Dear Jean,

Many thanks for your note dated 12 April.

Your draft for the Brunei project was sent to us by Clark a few weeks after you left. In his transmission letter, he pointed out that it was not yet cleared by the EPU (and those above) and was therefore for our information only. I telephoned Mr. Kidd on 11 April and asked him if he knew whether there was any intention that EPU would request UNDP's assistance and to tell Mr. Clark that if there were delays in the delivery of assistance it would not be our fault. Mr. Kidd promised to tell Mr. Clark and inquire about intentions.

That's where we are.

Can we therefore leave it that you, when you get to Bangkok, telephone this office in order to see whether we have any more news. As I may be on home leave, you had better ask for Mr. Satrap, who sends his best regards.

Personally, I feel your proposal fits Brunei very well. When I was there they gave, however, highest priority for water survey for domestic water, but that is a detail.

Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries

Please refer to your letter TE 311/1 Malaysia, Brunei and Singapore of 17 April 1975. We wish to inform you that the Government of Malaysia has responded as follows:

1. Expert services. The Government agency responsible for this activity is the Public Services Department, UMBC Building, Kuala Lumpur. The following four universities should also be included: University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur, Universiti Sains, Penang; Agriculture University, Serdang and the National University, Kuala Lumpur.
2. The list of firms which can offer supplies, equipment or services to development assistance projects in developing countries can be obtained from the Implementation, Coordination Development Administration Unit of the Prime Minister's Department. (We have, as yet, not received this list and will forward it to you once it is received).
3. With regard to training facilities, Malaysia can provide placements in the field of rubber research (Rubber Research Institute); telecommunications technique (Telecoms Training Centre); specialised vocational

trades (Industrial Training Institute), broadcasting development (National Broadcasting Training Centre); administrative procedures and management techniques (National Institute of Public Administration, Petaling Jaya).

Malaysia has also been contributing to the publication by UNIDO on programmes of cooperation among developing countries in which they have indicated their interests and are actively participating in regional economic groupings e.g. ASEAN and SEATAC.

Singapore

No reply has yet been received from Singapore and we will communicate with you as soon as their reaction is received.

Brunei

We have received a negative reply from the Brunei Government informing us that they are unable to provide expert personnel who could be nominated to fill the posts in the UN, or to nominate firms which can offer services to development assistance projects in developing countries, or to provide training facilities and courses which can be utilized for placement of UN fellows. 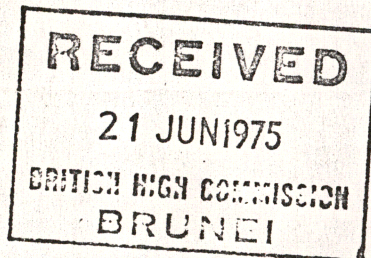
