4. HUMANITARIAN : The ZAZA Health Centre has now been provided with required medicine by an NGO called IMC. But the problem of water supply still exists.



1. SITUATION

a. GENERAL

The general situation in the area was calm.

b. BORDER

RUSUMO : The border post was open to normal traffic.

2. a. POLITICAL : NTR.

b. RPA : Normal presence at check points was seen.

3. a. SECT HQ : The Sect HQ coordinated the teams' activities. The Sect Comd continued his familiarisation tour in the AOR. He visited the NYAKARAMBI Transit Camp 7349 and the BUKOBA Border Post 8737. He met the officials of AEF, World Food Programme and the immigration .

b. TEAMS :

(1) One team patrolled route KABARONDO 6278, RWAINKAVU 6782, MULUNDI 7768 and RUKIRA 6658. The situation in the whole area was calm.

(2) One team patrolled route KAYONZA 5784, KWANGIRE 5099, RUKARA 5601 and GAHINI 5397. The area was reported calm.

(3) One team patrolled route CYUNUZI 6247, NYAKARAMBI Transit Camp 7349 and BUKOBA Border Post 8636. The area was also calm.

4. HUMANITARIAN

a. Our team was informed by the hospital administrator that a curfew has been enforced by RPA recently in and around RWAINKAVU area and is causing unnecessary harm to the patients, staffs and local populace surrounding RWAINKAVU CENTRE DE SANTE. Nobody is allowed to visit the hospital after

2000 hours. Even none is allowed to call a hospital staff from his residence to attend an emergency patient during the curfew time. Further details are being ascertained and will be forwarded as soon as possible.

b. An NGO called LUTHERIAN WORLDWIDE FEDERATION (LWF) distributed 135 bags of food stuffs like maize, beans and flour to the people of RWAINKAVU area.


c. There is a shortage of drinking water in MULUNDI area and an inconsistent supply of water prevails in RUKARA commune, because of the limited capacity of the diesel engine pumping water from lower ground into the commune water supply system. The Bourgemestre of the commune requested for assistance in the rehabilitation of a water reservoir in GAHINI Sectuer for constant supply.

d. The administrator of GAHINI Hospital under RWAMAGANA Sous Prefecture complained of insufficient food for the patients, lack of medical staffs and laboratory equipments. The hospital is assisted by Italian Aid - a NGO and the World Food Programme provides food for the patients. At present there are 115 returnees in the NYAKARAMBI Transit Camp. The officials of the camp are ready to receive any returnees from Zaire.







b. A meeting was held at SAKE commune office today about health and sanitation in the commune. About eighty (80) people attended including representatives of UNHCR and UNICEF. It was



1. Reference "A" requested for returns on refugees for the month of June and to include data from Jan 95. It further requested for an assessment on likely progress with reasons.

2. Efforts have been made by this office to provide a comprehensive report as requested. We have liaised with the prefecture, commune bureaux, transit camps and UNHCR. There have been good responses but the Kibungo Prefecture and its subsidiary commune bureaux - are yet to complete their data for June to enable us cross check with ours.

3. However, available figures cross checked with UNHCR for June showed 3,969 returnees entered Rwanda. The breakdown is as follows:

a. Burundi - 1359

b. Tanzania - 672

c. Uganda - 29

d. Zaire - 1909 (Returnees crossed into Rwanda from various entry points some months ago and settled at NDERA Transit Camp in Kigali before being moved to Kibungo Prefecture. Therefore, the acceptance of 1909 is likely to be a duplication).

4. Furthermore, the figure 3,969 are those who crossed over into the country and sought UNHCR assistance of either transportation, accommodation or feeding. It is expected that the figures from the communes will show the correct number of returnees because most of them came home without the assistance of UN or NGO agencies. We will therefore be in a position to provide the correct number of returnees when we receive figures from the prefecture and commune bureaux and cross check with UNHCR/Milobs.

5. On the assessment of trends in the coming periods, we wish to state that there will be an increase from both Tanzania and Burundi because of the visit by the Prefect of Kibungo to Tanzania in mid June and the visit of 20 community (camp) refugee leaders in Burundi from 4 - 6 July to Kibungo Prefecture.

The community leaders, 12 from MUGANO and the remaining 8 from NTAMBA Camps, visited BIRENGA, SAKE and KIGARAMA Communes. They made random interviews of locals in their communes and were more impressed to see their former refugee mates who returned about a fortnight ago fully settled-in. The leaders are expected to return to Burundi tomorrow.
5. The community in GATI is facing a major problem of housing as a result of destruction of houses during the civil war. The earlier returnees to the community occupied houses not belonging to them. With the return of the actual owners of the houses the illegal occupants are being ejected resulting in acute shortage of accn. It was again reported that parents also find it quite

difficult of sending their children to school because they cannot meet the school fees of RFW 300 a year plus school uniform cost.

Speakers at the parade included a witness of the genocide Mr HATEGEKIMANA DONACIEN, Bourgemestre of BIRENGA, 201 A/Bde Comd and the Prefect of KIBUNGO who was the Guest of Honour. Mr Hategekimana thanked the RPA for saving the lives of innocent people including children; the Bourgemestre asked for the observance of a Minute's Silence for the dead; the 201 A/Bde Comd recounted events that lead to the taking over of government which included the destruction of the economy and bebasing the life of ordinary people of Rwanda by the former government; and finally the Prefect of KIBUNGO assured the people of good governance. The parade was watched by a crowd of about 5,000 which included UN Agencies and NGOs stationed in the prefecture. At a reception, the Catholic Bishop of KIBUNGO thanked God for saving the lives of innocent people and prayed for a new christian in Rwanda. Later, 201 Bde engaged KIBUNGO Town XI in a friendly football match which ended 3 - 1 in 201 Bde's favour. Finally, a Disco session and fund raising ceremony was to be held in the evening to run off the celebration.





would be conducted to confirm the report.







TODAY (26 JUNE 1995) I (CPMT) WENT AT 0900 HOURS WITH MSF TO THE GENDARMERIE BRIGADE. THE COMMANDER OF THE BRIGADE WAS NOT AROUND. MSF PRESENTED TO THE RESPONSIBLE OFFICER THE ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS OF THE ARRESTED VEHICLE. NEVERTHELESS THE RESPONSIBLE OFFICER COULD NOT RELEASE THE VEHICLE BEFORE CONTACTING THE COMMANDER OF THE GENDARMERIE. HE REQUESTED US TO COME BACK AT 1030 HOURS.

AT 1030 HOURS WE WENT ONCE MORE TO THE GENDARMERIE BRIGADE. NEITHER THE COMMANDER NOR THE RESPONSIBLE OFFICER WERE AVAILABLE. WE LEFT THE BRIGADE AT 1115 HOURS. MSF INFORMED THE GENDARMERIE, THAT THEY WILL STOP ALL ACTIVITIES IN THE GISENYI PREFECTURE TILL THE MOMENT THE VEHICLE WILL BE GIVEN BACK.



The team investigated an earlier report of a suspected mass grave along road MUGESERA 4764 -RWAMAGANA 4881. It was revealed to the team that on Saturday 24 Jun 95 about ten (10) people were buried in three (3) graves at GR 505755 and that the dead were believed to have been shot and killed in RUTONDE Commune 4884 possibly at RWAMAGANA 4881. UNCHR has been informed.
- (d) One team patrolled KIBUNGO, RUKIRA 6557, NYARUBUYE 8458, RUSUMO Border Post 8737 and NYAKARAMBI Transit Camp. Teachers at NYARUKA 7762 Primary School complained of default of salary payment from 16 January 1995. The NYARUBUYE dispensary reported of shortage of drugs. AEF, which runs the dispensary, was informed and are prepared to address the drug situation tomorrow 27 Jun.
- (e) One team investigated reported concentration of about 600 IDPs at KANKOBWA 8860 on 18 Jun following a directive from the local counsellor to make administration and distribution of relief items to them easier. As at now the IDPs have left the concentrated area to their homes. The investigation revealed that most of the 600 IDPs were forced to leave their homes along the RWANDAN-TANZANIAN border because of possible alleged assistance to refugees living in Tanzania. The rest of the IDPs feared for their life because of arrests of their neighbours by the security agencies. They subsequently left to the concentrated area.

4. It was reported that at NYAKARAMBI Transit Camp, on Saturday 24 Jun 95, 375 returnees from NDERA in Kigali manhandled a local staff of AEF and the Transit Camp Administrator over non-provision of cooking pots to them. The two men were detained for over three hours at the camp. Efforts by the Sous-Prefect of KIREHE yielded no positive result until the security agencies were asked to provide security at the camp before the two staff were released by their captives. Today, the Milob Sector sought assistance from German Agro Action to provide the returnees with the cooking pots which were delivered to the returnees in the afternoon. Meanwhile, some of the returnees have left the camp for various secteurs and the rest will be sent to their communes tomorrow.

5. GHANBATT reported that at about 251900B Jun a local NYABUTSITSI aged 26 yrs from MULAMBI 4994 and residing at GATI 4392 escaped arrest and sought refuge at GHANBATT Coy location GISHALI 4889. He was accused of acts of genocide. UNCHR was informed and investigation was in progress before hand over action.
