DAILY SITREP FOR 14 MAR 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE STABLE BUT SOMEWHAT TENSE.

B. AN RPA SOLDIER REPORTED TO UNAMIR HQ AT 150400B 95 SEEKING PROTECTION FROM UNAMIR. HE ALLEGED THAT HE WAS ORDERED BY HIS SUPERIORS TO KILL HIS RELATIVE WHO IS A HUTU. HE CLAIMED HIS FELLOW SOLDIERS HAVE THREATENED TO KILL HIM BECAUSE HE HAD REFUSED TO COMPLY WITH THE ORDER. THE SOLDIER IS CURRENTLY BEING PROTECTED BY UN MP. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, RECEIVED A DELEGATION FROM THE CONFEDERATION INTERNATIONALE DES SYNDICATS LIBRES (CISL).

B. HE MET WITH MR. CLARENCE, THE HEAD OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION, TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, PROGRESS IN THE REHABILITATION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM AND THE STATUS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL.

C. AMBASSADOR KHAN ACCOMPANIED BY THE FORCE COMMANDER, WAS RECEIVED BY THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. THE TWO OFFICIALS ~~DISCUSSED~~ THE OVERALL SITUATION IN RWANDA, INCLUDING THE ISSUE OF SECURITY.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA

(1) SECTOR 3 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA BN COMMANDER IN GITARAMA VISITED THEIR HQ AT 1830 HRS ON 13 MAR 95.

(2) A TOTAL OF 9XAK 47 RIFLES WERE CONFISCATED BY THE RPA AFTER YESTERDAY'S CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN SECTOR 3. THE NUMBER OF THOSE ARRESTED IS BEING ASCERTAINED.

(3) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT APART FROM THE ARREST OF THE DIRECTOR OF GISAKURA TEA FACTORY, THE DIRECTOR OF L'ECOLE SECONDAIRE AGRICULTURE VERTENAIRE AND THE REPRESENTANT DE I.S.A.R IN INTENDEZI WERE ALSO ARRESTED BY THE RPA. THEY ALSO CONFIRMED THAT THE SHOOTING ON 24 FEB 95 NEAR THE ORPHANAGE IN KAMEMBE RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF 12 PERSONS FROM NKOMBO ISLAND. THE RPA HAD EARLIER DENIED ANY ENGAGEMENT.

(4) UN MP COY RECEIVED A REPORT OF A PRIVATE PROPERTY ROBBERY AT REMERA RWANDA IN WHICH 3 SOLDIERS, ACCORDING TO REPORT BELIEVED TO BE RPA, TOOK AWAY A LARGE NUMBER OF ITEMS BELONGING TO A UNAMIR EMPLOYEE AT GUN POINT. ESTIMATED COST OF ITEMS STOLEN US \$4885. UN MP INVESTIGATING.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) DURING THE FORCE COMMANDER'S MORNING SESSION WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF, HE HIGHLIGHTED THE NEED FOR ALL BRANCHES OF UNAMIR TO CONTINUE TO REPORT ALL BREACHES OF THE STATUS OF MISSION AGREEMENT BY EITHER UNAMIR OR THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT. LATER HE MET WITH THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE. THEY DISCUSSED THE STATUS OF RELATIONS BETWEEN SENBATT, THE RPA AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES. LATER, THE FC CONDUCTED A WORKING VISIT TO THE FORCE ENGINEER COMPANY. HE EXPRESSED HIS GRATITUDE FOR THEIR OUTSTANDING ENGINEERING SUPPORT THEY HAVE PROVIDED THROUGHOUT RWANDA. HE ALSO THANKED THEM FOR A SUPERB DEMONSTRATION AND TOUR.

(3) IN THE AFTERNOON, THE FC AND THE SRSG MET WITH MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF RWANDA. THEY CONFERRED ON A NUMBER OF ISSUES REGARDING CURRENT RELATIONS BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE RPA AND THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY'S PERCEPTION OF THE LATTER'S ROLE AS THE PROVISIONAL POLICE FORCE OF RWANDA.

(3) PROVIDED VEHS AND SECURITY FOR OP RETOUR. ALSO PROVIDED SECURITY DURING RELIEF DISTRIBUTION BY CARITAS AT MBUGA, GIKONGORO AND CYANIKA.

F. SECTOR 4B (SENBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

- (1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.
- (2) TRANSPORTED 21 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI-1 TO TRANSIT CAMP AT NYAGATARE.
- (3) UNHCR TRANSPORTED 84 REFUGEES FROM BUGARAMA TO NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP.
- (4) ESCORTED A UNHCR CONVOY OF 183 IDPs PROCEEDING TO BUTARE FROM NYAGATARE TO KITABI.
- (5) CLEARED 70M OF ROAD IN THE AREA OF GR 7817 WHICH WAS BLOCKED BY LANDSLIDE AS A RESULT OF HEAVY RAIN TO ENABLE VEHs CARRYING RELIEF ITEMS TO PROCEED TO BUGARAMA UNHINDERED.

- (2) INDBATT SENTRIES AT ACADEMY REPORTED THE THREE GUN SHOTS AT 132130 HRS. EXACT LOCATION WAS NOT KNOWN. IT IS BELIEVED THE SHOTS WERE FIRED INTO THE AIR.
- (3) GUARDS AT TRANSIT CAMP FOILED AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY AT 1200 HRS WHEN A LOCAL WORKER TRIED TO STEAL SECURITY LIGHTS AND WIRE AT THE CAMP. THE LOCAL WAS CAUGHT AND HANDED OVER TO UN MP.
- (4) 173 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP.
- (5) MED STAFF TREATED 39 UNAMIR CIVILIAN STAFF IN AOR.

- (4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.
- (5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.
- (6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.
- (A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.
- (B) THE SECTOR COMD AND HUMANITARIAN OFFICER RECEIVED, BRIEFED AND ACCOMPANIED WORLD BANK OFFICIALS VISITING GITARAMA. THE TEAM VISITED THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE OFFICES AND WAS BRIEFED BY THE PREFECT. THEY ALSO VISITED LUTHERAN WORLD FEDERATION, CARE INTERNATIONAL AND SHYOGWE ORPHANAGE.
- (C) MILOBS PTL TO MASANGO GR 6254 AND MURAMA GR 6749 REPORTED NGO ACTIVITIES IN THESE COMMUNES HAD STOPPED. ICRC AND ADRA HAVE CEASED THEIR OPERATIONS AND CRS WILL CEASE OPERATIONS AT THE END OF THIS MONTH. NO REASONS WERE GIVEN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.
- (D) A JOINT MILOB/HR/CIVPOL TEAM VISITED GITARAMA PRISON AND MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE GR 8273. MILOBS REPORTED 5,581 PRISONERS WERE IN THE GITARAMA PRISON INCLUDING 63 CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGES OF 9 AND 18. SINCE 08 MAR 95 TO DATE, 13 OF THEM HAVE DIED AND WERE BURIED IN MASS GRAVES LOCATED BEHIND THE PRISON. ON 14 MAR, 30 NEW PRISONERS CHARGED WITH GENOCIDE WERE BROUGHT TO THE PRISON FROM RUTOBWE GR 7781. PRISON OFFICIALS GIVE INFORMATION ON PRISONERS TO FAMILY MEMBERS ON WEDNESDAYS ONLY. MILOBS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE OVERCROWDING AND CONDITIONS IN THE PRISON ARE GETTING WORSE.
- (E) PTL TO KIGOMA GR 7649 AND MUGUSA GR 8425 OBSERVED THE TRAINING OF COMMUNAL POLICE IN KIGOMA. AT MUSUGA, THE TEAM ACCOMPANIED BY RPA LO WAS DENIED ENTRY DUE TO UNAVAILABILITY OF OFFICIAL PERMISSION FROM THE PREFECT OF BUTARE.
- (7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN THE

AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE .

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN THE AOR.

(B) PTL TO KIBUYE WERE INFORMED OF THE LANDING OF SOME RETURNEES BY BOAT FROM IJWE ISLAND ON 10 MAR 95. INVESTIGATION BY MILOB HUMANITARIAN OFFICER AND A UNHCR REP IN PROGRESS.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. THE NORTH-EASTERN PART OF THE SECTOR CONTINUED TO BE GENERALLY TENSE.

(B) A JOINT PATROL WITH HR TEAM WAS CARRIED OUT IN THE AREA OF ISHARA. THE SITUATION THERE WAS CALM.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SENT PTLs TO GISENYI-BIGOGWE GR 3520, NKULI GR 4724, MUKINGO GR 5029 AND NDUBI GR 4739 TO CHECK ON THE CONDITION OF THE MUKINGO - NDUBI STRETCH AND TO INVESTIGATE THE REPORTED KILLINGS AT KAREBA GR 4224. THE KILLINGS TURNED OUT TO BE A RUMOUR BUT MILOBS WERE INFORMED OF THE ARREST OF TWO TEACHERS FROM THE SCHOOL IN NYAMULIMIRWA GR 4835. THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE TWO IS NOT KNOWN.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PTLs TO KACYIRU, BUTAMWA AND KANOMBE COMMUNES REPORTED THAT OFFICIALS OF THE VARIOUS COMMUNES IN THE PREFECTURE WERE ON COURSE TILL FRIDAY 17 MAR 95. ALSO THE INDBATT CLINIC WHICH USED TO PROVIDE PRIMARY HEALTH CARE TO THE LOCAL POPULATION WAS CLOSED TO LOCALS BY ORDER OF THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH OF THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT. INDBATT IS FIGHTING BACK AT THE DECISION. IN KANOMBE, MILOBS REPORTED THAT 30 PRISONERS WERE BEING HELD BY THE RPA AND THE INHABITANTS OF THE AREA ARE LIVING IN FEAR DUE TO ARBITRARY ARRESTS.

(3) COMPLETED LAUNCHING OF BRIDGE NEAR GAKO CAMP.

(4) FC PAID A VISIT TO THE COY AND WAS GIVEN A BRIEF ON THE TASKS PERFORMED AND BEING UNDERTAKEN BY THE COY.

(5) COMPLETED DOZER WORK IN NYANZA LAND FILL IN KIGALI.

M. AUSMED.

(1) PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(2) MP COY INVESTIGATED A THEFT CASE IN WHICH 3 PEOPLE WERE CAUGHT STEALING UNAMIR SECURITY LIGHTING SYSTEMS.

(3) OP RALENTIR STILL IN PROGRESS.

P. 95 FLSG.

(1) CONDUCTED NORMAL WEEKLY RESUPPLY RUNS FOR SENBATT AND GHANBATT. IN ADDITION, SENBATT RECEIVED A SIGNIFICANT AMOUNT OF GENERAL AND TECHNICAL STORES.

(2) A 4 TON RPA TRUCK IS BEING RECOVERED FROM A DITCH LOCATED 15 KM NORTH OF KIGALI ON THE ROAD TO RUHENGIRI.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

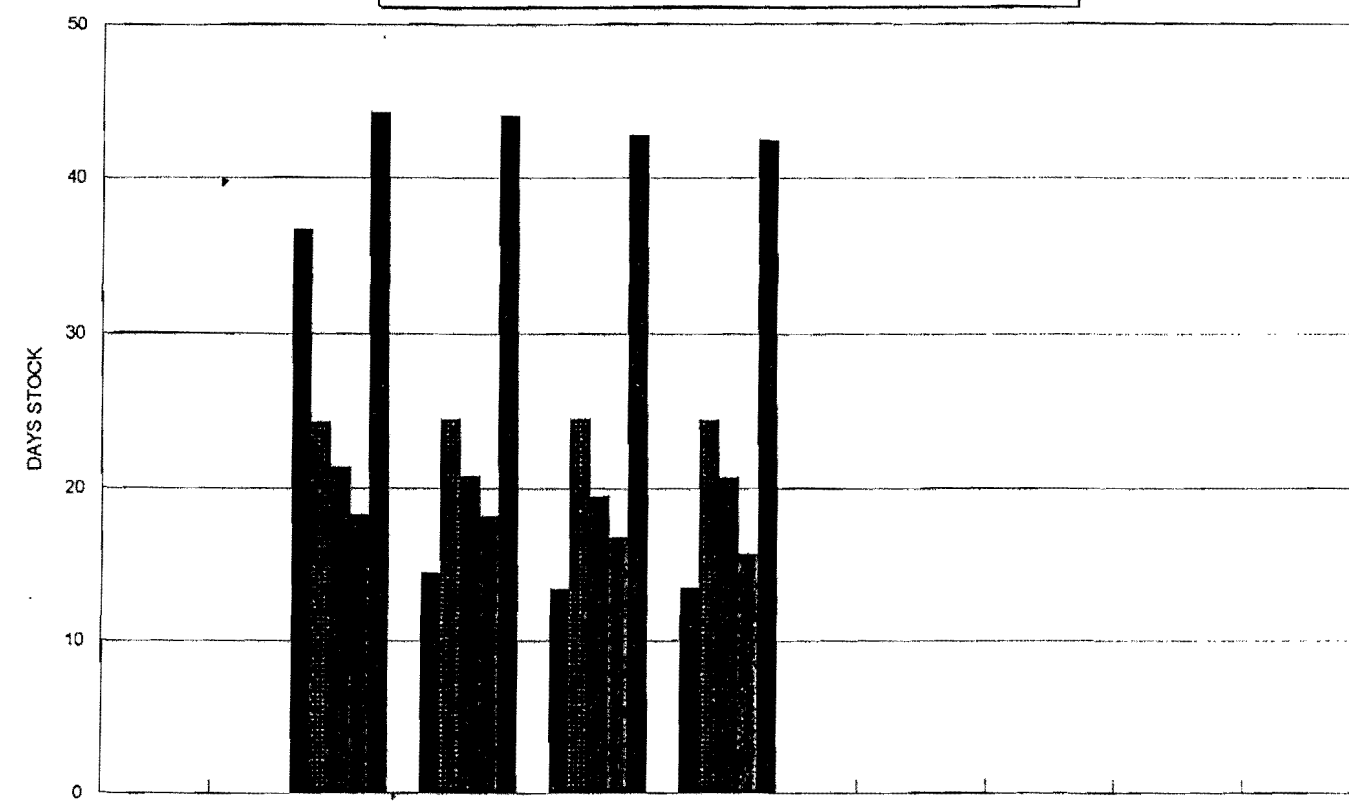

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE STABLE BUT SOMEWHAT TENSE.

B. IN SECTOR 4A ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 0530 HRS M5003 SGT PHIRI CHRISTOPHER COMMITTED SUICIDE AT MURAMBI AFTER SHOOTING M5001 WOII PHIRI PHILIP WHO LATER DIED IN KIGEME HOSP AT 0800 HRS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

C. IN RECENT PAST A NUMBER OF RWANDAN CITIZENS HAVE ALLEGEDLY BEEN HARASSED, ATTACKED OR ARRESTED BY LOCAL GOVT OFFICIALS OR RPA AFTER COOPERATING WITH UNAMIR MILOBS OR TROOPS WHO WERE GATHERING INFORMATION OR CONDUCTING INVESTIGATIONS. THESE ACTIVITIES ARE CONTRARY TO THE STATUS OF MISSION AGREEMENT AND SERIOUSLY AFFECTS UNAMIR'S ABILITY TO FULFIL ITS MANDATE. MATTER TO BE ADDRESSED WITH RPA LO.

D. SEARCHING OF UNAMIR VEHS AT RPA CHECK PTS IN RUHENGARI AND IN KIGALI AREA IS ALSO CONTRARY TO SOMA. OBJECTIONS RAISED BY SRSG AND FC WITH SR GOVT OFFICIALS AND BY SR STAFF WITH RPA HAS NOT YET RESOLVES SOMA RELATED ISSUES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, HELD MEETINGS WITH THE
FOLLOWING:

SPECIAL INVESTIGATION UNIT, HUMAN RIGHTS.

B. IN ADDITION, HE GAVE AN INTERVIEW TO REUTERS NEWS
AGENCY. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA ON SATURDAY
VISITED THE MUTARA AREA TO ASSESS THE PROBLEMS RELATED
TO THE RESETTLEMENT OF RETURNEES LIVING IN THE AREA.
AMONG THE PROBLEMS EXAMINED BY THE PRESIDENT WERE:
THE LACK OF CLEAN WATER, CATTLE DISEASES AND THE
POPULATION'S MISTRUST OF THE GOVERNMENT ARMED FORCES.

(2) THE LOCAL OFFICIALS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE AREAS
ALONG THE BORDER BETWEEN TANZANIA AND RWANDA, NAMELY;
THE HEAD OF THE TANZANIAN DISTRICT OF NGARA,
BRIGADIER-GENERAL AHMED AND THE SUB-PREFECT OF KAREHE
IN KIBUNGO PREFECTURE, MR. CHARLES MUKURARINDA, MET AT
NGARA ON SATURDAY TO DISCUSS THE PROBLEMS ON THE
COMMON BORDER. TANZANIA PROTESTED THAT RWANDESE
GOVERNMENT FORCES HAD OPENED FIRE ON TANZANIAN
TERRITORY, KILLING A CHILD. THE RWANDESE OFFICIALS
EXPLAINED THAT INTERAHAMWE ELEMENTS WERE RESPONSIBLE
FOR THE GUNFIRE.

(3) THE RWANDESE OFFICIALS ALSO ASKED TANZANIA TO
FACILITATE THE RETURN TO RWANDA OF RWANDESE VEHICLES
STOLEN BY INTERAHAMWE MILITIA DURING THEIR FLIGHT FROM
RWANDA. THEY ASKED THE TANZANIAN OFFICIALS TO EXPLAIN
WHY IT HAD CLOSED ITS BORDER WITH RWANDA FOR THREE
MONTHS. THE TANZANIAN OFFICIALS DENIED THAT THE
BORDER WAS CLOSED AND INFORMED THEIR COUNTERPARTS THAT
THEY ONLY REQUIRED LEGAL TRAVEL DOCUMENTS FROM
RWANDESE NATIONALS WANTING TO CROSS OVER TO TANZANIA.
RWANDESE NATIONALS WERE NOT FORMERLY REQUIRED TO HAVE
TRAVEL DOCUMENTS TO GO TO TANZANIA.

(4) A TWO-WEEK SEMINAR TO TRAIN DIRECTORS OF RWANDESE PRISONS AND REFORMATORY CENTRES, WAS CONVENED ON SUNDAY AT CENTRE CHRISTUS IN KIGALI BY THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, MR. ALPHONSE-MARIE NKUBITO. THE AMBASSADORS OF BELGIUM AND GERMANY TO RWANDA, AS WELL AS THE REPRESENTATIVES OF UNHCR AND ICRC, WHO HELPED ORGANISE THE SEMINAR, WERE ALSO IN ATTENDANCE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA

(1) RPA TROOPS IN SECTOR 1 WERE REPORTED TO HAVE DEPLOYED IN MULINDI (GR 0436) AND RUSHAKI. A NEW CHECK POINT WAS ALSO REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED ON THE KIGALI-KAGITUMBA MAIN ROAD GR 358559.

(2) IN SECTOR 3 TAC HQ REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OPS IN SELECTED COMMUNES OF BUTARE PREFECTURE. THE OPS INTERRUPTED MOV OF PEOPLE AND THE MARKET WAS REPORTED CLOSED DURING THE PERIOD. IT WAS FURTHER REPORTED THAT CERTAIN ITEMS FOR WHICH OWNERS COULD NOT PRODUCE A RECEIPT OR ACCOUNT FOR WERE CONFISCATED. 8 RIFLES WERE DISCOVERED IN MATYAZO GR 6913 DURING THE SEARCH.

(3) SECTOR 4C MILOBS RECEIVED REPORTS THAT RPA TROOPS IN SOME OF THE RURAL JAILS WERE COLLECTING BRIBES TO RELEASE DETAINEES. IT IS UNKNOWN IF THIS IS TRUE AND IF THE DETAINEES ARE ACTUALLY RELEASED AFTER PAYING THE BRIBES. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) RPA TROOPS IN RUSIZI 2 IN SECTOR 4C DETAINED A UNHCR VEHICLE AND THE DRIVER ON 10 MAR 95. THE DRIVER HAD US\$ 3,000 AND A PROPAGANDA TYPE LETTER IN HIS POSSESSION. THE DRIVER CLAIMED THAT THE MONEY WAS GIVEN TO HIM BY HIS BOSS, A UNHCR OFFICIAL OF MALIAN NATIONALITY LIVING IN BUKAVU AND THAT HE HAD BEEN SENT TO DELIVER THE MONEY TO THE FIELD OFFICE. THE RPA TROOPS INSISTED ON SEEING THE DRIVER'S SUPERIOR BEFORE RELEASING THE DRIVER, THE MONEY AND THE VEHICLE. SECTOR MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(5) RPA TROOPS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED THE DIRECTOR OF THE GASKURA TEA FACTORY ON ALLEGATIONS OF PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE. LOCALS DO NOT SUPPORT THE ARREST ON THE GROUNDS THAT THE DIRECTOR WAS A STRONG OPPONENT TO THE FORMER REGIME AND DID NOT SUPPORT THE GENOCIDE. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(6) IN SECTOR 4A, RPA OC HAS DIRECTED THAT THE VEH THAT WAS TAKEN AWAY BY FORCE FROM A LOCAL BE RETURNED

THROUGH THE BOURGEMESTER OF RWAMIKO. OUR SITREP FOR 11 MAR 95 PARA 3A (2) REFERS.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA CONDUCTED A SEARCH AT NYUNDO AND WERE REPORTED TO HAVE CONFISCATED 10 WEAPONS.

B. FRGF. IN SECTOR 5 A LOCAL REPORTED TO TUNBATT COY AT NEMBA THAT FRGF SOLDIERS WERE IN THE AREA. HE ALSO MENTIONED THAT HE SAW ARMED FRGF SOLDIERS ON 09 MAR 95 LOOKING FOR SOME LOCALS, WHOSE IDENTITIES THEY DID NOT DISCLOSE.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(1) DURING THE FORCE COMMANDER'S MORNING SESSION HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE POTENTIAL FOR WATER SHORTAGES TO UNAMIR SITES IN KIGALI DUE TO LACK OF PIPED WATER FROM THE CIVIL SYSTEM AND SHORTAGE OF FILLING SITES FOR THE WATER TRUCKS USED IN LIEU. LATER, HE AND THE SRSG MET WITH THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA TO DISCUSS A NUMBER OF ISSUES OF MUTUAL INTEREST AND POSSIBLE CHANGES TO THE MANDATE OF UNAMIR. THE FC CONCLUDED HIS MORNING WITH A VISIT FROM THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA WHO PRESENTED HIM WITH A PROPOSAL TO FORMALLY CONTRACT THE BELGIAN VILLAGE TO UNAMIR.

(2) IN THE AFTERNOON, THE FC MET WITH A DELEGATION FROM THE WORLD BANK, LED BY MR GAMBA. THE MODALITIES OF RESTORING THE MONETARY SYSTEM AND INFRASTRUCTURE OF RWANDA WERE EXAMINED. HE CONCLUDED HIS WORKING DAY WITH A SUPPLEMENTARY SESSION WITH THE SRSG AND THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF INTERIOR. THE MINISTER AND THE FC DISCUSSED UNAMIR SUPPORT TO AN UPCOMING CEREMONY REMEMBERING THE CARNAGE AND GENOCIDE WHICH OCCURRED LAST YEAR DURING THE CIVIL WAR.

HE HAS DECLINED FURTHER INVESTIGATION IN THE CASE FOR FEAR OF REPRISALS. HR INFORMED.

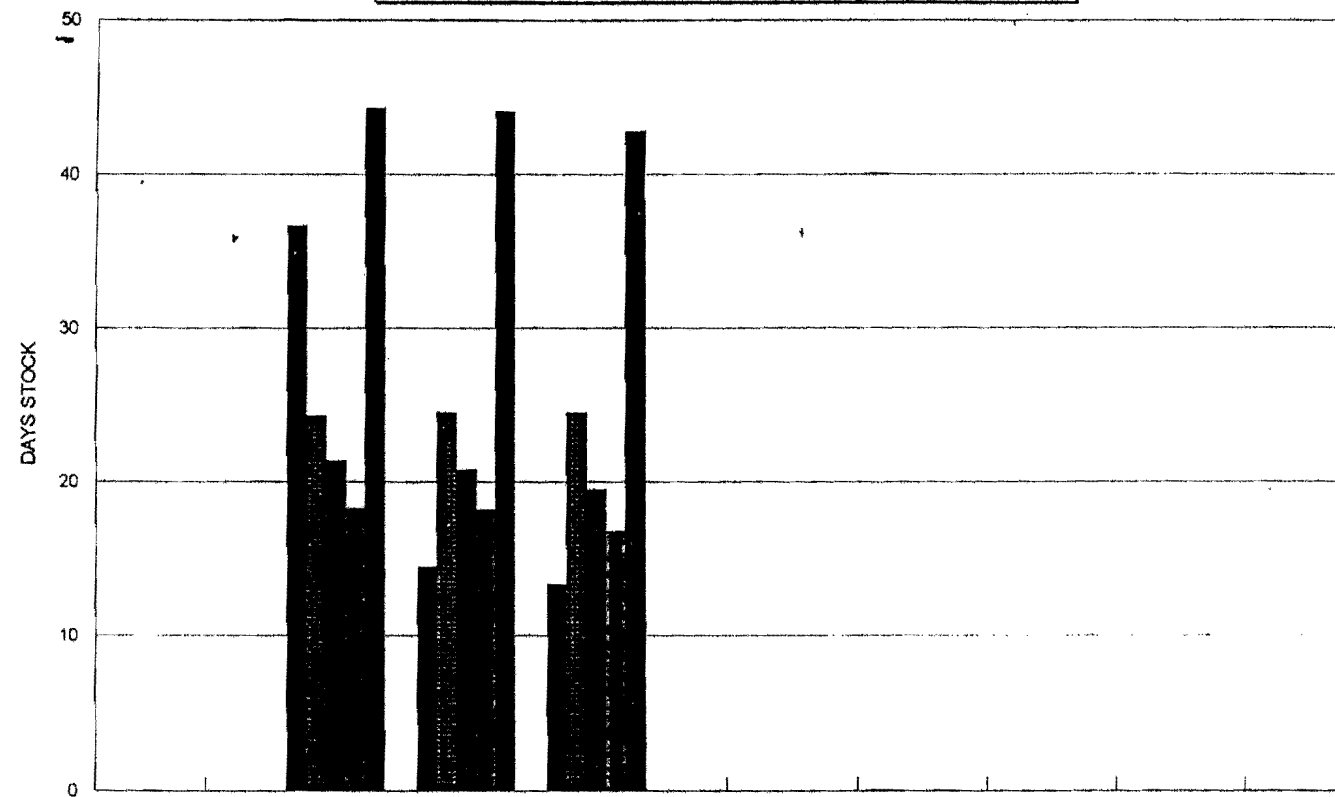

THEIR IDENTITIES WERE DISCLOSED TO THE TEAM BY THE PRISON AUTHORITIES.

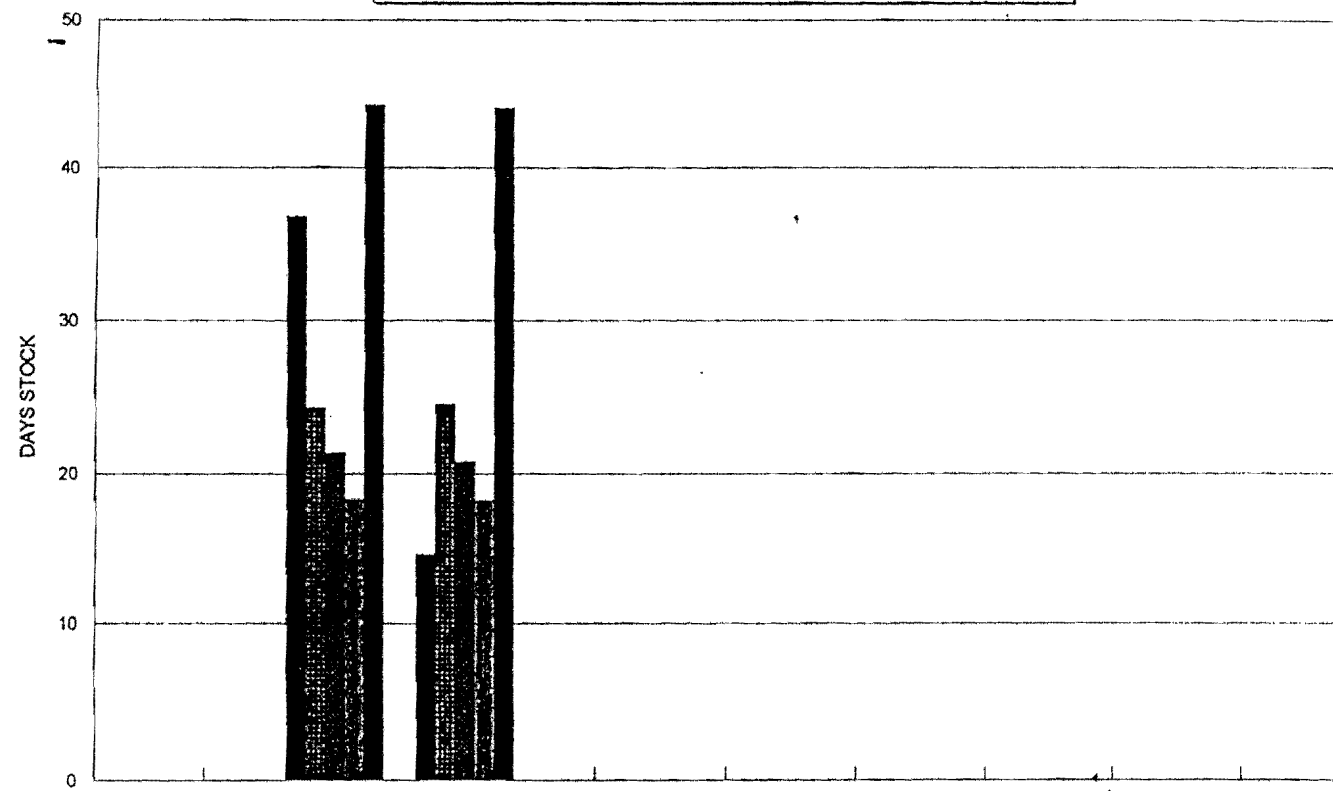

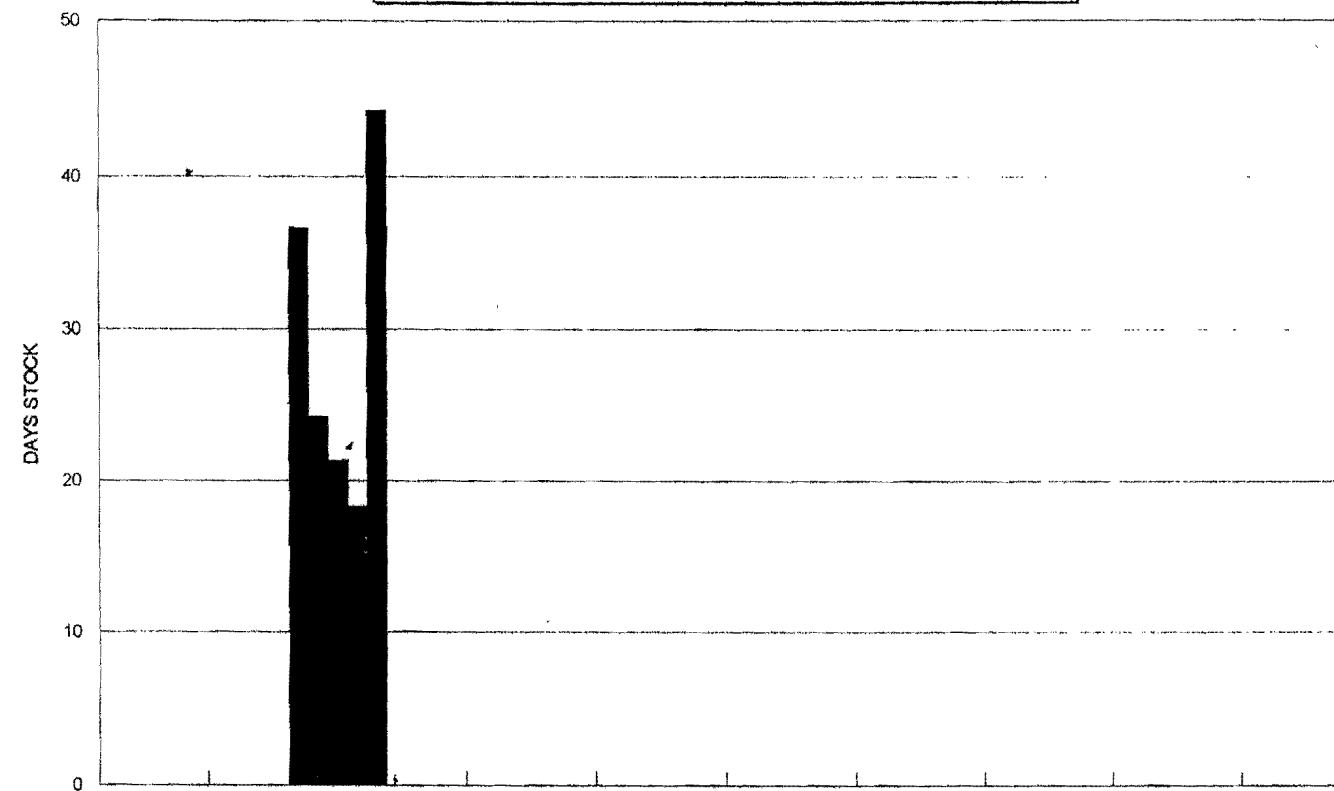



2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THE DFC RECEIVED THE WORLD BANK MISSION ON POPULATION DISPLACEMENTS AND REFUGEES REINTEGRATION TO GIVE THEM A FULL BRIEFING BEFORE THEY BEGIN THEIR WORK.

B. THE SRSG RECEIVED PROF. ADEDEJI, THE FORMER DIRECTOR OF THE ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR AFRICA, WHO IS ON A

CONSULTATION MISSION FOR UNICEF.

C. THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA HELD TALKS WITH THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, MR. FRANK DE KONINCK. THEIR TALKS FOCUSED ON THE BELGIAN CONTRIBUTION TO THE RWANDAN JUDICIAL AND EDUCATIONAL SYSTEMS.

D. MR. GASANA ALSO MET THE RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (UNDP), MR. SUKEIRO HASEKAWA TO DISCUSS THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE GENEVA ROUND-TABLE PLEDGES. MR. HASEKAWA ANNOUNCED THAT UNDP WILL ESTABLISH A PERMANENT SECRETARIAT TO FOLLOW-UP THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE GENEVA ROUND-TABLE RESOLUTIONS.

E. THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF INFORMATION, MR. JEAN BAPTISTE NKURIYINGOMA HELD A MEETING WITH MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL COMMISSION ON THE PRESS. IT WAS ANNOUNCED THAT THREE RADIO STATIONS, NAMELY RADIO AGATASHYA, RADIO UBUMWE OF KABGAYI ROMAN CATHOLIC DIOCESE, AND RADIO RDH OF CLADHO HUMAN RIGHTS GROUP, AND TWO TELEVISION STATIONS, NAMELY VIDEOCAM AND TELE-PEACE, HAVE OFFICIALLY REQUESTED AUTHORIZATION TO START BROADCASTING IN RWANDA. MR. NKURIYINGOMA EXPRESSED HIS SATISFACTION WITH THE WORK OF THE COMMISSION ON THE PRESS.

F. THE MEMBERS OF THE RWANDESE NATIONAL COMMISSION ON THE PRESS EXPRESSED THEIR CONCERN OVER THE INCREASE IN ARTICLES IN THE RWANDAN PRESS WHICH CONTAIN ELEMENTS CONTRARY TO THE SPIRIT OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION.

(1) IN SECTOR 2, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ASSAULTED SOME LOCALS AT KAJESI VILLAGE GR 811664 ON 06 MAR 95 FOR INTERACTING WITH GHANBATT PTL WITHOUT SEEKING PERMISSION FROM LOCAL RPA COMD. LIAISON BETWEEN UNAMIR AND RPA LOCAL COMD IN PROGRESS TO RESOLVE ISSUE. MILOB AND HR INFORMED.

(2) IN SECTOR 4B SENBATT REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS ARRESTED RELATIVES OF BROWN AND ROOT EMPLOYEES AT SENBATT HQ. THE RPA TROOPS HAVE INDICATED THAT THE RELATIVES WOULD ONLY BE RELEASED ON PAYMENT OF 3,000 RWANDESE FRANCS. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS NOT KNOWN. THE B&R EMPLOYEES ARE SCARED AND HAVE SOUGHT PROTECTION AT SENBATT HQ. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) RPA IN SECTOR 5 DENIED ACCESS TO IOC/IOM PERSONNEL FROM ENTERING GISENYI FOR REFUSING TO SIGN AN RPA REGISTER AT AN RPA CHECK POINT NEAR GISENYI. THE TEAM WAS COMPELLED TO RETURN TO KIGALI. MILOBS INFORMED.

(4) IN SECTOR 3 RPA DENIED ACCESS TO MALAWICOY PTL TO

BUSOLO FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

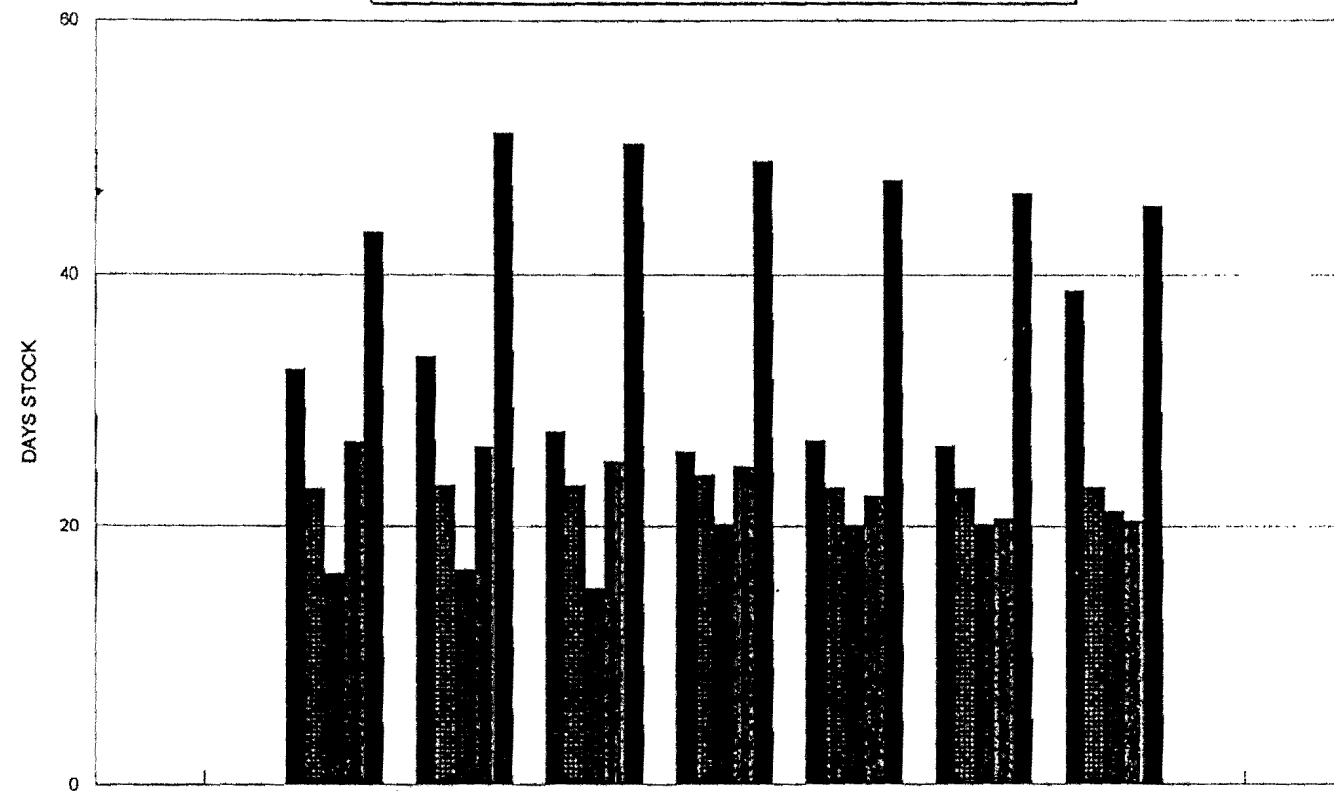

A. THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT, MR. PAUL KAGAME RECENTLY SAID THAT WE SHOULD EXAMINE WHETHER A NUMBER AS HIGH AS 6,000 UN TROOPS IS NEEDED IN RWANDA, AND THAT THE RWANDESE SHOULD CHOOSE THEMSELVES THE KIND OF ASSISTANCE THEY NEED AND SHOULD NOT BE IMPOSED ON THE KIND OF ASSISTANCE THEY NEED.

B. THE BELGIAN GOVERNMENT HAS APPOINTED A JUDGE TO

PROSECUTE ANY RWANDESE NATIONAL LIVING IN BELGIUM SUSPECTED OF BEING INVOLVED IN MASSACRES IN RWANDA.

C. THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INFORMATION, MR. JEAN BAPTISTE NKURIYINGOMA ON TUESDAY RETURNED HOME IN KIGALI FROM CANADA WHERE HE PARTICIPATED IN A CONFERENCE ON WOMEN IN THE PRESS. IN HIS INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA, MR. NKURIYINGOMA STRONGLY CRITICISED THE NATIONAL COMMISSION APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNMENT TO WORK OUT THE MODALITIES FOR THE AUTHORIZATION OF PRIVATE RADIO AND TELEVISION STATIONS, FOR STALLING MUCH ON THEIR WORK.

D. NINE INDEPENDENT OFFICES HAVE BEEN LEGALISED IN RWANDA TO CARRY OUT THE EXCHANGE OF FOREIGN CURRENCIES. THE RATE OF EXCHANGE OF THE RWANDESE CURRENCY AGAINST THE US DOLLAR WAS RWF 232 ON TUESDAY AS ANNOUNCED BY THE RWANDESE CENTRAL BANK.

CAUSE OF ARREST AND WHEREABOUTS OF THE HUSBAND NOT KNOWN. MILOBS AND HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

- (1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.
- (2) DURING THE FORCE COMMANDER'S MORNING SESSION WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF, HE RECEIVED A BRIEFING ON THE WORK DONE BY THE ICRC SPONSORED WORKING GROUP ON REFORMING THE RWANDAN JUDICIAL SYSTEM. IT WAS HIGHLIGHTED THAT AT LEAST THREE DEATHS PER THOUSAND INMATES OCCUR EVERY WEEK AND THAT THE WORKING GROUP AND THE GOVERNMENT

HAVE SETTLED ON FOUR SITES WHERE NEW DETENTION CAMPS WILL BE ESTABLISHED. UNAMIR WILL PROVIDE TECHNICAL AND SOME PRACTICAL ASSISTANCE IN THE CREATION OF THESE CAMPS. HE ALSO NOTED THAT SEVERAL COUNTRIES HAD INDICATED THAT THEY WOULD PROVIDE EITHER TECHNICAL OR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

(3) LATER, THE FC OFFICIATED AT A MEDAL PARADE FOR MILITARY OBSERVERS WHO HAD QUALIFIED FOR THE UN PEACEKEEPING MEDAL. HE CONCLUDED HIS WORKING DAY IN THE EARLY AFTERNOON AND PROCEEDED TO NAIROBI FOR SOME WELL DESERVED CTO. THE FC IS EXPECTED BACK IN KIGALI ON 12 MAR 95.

SOME OF THE SEARCHERS WERE REPORTED AS TAKING WHATEVER THEY WANTED. THE PATROL TO KIGOMA COMMUNE ALSO REPORTED THAT IN THE KIGOMA SECTOR, THE FAMILIES OF 40 LOCALS, WHO HAD BEEN ARRESTED, HAD NO INFORMATION OF THEIR WHEREABOUTS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF 3 WHO WERE

KNOWN TO HAVE DIED IN THE GITARAMA PRISON. THE COUNSELLOR OF THE MPANGA SECTOR WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN SHOT WHEN HE WENT TO MAKE ENQUIRIES ABOUT THE MISSING DETAINEES. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS ASSESSED AS UNSTABLE.

(D) A MILOB PATROL TO MWALI SECTOR OF NTONGWE COMMUNE WAS INFORMED THAT 6 LOCALS WHO WERE INTERVIEWED BY MILOBS ON 06 MAR 95 WERE ARRESTED SHORTLY AFTER THE PATROL LEFT THE AREA. JOINT MILOB/CIVPOL PATROL IS TO INVESTIGATE THIS REPORT ON 10 MAR 95 AND THE SECTOR COMD WILL TAKE UP THE MATTER WITH THE BOURGMESTRE.

(F) A MILOB PATROL TO MUGUSA AND RUHASHYA GR 8926 REPORTED THAT THERE WERE RUMOURS AMONG LOCALS OF AN IMMINENT FRGF ATTACK. THE BOURGMESTRE PLANNED A COMMUNE MEETING TO STOP THE RUMOUR AND ALLAY THE FEARS OF THE LOCALS.

KIBUYE.

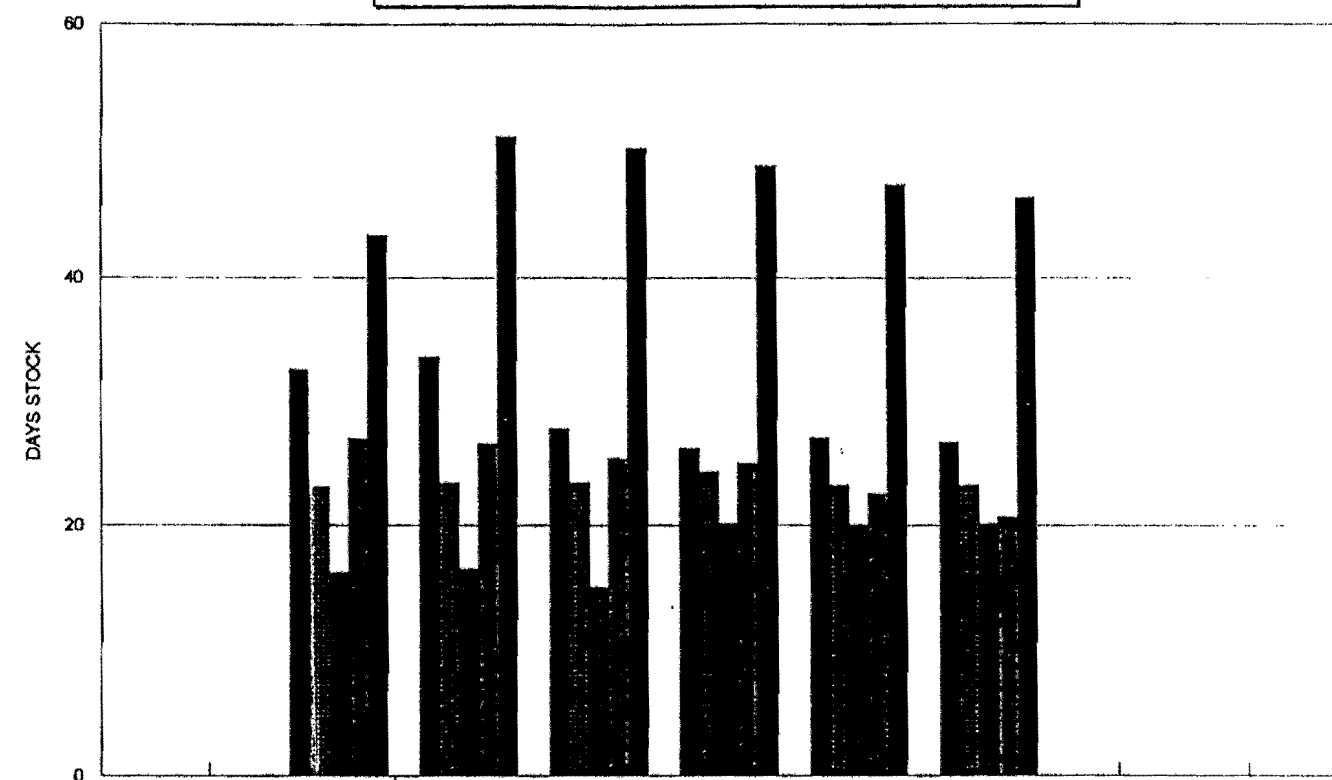



2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA CELEBRATED INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY WITH A CEREMONY HELD AT NTARAMA WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU, MEMBERS OF THE CABINET AND THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, AMBASSADOR KHAN, WAS ALSO IN ATTENDANCE TO ADDRESS THE CEREMONY.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA

(1) WIFE OF A LOCAL INTERPRETER AT CIVPOL HQ REPORTED TO CIVPOL HQ THAT HER HUSBAND AND HIS TWO BROTHERS HAVE BEEN PICKED UP FROM THEIR RESIDENCE AT KAMUHOSA/KIGALI BY 10 RPA SOLDIERS AT 0600 HRS ON 08 MAR 95 TO AN UNKNOWN DESTINATION. HR AND CIVPOL MONITORING TEAM IN KIGALI VISITED GENDARMERIE BRIGADE STATIONS IN KIGALI TO ENQUIRE ABOUT THE ARRESTED PERSONS HOWEVER THE AUTHORITIES AT THE STATIONS DID NOT DISCLOSE ANY INFORMATION ABOUT THE THREE PERSONS. LATER THE TWO BROTHERS RETURNED TO THEIR RESIDENCE AND DISCLOSED THAT THE LADY'S HUSBAND WAS STILL BEING HELD BY THE RPA IN ONE OF THEIR CAMPS IN KIGALI. THEY FURTHER MENTIONED THAT THEY WERE SUBJECTED TO INTENSIVE QUESTIONING BY THE RPA BEFORE THEY WERE RELEASED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) A CIVPOL OBSERVER REPORTED TO UNAMIR HQ THAT HE HAD BEEN ROBBED AT GUN POINT BY 3 MEN AT HIS RESIDENCE AT KIYOVU RUGENGE AREA IN KIGALI. ONE OF ARMED ROBBERS WAS IN RPA UNIFORM. THEY TOOK AWAY HIS UN VEH, UNAMIR 1144 (4 RUNNER), UNID CARD NO CP 015, AND A WRIST WATCH. GENDARMERIE AND UN MP INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THEIR PATROL OBSERVED 15 YOUTHS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 18 AND 25 UNDERGOING TRAINING BY THE RPA AT MURAMA (GR 6749). THEY WERE INFORMED THAT THE YOUTHS BELONG TO THE YOUTH WING OF THE "FORCE PATRIOTIQUE RWANDAIS" (FPR) AND THAT THEY WERE BEING PREPARED TO TAKE OVER COMMUNE DUTIES. MILOBS WILL CHECK FOR SIMILAR ACTIVITIES IN OTHER COMMUNES IN THEIR AOR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

THE FC ALSO VISITED PL LOCATIONS AT NAGARAMA AND NYAGATARE AND WAS MOST IMPRESSED BY THE WORK THAT THE DEPLOYED TROOPS WERE DOING. PRESENT WERE THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO, 2IC GHANBATT, FEMALE SOLDIERS OF THE UNIT AND GHANBATT BRASS BAND PROVIDED MUSIC DURING THE PROCESSION.

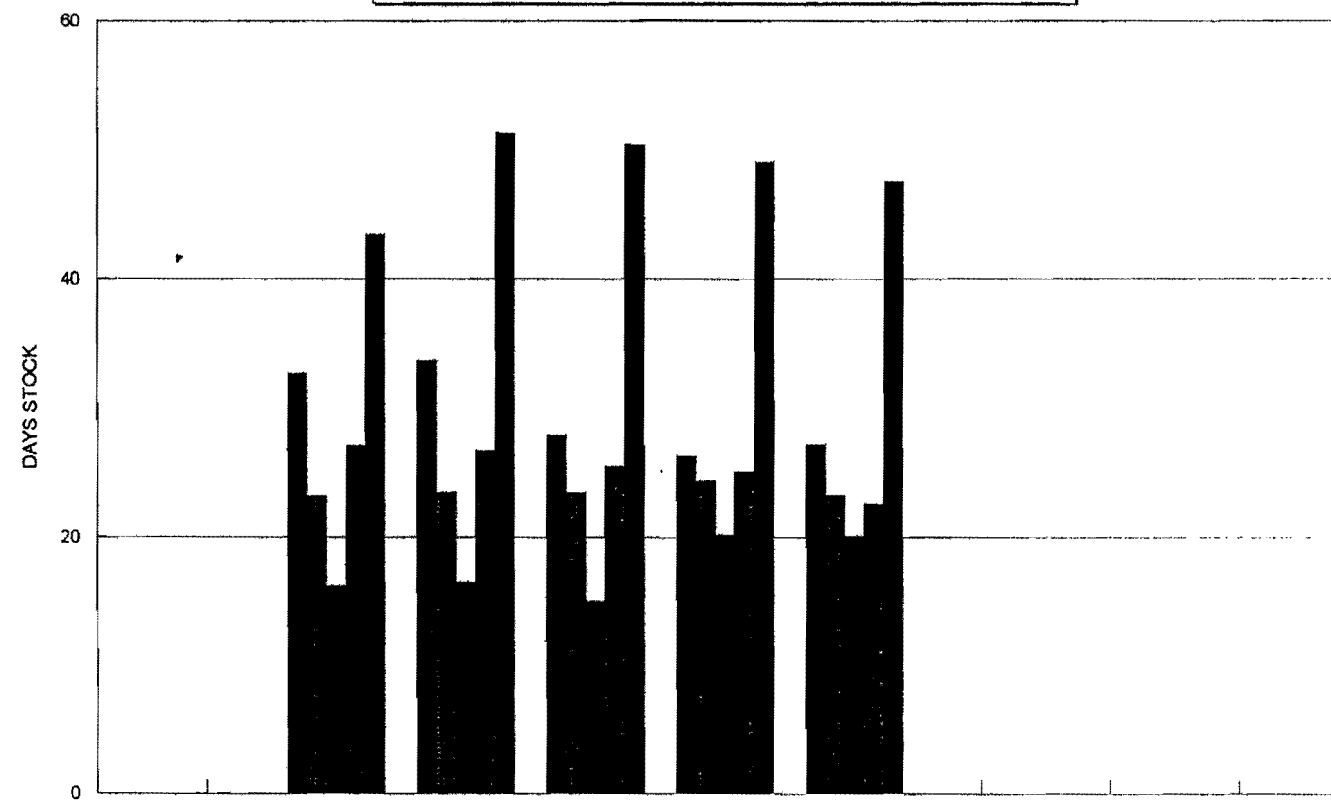

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE STABLE BUT SOMEWHAT TENSE.

B. IN SECTOR 2, A 26 YEAR OLD MALE REPORTED TO GHANBATT TROOPS AT KISERI (GR 4788) WITH DEEP WOUNDS WHICH HE ALLEGED WERE INFLICTED BY PRISON AUTHORITIES AND RPA TROOPS WHILE UNDERGOING INTERROGATION AT MUEAZI PRISON (GR 4791). THE INTERROGATION WAS AIMED AT INDUCING THE LOCAL TO REVEAL OTHER PARTICIPANTS IN THE GENOCIDE. HE WAS GIVEN FIRST AID BY THE GHANBATT TROOPS AND EVACUATED TO RWAMAGANA HOSPITAL (GR 4844). SECTOR HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS WERE INFORMED. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG AMBASSADOR KHAN, CHAIRED HIS REGULAR UN HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, THE FOLLOW-UP TO THE ROUND TABLE AND THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY.

B. HE MET WITH MR. CLARENCE, THE CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION, TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, THE ASSASSINATION OF THE PREFECT OF BUTARE, MR. RWANGABO.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA

(1) IN SECTOR 4C ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT AT A CHURCH IN KIRAMBO RPA AMBUSHED, ARRESTED AND LATER KILLED TWO LOCALS AT GR 0646 FOR NO APPARENT REASON. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) SECTOR 3 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA CAMP IN GITARAMA WAS VERY QUIET DURING THE PERIOD. VERY FEW SOLDIERS WERE SEEN IN THE TOWN. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE DAILY RPA PHYSICAL TRAINING SESSIONS HAD NOT BEEN OBSERVED SINCE THE MORNING OF 02 MAR 95. THE REASON FOR THESE DEVIATIONS IN THE ROUTINE WAS NOT KNOWN. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE RPA SOLDIERS MAY HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED ELSEWHERE. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(3) IN SECTOR 3A, RPA TROOPS IN THE RUHASHYA AND MUGUSA COMMUNES DENIED MILOB PATROLS ACCESS TO THE PRISONS IN THE 2 LOCATIONS. THE PATROL WAS TASKED TO MONITOR THE PROGRESS OF RETURNEES IN THE TWO COMMUNES, MANY OF WHOM WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF THIS MORNING. HE RECEIVED BRIEFINGS ON OPTIONS BEING CONSIDERED BY THE INTEGRATED OPERATIONS CENTRE WITH REGARD TO THE IDP CAMPS AND OP RETOUR. HE ALSO RECEIVED UPDATES ON PROGRESS WITH THE ICRC SPONSORED WORKING GROUP ON PRISON REFORMS AND THE INCREASE IN ARRESTS OF VARIOUS RWANDAN OFFICIALS SUCH AS BOURGEMESTERS. THE FC STRESSED THE NEED TO ENSURE THAT THE CORRECT OPERATIONAL SITUATION IS BEING PRESENTED TO CONTINGENTS IN THE MISSION AND THAT THERE IS A NEED

TO EXERCISE INCREASED VIGILANCE THROUGHOUT RWANDA.

(3) THE FC AND DFC IN THE AFTERNOON GREETED THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MR. TADEKANE, FROM ETHIOPIA AND HIS FOUR PERSON DELEGATION AT THE AIRPORT. LATER, BOTH THE SRSG AND THE FC HELD AN OPEN AND FRANK ROUND-TABLE DISCUSSION WITH MR. TADEKANE, HIS DELEGATION AND THE ETHIOPIAN CONTINGENT COMMANDER. ALL AGREED THAT THE DIALOGUE HAD BEEN MOST USEFUL FOR DETERMINING THE FUTURE ROLE OF UNAMIR AND THE POTENTIAL FOR CONTINUED INVOLVEMENT BY MR. TADEKANE'S GOVERNMENT.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS TO THE MURAMBI COMMUNE (GR 4601) TO COLLECT DATA ON THE COMMUNE. THE PATROL LIAISED WITH THE BOURGEMESTRE FOR THAT PURPOSE.

(B) ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED IN GATUNA (GR 0142), RUKOMO (GR 1121) AND GITTI (2303). THE PTL WAS ACCOMPANIED BY A REP FROM THE PREFECT'S OFFICE IN BYUMBA.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS, TOGETHER WITH OFFICERS FROM GHANBATT AND UNHCR OFFICIALS ATTENDED A CONFERENCE HELD BY THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO TO DISCUSS THE RESETTLEMENT OF REFUGEES IN KARAMA.

(C) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THE ARRIVAL OF 201 RETURNEES FROM TANZANIA AT 0530 HRS ON 07 MAR 95. THE RETURNEES WERE REPORTED TO BE HEADING FOR KIGALI.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(A) THERE WERE REPORTS OF SEVERAL RUMOURS CIRCULATING AMONG THE LOCAL POPULACE ABOUT WHO WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATH OF THE BUTARE PREFECT. SOME LOCALS WERE OF THE OPINION THAT THE ASSASSINATION WAS ORCHESTRATED BY THE RPA, WHILE OTHERS THOUGHT THAT THE FRGF/MILITIA WERE RESPONSIBLE. SOME OF THE LATTER GROUP WERE OF THE VIEW THAT THE ASSASSINATION MARKED THE BEGINNING OF ANOTHER WAR.

(B) A MILOB PATROL TO NTONGWE COMMUNE TO MONITOR

THE PROGRESS OF RETURNEES DISCOVERED THAT A LARGE NUMBER OF ARRESTS HAD TAKEN PLACE IN THE COMMUNE. THE HOLDING FACILITY IN THE TOWN HAD 80 INMATES, A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF WHOM WERE RECENT RETURNEES.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS CONDUCTED IN RUHASHYA AND MUGUSA COMMUNES OBSERVED THE COMMUNE BUILDING IN RUHASHYA BEING USED AS A PRISON. THE BOURGEMESTRE CONFIRMED THAT THERE WERE 7 INMATES. THE 'MAISON DU PROJET' BUILDING IN MUGUSA COMMUNE WAS ALSO BEING USED AS A PRISON AND WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ABOUT 50 INMATES. MILOBS WERE DENIED ACCESS TO BOTH PRISONS.

(D) SECTOR MILOBS MADE VOLUNTARY MONETARY DONATIONS TO THE COORDINATOR OF THE ACTIVITIES FOR THE INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY. THE DONATIONS ARE TO BE USED TO ASSIST WIDOWS AND ORPHANS IN THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE.

(E) SECTOR MILOBS ASSISTED LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO TRANSPORT SCHOOL SUPPLIES TO MUGUSA COMMUNE.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN THE AOR.

(B) PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN THE DPCs TO MONITOR THE SITUATION AND THE PROGRESS OF OP RETOUR. A PATROL TO THE BORDER WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS OF AN INCIDENT OF ARMED ROBBERY IN MUGANZA WHICH TOOK PLACE ON 05 MAR 95. THE ROBBERY WAS CARRIED OUT BY UNKNOWN NUMBER OF BANDITS ON TWO SHOP OWNERS. ONE SHOP OWNER AND HIS WIFE WERE INJURED AND EVACUATED TO KAMANA (GR 5196) BY ZAMBATT TROOPS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. CONDUCTED PTLs IN THE AOR.

(A) THE DIRECTOR OF THE KIBUYE HOSPITAL INFORMED MILOB PATROL THAT THOUGH HE HAD INFORMED LOCAL AUTHORITIES ABOUT THE OUTBREAK OF RABIES IN THE AREA, NO ACTION HAD BEEN TAKEN. HE SAID PEOPLE ARE DYING FROM RABIES IN THE GISOVU COMMUNE. MILOBS WERE ALSO INFORMED THAT VACCINATIONS WERE BEING ADMINISTERED TO LOCALS ON REQUEST.

(B) MILOBS LIAISED WITH THE SUB-PREFECT OF BIRAMBO GR 4673 ON THE PROCESS OF GATHERING INFORMATION IN THE PREFECTURE. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS NORMAL AND VIGOROUS AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITY WAS IN PROGRESS IN MOST OF THE FARMING AREAS.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. THE SITUATION WAS

GENERALLY UNSTABLE DURING THE PERIOD DUE TO FREQUENT SHOOTING BY THE RPA TROOPS IN THE AREA AND THE INCREASING FREQUENCY OF LETTERS INCITING THE LOCALS TO RETURN TO ZAIRE.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATIONS OF THE MURDER OF 4 PERSONS IN THE RUBAVU COMMUNE GR 2213. THE TEAM INTERVIEWED ONE VICTIM WHO HAD BEEN KIDNAPPED BY THE KILLERS. HE CONFIRMED THAT HIS ATTACKERS HAD COME FROM ZAIRE. INVESTIGATIONS STILL IN PROGRESS.

(C) MILOBS PATROLLED GISENYI, GASEKE (GR 4904), KABAYA (GR 4806) AND BIGOGWE (GR 3520) TO COLLECT STATISTICS ON THE NUMBERS OF WIDOWS AND ORPHANS IN THE VARIOUS AREAS. SITUATION IN THE COMMUNE WAS CALM.

(D) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THE MOVEMENT OF 59 RETURNEES FROM THE RUBUNGA CAMP IN ZAIRE ORGANISED BY UNHCR.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS PATROLLED GIKOMERO COMMUNE TO MONITOR THE SITUATION IN THE 4 PRISONS IN THE AREA. THE MAIN HOLDING FACILITY WAS AT THE GISHAKA SECTEUR OFFICE GR 1965 WHERE 108 PRISONERS WERE BEING HELD. THE PRISON IN RUTUNGA SECTEUR WAS FOUND TO CONTAIN 40-50 PRISONERS WHILE THE KAYANGA PRISON HELD 15 MEN AND 4 WOMEN. THERE WERE ALSO 10 PRISONERS IN THE GIKOMERO COMMUNE OFFICE. LOCALS INFORMED THE PATROL THAT ARBITRARY ARRESTS WERE BEING CARRIED OUT BY THE RPA AND THAT THEY LIVED IN FEAR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS TO THE KICUKIRO COMMUNE REPORTED THAT THE COMMUNE IS URGENTLY IN NEED OF HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE IN THE FORM OF AGRICULTURAL INPUTS. THE COMMUNE WAS SAID TO HAVE BEEN SEVERELY NEGLECTED BY NGOS IN THIS REGARD.

L. FORCE ENGR COY. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(1) PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

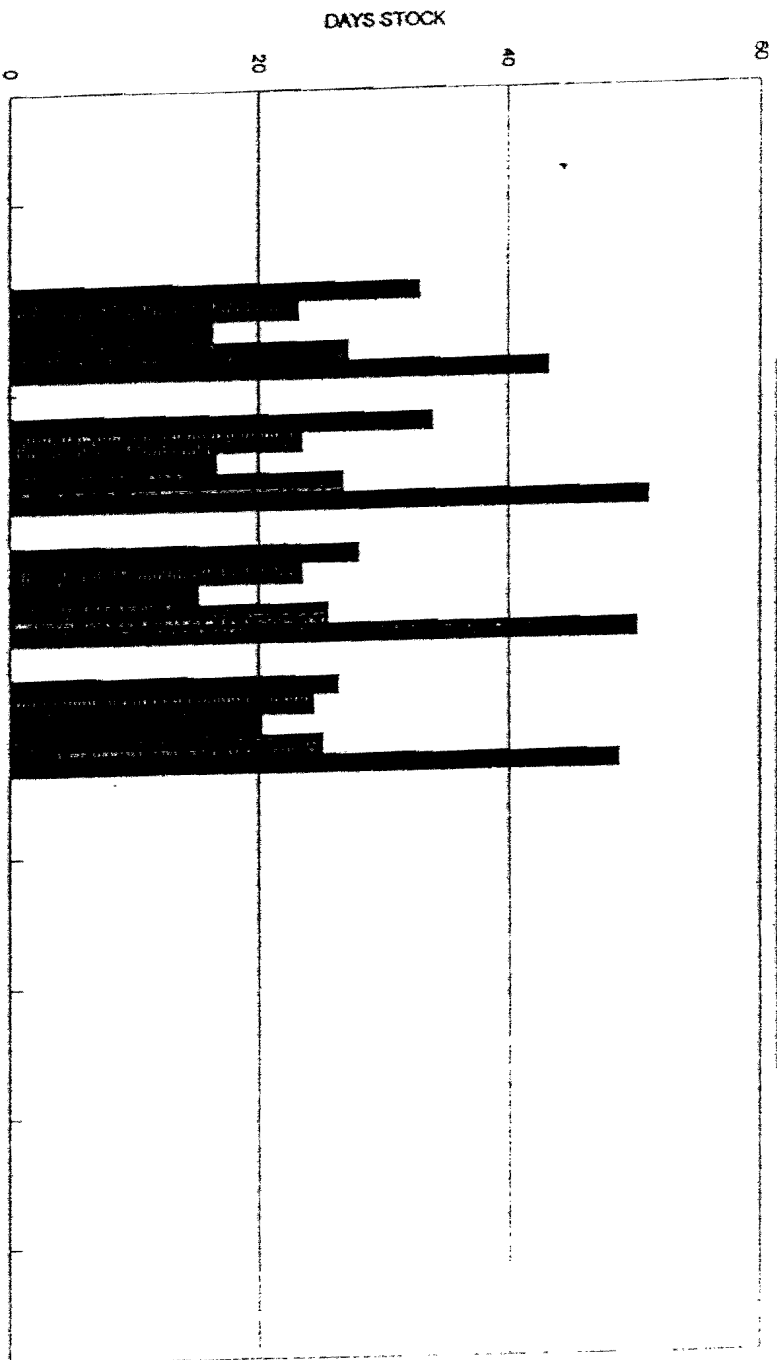



2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. MR. PIERRE CLAVER RWANGABO, THE PREFECT OF BUTARE, WAS ASSASSINATED ON SATURDAY EVENING AT 9.00 PM AT MWURIRE, IN MBAZI COMMUNE, IN BUTARE PREFECTURE, BY FIVE UNIDENTIFIED GUNMEN. MR RWANGABO, WHO WAS ONE OF THE SENIOR LEADERS AND CHAIRMAN OF THE SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY (PDS), WAS ON HIS

WAY HOME FROM A WORKING MISSION IN KIGALI. HIS ELDEST SON KWIHANGANA, AND HIS DRIVER WERE ALSO KILLED, WHILE AN RPA ESCORT SOLDIER WAS WOUNDED AND IS CURRENTLY IN BUTARE HOSPITAL. THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, ALONG WITH SEVERAL OTHER MINISTERS, VISITED THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT AND MADE STATEMENT CONDEMNING THE ASSASSINATION. THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA, MR PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, SENT A MESSAGE OF CONDOLENCE TO MADAM AGNES RWANGABO.

B. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL, AMBASSADOR KHAN, ACCOMPANIED BY SEVERAL OTHER UN OFFICIALS, ATTENDED MR. RWANGABO'S FUNERAL SERVICE IN BUTARE.

C. THE REPUBLIC OF GHANA CELEBRATED ITS NATIONAL AND INDEPENDENCE DAY WITH A MILITARY PARADE IN KIBUNGO. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, WAS IN ATTENDANCE AND GENERAL TOUSIGNANT, THE UNAMIR FORCE COMMANDER, OFFICIATED AT THE MEDALS CEREMONY.

D. A CABINET MEETING WAS HELD IN KIGALI UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU DURING WHICH A DECISION WAS MADE TO INSTITUTE A FLOATING EXCHANGE RATE WHICH WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE RWANDAN NATIONAL BANK AND THE RELEVANT INDEPENDENT FOREIGN CURRENCY EXCHANGE OFFICES. THE INSTITUTION OF A FLOATING CURRENCY WAS A CONDITION IMPOSED BY THE EUROPEAN UNION AS PART OF ITS PROGRAMME OF ASSISTANCE. THE FLOATING RATE WILL GO INTO EFFECT ON 14 MARCH, 1995.

E. A PRESIDENTIAL DECREE HAS BEEN ISSUED BANNING THE EXCHANGE OF FOREIGN CURRENCY ON THE BLACK MARKET.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) IN SECTOR 1, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OF AREA AROUND BYUMBA CAMP IMMEDIATELY AFTER HEARING THE EXPLOSIONS AT 060200 HRS AND DETAINED MANY PERSONS INCLUDING 15 LOCAL WORKERS OF BROWN AND ROOT, WHO WERE LATER RELEASED, FOR QUESTIONING. THE RPA HAS GIVEN ORDERS FOR THE ARREST OF ANY STRANGERS IN THE LOCALITY. AT 1615 HRS, THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KIBALI ARRESTED FIVE GIRLS WHO HAD COME FROM KIGALI TO THE NEIGHBOURING VILLAGE OF BUHAMBE GR 0426 TO MEET SOLDIERS. RPA HAS ESTABLISHED A CHECK POINT IN BYUMBA TOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TPS DEPLOYED IN CONNECTION WITH THE PRESIDENT'S TRIP TO BUTARE WERE VERY UNFRIENDLY TOWARDS THE LOCALS. THEY ALSO FIRED SEVERAL SHOTS. NO CAS WERE REPORTED.

(3) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA SECTION AT NYAMIGINA GR 455235, AT 051800 HRS MAR 95, OPENED

FIRE AT THE DPC AND KILLED 03 PEOPLE. ZAMBATT HAS REINFORCED ITS TPS IN THE AREA. REASONS FOR SHOOTING NOT KNOWN.

(4) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA TRAINING IN KIBUYE IS IN PROGRESS.

(5) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA WERE SEARCHING ALL VEHS AT THEIR CHECK POINTS BETWEEN GISENYI AND RUHengeri.

B. FRGF. NTR.

C. MILITIA. IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT ONE LOCAL MALE AGED 56 OF KIVU COMMUNE, MGANZA SECTOR REPORTED THAT HE AND HIS WIFE AGED 36 WERE ATTACKED BY BANDITS ON 052300B MAR 95. THE BANDITS STOLE 350,000 FRANCS, 4000 KG BEANS, 400 KG SORGHUM, 500 KG POTATOES AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS. THE MAN WAS SEVERELY STABBED IN THE CHEST, WHILE THE WIFE RECEIVED MATCHETE WOUND ON THE LEFT HAND.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDER DIRECTED DEBATE WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF ON THE APPARENT CHANGE IN SECURITY WITHIN RWANDA WHICH WAS UNDERScoreD BY THE SERIOUS EVENTS WHICH OCCURRED IN BUTARE AND BYUMBA OVER THE WEEKEND. THE DFC RELATED THAT EVENTS OF A SIMILAR NATURE PRE-DATED THE CIVIL WAR OF A YEAR AGO. LATER IN THE MORNING A SIZEABLE DELEGATION LED BY THE FC AND THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE AWARD OF THE UNAMIR MEDAL TO GHANBATT II AT KIBUNGO. IN HIS SPEECH THE FC COMMENDED THE BN FOR AN OUTSTANDING EFFORT TO DATE AND ALSO REMINDED THE ASSEMBLY THAT ON THE 38TH ANNIVERSARY OF GHANA'S INDEPENDENCE, WE SHOULD ALL REFLECT ON THE LARGE CONTRIBUTION THE NATION HAD GIVEN TO THE FURTHERANCE OF PEACE THROUGHOUT THE WORLD.

(3) THE FC CONCLUDED HIS DAY WITH A VISIT BY A TWO-PERSON DELEGATION FROM CANADA REPRESENTING GOVERNMENTAL AND NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS. THEY ARE IN RWANDA TO WORK WITH THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE AND ASSOCIATED DEPARTMENTS TO REFORM AND REJUVENATE THE NATION'S JUDICIAL SYSTEM.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) A CLOSE LOOK AT THE GUARD POST AFTER YESTERDAY'S INCIDENT REVEALED THAT 3 X HAND GRENADES WERE LOBBED AT THE GUARD POST. THE RPA COMD IN BYUMBA WAS

CONTACTED WHEN THE INCIDENT OCCURRED. AT ABOUT 060530B MAR 95, ABOUT 50 RPA TPS MOVED INTO THE VILLAGES AROUND THE CAMP. THE RPA COMD AND SUB PREFECT OF BYUMBA PAID A VISIT TO NIBATT COMD. RPA COMD CFM A CORDON AND SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED IN NEARBY VILLAGES AND UNCONFIRMED NUMBER OF LOCALS WERE ARRESTED.

(3) AN ACCIDENT INVOLVING A BUS AND A BICYCLE RIDER OCCURRED BETWEEN NYAGATARE AND KAGITUMBA BORDER. 02 WERE KILLED AND 30 OTHERS WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED. VICTIMS EVAC BY NIBATT PTL TEAM TO NYAGATARE HOSPITAL.

(4) THERE WAS A GRENADE EXPLOSION IN NYAGATARE GR 378570. OTHER GRENADES WERE SEEN IN THE AREA. THE AREA HAS BEEN MARKED FOR EOD TEAM DISPOSAL ACTION.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 20 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) REF OUR SITREP OF 23 FEB 95 PARA 4C (6) REGARDING THE ARREST OF A FATHER AND SON AT RUKIRA. THE WIFE CONTACTED THE RUKIRA BOURGMESTRE AND WAS TOLD THAT HER HUSBAND WAS BELIEVED TO BE PRESIDENT OF RUKIRA COMMUNE HUTU ASSOCIATION AND HAD ORGANISED FUNDS TO BE SENT TO COUNTERPARTS OUTSIDE THE COUNTRY FOR AN ATTACK ON RWANDA. HIS BROTHER WAS ALSO BELIEVED TO BE THE SECRETARY OF THE SAME ASSOCIATION. THE BOURGMESTRE WAS NOT HAPPY THAT SHE HAD REPORTED THE INCIDENT TO UNAMIR. THE BOURGMESTRE HOWEVER PROMISED TO ARRANGE FOR HER TO VISIT HER HUSBAND WHO IS BELIEVED TO BE IN RUKIRA COMMUNE CELL.

(3) GHANBATT CELEBRATED NATIONAL/MEDAL DAY AT GHANBATT HQ LOC KIBUNGO ON 06 MAR 95. IN ATTENDANCE WERE THE FC, DFC, MEDAL DELEGATION FROM GHANA AND STAFF OFFICERS FROM UNAMIR HQ.

(4) 19 IDPs FROM GIKONGORO SECTOR 4A AND 26 FROM NDERA WERE RECEIVED AT NGENDA AND RILIMA ORCs RESPECTIVELY. THEY WERE REGISTERED AND CONVEYED IN GHANBATT VEHs TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES.

(5) 18 DPs FROM BURUNDI WERE RECEIVED BY OWN TPS AT BARE GR 5347. THEY ARE YET TO BE CONVEYED TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 6 LOCALS IN AOR.

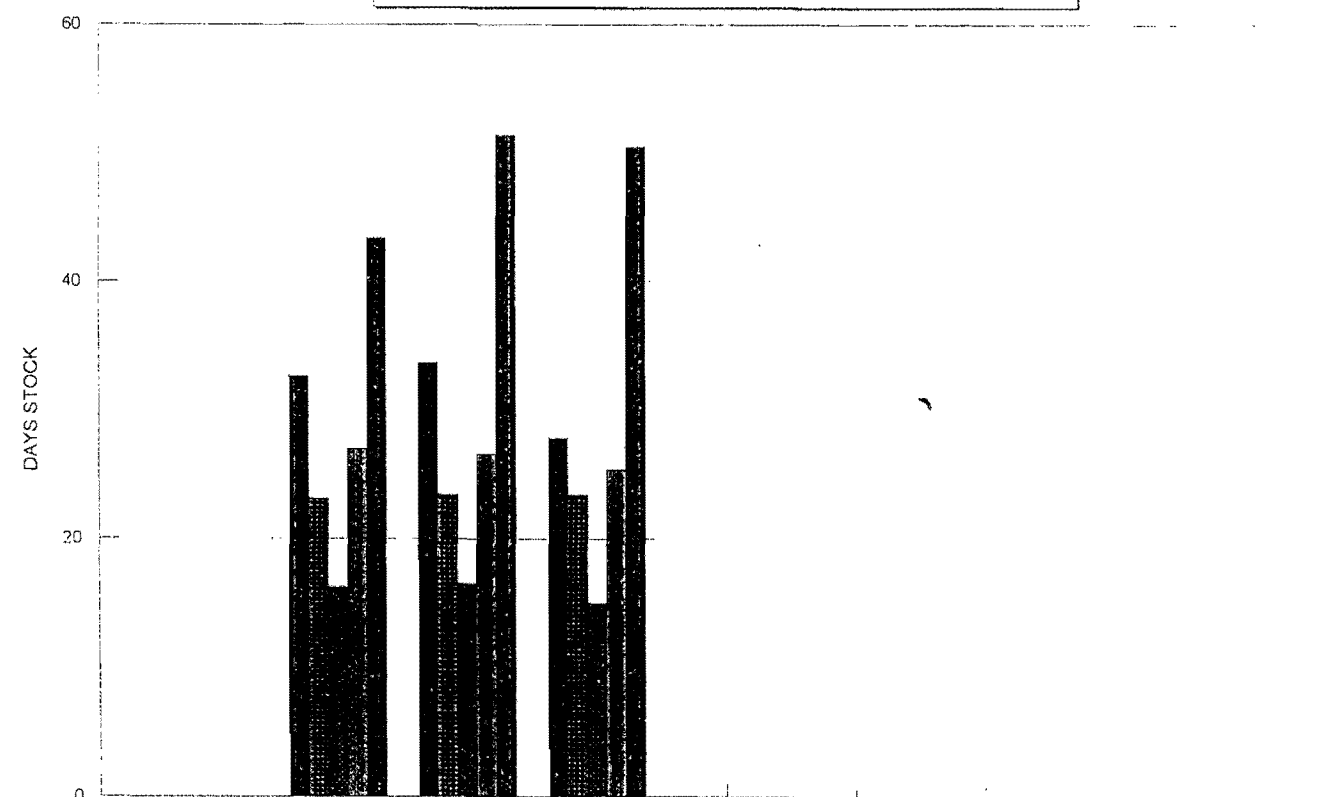

IT WAS ASSESSED THAT THE ASSASSINATION MIGHT BE USED BY THE RPA TO INTRODUCE FURTHER REPRESSIVE MEASURES AGAINST THE CIVIL POPULATION UNDER THE GUISE OF TIGHTENING SECURITY.

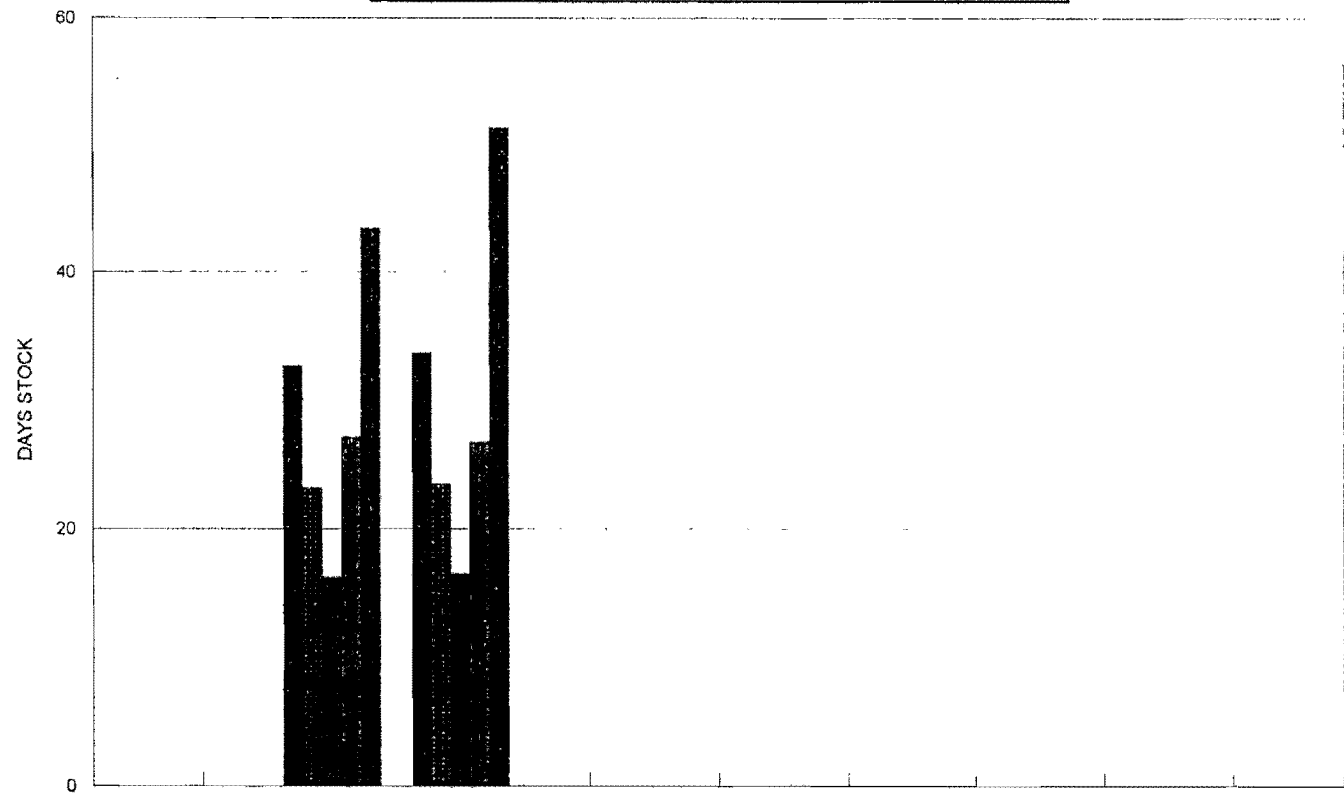

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE UNDER CONTROL.

B. IN SECTOR 3, TAC HQ REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 042100B MAR 95 THE PREFECT OF BUTARE AND TWO OTHERS ACCOMPANYING HIM WERE KILLED IN AN AMBUSH BY UNKNOWN PERSONS AT SAVE GR 7419. HIS RPA ESCORT WAS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

C. THE MINISTERS OF JUSTICE AND DEFENCE VISITED KIBUYE PRISON TO ASSESS THE CONDITIONS IN THE PRISON. THE MINISTERS WERE ACCOMPANIED BY HUMAN RIGHTS AND ICRC OFFICIALS. IT WAS PROPOSED THAT A NEW PRISON WAS TO BE CONSTRUCTED TO REDUCE THE CONGESTION CURRENTLY EXISTING IN THE PRISON AND TO CATER FOR FUTURE ARRESTS. HUMAN RIGHTS AND ICRC EXPRESSED THE OPINION THAT THE SOLUTION LAY IN THE SPEEDY DISPOSAL OF PENDING CASES AND NOT IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW PRISON FACILITIES.

A. A CABINET MEETING WAS HELD IN KIGALI UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA. THE CABINET DISCUSSED THE PLAN TO PRIVATISE GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND PARASTATAL COMPANIES.

B. TWO LOCAL ADMINISTRATORS IN GIKONGORO PREFECTURE, THE FORMER ACTING BOURGMESTRE OF RUKONDO COMMUNE AND THE FORMER ACTING BOURGMESTRE OF NYAMAGABE COMMUNE, HAVE BEEN ARRESTED ON SUSPICION OF PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE.

C. MADAM ANNONCIATA CYUBAHIRO, WHO HEADS THE RWANDAN ASSOCIATION AVEGA AND WHO HERSELF WAS WIDOWED AS A RESULT OF THE GENOCIDE, CRITICISED UNAMIR TROOPS FOR HAVING REMAINED INDIFFERENT WHILE THEY PATROLLED THE STREETS WHEN MASSACRES WERE BEING PREPARED AND PERPETRATED AND FOR HAVING GUARDED THE AIRPORT THROUGH WHICH MANY ARMS WERE SMUGGLED.

(3) AT 050345B MAR 95, 20 RPA SOLDIERS IN 2 VEHS, LED BY 2/LT WENT TO UNAMIR FILLING STATION AND ASKED FOR A WEAPON AND AMMUNITION FROM THE SENTRY ON DUTY. THE SENTRY PRETENDED HE DID NOT UNDERSTAND A WORD OF WHAT THE RPA OFFICER WAS SAYING, ON WHICH THE RPA OFFR EXPLAINED HIS INTENTIONS BY GESTICULATING. MEANWHILE THE GD COMD RUSHED TO THE SITE OF THE INCIDENT AFTER INFORMING INDBATT HQ OF WHAT WAS GOING ON. HOWEVER ON SEEING THE GD COMD, THE RPA PERSONNEL DROVE AWAY. MEANWHILE THE INDBATT HAD INFORMED DUTY OFFR UNAMIR HQ OF THE INCIDENT AND THE RRF WAS MOBILISED. THE RRF REACHED THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT AT ABOUT 0400 HRS

AND STAYED ON TILL 0500 HRS, BUT THE RPA VEHS NEVER RETURNED.

THE PATROL WAS GIVEN NAMES OF 30 PERSONS ARRESTED BY THE SOLDIER AND IT WAS ALLEGED THAT ABOUT 100 PERSONS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THIS SOLDIER ALONE. MILOBS WERE PROVIDED WITH THE NAME OF THE SOLDIER AND WILL TAKE UP THE MATTER WITH THE RPA BDE COMD IN GITARAMA. IT IS ALSO INTENDED TO SEARCH JAILS IN THE SECTOR TO FIND THE MISSING PERSONS.

(C) MILOBS ESCORTED HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS TO CONFIRM THE LOCATION OF A PREVIOUSLY UNDISCOVERED MASS GRAVE SITE IN RUTOBWE GR 7681. LOCALS INTERVIEWED IN THE MARA SECTOR GR 115875 INFORMED MILOBS THAT THE MILITIA WHO WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THOSE MURDERS WERE SLOWLY BEING HUNTED DOWN. NO FURTHER DETAILS WERE GIVEN.

(D) A PATROL TO THE NYAKIZU COMMUNE GR 5696 AND GISHAMVU GR 6505 HELD A CONFERENCE WITH THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER. REPORT TO BE SUBMITTED SEPARATELY.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN THE AOR.

(B) PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN DPCs AND BORDER POSTS IN THE SECTOR, AS PART OF OPS RETOUR AND RUBY. TWO MASS GRAVES, AROUND THE MUKO COMMUNE OFFICE CONTAINING AN ESTIMATED 8,000 CORPSES WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN EXHUMED RECENTLY. LOCAL AUTHORITIES INTEND TO REBURY THE

CORPSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH LOCAL TRADITIONS AND CUSTOMS. A SIMILAR EXERCISE IS INTENDED TO TAKE PLACE IN KADUHA GR 468420.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE DCMO VISITED THE SECTOR DURING THE PERIOD. HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE SECTOR COMD AND HQ STAFF. THE DCMO ALSO MET WITH OFFICIALS OF UNHCR AND HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS.

(C) MILOBS HELD A CONFERENCE WITH SUB-PREFECT OF KIBUYE. THE SUB-PREFECT REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF 387 RETURNEES IN KIBUYE AWAITING TRANSPORT TO GISENYI AND CYANGUGU. MENTION WAS ALSO MADE OF CONFLICT OF OWNERSHIP OF PROPERTY BETWEEN 1959 RETURNEES AND THE LOCALS. THE PREFECT ALSO INFORMED MILOBS THAT MEDICS AT THE KIBUYE HOSPITAL HAD BEEN GIVEN 15 DAYS TO ACQUIRE ATTESTATION FROM THEIR HOME COMMUNES FOR THEIR NON-INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE. 28 CHILDREN FROM THE ORPHANAGE WERE REPORTED TO HAVE RE-UNITED WITH THEIR FAMILIES DURING THE LAST WEEK.

(B) A MILOB PATROL TO BUSHENGO (GR 2016) REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 03/04 MAR 95, A GANG OF ABOUT 10 BANDITS, ARMED WITH MACHETES RAIDED THE VILLAGE AND STOLE CATTLE AND VALUABLES BELONGING TO THE LOCALS. 4 LOCALS WERE KILLED AND ANOTHER INJURED IN THE ATTACK. NO ARRESTS WERE MADE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED THE FIRING OF SHOTS AROUND THE KING FAISAL HOSPITAL IN THE KACYIRU COMMUNE AROUND 1745 HRS. RPA GUARDS ON DUTY IN THE AREA CONFIRMED THE FIRING BUT WERE UNWILLING TO PROVIDE ANY FURTHER DETAILS. NO CAS WERE REPORTED.

(C) PATROLS TO NDERA WAY STATION AND RUBUNGO PRISON FOUND 942 IDPs AT THE NDERA CAMP AND 102 PRISONERS AT RUBUNGO CAMP.

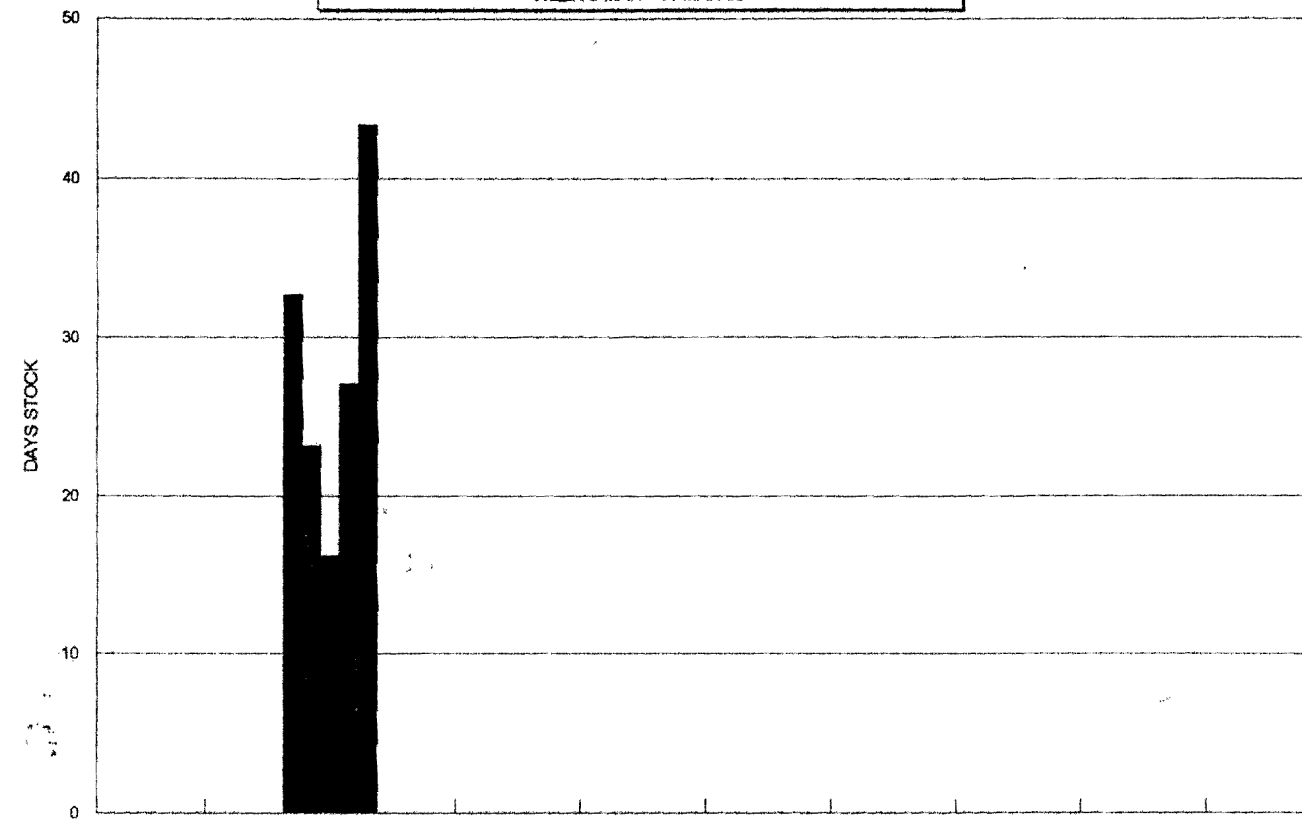

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE UNDER CONTROL.

B. SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA SHOT AND KILLED ONE LOCAL ON 02 MAR 95 ON THE BANKS OF LAKE KIVU. THE RPA ALLEGED THAT HE WAS MEETING BANDITS AT THAT LOCATION. ANOTHER REPORT BY ANOTHER LOCAL INDICATED THAT THE DECEASED OFTEN CROSSED THE LAKE TO IJWI ISLAND. INVESTIGATIONS STILL IN PROGRESS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, HELD A MEETING WITH AMBASSADOR ACHIM KRATZ, THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE EUROPEAN UNION, DURING WHICH THEY DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION IN RWANDA AS WELL AS THE UPCOMING VISIT OF AN EU DELEGATION. HE THEN GRANTED AN INTERVIEW TO CNN ON THE OVERALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY.

B. A DEMONSTRATION IN HONOUR OF THE VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE WAS HELD TODAY IN KIGALI BY THE RWANDAN ASSOCIATION FOR HUMAN RIGHTS. THE MARCH BEGAN AT SAINT FAMILLE CHURCH AND ENDED AT KIGALI CENTRAL HOSPITAL, WHERE SKELETONS OF VICTIMS OF THE MASSACRES WERE RECENTLY EXHUMED.

C. LT COL LAURENT MUNYAKAZI, THE COMMANDER OF THE RWANDAN NATIONAL GENDARMERIE UNDER THE REGIME OF THE EXILED RWANDAN GOVERNMENT, RETURNED HOME FROM ZAIRE WHERE HE HAD COMMANDED A 5,000-SOLDIER CAMP AT BOLONGE, IN THE BUKAVU AREA. LT COL MUNYAKAZI DISMISSED THE RUMOUR THAT THE EXILED RWANDAN ARMY WAS PLANNING AN IMMINENT ATTACK ON RWANDA.

D. THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, HELD TALKS WITH THE DEPUTY REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNHCR IN RWANDA, MR. ABDELAZIK EZAYED, WHO INFORMED HIM THAT THE UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, MR. AYALA LASSO, WOULD VISIT RWANDA FROM THE 27TH TO THE 29TH OF MAR 95. THE UNHCR REPRESENTATIVE ASKED THE GOVERNMENT TO PUBLISH THE LIST OF THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR MASSACRES IN RWANDA. HE ALSO INFORMED THE FOREIGN MINISTER THAT 80 HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS WERE DEPLOYED THROUGHOUT RWANDA, EXCEPT IN THE PREFECTURE OF BYUMBA, AND THAT BY THE END OF MAR 95, A TOTAL OF 110 MONITORS WOULD BE DEPLOYED IN RWANDA.

E. THE MINISTER FOR FAMILY AND WOMEN'S PROMOTION, MISS ALOYSIE INYUMBA, OFFICIATED AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF THE TWO-DAY SEMINAR ON ASSISTANCE FOR VICTIMS OF RAPE IN KABUSUNZU, IN KIGALI.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) IN SECTOR 2, A LOCAL REPORTED TO GHANBATT HQ AT KIBUNGO GR 5961 THAT 2 RPA SOLDIERS WHO FORCIBLY COLLECTED 4,000 AMAFARANGA FROM HIM CAME LATER TO ARREST HIM FOR LOOTING DURING THE WAR. PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE LOCAL, WHOSE FATHER WAS HELD AT KABARONDO LOCAL CELL HAD ESCAPED. THE PROSECUTOR OF KIBUNGO HAS ORDERED THE BOURGMESTRE OF KABARONDO TO INVESTIGATE AND SUBMIT REPORT. THE LOCAL IS CURRENTLY UNDER GHANBATT PROTECTION AT KIBUNGO.

(2) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED THE ARRESTS OF AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF SMUGGLERS BY RPA FOR ALLEGEDLY USING UNAUTHORISED ROUTES TO AVOID PAYING TAXES ON

GOODS IMPORTED INTO THE COUNTRY. THE SMUGGLERS ARE CURRENTLY HELD AT REMERA UNTIL THE APPROPRIATE CUSTOM DUTIES ARE PAID. AN FRGF SOLDIER WAS ALSO ARRESTED DURING THE PERIOD.

(3) THE RPA IN COLLABORATION WITH ZAMBATT TROOPS ARRESTED A FRGF SOLDIER, MR INNOCENT NYIRMANA, OF NYAKIZU COMMUNE (GR 5796) AT RUNYOMBI GR 4892 FOR UNSPECIFIED REASONS. THE SOLDIER WAS EVAC UNDER ZAMBATT ARRANGEMENTS TO GIKONGORO PRISON.

THEY ALSO TIED TWO MEN UP, BEAT THEM AND THREATENED TO RETURN AND REPEAT THE ACTION ON OTHER INHABITANTS. THE VICTIMS IDENTIFIED TWO OF THE BANDITS BY NAME. ONE A FORMER INTERAHAMWE AND THE OTHER AN FRGF SOLDIER. SECTOR MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(2) ETHIOBATT PTL TO NYAMASHEKE REPORTED THAT ARMED FRGF SOLDIERS IN MILITARY UNIFORM FROM ZAIRE ATTACKED LOCALS IN NYAMASHEKE AND STOLE LIVESTOCK AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS ON 02 MAR 95. AT MWITO GR 8634 THE PTL WAS ALSO INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT FRGF SOLDIERS STOLE SOME MONEY FROM THE VILLAGERS AND ABDUCTED ONE CIVILIAN. NO ARRESTS WERE REPORTED. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

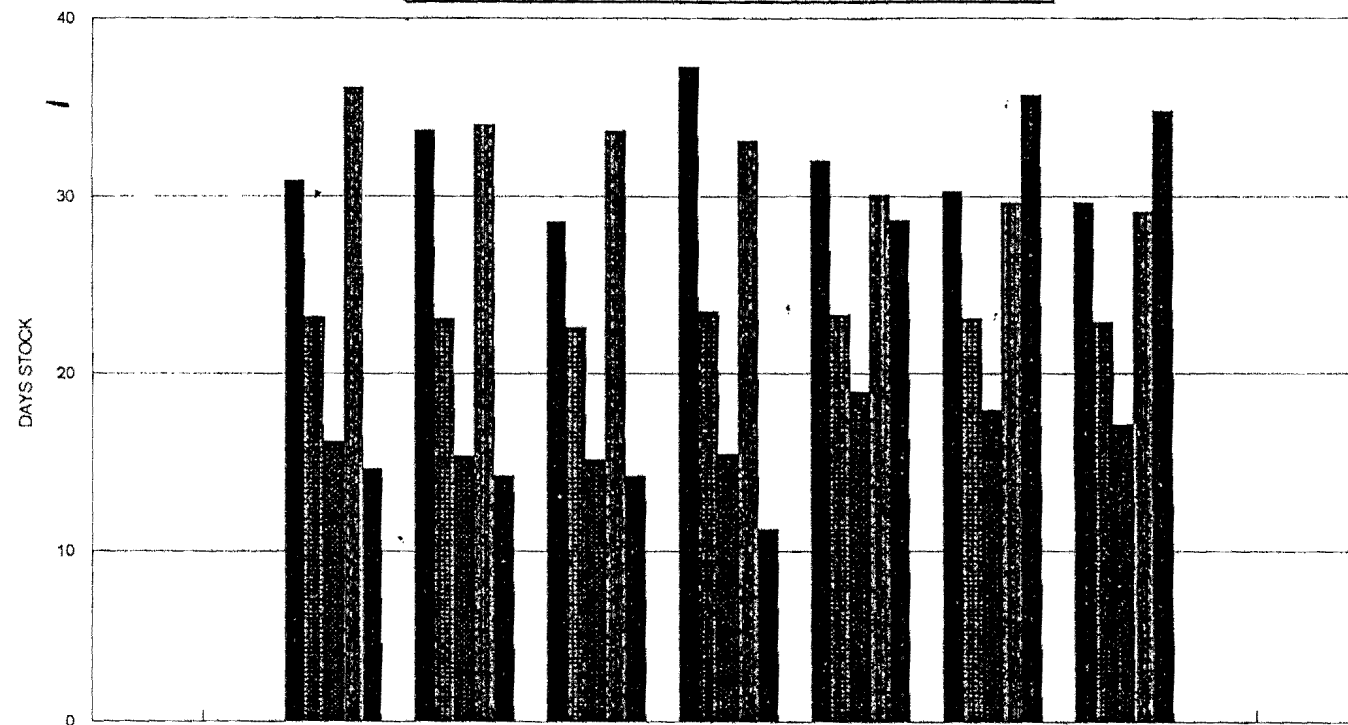
