


Dear Mayor Villaraigosa,


Dear Mayor Kautz,



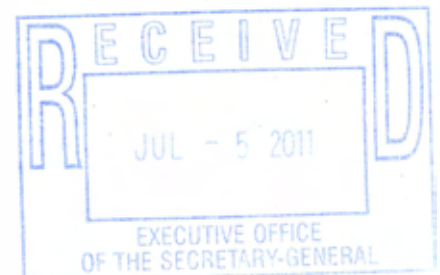

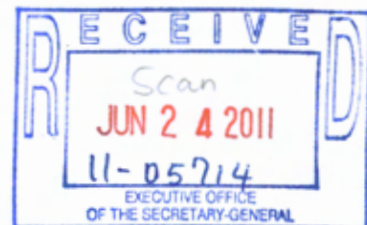
