OPENING REMARKS

ACTION

1. LT COL Sainz welcomed the participants to Sect 5 and expressed his pleasure in hosting this conference.
 2. The DFC\CMO, in his opening remarks, high lighted the following:
 - a. He congratulated all MILOBS of Sector 5 for the mature way in which they faced the hostile demonstration on 12 April, at the Hotel Meridien.
 - b. He explained that the Force Comd could not come due to ongoing operations in the Kibeho IDP camp.
 - c. He introduced Col Major B.Toumia, the TUNBATT contingent comd to the participants, as the DFC/CMO designate, who was slated to take over from him.
 - d. The DFC commented on the deterioration of the general situation during the week of commemoration, and highlighted the excesses committed against UNAMIR and other UN/NGO agencies. The matter has been discussed by the SRSG and the Force Comd with the Government, and the serious view taken by UNAMIR on this matter has been conveyed.
- 

e. The situation in Kibeho IDP camp has taken a turn for the worse with the Government,insisting on closing down these camps immediately. The NGOs have withdrawn from here as they do not agree with this. Though UNAMIR too, does not support the Government decision, it has decided to step in and is now carrying out operations to transport the IDPs to their communes to prevent these masses from dying in the camps.

ITEM ONE: REVIEW OF THE MINUTES OF LAST CONFERENCE

3. The SOO read out the salient points of the last conference as follows:

- a. The necessity of being alert and security conscious during the week of commemoration.
- b. The need to be accurate while reporting incidents.
- c. Necessity of initiating confidential reports in respect of MILOBS being transferred to other sectors.
- d. Information on vehicles being received from Somalia, and further allotment to MILOBS.

ITEM TWO: SECTOR BRIEFINGS

4. All Sect Comds gave out detailed briefs of their sectors. The DFC and DCMO clarified/ gave out the following points in respect of different sectors:

- a. Comd Sect 1 briefed on the closing of the Gituza subsect. The DCMO clarified that the subsect was closed since the area was isolated. The new locations, Ngarama and Nyagatare are better suited as the MILOBS are now co-located with the formed troops in these ares.
- b. In response to a request from the sect comd to transfer two communes of Kigali Prefecture presently with Sect 1, to Sect 6,the Sect Comd was asked to send out a proposal to this effect.
- c. Comd Sect 1 projected the requirement of having two base stations in Sect 1 . The same was noted.

d. Comd Sect 2 briefed the assembly about a large number of people, seeking shelter at GHANBATT, in face of mass arrests being carried out there. The CMO directed tht the guidelines laid down for handing over these people to the local authorities, should be adhered to. ALL

e. The DCMO warned Sect 2 to be prepared to receive IDPs from the camps in the South, shortly. "

f. Comd Sect 3 intimated the assembly about the searching of UN premises at Kibuye, on 19/20 April by the RPA. The CMO said that a serious view has been of the and the matter is being taken up with authorities in Kigali.

g. On the apparent misinterpretation of Sect 3a and Sect 3b as separte sects, the CMO clarified that they should be considered as one sect until orders to the contrary are issued. In this connection the CMO refered to the apparent power struggles between Sect Comds and firmly discouraged it. ALL

h. Comd Sect 3 raised the problem of office accomodation in Kibuye. The DCMO informed him that the Force Comd has spoken to the Prefect, to allow the MILOBS to share accomodation in the prefecture building. The same should be followed up. SECT3

j. Comd Sect 3 briefed the assembly regarding the ongoing operations at Kibeho camp. The critical nature of operations to shift IDPs from Kibeho camp was stressed on by the CMO. The action of MILOBS who rallied around and maintained a good flow of information, was appreciated. It is considered SECT4A desirable to maintain the same tempo till such SECT4B time the crisis is over. The DCMO clarified that Sect 4a is to receive 20 additional MILOBS during the period of this operation. The operation is to be coordinated between Sect 4a and 4b.

k. The CMO observed that IDP settlements were building up in vicinity of the ZAMBATT. This is not desirable and could give a wrong picture to the RPA, to the effect that UNAMIR is giving protection to the IDPs. The same should be rectified at the earliest. SECT 4A

l. The Comd Sect 4B stated that the road Butare - Kidaho is waterlogged over a certain portion and cannot be crossed by vehicles

transporting the IDPs. The CMO stated that it will not be possible to repair the road at short notice. The IDPs could debus at the waterlogged portion and be picked up by vehicles on the other side. SECT 4B

m. On Sect 4c's request for allotment of interpreters, the DCMO informed that MILOBS were authorised 40 and are holding 40. However efforts are on to get some more. Meanwhile the existing resources could be shared. SECT 4C

n. Sect 4C projected their shortage of vehicles. The DCMO stated that priority would be accorded to Sect 4C for allotment of vehicle. A minibus has already been allotted. "

o. Sect 5 projected that intelligence gathering tasks allotted to sectors have to be carried out informally and over a period of time. Hence it may not be always possible to meet the dead line set. This was agreed to; but it was clarified that such tasks are usually initiated at very high level and it is necessary to execute these ASAP. ALL

p. In reply to Sect 5's point that feedback regarding projects forwarded to higher hq was not forthcoming the DCMO said that the same would be looked into. Sectors must also make an effort on their own to progress things. ALL

q. Sect 5 projected that changing of key appointments in bulk without additional reaction time is detrimental to the functioning of the sect. DCMO clarified that this is not normally resorted to. However, sectors must avoid making ad-hoc appointments on their own. In case of a particular problem the issue could always be addressed to the MILOB Hq. ALL

r. The CMO took a very serious view of the car theft which took place in Kigali recently, and said that in case instructions on the subject had been violated, appropriate action would be taken. ALL

s. Sect 6 projected a shortage of radio sets. The sect was asked to work out their requirement of additional radio sets and forward the same to MILOB Hq. SECT 6

ITEM THREE: STAFF OFFICERS' BRIEF

5. SOO. The following points were given out:

- a. MILOB ops has now been co-located with Forces Hq, to facilitate work and enhance response. ALL
- b. A dedicated MILOB Gp Sig offr has been appointed to attend all communication problems within the sectors. ALL
- c. A new list of reports and returns along with prescribed format will shortly be forwarded to the sectors. ALL
- d. Mentioning of names of local sources of information in reports, should be avoided, to prevent compromising their safety, in view of the lax security prevailing in the offices. ALL
- e. Timely reporting of information is extremely important to enable appropriate action to be taken at higher hq. ALL
- f. A seminar on int collection techniques will be held for all ops o on 26 April 95. ALL
- g. To improve the awareness of MILOBS, the UNAMIR infosum and other important incident reports will be sent to all sects and should be disseminated. ALL
- h. New helicopter request forms, requiring manifesting of passengers in advance, have been given out, and the same should be adhered to. There may be a cut in helipatrols to other sectors, in view of the ongoing operations at Kibeho.

SMPO

6. The following points were covered:

- a. Overstayal of leave by MILOBS would henceforth be monitored by MILOB Hq by calling for daily flight manifests. MSA would be deducted for the period of absence and explanations would be asked for. ALL
- b. All concerned coming to Kigali must make it a point to visit the MILOB GP Hq and collect official mail. ALL

- c. The next rotation of MILOBS would take place by end of June. This will give adequate reaction time to train replacements for appointment holders. ALL
- d. The next medal parade will tentatively be held in the first week of June. ALL
- e. In order to bid farewell to the outgoing DCMO and other MILOBS leaving in May, a dinner will be organised at hotel Chez Lando on 28 April. Three MILOBS from other sectors and all MILOBS in Kigali are expected to attend. The contribution would be 13 USD per head. ALL

SLOGO

7. The following points were given out:

- a. Copy of leave request forms should be sent to SLOGO in advance. ALL
- b. Frequent change of LOGO in the sectors should be avoided. "
- c. Restricted items like berets and cap badges are one time issue items and it is not possible to issue these again. "
- d. All LOGOs to forward names of MILOBS without driving license to SLOGO for further action. "
- e. Items like hand held motorolas should not be carried along by MILOBS while moving out on transfer to other sectors. Sectors should initiate clearance procedure at their end to ensure the same. ALL

CIVPOL

8. The following points were covered:

- a. The CIVPOL have been placed under comd the MILOBS for administration. Leave for the CIVPOL officers is required to be sanctioned by the MILOB Sect Comd. ALL
- b. The CIVPOL is expected to work in conjunction with the MILOBS and keep them informed about their movements. "

HAC

9. The following points were given out:

a. Office of the HAC has shifted to the Forces Hq.

b. All sects to forward names of their humanitarian teams to HAC. Weekly humanitarian sitreps are required to be submitted by all sects to HAC every Friday.

c. It is proposed to hold monthly/fortnightly humanitarian meetings at HAC, henceforth.

ITEM FOUR: CLOSING REMARKS

10. The DCMO made the following closing remarks:

a. When handing over prisoners/locals seeking shelter to prosecutors, it is necessary for the human rights and the ICRC to be present.

b. First hand report of any incident is extremely essential. The information should be given out in a steady flow, as the incident unfolds.

"

c. IDPs from camps closing down are likely to be received by different sectors shortly. It would required to be monitored.

"

d. Frequent assesment of the situation by the sect comds is highly desirable to get an idea of what actually is happening.

"

e. On the eve of his departure from the mission, the DCMO thanked everyone for their excellent cooperation, and hoped that the same would be extended to the new incumbent.

"

11. The DFC/CMO made the following closing remarks:

a. He thanked the DCMO for an excellent job done and wished him all the success. He wished safe journey to all outgoing MILOBS.

b. He emphasised on the fact that the MILOB Hq ops was only co-located and not integrated with Forces hq ops. It has facilitated operations tremendously.

c. He asked all concerned to make the dinner for the DCMO and other outgoing MILOBS a success. ALL

d. He thanked all MILOBS who contributed towards the orphans. The total contribution amounts to 4525 USD and would be donated as a MILOB contribution.

e. The CMO cautioned all concerned to restrict unnecessary vehicle movements in Rwanda and use due discretion and judiciousness while filling in trip tickets. ALL

CONCLUSION

11. The next meeting is scheduled to be held at Kigali.

1. It has been observed by this branch that your SITREPS of late contains unnecessary details which make them long for reading and tend to eclipse the required information.

2. The inclusion of names and ID numbers of members of a patrol clearly indicates that the SITREP is mistaken for a patrol report. At worst, routes could be mentioned if there is something to say about road conditions. Long stories under other headings not giving any significant information should also be avoided.

3. Importantly, care should be taken in editing the SITREP before it is sent. It is of no use to state correct names and ID numbers of members of a patrol and make unbelievable statements like donation of grenade by Australian EOD team ; reference para 4 (d) of your SITREP of 05 MAY 95.

4. Please accept for necessary and immediate corrections.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION N° 021/95

(Civilian, Military, CIVPOL and MILOBs)

SUBJECT: Security of UNAMIR Vehicles

1. Further to previous Administrative Instructions issued on this subject, the Administration notes with concern the number of UNAMIR vehicles which have been stolen recently in broad day light from the UNAMIR Headquarters compound.
2. In this connection all UNAMIR security units, including the Indian Battalion Guard Force currently providing security for the UNAMIR Headquarters and other UNAMIR premises, are required to implement the following procedures:
 - (a) All drivers of UNAMIR vehicles leaving any UNAMIR premises at any time are required to submit their identity cards to a security officer/guard at the gate, who shall check the identity photograph of each such driver against the face of the driver, record the identity number and the registration number of the vehicle, record the number of passengers, enter the time of departure, and record any other identification features that may be obvious. This is without prejudice to the identification procedure for drivers and vehicles of high ranking UNAMIR officials whose vehicles and drivers are known.
 - (b) With the exception of vehicles with ministerial or diplomatic registration numbers and vehicles belonging to UN Agencies, all non-UNAMIR vehicles leaving UNAMIR premises shall be subject to the same procedure as in (a) above, and shall also be subject to searches at the discretion of the security officers/guards.
3. All UNAMIR personnel are requested to cooperate with all security units in the enforcement of these measures towards the preservation of UN and staff personal property.





1. The water piping system around the NYAKIRAMBI Transit camp is currently under repairs and it will take not less than two weeks to complete the repairs. The camp has been without water for the past 4 days thus making life very unbearable for the refugees.

2. Currently the transit camp has over 500 old case loads and additional 200 people are expected today. The water shortage is creating a lot of concern to UNHCR and the other NGOs working at the camp.

3. It is therefore requested that arrangements be made for a water tanker to be sent once every 3 days for two weeks to alleviate the acute water shortage in the camp. In view of the seriousness of the problem, it would be appreciated if the first water tanker is despatched today to the camp before the situation gets out of hand by the close of day.

DAILY REPORT ON RADIO RWANDA PROGRAMMES

Kigali, June 1, 1995 - President Jacques Chirac of France on Wednesday sent a message of gratitude to President Pasteur Bizimungu of Rwanda for sending him a message of congratulations on the occasion of his election to be the President of France. President Chirac wishes success to President Bizimungu in his efforts to achieve national reconciliation in Rwanda and the development of the country.

- The Rwandese Minister of Tourism and Environment, Mr. Jean Népomuscene Nayinzira on Wednesday opened in Kigali a national environmental week during which a campaign of information will be conducted to sensitize the population over environment issues.

- The Rwandese Minister of Social welfare and Labour, Mr. Pie Mugabo on Wednesday visited the headquarters of BRALIRWA, the only brewing company in Rwanda. The company donated RWf 1 million in financial assistance to the Government in favour of Rwandese orphans.

- The Belgian Justice issued an international arrest warrant for three Rwandese nationals accused of being involved in genocide. One is Mr. Theoneste Bagosora, a former army colonel accused of ordering the assassination of Prime Minister Agathe Uwilingiyimana and ten Belgian paratroopers serving with UNAMIR who were guarding her, and of ordering the shooting down of the plane transporting President Habyarimana of Rwanda and President Ntaryamira of Burundi. The two others are Mr. Syvain Mutabaruka, the former head of Sake commune, and Lieutenant-Colonel Jean Ntiwiragaba, the former commander of Kigali military camp where the ten Belgian soldiers were assassinated.

- The Prefect of Kibungo on Monday presided over a meeting to discuss the security situation in Kibungo prefecture. The participants complained about the travel restrictions imposed on Rwandese nationals by Tanzania on its border post with Rwanda. Many Rwandese nationals were denied visas to enter Tanzania for unknown reasons.

DAILY REPORT ON RADIO RWANDA PROGRAMMES

Kigali, June 2, 1995 - The lawyer of Colonel Bagosora, Mr. Luc de Theonomane, has announced that his client denied the charges of ordering the assassination of Prime Minister Agathe Uwilingiyimana and ten Belgian paratroopers, and the shooting down of the plane transporting President Habyarimana of Rwanda and President Ntaryamira of Burundi. According to Radio Rwanda, Colonel Bagosora was a close collaborator of President Habyarimana and could not be unaware of the plan of genocide. Colonel Bagosora had announced at Arusha during the peace talks, that he was going to prepare an apocalypse when he returned in Kigali.

- The Roman Catholic Bishop of Kibungo, Frederick Rubwejanga, on Thursday dismissed the allegations that the Rwandese Catholic Church took part in genocide, as being unfounded. He agreed however that some Christians or Church members on individual basis took part in genocide or were suspected of being involved in genocide.

According to a communique issued after the meeting of Rwandese Catholic Bishops and priests that ended on Thursday in Kigali, Rwandese Catholic Bishops have decided to suspend the reburial ceremony for the 3 Rwandese bishops who were killed last year.

The participants in the meeting also asked for the setting up of a Church radio Station in Rwanda to teach Christian values.

- The European Union on Thursday decided to resume its assistance to Rwanda. The EU had suspended a USD 55 million in development assistance that it had pledged to Rwanda, following the Kibeho incidents.

- The Rwandese Minister of Rehabilitation and Social Integration, Mr. Jacques Bihozagara on Thursday met in Kigali members of the national commission on repatriation and resettlement of Rwandese refugees to discuss the modalities of their work.

- The World Health Organisation (WHO) on Thursday donated 2 vehicles and 7 computers equivalent to Rwf 16 million to the Rwandese Government, to be used in the health sector.

- The Prefect of Ruhengeri on Thursday presided over a security meeting in Ruhengeri. The participants expressed their concern over planted landmines that had exploded in Nkuli, Mukingo and Nyarutovu communes, destroying the pylons propping up power lines.

The participants also accused UNAMIR of offering refuge to an Interahamwe in Nyarutovu commune.

A. GITARAMA TEAM

i) THE SECTOR CDR TOGETHER WITH KIBUYE SUB SECTOR CDR HAD A HELICOPTER RECCE PATROL ALONG THE COASTAL LINE AND WITHIN KIBUYE SUB SECTOR BOUNDARIES. IT HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED THAT, ALONG THE KIBUYE LAKE KIVU SHORES IS NOT INHABITED LIFE COULD ONLY BE SEEN 2 TO 3 KM FROM THE SHORES AND ALSO THE LITTLE ISLANDS WHICH WERE INHABITED ARE NOW DESERTED.

ii) ONE TEAM WENT TO MASANGO COMMUNE 6254 AND VISITED MUYUNZWE 6260 AND GITINDA 5959 SECTORS. THE TEAM REPORTED THAT IN THE GITINDA SECTOR, LOCALS ARE STILL SUFFERING THE NIGHTMARE OF THE ARMED BANDITS WHO ARE BELIEVED TO BECOMING FROM KIBUYE PREFECTURE. IT IS ALSO BELIEVED THAT THE BANDITS ARE USING NYABARONGO RIVER AS THEIR HIDEOUT DURING DAY LIGHT. IN MUYUNZWE, IT IS SAID THE ONLY DISPENSARY WHICH CATERS FOR ALMOST 5 SECTORS HAVE 3 QUALIFIED STAFF OUT OF 18 STAFF MEMBERS. THE DISPENSARY STAFF GETS PAID FROM CARITAS AND THE GOVERNMENT. THE HOSPITAL IS IN NEED OF BEDS AND THE STAFF IS APPEALING TO UNAMIR TO PROVIDE ABOUT 20, IT HAS NO AMBULANCE AND CLEAN WATER. THE TEAM VISITED MUYUNZWE SECONDARY SCHOOL AND REPORTED THAT, MUYUNZWE IS A PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL WHICH HAS 132 STUDENTS HOUSED IN 8 CLASSES. IT HAS 13 TEACHERS OUT OF WHICH 03 ARE QUALIFIED. THE DIRECTOR OF THE SCHOOL TOLD THE TEAM THAT, THE SCHOOL LACKS SPORTING, TEACHING AIDS AND ELECTRICITY WHICH HE SAID HE IS SEEKING OUR ASSISTANCE. HE

FURTHER MENTIONED THAT THEY ARE 38 ORPHANS STUDENTS WHOM THE GOVERNMENT HAD PROMISED TO MEET THEIR SCHOOLING EXPENSES BUT UP TO NOW THERE IS NOTHING THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAS DONE ABOUT IT.

iii) A JOINT HUMAN RIGHTS AND MILOBS TEAM WENT TO RUHANGO 7653 AND NTONGWE 9057 COMMUNES. THE TEAM WAS ON A FOLLOW UP TASK OF AN ALLEGED ARRESTS BY RPA IN THE RUHANGO COMMUNE, IT WAS ESTABLISHED FROM RUHANGO BOURGMESTRE THAT MR. ELIAS MBARUBUKEYE AGED 58 YEARS WAS ARRESTED BUT DATE NOT GIVEN AND SEND TO GITARAMA PRISON. IT IS BELIEVED THAT HIS SON WHO IS STUDYING IN USA ADDRESSED A PRESS CONFERENCE IN USA AND MADE SOME SUBVERSIVE STATEMENTS THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA IS VIOLATING HUMAN RIGHTS. THE TEAM LATER VISITED MUKINDO CELLULE 8551 AND NYARURAMA SECTOR 8751 AND REPORTED THAT, LOCALS ARE LIVING FEAR DUE TO RUMORS OF THE FRGF IMPENDING INCURSION. IN NYARURAMA SECTOR, THE TEAM WAS BRIEFED BY THE SCHOOL HEADMASTER OF THEIR PROBLEMS AMONG WHICH HE SAID TEACHERS WERE LAST PAID THEIR SALARIES IN APRIL 1995 AND THAT THE SCHOOL LACKS STATIONERY, SCHOOL FURNITURE AND SPORTING ITEMS. HE ALSO INFORMED THE TEAM THAT UNICEF HAD PROMISED TO GIVE THE THEIR REQUIRED ASSISTANCE THUS IN MUCH BUT UP TO NOW UNICEF IS NOT SHOWN UP.

COMMENTS : IN THE LAST MEETING WITH PREFET OF GITARAMA THE SECTOR CDR CONSULTED HIM ABOUT THE REASONS OF THE IRREGULAR PAYMENT OF THE TEACHERS IN THE JURISDICTION AND THE ANSWER WAS THAT SOME OF THE TEACHERS DO NOT HAVE THEIR FILES COMPLETED IN THE MINISTRY AND THE ARE RECEIVING SOME MONEY BUT NOT THE COMPLETE SALARY AND THIS CIRCUMSTANCES ARE DUE THE ARRIVAL OF SOME TEACHERS FROM THE NEIGHBORING COUNTRIES AND THE BUREAUCRATIC STEPS THAT TAKE A LONG TIME TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM.

B. KIBUYE TEAM

i) THE SUB SECTOR CDR HELD A MEETING YESTERDAY WITH THE PREFET REGARDING THE SECURITY PREVAILING IN THE PREFECTURE, AND ABOUT THE THEFT OF A SWISS DISASTER RELIEF FUND VEHICLE. THE MEETING WAS ATTENDED BY THE PREFECTURE SECURITY CHIEF, THE RPA BN SECURITY OFFICER AND THE HEAD OF THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE. THE FOLLOWING MEASURES WERE INSTITUTED :

- a) RPA PATROLS IN THE CITY OF KIBUYE WILL BE INCREASED AND REINFORCED.
- b) RPA CHECK POINTS IN THE PREFECTURE WILL BE INCREASED AND REINFORCED.
- c) ALL NGOS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL WILL LIMIT THEIR MOVEMENTS PAST MIDNIGHT TO ONLY THOSE FOR REASONS OF DUTY.

d) AS SOON AS A SECURITY INCIDENT OCCURS, THE ABOVE MENTIONED SECURITY OFFICERS ARE TO BE CONTACTED SOONEST.

e) A SECURITY MEETING PRESIDED BY THE PREFET WILL TAKE PLACE ONCE A MONTH.

ii) ONE TEAM WENT TO KIVUME COMMUNE 5573 AND VISITED RUKOKU SECTOR 4772, AND REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION IS CALM. THE TEAM WAS INFORMED THAT RPA SOLDIERS STOLE 4 SHEEP AND 3 COWS IN THIS SECTOR. THE TEAM FURTHER LEARNED THAT FOUR TEACHERS WHO WERE ARRESTED SIX WEEKS AGO ARE STILL IN CUSTODY.

iii) ONE TEAM WENT TO MBOGO SECTOR 1555 AND REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION IS CALM, HOWEVER LOCALS ARE COMPLAINING OF HARASSMENT BY RPA SOLDIERS IN THE AREA. THE TEAM WAS INFORMED THAT THE TUTSIS IN THE AREA ARE COLLABORATING WITH RPA SOLDIERS IN STEALING LIVESTOCK FROM THE HUTUS. THE TEAM WAS FURTHER INFORMED THAT BANDITS FROM ZAIRE LOOTED UNDISCLOSED AMOUNT OF MONEY AND RADIO SETS FROM THE LOCALS LAST WEEK.

C. MALI COY.

i) ONE PATROL WENT TO BEMBA 9454 CELLULE AND RUTABO SECTOR 9455 AND REPORTED SITUATION IS CALM. ANOTHER TEAM WENT TO NYAKOGO 6295 AND WAS TOLD BY THE LOCALS THAT THEY ARE HAPPY ABOUT THE RENEWAL OF THE UN MANDATE. GENERAL SITUATION IS CALM.

D. MALAWI COY.

i) ONE PATROL WENT TO MBOGO SECTOR 1555 AND REPORTED THAT A GROUP OF BANDITS USUALLY COME DURING NIGHT AND ROB LOCALS OF MONEY. THESE UNKNOWN BANDITS COME FROM ZAIRE AND BEACH-LAND IN THE AREA. IT IS ALSO REPORTED THAT LOCALS LIVE IN FEAR DUE TO WIDELY SPREAD RUMORS THAT RGF IS REGROUPING IN ZAIRE WITH AN AIM OF OVERTHROWING THE PRESENT GOVERNMENT.



THE PATROL REPORTED THAT THE ROAD CONDITION WAS POOR BUT WAS PASSABLE BUT IN SOME PLACES THE TEAM HAD TO BE ASSISTED BY THE LOCALS. THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED THAT THE FOOD DISTRIBUTION AT RAMBA TOOK PLACE ON THE 24 MAY 95. THE GENERAL SITUATION IN THE AREA WAS

REPORTED CALM.

4. THE UNHCR TODAY TRANSPORTED A TOTAL OF 394 1959-60 CASE LOAD RETURNEES FROM GISENYI RECEPTION CENTER TO THEIR NEW RESETTLEMENT AREAS. A TOTAL OF 56 FAMILIES CONSISTING OF 186 PEOPLE WERE TRANSPORTED FROM GISENYI TO KIBUNGO AND A TOTAL OF 51 FAMILIES CONSISTING OF 208 PEOPLE WERE TRANSPORTED TO KIBUYE. THE CONVOYS WERE ACCOMPANIED BY TRUCKS CONSISTING OF FOOD AND NONFOOD ITEMS. THIS CONVOYS ARE THE INITIAL CONVOYS SCHEDULED BY THE UNHCR AND THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION IN THE PROCESS OF RESETTLING THE 1959-60 CASE LOAD RETURNEES AT THE EARLIEST AND EMPTYING THE COLLEGE RECEPTION CENTER AT GISENYI WITHIN A TIME SPAN OF TWO WEEKS.

- 7.B. [REDACTED] THE FAULT DOES NOT SEEM TO LIE WITH THE BASE STATION BUT IN THE INSTALLATION OF THE RADIO WHEN THE OFFICE VENUE WAS SHIFTED. THE FAULT BASICALLY LIES IN THE FEED COMING FROM THE ANTENNA AS HAS BEEN ANALYSED BY THE SIGNAL REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE FORCE SIGNAL. IT IS THEREFORE MANDATORY THAT THE COMMUNICATIONS IN THE UNAMIR HQ BE CONTACTED TO REACH THIS LOCATION ASAP AND REPAIR THE SYSTEM TO ENSURE THAT POOL PROOF COMMUNICATION IS RESTORED AT THIS HQ. AT PRESENT THERE IS A ADHOC ARRANGEMENT IMPROVISED TO KEEP THE SYSTEM GOING HOWEVER THE SAME CANNOT BE USED AS A RULE AND WOULD REQUIRE A PROMPT RESPONSE FROM THE COMMUNICATION.
- 7.C. THE STATE OF VEHICLES IN THIS SECTOR REMAINS TO BE CRITICAL. A TOTAL OF 05 VEHICLES ARE PRESENTLY IN THE WORKSHOP. THE SECTOR HQ AT GISENYI HAS ONLY THREE VEHICLES OUT OF WHICH ONE VEHICLE UNAMIR 1115 IS DUE FOR SERVICING AND IS NOT IN A POSITION TO BE USED FOR PATROLS. THEREBY LEAVING ONLY ONE VEHICLE FOR PATROL AND ONE VEHICLE FOR THE SECTOR COMMANDER. THIS EFFICIENCY OF THE WORKSHOP RESULTING IN THE VEHICLES BEING SUCKED INTO THE WORKSHOP FOR SERVICING WITHOUT ANY VISIBLE

OUTPUT IS LIKELY TO JEOPARDISE OPERATIONS IN THE SECTOR. THERE IS A URGENT NEED TO CHASE THE WORKSHOP TO SPEED UP REPAIRS OF THE SECTOR VEHICLES SO AS TO ENSURE THAT WE ARE MAINTAINED AT A ACCEPTABLE STATE OF VEHICLES SO THAT OPERATIONS ARE NOT JEOPARDISED.

THE LOCAL BN COMD VISITED LAST NIGHT AND BASICALLY CONFIRMED THAT WHICH WE ALREADY KNEW. HE EXPRESSED HIS REGRETS FOR THE INCIDENT.

B. TEAMS. ONE MILOB TEAM ON B1 ROUTE. THE SECURITY SITUATION IS REPORTED AS GENERALLY CALM. THE PATROL WAS NOT ALLOWED TO PASS THE RPA CHECK POINT AT BUTAKA (3129) AS THE SOLDIERS AT THE CHECK POINT INDICATED THAT THE FRGF HAD LAID MINES AHEAD ON THE ROAD. THEY ALSO REPORTED THAT LAST WEEK AN A/TK MINE HAD BEEN PLACED NEXT TO THE SAME CHECK POINT HOWEVER WAS DETECTED AND DEFUSED. AT BISIKERO CELLULE (3425), SEVEN COWS WERE STOLEN FROM A LOCAL, MR SEKABUGO. WHEN HE REPORTED THIS MATTER HE, ALONG WITH ONE MR ZIHABAHANI, WERE ARRESTED BY THE

RPA FOR NOT KEEPING THE COWS CLOSE TO THE RPA POSITION FOR SECURITY REASONS. THE TEAM RECEIVED CONFLICTING REPORTS REGARDING RADIO AMAHORO, IN GISHWE SECTOR (3425) THE LOCALS REPORTED THAT THE BROADCASTS INDICATE THE SITUATION IN RWANDA IS TURBULENT WITH MANY IMPRISONED AND KILLED. IN KABETWA SECTOR (3327), THE LOCALS REPORT THAT THE BROADCASTS INDICATE THAT THE SITUATION IS PEACEFUL AND THAT THE REFUGEES SHOULD RETURN. THIS WAS ALSO THE REPORT FROM MUTURA (3223).

C. ONE COMBINED MILOB AND HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO THE AREA WHERE THE RPA SOUS LT WAS REPORTEDLY KILLED AND ALSO TO THE SITES OF THE MURDERS. THE LOCALS ARE NOT SLEEPING IN THEIR HOUSES AND RETURN ONLY AFTER FIRST LIGHT. THEY ARE ENCOURAGED BY THE MILOB PRESENCE AND SUPPORT OUR CONTINUED PATROLLING. THE RPA HAVE ESTABLISHED AN PATROL BASE AT 288148 COMPRISED OF APPROXIMATELY 10 SOLDIERS WITH A LMG.

D. ONE MILOB PATROL TO THE AREA OF THE INCIDENT OF 12 SEP. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED TO THE PATROL:

- (1) THERE HAS NOT BEEN ANY ADDITIONAL KILLING,
- (2) THE LOCALS REMAIN TERRIFIED OF THE RPA DUE TO THEIR PAST AND PRESENT BEHAVIOR,
- (3) THAT YESTERDAY, A LOCAL RESPONSIBLE, MR ZAVANDORA OF KARAGO (6114), WAS BEATEN BY THE RPA ONCE THE UN HAD LEFT THE AREA,
- (4) THE RPA ALSO INDICATED TO THE LOCALS THAT IF THEY DID NOT COOPERATE WITH THE RPA, THEY WOULD BE KILLED,
- (5) LOCALS ALSO REPORT THAT IF THE RPA CONTINUE WITH THEIR PRESENT BEHAVIOR, THEY WILL SEEK TO MOVE TO ZAIRE.

E. ONE COMBINED MILOB/CIVPOL PATROL TO KAYOVE (2792) AND KINUNU (2189). THE BOUTCHMEISTER OF KAYOVE REPORTED THAT 10 INSURGENTS LANDED BY BOAT ON 07 SEP. ONE PERSON WAS IDENTIFIED BY A LOCAL AS AN FRGF SOLDIER. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY BY THE RPA. HE REPORTED THAT THESE PEOPLE WERE ARMED AND HAD MOVED TO THE GISHWATI FOREST.

THEY ALSO CAPTURED TWO FRGF SOLDIERS WHO WERE SUBSEQUENTLY TAKEN TO BIGOGWE CAMP. THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM IS FOLLOWING UP.

D. THE MILOBS LEARNT OF KILLINGS AND A POTENTIAL INCIDENT IN THE CELLULE NEAR KANAMA COMMUNE 2712 AT 1200 H FROM THE MSF. TWO TEAMS INCLUDING THE OPS OFFR AND THE HUM OFFR WERE IMMEDIATELY DESPATCHED TO THE SITE. THE DETAILS OF THE INCIDENT

ARE AS FOLLOWS:-

i) LAST NIGHT SOME INSURGENTS WENT TO A CELLULE IN KAYOVE SECTOR 2914 OF KANAMA COMMUNE 2712 AND ROUNDED UP THE PEOPLE . THEY OPENED FIRE INDISCRIMINATELY KILLING A LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE.

ii) THE TEAMS VISITED THREE SITES WHERE THE KILLINGS HAD OCCURRED. AT THE FIRST SITE GR 270183 THE TEAM COUNTED 24 DEAD BODIES ALL SHOT. THE SECOND SITE WAS 200 M FROM THE FIRST WHERE 22 BODIES WERE FOUND. AT THE THIRD SITE 55 BODIES WERE COUNTED AND IT WAS REPORTED THAT 7 BODIES WERE REMOVED FROM THE SITE. ONE GRAVE WAS ALSO SEEN. ONE OF THE VICTIMS INCLUDED THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KANAMA COMMUNE.

iii) THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 16 CAS TAKEN TO THE HOSPITALS AT GISENYI(10) AND RUHENGARI(6). ONE CAS SUCCOMBED TO HIS INJURIES ON THE WAY TO RUHENGARI.

iv) THE LOCALS REPORTED THAT ONE RPA OFFR (LT) AND THREE RPA SOLDIERS WERE KILLED IN A VEH WHICH WAS TRAVELLING ON THE ROAD GISENYI - RUHENGARI NEAR THE INCIDENT SITE LAST EVENING. THE PERSONS RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS WAS A GROUP OF PERSONS WEARING MILITARY UNIFORMS.

NOBODY WAS INJURED HOWEVER THE RPA REPORTEDLY FIRED IN THE AIR TO INTIMIDATE THE OWNER. THERE WERE A NUMBER OF OTHER HUMANITARIAN POINTS THAT WILL BE PASSED TO THE RELEVANT UN/NGO AGENCY AT TOMORROWS BRIEF.

D. ONE TEAM VISITED BP 1 AND BP 2. THE SITUATION IS CALM ALONG THE BORDER IN THE GISENYI AREA.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

A. HUMANITARIAN TEAM VISITED THE RUBARU SECONDARY SCHOOL TO INFORM THE DIRECTOR THAT HIS REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE WITH MATERIALS SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION.

B. IN ADDITION THE PRISON DIRECTOR VISITED MILOB HQ TO INQUIRE AS TO THE STATUS OF THE SECURITY LIGHTING REQUEST. I HAVE FORWARDED A SECOND LETTER TO THE HAC FOR ACTION. HE INFORMED ME THAT THE BEDS FROM THE ICRC HAD ARRIVED AND THAT THEY WILL BE INSTALLED TOMORROW.

C. VISITED THE NKIMARA TRANSIT CAMP TODAY. PREPARATIONS THERE ARE GOING WELL. THE REQUEST FOR THE ASSISTANCE WITH A FRONT END LOADER AND DUMP TRUCKS WAS PARTIALLY FULFILLED. 9. MISC. MY OPS OFFR HAS JUST HAD A DISCUSSION WITH THE MILOB DUTY OFFICER REGARDING TRANSPORT FOR THE MILOB WHO IS TO COLLECT THE MSA FOR THIS SECTOR. HE WAS INFORMED THAT THE HQ CANNOT PROVIDE TRANSPORT TO TAKE THIS MILOB TO HIS ACCOMMODATION IN KIGALI AND PICK HIM UP THE FOLLOWING MORNING TO ALLOW HIM TO DRAW THE MSA. UNDERSTAND THAT WE ARE CRITICALLY SHORT OF TRANSPORT AND CANNOT SPARE ONE VEHICLE FOR TWO DAYS, INCLUDING TWO MILOBS, FOR THIS FUNCTION. THIS PROBLEM HAS BEEN STATED ON A NUMBER OF OCCASIONS, WITH POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS ADVANCED, WITH NO RESULT.

10. COMMANDERS ASSESSMENT. DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RPA LO THIS AM HAS INDICATED THAT THE SWEEP OF THE GICWATT IS CONTINUING. DETAILS REGARDING THE EXTENT AND SUCCESS/FAILURE WERE NOT FORTHCOMING. OUR SHORTAGE OF VEHICLES REMAINS OF GREAT CONCERN TO ME. SHOULD THE SITUATION CHANGE RAPIDLY, AS IT DID LAST MONTH WITH THE RETURNEES, WE WILL HAVE TO DEDICATE AT LEAST TWO VEHICLES TO HUMANITARIAN TASKS AND COORDINATION DUTIES WHICH WILL LEAVE ONLY TWO VEHICLES FOR PATROLLING AND ROUTE RECCE TASKS. A. SECT HQ. THE DAILY MORNING BRIEF WAS HELD AT 0800 H AND ATTENDED BY ALL THE MILOBS AND REPS OF HUMAN RIGHTS, UNHCR, AND NGOS'.

B. TEAMS. ONE TEAM ON B PATROL VISITED THE COMMUNES OF RWERERE 2722 AND RUBAVU 2313. THE TEAM VISITED THE SECTORS OF MURAMBI 2216 , KINYANZOU 2318 , MUTOVU 2829 , MUBONA 2821 AND SPOKE TO THE LOCALS. THE MAIN COMPLAINT WAS NONAVAILABILITY OF WATER. HOWEVER WITH THE MONSOONS APPROACHING THEY NOTICED FARMERS TILLING THE LAND AT A NUMBER OF PLACES. THE TEAM VISITED THE MSF CLINIC AT RWERERE WHICH WAS TREATING 20 INPATIENTS. AT RWANGARA 2318 THE LOCALS COMPLAINED OF THE 59 CASELOADS ESCORTED BY RPA TAKING OVER LAND FROM OWNERS BY FORCE.

C. ONE TEAM ON 'A' PATROL VISITED THE COMMUNES OF NYAMYUMBA 2106 AND KAVOYE 2792. THE LOCALS AT NYAMYUMBA REPORTED THAT 3 RETURNEES AND 3 LOCALS WERE DETAINED BY THE RPA ON CHARGES OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE .AT KAYOVE TWO RETURNEES WERE

DETAINED BY THE RPA FOR SIMILAR REASONS. ONE RETURNEE HOWEVER MANAGED TO ESCAPE .THESE CASES WILL BE HANDED OVER TO HUMAN RIGHTS / CIVPOL.

D. A SEMINAR ON ARREST AND DETENTION WAS ORGANISED BY THE HUMAN RIGHTS IN KABAYA 4906. ONE MILOB ATTENDED THE SEMINAR AND SPOKE ON INTERNATIONAL LAW AND POWERS OF THE ARMY DURING WAR AND IN THE TRANSITION PERIOD. THE SEMINAR WAS TO EDUCATE THE LOCALS ABOUT THE POWERS OF THE RPA THUS AVOID ANY NASTY INCIDENTS AND MISUNDERSTANDING ON THE PART OF THE LOCALS.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

A. THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM ATTENDED THE CULTURAL DAY FESTIVITIES AT THE GISENYI STADIUM. THE PREFECT OF GISENYI ADDRESSED THE POPULATION. HIS MAIN THEME WAS THE IMPORTANCE OF CULTURE TO A COUNTRY, HE ALSO REPEATEDLY STRESSED THAT RWANDANS MUST SHARE THE SUFFERING AND FORGIVE IN ORDER TO ENRICH THEIR CULTURE.

10. COMMANDERS ASSESSMENT.

THE RPA LO INFORMED THAT A MEETING OF PREFETS OF THE PREFECTURES BORDERING ZAIRE AND BURUNDI IS LIKELY ON 11 SEP. THE MEETING IS LIKELY TO BE ATTENDED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE CABINET INCL THE MINISTERS OF DEFENCE. THOUGH THE AGENDA IS NOT KNOWN IT IS POSSIBLE THE MEETING WOULD DISCUSS THE SECURITY SIT AND COORD OF REPATRIATION IF THE REFUGEES RETURN IN LARGE NUMBERS. THE QUESTION OF OPENING ADDL ENTRY POINTS NEAR BP 4 MUTOVU 2829 WHICH IS OPPOSITE KIBUMBA REFUGEE CAMP IS ALSO LIKELY TO BE ADDRESSED.

THE FRGF ELEMENTS IN ZAIRE ARE RETURNING TO THE CAMPS IN GOMA AFTER FORCIBLE EXPULSION OF REFUGEES HAS STOPPED. THEY APPEAR TO HAVE TAKEN CONTROL OF THE CAMPS AGAIN WITH ACTIVE DISINFORMATION CAMPAIGN WHICH HAS RESULTED IN LOW FIGURE OF RETURNEES. IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT ALL COUNTERMEASURES IN THE FORM OF MASS MEDIA INCL BROADCASTS FROM RADIO RWANDA BE USED. IT IS REITERATED HERE THAT RADIO UNAMIR IS NOT HEARD IN THE AREA AND IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT TIME FROM RADIO RWANDA BE TAKEN IF SUITABLE REPEATER STATIONS FOR RADIO UNAMIR CANNOT BE EST.
