DAILY SITREP FOR 04 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS **65**. **64** WERE FROM ZAIRE AND **01** FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS **NIL**.

(2) TOTAL **INFLOW** FOR THE MONTH IS **454**. **OUTFLOW** IS **NIL**.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG AMBASSADOR KHAN, RETURNED BACK FROM LEAVE ON 04 DEC 95 AND TOOK OVER AS CHIEF OF THE MISSION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), MILOBS ON 04 DEC 95 CONFIRMED THAT THE MANAGER OF CIMERWA, A HUTU, WAS ARRESTED ON 18 NOV 95 BY RPA IN KIGALI. THE MOTIVE FOR THE ARREST IS HIS CLOSE TIES WITH HUMAN RIGHTS CYANGUGU.

(2) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), MILOBS TEAM REPORTED TWO INCIDENTS, ONE ROBBERY AND ONE KILLING BOTH ALLEGEDLY PERPETRATED BY THE RPA. ON 02 DEC 95, A WOMAN WAS REPORTEDLY ROBBED IN GISENYI OF SIX MILLION RWF BY SUSPECTED RPA SOLDIERS. TWO PERS WERE ALSO REPORTED KILLED THE SAME NIGHT. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), MILOBS PTL TO RUNYINYA COMMUNE GR 6012 REPORTED THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS WORSENING DUE TO THE INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE COMMUNE. THE LOCALS ARE REPORTED TO HAVE STARTED SLEEPING AT NIGHT IN THE BUSH OUT OF FOR FEAR OF BEING ATTACKED.

(2) ON 04 DEC 95, IN GIKONDO AREA OF SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), FOUR ROBBERS ENTERED THE HOUSE OF A UNAMIR CONTRACTOR, LOCKED UP THE MAID SERVANT AND STOLE HOUSEHOLD GOODS WORTH RWF 800,000. THE THEFT WAS REPORTED TO THE GENDARMERIE WHO HAVE ARRESTED TWO PERSONS. THE GENDARMERIE HAS ALSO PROVIDED A ARMED GUARD TO THE RESIDENCE OF THE CONTRACTOR AS THE ROBBERS HAVE

THREATENED TO RETURN.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 57 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP ON 04 DEC 95. 29 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO NGENDA AND KIBUYE. A TOTAL OF 133 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO PAM FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD STUFF FROM GIKONGORO TO VARIOUS COMMUNES.

C. NICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT FOOD FROM KIGALI TO RAMBURA BOYS COMMUNITY SCHOOL.

D. MILOBS OF SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) DONATED CARTONS OF REHYDRATION SALT TO BUYOGA AND NGARAMA COMMUNES RESPECTIVELY.

E. FORCE SIG COY AND FORCE ENGR COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE A VEHICLE EACH TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FIREWOOD.

E. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED A TOTAL OF 458 MEDICAL AND 23 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE CONFIDENCE BUILDING VISIT FOR REFUGEES FROM IJWI ISLAND, WHICH WAS ORGANISED BY UNHCR AND WAS SCHEDULED ON 05 DEC 95, WAS CANCELLED BY UNHCR DUE TO LACK OF PARTICIPATION ON PART OF THE REFUGEES.

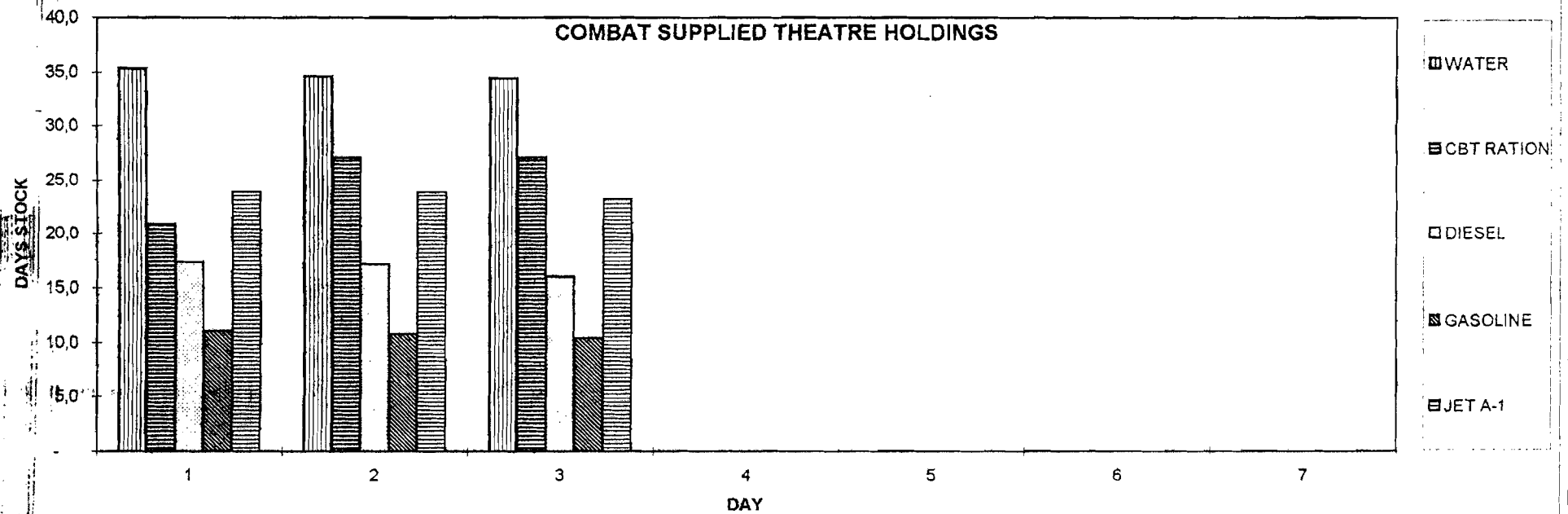

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), RPA CONDUCTED A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN RUNDA COMMUNE (9882) IN AN AREA WHERE A LOT OF NGOS, MOSTLY RELIGIOUS ONES, ARE OPERATING. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT ANOTHER CATHOLIC FATHER/ BROTHER IS ON THE WANTED LIST OF THE RPA.

(2) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), IN MUGANDA CELLULE, LOCALS COMPLAINED OVER THEIR INABILITY TO VISIT ARRESTED RELATIVES IN THE BIRAMBO (QT 4368) SOUS-PREFECTURE CACHOT AND THE KIBUYE PRISON. THE LOCALS CLAIMED MALES WHO WENT TO THOSE PLACES WERE ARRESTED. THESE DEVELOPMENTS HAVE PROMPTED INCREASED SUSPICION AMONG THE LOCALS THAT THEIR RELATIVES MIGHT HAVE BEEN KILLED.

(3) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 27 NOV 95, RPA FIRED AT SUSPECTED BANDITS MOVING IN A CANOE ON LAKE KIVU IN THE AREA OF MURWA PENINSULA GR 973415. NO CAS WERE REPORTED.

(4) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA WAS APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE SITTING OF A UN MARKED BEEHCRAFT WHICH CROSSED OVER THE BORDER INTO GOMA ON 28 NOV 95. THIS INCIDENT TOOK PLACE POSSIBLY BECAUSE OF A LACK OF COORDINATION BETWEEN THE AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL AT KIGALI AND THE RPA.

(5) IN SECTOR 1B SITUATION IN KAYENZI COMMUNE IS TENSE DUE TO ARBITRARY ARRESTS. THE NUMBER OF DETAINEES IN THE CACHOT HAVE INCREASED FROM 194 ON 23 NOV 95 TO 223 AS ON DATE. MOST OF THE ARRESTS TOOK PLACE LAST WEEKEND WHEN

THE IPJ WAS NOT AVAILABLE. THE IPJ REQUESTED A MEETING WITH SECTOR COMMANDER WHICH HAS BEEN SCHEDULED TO BE HELD IN THE PRESENCE OF HR REPS.

(6) MILOB SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT RPA HAS ARRESTED UNKNOWN NUMBER OF LOCALS FROM BAYI (GR 4694) AND SOVU (GR 5188) FOR ALLEGEDLY HAVING LINKS WITH THE FRGF. THE LOCALS REPORTED THAT A PRISONER MR. JOSEPH HABYARIMANA WHO WAS ARRESTED THREE MONTHS AGO, WAS BEING TORTURED DAILY.

(7) MILOBS SECTOR 5C REPORTED THE TRANSFER OF 21 PRISONERS FROM CYANYANZA (GR 5465) TO KIBUYE PRISON. THE SOUS- PREFECT WAS RELUCTANT TO CONFIRM WHETHER MALE VISITORS WERE ALLOWED INSIDE THE SOUS-PREFECTURE CACHOT OR NOT. ALSO IN MUHORORO (GR 5062), LOCALS REPORTED THE ARREST OF FIVE PERSONS ON 24 NOV 95 BY THE BWAKIRA COMMUNAL POLICE ON CHARGES OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE. ALL ARE BEING HELD IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE CACHOT.

(8) IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), SIX WOMEN WERE ARRESTED IN NGARAMA COMMUNE FOR HAVING KILLED AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF PEOPLE BY POISONING. ANOTHER WOMAN WAS ARRESTED FOR A MINOR OFFENCE.

(9) IN SECTOR 2A, BYUMBA, ON 30 NOV A TRUCK GOT STUCK IN THE MUD AT GAKUMA (GR 225539) WHILE DELIVERING SCHOOL MATERIAL TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE. THE MILOB TEAM LEADER OFF LOADED THE MATERIAL IN THE TRUCK INTO THEIR PICK-UPS AS THE RECOVERY COULD NOT BE ORGANIZED THE SAME DAY AND LEFT AN ARMED ESCORT TO GUARD THE TRUCK. WHEN THE TEAM ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE OFFICES AFTER 2100 HRS, THE ARMED ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE NAMED BOSCO MANZIA AND ANOTHER PERSON NAMED STANCLLAS MUBASHAKIWAYA BOTH DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORMS, IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED THE SCHOOL INSPECTOR AND ORDERED THE MILOBS TO LEAVE. WHEN THE TEAM LEADER EXPLAINED THAT THE INSPECTOR HAD THE KEYS TO THE STORE ROOM FROM WHERE THEY HAD TO TAKE THE ITEMS, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE FIRED TWO SHOTS INTO THE LEGS OF THE ARMED ESCORT FROM CHANCOY BUT FORTUNATELY MISSED. THE TEAM LEADER CONTACTED THE HQ AND WAS TOLD NOT TO FIRE BACK BUT TO WITHDRAW TO A NEARBY CLINIC AND PROCEED BACK TO BYUMBA WITH THE REST OF THE PARTY AND MATERIAL LEAVING ONLY THE ROOFING SHEETS AND THE INSPECTOR IN THE HANDS OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE. ON 01 DEC 95, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE AND HIS ACCOMPLICE WERE ARRESTED AND ARE BEING HELD AT BYUMBA GENDARMERIE. THE INSPECTOR WAS RELEASED AND THE SCHOOL ITEMS WERE DELIVERED TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE ON 02 DEC 95.

(10) RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN THE NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) ON 30 NOV FROM 0600 TO 1800

HRS. ONE WEAPON WAS FOUND IN THE HOUSE OF ONE OF THE TWO COUNCILLORS WHO WERE ARRESTED FOR NOT MAINTAINING SECURITY IN THEIR AREAS. TWO CIVILIANS WERE ALSO ARRESTED DURING THE OPERATION FOR ALLEGEDLY HARBOURING FRGF SOLDIERS IN THEIR HOUSES.

(11) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), MILOB TEAM TO RUKINA SECTOR WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT RPA SOLDIERS OF A REGULAR PATROL, ROBBED AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF SEWING MACHINES AND RADIOS.

(12) IN SECTOR 3A, MILOBS RECEIVED REPORTS THAT PEOPLE HAVE BEEN KILLED IN THE FOREST NEAR SHABA SECTOR (GR 397155) OF KIVU COMMUNE. PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT ON 17 AUG 95, CONSEQUENT TO THE ARREST OF THE LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN RWAMIKO COMMUNE (4914), LOCALS HAD FLED TO THE FOREST AND ESTABLISHED A CAMP WEST OF SHABA OF WHICH PEOPLE ON THE COMMUNE WERE NOT AWARE. LOCALS REPORTED HAVING HEARD FIRING ON 25 NOV 95 BETWEEN 0900 - 1600 FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE CAMP. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT THEY HAD SEEN ABOUT 08 PEOPLE IN UNIFORM IN SHABA AREA AND THESE HAD LEFT ON 26 NOV 95. ON RECEIPT OF ABOVE INFO A TEAM OF MILOBS, HR AND ABOUT 40 TO 50 LOCALS WENT TO THE CAMP SITE WHICH HAD BEEN DESTROYED AND COUNTED UP TO 20 DEAD BODIES. ONE OF THE SURVIVORS SAID THAT PRIOR TO THE INCIDENT, ABOUT 135 PEOPLE WERE LIVING IN THE CAMP AND DURING THE SHOOTING, THE PEOPLE HAD FLED INTO THE FOREST. THE EXACT NUMBER OF CASUALTIES COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED AS A NUMBER OF BODIES ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN DISPOSED OFF BY THE ATTACKERS. THE RPA SECOND IN COMMAND WHEN CONTACTED, DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF THE INCIDENT. ON 02 DEC 95, A MILOB TEAM ACCOMPANIED BY AN RPA REP AND 05 LOCALS VISITED THE SITE BUT COULD FIND ONLY THREE BODIES AND SOME UNIFORMS. THERE WERE 20 HUTS IN THE CAMP. FURTHER INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(13) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE COUNCILLOR OF MUSUMBA SECTOR (GR 7869) WAS ARRESTED ALONG WITH 15 PERSONS FOR THEIR ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE. THE RPA HAD AN ARREST WARRANT FROM THE IPJ. IN THE SAME SECTOR, THREE PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED FROM KIRWA (GR 6388) ON 01 DEC 95 AND ANOTHER 05 FROM KAGOGWE (GR 6490) ON 30 NOV 95 ON SIMILAR CHARGES.

(14) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), THAT 11 PERSONS ALLEGED TO BE BANDITS, WERE ARRESTED BY RPA DURING A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN MUJUGA SECTOR (GR 3920) ON 01 DEC 95.

(15) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), MILOBS ON 04 DEC 95 CONFIRMED THAT THE MANAGER OF CIMERWA, A HUTU, WAS ARRESTED ON 18 NOV 95 BY RPA IN KIGALI. THE MOTIVE FOR THE ARREST IS HIS CLOSE TIES WITH HR CYANGUGU.

(16) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), MILOBS TEAM REPORTED TWO INCIDENTS, ONE ROBBERY AND ONE KILLING BOTH ALLEGEDLY PERPETRATED BY THE RPA. ON 02 DEC 95, A WOMAN WAS REPORTEDLY ROBBED IN GISENYI OF SIX MILLION RWF BY SUSPECTED RPA SOLDIERS. TWO PERS WERE ALSO REPORTED KILLED THE SAME NIGHT.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 1B, ON NIGHT 05/06 NOV 95, IN MPANGA SECTOR, A MAN WAS ROBBED OF 164,000 RWF BY A GROUP OF NINE MEN, TWO OF WHOM WERE ARMED AND IN UNIFORM. THE SAME GANG ROBBED ANOTHER BUSINESSMAN OF 75,000 RWF ON THE SAME NIGHT.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5C WERE INFORMED BY AN RPA SOLDIER OF ARMED ROBBERIES AND BREAK-IN BY FOUR UNIFORMED ARMED MEN IN MUGUBA ( GR 2463) ON THE NIGHT OF 27 NOV 95. A TOTAL OF 150,000 RWF WAS STOLEN IN THE THEFTS. INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

(3) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT AT APPROX 1300 HRS ON 29 NOV 95, A UNHCR WATER TRUCK HIT A MINE NEAR KIBUMBA CAMP IN GOMA. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGIERI) WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT THREE FRGF MEMBERS WERE ARRESTED IN KAREBA SECTOR AND FOUR WEAPONS AND AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF MINES WERE RECOVERED FROM THEM. TWO FRGF MEMBERS WERE ALSO REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN KARAGO COMMUNE OF NANGA SECTOR ON 28 NOV 95.

(5) IN SECTOR 5B, MILOB PATROL TO KIVUMU SECTOR (2303) REPORTED THAT SEVEN INDIVIDUALS HAD COME TO RWANDA FROM MUGUNGO CAMP IN ZAIRE CARRYING THREE ATK MINES, SIX HAND GRENADES AND TWO AK 47 RIFLES AND ASSORTED UNIFORMS. THE INFILTRATORS WERE SUSPECTED TO BE HIDING IN THE FOREST. ALSO IN THE SAME SECTOR ON THE NIGHT 29/30 NOV 95, SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE SURROUNDED THE HOUSE OF THE COUNCILLOR AND DEMANDED ENTRY. THE LOCALS RESPONDED TO THE SITUATION AND CHASED THE INSURGENTS AWAY.

(6) MILOBS PATROL TO KANZENZE SECTOR GR 3019 WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT 50 INTERHAMWE HAD INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE CLOSELY FOLLOWED BY THE RPA. THE INSURGENTS HOWEVER ESCAPED INTO THE NEARBY FOREST.

(7) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), LOCALS INFORMED MILOB PATROL THAT INTERHAMWE ARMED WITH SPEARS AND MACHETES, WERE HIDING IN THE FOREST AND CARRYING OUT RAIDS IN HUYE, MBAZI AND MARAMBA COMMUNES WITH THE AIM OF STEALING FOOD AND OTHER HOUSEHOLD ITEMS.

(8) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), MILOBS REPORTED THE MURDER OF THE COUNCILLOR OF NUYAMUEGO SECTOR GR 4703 ON NIGHT 30 NOV 95 BY UNKNOWN ASSAILANTS. LOCALS ALSO INFORMED THE TEAM OF THE MURDER OF A COUPLE ON NIGHT 28 NOV 95 IN MUHUNGWE COMMUNE. THE KILLERS ALSO THREW A GRENADE INTO THE HOUSE OF THE ASSASSINATED COUPLE, INJURING ONE OF THEIR THREE CHILDREN.

(9) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), A GROUP OF 15 BANDITS ARMED WITH FAKE RIFLES, ROBBED THE LOCALS OF THREE BICYCLES, TWO RADIOS AND TWO TYPING MACHINES IN MUSUMBA SECTOR (GR 7896) ON NIGHT 29 NOV 95.

(10) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), MILOBS PTL TO RUNYINYA COMMUNE GR 6012 REPORTED THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS WORSENING DUE TO THE INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE COMMUNE. THE LOCALS ARE REPORTED TO HAVE STARTED SLEEPING AT NIGHT IN THE BUSH OUT OF FOR FEAR OF BEING ATTACKED.

(11) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) REPORTED THE UNUSUAL SIGHTING OF A HELI/SMALL FIXED WING AIRCRAFT FLYING AT AN ALTITUDE OF APPROX 1500 FEET FROM SOUTH TO NORTH, PARALLEL TO THE ZAIRIAN COAST AND ON THE WESTERN COAST OF IJWI ISLAND. THIS SIGHTING WAS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND AND IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT THE DESTINATION OF THE AIRCRAFT WAS POSSIBLY GOMA.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ON 29 NOV 95, THE FC VISITED SECTOR 4 WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE EXISTING SECURITY SITUATION BY THE SECTOR COMDR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 84 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR TRANSPORTING VARIOUS ITEMS AS PART OF HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 133 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 1373 MEDICAL AND 141 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY MED CENTRES IN VARIOUS SECTORS.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A DOZER AND THREE DUMPERS FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF EXPIRED RATION AND ALSO CARRIED OUT A RECCE FOR THE RECOVERY OF A VEHICLE HIT BY A MINE NEAR KIBUYE.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS



A. ABOUT 500 EMPLOYEES OF BROWN & ROOTS COMPANY DEMONSTRATED AGAINST THE MANAGEMENT FOR NON-PAYMENT OF THEIR WAGES AT IVECO IN KIGALI. THE STRIKE WHICH STARTED AT 0800 HRS ON 28 NOV 95 AND ON 30 NOV 95, CONTINUED TILL LATE IN THE AFTERNOON ON BOTH THE DAYS. THE CHAIRMAN OF BROWN & ROOTS AND THE PREFECT OF KIGALI MET AT 1400 HRS AND PROMISED TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE. THE DEMONSTRATORS WENT TO THE POINT OF THROWING STONES BUT THE SITUATION WAS CONTROLLED BY UNAMIR GUARDS, GENDARMERIE AND THE RPA AT THE SITE.

B. IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) STUDENTS OF ECOLE SOCIALE DE BYUMBA DEMONSTRATED VIOLENTLY AGAINST THEIR HEADMISTRESS ON 29 NOV 95, ACCUSING HER OF NOT ATTENDING TO THEIR PROBLEMS. THE SCHOOL HAS BEEN CORDONED OFF BY RPA AND UNCONFIRMED SOURCES SAID THE HEADMISTRESS HAS BEEN ARRESTED BY GENDARMERIE. MILOBS MONITORING SITUATION.

C. UNHCR REPORTED THAT ABOUT 40 REFUGEES WERE EXPELLED FROM TANZANIA LATE IN THE AFTERNOON ON 01 DEC 95 BY TANZANIAN FORCES. THE REFUGEES STAYED AT THE BORDER UNDER RPA GUARD AND WERE TRANSPORTED TO NYAKARAMBI ON 02 DEC 95 IN GHANBATT VEHs.

D. TOP GOVT OFFICIALS AND HUNDREDS OF LOCALS MARCHED FROM KIGALI CITY TO NYAMIRAMBO STADIUM ON 01 DEC 95 WHERE SPORTS ACTIVITIES AND TRADITIONAL DANCES TOOK PLACE TO COMMEMORATE THE WORLD AIDS DAY.

E. IN SECTOR 5A (RUHengeri), CIVPOL REPORTED THAT THE FINAL EXAMINATIONS OF THE 519 TRAINEES AT THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL, CONCLUDED ON 02 DEC 95. RESULTS OF THE EXAMS ARE STILL AWAITED.

F. MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE CONFIDENCE BUILDING VISIT FOR REFUGEES FROM IJWI ISLAND, WHICH WAS ORGANIZED BY UNHCR AND WAS SCHEDULED ON 05 DEC 95, WAS CANCELLED BY UNHCR DUE TO LACK OF PARTICIPATION ON PART OF THE REFUGEES.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL. ON 04 DEC 95, IN GIKONDO AREA OF SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), FOUR ROBBERS ENTERED THE HOUSE OF A UNAMIR CONTRACTOR, LOCKED UP THE MAID SERVANT AND STOLE HOUSEHOLD GOODS WORTH RWF 800,000. THE THEFT WAS REPORTED TO THE GENDARMERIE WHO HAVE ARRESTED TWO PERSONS. THE GENDARMERIE HAS ALSO PROVIDED A ARMED GUARD TO THE RESIDENCE OF THE CONTRACTOR AS THE ROBBERS HAVE THREATENED TO RETURN.

9. COMMENTS

A. HARASSMENT OF POPULACE AND CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS CONTINUE IN MOST PREFECTURES IN RWANDA. THIS IS PROBABLY SO BECAUSE THE RPA'S APPREHENSION OF INCREASED ACTIVITIES BY FRGF/INTERHAMWE INSIDE RWANDA.

B. THE SECURITY SITUATION EVEN THOUGH APPEARS SUPERFICIALLY CALM, HAS GOT SOME UNDERCURRENTS ESPECIALLY NOW THAT THE PRESENT UNAMIR MANDATE IS COMING TO AN END ON 08 DEC 95. THERE IS A GENERAL APPREHENSION IN THE POPULUS REGARDING THE SITUATION THAT WOULD PREVAIL AFTER UNAMIR PULL OUT.

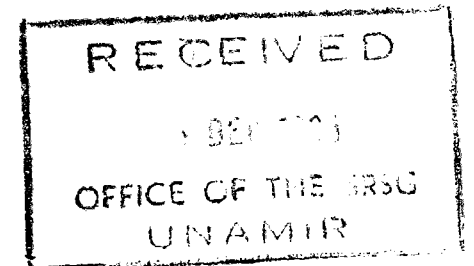

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 65. 64 WERE FROM ZAIRE AND 01 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 454. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG AMBASSADOR KHAN, RETURNED BACK FROM LEAVE ON 04 DEC 95 AND TOOK OVER AS CHIEF OF THE MISSION.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), MILOBS ON 04 DEC 95 CONFIRMED THAT THE MANAGER OF CIMERWA, A HUTU, WAS ARRESTED ON 18 NOV 95 BY RPA IN KIGALI. THE MOTIVE FOR THE ARREST IS HIS CLOSE TIES WITH HUMAN RIGHTS CYANGUGU.

(2) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), MILOBS TEAM REPORTED TWO INCIDENTS, ONE ROBBERY AND ONE KILLING BOTH ALLEGEDLY PERPETRATED BY THE RPA. ON 02 DEC 95, A WOMAN WAS REPORTEDLY ROBBED IN GISENYI OF SIX MILLION RWF BY SUSPECTED RPA SOLDIERS. TWO PERS WERE ALSO REPORTED KILLED THE SAME NIGHT. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), MILOBS PTL TO RUNYINYA COMMUNE GR 6012 REPORTED THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS WORSENING DUE TO THE INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE COMMUNE. THE LOCALS ARE REPORTED TO HAVE STARTED SLEEPING AT NIGHT IN THE BUSH OUT OF FOR FEAR OF BEING ATTACKED.

(2) ON 04 DEC 95, IN GIKONDO AREA OF SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), FOUR ROBBERS ENTERED THE HOUSE OF A UNAMIR CONTRACTOR, LOCKED UP THE MAID SERVANT AND STOLE HOUSEHOLD GOODS WORTH RWF 800,000. THE THEFT WAS REPORTED TO THE GENDARMERIE WHO HAVE ARRESTED TWO PERSONS. THE GENDARMERIE HAS ALSO PROVIDED A ARMED GUARD TO THE RESIDENCE OF THE CONTRACTOR AS THE ROBBERS HAVE

## COMBAT SUPPLIES USAGE AND STOCK CHARTS

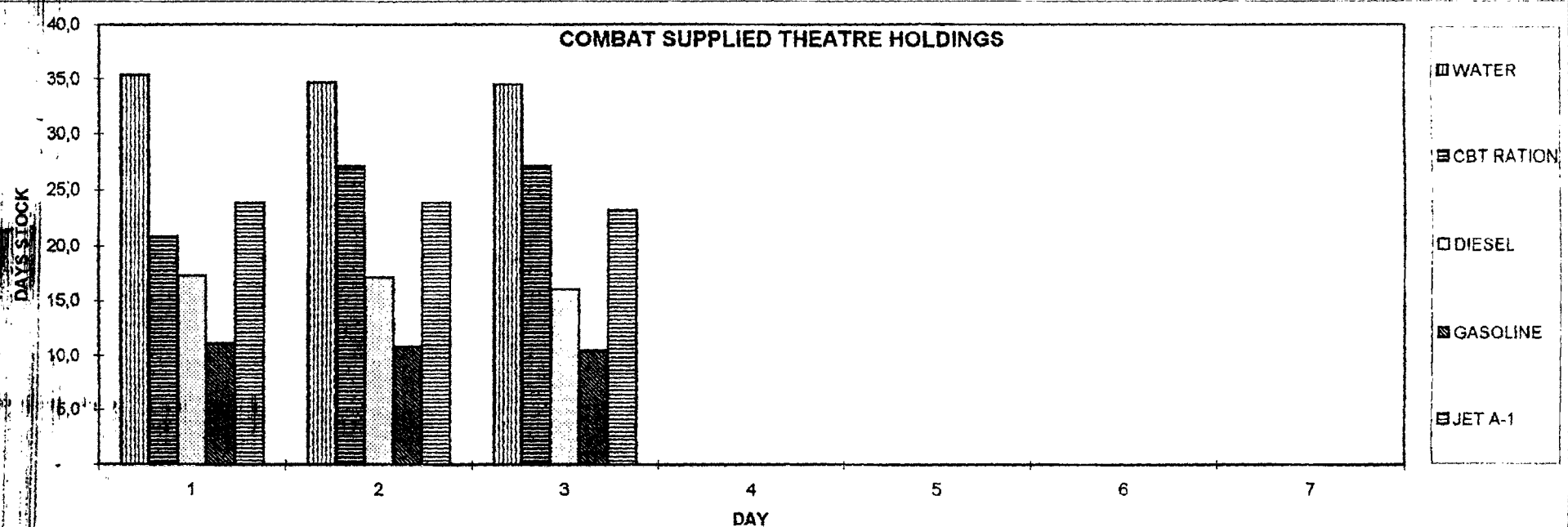

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 591. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), RPA CONDUCTED A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN RUNDA COMMUNE (9882) IN AN AREA WHERE A LOT OF NGOS, MOSTLY RELIGIOUS ONES, ARE OPERATING. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT ANOTHER CATHOLIC FATHER/ BROTHER IS ON THE WANTED LIST OF THE RPA.

(2) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), IN MUGANDA CELLULE, LOCALS COMPLAINED OVER THEIR INABILITY TO VISIT ARRESTED RELATIVES IN THE BIRAMBO (QT 4368) SOUS-PREFECTURE CACHOT AND THE KIBUYE PRISON. THE LOCALS CLAIMED MALES WHO WENT TO THOSE PLACES WERE ARRESTED. THESE DEVELOPMENTS HAVE PROMPTED INCREASED SUSPICION AMONG THE LOCALS THAT THEIR RELATIVES MIGHT HAVE BEEN KILLED.

(3) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 27 NOV 95, RPA FIRED AT SUSPECTED BANDITS MOVING IN A CANOE ON LAKE KIVU IN THE AREA OF MURWA PENINSULA GR 973415. NO CAS WERE REPORTED.

(4) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA WAS APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE SITTING OF A UN MARKED BEECHCRAFT WHICH CROSSED OVER THE BORDER INTO GOMA ON 28 NOV 95. THIS INCIDENT TOOK PLACE POSSIBLY BECAUSE OF A LACK OF COORDINATION BETWEEN THE AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL AT KIGALI AND THE RPA.

(5) IN SECTOR 1B SITUATION IN KAYENZI COMMUNE IS TENSE DUE TO ARBITRARY ARRESTS. THE NUMBER OF DETAINEES IN THE CACHOT HAVE INCREASED FROM 194 ON 23 NOV 95 TO 223 AS ON DATE. MOST OF THE ARRESTS TOOK PLACE LAST WEEKEND WHEN

THE IPJ WAS NOT AVAILABLE. THE IPJ REQUESTED A MEETING WITH SECTOR COMMANDER WHICH HAS BEEN SCHEDULED TO BE HELD IN THE PRESENCE OF HR REPS.

(6) MILOB SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT RPA HAS ARRESTED UNKNOWN NUMBER OF LOCALS FROM BAYI (GR 4694) AND SOVU (GR 5188) FOR ALLEGEDLY HAVING LINKS WITH THE FRGF. THE LOCALS REPORTED THAT A PRISONER MR. JOSEPH HABYARIMANA WHO WAS ARRESTED THREE MONTHS AGO, WAS BEING TORTURED DAILY.

(7) MILOBS SECTOR 5C REPORTED THE TRANSFER OF 21 PRISONERS FROM CYANYANZA (GR 5465) TO KIBUYE PRISON. THE SOUS- PREFECT WAS RELUCTANT TO CONFIRM WHETHER MALE VISITORS WERE ALLOWED INSIDE THE SOUS-PREFECTURE CACHOT OR NOT. ALSO IN MUHORORO (GR 5062), LOCALS REPORTED THE ARREST OF FIVE PERSONS ON 24 NOV 95 BY THE BWAKIRA COMMUNAL POLICE ON CHARGES OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE. ALL ARE BEING HELD IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE CACHOT.

(8) IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), SIX WOMEN WERE ARRESTED IN NGARAMA COMMUNE FOR HAVING KILLED AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF PEOPLE BY POISONING. ANOTHER WOMAN WAS ARRESTED FOR A MINOR OFFENCE.

(9) IN SECTOR 2A, BYUMBA, ON 30 NOV A TRUCK GOT STUCK IN THE MUD AT GAKUMA (GR 225539) WHILE DELIVERING SCHOOL MATERIAL TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE. THE MILOB TEAM LEADER OFF LOADED THE MATERIAL IN THE TRUCK INTO THEIR PICK-UPS AS THE RECOVERY COULD NOT BE ORGANIZED THE SAME DAY AND LEFT AN ARMED ESCORT TO GUARD THE TRUCK. WHEN THE TEAM ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE OFFICES AFTER 2100 HRS, THE ARMED ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE NAMED BOSCO MANZIA AND ANOTHER PERSON NAMED STANCLLAS MUBASHAKIWAYA BOTH DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORMS, IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED THE SCHOOL INSPECTOR AND ORDERED THE MILOBS TO LEAVE. WHEN THE TEAM LEADER EXPLAINED THAT THE INSPECTOR HAD THE KEYS TO THE STORE ROOM FROM WHERE THEY HAD TO TAKE THE ITEMS, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE FIRED TWO SHOTS INTO THE LEGS OF THE ARMED ESCORT FROM GHANCOY BUT FORTUNATELY MISSED. THE TEAM LEADER CONTACTED THE HQ AND WAS TOLD NOT TO FIRE BACK BUT TO WITHDRAW TO A NEARBY CLINIC AND PROCEED BACK TO BYUMBA WITH THE REST OF THE PARTY AND MATERIAL LEAVING ONLY THE ROOFING SHEETS AND THE INSPECTOR IN THE HANDS OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE. ON 01 DEC 95, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE AND HIS ACCOMPLICE WERE ARRESTED AND ARE BEING HELD AT BYUMBA GENDARMERIE. THE INSPECTOR WAS RELEASED AND THE SCHOOL ITEMS WERE DELIVERED TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE ON 02 DEC 95.

(10) RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN THE NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) ON 30 NOV FROM 0600 TO 1800

HRS. ONE WEAPON WAS FOUND IN THE HOUSE OF ONE OF THE TWO COUNCILLORS WHO WERE ARRESTED FOR NOT MAINTAINING SECURITY IN THEIR AREAS. TWO CIVILIANS WERE ALSO ARRESTED DURING THE OPERATION FOR ALLEGEDLY HARBOURING FRGF SOLDIERS IN THEIR HOUSES.

(11) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), MILOB TEAM TO RUKINA SECTOR WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT RPA SOLDIERS OF A REGULAR PATROL, ROBBED AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF SEWING MACHINES AND RADIOS.

(12) IN SECTOR 3A, MILOBS RECEIVED REPORTS THAT PEOPLE HAVE BEEN KILLED IN THE FOREST NEAR SHABA SECTOR (GR 397155) OF KIVU COMMUNE. PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT ON 17 AUG 95, CONSEQUENT TO THE ARREST OF THE LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN RWAMIKO COMMUNE (4914), LOCALS HAD FLED TO THE FOREST AND ESTABLISHED A CAMP WEST OF SHABA OF WHICH PEOPLE ON THE COMMUNE WERE NOT AWARE. LOCALS REPORTED HAVING HEARD FIRING ON 25 NOV 95 BETWEEN 0900 - 1600 FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE CAMP. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT THEY HAD SEEN ABOUT 08 PEOPLE IN UNIFORM IN SHABA AREA AND THESE HAD LEFT ON 26 NOV 95. ON RECEIPT OF ABOVE INFO A TEAM OF MILOBS, HR AND ABOUT 40 TO 50 LOCALS WENT TO THE CAMP SITE WHICH HAD BEEN DESTROYED AND COUNTED UP TO 20 DEAD BODIES. ONE OF THE SURVIVORS SAID THAT PRIOR TO THE INCIDENT, ABOUT 135 PEOPLE WERE LIVING IN THE CAMP AND DURING THE SHOOTING, THE PEOPLE HAD FLED INTO THE FOREST. THE EXACT NUMBER OF CASUALTIES COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED AS A NUMBER OF BODIES ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN DISPOSED OFF BY THE ATTACKERS. THE RPA SECOND IN COMMAND WHEN CONTACTED, DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF THE INCIDENT. ON 02 DEC 95, A MILOB TEAM ACCOMPANIED BY AN RPA REP AND 05 LOCALS VISITED THE SITE BUT COULD FIND ONLY THREE BODIES AND SOME UNIFORMS. THERE WERE 20 HUTS IN THE CAMP. FURTHER INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(13) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE COUNCILLOR OF MUSUMBA SECTOR (GR 7869) WAS ARRESTED ALONG WITH 15 PERSONS FOR THEIR ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE. THE RPA HAD AN ARREST WARRANT FROM THE IPJ. IN THE SAME SECTOR, THREE PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED FROM KIRWA (GR 6388) ON 01 DEC 95 AND ANOTHER 05 FROM KAGOGWE (GR 6490) ON 30 NOV 95 ON SIMILAR CHARGES.

(14) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), THAT 11 PERSONS ALLEGED TO BE BANDITS, WERE ARRESTED BY RPA DURING A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN MUJUGA SECTOR (GR 3920) ON 01 DEC 95.

(15) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), MILOBS ON 04 DEC 95 CONFIRMED THAT THE MANAGER OF CIMERWA, A HUTU, WAS ARRESTED ON 18 NOV 95 BY RPA IN KIGALI. THE MOTIVE FOR THE ARREST IS HIS CLOSE TIES WITH HR CYANGUGU.



(16) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), MILOBS TEAM REPORTED TWO INCIDENTS, ONE ROBBERY AND ONE KILLING BOTH ALLEGEDLY PERPETRATED BY THE RPA. ON 02 DEC 95, A WOMAN WAS REPORTEDLY ROBBED IN GISENYI OF SIX MILLION RWF BY SUSPECTED RPA SOLDIERS. TWO PERS WERE ALSO REPORTED KILLED THE SAME NIGHT.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 1B, ON NIGHT 05/06 NOV 95, IN MPANGA SECTOR, A MAN WAS ROBBED OF 164,000 RWF BY A GROUP OF NINE MEN, TWO OF WHOM WERE ARMED AND IN UNIFORM. THE SAME GANG ROBBED ANOTHER BUSINESSMAN OF 75,000 RWF ON THE SAME NIGHT.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5C WERE INFORMED BY AN RPA SOLDIER OF ARMED ROBBERIES AND BREAK-IN BY FOUR UNIFORMED ARMED MEN IN MUGUBA ( GR 2463) ON THE NIGHT OF 27 NOV 95. A TOTAL OF 150,000 RWF WAS STOLEN IN THE THEFTS. INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

(3) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT AT APPROX 1300 HRS ON 29 NOV 95, A UNHCR WATER TRUCK HIT A MINE NEAR KIBUMBA CAMP IN GOMA. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT THREE FRGF MEMBERS WERE ARRESTED IN KAREBA SECTOR AND FOUR WEAPONS AND AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF MINES WERE RECOVERED FROM THEM. TWO FRGF MEMBERS WERE ALSO REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN KARAGO COMMUNE OF NANGA SECTOR ON 28 NOV 95.

(5) IN SECTOR 5B, MILOB PATROL TO KIVUMU SECTOR (2303) REPORTED THAT SEVEN INDIVIDUALS HAD COME TO RWANDA FROM MUGUNGO CAMP IN ZAIRE CARRYING THREE ATK MINES, SIX HAND GRENADES AND TWO AK 47 RIFLES AND ASSORTED UNIFORMS. THE INFILTRATORS WERE SUSPECTED TO BE HIDING IN THE FOREST. ALSO IN THE SAME SECTOR ON THE NIGHT 29/30 NOV 95, SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE SURROUNDED THE HOUSE OF THE COUNCILLOR AND DEMANDED ENTRY. THE LOCALS RESPONDED TO THE SITUATION AND CHASED THE INSURGENTS AWAY.

(6) MILOBS PATROL TO KANZENZE SECTOR GR 3019 WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT 50 INTERHAMWE HAD INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE CLOSELY FOLLOWED BY THE RPA. THE INSURGENTS HOWEVER ESCAPED INTO THE NEARBY FOREST.

(7) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), LOCALS INFORMED MILOB PATROL THAT INTERHAMWE ARMED WITH SPEARS AND MACHETES, WERE HIDING IN THE FOREST AND CARRYING OUT RAIDS IN HUYE, MBAZI AND MARAMBA COMMUNES WITH THE AIM OF STEALING FOOD AND OTHER HOUSEHOLD ITEMS.

(8) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), MILOBS REPORTED THE MURDER OF THE COUNCILLOR OF NUYAMUEGO SECTOR GR 4703 ON NIGHT 30 NOV 95 BY UNKNOWN ASSAILANTS. LOCALS ALSO INFORMED THE TEAM OF THE MURDER OF A COUPLE ON NIGHT 28 NOV 95 IN MUHUNGWE COMMUNE. THE KILLERS ALSO THREW A GRENADE INTO THE HOUSE OF THE ASSASSINATED COUPLE, INJURING ONE OF THEIR THREE CHILDREN.

(9) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), A GROUP OF 15 BANDITS ARMED WITH FAKE RIFLES, ROBBED THE LOCALS OF THREE BICYCLES, TWO RADIOS AND TWO TYPING MACHINES IN MUSUMBA SECTOR (GR 7896) ON NIGHT 29 NOV 95.

(10) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), MILOBS PTL TO RUNYINYA COMMUNE GR 6012 REPORTED THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS WORSENING DUE TO THE INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE COMMUNE. THE LOCALS ARE REPORTED TO HAVE STARTED SLEEPING AT NIGHT IN THE BUSH OUT OF FEAR OF BEING ATTACKED.

(11) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) REPORTED THE UNUSUAL SIGHTING OF A HELI/SMALL FIXED WING AIRCRAFT FLYING AT AN ALTITUDE OF APPROX 1500 FEET FROM SOUTH TO NORTH, PARALLEL TO THE ZAIRIAN COAST AND ON THE WESTERN COAST OF IJWI ISLAND. THIS SIGHTING WAS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND AND IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT THE DESTINATION OF THE AIRCRAFT WAS POSSIBLY GOMA.

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ON 29 NOV 95, THE FC VISITED SECTOR 4 WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE EXISTING SECURITY SITUATION BY THE SECTOR COMDR.

#### 4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 84 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR TRANSPORTING VARIOUS ITEMS AS PART OF HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 133 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 1373 MEDICAL AND 141 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY MED CENTRES IN VARIOUS SECTORS.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A DOZER AND THREE DUMPERS FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF EXPIRED RATION AND ALSO CARRIED OUT A RECCE FOR THE RECOVERY OF A VEHICLE HIT BY A MINE NEAR KIBUYE.

#### 5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. ABOUT 500 EMPLOYEES OF BROWN & ROOTS COMPANY DEMONSTRATED AGAINST THE MANAGEMENT FOR NON-PAYMENT OF THEIR WAGES AT IVECO IN KIGALI. THE STRIKE WHICH STARTED AT 0800 HRS ON 28 NOV 95 AND ON 30 NOV 95, CONTINUED TILL LATE IN THE AFTERNOON ON BOTH THE DAYS. THE CHAIRMAN OF BROWN & ROOTS AND THE PREFECT OF KIGALI MET AT 1400 HRS AND PROMISED TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE. THE DEMONSTRATORS WENT TO THE POINT OF THROWING STONES BUT THE SITUATION WAS CONTROLLED BY UNAMIR GUARDS, GENDARMERIE AND THE RPA AT THE SITE.

B. IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) STUDENTS OF ECOLE SOCIALE DE BYUMBA DEMONSTRATED VIOLENTLY AGAINST THEIR HEADMISTRESS ON 29 NOV 95, ACCUSING HER OF NOT ATTENDING TO THEIR PROBLEMS. THE SCHOOL HAS BEEN CORDONED OFF BY RPA AND UNCONFIRMED SOURCES SAID THE HEADMISTRESS HAS BEEN ARRESTED BY GENDARMERIE. MILOBS MONITORING SITUATION.

C. UNHCR REPORTED THAT ABOUT 40 REFUGEES WERE EXPELLED FROM TANZANIA LATE IN THE AFTERNOON ON 01 DEC 95 BY TANZANIAN FORCES. THE REFUGEES STAYED AT THE BORDER UNDER RPA GUARD AND WERE TRANSPORTED TO NYAKARAMBI ON 02 DEC 95 IN GHANBATT VEHs.

D. TOP GOVT OFFICIALS AND HUNDREDS OF LOCALS MARCHED FROM KIGALI CITY TO NYAMIRAMBO STADIUM ON 01 DEC 95 WHERE SPORTS ACTIVITIES AND TRADITIONAL DANCES TOOK PLACE TO COMMEMORATE THE WORLD AIDS DAY.

E. IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI), CIVPOL REPORTED THAT THE FINAL EXAMINATIONS OF THE 519 TRAINEES AT THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL, CONCLUDED ON 02 DEC 95. RESULTS OF THE EXAMS ARE STILL AWAITED.

F. MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE CONFIDENCE BUILDING VISIT FOR REFUGEES FROM IJWI ISLAND, WHICH WAS ORGANIZED BY UNHCR AND WAS SCHEDULED ON 05 DEC 95, WAS CANCELLED BY UNHCR DUE TO LACK OF PARTICIPATION ON PART OF THE REFUGEES.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL. ON 04 DEC 95, IN GIKONDO AREA OF SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), FOUR ROBBERS ENTERED THE HOUSE OF A UNAMIR CONTRACTOR, LOCKED UP THE MAID SERVANT AND STOLE HOUSEHOLD GOODS WORTH RWF 800,000. THE THEFT WAS REPORTED TO THE GENDARMERIE WHO HAVE ARRESTED TWO PERSONS. THE GENDARMERIE HAS ALSO PROVIDED A ARMED GUARD TO THE RESIDENCE OF THE CONTRACTOR AS THE ROBBERS HAVE THREATENED TO RETURN.

A. HARASSMENT OF POPULACE AND CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS CONTINUE IN MOST PREFECTURES IN RWANDA. THIS IS PROBABLY SO BECAUSE THE RPA'S APPREHENSION OF INCREASED ACTIVITIES BY FRGF/INTERHAMWE INSIDE RWANDA.

B. THE SECURITY SITUATION EVEN THOUGH APPEARS SUPERFICIALLY CALM, HAS GOT SOME UNDERCURRENTS ESPECIALLY NOW THAT THE PRESENT UNAMIR MANDATE IS COMING TO AN END ON 08 DEC 95. THERE IS A GENERAL APPREHENSION IN THE POPULUS REGARDING THE SITUATION THAT WOULD PREVAIL AFTER UNAMIR PULL OUT.

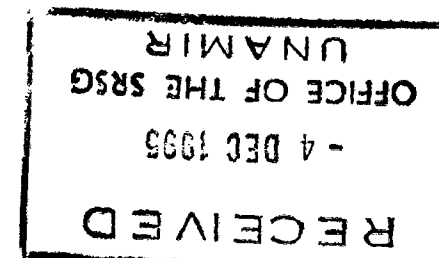

DAILY SITREP FOR 02 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 18 ALL FROM ZAIRE, OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 299 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE MILOB TEM PATROLLING THE RUKINA SECTOR WAS INFORMED BY THE LOCALS THAT RPA SOLDIERS OF A REGULAR PATROL, ROBBED AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF SEWING MACHINES AND RADIOS FROM LOCALS IN THE AREA.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), MILOB PATROL FOLLOWED UP THE REPORTS OF SHOOTING INCIDENT REPORTED IN YESTERDAYS SITREP. THE TEAM ACCOMPANIED BY RPA REPRESENTATIVES AND 05 LOCALS WENT TO THE SITE BUT COULD LOCATE ONLY THREE DEAD BODIES AND SOME CLOTHING ITEMS OF MILITARY ORIGIN. FURTHER INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), LOCALS INFORMED THE MILOB PATROL THAT INTERHAMWE ARMED WITH SPEARS AND MACHETES WERE HIDING IN THE FOREST AND WERE CARRYING OUT RAIDS IN HUYE, MBAZI AND MARAMBA COMMUNES WITH THE AIM OF STEALING FOOD ITEMS AND OTHER HOUSEHOLD GOODS.

(3) IN SECTOR 5B (GISYENI), MILOB TEAM REPORTED THE MURDER OF COUNCILLOR OF NUYAMUEGO SECTOR (4703) ON THE NIGHT OF 30 NOV 95 BY UNKNOWN ASSAILANTS. A NOTE SAYING "DEATH IS THE FATE OF ALL COLLABORATORS" WAS LEFT BY THE BODY. LOCALS INFORMED THE MILOB PATROL THAT A COUPLE WAS

MURDERED IN MUHUNGWE COMMUNE (5015) ON THE NIGHT OF 28 NOV 95 WITH KNIVES. THE KILLERS ALSO THREW A GRENADE IN THE HOUSE OF ASSASSINATED COUPLE INJURING ONE OF THEIR THREE CHILDREN.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. NO RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP TODAY. 10 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI. A TOTAL OF 105 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 300 BOXES OF ORAL REHYDRATION SALT FROM TRAFFIPRO TO GITARAMA.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD ITEMS FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND TWO TOYOTA PICK-UPS TO UNHCR TO CONVEY PRISONERS FROM RUSOMO (0637) TO NYAKARAMBI (7594) TRANSIT CAMP.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED ONE VEHICLE TO ARDEC AND DEPLOYED A DOZER IN THE WFP YARD IN KIGALI. A MINE AWARENESS LECTURE WAS CONDUCTED FOR UNICEF IN KIGALI. EOD TEAM RECOVERED A GRENADE FROM A SITE IN KIGALI.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD AND CONTINUED PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES.

F. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED A TOTAL OF 83 MEDICAL AND 15 DENTAL PATIENTS.

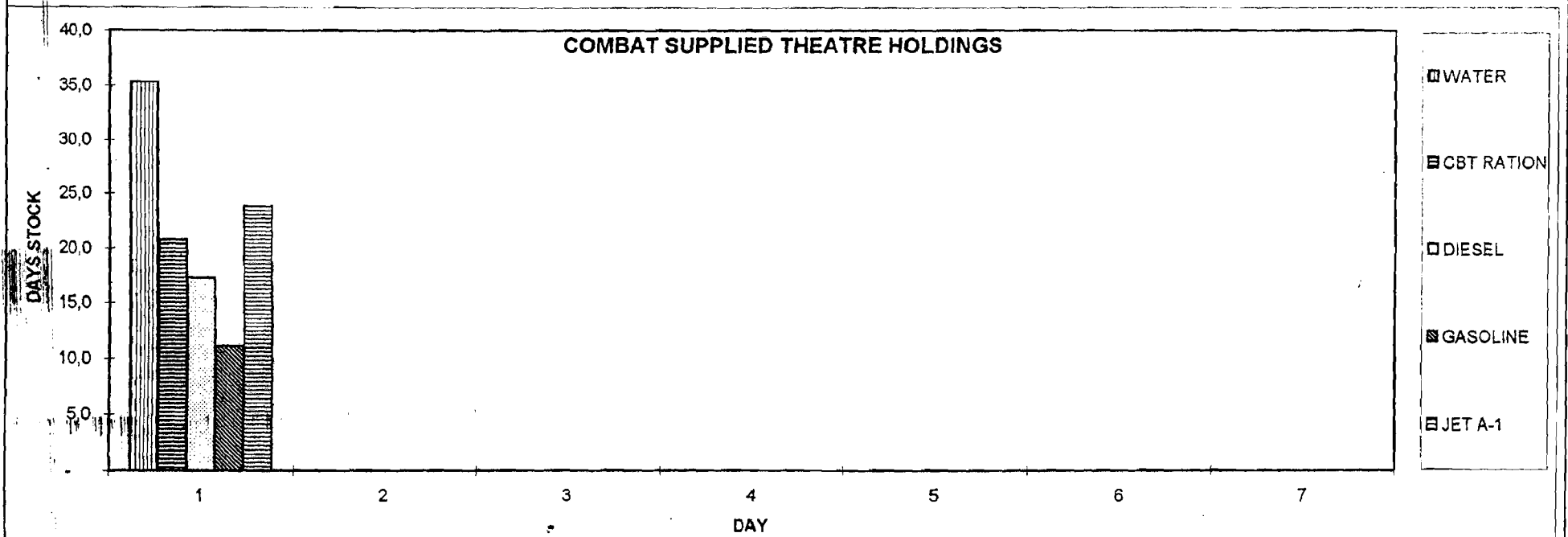

DAILY SITREP FOR 01 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 213. 208 WERE FROM ZAIRE, 03 FROM UGANDA AND 01 EACH FROM BURUNDI AND TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 27,231 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 2A - REF THE REPORTED INCIDENT OF 30 NOV IN WHICH A TRUCK GOT STUCK IN THE MUD AT GAKUMA (GR 225539) WHILE DELIVERING SCHOOL MATERIAL TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE. THE MILOB TEAM LEADER OFF LOADED THE MATERIAL IN THE TRUCK INTO THEIR PICK-UPS AS THE RECOVERY COULD NOT BE ORGANISED THE SAME DAY AND LEFT AN ARMED ESCORT TO GUARD THE TRUCK. WHEN THE TEAM ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE OFFICES AFTER 2100 HRS, THE ARMED ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE NAMED BOSCO MANZIA AND ANOTHER PERSON NAMED STANCLIAS MUBASHAKIWAYA BOTH DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORMS, IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED THE SCHOOL INSPECTOR AND ORDERED THE MILOBS TO LEAVE. WHEN THE TEAM LEADER EXPLAINED THAT THE INSPECTOR HAD THE KEYS TO THE STORE ROOM WHERE THEY HAD TO DEPOSIT THE ITEMS, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE FIRED TWO SHOTS INTO THE LEGS OF THE ARMED ESCORT FROM GHANCOY BUT FORTUNATELY MISSED. THE TEAM LEADER CONTACTED THE HQ AND WAS TOLD NOT TO FIRE BACK BUT TO WITHDRAW TO A NEARBY CLINIC AND PROCEED BACK TO BYUMBA WITH THE REST OF THE PARTY AND MATERIAL LEAVING ONLY THE ROOFING SHEETS AND THE INSPECTOR IN THE HANDS OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE. ON 01 DEC 95, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE AND HIS ACCOMPLICE WERE ARRESTED AND ARE BEING HELD AT BYUMBA GENDARMERIE. THE INSPECTOR WAS RELEASED AND THE SCHOOL ITEMS WILL BE DELIVERED TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE TODAY.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI), RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN THE NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) ON 30 NOV FROM 0600 TO 1800 HRS. ONE WEAPON WAS FOUND IN THE HOUSE OF ONE OF THE TWO COUNCILLORS WHO WERE ARRESTED FOR NOT MAINTAINING SECURITY IN THEIR AREAS. TWO CIVILIANS WERE ALSO ARRESTED DURING THE OPERATION FOR ALLEGEDLY HARBOURING FRGF SOLDIERS IN THEIR HOUSES.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) SECTOR 3A - MILOBS RECEIVED REPORTS THAT SOME PEOPLE HAVE BEEN KILLED IN THE FOREST NEAR SHABA SECTOR (GR 397155) OF KIVU COMMUNE. PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT ON 17 AUG 95, CONSEQUENT TO THE ARREST OF THE LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN RWAMIKO COMMUNE (4914), LOCALS HAD FLED TO THE FOREST AND ESTABLISHED A CAMP WEST OF SHABA OF WHICH PEOPLE ON THE COMMUNE WERE NOT AWARE. LOCALS REPORTED HAVING HEARD FIRING ON 25 NOV 95 BETWEEN 0900 HRS TO 1600 HRS FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE CAMP. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT THEY HAD SEEN ABOUT 08 PEOPLE IN UNIFORM IN SHABA AREA AND THESE HAD LEFT ON 26 NOV 95. ON RECEIPT OF ABOVE INFO A TEAM OF MILOBS, HR AND ABOUT 40 TO 50 LOCALS WENT TO THE CAMP SITE WHICH HAD BEEN DESTROYED AND COUNTED UP TO 20 DEAD BODIES. ONE OF THE SURVIVORS SAID THAT PRIOR TO THE INCIDENT, ABOUT 135 PEOPLE WERE LIVING IN THE CAMP AND DURING THE SHOOTING, THE PEOPLE HAD FLED INTO THE FOREST. THE EXACT NUMBER OF CASUALTIES COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED AS A NUMBER OF BODIES ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN DISPOSED OFF BY THE ATTACKERS. THE RPA SECOND IN COMMAND WHEN CONTACTED, DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF THE INCIDENT. HR INVESTIGATING.

(2) SECTOR 5B - MILOB PATROL TO KIVUMU SECTOR (2303) REPORTED THAT SEVEN INDIVIDUALS HAD COME TO RWANDA FROM MUGUNGO CAMP IN ZAIRE CARRYING THREE ATK MINES, SIX HAND GRENADES AND TWO AK 47 RIFLES AND ASSORTED UNIFORMS. THE INFILTRATORS WERE SUSPECTED TO BE HIDING IN THE FOREST. ALSO IN THE SAME SECTOR ON THE NIGHT 29/30 NOV 95, SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE SURROUNDED THE HOUSE OF THE COUNCILLOR AND DEMANDED ENTRY. THE LOCALS RESPONDED TO THE SITUATION AND CHASED THE INSURGENTS AWAY.

(3) MILOBS PATROL TO KANZENZE SECTOR GR 3019 WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT 50 INTERHAMWE HAD INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE CLOSELY FOLLOWED BY THE RPA. THE INSURGENTS HOWEVER ESCAPED INTO THE NEARBY FOREST.

(4) CIVPOL MONITORS IN KIGALI REPORTED AN INCIDENT OF FIRING IN KIMIHURURA AREA OF KIGALI AT 0300 HRS ON 02 DEC 95. CAUSE OF THE FIRING IS NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

A. FC HELD A MEETING WITH UNAMIR SENIOR STAFF TO DISCUSS UNAMIR FUTURE MANDATE.

B. MR. DUSAIDI, DIRECTOR OF CABINET FROM THE OFFICE OF RWANDAN VP AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE CALLED ON THE FC TO DISCUSS MATTERS OF MUTUAL CONCERN.

C. MR. E ASSEID, DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF UNHRFOR PAID A COURTESY CALL ON THE FC.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 53 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND NYAGATARE. 56 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI, GITARAMA, NYAGATARE, BUTARE, KIBUNGO AND BYUMBA. A TOTAL OF 115 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND COMPLETED FENCING WORK ON WFP WARE HOUSE IN BIRENGA. GHANBATT ALSO PROVIDED TWO TCVs TO KIBUNGO HOSPITAL FOR ACTIVITIES MARKING THE WORLD AIDS DAY, TWO TRUCKS TO MINISTRY OF JUSTICE TO TRANSPORT PRISONERS AND SIX TOYOTA PICK-UPS TO UNHCR FOR ESCORTING RETURNING REFUGEES.

C. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK EACH TO GISUMA, RPA AND ICR FOR TRANSPORTING GRAVEL AND FIRE WOOD.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED TWO DUMPERS FOR DESTRUCTION OF EXPIRED RATIONS, DEPLOYED A DOZER FOR REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FUEL WOOD.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD AND CONTINUED PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES.

F. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED A TOTAL OF 223 MEDICAL AND 25 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. UNHCR REPORTED THAT ABOUT 40 REFUGEES WERE EXPELLED FROM TANZANIA LATE IN THE AFTERNOON BY TANZANIAN FORCES. THE REFUGEES WILL STAY AT THE BORDER UNDER RPA GUARD AND WILL BE TRANSPORTED TO NYAKARAMBI TOMORROW IN GHANBATT TRANSPORT.

B. TOP GOVT OFFICIALS AND HUNDREDS OF LOCALS MARCHED FROM KIGALI CITY TO NYAMIRAMBO STADIUM WHERE SPORTS ACTIVITIES AND TRADITIONAL DANCES TOOK PLACE TO COMMEMORATE THE WORLD AIDS DAY.

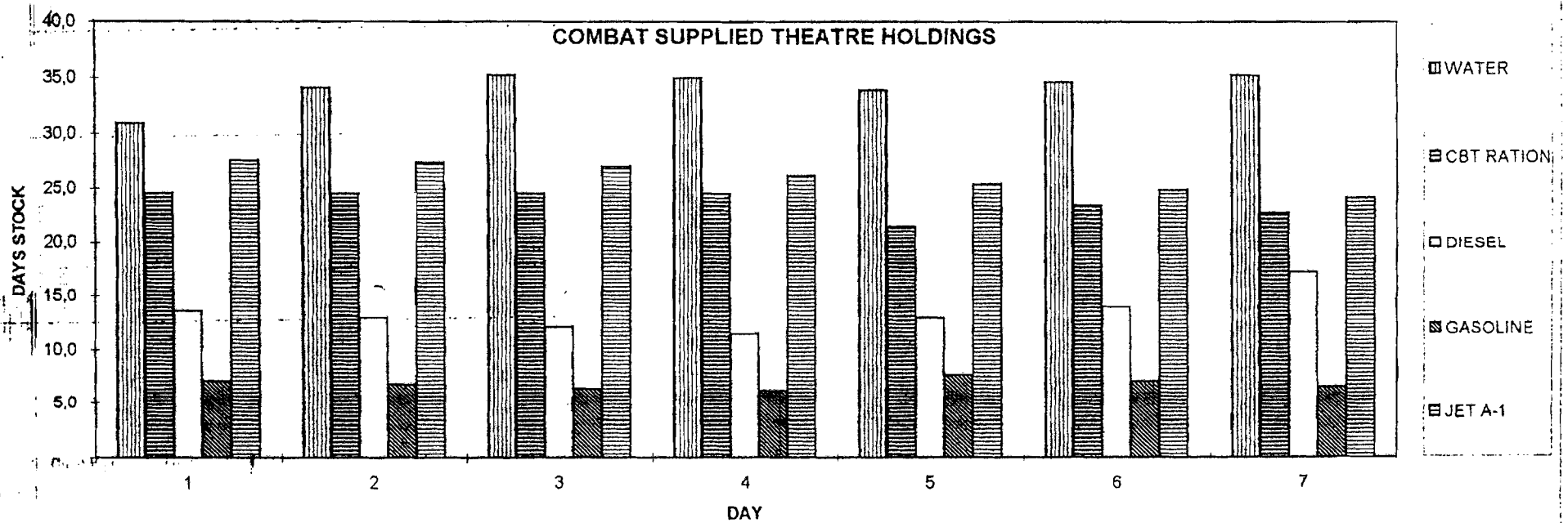

REPORT SITUATION FOR 02 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. POSTAL BORDER POSTS AND OVERA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPLENISHMENT OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 111. 100 FROM ZAIRE, 03 FROM UGANDA AND 08 FROM BURUNDI AND TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS 00.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 27,272 AND OUTFLOW IS 03.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/COMMUNITIES

(1) SECTOR 2A - RPP THE REPORTED INCIDENT OF 30 NOV IN WHICH A TRUCK GOT STUCK IN THE MUD AT GAKUMA (GR 215539) WHILE DELIVERING SCHOOL MATERIAL TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE. THE MILOB TEAM LEADER OFF LOADED THE MATERIAL IN THE TRUCK INTO THEIR PICK-UPS AS THE RECOVERY COULD NOT BE ORGANISED THE SAME DAY AND LEFT AN ARMED ESCORT TO GUARD THE TRUCK. WHEN THE TEAM ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE OFFICES AFTER 2100 HRS, THE ARMED ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE NAMED BOSCO MANZIA AND ANOTHER PERSON NAMED STANCLAS MUBASHAKIWAYA BOTH DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORMS, IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED THE SCHOOL INSPECTOR AND ORDERED THE MILOBS TO LEAVE. WHEN THE TEAM LEADER EXPLAINED THAT THE INSPECTOR HAD THE KEYS TO THE STORE ROOM WHERE THEY HAD TO DEPOSIT THE ITEMS, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE FIRED TWO SHOTS INTO THE LEGS OF THE ARMED ESCORT FROM GANCOY BUT FORTUNATELY MISSED. THE TEAM LEADER CONTACTED THE HQ AND WAS TOLD NOT TO FIRE BACK BUT TO WITHDRAW TO A NEARBY CLINIC AND PROCEED BACK TO BYUMBA WITH THE REST OF THE PARTY AND MATERIAL LEAVING ONLY THE ROOFING SHEETS AND THE INSPECTOR IN THE HANDS OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE. ON 01 DEC 95, THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE AND HIS ACCOMPLICE WERE ARRESTED AND ARE BEING HELD AT BYUMBA GENDARMERIE. THE INSPECTOR WAS RELEASED AND THE SCHOOL ITEMS WILL BE DELIVERED TO MUVUMBA COMMUNE TODAY.

SITREP

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUENGERI), RPA CONDUCTED COTTON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN THE NYAKINAMA COMBINE (GR 0017) ON 30 NOV FROM 0600 TO 1800 HRS. ONE WEAPON WAS FOUND IN THE HOUSE OF ONE OF THE TWO COUNCILLORS WHO WERE ARRESTED FOR NOT MAINTAINING SECURITY IN THEIR AREAS. TWO CIVILIANS WERE ALSO ARRESTED DURING THE OPERATION FOR ALLEGEDLY HARBOURING FRGF SOLDIERS IN THEIR HOUSES.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/LANDMILITARY.

(1) SECTOR 3A - MILOBS RECEIVED REPORTS THAT SOME PEOPLE HAVE BEEN KILLED IN THE FOREST NEAR SHABA SECTOR (GR 397155) OF KIVU COMMUNE. PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT ON 17 AUG 95, CONSEQUENT TO THE ARREST OF THE LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN RWAMUKO COMMUNE (4914), LOCALS HAD FLED TO THE FOREST AND ESTABLISHED A CAMP WEST OF SHABA OF WHICH PEOPLE ON THE COMMUNE WERE NOT AWARE. LOCALS REPORTED HAVING HEARD FIRING ON 25 NOV 95 BETWEEN 0900 HRS TO 1600 HRS FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE CAMP. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT THEY HAD SEEN ABOUT 98 PEOPLE IN UNIFORM IN SHABA AREA AND THESE HAD LEFT ON 26 NOV 95. ON RECEIPT OF ABOVE INFO A TEAM OF MILOBS, MR AND ABOUT 40 TO 50 LOCALS WENT TO THE CAMP SITE WHICH HAD BEEN DESTROYED AND COUNTED UP TO 20 DEAD BODIES. ONE OF THE SURVIVORS SAID THAT PRIOR TO THE INCIDENT, ABOUT 135 PEOPLE WERE LIVING IN THE CAMP AND DURING THE SHOOTING, THE PEOPLE HAD FLED INTO THE FOREST. THE EXACT NUMBER OF CASUALTIES COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED AS A NUMBER OF BODIES ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN DISPOSED OFF BY THE ATTACKERS. THE RPA SECOND IN COMMAND WHEN CONTACTED, DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF THE INCIDENT. MR INVESTIGATING.

(2) SECTOR 5B - MILOB PATROL TO KIVUMU SECTOR (2303) REPORTED THAT SEVEN INDIVIDUALS HAD COME TO RWANDA FROM MUGUNGO CAMP IN ZAIRE CARRYING THREE ATK MINES, SIX HAND GRENADES AND TWO AK 47 RIFLES AND ASSORTED UNIFORMS. THE INFILTRATORS WERE SUSPECTED TO BE HIDING IN THE FOREST. ALSO IN THE SAME SECTOR ON THE NIGHT 29/30 NOV 95, SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE SURROUNDED THE HOUSE OF THE COUNCILLOR AND DEMANDED ENTRY. THE LOCALS RESPONDED TO THE SITUATION AND CHASED THE INSURGENTS AWAY.

(3) MILOBS PATROL TO KANZENZE SECTOR GR 3019 WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT 50 INTERHAMWE HAD INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE CLOSELY FOLLOWED BY THE RPA. THE INSURGENTS HOWEVER ESCAPED INTO THE NEARBY FOREST.

(4) CIVPOL MONITORS IN KIGALI REPORTED AN INCIDENT OF FIRING IN KIMIHURURA AREA OF KIGALI AT 0300 HRS ON 02 DEC 95. CAUSE OF THE FIRING IS NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FC HELD A MEETING WITH UNAMIR SENIOR STAFF TO DISCUSS UNAMIR FUTURE MANDATE.

B. MR. DUSAIDJ, DIRECTOR OF CABINET FROM THE OFFICE OF RWANDAN VP AND MINISTER OF DEFENSE CALLED ON THE FC TO DISCUSS MATTERS OF MUTUAL CONCERN.

C. MR. E ASSEID, DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF UNHCR PAID A COUNTRY CALL ON THE FC.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 53 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND NYAGATARE. 56 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI, GITARAMA, NYAGATARE, BUTARE, KIBUNGO AND MUKELA. A TOTAL OF 115 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND COMPLETED FENCING WORK ON WFP WARE HOUSE IN BIRENGA. GHANBATT ALSO PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO KIBUNGO HOSPITAL FOR ACTIVITIES MARKING THE WORLD AIDS DAY, TWO TRUCKS TO MINISTRY OF JUSTICE TO TRANSPORT PRISONERS AND SIX TOYOTA PICK-UPS TO UNHCR FOR ESCORTING RETURNING REFUGEES.

C. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK EACH TO GISOMA, RPA AND ICR FOR TRANSPORTING GRAVEL AND FIRE WOOD.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED TWO DUMPERS FOR DESTRUCTION OF EXPIRED RATIONS, DEPLOYED A DOZER FOR REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FUEL WOOD.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD AND CONTINUED PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES.

F. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED A TOTAL OF 223 MEDICAL AND 25 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. UNHCR REPORTED THAT ABOUT 40 REFUGEES WERE EXPELLED FROM TANZANIA LATE IN THE AFTERNOON BY TANZANIAN FORCES. THE REFUGEES WILL STAY AT THE BORDER UNDER RPA GUARD AND WILL BE TRANSPORTED TO NYAKARAMBI TOMORROW IN GHANBATT TRANSPORT.

B. TOP GOVT OFFICIALS AND HUNDREDS OF LOCALS MARCHED FROM KIGALI CITY TO NYAMIRAMBO STADIUM WHERE SPORTS ACTIVITIES AND TRADITIONAL DANCES TOOK PLACE TO COMMEMORATE THE WORLD AIDS DAY.

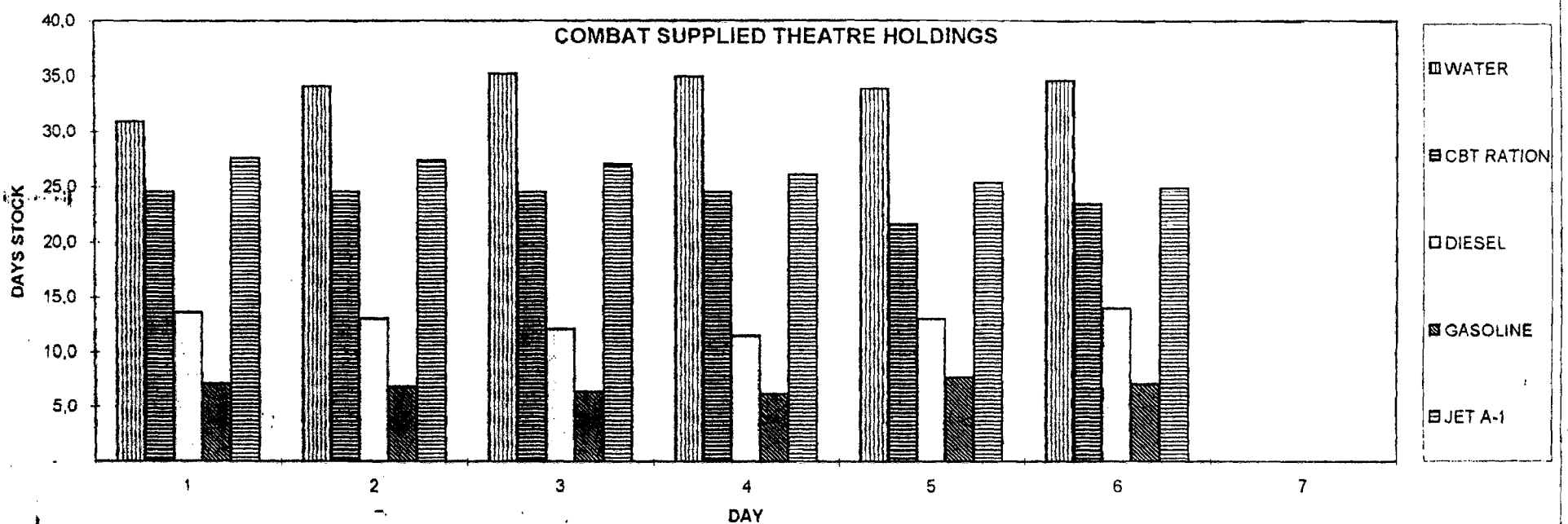
