The program projections on which these allotments are based cannot be definitely determined at this time, but since IRO has accepted both of these as a charge for later reimbursement, it is no longer necessary to keep these two allotments separately.

You are hereby authorized to cancel these two allotments and issue one new allotment in the amount of 3575,000 in free funds for the same purpose as the cancelled allotments.

Subject: Procurement of supplies for DP program in Italy

In order to insure a continuous supply line for DP operations in Italy, I am approving the request for supplies detailed in cable 3973 Rome to Washington, dated 22 May 1947.


The following will be considered in carrying out this program:

1. Procurement will be limited to \$450,000 and will be directly by UNRRA through the use of free funds.
2. The free funds will be charged against the R & R budget. The Controller's Office will prepare and process a request for an allotment of \$450,000 which will provide the authority that the Bureau of Supply needs to proceed with procurement.
3. Purchase orders and other documents will be so identified as to insure that the costs are charged against R & R on all records and not against the supply budget of Italian Government or the budgets of the Food Division or any other Division doing the procurement.
4. Transportation & Warehousing and Ocean Shipping costs will be charged against the Transportation & Warehousing budget.
5. This operation represents a potential charge against IRO, since the Executive Secretary of the Preparatory Commission has asked UNRRA to issue an adequate supply pipeline for this part of the DP operations. The extent of the charge will, of course, be determined by the status of UNRRA funds after the close of operations, as well as the amount of supplies at the time of transfer of operating responsibility to IRO.
