOR ASSEMBLING FOR PRAYERS AFTER CURFEW.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), THREE PERSONS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE RUHUNDO (6937) AND NYANGA (7138) ARMS CACHE INCIDENT AND ARE NOW BEING HELD IN THE RPA DETENTION CAMP AT RUHENGIERI.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IN KABATWA (GR3228), THE MSF CLINIC HAS BEEN CLOSED REPORTEDLY DUE TO CONSTANT RPA THREATS. THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER WAS NOT AWARE OF THE THREATS BUT WAS AWARE THAT THE CLINIC HAD BEEN CLOSED DOWN.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE COUNSELLOR OF RWII GR 4400 WAS KILLED BY INSURGENTS ON 06 JAN 96. MOTIVE BEHIND THE KILLING IS NOT KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), INDBATT REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 08/09 JAN 96, BETWEEN 2350 HRS AND 0140 HRS, SOUNDS OF CONTINUOUS AUTOMATIC FIRE WERE HEARD IN THE ADEPR WAREHOUSE COMPLEX IN GIKONDO DURING AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY. TWO GUARDS AND THREE ROBBERS WERE KILLED IN THE INCIDENT. DETAILS BEING INVESTIGATED.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED ON 09 JAN 96, THAT RPA IN AN ENCOUNTER WITH FOUR FORMER MILITIA MEMBERS, KILLED THREE AND ARRESTED ONE. ONE HAND GRENADE WAS RECOVERED FROM THE DETAINEE. FURTHER, AN ARMS CACHE

OF 16 AK 47 AND M16 RIFLES (ALL WITHOUT MAGAZINES) WAS DISCOVERED. ANTI PERSONAL MINES WERE ALSO RECOVERED FROM DIFFERENT LOCATIONS. THE WEAPONS WERE ALLEGEDLY RECEIVED BY A PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHER WHO IS PRESENTLY IN HIDING.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

- (1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.
- (2) MILOBS SECTOR HQs AT BYUMBA, KIBUYE, RUHENGARI AND GIKONGORO CLOSED DOWN AS PART OF THE NEW DEPLOYMENT.
- (3) ON 10 JAN 96, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED A JOINT MEETING HELD BETWEEN THE RWANDAN GOVT OFFICIALS AND THE SRSG. HE ALSO VISITED NORMED AND GHANCOY II TO DISCUSS THEIR OPERATIONAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROBLEMS.
- (4) ON 11 JAN 96, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD SEPARATE MEETINGS WITH BELGIUM AMBASSADOR AND RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE WORLD BANK.
- (5) THE SRSG LEFT THE MISSION AREA ON 12 JAN 95 FOR HOME LEAVE AND DUTY TO NEW YORK.
- (6) ON 12 JAN THE ACTING FC VISITED SHAGASHA TO BRIEF MALAWICOY AND NICOY ON THE PULL OUT OF MALAWICOY AND ESTABLISHMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE BASES.

D. OTHER SECTORS FROM 11 JAN 96, ALL REF IS BEING DONE AS PER THE REDESIGNATED SECTORS (NEW REDEPLOYMENT) IN PLACE OF THE OLD ONES.



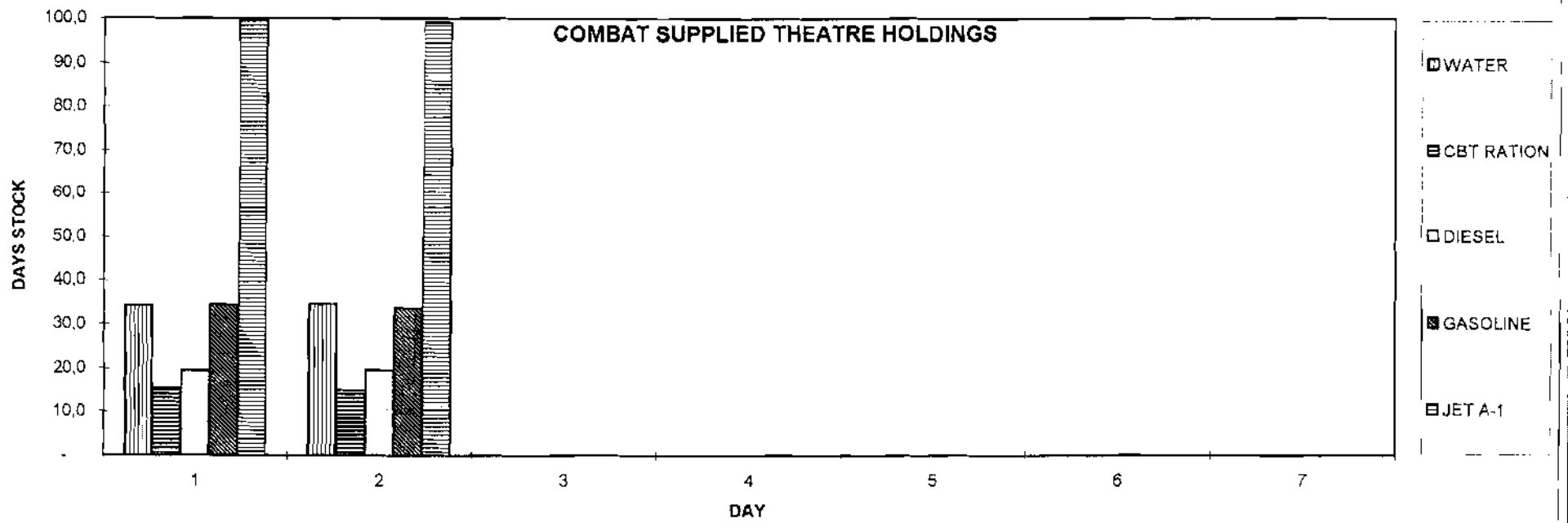

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 09 JAN 96 TO 15 JAN 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES AT A NORMAL SCALE.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 3637 OUT OF WHICH 2247 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 1266 FROM BURUNDI AND 124 FROM UGANDA. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 11 JAN 96, THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED JUDGE GOLDSTONE TO MEET WITH THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA. THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR PAID A COURTESY VISIT TO THE SRSG AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS.

B. ON 11 JAN 96 RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA HAD REVEALED THREE NAMES OF GENOCIDE SUSPECTS, CURRENTLY DETAINED IN BELGIUM. THE SUSPECTS ARE THE FORMER BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGANZA COMMUNE, MR ELIE NDAYAMBAJE, THE FORMER BOURGEMESTRE OF NGOMA COMMUNE, MR JOSEPH KANYABASHI AND MR ALPHONSE HIGANIRO A FORMER MINISTER OF THE HABYARIMANA GOVERNMENT.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 12 JAN 96 THAT THE US SENATOR NANCY KASSEBAUM MET THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENSE MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME AND DISCUSSED PROBLEMS OF JUSTICE, BILATERAL COOPERATION, THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA AND THE REPATRIATION OF OLD AND NEW CASELOAD REFUGEES.

D. ON 14 JAN 96, RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT H.E PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU CLOSED A SEMINAR FOR THE BOURGEMESTRES WHICH LASTED A WEEK. THE CLOSING SESSION WAS ATTENDED BY HIGH PERSONALITIES SUCH AS H.E THE PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, H.E THE VICE-PRIME MINISTER AND VARIOUS REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS ACCREDITED TO RWANDA. THE SEMINAR ISSUED VARIOUS RECOMMENDATIONS GEARED TOWARDS INCREASING THE ROLE OF THE COMMUNES AND THEIR BOURGEMESTRES IN THE POST-WAR ADMINISTRATION IN RWANDA. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU'S CLOSING

REMARKS CENTERED ON SIX MAIN POINTS, THE RECONSTRUCTION AND REHABILITATION OF THE COUNTRY, THE FUNCTIONING OF THE JUSTICE SYSTEM, SECURITY, NATIONAL RECONCILIATION, PROBLEMS POSED BY PROPERTY ISSUES AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE COUNTRY. THE ROLE OF THE BOURGMESTRE AS THE LINK BETWEEN THE STATE AND THE CITIZENRY WAS EMPHASIZED, WHICH LEADS TO AN EXIGENCY FOR ABSOLUTE TRANSPARENCY IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE COMMUNES.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AT MUHANDA GR 2419, A JUDGE IN THE FORMER GOVERNMENT WAS ARRESTED ON 08 JAN 96 FOR REASONS NOT YET KNOWN. HR INFORMED.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA IN KARAGO COMMUNE (4516) FOR REFUSING TO GIVE AWAY HIS LIVESTOCK TO RPA AUTHORITIES. IT WAS REPORTED THAT RPA HAS RESORTED TO BEATING LOCALS WHO REFUSE TO SURRENDER THEIR COWS TO THE RPA. IN THE SAME COMMUNE, TEN PERSONS WERE ARRESTED ON ROBBERY CHARGES AND NINE FOR ASSEMBLING FOR PRAYERS AFTER CURFEW.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), THREE PERSONS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE RUHUNDO (6937) AND NYANGA (7138) ARMS CACHE INCIDENT AND ARE NOW BEING HELD IN THE RPA DETENTION CAMP AT RUHENGARI.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IN KABATWA (GR3228), THE MSF CLINIC HAS BEEN CLOSED REPORTEDLY DUE TO CONSTANT RPA THREATS. THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER WAS NOT AWARE OF THE THREATS BUT WAS AWARE THAT THE CLINIC HAD BEEN CLOSED DOWN.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE COUNSELLOR OF RWII GR 4400 WAS KILLED BY INSURGENTS ON 06 JAN 96. MOTIVE BEHIND THE KILLING IS NOT KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), INDBATT REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 08/09 JAN 96, BETWEEN 2350 HRS AND 0140 HRS, SOUNDS OF CONTINUOUS AUTOMATIC FIRE WERE HEARD IN THE ADEPR WAREHOUSE COMPLEX IN GIKONDO DURING AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY. TWO GUARDS AND THREE ROBBERS WERE KILLED IN THE INCIDENT. DETAILS BEING INVESTIGATED.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED ON 09 JAN 96, THAT RPA IN AN ENCOUNTER WITH FOUR FORMER MILITIA MEMBERS, KILLED THREE AND ARRESTED ONE. ONE HAND GRENADE WAS RECOVERED FROM THE DETAINEE. FURTHER, AN ARMS CACHE

OF 16 AK 47 AND M16 RIFLES (ALL WITHOUT MAGAZINES) WAS DISCOVERED. ANTI PERSONAL MINES WERE ALSO RECOVERED FROM DIFFERENT LOCATIONS. THE WEAPONS WERE ALLEGEDLY RECEIVED BY A PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHER WHO IS PRESENTLY IN HIDING.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

- (1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.
- (2) MILOBS SECTOR HQs AT BYUMBA, KIBUYE, RUHENGARI AND GIKONGORO CLOSED DOWN AS PART OF THE NEW DEPLOYMENT.
- (3) ON 10 JAN 96, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED A JOINT MEETING HELD BETWEEN THE RWANDAN GOVT OFFICIALS AND THE SRSG. HE ALSO VISITED NORMED AND GHANCOY II TO DISCUSS THEIR OPERATIONAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROBLEMS.
- (4) ON 11 JAN 96, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD SEPARATE MEETINGS WITH BELGIUM AMBASSADOR AND RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE WORLD BANK.
- (5) THE SRSG LEFT THE MISSION AREA ON 12 JAN 95 FOR HOME LEAVE AND DUTY TO NEW YORK.
- (6) ON 12 JAN THE ACTING FC VISITED SHAGASHA TO BRIEF MALAWICOY AND NICOY ON THE PULL OUT OF MALAWICOY AND ESTABLISHMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE BASES.

D. OTHER SECTORS FROM 11 JAN 96, ALL REF IS BEING DONE AS PER THE REDESIGNATED SECTORS (NEW REDEPLOYMENT) IN PLACE OF THE OLD ONES.

- A. A TOTAL OF 54 VEHs WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.
- B. A TOTAL OF 153 REFUGEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.
- C. A TOTAL OF 1644 MEDICAL AND 101 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY MED CENTRES IN VARIOUS SECTORS.
- D. FORCE ENGR COY CARRIED OUT RECCE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FENCING AROUND AMAHORO STADIUM AS REQUESTED BY THE GOVT OF RWANDA. CARRIED OUT RECCE OF MUTOVU ROAD FROM THE BORDER TO THE MAIN GISENYI-RUHENGARI TARMAC ROAD AND FOR DOZER WORK FOR APPROACH ROAD TO CYANGUGU TRANSIT CAMP.
- E. IN SECTOR 1 (KIBUNGO), UNHCR PROVIDED 2030 IRON SHEETS AND NAILS TO BUILD HOUSES IN KABARONDO COMMUNE.

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL. ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

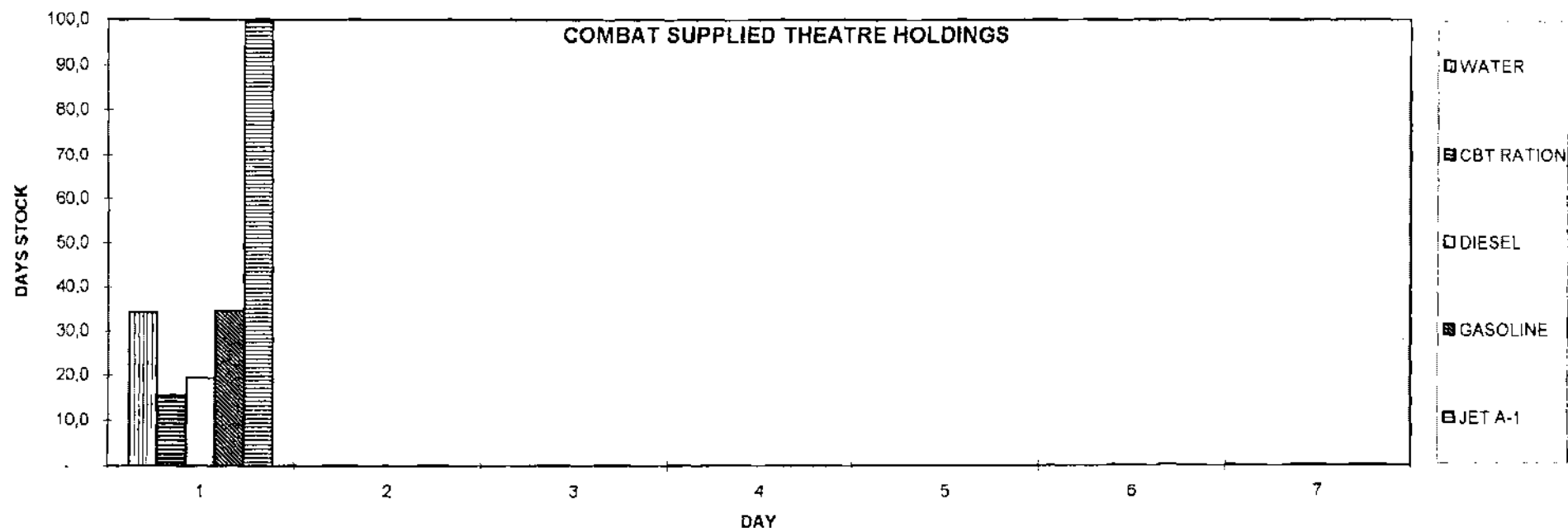
COMBAT SUPPLIES USAGE AND STOCK CHARTS

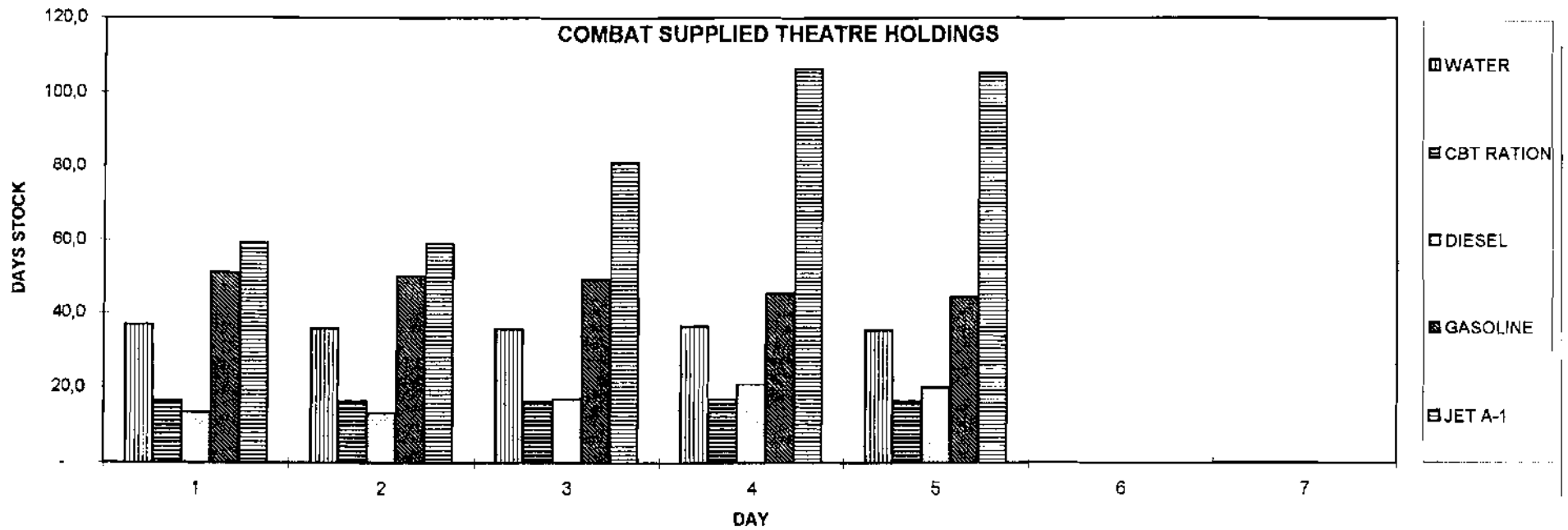

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 937. 328 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 609 FROM BURUNDI ON 09 JAN 96. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

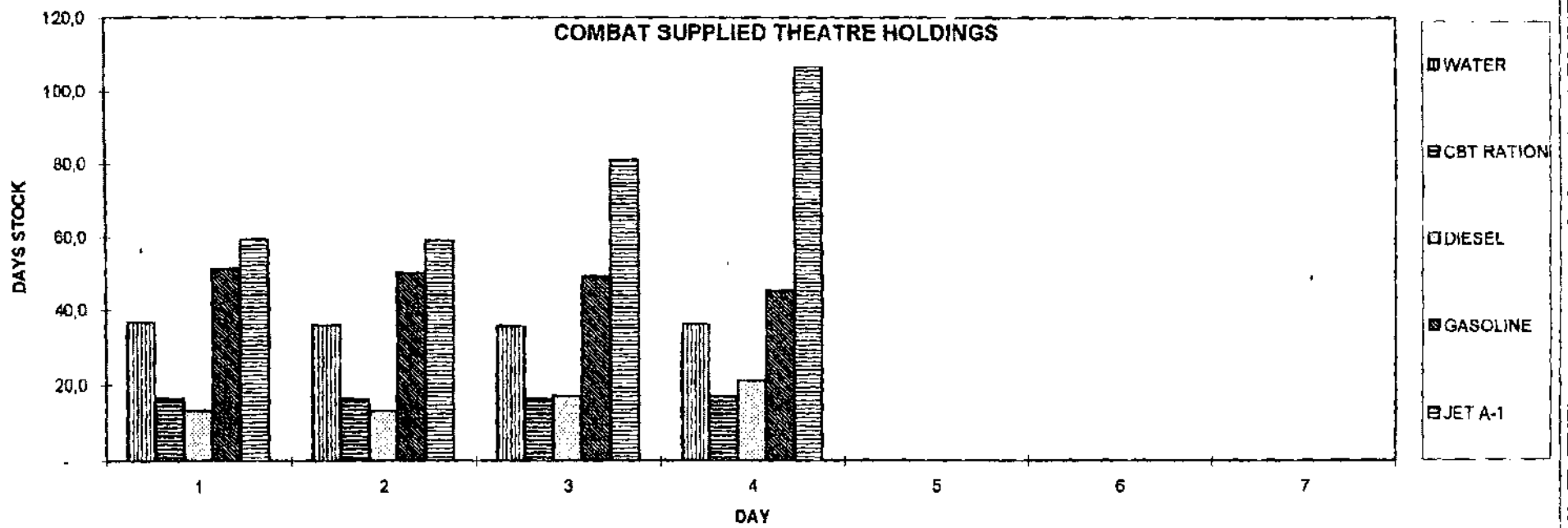

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 937. 328 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 609 FROM BURUNDI ON 09 JAN 96. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 2860. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE NSTR.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED ON 09 JAN 96, THAT RPA IN AN ENCOUNTER WITH FOUR FORMER MILITIA MEMBERS, KILLED THREE AND ARRESTED ONE. ONE HAND GRENADE WAS RECOVERED FROM THE DETAINEE. FURTHER, AN ARMS CACHE OF 16 AK47 AND M16 RIFLES (ALL WITHOUT MAGAZINES) INCLUDING ANTI PERSONAL MINES WAS ALSO RECOVERED FROM DIFFERENT LOCATIONS. THE WEAPONS WERE ALLEGEDLY RECEIVED BY A PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHER WHO IS PRESENTLY IN HIDING.

A. 55 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM NYAGATARE. 169 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, BYUMBA, KIGALI AND GITARAMA. A TOTAL OF 104 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED FOUR TRUCKS TO KIGALI PREFECTURE FOR FOOD DISTRIBUTION.

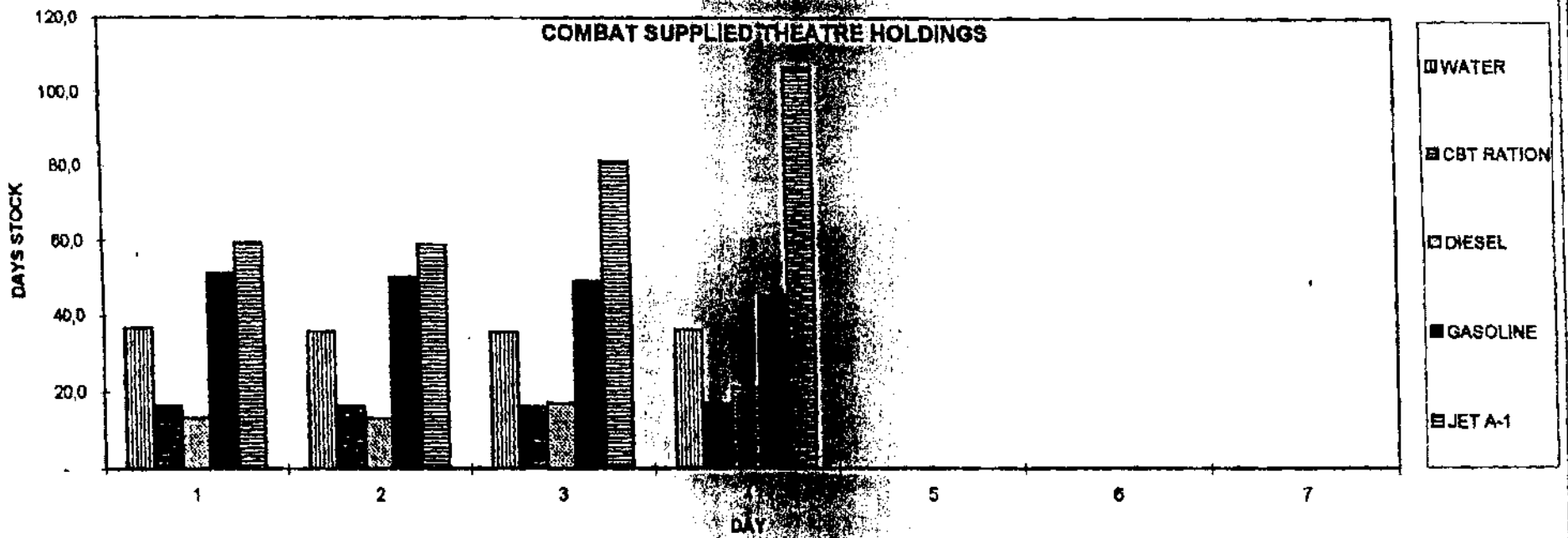

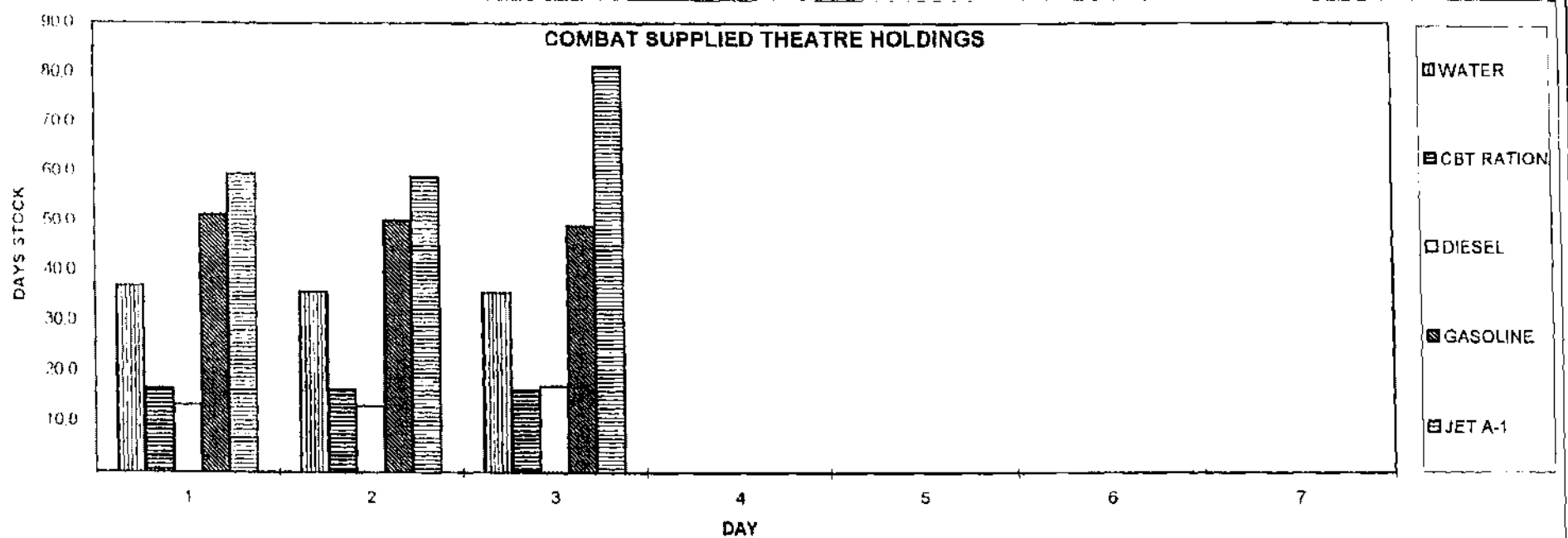

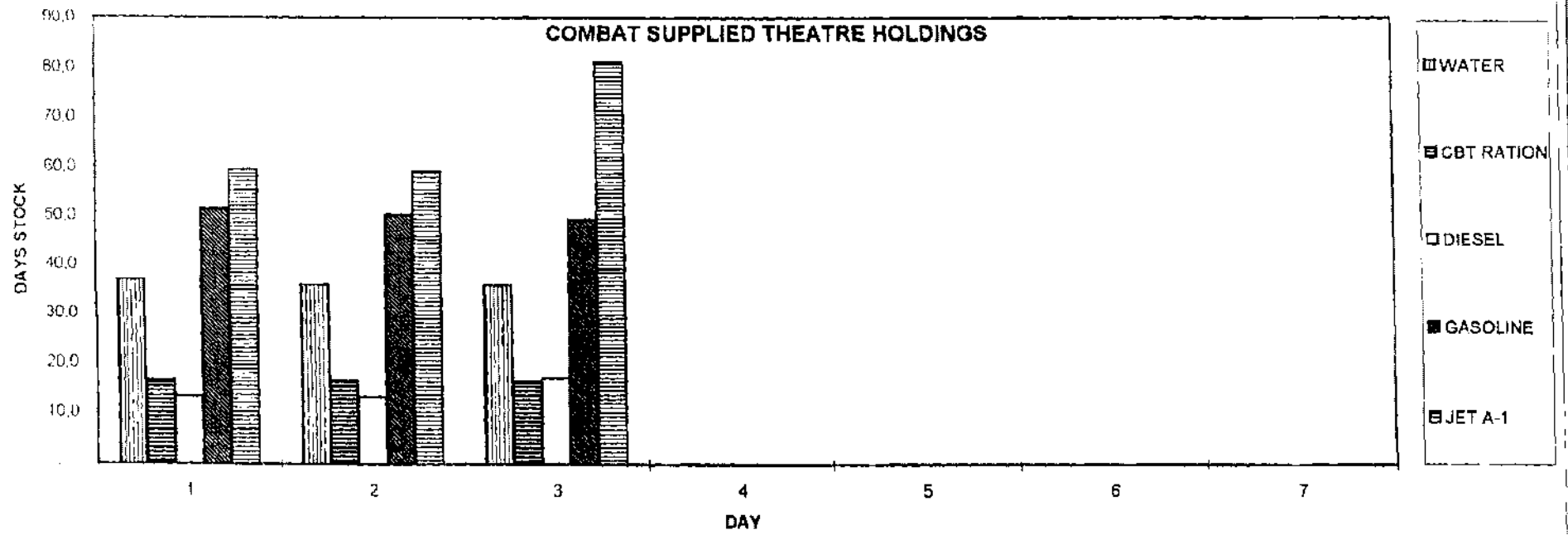

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 02 JAN TO 08 JAN 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 1851 OUT OF WHICH 1129 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 562 FROM BURUNDI AND 160 FROM TANZANIA. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 03 JAN 96, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM AND HAD DISCUSSIONS ON THE CONCLUSION OF THE UNAMIR MANDATE, THE REGIONAL SITUATION AS WELL AS ON MATTERS RELATING TO THE RETURN OF REFUGEES. LATER, THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR CALLED ON THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION CONCERNING RWANDA AND UNAMIR. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG MET WITH THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF YOUTH AND COOPERATIVE MOVEMENTS AND DISCUSSED THE POSSIBILITY OF UNDERTAKING REPAIR WORK CONCERNING THE AMAHORO STADIUM.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 03 JAN 96 THAT THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER MET THE PRESIDENT OF THE STATE ACCOUNTS COURT AND THE GENERAL PROSECUTOR AND DISCUSSED WORKING CONDITIONS OF THE RECENTLY SET UP SUPREME COURT. THEY AGREED ON THE URGENT NEED TO HAVE THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM BEGIN ITS WORK AND BRING TO JUSTICE THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR GENOCIDE.

C. ON 04 JAN 96, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE MEDAL PARADE CEREMONY AT GIKONGORO AND EXPRESSED HIS APPRECIATION FOR SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE TASK ASSIGNED TO MALICOY. LATER THE SRSG HELD AN INTERNAL MEETING WITH THE SENIOR OFFICERS TO DISCUSS AND APPROVE CERTAIN MEASURES PERTAINING TO UNAMIR. IN THE AFTERNOON DR. NDAHIRO OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE CALLED ON THE SRSG AT HIS OFFICE AND DISCUSSED BILATERAL MATTERS CONCERNING UNAMIR AND RWANDA, PARTICULARLY THE ISSUE OF EQUIPMENT.

D. ON 05 JAN 96, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR. MORJANE, DIRECTOR AFRICAN BUREAU, GENEVA AND DISCUSSED THE REFUGEE RETURN PROGRAMME OF UNHCR AS WELL AS UNHCR'S COOPERATION WITH THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT. THE RUSSIAN AMBASSADOR CALLED ON THE SRSG AT HIS OFFICE AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION. THE

PROPOSAL OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL ALSO CAME UNDER DISCUSSION. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR. IAN MARTIN, HEAD OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS, AND REVIEWED THE PROBLEM OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN RWANDA.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) REPORTED THE ARREST OF AN INTERPRETER WORKING FOR MILOBS ON 31 DEC 95 AT BUTARE. THE REASON FOR ARREST NOT KNOWN.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT ONE MAN WHO WAS ALLEGEDLY WOUNDED BY RPA, WAS ADMITTED IN THE MSF CLINIC IN RUVUMU (GR 3229) ON 30 DEC 95. DETAILS OF THE INCIDENT BEING INVESTIGATED. HR INFORMED.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) WERE INFORMED BY THE LOCALS THAT RPA IS INDULGING IN EXTORTION IN KARAGO COMMUNE (GR 4416). IN NDORWA SECTOR (GR 4616) ONE PERSON WAS INJURED IN FIRING BY RPA ON 23 DEC 95 WHEN THE VICTIM FAILED TO OBEY AN ORDER. HR INFORMED.

(4) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THE ARREST OF TWO PERSONS IN GATSIRO CELLULE (GR 2702) IN NYABIRISI SECTOR (GR 2706). DETAILS BEING ASCERTAINED.

(5) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGERI) REPORTED THAT RPA HAS ARRESTED ONE EX FRGF SOLDIER ARMED WITH A PISTOL AND A GRENADE. THE RPA HAS ALSO TIGHTENED SECURITY IN THE COMMUNE OFFICES AT NYAMUTERA (GR 5719) AND NYAKINAMA IN VIEW OF THE BREAKOUT FROM THE COMMUNE CACHOT AS REPORTED EARLIER.

(6) IN SECTOR IB (GITARAMA), ONE PERSON WAS REPORTED ARRESTED IN BIBUNGO (GR 8967) AND ANOTHER ONE IN MBARTI (GR 9467) SECTORS. BOTH THE DETAINEES ARE ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE REPORTED MURDER IN THE SITREP DATED 21 DEC 95 IN WHICH, ONE PERSON WAS KILLED IN KANMILILI CELLULE.

(7) MILOB SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THAT THE RPA DISMANTLED KIYANZI CHECK POINT (GR 8439) IN RUSUMO COMMUNE ON 05 JAN 96. AN RPA PLATOON STRENGTH WAS OBSERVED MOVING FROM RUZINGA (GR 6049) IN RUSUMO COMMUNE ALONG THE MAIN ROAD RUSUMO BORDER POST (GR 8737) TOWARDS NYKARAMBI (GR 7449). THEY CARRIED WITH THEM PERSONAL WEAPONS, ONE ROCKET LAUNCHER, ONE MORTAR (CALIBRE UNKNOWN) AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS. AROUND RUSUMO BORDER POST (GR 8737), AN UNUSUAL LARGE NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS WERE OBSERVED. REASONS FOR THESE RPA ACTIVITIES COULD NOT

BE ASCERTAINED BUT IS SUSPECTED TO BE REDEPLOYMENT OF FORCES.

(8) REF PARA 3B(1) OF OUR SITREP FOR 05 JAN 96 IN WHICH, SHELLING OF THE SOUTHERN TIP OF IJWI ISLAND WAS REPORTED. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT ON 04 JAN 96, PRGF ELEMENTS WHO ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM IJWI ISLAND, ATTACKED AND WOUNDED TWO FISHERMEN AT GR 912462 IN BUGEZA IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU). THE INFILTRATORS THEN LURED RPA SOLDIERS WHO RUSHED TO THE INCIDENT SITE AND ENGAGED THEM AT KAGARAMA GR 9244 AND KANHUD GR 9245 WITH GRENADES AND HEAVY MACHINE GUNS WHICH WERE MOUNTED ON RAFTS. TWO RPA SOLDIERS WERE WOUNDED IN THE ENCOUNTER. IN RETALIATION, RPA CARRIED OUT HEAVY SHELLING OF THE SOUTHERN TIP OF IJWI ISLAND USING MORTARS.

(9) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), AT NYAMUMBA (GR 2007), LOCALS REPORTED THAT ONE PERSON NAMED SAMAKOA WAS ARRESTED ON 5 JAN 96 AND CHARGED WITH PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE. ON THE EVENING OF 6/7 JAN HE ESCAPED. HOWEVER, HIS WIFE AND TWO SONS WERE SUBSEQUENTLY ARRESTED. HR INFORMED.

(B) MILITIA/FRGF

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) LEARNED FROM RPA LO THAT ONE LOCAL OF KIDAHU COMMUNE (GR 7047) WAS SEVERELY WOUNDED BY UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN ON THE NIGHT OF 31 DEC 95 AND IS PRESENTLY ADMITTED IN RUHENGARI HOSPITAL.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) LEARNED FROM THE LOCALS OF BUTAKA (GR 3229), THAT A MAN WAS KILLED AND A WOMAN SERIOUSLY INJURED BY SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE ON 29 DEC 95. FURTHER DETAILS BEING INVESTIGATED.

(3) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI), ON 31 DEC 95, THREE PERSONS WERE KILLED AND ONE INJURED BY UNIDENTIFIED GUNMEN IN CYAMBINGO COMMUNE (GR 6525). MOTIVE BEHIND THE KILLING IS NOT KNOWN.

(4) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) REPORTED A BREAKOUT FROM THE COMMUNE CACHOT ORGANIZED BY EIGHT MEN IN MILITARY UNIFORMS POSSIBLY EX-FAR IN WHICH, THE COMMUNAL POLICE CHIEF OF NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) WAS KILLED. EIGHT PRISONERS WERE FREED IN THE INCIDENT FROM THE CACHOT. THIS IS THE THIRD BREAKOUT FROM THE CACHOT IN THE LAST TWO MONTHS. IN THE SAME SECTOR, AN ASSAILANT WITH A HAND GRENADE, WAS INJURED WHEN HE TRIED TO ATTACK THE HOUSE OF A RPA SOLDIER IN KANZA SECTOR (GR 5930) ON THE NIGHT 02/03 JAN 96. THE ASSAILANT HOWEVER MANAGED TO GET AWAY.

(5) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THE DEATH OF ONE PERSON IN KORA COMMUNE (GR 3821) WHEN SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE THREW A GRENADE INTO HIS HOUSE.

(6) MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THAT ON 03 JAN 96, SEVEN LOCALS OF BUGEGA CELL (GR 9245) AND KANKONI CELL (GR 9246) WERE KILLED BY UNKNOWN ASSAILANTS. NO PROPERTY OR MONEY WAS STOLEN FROM THOSE KILLED. MOTIVE BEHIND THE KILLINGS, IDENTITY OF THE KILLERS AND WEAPONS USED IS NOT KNOWN. HR INFORMED. IN THE SAME SECTOR, UNHCR SOURCES AT CYANGUGU AND BUKAVU HAVE REPORTED THE SPORADIC SHELLING OF THE SOUTHERN TIP OF IJWI ISLAND ON 04 JAN 96 FROM 2230 HRS TO 2330 HRS. DETAILS OF CASUALTIES, DAMAGE TO PROPERTY AND WEAPONS USED ARE NOT KNOWN.

(7) RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 04 JAN 96, AN ARMED GROUP IN MILITARY UNIFORMS ATTACKED NYAKINAMA COMMUNAL CACHOT AND ORDERED THE GUARD NAMED RUBONEZA TO FREE THE PRISONERS. HE DID SO BUT WAS KILLED AFTERWARDS. SECURITY FORCES INTERVENED AND CAPTURED TWO CRIMINALS IDENTIFIED AS EX FRGF.

(8) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) WERE INFORMED BY THE RPA LO ABOUT TWO BOMB EXPLOSIONS IN GOMA IN WHICH, ONE PERSON WAS KILLED AND TWO OTHERS SERIOUSLY INJURED. THE EXPLOSIONS REPORTEDLY OCCURRED IN EARLY HOURS OF 05 JAN 96. IN THE SAME SECTOR, MILOB PATROL TO RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4983) LEARNT ABOUT THE PRESENCE OF INFILTRATORS IN SOUS SECTOR (GR 4983) FROM THE LOCALS. THE LOCALS LIVING CLOSE TO THE FOREST COMPLAINED OF INCREASED STEALING OF THEIR CATTLE.

(9) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), ON NIGHT 07/08 JAN 96 FROM 2356 HRS TO 0025 HRS, EXPLOSIONS WERE HEARD IN THE AREA OF THE GOMA AIRPORT. RPA LO INFORMED MILOBS THAT THESE WERE APPARENTLY BOMBING OF TWO HOUSES IN THE VICINITY OF THE AIRPORT AND THAT ONE PERSON SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. DETAILS OF THE INCIDENT ARE NOT KNOWN AND ARE BEING ASCERTAINED.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ON 02 JAN 96, THE SRSG AND THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED FORMED TROOPS AND MILOBS IN ALL THE SECTORS LESS BYUMBA, RUHENGARI AND BUTARE TO CONVEY THEIR FELICITATIONS ON THE OCCASION OF THE NEW YEAR AS ALSO TO BRIEF THEM ON THE REDEPLOYMENT OF TROOPS CONSEQUENT TO THE NEW MANDATE.

(3) ON 03 JAN 96, THE A/FC VISITED MILOBS IN SECTOR 2A

AND WAS BRIEFED ON THE PREVAILING SECURITY SITUATION IN BYUMBA. THE LIKELIHOOD OF INFLUENCE OF REFUGEES, HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE BEING RENDERED BY UNAMIR AND THE PROGRESS ON CLOSING DOWN OF THE SECTOR WERE ALSO DISCUSSED DURING THE VISIT. THE MILOB SUB SECTOR WAS CLOSED ON 06 JAN 96.

(4) ON 04 JAN 96, THE A/FC ATTENDED THE MEDAL PARADE CEREMONY OF MALICOY AT GIKONGORO AND PRESENTED UNAMIR MEDALS TO ALL RANKS OF MALICOY.

(5) CONSEQUENT TO THE NEW MANDATE AND THE REDUCTION IN FORCE LEVEL, MALICOY CONC IN KIGALI ON 06 JAN 96.

(6) ON 08 JAN 96, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER BID FAREWELL TO 120 PERS OF MALICOY AT KIA AT 0730 HRS. A REAR PARTY OF 12 PERS REMAINS WHO WILL DEPART ON 13 JAN 96. THE FC THEN PRESENTED UNAMIR MEDALS TO MOVCON PERS AND MEMBERS OF UNAMIR STAFF AT A PARADE HELD AT THE FORCE HQ. LATER, THE FC MET THE CANADIAN AMBASSADOR TO KENYA AND THE CANADIAN CHARGE-DE-AFFAIRS IN RWANDA TO DISCUSS MATTERS RELATED TO THE REPATRIATION OF THE CANADIAN CONTINGENT.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 31 TRUCKS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 174 REFUGEES ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 1879 MEDICAL AND 124 DENTAL PATIENTS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE DURING THE WEEK.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THE DEATH OF THREE PRISONERS ON 30 DEC 95, WHEN THE TOYOTA PICK UP TRANSPORTING 19 PRISONERS (INCLUDING THE VICTIMS) FROM KIBILIRA COMMUNE PRISON TO NGORORERO SUB PREFECTURE PRISON (GR 5995) OVERTURNED. THE INJURED WERE TREATED AT KIBILIRA MEDICAL CENTRE.

B. MILOBS SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THE FORCIBLE REPATRIATION OF 57 REFUGEES FROM TANZANIA ON 03 JAN AND 05 JAN 96 THROUGH RUSUMO BORDER POST FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. ALL THE 57 REFUGEES ARE BEING CURRENTLY HELD IN THE RUSUMO COMMUNE CACHOT.

C. IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), UNCONFIRMED REPORTS INDICATE THAT THE ZAIRIAN OFFICIALS OPPOSITE BUGARAMA ARE EXTORTING MONEY

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 310, ALL FROM ZAIRE. IN ADDITION TO THE CROSSINGS REPORTED EARLIER, 139 CAME FROM BURUNDI ON 04 JAN 96 AND 61 FROM ZAIRE ON 07 JAN AND 08 JAN 96. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 1851. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. THERE HAS BEEN AN INCREASE IN THE EX-FAR ACTIVITIES ALONG THE WESTERN BORDERS OF RWANDA. THIS HAS CREATED TENSION IN THE BORDER AREAS. RPA IS LIKELY TO INCREASE ITS ACTIVITIES WHICH MAY IN IMPOSITION OF ADDITIONAL CONTROL MEASURES. HOWEVER THE SITUATION REMAINS UNDER CONTROL.

B. NO SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES HAS TAKEN PLACE. HOWEVER, AS PER AVAILABLE INDICATIONS, THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES FROM ALL NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES, IN PARTICULAR TANZANIA, MAY PICK UP MOMENTUM. NECESSARY COORDINATION WITH UNHCR HAS BEEN DONE TO MEET INCREASED INFLUX.
