COUNCIL FOR NAMIBIA MISSION LEAVES FOR ASIA THIS WEEK

First of Two Such Missions; Will Visit China, Pakistan, Turkey, Japan

The first of two missions of consultation to be sent to Asian States by the United Nations Council for Namibia will leave New York on Friday, 9 February, enroute to Peking.

The mission, headed by Ahmed Esmat Abdel Meguid (Egypt), will visit China, Pakistan, Turkey and Japan, returning to New York on 10 March.

The Council for Namibia decided on 22 January to send two missions to Asian States for consultations with their Governments on the implementation of the General Assembly and Security Council resolutions regarding Namibia, in the light of the role the United Nations would play in the transition of Namibia to independence.

Arrangements are not yet complete for the second mission, which will visit Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia and the Philippines.

The first mission, in addition to its Chairman, Mr. Abdel Meguid (Egypt), will be composed of Mohammad Tayyab Siddiqui (Pakistan), Cherif Bachir Djigo (Senegal), Mrs. Solmaz Unaydin (Turkey) and Ramadan Marmulaku (Yugoslavia), as well as Theo-Ben Gurirab of the South West Africa People's Organization (SWAPO).

It will hold consultations in Peking from 12 to 18 February; in Islamabad, from 21 to 23 February; in Istanbul and Ankara, from 26 to 28 February; and in Tokyo, from 7 to 9 March.

The General Assembly, in a resolution adopted on 21 December 1978, proclaimed 1979 as the International Year of Solidarity with the People of Namibia.

In another resolution, the Assembly decided to reconvene its thirty-third session, at a time to be decided in consultation between the President of the Assembly, the President of the Council for Namibia and the Secretary-General, "in order to consider fully the question of Namibia and the implications of South Africa's continued defiance of the resolutions of the Assembly and the Security Council".
