





SUBJECT : ENHANCING IMAGE OF UNAMIR BY PROVIDING MATERIAL AID

Ref: A Sect Comd's brief to the SRSG on his visit to Sector 1 Milob HQ on 28 Mar 95.

Sect Comd on conduct of Psy Ops in the Sector on 03 May 95.

1. The Sect Comd had accompanied one of the Milob Teams on routine patrol to Rutare Commune . The team as part of their task visited the Secy School. The Sect Comd noted that the children were facing difficulty in reading and writing , as the classrooms were inadequately illuminated. The Sect Cdr then discussed this matter with the school authorities and on his return to Byumba , with the Prefect. From the discussions , it emerged that the Prefecture , Govt authorities or the Min of Edn could not solve the problem in the near future due to paucity of funds and meagre resources.

2. It is felt that if the UNAMIR could provide the school with a 05 KV generator set , it would be greatly appreciated by the locals. It would enhance the prestige and generate goodwill amongst the locals for the Milobs in particular and UNAMIR in general. This proposal was agreed to in general by both the DFC and the SRSG during ref A and B above. The Psy Ops ofr also suggested such actions during , ref C above.

3. In view of this you are requested to use your good offices to try and procure the gen set for the school. You are further requested to take up a case for allotment of sports items like Footballs, Volleyballs and Basketballs to sectors for distribution to Schools within the sectors.

SUBJECT : FOOD DISTRIBUTION TO KIYOMBE COMMUNE

1. During the routine patrolling of Kiyombe Commune by our Milob Team today , the B/Master stated that there was an acute shortage of food in the commune. He requested UNAMIR to approach a NGO or UN Agency to bail them out. He explained that the food crisis was forcing him to issue letters to Commune inhabitants , to enable them to seek jobs elsewhere and get paid either in terms of money or food.
2. You are requested to kindly look into the matter and try and solve the problem . Please treat matter most urgent. This HQ is also liaising with the Prefecture authorities at Byumba as well as UNREO , through the CHAO's office at Kigali.

Subject: RECCE AND REPAIR OF ACCESS ROAD TO KYANZA

1. Reference your letter No 1001.1(FEO)/DPS/1 dated 13 Apr 95.
2. A joint recce of route to Kyanza was carried out by Force Engr Coy, NIBATT Engr Officer and a rep of MILOB HQ Sector 1 on 28 Apr 95.
3. Following points were observed :-
 - (a) Total stretch of the road is 12 Kms.
 - (b) Complete stretch of 12 Kms is a dirt track capable of taking light commercial vehicle.
 - (c) First 5 Kms of the track is damaged by ruts caused by rain water.
 - (d) Second stretch of 4.0 Kms of the tracks was also damaged by ruts, but the track has been done up.
 - (e) The last stretch of 3.0 Kms is in good condition and does not require any repairs.
 - (d) Track is being used by the traffic for the hospital located at Kyanza.
4. Road in the present form can take the traffic and the ruts in the track can be filled up manually since these are caused by the rain water and will have to be attended to regularly. Also local labour has completed filling of ruts in the first stretch and may be permitted to complete the job.

Reference : Operation Order No 20 dated 6 Oct 94

1. The HAC has been approached by G3 Plans to confirm that the tasks assigned to the cell under OpO 20 are still valid for inclusion in an OpO 21 which will be produced in the near future. The humanitarian situation in Rwanda continues to improve. UNREO has been co-ordinating humanitarian assistance in the country for the past six months and the requirement for close assistance from the HAC has progressively diminished over time. The same can be said for UN and NGO agencies. As their confidence with the situation improved and their logistic capabilities increased, the requests to the cell have reduced considerably.

2. To produce a modified series of tasks for the new OpO a study will be presented on each of the presently assigned tasks under OpO 20. The tasks are as follows:

- a. Brief the FC on humanitarian assistance operations in RWANDA.
- b. Provide advice to the Plans Cell of UNAMIR concerning UNAMIR operations in support of humanitarian assistance.
- c. Assist UNREO/UNDP in coordinating the activities of UN and NGO agencies operating in RWANDA.
- d. Conduct humanitarian relief assessment recce throughout sectors as required.
- e. Arrange for the security aspects of humanitarian organizations conducting relief operations in RWANDA in close liaison with UNAMIR Ops Branch.
- f. Collate data from sectors pertaining to humanitarian matters.
- g. Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees.
- h. Disseminate information concerning human rights abuses to UN human rights rapporteurs.
- i. Arrange for the necessary administration for the handover of PWs to the Rwandan authorities to include the presence of ICRC officials.
- j. Effect close liaison with UN and NGO agencies.

k. Effect close liaison as required with humanitarian representatives of the Rwandan Government.

l. Assist where possible in locating missing Rwandans and foreign nationals.

3. Brief the FC on humanitarian assistance operations in RWANDA. This task, for the most part, is being done by UNREO and the FC is briefed each morning by an UNREO representative. Whereas the ICRC was very forthcoming with their operations during the war, they rarely divulge information at present to the HAC. The same can be said about UN agencies. UNREO is in a far better position to determine major humanitarian activities conducted by UN and NGO agencies in Rwanda than is the HAC. Further, it is not looked upon favourably if the HAC deals directly with UN agencies. It is suggested therefore that the cell be given communications with the sectors in the field and that this task be first in priority in the new OpO and be re-written as follows:

" Brief the FC on humanitarian assistance operations and problems as reported by UNAMIR troops deployed "

4. Provide advice to the Plans Cell of UNAMIR concerning UNAMIR operations in support of humanitarian assistance. This remains a valid task for the HAC and requires no changes.

5. Assist UNREO/UNDP in co-ordinating the activities of UN and NGO agencies operating in RWANDA. Very little assistance is being asked for from UNREO in this area. While we had considerable co-ordinating experience during and just following the war, there is little assistance we can provide in peacetime. This task should be re-written as follows:

" When requested, assist UNREO/UNDP in co-ordinating the activities of UN and NGO agencies operating in Rwanda particularly with regards to liaison with deployed troops and Milobs "

6. Conduct humanitarian relief assessment recce throughout sectors as required. This will continue to be a major task for the cell. The patrols should be conducted for the benefit of the FC, UNAMIR HQ, Sector HQ and UNREO. This task should appear second in the OpO and be re-written as follows:

" Conduct recce operations on humanitarian concerns in all sectors as directed by the FC or as requested by UNAMIR HQ, Sector HQs and UNREO "

7. Arrange for the security aspects of humanitarian organizations conducting relief operations in RWANDA in close liaison with UNAMIR Ops Branch. This remains a valid task and should be retained and appear third in the OpO.

8. Collate data from sectors pertaining to humanitarian matters. This remains a valid task and should appear fourth in the OpO. The task should be re-written as follows:

" Collate data from sector humanitarian representatives and produce a weekly humanitarian report "

9. Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees. This remains a valid task, however UNREO now has the most current information on IDPs and refugees inside and outside Rwanda. This task should be re-written as follows:

" Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees as reported by UNREO "

10. Disseminate information concerning human rights abuses to UN human rights rapporteurs. It is not felt that this remains a valid task as all UNAMIR sub-elements are doing this via the UNAMIR LO. This task is more relevant to the sectors than the HAC.

11. Arrange for the necessary administration for the handover of PWs to the Rwandan authorities to include the presence of ICRC officials. This task is no longer relevant as there remain no combatants inside the country, just bandits who are turned over to the prosecutor via Human Rights representatives. If retained as a task it should be modified to pertain to criminals and be tasked to all sectors.

12. Effect close liaison with UN and NGO agencies. This remains a valid task. No modifications are required.

13. Effect close liaison as required with humanitarian representatives of the Rwandan Government. This remains a valid task. No modifications are required.

14. Assist where possible in locating missing Rwandans and foreign nationals. This task is no longer valid as the ICRC has assumed this responsibility.

15. In Summary the tasks for the HAC in the new OpO should be written as follows:

- a. Brief the FC on humanitarian assistance operations and problems as reported by UNAMIR troops deployed.
- b. Conduct recce operations on humanitarian concerns in all sectors as directed by the FC or as requested by UNAMIR HQ, Sector HQs and UNREO "
- c. Arrange for the security aspects of humanitarian organizations conducting relief operations in RWANDA in close liaison with UNAMIR Ops Branch.
- d. Collate data from sector humanitarian representatives and produce a weekly humanitarian report.

- e. Provide advice to the Plans Cell of UNAMIR concerning UNAMIR operations in support of humanitarian assistance.
- f. When requested, assist UNREO/UNDP in co-ordinating the activities of UN and NGO agencies operating in Rwanda, particularly with regards to liaison with deployed troops and Milobs.
- g. Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees as reported by UNREO.
- h. Effect close liaison with UN and NGO agencies.
- i. Effect close liaison as required with humanitarian representatives of the Rwandan Government.

BREIF ON HUMANATARIAN ACTIVITIES
FOR CHAO MEETING ON 03 MAR 95

INTRODUCTION

1. Sector 1 has been the most peaceful and calm sector for quite sometime. This sector saw the maximum influx of NGOs helping out people in the DP camps prior to the war , after te war this sector has been relegated to the background as other sectors shot into prominence and now the focus of all is towards the sectors afected by OP RETOUR. This does not neccessarily mean that all is well within the sector and the requirement of Humanitarian aid has diminished.

2. There are many areas requiring Humanatarian Aid ,as well as many NGOs providing all types of help . The prefect of Byumba has in fact called a meting on 10 Mar of all the NGOs working within the area to firstly decide on their usefullness and secondly to coordinate their activity. The areas identified for provision of aid are outlined in the underlying paras.

AREAS REQUIRING HUMANATARIAN ASSISTANCE

3. **INFLUX OF RETURNEES.** There is a constant inflow of returnees from Uganda across the Gatuna , Tabagwe and Kagitumba border check posts , and from Tanzania from across the Akagera river affecting a crossing at an unmanned point named Namunemura (B 5371). The average daily influx at Kagitumba is 800 persons and 1000 heads of cattle whereas those coming across Gatuna average around 20 daily . The number crossing over from Tanzania is not known . This creates the following problems. Reception centres have been set up jointly by ADRA and UNHCR at Matimba and Nyagatare to receive these returnees. The problems encountered are as under :-

(a) **Kagitumba Border Outpost.** The border outpost needs the following :-

(i) Tent or shelter for the returnees from rain and sun while they await transportation .

(ii) A bladder be placed there and replenished with drinking water when required to cater for approx 1000 persons daily.

(iii) The sector has tied up with Nicoy to provide trucks biweekly on Mondays and Fridays , but the UNHCR can augment this by running a bus for transporting returnees on a daily basis from the border to the Reception centres and from the centres to the communes.

(b) **Matimba Reception Centre.** The daily registration is around 80 families of 800 persons collecting their " welcome home " food package , out of these approx 400 returnees especially women and children stay at the centre .This centre of late has seen a vast improvement in the basic infrastructure after the visit by the HAC himself which resulted in vaccination campaign by MSF, provision of drinking water by UNHCR . The Min of rehabilitation has decided to close down this centre to prevent the increase in farming and squatting inside the National Park area. The closure deadline has however been extended now by a month.

(c) **Nyagatare Reception Centre.** The daily registration is around 1000 persons. The Min of rehabilitation has decided to have this as the only centre and to increase the size of this camp to accommodate almost a 1000 families . A medical centre is also proposed to be opened in this camp by Norwegian Refugee Trust. The basic infrastructure provided in this camp is much better than Matimba.

(d) **Veterinary Care.** The cattle crossing over from Uganda is being allowed inside Rwanda only after the production of an inoculation certificate . The cattle crossing over from Tanzania across the unmanned crossing is not inoculated against contagious bovine diseases. This cattle is in turn affecting the cattle stock of Rwanda . **Action NORD Sud** has been carrying out inoculations against **Contagious Bovine Pluero Pneumonia (PPCB)**, till date it has inoculated 114,749 heads of cattle within Byumba prefecture, but it needs more vaccinations.

(e) **Settlement Within National Park Area.** Increasing number of nomads are settling down inside the park area. Shanty towns with UNHCR plastic roofing is springing up within the park . These nomads are settling down with their herds of cattle and are creating problems of overgrazing and poaching . The govt has decided to settle returnees within the area West of the road to Kagitumba. This needs to be done systematically and will need lot of coordinated help from NGOs.

4. **MEDICAL SERVICES.** The medical services within the sector is amongst the best in Rwanda . All medical and sanitary posts that were functional before the war are functional now. The farthest one has to travel for medical aid is approx 12 Km , which may be a record for Africa. All medical aid is coordinated at a monthly meeting in the prefecture. The NGOs have been given communewise responsibilities. The last meeting was held on 22 Feb 95, wherein the salaries of the medical staff was discussed . The UNICEF rep thereafter requested the NGOs to provide refrigerators at med centres and to carry out inoculation of returnees. The overall shortfall is in drugs for treating treating diseases like TB , med eqpt , ambulances and electricity generators.

5. **SCHOOLS.** Primary schools in all communes are open and functioning . They however lack books , copies , teaching material and furniture. The buildings in most cases require repair of roofs. Secy schools are yet to open.

6. **FARMING ACTIVITIES.** The sector is producing food enough for the consumption of its population as well as surplus for other communes . They do not need food aid *per se* but need good quality seeds of the high yield variety. The returnees need seeds , farming implements and tools.

10. **ENGR HELP.** The Refugee Trust Ireland has sought engr help from UNAMIR to repair the access road to Kyanza in Mugambazi commune. The work involved is dozer effort to fill in earth next to the berms at three places on the mountain track.

11. **FOOD FOR WORK.** The prefecture of Byumba initiated a feasibility study for community work on roads within Byumba Prefecture . amongst other agencies they approached UNAMIR to provide them with tools and implements through UNHCR . Food was to be provided by WFP.

CONCLUSION

12. We have been meeting all the NGOs with regular frequency and ironing out any kinks in the process that we detect from time to time . The requirement of such a meeting was long felt . This will enable us to coordinate our Humanatarian effort, and also give us an idea of what to expect from various NGOs. What is requested however is that a clear concept be formulated and guidelines given to coordinate the Humanatarian working in sectors.





3. Team patrolled from Byumba along route 5 at Mulindi turn-off joined ~~route~~ route 8 up to Nyange GR 0836. From Nyange team went to Rushaki GR 0939 Rugarama GR 1136 Mukono and back to Byumba. In all areas patrolled no DPs or ORCs were observed.

INCIDENTS

4. Information received from one RPA officer namely Andrew Mugenzi that a cow detonated a mine in the general ~~area~~ area of Nyabishambi GR 0928. The area is said to have been cleared of mines by NICOG before the incident.

CIVIL POPULATION

7. In all areas patrolled the locals seem to have settled back to normal life, they were seen going ~~with~~ on with field harvesting. In Rushaki ~~they~~ there was a market in progress. Along route 5 there is an extensive deforestation going on locals are cutting down trees to make charcoal for sale.

HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITY

8. Team visited Mukoro health Centre at CR 1328 where they interviewed a medical assistant namely Bernard Hategeka. He said the hospitals in big centres have introduced hospital fees of 1300 FRW per patient before they admit them. He said most people in the area are so poor they can not afford the fee. Initially GOAL NGOs were assisting to pay for some patients who had to be transferred from the

- health centre to bigger hospitals, but due to financial constraints faced by the NGO they have since stopped assisting.

STATE OF ROADS

9. The road between Rushaki and Rugarama is too narrow and seems as if it has not been used by vehicles for a long time. Otherwise most roads in areas patrolled are passable:

CIVIL AFFAIRS

10. School teachers in the area of Rushaki received their salaries for November⁹⁴ on the 8th February 1995. They were promised to be paid the remaining months as soon as possible.

ELECTRICITY

11. There is no electricity in all the areas patrolled.

WATER

12. Locals are fetching water from the streams and mountain springs. No treated water available.

SCHOOLS

13. Team visited Rushaki primary school which has 1200 pupils and ~~47~~ 17 teachers. The school has a shortage of books and school furniture. Team was informed by

- one teacher that UNICEF has promised to supply chalks, pens and school furniture for primary one to three.

1. There will be a meeting for all Milob humanitarian representatives of Sectors with the CHAO at the UNREO Conference Room at the UNDP Complex in Kigali at 1000 hrs, 03 Mar 95. The aim of the meeting is to find practical and effective ways of co-ordinating the humanitarian and related activities especially with UNREO, UN and NGO field units/offices located within the Sectors. Dear Sir,

Following our visit to you on 1 February, the following is a brief report in relation to the engineering tasks that we need assistance with in the above mentioned Health Centres. Any assistance that may be forthcoming would be greatly appreciated.

Rwesero Health Centre (Commune Giti) :

Refugee Trust has been working in Rwesero since the beginning of November 1994. Locks, doors, windows, and the generator have all been repaired to date us. The health centre is fully operational at the moment, and is seeing approximately one thousand people per week.

As the Health Centre is beside the lake, we are also trying to ascertain how the local population receives its water. This we feel should be the starting point for any future development of the water and sanitation systems. If the water is coming from the lake, how clean is it? Do cattle and other animals have access to the water source? Is it polluted? Once we have the answers to these questions, we can assess the need for a water purification system in the area.

At the moment Refugee Trust is in the process of repairing and developing the sanitation system in this Health Centre. In this regard, we need to **build a soak pit and a septic tank for the latrines**. This would allow the 'waste' to drain away safely from the area avoiding the possibility of contamination of water supplies. We are also proposing to clean up the latrines in the centre. This would involve the **plastering and painting of the latrines**, which have already been constructed.

Any help that you might be able to give us in this area would be very welcome indeed.

Kiyanza Health Centre (Commune Mugambazi) :

This was Refugee Trust's first project in Rwanda. We have been working in the health centre since July 1994. This centre is fully operational and highly organised by the local staff. We have renovated this health centre totally, from the locks and the doors, to the solar system, all of which are completed at the moment. The centre runs Mother and Child Clinics,

The main problem that we have with this Health Centre is access. The road leading to the centre is getting to a stage where it is dangerous for us to try and travel on it. When it rains, the road becomes impassable. Our main fear is that the truck will slide over the edge of the road, and people may be injured, not only our staff but also transfer patients. On several occasions, the RT team has not been able to gain access to the Health Centre due to the deteriorating state of this road.

Any assistance that you may be able to provide in this matter would be extremely welcome to us, in order to help us to carry out our work safely and regularly.

All that remains is to thank you for your hospitality during our recent visit, and we hope that you will be able to help us with some of the above requests. We look forward to your reply.



1. The following paid a visit to the Matimba Reception Centre and Kagitumba border outpost on 11Feb 95, with the aim of giving a follow up report on its present state of affairs.

- a. Lt Col Adjei G K - Sect Cdr
- b. Maj Ashish Ghosh - Ops Offr
- c. 2 X Milobs - Milob Team

2. **Matimba Reception Centre.** The patrol met Mr Samuel Ndambazhi , who introduced himself as the ADRA monitor for the Matimba Reception Centre. From him and by moving around the camp as well as asking the inmates the following were foud out :-

- a. **Dependants.** There were 364 inmates and approx 1000 returnees pass through everyday to collect their food packets provided by WFP.
- b. **Food.** The WFP has provided food for the inmates in the form of Beans , Maize Grain , Oil and salt. The problem faced by the inmates was an acute shortage of cooking fuel and also as the food items provided took a long time to cook if faster cooking substitutes could be provided.

c. **Water.** Two bladders have been installed. These were filled once initially a week back. These have not been refilled since then and have been bone dry for the past four days. The inmates have now restarted to use the water from the Akagera river for drinking purposes.

d. **Shelter.** The inmates are housed in four structures around the complex. Two are large tents while others are Shelters erected with other material. Plastic sheeting , cooking utensils are not yet available for the returnees.

e. **Sanitation.** Two trench latrines have been dug within 10 mtrs of the housing Shelters. These need to be redug at a greater distance and hygiene chemicals spread daily.

f. **Medical.** Inoculations were carried out only once and a doctor visited once last week. There have been no further medical aid / activity.

g. **Veterinary** There has been no examination or inoculation of the cattle at the centre so far. Some of the cattle have died recently due to diseases.

3. **Kagitumba Border Outpost.** The patrol met Immigration Officers of both countries.


a. The Ugandan officials have no complaint about the returnee movement. On being asked about pressure being applied by their govt on the Rwandese to return to Rwanda , they said there was no such pressure but only friendly advice given by their President.

b. The Rwandese authorities were extremely cooperative. They requested that as the returnees had to await transportation they needed some sort of night shelter . They informed the patrol that only the cattle accompanied with a certificate of inoculation were being allowed entry into Rwanda. They were providing the daily crossing figures to our teams on a regular basis and no other problems were faced.

4. **Recommendation.** All the recommendations made by the HAC team in the IOM dated 10 Feb 95 are agreed to and must be enforced . However in additon the following are also suggested:-

a. **Transportation.** The arrangement made by the Sector HQ with the Nicoy was for the provisioning of a truck every Monday and Friday for transportation of returnees from the Kagitumba border outpost to Matimba and Nyagatare Reception Centres. This need not be disturbed. The UNHCR and IOM should tackle the movement from the Reception Centres to home communes only.

b. **Veterinary.** A veterinary doctor must visit the camp to examine and carry out inoculations on a regular basis.

1. On 8 Feb 95, HAC Ops conducted a vehicle patrol in Sector 1. The aim of the patrol was to conduct a follow up visit at the reception center in MATIMBA (GR TD1475) in order to confirm the action taken since our last patrol (ref c and d).

2. The patrol was conducted by Col S. Iliya (CHAO) and Capt P.F.A. Demers (HAC Ops/LN).

3. The route taken by the patrol was as follows:
KIGALI-RWAMAGANA-KAGITUMBA-RWAMAGANA-KIGALI.

4. Meetings were held with Mr Nunyandamutsa Philippe, the assistant manager for ADRA MATIMBA reception center, Mr Rubambana Josue, the monitor for the ADRA reception camp and Mr David, government immigration official at the KAGITUMBA border post.

MATIMBA

5. The reception center in MATIMBA has received some help since our last visit (ref c): WFP delivered some food (maize) and UNHCR delivered some water. MSF conducted a vaccination campaign against measles for the children staying at the center. Mr Nunyandamutsa stated that the minister of rehabilitation, Dr Bihozagara, visited the area on Friday 3 Feb 1995. It was reported to the HAC that Dr Bihozagara was not pleased with the current humanitarian situation prevalent in the center.

6. Up to 1000 returnees go through the center daily in order to receive the 14 days "welcome home" food package. Some 400 returnees are currently living at the reception center awaiting onward transport for destination inside RWANDA (mainly KIBUNGO and BUGASERA). Mr Rubambana stated that since 2 Jan 1995 only one UNHCR truck came to the reception center to take people away. He also stated that UNAMIR trucks go to the border on mondays and fridays but they do not stop at the reception center. Local private transport is available for a price of 1500 RFR to KIBUNGO and 2000 RFR to KIGALI.

7. The reception center is still in need of the following:

a. FOOD: WFP is providing maize, beans and oil on a regular basis to the reception center.

Mr Munyandamutsa stated that maize took too long to cook, since the area is lacking in firewood maize meal would therefore be more suitable for this reception center. Also the provision of High Energy Milk (HEM), High Energy Biscuits (HEB) and rice is required for the children present at the center.

b. MEDICAL CARE: Mr Munyandamutsa informed the HAC that the two local medics operating the health center in the area of Nyahwishongwezi (GR TD1280) are now sick. Currently no proper medical care is available at the center.

c. WATER: There are two water bladders at the reception center which need to be resupplied on a regular basis.

d. PLASTIC SHEETING, BLANKET, COOKING UTENSILS, JERRY CANS: These items are still not available at the MATIMBA reception center

KAGITUMBA BORDER POST

8. The border post receives on average 600 to 1200 returnees daily. Registration is done at the border by the government. Mr David stated that the main problems facing returnees at the border are:

a. Lack of transport from the border to the reception center in MATIMBA / other destination within RWANDA; and

b. Need tents at the border post to house the returnees who cross the border late at night.

9. The team explained that the idea is not to create or establish another center at the border. A tent can be pitched if only to receive returnees arriving in the night but who must proceed to the reception center the next morning.

RECOMMENDATION


9. It is recommended that UNREO coordinate the following in order of priority:

a. Regular resupply of water to the center;

b. Regular resupply of food (maize meal, HEM, HEB, rice), plastic sheeting, blankets, cook sets and jerry cans;

c. Regular visits by a medical doctor from any of the NGOs be made at the reception center. Preferably a health center be established for the returnees; and

d. UNHCR/IOM or UNAMIR (NICOY) transport should go to the reception center on a regular basis in order to assist the returnees in going back to their home commune.

SUBJECT : REPORT ON MATIMBA AND NYAGATARE RECEPTION CENTRES

1. **BACKGROUND.** End Aug 94 the present Govt authorities granted permission to ADRA and WFP to establish reception centres in Northwest Rwanda . They were to distribute both food and non food items wef 01 Sep 94 to Dec 94. Food items provided by WFP and non food items by UNHCR. There has been a sudden increase in the inflow of returnees and now these reception centres are unable to cope with this.

2. **DISTRIBUTION PROJECT.** The initial assessment catered for 28,000 people upto 31 Dec 94. The actual figures on ground was 112,000 in 04 months time. At Nyagatare 05 centres with 47 distribution cells and at Matimba 03 centres with 20 distribution cells were formed for the purpose. The distribution was worked out on a 09 day cycle . 06 cycles from Nyagatare and 07 cycles from Matimba centre have been completed so far.

4. **LOCAL EMPLOYMENT.** 32 Local civilians were employed as distributors and paid 120 US\$ per month. For handling of Trucks and stores more were employed at 2 US\$ per day.

5. **TEACHERS FOOD FOR WORK PROGRAMME.** To rehabilitate Education in NE Rwanda , UNHCR and ADRA have undertaken a project for Teachers in NE Rwanda , 170 Teachers in 12 Schools are being benefited. Food is being given as salary, instead of money.

6. **TEMPORARY CLASSROOM.** Majority of schools were destroyed during the war. Temporary classrooms are being constructed by local help. Plastic sheeting is being used for roofing.

7. **RECEPTION CENTRES.** Reception centres were established at Nyagatare and Matimba in consultation with Ministry of Rehabilitation. The tasks of the centres are as follows :

- (a) Provide temporary accommodation , including latrines and kitchen.
- (b) Registration and identification of returnees.
- (c) Supply of 14 days ration by WFP.
- (d) Food items by UNHCR.
- (e) Coordinate movement of families to final destination in Rwanda by IOM and Ministry of Rehabilitation.
- (f) Supply water and firewood to returnees.

8. **INCREASE IN FLOW OF RETURNEES.** The increase in flow of returnees can be judged by the figures for month of Jan in respect of the Nyagatare Reception Centre.



- (a) Lack of potable water.
- (b) Lack of sanitary facilities.
- (c) Lack of adequate Shelter.
- (d) Inadequate bedding.

11. **FUTURE PLANS.** Project in hand is in the form of Seed Protection Distribution Programme . This was to start in mid Jan but did not take off , it was anticipated that this would start by 07 Feb . The project had to be launched prematurely at Tabagwe and Shonga by 31 Jan 95 to cater for the last week of planting season for Shorgum seeds.

6. The reception center at MATIMBA is staffed by representatives from ADRA. Security is provided on site by the RPF. The relationship between the RPA and the local population is good. Also, the HAC has been supplying the center with food. The center consists of 2 smaller buildings for shelter and is also a small garden used by the ADRA staff and the returnees for agricultural work for the area. Registration of the returnees as well as final destination in Rwanda is done at the border government/HQ.

7. On the average 400 to 500 returnees go through the center daily with the majority going straight to the AKACERA camp.

1. On 31 Jan 95, HAC Ops conducted a vehicle patrol in Sector 1. The aim of the patrol was to visit the reception center in MATIMBA (GR TD1475) following a request for humanitarian aid made by sector 1 (ref a.).

2. The patrol was conducted by Maj B. Mande and Capt P.F.A. Demers of the HAC.

3. The route taken by the patrol was as follows:
KIGALI-BYUMBA-KIGALI-RWAMAGANA-KAGITUMBA-RWAMAGANA-KIGALI.

4. Meetings were held with the MILOBS Ops Officer sector 1 (Maj Ashish Ghosh) and with Mr Nunyandamutsa Philippe, the assistant manager for ADRA MATIMBA reception center.

5. At BYUMBA, the Ops O sector 1 indicated that the reception center received up to 700 returnees a day and that 400 to 450 returnees were staying there for up to two weeks waiting for onward movement to their home communes. He also stated that WFP was now supplying the center with food on a regular basis but he noted some problems regarding the water, health, plastic sheeting and blankets situation.

MATIMBA

6. The reception center in MATIMBA is staffed by 8 representatives from ADRA as well as some local workers. Security is provided on site by the RPA and the relations between the RPA and the local population was reported by Mr Nunyandamutsa as good. Also the MILOBS patrols visit the center from time to time. The center consist of one large tent for food storage and of 7 smaller modular/improvised type tents for shelter. There is also a small garden used by the ADRA staff as a teaching aid to demonstrate to the returnees proper agricultural techniques for the area. Registration of the returnees as well as their final destination in Rwanda is done at the border by the government/NGOs.

7. On the average 400 to 500 returnees go through the center daily with the majority going straight into the AKAGERA National

Park (especially in the area between the AKAGERA river and the MUVUMBA river) with large herds of cattle. Presently the reception center distributes a 7 day food package as a one time issue to the returnees and provides shelter for up to 450 people for 3 to 14 days.

8. The reception center is in need of the following:

a. FOOD: WFP is providing maize, beans and oil on a regular basis to the reception center. Mr Munyandamutsa stated that maize took too long to cook, since the area is lacking in firewood maize meal would therefore be more suitable for this reception center.

b. MEDICAL CARE: Currently there is no one providing medical care for the reception center. There is a health center in the area of Nyahwishongwezi (GR TD1280) but the two local medics cannot cover the reception center adequately.

c. WATER: There is no water source close by. A water bladder needs to be installed in order to supply the reception center.

d. PLASTIC SHEETING, BLANKET, COOKING UTENSILS, JERRY CANS: These items are available at other reception centers in the country as part of the "welcome home" package given to IDPs. However these items are not available at the Matimba reception center.

e. VETERINARIAN CARE: Because of the large number of cattle coming in the country through that region, regular visits from a veterinarian to this area as a preventive measures against any outbreak of disease would be helpful to the returnees.

RECOMMENDATION


9. It is recommended that UNREO coordinate the following:

a. Regular visits by a medical doctor from any of the NGOs be made at the reception center. Preferably a health center be established for the returnees;

b. Installation of a water bladder is required;

c. Provision of plastic sheeting, blankets, cook sets and jerry cans; and

d. Exploring the possibility ~~with the Morris Animal Foundation (or any of the NGOs)~~ of sending a veterinarian team to this area.

**SUBJECT : REQUEST FOR UNAMIR HELP FROM THE
PREFECT OF BYUMBA**

1. The Sector Cdr met the Prefect of Byumba on 24 Jan 95 . The meeting was very fruitful and many points of mutual interest were discussed . Important details are mentioned below :-

(a) **Border Situation** :- The prefect was taken aback and surprised at the suggestion that RGF soldiers were being trained in areas adjoining the border areas of Uganda and Tanzania of our Sector . The prefect declared the suggestion an outright impossibility. He confirmed to us that the Govt authorities of Rwanda were more concerned about such matters than anyone else as it was a matter of survival for them . He said that had there been any hint or suggestion of truth in the matter , they would have been making it known to the world and UNAMIR by now. he reiterated his stand saying that this rumour was baseless , illogical and militarily unsound as Uganda has been the RPF base and their sympathisers were in both countries who would not allow such a thing . What is happening and is known to the RPA and the Prefecture is the voluntary donation of money by the Hutus of the Sector to some pers of the old regime.

(b) **Communication Problems**:- The major problem faced by the Prefect in the discharge of his duties is that of communication with Communes and Secteurs . The telephone services to the Sectuer level is not functional . The prefect has to rely on only one car that has been provided by the UNAMIR. To this end he requested for help from the UNAMIR for the following :-

(i) 80 Ltrs of Diesel per week .

(ii) Since the Prefects car was a gift from UNAMIR if the repair

facilities of the UNAMIR Wksp could be made available for repair and maintainance of the car.

(iii) Meeting certain transport requirements within the prefect from time to time.

(iv) Provision of a PA System / Power Megaphone to help him address meetings and gatherings.

3. The Meeting ended with the prefect requesting the Sector Cdr for regular help and guidance in running the affairs of the commune . He expressed his good fortune in having such a Milob Sector Cdr who had himself been a Prefect for 06 yrs and whose experience he could tap. He was assured of our unstinted help and advice .

4. You are requested to peruse and take up the matter at appropriate levels and grant permission to enable us to help the prefect . This will generate a lot of goodwill amongst the two organisations and enhance the standing of UNAMIR.







The extent is 30 m X 80 m.

Human file.

1. At 1200 hrs on 1st of January 1995 a team of four (4) UN Human Rights Personnel led by a lady came to Sub-Sector one in RWAMAGANA to request for Ghana batt Coy escort in order to take a man whose life is being threatened for allegedly taking part in the genocide away. I therefore accompanied them to the Ghana batt Coy position to see the O/C.
2. I was given a verbal briefing by Lt (GN) Osei Owusu during our exchange of duties on 31st December 1994 that the O/C of Ghana batt Coy at GISHALI reported to him that a man who claimed his life is being threatened by some persons believed to be RPPs had gone to see him, the O/C for UNAMIR protection. Lt (GN) Osei Owusu said he had advised the O/C to contact his headquarters on the matter while he also inform MULO Sector one Headquarter in Byumba about it.

3. I am therefore submitting this report to inform you officially that the alleged man was taken away on Sunday 1st January 1995 to Kigali by the UN Human Rights team. They were given escort by Gharabath Coy from their location, Grid Ref. 4788 up to the Rwamagana - Kigali main road.
4. On Monday 2nd of January 1995 one of the UN Human Rights members was here at the Sub-sector one, to report that the man is still in their custody for interrogation. No further details have been communicated to me by the UN Human Rights Centre other than this.
5. I have duly briefed the Sub Sector one team leader, Maj Hazdra, who was then on ctc/leave at the time on the matter.
6. I am therefore submitting this report to you for your information.
