

SITUATION

1. Lately, there has been an increase in the number of robberies and intrusions into UN installations in Kigali by armed personnel. It is anticipated that the situation is likely to deteriorate further. Furthermore, several UN facilities are yet to be provided with military security.

2. In view of the above, the security currently provided to UN installations in Kigali is inadequate and needs to be augmented.

MISSION

3. To provide additional security to UN property and installations in Kigali.

EXECUTION

4. General Outline Security of UN installations in Kigali will be enhanced by deploying additional troops from TUNBATT and civilian elements of KK Security firm.

SUBJECT : COLLECTION OF INFO FOR INTERNATIONAL INDEPENDENT COMMISSION

1. An International Independent Commission has been established by the Rwandese Govt with the approval of UN HQ New York to investigate the circumstances surrounding the massacre of several thousand IDPs at Kibeho DP Camp on 22 April 95. The Commission will commence its investigations on 03 May 95.

2. Especially in view of the ongoing ZAMBATT rotation, it is imperative that all relevant info pertaining to the incident, which would assist the Commission in its inquiry, be collected before the actual eyewitnesses are rotated/leave the mission area.

3. The Commission's TORs will be forwarded once available, however, it will likely investigate the following:

- a. Why were IDPCs closed;
- b. Were there enough consultations before the closure of the camps was implemented and how was the closure implemented.
- c. Did any ethnic tensions contribute to events in any way;
- d. Why the operation became violent/was derailed;
- e. The roles of Govt, RPA, UN Agencies and NGOs; and
- f. Confirmation of number of casualties.

4. You are therefore requested to collect and collate all possible info such as sitreps, increps and statements regarding the incident from eyewitnesses, duty personnel and other personnel present in the camp between 18 and 24 April 95.

5. The G2 cell is the coordinator for UNAMIR HQ and all further queries and information should be passed accordingly.

SUBJECT : WNGO

1. SIT.

A. The forcible closure of Kibeho camp has resulted in thousands of IDPs concentrated in Runyinya, Gishamvu and Butare. Several other IDPs from the same loc are reported moving on foot to home communes within sectors 4A and 4B.

B. Reports also indicate that IDPs on foot are being assaulted by locals along the routes and in the home communes. It is also confirmed that RPA has intensified its mil activities to control the security sit in sectors 4A and 4B.

C. In order to ensure that excesses are not perpetrated by the RPA, it is imperative that UNAMIR presence is enhanced within the two sectors.

2. MSN. To reinforce sectors 4A and 4B.

3. EXECUTION.



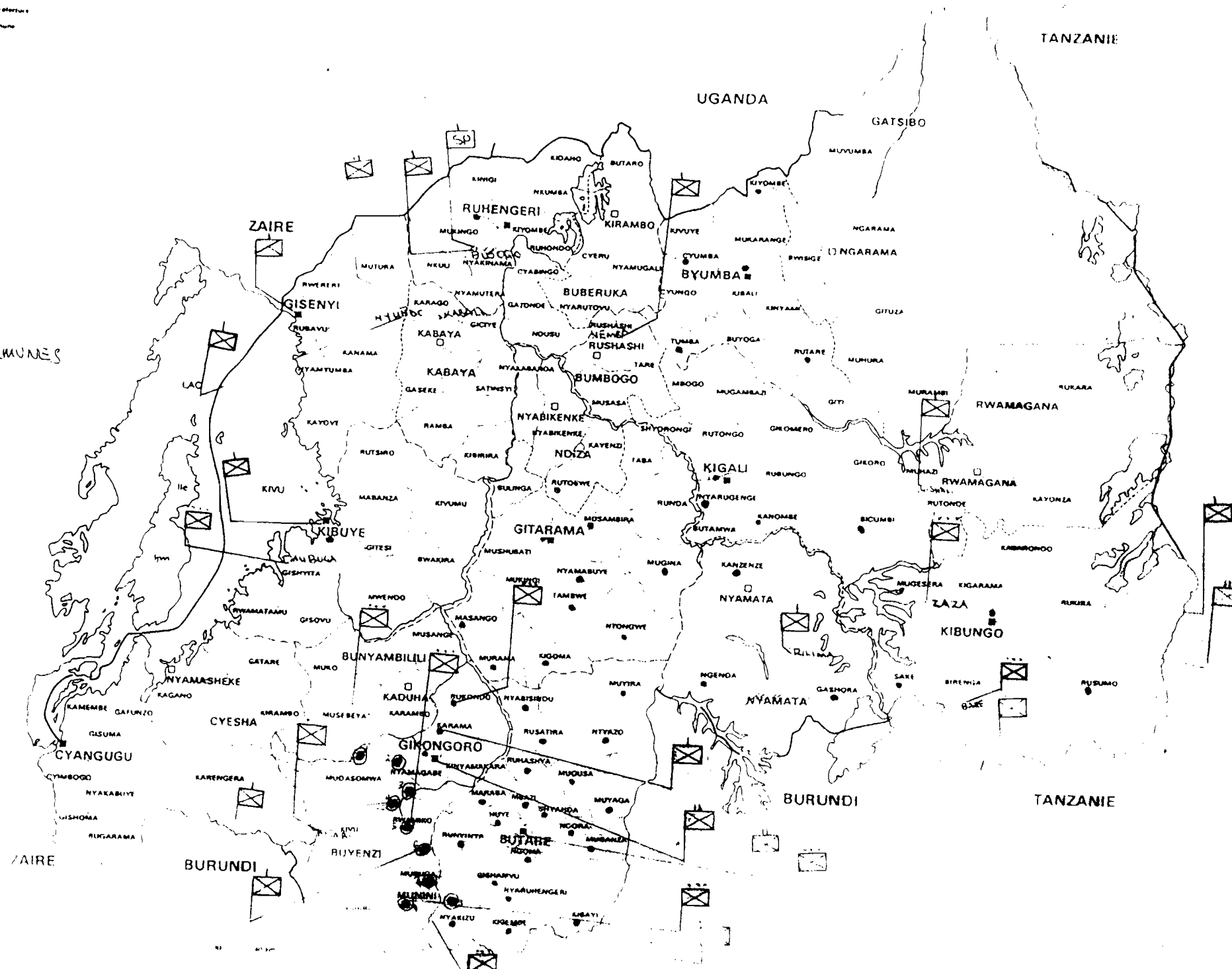

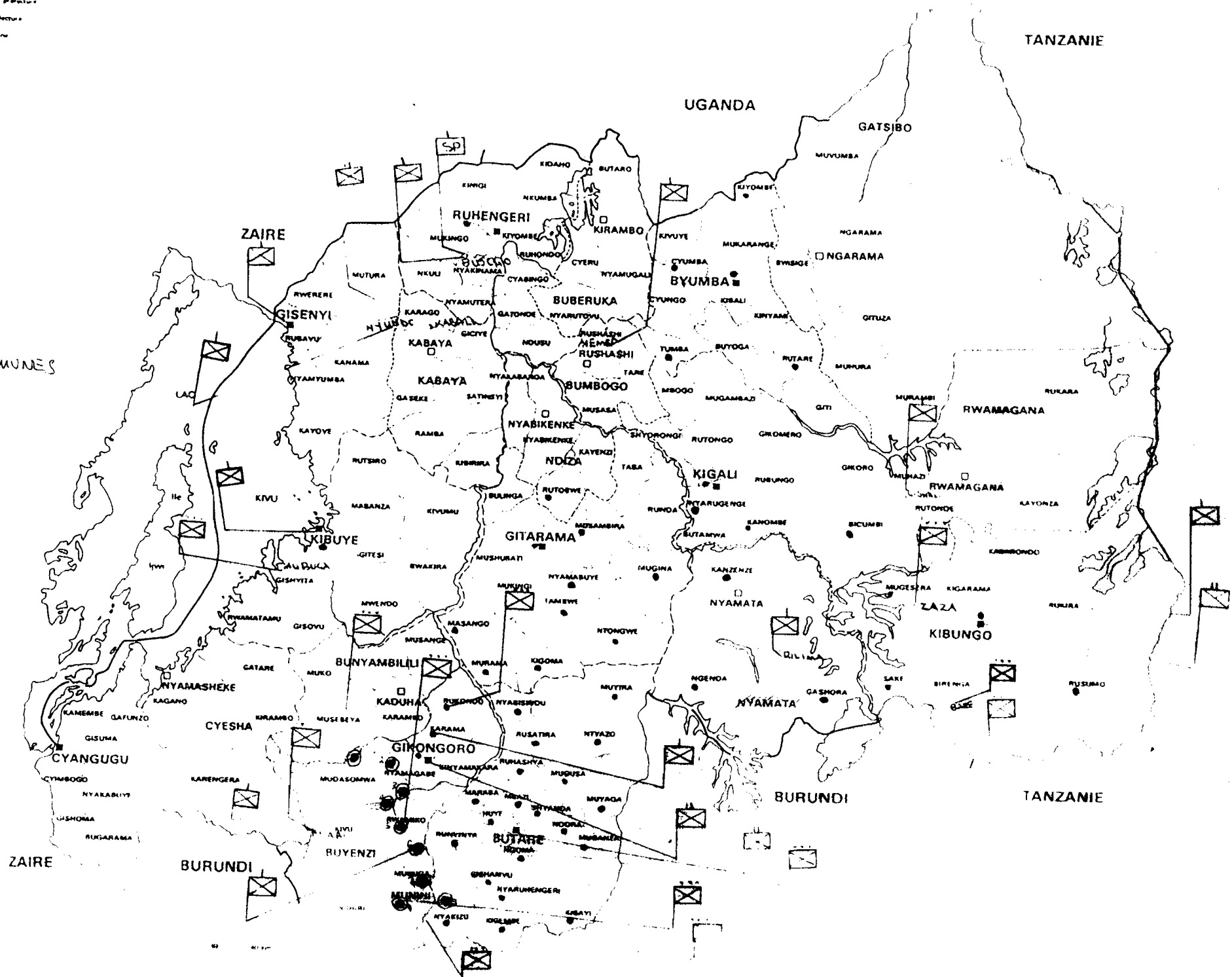

1. THE GITARAMA PRISON IS OVERCROWDED. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT HAS ASKED FOR UNAMIR ASSISTANCE TO EASE THE PROBLEM BY PROVIDING TRANSPORT TO OTHER LESS CROWDED PRISONS. SECTOR 3 HAS BEEN GIVEN THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR COORDINATION OF THE OVERALL MISSION.

2. A TOTAL OF 2400 PRISONERS ARE SCHEDULED FOR TRANSPORT IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- A. GISENYI - 700
- B. RUHENGERI - 500
- C. KIBUYE - 600

3. SECTOR 3 WILL COORDINATE THE MOVE OF 2400 PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA PRISON TO GISENYI, RUHENGERI, KIBUYE AND NYANZO STARTING 0900 HRS 11 APR 95.

Situation

1. General. The general situation in Gikongoro Prefecture continues to remain calm. However of late the RPA presence has increased, and number of arrests are on the rise. Presence of some former RGF soldiers in the IDP camps has been confirmed as few of them have been apprehended. There has been a spurt in banditry activities involving killings, robbery and extortion. The ever swelling IDP camps in the South, like Kibeho and Ndago are a potential "flash point". The proximity of Burundi border on the South, and the adjacent Sector 4-C on the West, makes our sector conducive for any insurgency activity.

2. Threat. The following types of threat are envisaged in this sector:

A. Laying of mines on the un-metalled roads by former RGF/Interhamwe, with the intention of blowing up RPA vehicles. The milob vehicles may be the unfortunate ones to be affected.

B. Ambush on UNAMIR or RPA vehicles.

C. Kidnapping of milobs to make them hostages, for ulterior motives or subsequent bargaining.

D. Looting of milob houses, and UNAMIR property in the sector HQ office.

E. Full scale War, resulting in anarchy and confusion.

Preventive Measures

3. Against Land Mines.

A. Follow the tyre marks of a vehicle which could be taking the same route. Wherever the tyre marks are not visible, the vehicle should be stopped and the area to be searched. Any signs of fresh dug up earth, indicates the presence of a possible land mine. The area should be cordoned off and the R to be informed about the same on the radio. Monitor the sign till the arrival of Engineer team for further action.

H. Avoid the pot holes with water as a vehicle should be closed in it.

4. Against Being Ambushed.

A. It is advisable to group with other vehicles, such as those of NGOs and other UN agencies. However grouping with RPA vehicles should be avoided, as they would be the targets.

B. Night driving is forbidden, until the situation demands. Permission for movement of any vehicle in the night has to be obtained from the Sector-Commander.

C. Any vehicle will always have minimum two milobs. Regular communication will be maintained with the Sector HQ.

D. Always avoid set timings and routine.

5. Against Being Kidnapped.

A. Besides the above mentioned precautions, NEVER give lift to un-authorized persons. The keys of the vehicle should never be handed over to the RPA or strangers in any road-block.

B. Avoid driving at night in remote and isolated areas.

C. Stop only at authorised road blocks/check points. Do not stop at any hand signals.

6. Against House Robbery.

A. Before hiring a local servant, ensure proper verification.

B. Keep your belongings always locked. Never display valuable items in front of the servants. When proceeding on CTO, it is advisable to keep valuable items with another milob or with the local UNAMIR battalion.

C. Always keep your passport and money in your possession.

D. Any door knocks in the night should arouse suspicion. Open the door after proper confirmation.

E. The senior of each Milob House, has been provided with a Motorola. Daily Radio check will be carried out with Zambatt Duty Officer, call-sign "Zulu" and with Sector HQ Duty officer, "CR-0". The timings for the radio check are listed in Appendix.

Security Plan : Various Contingencies

7. Contingency 1 - Attack/Raid on Any Milob House.

A. Immediate contact to be made on radio with Sector HQ, Duty Officer, (CR-0) and Zambatt Duty Officer (Zulu). The list of all call-signs of the sector and Zambatt are listed at Appendix.

B. Transmit the situation in brief, and indicate the type of assistance required.

C. If there is requirement of formed troops, Zambatt will immediately rush the RRF to the concerned spot.

D. During the night it is the endeavour of the Sector to provide a vehicle to each house. However, because of the acute shortage of the vehicles it may not be possible to provide a vehicle to each house. Whenever the situation demands, and the vehicle is available, the team will immediately use the vehicle for a quick get-away to the Zambatt Tac HQ.

8. Contingency 2 - War Scenario.

A. Adopt plan " OP JASON ", issued by the UNAMIR HQ. This plan entails threatened Sectors falling back to Kigali, for final evacuation from Rwanda or alternately being evacuated to neighbouring countries.

B. Op Jason - Jason Yellow "Evacuation Process".

1. All Milobs to concentrate at Zambatt Tac HQ, in the available vehicles. Zambatt to provide formed troops, for escorting milobs from their houses to the Zambatt Tac HQ.

2. Each milob to be in possession of his Iden card, passport, money and only 15 Kgs of baggage.

3. The LOGO will be responsible to carry all essential stores. The non-essential stores will be destroyed in-situ.

4. At Zambatt, the Pers officer will prepare the flight manifest.

C. Modes of Evacuation to Kigali.

1. By Helicopter. The helipad is located within the premises of the Zambatt Tac HQ, which caters for security. The milobs will embark the helicopter based on the flight manifest. The number of sorties would depend on the capacity of the heptr, and the number of milobs.

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C. Modes of Evacuation to Kigali.

1. By Helicopter. The helipad is located within the premises of the Zambatt Tac HQ, which caters for security. The milobs will embark the helicopter based on the flight manifest. The number of sorties would depend on the capacity of the heptr, and the number of milobs.

2. By Road. The milob vehicles will move as a convoy from the Zambatt Tac HQ. The milobs may form part of the Zambatt convoy. This would depend on the instructions from the UNAMIR HQ. Alternately the milob convoy may be tasked to move separately. In this case the protection will be provided by the Zambatt.

Coordinating Instructions.

9. The Zambatt HQ will be provided with a sketch, showing the location of the milob houses. (Refer to Annexure P). Zambatt will detail some officers and troops, to see these locations on ground, so that they are conversant with all the routes for evacuation.

10. Daily radio check will be carried out with Zambatt Tac HQ and the Sector HQ. For details of timing, refer to Appendix.

11. Zambatt will continue to provide the guard at the Sector HQ.



SUBJECT : REACTION TO SITUATIONS

1. In the recent past, there have been a number of incidents which have come to the notice of this HQ, in which the intervention of formed tps was required to save the situation. However, the tps could not react to these situations in an acceptable time frame, as the procedure of reporting an incident which requires the assistance of armed tps, was not laid down.

2. In future, whenever an incident occurs, and the preliminary findings of the MILOBS present on the spot, merit the requirement of armed tps, the MILOB will immediately inform the Sector Comd on radio, who in turn will apprise the local commander of the formed tps. The local comd will then order his tps to react to the situation. In case the situation is beyond his control, he will immediately inform his unit HQ who in turn shall rush reinforcements to the incident site at the earliest.

3. In emergent situations and when communications fail, the local comd will respond to the request of the MILOBS to meet any unforeseen contingencies. It must be appreciated, that if this procedure is not followed, it may result in the situation escalating to such a level that it results in the loss of property and life, which is not acceptable at any cost.

4. MILOB Gp HQ only. You are requested to issue suitable instructions on the above subject to all sector MILOBS at the earliest.

SUBJECT: WNGO

1. SIT.

A. As a result of increased criminal activity and intimidation in Sectors 3 and 4A, NGO ops have been suspended in some areas. Mil info reveals extremist and criminal elements are operating from DP camps in Sector 4A and in some cases there is sufficient evidence to the fact that armed elements are using the DP Camps, specifically Kibeho and Ndago, as hide-outs from where they conduct killings in the outlying communes.

B. In order to create a security environment which will diminish the random killings in the western portion of Sector 3A and to encourage DPs to return to their homes, it is anticipated that the removal of undesirable is essential. This may eventually sufficiently motivate the moderate inhabitants to abandon the camps and return to their communes.

2. MSN. To clear the criminal elements from Kibeho and Ndago DP camps in order to establish a security environment which will encourage DP repatriation.

3. EXECUTION

A. GENERAL OUTLINE. UNAMIR will conduct a cordon and search op in cooperation with the RPA. Two RPA bns will form the outer cordon. Seven UNAMIR companies will form the inner cordon and conduct the search with RPA identification and liaison teams. A linear oriented search

will be conducted con-currently by all UNAMIR companies commencing at Kibeho. A single UNAMIR Coy will be inserted at Ndago as a blocking force. A two pl spares element will be loc at Kibeho. A prelim op to increase the UN presence in the camps will be conducted during the planning period.






A. As a result of increased criminal activity and intimidation in Sectors 3 and 4A, NGO ops have been suspended in some areas. Mil info reveals extremist and criminal elements are operating from DP camps in Sector 4A and in some cases there is sufficient evidence to the fact that armed elements are using the DP Camps, specifically Kibeho and Ndago, as hide-outs from where they conduct killings in the outlying communes.

B. In order to create a security environment which will diminish the random killings in the western portion of Sector 3A and to encourage DPs to return to their homes, it is anticipated that the removal of undesirable is essential. This may eventually sufficiently motivate the moderate inhabitants to abandon the camps and return to their communes.

2. MSN. To clear the criminal elements from Kibeho and Ndago DP camps in order to establish a security environment which will encourage DP repatriation.





FRAG ORDER NO 12 FOR NIGHT HELI OBSERVATION AND REPORTING TRIAL ON LAKE KIVU

GENERAL

1. Since late Dec 94 there have been a number of raids carried out by FRGF troops/bandits into Rwanda. The raids are thought to have been launched from bases on the Zairiah island of IJWI, in lake KIVU, and are targetted at the Rwandan shores of the lake.
2. It is believed that the FRGF troops on IJWI number about 400 men and operate from at least 2 bases using boats. The soldiers wear uniform (or part uniform) and are armed with automatic weapons and hand grenades. It is assessed that the FRGF lack any night vision devices (NVDs). The raids have all occurred at night and appear to be aimed at the acquisition of food, money and personal belongings. Cows are frequently stolen and loaded into boats before being taken to IJWI. Recent attacks have also been made against RPA and UN military targets, although these may have been unintentional.
3. The majority of the raids have been carried out in that part of Sector 4C which borders lake KIVU. There have been 14 raids carried out between the GAFUNZO peninsular (GR 9246) and KIRAMBO (GR 0545) from 30 Dec 94 - 28 Jan 95. An unknown number of raids have been carried out along the shores of Lake KIVU in Sectors 4B and 5. It is known that at least 22 head of cattle have been stolen from the commune of GISHYITA and, it is alleged, taken to IJWI. It is strongly believed that raids have been carried out along the complete length of the Rwandan shores of Lake KIVU, from GISENYI to CYANGUGU, but a large number of these raids have gone unreported.
4. UNAMIR has now acquired a limited helicopter night observation capability using Forward Looking Infra Red (FLIR) equipment. A night trial of the equipment along the western border of Rwanda is planned for a period of one week from 03 to 10 Feb 95 inclusive to ascertain its effectiveness to detect movements by bandits/FRGF elements on Lake KIVU, and to develop an early warning reporting capability to alert the ground forces necessary to provide an effective deterrent response.

MISSION

5. To conduct a night helicopter observation and reporting operation in the Lake KIVU area from 3 - 10 Feb 95 inclusive.

EXECUTION

6. General Outline. The op will be conducted in two phases:
- a. Phase I. - Preparation of a Forward Operating Base (FOB) near KIBUYE at GR 248729.
 - b. Phase II - Conduct of night heli surveillance op.

(d) Ensure all RPA patrols, and shore defence installations informed of combined RPA/UN operations in Lake Kivu area. Briefing to include orders to hold fire against UN helicopter carrying out night flights over Lake Kivu and along Rwanda coast.


