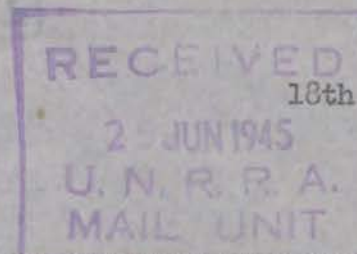

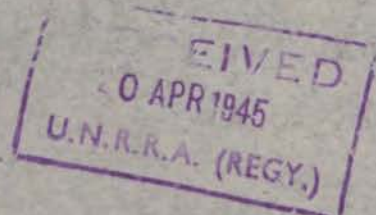

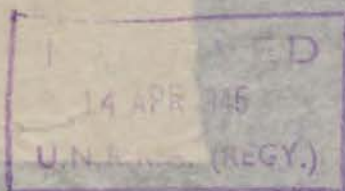

## 1. THE GENERAL PICTURE.

The beginning of the Mission's work was disappointingly slow. It was impossible to complete an agreement laying heavy responsibilities upon the Government, as the Italian Agreement does, until UNRRA could definitely promise supplies. But when supplies were assigned in late February, the agreement was quickly signed. The performance of UNRRA Headquarters in sending supplies during March, April and May has been admirable, although medical supplies are slow in coming forward.

Our major problem in the field has been in moving supplies from ports to communes. Rail transport has been hard to get, first because of military operations, and secondly because of the scarcity of railroad cars. Trucks are even scarcer. Even now, with the war in Europe over, we are limited to 4,000 tons a month by rail, although schooner traffic is becoming easier. This bottleneck has determined the rate at which food can be organized. The problem is even greater than it appears, because deliveries to local points are seriously affected unless commodities arrive in reasonable balance. Our own limited fleet of trucks is used to round out local supplies until rail transport can deliver the missing items. As a result less than a quarter of a million children were being fed on May 31, nearly three months after the agreement was signed, and two months after the first ship arrived.

Progress is thus much slower than we had planned. The general outcome is not too serious, however, because the summer period is the best period of the year in Italy, since local vegetables are then available. The outlook for the autumn and winter, however, is serious, especially within the larger cities, for the following reasons:-

- a) The withdrawal of the Military will result in a great increase of unemployment, because a high percentage of jobs in Italy have been created by the Army, both for handling of military supplies and repairing roads, railroads and ports.
- b) There is a great shortage of power in Central and Southern Italy, where two thirds of the electrical power is still out of commission
- c) There is a great shortage of coal and no relief in sight.
- d) The import of essential raw materials is disappointingly slow in getting under way.
- e) The present season is unusually dry, which will cause a serious shrinkage in the grain crop. In addition to the drought there has been a serious grasshopper plague in Sardinia.

All of these factors taken together threaten a most serious unemployment situation beginning this autumn. Industrial employees are being carried to 30th June by their companies (even though there is no work), at 75% of their wages. As of 30th June this load will be shifted to the Government, probably at the rate of 60% of their old salary. This arrangement will hold only until 31st October, when it will have to be reviewed. In the meantime the cost of living is rising rapidly, especially in the North. Food costs are inadequately controlled, and wages do not keep up with them. Our policy is therefore to complete our organization this summer, with the grim expectation that our facilities and our supplies will be sorely taxed next winter.

## 2. LEGAL BASIS OF ITALIAN UNRRA PROGRAM

The responsibilities of the Italian UNRRA Mission are limited by the provisions of Resolutions 57 and 58. On the basis of these Resolutions an Agreement was signed on 8 March between the Italian Government and UNRRA. The Agreement



was approved by a legislative decree on 19 March 1945, but another decree will be issued shortly for the purpose of implementing the specific provisions of the Agreement. No difficulties, however, have been encountered in obtaining from the Italian Government the privileges and facilities accorded to UNRRA under the provisions.

### 3. RELATIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT

#### a) Relations with the Central Authorities.

The channel between the Mission and the Italian Government is the Delegation of the Italian Government for the Relations with UNRRA and consists of representatives of the following agencies:-

- (i) Presidency of the Council of Ministers and High Commissariat for Food
- (ii) Ministry of the Interior (General Direction of Public Health)
- (iii) Ministry of Foreign Affairs (General Direction of Economic)
- (iv) Ministry of the Treasury (State Accounts Office)
- (v) High Commissariat for Refugees
- (vi) Court of Accounts

Matters of interest to only the Government Agencies concerned, are dealt with directly between the individual Government Agencies and the functional divisions of the Mission, for example, the Health Division and the General Direction of Public Health. All questions of general interest, however, are referred to the President of the Government Delegation, Avvocato Ludovico Montini.

The Government Delegation and a Delegation of the UNRRA Italian Mission, composed of the Chief of Mission and representatives designated by him, form a Joint Committee, which has broad advisory capacity. The Joint Committee has been called upon to make recommendations giving approval to a number of questions of a general nature, such as plans for distribution and supply to the provinces, agreement on the transfer of title of supplies from UNRRA to the Government, and principles for the sale of UNRRA goods. Financial authority to conclude all the agreements necessary to the execution of the UNRRA program is vested in the Chairman of the UNRRA and Government Delegations.

#### b) Relations with Local Authorities

Provincial committees have been formed in each province receiving UNRRA assistance (33 of the 49 provinces in territory returned to the Italian Government have been organized). The Prefect of the Province presides on these Committees, which are representative of the life of the Community. Provincial committees have been given overall responsibility for the distribution of UNRRA supplies to the institutions and individuals eligible for UNRRA assistance. The local Mayor presides at communal level and the responsibility of these committees is restricted to the execution of the program within these limits.



#### 4. PUBLIC RELATIONS

A number of pictures have been obtained which have been used extensively for publicity purposes, both in Italy and abroad, of refugees camps in the South, the unloading of UNRRA supplies in Italy, and refugee children being tendered by UNRRA personnel.

Various broadcasts have been undertaken, the first shortly after the signing of the Agreement when both Prime Minister Bonomi and Mr. Keeny were on the air. These broadcasts were heard in Rome in Italian and were also relayed to the United States and the world both in English and in Italian through the "Voice of America" program. A series of broadcasts by prominent Italian personalities, such as Sforza Venturi and Croce were recorded and relayed to the United States.

A pamphlet was urgently needed to explain the original structure of UNRRA and its relationship with Italy. Despite numerous printing and publishing difficulties, the pamphlet was produced in the minimum time and at present 10,000 copies are being distributed. The weekly bulletin, whilst originally intended for personnel of the Italian Mission only, circulates, upon request, to an increasing reading public.

News coverage about UNRRA increased noticeably during the last month, both in the local press and in the service newspaper published in English. "Stars and Stripes" have featured UNRRA news repeatedly, and the fights against malaria and tuberculosis have been given prominence in "Nucleo Mondo". A plan is afoot with the cooperation of U.S.I.S., for a long range publicity campaign against tuberculosis in Italy.

#### 5. SUPPLY SITUATION.

By 31 May 1945 the Mission had received 17 shipments, totalling 45,000 tons, of which three were small shipments from Casablanca and Algiers, nine were small shipments from the United States and the United Kingdom and five were full shipments from the United States. The present operational basis is two full shipments monthly, one of grain and one of general cargo. Sometime ago, Allied Commission began gradually to relinquish its operative functions in the reception of cargo and warehousing, whilst the Federazione Italiana dei Consorzi Agrari, the Government Agency, began to assume these functions. The Federazione is UNRRA's reception and warehousing agent. Despite insufficient political backing and lack of physical means, the Federazione is today making real progress, aided by UNRRA wherever possible. The form of this assistance is advice, personnel and transport.

The Allied Commission has been particularly helpful not only in guaranteeing port acceptance for UNRRA cargoes, but in a number of other ways as well. They lent flour and lent before UNRRA's had arrived and in turn we lent them peas and beans. Sugar, too, has been a commodity which has been exchanged satisfactorily. Apart from these exchanges 1750 tons of cod fish have been loaned to the Government through the High Commissioner for Food, to avoid spoilage. The loan will be repaid in other animal proteins of an equal dollar value.

Generally we do not operate ourselves unless we have exhausted the possibilities of getting the Government or some Agency retained by the Government, to do the job instead. UNRRA wheat is lent to the Government upon arrival, and the Government in return supplies an equivalent amount of flour of a 91% extraction rate, when and where that flour is needed for the UNRRA program. An arrangement is being



concluded with the Government whereby the Federazione, acting as its agent, accepts title to UNRRA goods on instructions in the port warehouses so that when goods move to various provinces they are the property of the Government. The major problem of supply and distribution are lack of internal transport and the faulty organization of existing transport; inflation and black markets, which make pilferage attractive; lack of guards over warehouses; lack of initiative or willingness to take responsibility by Government Officials, particularly in time of crises, and the actual difficulty of ensuring that relief goes to needy children and pregnant mothers. Above all it would appear that the commodities most needed, namely animal proteins, textiles and shoes are in world short supply.

## 6. HEALTH DIVISION ACTIVITIES.

### a) Sanitation and Malaria Control Activities.

The Sanitation section has been confined to the preparation of estimates of sanitation supplies needed during 1945; to acquainting itself with the problems before it on the basis of existing and inadequate information; to conferring with both the Public Health authorities of the Allied Commission and the Italian Government; to field survey of sanitation problems and need in 17 provinces; to advice to the Italian High Commissariat for refugees on camp sanitation problems and to other miscellaneous activities both at Headquarters and in the field. At the end of May sanitation supplies were beginning to arrive. The arrival of D.D.T. concentrate has enabled the section to give material assistance in malaria control working in conjunction with the Allied Commission Public Health Sub-Commission and A.M.G.

### b) Epidemic Control

D.D.T. and technical services, including a "dusting team" were supplied to Sicily to combat an outbreak of typhus reported in May.

### c) Tuberculosis

It has been of the utmost importance to the Health Division to determine the incidence of tuberculosis, which is not a reportable disease in Italy, and about which possibly extravagant statements have been made. Surveys, by the use of the photofluorographic unit, were completed in Rome on residents of one Italian refugee camp, one Displaced Persons camp, the pupils of two public schools and the majority of employees of UNRRA Italian Mission. The unit was then moved to Fandi to cooperate with the Medical Nutrition Mission in their survey and will shortly be moved to Pontecorvo with the same group. Attempts are being made to repair Italian X-ray equipments and to provide films and chemicals for developing and fixing films. An Italian survey team is being employed by the Mission to be used eventually in operating the Italian equipment which is being rehabilitated. The Health Division has been able to assist in plans for the anti-tuberculosis meeting to be held between 4 and 14 June, at which all Italian agencies interested in the control of tuberculosis will participate. UNRRA is to assist the Italian refugee Administration in the problem of tuberculosis control among Italian refugees being returned to Italy.



d) Nutrition

The Nutrition Section has served in a consultant and advisory capacity in the Nutrition planning of both Welfare and Supply Divisions of the Mission and has suggested priority groups for feeding on the basis of medical selection. Upon request specific nutritional data were made available to U.S.S. for its work in Central Europe and to the Allied Commission in Austria. Consistent attempts are being made to integrate the Nutrition program of the Welfare and the Health Divisions with that of the High Commissariat for Food of the Italian Department for Health. Fifteen different medical surveys have been made to date covering schools, refugees, institutionalised populations; approximately 3000 mothers and children have been examined. As a result the attention of both the Mission and the Government has been drawn to the prevalence in Italy of rickets, ariboflavinosis and avitaminosis. Relatively little evidence of other classical nutritional deficiency diseases has been observed.

e) Medical Care

A small dispensary has been organised to provide emergency medical care for the entire staff. Cases requiring more than emergency treatment are referred to the O.C. Dispensary for the regular employees and to private practitioners for the Italian Staff. The British and Americans are admitted, when circumstances warrant, to the respective British and American hospitals.

Medical services are provided for these displaced United Nations Nationals by hospital installations in the various accommodation centres. A medical member of the Mission, in collaboration with the Displaced Persons Division, has assisted in the selection of certain hospital and clinical facilities in the towns in which Displaced United Nations Nationals reside, when not accommodated in centres. Arrangements have been made for payment of such services upon presentation of certificates, which will be provided by the field representatives of the Displaced Persons Division.

Medical Services are being provided in Italian refugee camps. The work of the District medical staff is to investigate the social conditions and the need for medical supplies to assist Medici Provinciali in their requests for supplies and to cooperate with the work of other Divisions of the Mission in their districts. Four District Offices have been opened at the present time at Palermo, Cagliari, Naples and Rome, whilst it is hoped that the fifth will be opened in Siena shortly.

f) Medical Supplies.

Medical Supplies have arrived through March and April and requirements have been prepared for 1945. These schedules are subject to change when conditions in newly liberated areas can more accurately be determined. Of the 190 millions units of Penicillin all but 50 millions have been distributed through local committees.

7. DISPLACED PERSONS.

At the present time the camps being operated by the Displaced Persons Divisions are in Philippeville, Algeria, and in Santa Maria dei Bagni, di Louca, Ferramonti, all in Southern Italy. Every effort is being made to close the camp



at Philippoville and all that is now required is the agreement of A.F.H.Q. Steps have already been taken, in fact, in anticipation of this agreement to pack surplus supplies and divert shipments. By 1 March the Southern Italian camps were being operated by UNRRA personnel and on 1 May financial responsibility was assumed.

Assistance is being provided by furnishing medical nursing and sanitary engineering facilities, by transporting supplies and other incidental services to the camps at Caserta and Trecase, which are situated near our other camps. But the responsibility of the management of those camps remains with the Allied Commission at the moment. The population of the whole group in Southern Italy is over 3,300.

The present flow of Displaced Persons from Northern Italy southwards indicates that in the near future all our camps will be filled to capacity.

The future camp picture in Northern Italy remains obscure, but it would seem that the bulk of displaced persons in that area are moving rapidly from Italy to their home countries. The exception to these are, of course, the dissident Yugoslavs and Poles. There are about 20,000 of the former and a larger, but not accurately known, number of the latter. A decision is awaited concerning the latter as to the assumption of responsibility.

Responsibility for Italian refugees rests with the Office of the High Commissioner for Refugees of War. It is estimated that the number of Italian refugees in the country is about 600,000 in Italy, whilst the estimates for those outside Italy range from between 600,000 to 900,000.

The plan of operation by the Division for Italian refugees covers inter alia the furnishing of limited supplies; assistance in the operation of refugee camps; assistance in repatriation; assistance in distribution of supplies to refugees in or out of camps and cooperation with Government authorities on the registration of refugees. Thousands of Italian refugees, ex-internees, ex-P.W.s and ex-forced-labourers are coming in or being brought in from the North and are moving through A.H.G., A.C. and Italian refugee-camps to their homes.

71 British Voluntary Societies personnel attached to the Division are working on Italian refugees.

Up to the present time we have been directly responsible for the return of about 10,000 refugees to their homes. At present the rate of return is likely to be accelerated to about three to five thousand a week, excluding the refugees moving in from the North. There are still about 50,000 refugees in the regions south of Naples, who belong in central Italy and about 20,000 in central who belong in Southern Italy. We are handling repatriation of these groups directly. Some 55 trucks are being used for the distribution of supplies, repatriation and the operation of camps.

Voluntary Societies personnel, though only on loan and faced with imminent recall by the Yugoslav and ALBANIA Missions, have nevertheless done a splendid job of work.

#### Assistance to non-Italian Displaced Persons.

On 29 March 1945 this section of the Displaced Persons Division, with the approval of the Displaced Persons and the Repatriation Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission, transmitted to all of the United Nations governmental



representatives in Italy the announcement of the Assistance Program. Briefly, after satisfactory negotiations with the I.G.C.R. in effecting an orderly transfer of its "stateless" and "unrepresented" cases UNRRA was acting on behalf of virtually all displaced nationals. The largest single centre of activity was in the Rome Province. Consequently this was the first of a series of transfers programmed from the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission to UNRRA. This program was in full operation on 1 May 1945, and covered not only financial assistance, but regular distribution of food to all eligible persons. Subsequently the program was developed in the Southern and Central Districts. At present developments are under way to extend the program to the rest of Italy.

#### 8. WELFARE.

The work of the Welfare Division can be divided into two periods, namely that period prior to the signing of the Agreement and that which has followed since. In the first period activities were concentrated on surveys of need in the cities of Rome and Naples and in devastated provinces.

In the second period the major accomplishments have been the local organization in 33 provinces for program operation; the distribution of instructions concerning the eligibility for UNRRA assistance, provincial committees and communes; a Nutrition conference on O.N.M.I. nurses; the strengthening of Government plans regarding child care services; distribution of food to 205,000 persons by the 31 May; and the establishment of a scheme for school lunches in Rome during the summer months.

SUBJECT: Report on Meetings of Congressional Sub-Committees.

This Military Headquarters has recently been visited by three different Congressional Sub-Committees as follows:-

Mead Committee  
Military Affairs Committee (Senate)  
" " " (House)

I was in attendance at all of the sessions of the above mentioned Sub-Committees.

The Mead Committee did not have time (after conclusion of hearings on other Sections) to go into Civil Affairs, G-5, hence did not go into UNRRA operations.

The Military Affairs Committee of the Senate was represented by but two Senators, Maybank and Russell.

The Military Affairs Committee of the House was represented by seven House members, who served as a Sub-Committee.

While the Mead Committee, as stated above, did not get into UNRRA operations, it was noted throughout the day that they showed a very great interest in maximum possible use by the Military of all surpluses. Their attitude on this might have some adverse effect on availabilities of supplies items for disposal to UNRRA.

The Sub-Committee on Military Affairs, both House and Senate, showed the same interest as the Mead Committee in the use of surpluses. Both of these Sub-Committees stated that it was not their function to go into UNRRA matters, theirs being primarily a military affairs function. Then they proceeded to go quite extensively into UNRRA operations. I am enclosing copy of statement rendered for the House Committee. Such a report was requested from each of those who testified, because of a breakdown in the reporting system.

/In addition

In addition to above mentioned report, I was impressed by the interest shown, by the Sub-Committee of both House and Senate, in UNRRA operations in countries under Soviet influence, such as Yugoslavia; the nature of this interest is best shown by the type of questions: Senator Russell wanted to know if the people receiving relief knew from what countries it came. My reply was that they did know. Senator Russell replied that this was contrary to the previous information they had received on this subject. Some members of both Sub-Committees asked if we were permitted to take personnel into Yugoslavia. My reply was certainly we were. Next question was how many? My reply: approximately 100 UNRRA people were in Yugoslavia. Next question was were there any Americans among them? My reply: about 50% American and 50% British. I purposely omitted saying that the Chief of Mission was a Russian.

Senator Maybank asked whether Russia had paid anything into UNRRA account. My reply: not to my knowledge.

All in all the hearings were courteously held and a keen interest taken in UNRRA operations. However, there was apparent some scepticism about operations in territory known to be under Russian influence.

STATEMENT FOR MILITARY AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

made on 15 June 1945  
at Allied Force Headquarters

It is the function of UNRRA to assist the military in relief work for United Nations nationals in liberated countries; and also to assist in the care and return to their homes of persons who have become displaced as a result of the war. In these fields of activity it is the objective of UNRRA to relieve the military of its responsibility as early as possible.

The history of UNRRA's activities in this theatre are, briefly, as follows.

1. On May 1, 1944, UNRRA took over from the military responsibility for what are known as the Mideast camps, located in the Cairo vicinity, and accommodating almost 30,000 Yugoslavs and 10,000 Greeks who had been removed from their countries because of military necessity. These refugees are presently being returned to their homes. It is expected that by July 31, 1945, all of them will have been returned with the exception of 6,000 Greeks of the Dodecanese Islands. These will be returned as soon as they are prepared to receive them.

2. In October, 1944, UNRRA took over from the military the operation of the refugee camp located near Philippeville, North Africa. This camp was initially intended to provide accommodation for refugees from Yugoslavia, the ceiling for the Mideast camps above referred to having been reached. It was also intended to be used as a reserve for United Nations nationals for whom accommodations might be required from other countries. The potential capacity of this camp was 10,000. The expected need for this camp, however, did not develop. The total population at the present time is about 450. It now appears that this camp will no longer be needed as a reserve, and UNRRA has proposed to the military that it be closed and that the present refugee population of about 450 be transferred to the southern Italy camps now being operated by UNRRA, which I will discuss later.

3. On April 1, 1945, UNRRA took over from the military the operation of three refugee camps and a hospital located in the heel of Italy. These camps originally housed about 7,000 refugees; however, about 5,000 Yugoslavs have been returned to Yugoslavia, so that at present there remain about 2,000. Early shipments of 1,650 Jews from Austria and Switzerland to these camps are expected. It is



also expected that a considerable number of refugees from the north of Italy will need to be accommodated in these camps. It is proposed also that UNRRA will from time to time take over additional military camps for displaced persons farther to the north of Italy.

Additional operations carried on in Italy consist of a supplemental child feeding program and a health program. As of the end of May, 1945, UNRRA was feeding 205,000 children, exclusive of special assistance to refugees in camps. Food is being moved to various provinces, however, sufficient to feed one million children, which figure will be reached by the end of July. Two principles of selection are used. First places go to children discovered by medical examination to be in need of supplementary food. After that places are given in order of economic need, with special attention to families where the regular bread-winner is absent. This supplemental feeding program includes provision also for expectant and nursing mothers. In the medical field the two most important projects are those against tuberculosis and malaria. X-ray pictures are being taken at the rate of about 1,000 a day, and this number will be increased as soon as other groups are rehabilitated. A plan is being developed to identify all active tuberculosis in Italians returning from abroad, in order to facilitate later treatment. The malaria program is getting into full swing now, with UNRRA supplying chemicals and equipment. Speaking of the Italian program as a whole, there is a limitation of fifty million dollars in foreign exchange for expenditures. The Italian Government is responsible to match, on a fifty-fifty basis, the value of UNRRA supplies with lire for the Italian program. They are carrying out their part of the bargain. About one-half of this money is used to pay the costs incurred in the Italy program, such as housing, transportation, fuel, etc. The other half will be available for additional projects such as programs to fight tuberculosis and malaria and to continue the UNRRA programs as UNRRA withdraws.

Supplies to the amount of 50,000 tons have been delivered in Italy. The rate of shipment is 15,000 tons per month.

4. On April 1, 1945, UNRRA took over from the Military responsibility for relief and rehabilitation work in Greece. The total tonnage of supplies imported for June will amount to slightly more than 100,000 tons. For July this tonnage is expected to reach something over 140,000 tons; for August, 230,000, and a like amount for September. Inquiry was made by one of the Congressmen as to whether the UNRRA program did not differ somewhat from the military program for bringing in supplies. The reply was that it did differ, particularly as to rehabilitation items; that the July program contemplates shipment of 18,000 tons of agricultural and fisheries equipment to UNRRA-Greece, and that rehabilitation items would be emphasized more in succeeding months. The question was asked how far UNRRA proposed to go in the way of rehabilitation. The answer was that rehabilitation would be limited generally to a short-term program and the provision



of equipment and supplies as well as services which had a bearing on relief in the fairly immediate future. For example, seeds and agricultural equipment, as well as fertilizers, have a high priority in the UNRRA program. The provision of animals--shipment of bulls is currently being made; and it is expected that several thousand mules will be purchased from the military for shipment to Greece. In addition, rehabilitation work will be carried on to some extent in connection with communications and factories where the operation of such factories will be a means of bringing rather immediate relief to the people. The question was asked whether it was expected that shipment beyond September would continue at about the same rate. The reply was that the plans called for such deliveries in about the same amounts. It was stated, however, that all shipments planned were subject to availabilities of supplies and shipping.

5. On April 15, 1945, UNRRA took over from the military responsibility for all operations in Yugoslavia. Because of limitations on port capacities, shipments into Yugoslavia are substantially less than provided for in the relief plans. Shipments for June will probably aggregate 50,000 tons, while for July the total is estimated to reach 95,000 tons. Inquiry was made as to whether UNRRA personnel were permitted to go into Yugoslavia; whether they were not prevented from doing so by the Russian Government. The answer was that UNRRA personnel are permitted to go into Yugoslavia, and that approximately 100 have already entered, this number being made up about half of U.S. employees and half of British.

6. Albanian relief is still being operated by the military. However, UNRRA stands ready to take over as soon as an agreement has been concluded with Col.-Gen. Hoxha.

7. The military have requested UNRRA assistance in carrying out a Displaced Persons program in Austria. An UNRRA representative is presently in Austria, and it is expected that plans will soon be prepared for rendering such assistance with the idea of ultimate responsibility for this work being taken over by UNRRA.

The question was raised whether UNRRA did any work to improve the morals of the people in countries where they operated. The answer was no,--not directly. However, it was expected that some benefits would accrue along this line as a result of the relief being given, as well as from the advice given by welfare workers operating in these countries.

Shaaf and I appeared before Senators Tunnell and Brewster. Had general discussion of UNRRA's activities performances and plans. Senators showed friendly and co-operative attitude. Two points arose requiring considerable interpretation about which Senator quite anxious.

1. Provision by UNRRA of any materials which have a life of more than two years such as tractors hand tools and the like. Explanation made and discussion ended with Senators counselling firmly that this type of goods be kept to a minimum in so far as American appropriation is concerned. Senator Tunnell held forth on inability of American farmers to secure tractors farm implements and tools.
2. Senators have been informed that Italian Government is prepared to buy up any Army surplus in Italy. From this they concluded that Italy has considerable resources therefore cannot understand why UNRRA or any other organisation should provide supplies to Italy. We indicated that Italy's ability to pay for the supplies for the UNRRA programme had been gone into carefully in Washington and although we have had no information that Italy was prepared to buy up Army surpluses we assume that if this is true such purchases would be made in Italian lira not in American dollars. However Senators showed considerable irritation with the idea that UNRRA or any other organization using American funds should be putting supplies into Italy. In all probability this question will be raised with you in Washington upon their return.
