IV. UNITED STATES CASES.

- 597) Trial of Ferdinand Lents, a German national.
Date & Place of Trial: 20th - 21st November 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Being concerned in the killing of approximately three unknown non-German nationals, inmates of Buchenwald Concentration Camp, who were then in the custody of the then German Reich.
Verdict: Not guilty.
- 598) Trial of Johann Vican, an Austrian national.
Date & Place of Trial: 2nd October 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: That he was concerned in the killing of an unknown Russian national and two unknown Polish nationals, inmates of Flossenburg Concentration Camp, who were then in the custody of the then German Reich. (3 charges).
Verdict: Guilty of all charges.
Sentence: Imprisonment for 20 years commencing 1st May 1945. Confirmed.
- 599) Trial of Gustav Hermann Adolf Blay, a German national.
Date & Place of Trial: 15th - 19th May 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: That he encouraged and participated in the killing of 450 Russian and Polish inmates of Mauthausen Concentration Camp, 600 Polish, Czechoslovakian, Russian and French inmates of Mauthausen Concentration Camp, and 106 non-German nationals, inmates of the Mauthausen Concentration Camp, who were then in the custody of the then German Reich, the exact numbers and names being unknown. (3 charges).
Verdict: Guilty, but with exceptions.
Sentence: Imprisonment for life. Confirmed.
- 600) Trial of Klaus Ferdinand Huels, a German national.
Date & Place of Trial: 31st October - 4th November 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Being concerned in the killing of several non-German nationals, inmates of Buchenwald Concentration Camp. (3 charges).
Verdict: Not guilty.

- 601) Trial of Fritz Schallenberg, a German national.
Date & Place of Trial: 21st - 22nd April 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Being concerned in the killing of an unknown Yugoslav inmate of Gross Raming Concentration Camp who was then in the custody of the then German Reich.
Verdict: Guilty.
Sentence: Imprisonment for 20 years.
Confirmed.
- 602) Trial of Fritz Hecke and Johann Fellert.
Date & Place of Trial: 3rd - 10th February 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: (1) That .. acting in pursuance of a common design to commit the acts hereinafter alleged, and as individual(s) aiding in the operation of the Dachau Concentration Camp and camps subsidiary thereto, did, at or in the vicinity of Dachau and Landsberg, Germany, between about 1 January 1942 and about 29 April 1945, wilfully, deliberately and wrongfully encourage, aid, abet and participate in the subjection of civilian nationals of nations then at war with the then German Reich to cruelties and mistreatment, including killings, beatings, tortures, starvation, abuses and indignities, the exact names and numbers of such civilian nationals being unknown but aggregating many thousands who were then and there in the custody of the German Reich in exercise of belligerent control.
(2) As Charge No.1, but the acts were committed against surrendered and unarmed prisoners of war.
Verdict: Hecke, not guilty,
Fellert, guilty.
Sentence: Imprisonment for 3 years commencing 5 May 1945.
Confirmed.

Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.
Verdict: Guilty.

 J. Date & Place of Trial: 22nd January 1948 at Yokohama.
 Charge: Not shown.
 Verdict: Guilty.
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 10 years with hard labour.
- 631) Trial of Takayoshi Sakano, a Japanese national.
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 7th - 21st January 1948 at Yokohama.
 Charge: Decapitating.
 Verdict: Guilty.
 Sentence: Imprisonment for life with hard labour.
- 632) Trial of Ryohai Tanaka, a Japanese national.
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 19th Jan. - 2nd Feb. 1948 at Yokohama.
 Charge: Ill-treatment of prisoners of war; failure to discharge duty as camp commander; exposure of POWs to hazards of war; failure to restrain and control camp personnel and permitting them to commit cruel and brutal acts against POWs.
 Verdict: Guilty.
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 25 years with hard labour.

 Date & Place of Trial: 24th June - 14th July 1947 at Dachau.
 Charge: Being concerned in the killing of an Allied POW.
 Verdict: Guilty.
 Sentence: Death by hanging.
 Findings and sentence disapproved.
- 639) Trial of Hans Seibold, Albert Schraff and Fritz Miller, German nationals.
 Date & Place of Trial: 5th - 7th March 1947 at Dachau.
 Charge: (1) Being concerned in the killing of an American POW.
 (2) Being members of organisations declared criminal by the I.M.E., i.e. the Leadership Corps or the S.S.
 Verdict: All accused found guilty of both charges.
 Sentences: Death by hanging, 1,
 Imprisonment for life, 2. / life.
 Approved, but death sentence commuted to imprisonment for
- 640) Trial of Erwin Metz and Ludwig Herz, German nationals.
 Date & Place of Trial: 3th Sept. - 15th Oct. 1946 at Dachau.
 Charge: Against Metz: Being concerned in the killing of an American prisoner of war, and being concerned in assaults upon American prisoners of war.
 Against both accused: Ill-treatment of prisoners of war by failure to provide adequate food, medical care, etc., resulting in the death of several unknown members of the U.S. Army.
 Verdict: Both found guilty of the charges of which they were accused.
 Sentences: Death by hanging, 2.
 Findings approved, but sentences commuted to imprisonment for life, (Metz) and imprisonment for 5 years, (Herz).
- 641) Trial of August Kläbe and Paul Foerster, German nationals.
 Date & Place of Trial: 23rd April 1947 at Dachau.
 Charge: Assault upon an American POW.
 Verdict: Foerster escaped pending trial and Kläbe tried alone.

 Approved but the period reduced to 3 years.

 Charge: Assaults upon an unknown American prisoner of war.
 Verdict: Albrecht neither tried nor served.
 Guilty, 2.
 Sentences: Imprisonment for 2½ years, 1,

Date & Place of Trial: 17th - 19th July 1946 at Dachau.
Charge: Killing an unknown American prisoner of war.
Verdict: Not guilty.
- 644) Trial of Victor Hantscharenko, a Russian national, (an S.S. guard).
Date & Place of Trial: 14th - 16th October 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Killing approximately 12 non-German nationals, inmates of Buchenwald Concentration Camp.
Verdict: Guilty.
Sentence: Imprisonment for life.
Approved.
- 645) Trial of Anton Stinglwagner and Max Lengfelder, German nationals.
Date & Place of Trial: 12th - 14th August 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Being concerned in the killing of approximately 70 Polish nationals, inmates of Dachau Concentration Camp, and (against Stinglwagner only) being concerned in the killing of an unknown Czechoslovakian national, also an inmate of Dachau Concentration Camp.
Verdict: Guilty, with exceptions.
Sentences: Stinglwagner, Death by hanging.
Lengfelder, Imprisonment for life.
Findings confirmed, but death sentence commuted to imprisonment for life, and life sentence reduced to imprisonment for 20 years.
- 646) Trial of Ernst August Behrens and 9 others, German, Roumanian, Hungarian and Yugoslav nationals.
Date & Place of Trial: 5th December 1946 at Dachau.
Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.
Verdict: Not guilty, 1.
Guilty, 9.
Sentences: Imprisonment for 3 years, 1,
" " 2 1/2 " 2,
" " 2 " 6.
Approved.
- 647) Trial of Johann Adolf.
Date & Place of Trial: 24th - 25th February 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.
Verdict: Not guilty.
- 648) Trial of Wilhelm Kamm and 9 others, German nationals.
Date & Place of Trial: 23rd - 24th July 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.
Verdict: One person was neither served nor tried.
Not guilty, 1,
Guilty, 8.
Sentences: Imprisonment for 15 years, 2,
" " 10 " 1,
" " 11 " 1,
" " 5 " 4.
Findings approved, but sentences reduced as follows:
15 years to 10 years and 5 years respectively; 11 years and 10 years both reduced to 5 years; five years reduced to 3 years.

Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.
Verdict: Guilty of first charge only.
Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years.
Findings and sentence disapproved.
- 650) Trial of Heinz Thorenz and 5 others.
Date & Place of Trial: 11th - 12th September 1947 at Dachau.
Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.
Verdict: Five accused were served but not tried.
One found guilty, (Heinz Thorenz.)
Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years.
Approved.

651) Trial of Heinrich Beck and 2 others.

Date & Place of Trial: 30th - 31st July 1947 at Dachau.

Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.

Verdict: Not guilty, 2,
Guilty, 1.

Sentence: Imprisonment for 3 years.
Approved.

652) Trial of Johann Schiller, a German national.

Date & Place of Trial: 12th September 1947 at Dachau.

Charge: That he subjected persons to killings, beatings, tortures, etc. at or in the vicinity of Mauthausen Concentration Camp and/or its sub-camps, the persons being Poles, Frenchmen, Greeks, Yugoslavs, citizens of the Soviet Union, Norwegians, Danes, Belgians, Citizens of the Netherlands, and of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, Turks, British, Czechs, Chinese, citizens of the United States of America, stateless persons and other non-German nationals and members of the armed forces of nations then at war with the then German Reich, the exact names and numbers of such persons being unknown but aggregating thousands.

Verdict: Guilty.

Sentence: Imprisonment for 30 years.
Approved.

653) Trial of Werner Hess and Hubert von Svoboda, German nationals.

Date & Place of Trial: 5th August 1947 at Dachau.

Charge: Committing assaults upon a member of the U.S. Army, an unarmed prisoner of war.

Verdict: von Svoboda was served but not tried.
Hess, guilty.

Sentence: Imprisonment for 6 months.
Confirmed.

654) Trial of Max Hermann and 6 others, German nationals.

Date & Place of Trial: 10th - 26th June 1946 at Dachau.

Charge: Being concerned in the killing of an unknown American POW.
(2 charges).

Verdict: Not guilty, 1,
Guilty, 6.

Sentences: Death by hanging, 2,
Imprisonment for life, 1,
" " 7 years, 2,
" " 2 " 1.

Both death sentences and sentence of imprisonment for life all reduced to imprisonment for 10 years; one sentence of seven years reduced to imprisonment for 4 years. The other two sentences were approved.

655) Trial of Paul Kahnert, a German national.

Date & Place of Trial: 3rd July 1947 at Dachau.

Charge: That he killed an unknown American POW.

Verdict: Guilty.

Sentence: Imprisonment for life.
Approved.

656) Trial of Franz Umstatter, a German national.

Date & Place of Trial: 26th - 27th August 1946 at Dachau.

Charge: Being concerned in the killing of 4 known and 2 unknown American prisoners of war.

Verdict: Guilty.

Sentence: Death by hanging.
Findings and sentence disapproved and the accused was released from confinement.

- 657) Trial of Peter Kohn and 2 others, German nationals.
 Date & Place of Trial: 1 - 2 June 1945 at Ahrweiler, Germany.
 Charge: That, not being lawful belligerents, but German civilians, they did feloniously assault, and with one Peter Back /see U.S. Case No. 9/ did wilfully kill an American airman when they had the means to capture and protect him.
 Verdict: All found guilty.
 Sentence: Death by hanging, 3.
- 658) Trial of Georg Walter Degner, a German national.
 Date & Place of Trial: 5th - 12th June 1947 at Dachau.
 Charge: Being concerned in the assault upon and the killing of non-German nationals at or near Mauthausen Concentration Camp. (2 charges).
 Verdict: Not guilty.
- 659) Trial of Nikolaus Fiedler and 4 others,
 Date & Place of Trial: 22nd - 23rd May 1947 at Dachau.
 Charge: Two charges similar to case No. 602.
 Verdict: All found guilty.
 Sentences: Imprisonment for 6 years, 1,

 Date & Place of Trial: 28th August - 3rd September 1946 at Dachau.

 Sentences: Death, 2,
 Imprisonment for 25 years, 1,

- 662) Trial of Nikolaus Hartmann, A German National.
 Date & Place of Trial: 20th March 1946 at Ludwigsburg.
 Charge: Committing an assault upon an unknown American POW.
 Verdict: Guilty.
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 25 years.
 Sentence reduced to imprisonment for 20 years.
- 663) Trial of Edith Kohler, Heinrich Reinhard and 4 others, German nationals.

Since the circulation of the first supplement (Doc. C.208) to the Synopsis of Trial Reports (Doc. C.204), the reports summarised in this paper have been received by the United Nations War Crimes Commission from the National Offices up to 17th August 1946.

Verdict: All three found guilty.
Sentences: Bascioni to imprisonment for 3 years.

Findings and sentences confirmed.

Charge: Committing a war crime in that they at the village of Oberweiler, Kreis Rastatt, Germany, on or about the 29th July 1944, in violation of the laws and usages of war, were concerned in the killing of a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force, a Prisoner of War.

Verdict: Both Guilty.

Sentences: Death by shooting, Confirmed on April 11th.

3) Trial of Johann Neitz.

Date & Place of Trial: 15-25 March 1946, at Aurich, Germany, before a Canadian Military Court.

Charge: (1) Committing a war crime in that he, in or near Wilhelmshaven, Germany, on or about the 16th day of October 1944, in violation of the laws and usages of war, did fire, with intent to kill, two shots from a firearm, into the body of a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force, a prisoner of war.

(2) (Alternative to the first charge).

Committing a war crime in that he, in or near Wilhelmshaven, Germany, on or about the 16th day of October 1944, in violation of the laws and usages of war, wounded the same member of the Royal Canadian Air Force, a prisoner of war, by firing two shots from a firearm into his person.

Verdict: Guilty.

Sentence: Imprisonment for life, confirmed on April 8th.

4) Trial of Robert Hölzer, Walter Weigel and Wilhelm Ossenbach.

Date & Place of Trial: 25th March - 6th April 1946 at Aurich, Germany, before a Canadian Military Court.
