We refer to your letter AA/PAB of 25th September and note your ruling with regard to the Clothing Allowance.

It is suggested that your ruling is extremely harsh as Mr. Kent's application was in our hands on the 13th August and transmitted to you on the 22nd August. It may be relevant to refer you to your AA/PR. JJM/JJ of July 26th whereby it is clear that Mr. Kent has already suffered very considerable embarrassment in the handling of his account and it seems probable to infer that Mr. Kent's application for the Clothing Allowance was deferred until he received the statement of account referred to in the latter letter.

It would be appreciated if a ruling more favourable to Mr. Kent could be given in this case. Mr. Kent is at the moment on leave and cannot state his own claim personally.


