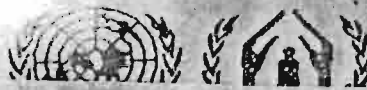

Overview of last week's incidents:

27/9 Hostage taking Several women were taken hostage in Mugunga camp suspected to support refugees to return to Rwanda.

28/9 Hostage threat in Camp Kituku In the morning Caritas International reported that in Kituku camp threats were issued to take Caritas and UNHCR staff hostage. Reason: discontent about inadequacy food supplies, particularly beans. Both agencies decided to avoid Kituku for the next 48 hours.

ARC driver arrested ARC requested UNHCR assistance to discuss the arrest of one of their drivers by the Gendarmerie. Reason: the driver was unable to show his original assurance papers. (The policeman involved would have harassed the same driver regularly by asking money and by taking in the originals if the money is not paid.) Driver was released.

Tense situation in Katale Camp At the end of the day field officers report a tense situation in Kattali. Militia have started to control the whole camp area. Their object seems to be to drive the scouts out of their "powerful" position as traffic controllers.

29/9 Roadblock in Kibumba After a theft of a bicycle in Kibumba camp a confrontation between two groups leads to a roadblock for a short time just south of the UNHCR location. An UNHCR intervention is responded by throwing stones. After this incident the situation calms down.

Medical care in Goma Assist UK reports to have transported a victim of a (one sided) road accident (to avoid a collision with their truck) to the hospital in Virunga. A doctor, who happened to be a brother of the victim, gave first aid to the patient, "confiscated" the passport of the driver and finished his treatment by beating up the interpreter of Assist UK.

Person killed in Katale The situation in Katale continued to be tense after a militia have been killed last night. Militia had roadblocked the main roads and were controlling the whole area. All relief traffic was advised to avoid the area. Senior field officer, commissaire de Zone a.o. negotiated with

the "president" of the militia about the release of the two scouts. They agreed on the transport of both scouts to the Gendarmerie in Rutshuru for further investigation. At 13.00 hrs the situation in Katale was back to normal.

Pillage by Rwandese refugees? The coordinator of a private school in Goma reports the looting yesterday by Rwandese refugees of all books, blackboards and furniture (est. \$ 18 000) out of his school. A survey at the spot did raise some questions about the indicated events. The case is handed over to "Social".

30/9 NGO's organizations leave Katale In the morning, after Care Canada had found out that militia were in complete control of Katale camp and that they were searching for two of their reliefworkers, nearly all relief organizations (Care, Concern, Assist UK a.o. left Katale and gathered in Rutshuru. Round 14.00 hrs, after having received the information that not two but seven relief workers were targeted by the militia, they left Rutshuru going northbound in the direction of the Uganda border. Later MSF Holland, situated in the southern part of the camp, had their expatriates returned to Goma. Since 8.30 hrs all relief traffic was advised to avoid the Katale area.

NGO's and UNHCR back in Kituku Today the senior field officer, the protection officer, the commissaire de Zone. Col. Tafua (Gendarmerie) and Caritas met (after 48.00 hrs) with the refugees leaders in Kituku camp to discuss the threats against the Caritas staff. After all "misunderstandings" were cleared all parties agreed on continuing all operations in good cooperation.

02/10 Evacuees arrive in Kabale Uganda Confirmation was received that the 80 evacuees of Katale safely arrived in Kabala, Uganda.

Discussions with refugee leaders in Rumangabo Security was provided to (UNHCR and Care) representatives discussing the security situation and other problems in Katale in Victoria Camp Rumangabo from 07.00-19.00 hrs.

Handgrenade explodes The Swedish Rescue Board reports an accident with a handgrenade in Rumangabo last night. The "owner" died shortly after the accident.

Shooting at the road to Mugunga At 05.00 hrs heavy shooting was reported between Goma and Mugunga. An assesment at 05.15 hrs learned that the situation was calme. No evidence was even found that there had been any incident.

1. In response to concerns expressed by the Force Commander to UN HQ regarding RPA activities in DP Camps, UN HQ has indicated that UNAMIR should continue its efforts to discourage the Government of Rwanda from forcibly closing the IDP Camps.
2. UN HQ further instructed that, UNAMIR should not try to stop the forcible closure of IDP camps if the Government undertakes to do so. UNAMIR should however, make every effort to ensure that innocent civilians are escorted safely to their home communes and upon their return provide protection and humanitarian assistance to which they are entitled under the UNAMIR mandate.

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


1. PLEASE REFER TO YOUR MEMO - INFO COLLECTION 002, ACCORDING TO WHICH INFORMATION IS REQUIRED FOR FC BY 27 MAR 95.

2. SINCE THE SUBJECT OF REFUGEE OUTFLOW FROM RWANDA INTO BURUNDI HAS BEEN RAISED, I CONSIDER IT PERTINENT TO TO POINT OUT SOME OBSERVATIONS ON THIS AS AN INTERIM REPORT.

3. THE MOVEMENT OF REFUGEES FROM RWANDA INTO BURUNDI IS OF TWO TYPES. FIRSTLY THE MOVEMENT OF RWANDESE NATIONALS INTO CAMPS IN BURUNDI, ACROSS THE BORDER. THIS MOVEMENT IS NOT REGISTERED BY UNHCR WITHIN RWANDA AND IS ILLEGAL MOVEMENT ACROSS THE BORDER AS A RESULT OF THE SECURITY SITUATION AT ANY GIVEN TIME. THE REFUGEES ARE REGISTERED WHEN THEY ENTER CAMPS IN BURUNDI. THERE ARE 5 SUCH CAMPS LOCATED AT KAYANZA, NGOZI, KIRUNDO, MUYINGA AND CIBITOKI. THE SECOND IS MOVEMENT OF REFUGEES OF BURUNDI ORIGIN WHO HAD SOUGHT REFUGE IN RWANDA OVER A PERIOD OF TIME SINCE AS EARLY AS 1972. THESE REFUGEES ARE BEING REGISTERED BY THE UNHCR AND ARE BEING TRANSPORTED BACK TO BURUNDI. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT A TOTAL OF 3000 SUCH REFUGEES ARE STILL UNREGISTERED BUT LIVING IN RWANDA AS FREE LIVERS.

4. AS PER INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM UNHCR, A TOTAL OF 8865 REFUGEES OF RWANDESE ORIGIN HAVE ENTERED THE 5 CAMPS ACROSS THE BORDER IN THE 11 WEEKS OF 1995 THUSFAR. THIS MOVEMENT IS CONSIDERED TO BE UNDETECTED AND TAKES PLACE ACROSS THE STRETCH OF BORDER AND MOSTLY AT NIGHT AND IS THUS DIFFICULT FOR UNAMIR FORMED TROOPS AND MILOBS TO DETECT. PERHAPS IT IS THESE FIGURES OF MOVEMENT WHICH HAVE BEEN REFERRED TO BY THE UN AGENCIES AND NGOS IN THEIR REPORTS. THIS APPEARS TO BE AUTHENTICATED BY THE FACT THAT IN MARCH 95 ALONE 3797 SUCH REFUGEES HAVE BEEN REGISTERED IN THE CAMPS IN BURUNDI.

5. MILOBS GP HQ ONLY. A COPY OF FHQ MEMO IS ATTACHED FOR REFERENCE SINCE IT DOES NOT APPEAR TO HAVE BEEN ADDRESSED TO YOU. IT MAY BE USEFUL TO SEND A COPY OF THE SAME TO ALL MILOBS SECTOR HQ SINCE THIS TYPE OF INFORMATION IS FAIRLY EASILY AVAILABLE WITH THEM.



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

b. Government Activities. Government activities have direct impact on reassuring the people and assist on confidence building among them. This paragraph shall cover:

(1) The treatment of returnees by the RWANDA PATRIOTIC ARMY (RPA).

(2) Those who influence people in the sector whether they are individuals or groups whether it is the radio or word of mouth/direct conduct being used.

(3) What is the flow of rumours from camps in ZAIRE like? What is and who is the source for such rumours?

(4) Whether you are meeting the local authorities, teachers priests, doctors, NGOs and commune leaders. How many times per week.

(5) The type of resources the local authorities have to assist on their daily functions. Highlight on vehicles, office equipment, employees and finance. Verify whether employees are being paid.

(6) Outline whether the situation is deteriorating or improving. Consider criminal or sabotage incidents, human rights violations, hospital occupancy, in addition report on market activity by assessing the flow of new commodities, availability of the local authorities and informal activities within the sector ie: the frequenting of restaurants, bars and shops.

(7) The public services provided by the Government. This can be first aid, nutrition, vaccination, road construction, water and sanitation etc. You are to include the number of health centres and highlight those that are functioning or not functioning.

(8) Whether there are prisons and how many they are. Establish also whether

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there are clandestine prisons and their locations. If there is not any form of prisons outline where detainees are being held.

(9) The cooperation that exists between MILOBs and customs authorities. Also cooperation with other authorities you interact with.

- (1) Whether NGOs are assisting the Government or working counter purpose.
- (2) Whether their activities are intrusive or cooperative.
- (3) The level of cooperation between MILOBs and NGOs.

4. After compiling all this information you are required to state your source of information. As a guide, make maximum use of the authorities, NGOs, the public and please state whether you can verify your information.

5. This report is very important, we are all to strive hard to ensure it is compiled weekly and submitted to this HQ every Tuesday starting from the 06 Dec 94.





1. SITUATION. There have been increase in acts of banditry, intimidation and criminal activities especially in certain DP camps. The most affected camps are those of KIBEHO (5007) stretching to NDAHO (5201). Both the DP camps are located in sector 4A. It is imperative that firm action is taken to restore security in accordance with UNAMIR mandate. UNAMIR forces will undertake operations in cooperation with 2 RPA battalions to get rid of criminal elements from the mentioned camps/area.

2. MISSION. The MILOB GP will conduct operations in conjunction with formed troops to clear criminal elements from KIBEHO and NDAGO DP camps.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation. UNAMIR will conduct a cordon and search op in cooperation with the RPA. Two RPA bns will form the outer cordon. Seven UNAMIR companies will form the inner cordon and conduct the search with RPA identification and liaison teams. A linear oriented search will be conducted concurrently by all UNAMIR companies commencing at Kibeho. A single UNAMIR coy will be inserted at Ndago as a blocking force. A prelim op to increase the UN presence in the camps will be conducted during the planning period.

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



SUBJECT : SITUATION IN RWANDAREVIEW OF THE SITUATION

1. The situation is deteriorating throughout RWANDA. Violations are a daily event. Control of MILOB movements by RPA is still witnessed. Co-ordination between RPA and MILOBS to establish total peace and stability remains a problem in every sector. Isolated cases of MILOBS private accommodation searches by RPA have been reported. UNAMIR vehicles have been targeted by armed robbers, one is still missing. Relations between RPA and MILOBS are not improving. It must be noted that heroic actions are always jealously guarded, hence cannot be shared.

2. Banditry related incidents are now on the increase. Mass murders feature in almost every Sitrep. Looting has been witnessed throughout the country. Extortions are becoming a subject of the day. In some sectors mine warfare has been reported.

3. The RPA has not been paid and this situation might continue

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for an unpredictable time to come. While banditry activities are realized, it is difficulty to rule out RPA involvement especially with the above in mind. Infact robberies, looting, killings, assaults and extortions are related to poverty hence the likelihood of certain elements within the RPA being involved cannot be exempted.

IMPACT ON MILOBS

4. Paragraphs 1 to 3 clearly show that MILOBS can be at risk since they are vulnerable. Their vulnerability extends from security at home, in offices and during patrols. Emphasis is not only on 'bodily harm but extends to MILOBS property (UN sponsored), MILOBS private property and money. It must be noted that money is an attractive and essential commodity especially in this situation, hence might attract the perpetrators to take risks.

PREVENTIVE MEASURES

5. It is difficult to outline a solution on the predicament of the MILOB. Suggested preventive measures might assist as outlined below :

a. MILOBS are all officers. It is believed that every country devotes all efforts to produce an efficient Officers Corps. The way one portrays himself to the public must leave no doubt that his image deserves respect. Even the way one presents arguments to the public must not cause friction. We must know our limits, understand which places to frequent, people to communicate to and subjects to discuss.

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b. In the event of situation deterioration through military action, a withdrawal plan was already issued to you. Action as appropriate (PLANS 13/94 dated 21 Sep 94 refers).

c. Routine patterns during movement or patrols must be avoided. It is advised that MILOBS must always be in twos. Night movements if possible should be confined to duties only. It must be noted that UNAMIR is not mandated to patrol during the night, however it is understood that MILOBS are an essential tool on the provision of information to the Mission.

d. Since vehicles are also targeted, it is necessary to exercise caution when parking at public places and at home. A MILOB is an observer, his main task is to observe. The MILOB has an extra duty now and that is to observe his vehicle. Windows and doors must always be closed and locked no matter how much time to the minimum, one intends to spend outside the vehicle. It is also important to check your surroundings before you approach your vehicle and identify something unusual. On approaching your home during hours of darkness, do not make it a trend to just jump out of the car and open the gate.

e. Security at your residence is also essential. Try to satisfy your guests to avoid friction. Do not just employ, check for credentials. Pay them enough and create understanding and friendship. A secured home plays a

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protective function. It must be walled and have a locking gate. Always keep the gate locked. A knock is not an emergency, take your time to allow for identification before you react.

f. Offices are facilitated with very valuable equipment. These equipments need protection. Duty Officers if co-located to the office blocks can be essential security tools. For those sectors co-located with UN armed troops, the advantage through local arrangement is at their disposal, this could be exploited.

Sector Commanders are required to ensure that MILOBS are made aware of these essential security requirements. You are also to assess threats in your respective areas and make additional where necessary.
