3. RPA.

A. IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) RPA SEIZED ABOUT 81 COWS FROM THE LOCALS IN GATARE COMMUNE FOREST IN NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR. MILOBS ARE INVESTIGATING THE CASE.

B. IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) RUHENGARI BDE COMD VISITED THE LOCAL RPA BN COMD AND INFORMED HIM THAT HE WAS POSTED TO KIGALI REPLACED BY MAJOR JOHN BOSCO FROM BYUMBA WHO WOULD TAKE-UP COMD WITHIN NEXT FEW DAYS. THE SAME BDE COMD WAS SCHEDULED TO HOLD ANOTHER MEETING TODAY BUT HE WAS SUMMONED TO ARMY HQ IN KIGALI FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

5. REFUGEES/IDPs.

A. THE UNHCR REPORT TO THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL OUTLINING A PLAN FOR THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES HAS STILL NOT BEEN TABLED. THE PLAN IS BEING DEVELOPED AROUND RESPONSES FROM UNHCR FIELD OFFICER, WHICH HAVE BEEN DIRECTED TO PROVIDED INFORMATION CONCERNING THEIR LOGISTICS CAPABILITY AND SECURITY STATUS. THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING THIS INFORMATION WAS 15 SEP 95. IT IS NOW EXPECTED THAT A PLAN WILL BE ANNOUNCED SOMETIME THIS COMING WEEK. TWO KEY ELEMENTS OF THE PLAN ARE BELIEVED TO BE THE VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION OF UP 600,000 REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE, TANZANIA AND BURUNDI BY 31 DEC 95, AND A COMMITMENT BY ZAIRE TO PROVIDE SECURITY IN THE CAMPS IN THAT COUNTRY.

B. COMMENT. THE FIGURE OF 600,000 VOLUNTARY REPATRIATIONS MAY PROVE TO BE OVERLY AMBITIOUS. BEGINNING ALMOST IMMEDIATELY, THIS WOULD REQUIRE A RETURNEE RATE OF OVER 6,000 PER DAY, VICE THE PRESENT RATE OF ONLY A COUPLE OF HUNDRED AT MOST. PROPAGANDISTS OPPOSED TO ANY REPATRIATION ARE TELLING REFUGEES THEY WILL BE KILLED BY THE GOVERNMENT IF THEY RETURN. THE KILLING OF OVER 100 RWANDANS AT KANAMA COMMUNE HAS SERVED TO VALIDATE THAT MESSAGE IN THE MINDS OF REFUGEES. IN THE ABSENCE OF ANY SIGNIFICANT AND DEMONSTRATIVE MEASURES AIMED AT COUNTERING THE CREDIBILITY, IT IS UNLIKELY REFUGEES WILL RETURN VOLUNTARILY IN NUMBERS ANYWHERE NEAR THOSE DESIRED. FURTHERMORE, IF FACED WITH FORCED REPATRIATION, REFUGEES WILL LIKELY CHOOSE TO FLEE INTO THE COUNTRYSIDE RATHER THAN RISK RETURNING TO RWANDA.

- (3) INDBATT TRANSPORTED 3 TONS OF SEEDS FROM KIGALI TO GITARAMA PREFECTURE BASED ON A REQUEST FROM MILOB HQ GITARAMA. PROVIDED TRANSPORT TO GAMINI HOSPITAL FOR SHIFTING MATTRESSES AND MEDICINES FROM KIGALI TO GAHANI.
- (4) INDBATT MED STAFF TREATED 39 MED AND 6 DENTAL PATIENTS.
- (5) IN SECTOR 1A KIGALI THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS REPORTED CALM. MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROL TO GIKOMERO COMMUNE AND LOCALS REVEALED FREQUENT BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN THE COMMUNE ESPECIALLY IN GICACA SECTOR WHERE THE SCHOOL WAS RECENTLY ROBBED-OFF ALL BOOKS AND OTHER SCHOOLING MATERIALS. MILOBS ALSO ATTENDED A SECURITY MEETING IN THE SAME COMMUNE WHERE THE BOURGEMESTRE AND HIS ASSISTANT, SECRETARY, NINE COUNCILLORS, TWO RPA REPS AND ONE JOURNALIST FROM RADIO RWANDA WERE IN ATTENDANCE.

- (3) THE GENERAL SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS ASSESSED AS CALM DESPITE THE FACT THAT LOCALS ARE STILL LIVING IN FEAR AND PREFER TO SLEEP IN THE FOREST AFTER THE REPETITION OF 11-12 SEPT. NO FURTHER KILLINGS HAD BEEN REPORTED AND ALL SITES HAVE BEEN COVERED. THE NUMBER OF THE PEOPLE KILLED STILL STANDS AS MILOBS REPORTED. SENIOR RPA OFFICER AND PREFECT OF GISENYI VISITED THE KILLING SITE ON 15 SEP 95.
- (4) MILOBS VISITED KIVUMU (GR 5170) AND NYARUTAGARA (GR 3354) COMMUNES AND REVEALED THAT LOCALS HAVE BEING INSTRUCTED NOT TO COMMUNICATE WITH MILOBS BY GISOVU BOURGEMESTRE. ONE TEACHER OF SANZA PRIMARY SCHOOL HAS EVEN BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS FOR TALKING TO MILOBS IN KIVUMU.

A. A EUROPEAN UNION (EU) DELEGATION CONSISTING OF THE MEMBERS OF THE TROIKA (FRANCE, ITALY AND SPAIN) ENDED A TWO-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO KIGALI ON 18 SEP 95. DURING THE COURSE OF THEIR VISIT, THEY WERE BRIEFED BY THE SRSG AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS ON THE SITUATION WITHIN THE COUNTRY, PARTICULARLY WITH REGARDS TO EFFORTS DIRECTED TOWARDS RECONSTRUCTION AND NATIONAL RECONCILIATION. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE DELEGATION PLEDGED INCREASED EU ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 16 SEPTEMBER THAT THE SPECIAL COORDINATOR FOR RWANDA AT THE U.S. STATE DEPARTMENT, MR. RICHARD BOGOSIAN, HELD MEETINGS WITH THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER AND VICE PRIME MINISTER DURING WHICH HE REITERATED HIS COUNTRY'S STRONG SUPPORT FOR RWANDA. MR. OGOSIAN REPORTEDLY STATED THAT HE WAS SATISFIED WITH THE PROGRESS MADE IN RECONSTRUCTING THE COUNTRY.





A. THE SRSG IN HIS BRIEFING TO THE PRESS TODAY, STATED THAT THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE UN SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR THE GREAT LAKES REGION, MR. JOSE LUIZ JESUS HAD MET WITH THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER AND DISCUSSED PLANS REGARDING THE CONVENING OF A REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT IN THE REGION. THE COMPLETION OF THE NSINDA PRISON BY END OF THIS MONTH WILL ACCOMMODATE 5,000 PRISONERS THEREBY MITIGATING THE PROBLEM OF OVERCROWDING.



B. RADIO RWANDA QUOTED THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE AS HAVING ANNOUNCED THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE IMF HAVE AGREED TO RELEASE A LOAN OF US\$13 MILLION THAT WAS PROMISED AT THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE.

ON 20 SEP 95 THE CARTER CENTRE IN ATLANTA, GEORGIA, USA STATED THAT FORMER US PRESIDENT JIMMY CARTER WILL MEET WITH OAU LEADERS TO DISCUSS REGIONAL ISSUES AND POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS TO THE CONTINUING CRISIS IN RWANDA AND BURUNDI. IN AN EDITORIAL COLUMN SYNDICATED IN THE NEW YORK TIMES, CARTER WARNED

WEDNESDAY THAT ARMED SKIRMISHES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AND MILITANT HUTU REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI, ZAIRE AND TANZANIA THREATENED TO ERUPT INTO A BROAD-SCALE WAR. HE SAID THAT THE CRISIS HAS BEEN OVERSHADOWED BY INTERNATIONAL CONCERN FOR THE WAR IN THE FORMER YUGOSLAVIA AND DECRIED THE WITHDRAWAL OF AN INTERNATIONAL PEACEKEEPING FORCE FROM THE AFRICAN REGION. CARTER CONTINUED THAT A STRONG MILITARY FORCE ON THE BORDER BETWEEN ZAIRE AND RWANDA COULD CREATE A BUFFER BETWEEN WARRING GROUPS. IN ADDITION, THAT THE FLOW OF REFUGEES WEAPONS TO REFUGEES SHOULD BE RESTRICTED, WITH UN MONITORS AT GOMA AND OTHER KEY AIRPORTS. CARTER CALLED ON THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO INSIST THAT THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT APPROVE THE MAINTENANCE OF AN ADEQUATE UN FORCE. EX-PRESIDENT CARTER IS SCHEDULED TO MEET WITH OAU LEADERS IN ADDIS ABABA ON 25 SEP 95.



IN SATINSYI COMMUNE (GR 5800) THE RPA CONTINUES TO INDULGE IN ARBITRARY APRESTS INCLUDING INTIMIDATION AND BEATING THE LOCALS TO OBTAIN INFORMATION. THERE IS ALSO REPORT OF LITTLE THEFTS CONTINUING IN GASEKE (GR 4904).



2. **OVERVIEW.** THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

3. **RPA.** A GENERAL FEELING OF INSECURITY AMONG LOCAL POPULATION IN ALMOST ALL THE COMMUNES OF KIBUYE PREFECTURE. RPA ENGAGES IN ACTS CAPABLE OF CAUSING EMIGRATION; SUCH AS ARREST, TORTURE AND EXTORTION OF MONEY AND OTHER VALUABLES. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

4. **FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.**

A. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) - AT APPROXIMATELY 1100 HRS THREE OFFICERS AND TEN SOLDIERS FROM THE TANZANIAN ARMY ESCORTED 28 MEN, 3 WOMEN AND 5 CHILDREN TO RPA POST AT RUSUMO BORDER. THEY ARE ALLEGED TO HAVE COMMITTED CRIMES IN TANZANIA HOWEVER UNCONFIRMED SOURCES STATED THAT THESE PEOPLE HAVE CONTACTS OR ARE MEMBERS OF THE FRGF. 

2. OVERVIEW. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

UNAMIR Military Activity Highlights For September 1995

KIGALI, RWANDA -- Did you know that during the month of September 1995, the following UNAMIR military activities were conducted under the command of Canadian Forces Major General Guy Tousignant to help assist the people of Rwanda?

Sector 1 (IndBatt)

During the month, military personnel from Indian Battalion:

- a. provided security at Ndera Camp which received hundreds of refugees and IDPs who were then returned safely to their home communes;
- b. provided trucks to Humanitarian Action Coordination Unity for the transportation of tiles;
- c. donated food and miscellaneous stores including toiletries to the "Missionaries of Charity" orphanage in Kigali;
- d. carried out the electrification - security lighting, electrical cables and electric points - and repair of water pipelines at the "Missionaries of Charity" orphanage. Additionally, the medical team conducted a medical check up of the orphans and distributed medicines;
- e. provided trucks to the RPA for the transport of firewood from Gitarama to Birango;
- f. provided trucks for "Food For The Hungry International" to transport food from Kigali to Gitarama;
- g. donated rations and foodstuffs to the Belgian Red Cross orphanage in Kigali;
- h. donated rations and foodstuffs to the Remera Orphanage for Unaccompanied Children;
- i. provided trucks to the RPA for the transport of food from Kigali to Butare;

j. donated 30 packages of medicines provided by the Indian Red Cross as well as rations and foodstuff to the Centre Medico Social;

k. carried out vehicle repair work for the Commanding Officer of the 7th RPA Battalion;

l. provided trucks to Gamini Hospital for the transport of medicines and mattresses;

m. provided trucks to the RPA to move recruits from Kigali to Nsinda;

n. provided trucks to UNDP for the transport of mattresses to Nsinda Prison;

o. medical staff treated local Rwandese throughout the month;

p. participated in fire fighting operations at a Kigali warehouse fire and provided medical assistance to the injured; and,

q. provided one truck to RPA to transport prison guards from Kigali to Nsinda.

#### Sector 2 (GhanCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Ghana Company:

a. provided vehicles to transport food for RPA troops from Kigali to Kibungo;

b. donated assorted food items to the Roman Catholic Church in Bare;

c. provided trucks for the delivery of food to local communes for the World Food Programme and UN High Commission for Refugees;

d. provided trucks to Kibungo Hospital for the delivery of food items to Gahini Hospital;

e. medical staff treated local Rwandese throughout the month;

f. provided trucks to the Byumba Bourgemestre for the transport of food for the RPA; and,

g. provided transport and escorts to Ministers of Justice and Rehabilitation visiting Kibungo Prison.



### Sector 3 (MaliCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Mali Company:

- a. on request from the Rusatira Bourgemestre, provided transport for plastic sheets from UNICEF to the commune office;
- b. provided trucks for the transport of CARITAS products to Butare; and,
- c. provided trucks for the transport of students from Cyangugu to Gikongoro.

### Sector 4 (MalawiCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Malawi Company:

- a. monitored the inflow/outflow of refugees at transit camps and entry points of Rusizi I and II and at Uvira;
- b. medical staff treated local Rwandese throughout the month at the Gihundwe Hospital as well as treating local staff at the Company First Aid Post;
- c. provided trucks to assist in the transportation of civilians from Gikongoro to Nyungwe Forest where there was a fire;
- d. provided trucks to the RPA to assist in the transportation of food to RPA sub-units. Trucks were also provided to the RPA to help them with local administration duties; and,
- e. provided trucks to the IRC to transport construction materials for the Nyarushishi Refugee Camp.

### Sector 5 (NiCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Nigeria Company:

- a. provided ambulance transport for a local patient with a spinal cord injury to Kigali from the Ruhengeri General Hospital;
- b. transported local counsellors to the Kabaya Sou-Prefet for a meeting;
- c. supplied water to the Imbabazi Orphanage;
- d. medical personnel treated 110 refugees for various diseases at the Kayove Refugee Camp, as well as making a reconnaissance for an alternate

drinking water source for the Camp as the present one is unhygienic;

- e. medical personnel investigated a reported measles outbreak in Kibuye;
- f. medical personnel treated 72 orphans at the Imbabazi Orphanage in Mutura;
- g. medical personnel treated 34 locals at Kayove Humanitarian Clinic; and,
- h. recovered an RPA vehicle with road recovery equipment.

#### Military Observers

During the month, Military Observers throughout Rwanda:

- a. discovered live explosives and identified mines - locals were made aware and Force Engineers defused the explosives safely;
- b. transported a representative of the Ministry of Rehabilitation to various communes to identify lands for the resettlement of returnees;
- c. visited communes throughout Rwanda to monitor the safe return of refugees;
- d. monitored hospital and prison conditions, schools and consulted with Prefects and Bourgemestres to assist in local communes;
- e. assisted in the investigation into the Kanama Incident along with UN Human Rights monitors, UN Civilian Police and the Rwandese Government;
- f. advised human rights monitors of any possible human rights violations and investigated infiltrations, thefts, assaults, illegal arrests; and,
- g. assisted in coordinating reburial ceremonies and carrying out clean water reconnaissance.

#### Force Signals Company

During the month, military personnel from the Force Signals Company:

- a. helped to activate the local Kigali telephone lines of Rwandatel;
- b. provided trucks to the local (Rwandan) organization "ARDEC" throughout the month for the transportation of wood; and,

- c. provided vehicle assistance to Rwandatel.

Force Engineer Company

During the month, military personnel from the Force Engineer Company:

- a. continued work on building sanitary facilities and water supplies, as well as donating food at a rehabilitation school in Butare;
- b. provided concrete mixers with operators to BMS for the concreting work at transit camps;
- c. conducted bulldozer and levelling work at the Nkamera Transit Camp in Gisenyi, deployed an excavator to construct drainage facilities and provided dump trucks for transporting of gravel to the Camp;
- d. constructed the security lighting system and sentry posts at the Ontracom Detention Centre in Kigali;
- e. deployed a bulldozer and an excavator for levelling and digging at the new Detention Centre in Gikondo;
- f. deployed a bulldozer at the "Sisters of Mercy" Orphanage in Kigali;
- g. Explosives Ordinance Disposal team recovered and destroyed large numbers of grenades and other explosives near Mount Zali in Kigali;
- h. provided vehicles for the transportation of children in Kigali;
- i. deployed a bulldozer for levelling and improving of approaches to Nsinda Prison;
- j. provided dump trucks to the Kabuga Development Centre to assist in the repair of bridge on the Muyenzi-Cyogo-Kabuga Road;
- k. deployed a bulldozer for the repair of road south of the bridge on the Muyenzi-Cyogo-Kabuga Road;

UNAMIR Political Activity Highlights For September 1995

KIGALI, RWANDA -- Did you know that during the month of September 1995, the following UNAMIR political activities were conducted to help assist the people of Rwanda?

The Special Representative of the Secretary General (SRSG), Ambassador Shaharyar Khan met with:

- a. the United Nations High Commissioner For Refugees, Mrs Sadako Ogata to discuss the refugee repatriation process;
- b. the Dutch Minister for Development Cooperation, Mr Jan Pronk, to discuss the refugee situation in Rwanda, the conditions of the prisons and political developments in the country;
- c. UNDP, UNICEF, UNHCR and ICRC representatives to discuss plans of action to alleviate Rwanda's prison conditions and pledged that UNAMIR military and civilian personnel would contribute their expertise and resources to assist;
- d. representatives from the Rwandan Government and various UN agencies to coordinate aid for the wounded and investigation into the Kanama incident;
- e. the Ugandan Ambassador to Rwanda to discuss recent developments in Rwanda;
- f. the Rwandese Vice Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior accompanied by UNAMIR's Commissioner of Civilian Police to discuss UNAMIR's assistance in training of Rwanda's communal police force;

g. the Rwandan President, Mr Pasteur Bizimungu to discuss the Kanama Incident, prison conditions and the refugee repatriation process;

h. a European Union (EU) delegation from France, Italy and Spain to discuss efforts towards reconstruction and reconciliation. The delegation pledged increased EU assistance to Rwanda;

i. the Special Envoy of the UN Secretary General for the Great Lakes Region, Mr Jose Luis Jesus, as well as with the Rwandan President, Vice President and Foreign Affairs Minister, Mr Anastase Gasana to discuss the possibility of holding a conference on security, stability and development in the region;

j. the media to announce that recruitment of judiciary is forthcoming and that 50 foreign experts should arrive in one month's time to review the judicial system in an advisory capacity;

k. the Minister of Justice, accompanied by the UNDP representative to discuss reconstruction of the national justice process;

l. the Deputy Prosecutor, Judge Rukotomanana to discuss modalities related to the establishment of the International Tribunal in Arusha;

m. the ambassadors of Germany, France and the United States to discuss the prison situation and the judicial system; and,

n. the heads of UN agencies to discuss a paper concerning the expected return of refugees to Rwanda.

The SRSG also attended ceremonies in Butare where 650 members of the Former Rwandese Government Forces were sworn into the Rwandese Patriotic Army following a one-year course in political and military training.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU HAS STOPPED FOR THE TIME BEING. HOWEVER SOME VOLUNTARY REFUGEES CONTINUE TO ARRIVE AT THE BORDER.



HE WAS ARRESTED ON THURSDAY 31 AUG 95 AND TAKEN TO THE BWAKIRA COMMUNE PRISON. ON 04 SEP 95 AT 0530 HRS HE WAS SHOT WITH THREE BULLETS. THE DIRECTOR FURTHER STATED THAT IT WAS THE SECOND CASE OF KILLING OF A TEACHER FROM THE KILINDA SECONDARY SCHOOL. THE FIRST INCIDENT TOOK PLACE ON 14 APR 95. DIRECTOR ALSO INFORMED MILOB TEAM THAT TWO ATTEMPTS WERE MADE TO KILL HIM BUT IN VAIN.

GENERAL SITUATION

1. (U) THE OVERALL SITUATION REMAINS STABLE. ON 19 AUG 95, ZAIREAN AUTHORITIES BEGAN TO FORCIBLY EVICT RWANDAN REFUGEES FROM CAMPS IN THE GOMA AND BUKAVU AREAS. THE EFFORT WAS SUSPENDED ON 24 AUG AFTER APPROX 13,000 REFUGEES CROSSED BACK INTO RWANDA. LOOTING AND BURNING OF SOME CAMPS, AND MISTREATMENT OF REFUGEES, BY ZAIREAN TROOPS WAS REPORTED. ZAIRE HAS STATED THAT FORCED REPATRIATION WILL RESUME IF AGREEMENT IS NOT REACHED BY 26 AUG ON THE VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION OF ALL REMAINING RWANDAN REFUGEES.

POLITICAL

2. (UN R) THE FORCED REPATRIATION THIS WEEK OF THOUSANDS OF RWANDAN REFUGEES PROMPTED UP TO 130,000 OTHERS TO FLEE INTO THE ZAIREAN COUNTRYSIDE. AT LEAST FOUR REFUGEE CAMPS ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF BUKAVU AND TWO CAMPS NEAR UVIRA HAVE SUSTAINED HEAVY DAMAGE OR BEEN DESTROYED. SOME FORMER RESIDENTS MAY BE RETURNING, HOWEVER, AS WORD OF THE SUSPENSION OF THE FORCED REPATRIATION REACHES THOSE HIDING IN THE COUNTRYSIDE.

3. (U) ZAIRE IS INSISTING THAT THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY FOR REPATRIATING AT LEAST 5,000 REFUGEES PER DAY TO RWANDA, AND WOULD LIKE ALL REMAINING REFUGEES ACROSS THE BORDER BY YEAR'S END. UNHCR, WHO HAS APPARENTLY OFFERED TO TURN THE OPERATION INTO A VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION PROGRAMME, HAS STATED THAT IT CANNOT SUPPORT THAT HIGH OF A RETURNEE RATE. ALSO, DESPITE ASSURANCES FROM SOME REFUGEE LEADERS THAT MOST REFUGEES WANT TO RETURN TO RWANDA, ONLY A FRACTION HAVE ACTUALLY APPLIED TO DO SO.

4. (U) THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT HAS OPENLY ENCOURAGED REFUGEES TO RETURN, INCLUDING FORMER GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS, BUT OPPOSITION

ELEMENTS IN THE CAMPS HAVE UNDERTAKEN A CAMPAIGN OF PROPAGANDA, DISINFORMATION AND INTIMIDATION TO DISCOURAGE REFUGEES FROM ACCEPTING THE OFFER. UNHCR, HOWEVER, IS REPORTEDLY EXPECTING AT LEAST 3,000 REFUGEES TO CROSS AT CYANGUGU BEGINNING 29 AUG 95.

5. (UN R) COMMENT. ZAIRE CLAIMS THAT FORCED REPATRIATION WAS THE DIRECT RESULT OF THE SUSPENSION OF THE ARMS EMBARGO AGAINST RWANDA, WHICH ZAIRE WAS NOT IN FAVOUR. HOWEVER, THE BURDEN OF CARING FOR ITS MILLION PLUS REFUGEE POPULATION, WHICH INCLUDES REFUGEES FROM RWANDA, BURUNDI AND ANGOLA, IS BECOMING A SOURCE OF INSTABILITY FOR THE ZAIREAN GOVERNMENT. NONETHELESS, IT IS UNCLEAR WHETHER ZAIRE IS PREPARED TO RESORT TO A FORCED, AND MASSIVE, REFUGEE REPATRIATION, OR IS ATTEMPTING A FEINT TO COERCE THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY INTO REASSUMING THE BURDEN OF CARE FOR REFUGEES IN THE COUNTRY.

**MILITARY**

6. (U) THE MOST SIGNIFICANT EVENT THIS WEEK HAS BEEN THE RESTRAINED REACTION BY THE RWANDAN MILITARY AND SECURITY SERVICES TO THE DRAMATIC SURGE IN RETURNEES. RWANDAN AUTHORITIES DETAINED SOME REFUGEES, INCLUDING PRISONERS TURNED OVER BY ZAIRE, AND A NUMBER OF ADMITTED FORMER GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS, BUT THE OVERALL FIGURE WAS A FRACTION OF THE REFUGEE INTAKE.

**CONCLUSION**

7. (U) THE REFUGEE CRISIS OF LAST WEEK DID NOT RESULT IN ANY SIGNIFICANT THREAT TO THE STABILITY OF THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT. THE TREATMENT OF REFUGEES AT THE BORDER AND IN THE TRANSIT CAMPS BY RWANDAN AUTHORITIES, PARTICULARLY THE ARMY, EXCEEDED EXPECTATIONS BY SOME, AND GARNERED PRAISE FROM SOME UN AGENCIES AND NGOs.

8. (UN R) COMMENT. A RESUMPTION OF FORCED REPATRIATION BY ZAIRE COULD RESULT IN AN UNCONTROLLED MASS EXODUS OF RWANDAN REFUGEES. THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT MAY REACT STRONGLY TO SUCH AN EVENT, FEARING THAT FORMER GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS WOULD SEIZE THE OPPORTUNITY TO INFILTRATE BACK INTO THE COUNTRY.

MOREOVER, ZAIRE'S END-YEAR DEADLINE FOR REPATRIATING RWANDAN REFUGEES IS LIKELY ONLY ACHIEVABLE IF FORCED REPATRIATION WERE TO RESUME. A NEGOTIATED RETURN MAY BE DIFFICULT TO ACHIEVE, EVEN WITH THE AGREEMENT OF ALL PARTIES. ONCE REFUGEES ARE COMMITTED TO A REPATRIATION, THEY MAY UNDERTAKE TO RETURN SOONER RATHER THAN LATER, INCLUDING THOSE FROM TANZANIA AND BURUNDI, OVERWHELMING THE RESOURCES IN PLACE TO HANDLE THEM.



1. PLEASE FIND ATTACHED THE DAILY INFOSUM MENTIONED ABOVE.

2. OVERVIEW. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU APPEARS TO BE TEMPORARILY HALTED, PENDING NEGOTIATIONS.

3. RPA.

(1) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) SOME SMALL ARMS FIRING WAS HEARD ON 30 AUG 95 AT 1755 HR'S FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE MAIN BORDER CROSSING POINT IN GISENYI. SUBSEQUENT INVESTIGATION DID NOT REVEAL ANY UNUSUAL ACTIVITY.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) ARMED RPA FROM KINIGI COMMUNE GR 5440 VISITED THE MSF CLINIC AFTER MIDNIGHT AND DEMANDED MEDICINES USING FORCE.

(1) CIVPOL TEAM PATROL TO NYAMUTERA COMMUNE WAS INFORMED THAT ON 26 AUG 95 ONE LOCAL WAS SHOT AND WOUNDED IN HIS HOUSE BY TWO ARMED MEN, ONE DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM AND THE OTHER IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES. THE WOUNDED WAS EVAC TO RUHENGARI HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. REASON FOR THE SHOOTING UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) ON 29 AUG 95 AN UNIDENTIFIED NUMBER OF BANDITS ATTEMPTED TO STEAL FIVE COWS IN GISHOMA COMMUNE GISAGARA AREA GR 7812, IN SECTOR 4 BUT WERE FOILED BY RPA AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE ENSUED BUT NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED. THE BANDITS ESCAPED WITHOUT THE COWS.
