



SUBJECT: RE TURNS ON WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN SERVICES BY NORMED MEDICAL STAFF.

1. Listed below are the humanitarian service by Normed Medical Staff from the 4th - 10th DEC 95.

(a) 04 Dec.95 - One doctor and 2 nurses went to Jesus Alive orphanage to re-arrange their pharmacy, donated some medicaments, and advised the nurses that were present.

(b) 05 Dec.95 - One doctor and 2 nurses went to Mother Thereza for consultation and treated 12 patients. One patient was brought to Normed for X-ray and application of POP.
- Two nurses and one doctor were also at Gitanga Centre de Jeunes. Twenty children were consulted and treated.
- Two other nurses were at CHK ICU department working in the recovery room.

(c) 06 Dec.95 - One doctor, one nurse and one pharmacist were at Mother Thereza orphanage for consultations and treatments. 30 patients were treated. The pharmacist re-arranged their Pharmacy.
- Two nurses were at CHK- ward, dressing wounds of patients.
- Two other nurses were at Jesus Alive orphanage and treated 30 children suffering from scabies.
- Two other nurses were also at CHK ICU recovery room the whole day.

(d) 07 Dec.95- Three nurses worked at CHK Recovery room. 4 patients operated upon.

(e) 08 Dec.95- One anaesthetic nurse and 2 ICU nurses were at CHK operating and recovery room on teaching sessions to local staff on difficult cases of anaesthesia.

1. Request immediate action to renew arrangements with Norwegian Refugee Council for a contingent of 26 pers in revised configuration as attached along with proposed pers rotation schedule. This incorporates lessons learned in initial deployment.
2. This would allow capability for continued humanitarian medical work and should be extended to liquidation of mission.
3. Turnover of pers will likely have to be staggered through month of Jan due to short time lines.
4. This assumes no change in Canadian military medical contribution.
5. Request reply within 24 hours.



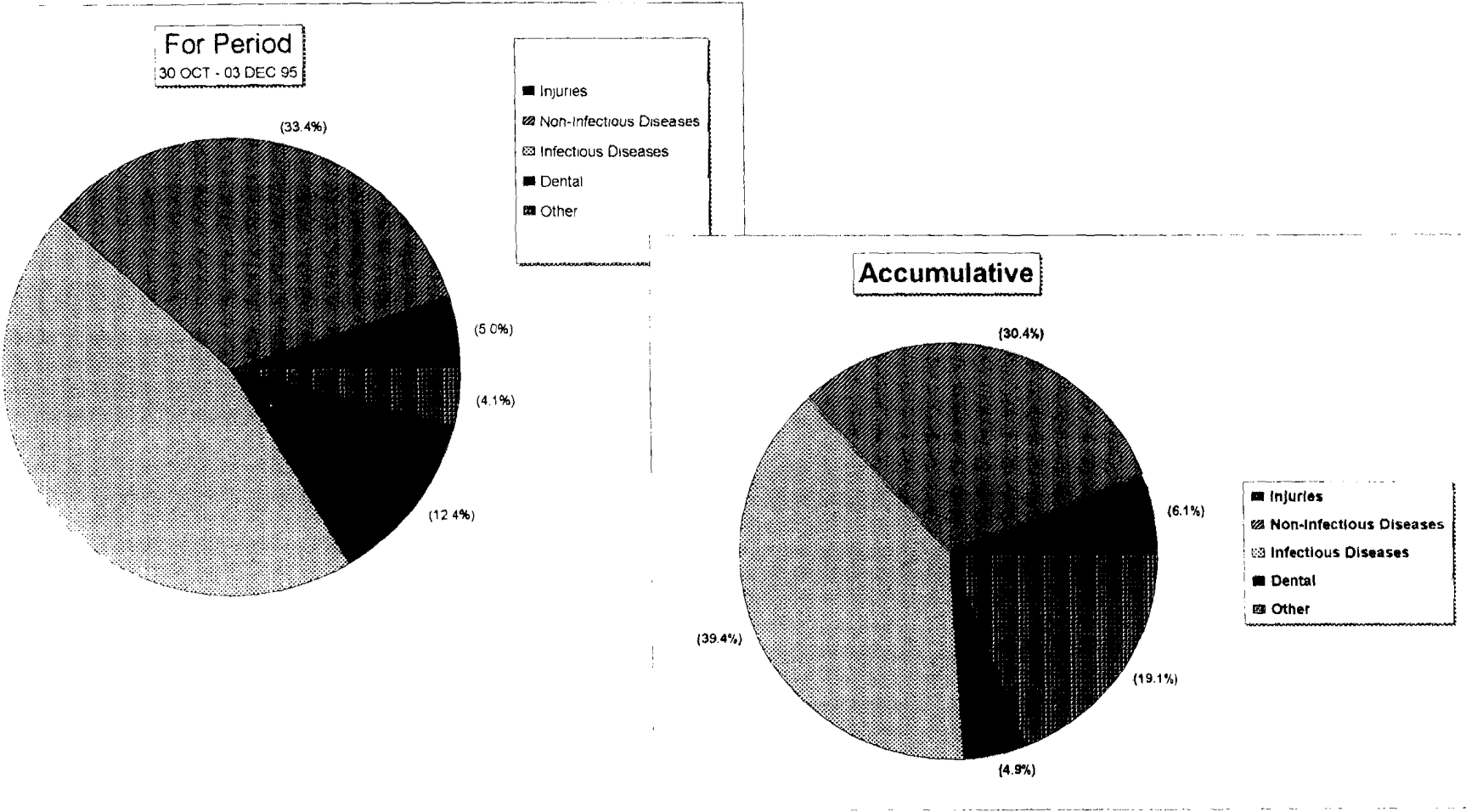

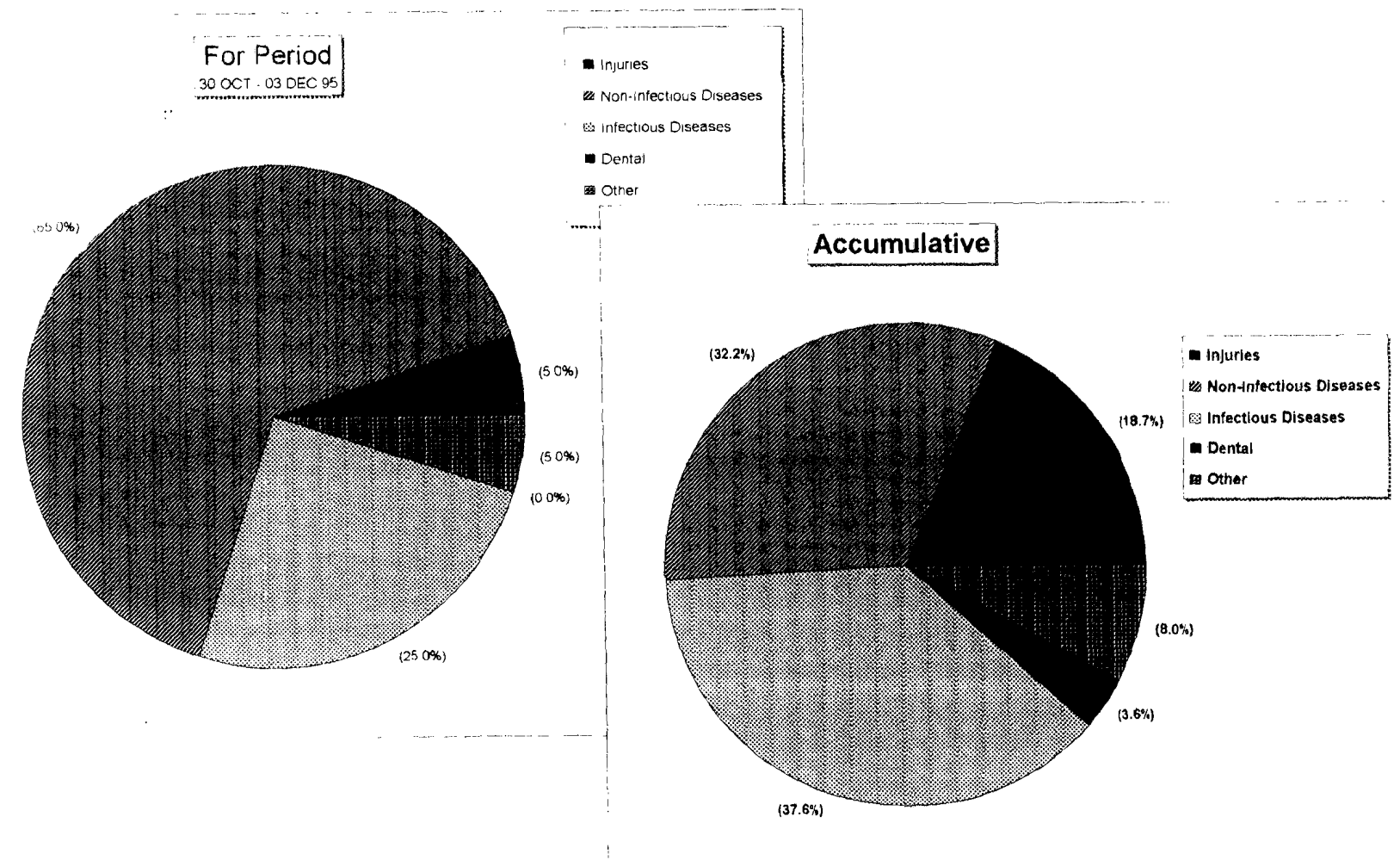
Monthly Unamir Diagnosis Stats

Force Out-patients Strength



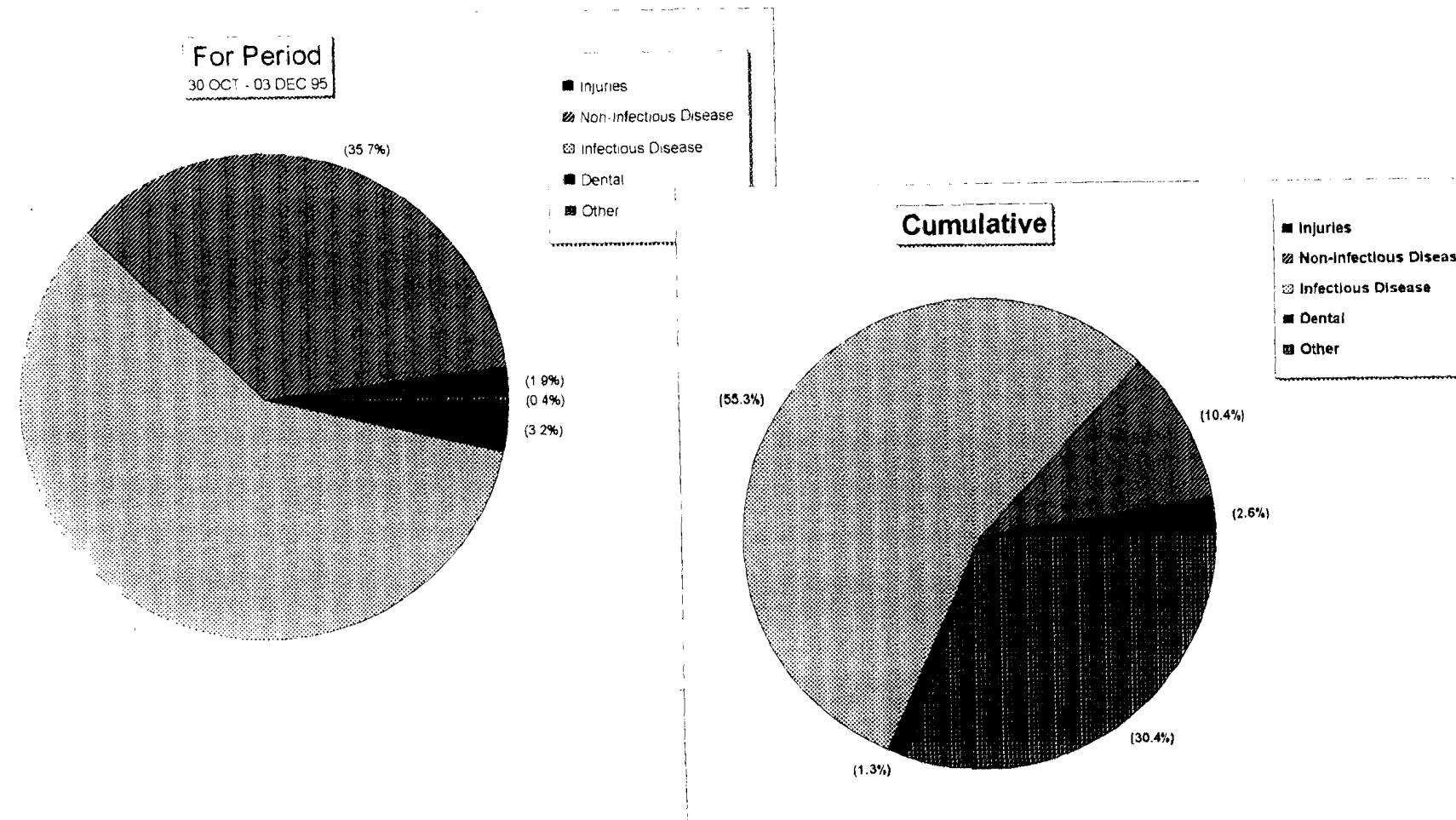
Monthly Unamir Diagnosis Stats

Force In-patients Strength



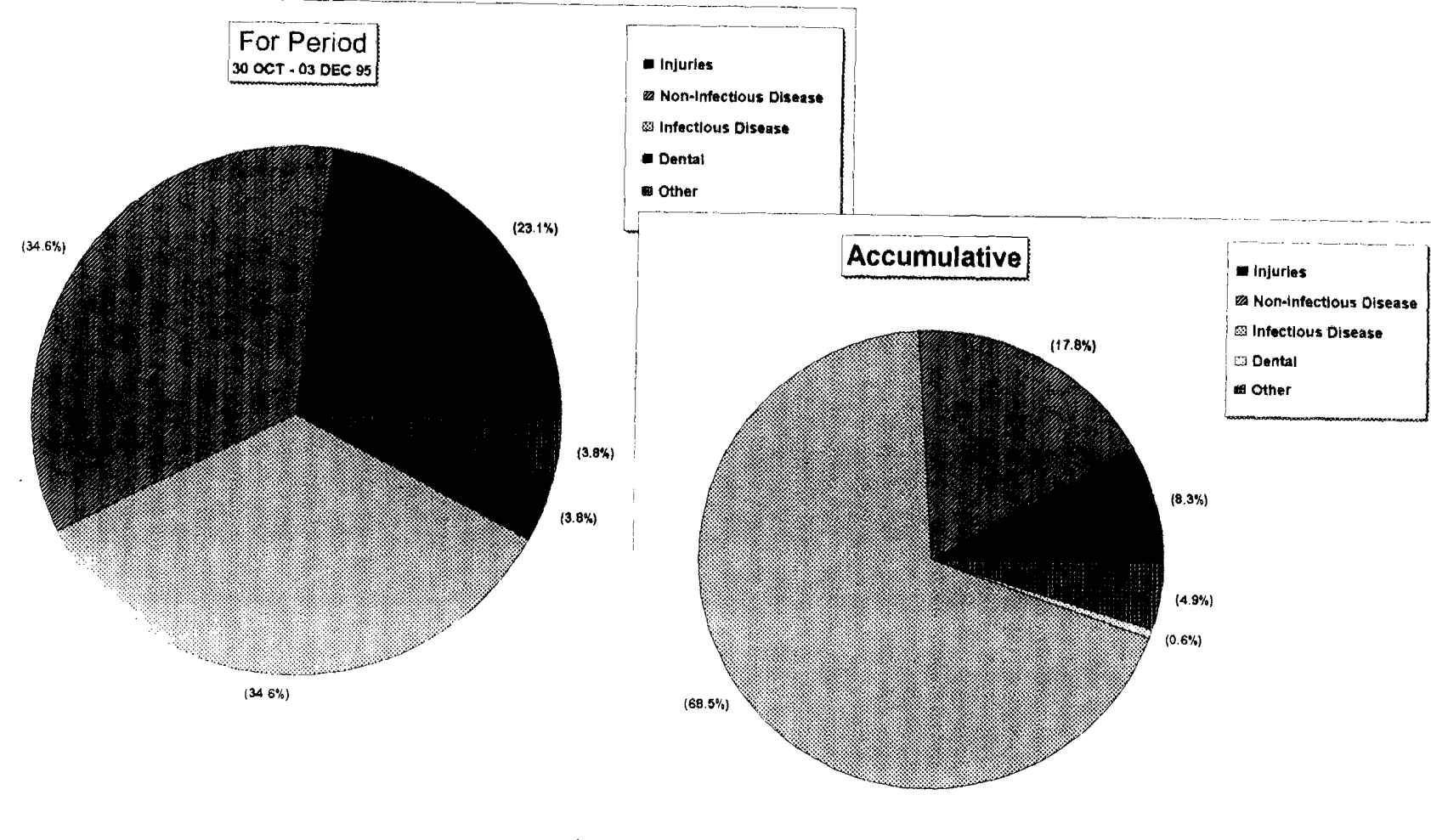
Monthly Humanitarian Diagnosis Stats

Subject: SWIMMING POOL CLOSURE BELGIUM VILLAGE

References:

A. 4000.4/27/FMO dated 20 Oct 95

B. 4000.4/27/FMO dated 11 Oct 95

1. The swimming pool at Belgium village was inspected by MWO Rankin FHO on 01 Dec 95. The results of the inspection are listed below:

- a. A safety hazard existed because the water was very dirty making it very difficult to see the pool bottom, and
- b. There was no chlorine residual creating a potential health hazard.

2. The FHO gave a verbal order to close the swimming pool. The swimming pool must remain closed until after the following corrective action has been carried out.

- a. Drain the swimming pool and then clean and sanitize all the pool surfaces.
- b. Refill with potable water.
- c. Add enough disinfectant to produce a 1.5-2.5 free chlorine residual.

3. In order to ensure that the water is free from pathogenic (disease causing) microorganisms a free chlorine residual of 1.5 - 2.5 ppm must be maintained at all times. To help maintain this residual it is recommended to add a chemical stabilizer such as cyanuric acid. Chemical stabilizers have the ability to release chlorine when needed and therefore reduce chlorine consumption.

4. The FHO must be contacted to reinspect the swimming pool when the above corrective has been taken. Pending this, the pool must remain closed.

1. Attached is NORMED report for malaria cases seen Oct/95.
2. Result of survey from contingent RAP's as follows:
 - a. INDBATT - strength 939 pers.
 - 590 Slide tests performed, 105 positive for malaria parasites.
 - UN local employees 40.
 - CIV Local 57.
 - INDBATT pers 6.
 - UNAMIR Staff/Milobs 2.

Compliance at Indbatt is very strictly enforced. In one case the soldier missed at least one dose of Mefloquine while on leave. In general the others are difficult to assess as admitted failure to take prophylaxis for Indian soldiers is a disciplinary matter.

- b. NICOY - strength 144 pers.
 - no slide tests done.
 - reported cases 51 own troops, 65 locals, 5 NGO's.
 - prophylaxis not taken due to endemic situation in Nigeria.

- c. GHANCOY - strength 307 pers.
- no slide tests done
- reported cases , own troops 41,
locals 171, Milobs and Civpol 6.
- compliance with prophylaxis is spotty due to
endemic situation in Ghana.
- d. MALAWICOY - strength 135 pers.
- no slide tests done.
- reported cases own troops 12, locals 367.
- compliance with prophylaxis, although not
universal, is good.
- e. MALICOY - strength 132 pers.
- no slide tests done.
- reported cases own troops 12, locals 270.
- compliance rate is estimated to be greater
than 90%.
- f. CANADIAN - strength 110 pers.
- one case reported, compliance failure.
Overall compliance almost universal.

3. Extrapolation of likely actual cases diagnostically confirmed on the basis of INDBATT and NORMED data would suggest that actual cases would be approximately 20% of those reported. Indbatt statistics are also of value in that they indicate a very low mefloquine failure rate. Other RAP's basically treat all febrile illness as malaria.

4. Rapid slide tests for the RAP's have been ordered some time ago but unfortunately arrived outdated. We are awaiting a replacement shipment. These kits should allow some semblance of accurate diagnosis.

5. Overall estimated incidence of malaria for UNAMIR military is 26 cases if all reported cases had been laboratory confirmed. This is from a force strength at end October of 1783 for an incidence of 1.4%. Such a prevalence level would be in accordance with previously studied low failure rate for Mefloquine prophylaxis.

MALARIA-DISEASE IN NORMED FIELD HOSPITAL 01-31 OCT 95

NUMBER OF PATIENTS AND HOSPITALIZATION:

17 patients has been treated for malaria in the month of Oct 95.

The diagnosis was confirmed by finding of plasmodium by microscopy in 13 patients.

8 of the patients were hospitalized.

Main reason for hospitalization was that the patient vomited and needed iv antimalarial-treatment.

Each patient stayed on average 4-5 days in the hospital.

9 patients were treated as outpatients.

LABORATORY RESULTS:

In the laboratory it was done totally 106 malaria slides on 88 different patients.

In 25 slides from 13 different patients plasmodium was found ..

24 slides: Plasmodium falciparum

1 slide: Plasmodium vivax

4 patients had 2400-2800 parasites pr 200 leucocytes. The others less.

When parasites were found a malaria smear was analyzed every day or every second day until the parasites had cleared.

TREATMENT:

4 patients was treated for malaria on clinical suspicion, but the malaria slide was negative.

None of them were very ill. They were all given Fansidar. None of them developed further symptoms or needed other treatment. One of them was hospitalized one night.

3 patients with microscopic confirmed diagnosis were treated with Fansidar only.

2 patients were given Fansidar initially and did not respond and was given Quinine and Doxycilin.

2 patients were treated with Quinine only.

4 patients were treated with Quinine and Doxycilin. One had already taken a course of Chloroquine without effect.

2 patients were given Quinine and 3 tbs. Fansidar after the last dose of Quinine.

Until today no recrudence has been seen in the patients we have treated.

COMPLICATIONS:

There has been no serious complications to the disease or the treatment.

In one woman the parasites cleared but she didn't respond satisfactory clinically and she was given Chloramphenicol orally.

WHAT MALARIA PROPHYLAXIS HAD BEEN TAKEN?

Only one patient had taken prophylaxis. This was an Indian soldier who was given Mefloquin 250mg every second week under supervision. Most likely the prophylaxis had been taken.

No other patients who developed malaria had taken any prophylaxis.

Whether the patients used mosquitosnets are not known.

*Note: Follow up confirmed
this soldier had missed
dosage while on leave.*





Below find the weekly humanitarian services carried out by the Normed Medical Staff from 20- 27 Nov. 95.

- (a) 21 Nov. 95. -Two ICU nurses and one anaesthetist nurse worked at the KCH operating theatre and recovery room. 2 patients were operated.
-Four other nurses worked on the wards and dressed the wounds of 13 patients.
-Two nurses and one doc. went to the Mother Theresa orphanage, consulted and treated 15 patients.
-Three nurses and one doc. went to Centre de Jeunesse Orphanage in Kigali to counsel and treat about 20 children.
-2 persons went to Cyangugu, and helped with the operations..
- (b) 22 Nov. 95. -The anaesthetist nurse and two ICU nurses worked at KCH. Four patients were given anaesthetics and the 2 ICU nurses worked in the recovery room.
-One doctor and one nurse and one midwife went to the Kibuye/ Bwiziza Camp for returnees for consultations, and treated about 50 returnees. They also left behind some first aid medication.
-One doc. and six nurses went to the Jesus Alive Orphanage and dressed wounds of 40 pts.
-In Cyangugu they operated and dressed the wounds of 11 pts.
- (c) 23 Nov 95. -The anaesthetist nurse and 2 ICU nurses worked the whole day at the KCH operating theatre and instructed students in anaesthesia. Eight patients were operated upon. The 2 ICU nurses worked in the recovery room. Two other nurses dressed the wounds of 14 pts.
-In Cyangugu the medical staff operated on 4 pats.
- (d) 24 Nov. 95 -The 2 ICU nurses worked at the KCH recovery room looking after 6 patients after operations, who were still in the recovery room.

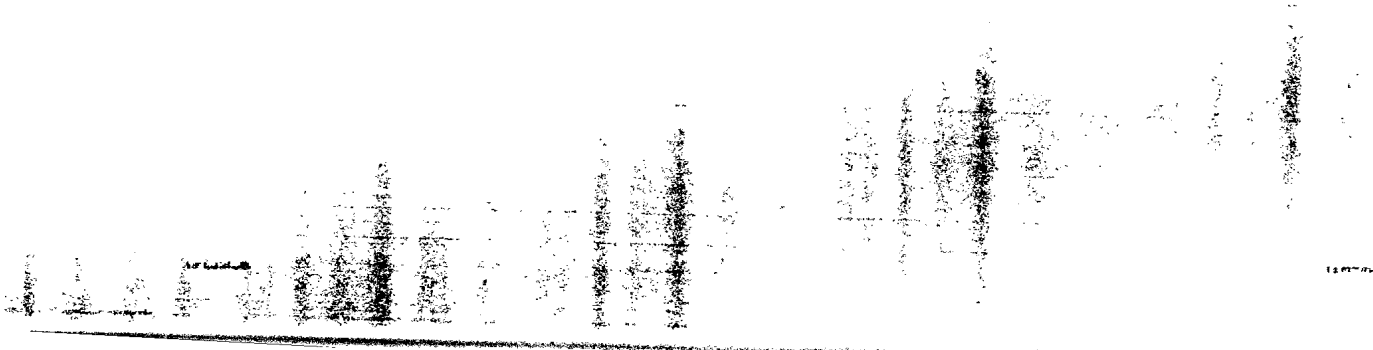



1. A Medical staff assistance visit was carried out at **INDBATT RAP** on 21 Nov 95. The inspection team members were Maj Fensom, FMO and MWO Rankin, FHO.

2. **INDBATT** medical staff include 2 x **MO**, 4 x medical assistants, 1x health assistant, 1 x lab assistant, 2 x Operating room assistants, 1 x dentist and 2 x dental assistants. Main facility is augmented by satellite clinics at Alexandra and Engineers locations.

3. **INDBATT** treat an average of ninety patients per day. This number is broken down into approximately 65 civilians, 20 Indbatt soldiers and 5 from **UN HQ**. The sick parade register is well organized and contains the required pertinent information. 24 / 7 service is provided with one medical assistant sleeping in the RAP for enhanced immediate availability. Sick parade for own troops is conducted daily 0730-0930 and walk-in patients are seen daily up to 1800 hrs. This provides excellent service to UNAMIR HQ staff who often seek care after working hours.

4. The physical lay-out of the **RAP** is well organized and contains a 3 bed holding facility which can be increased to 7 beds in emergency situations. Average bed occupancy is 2 patients. The **RAP** also includes a pharmacy, lab, medical supply room, **MO's** room, immunization area, an emergency area and a waiting room. Extensive self-help building modifications have been undertaken.

5. **INDBATT** immunizations are up to date. They are immunized against yellow fever, cholera, tetanus, typhoid, hepatitis B, and Meningitis. Compliance with malaria prophylaxis is virtually universal with tight control mechanisms in place.

6. There are no major pest control problems. Residual insecticide spraying is carried out in all **INDBATT** locations on a weekly basis. A pest control register is maintained at each location.

Subject: TRANSPORTATION OF REFUGEES AND
PRISONERS BY UN VEHICLES

1 There is always a potential for the spread of pathogenic organisms when large numbers of refugees or prisoners are transported to new locations in the cargo compartment of UN vehicles. The refugees or prisoners may be required to remain in the back of the vehicles for extended periods of time. Those suffering from infectious diseases may spread the disease from person to person and are also capable of contaminating the vehicle cargo compartment.

2 UN vehicles used to transport refugees from refugee camps to their home communes or to transport prisoners to new locations must always be cleaned and disinfected when the tasking is completed.

3 A recommended method for cleaning and disinfecting vehicles is listed below.

- a. Wash the cargo compartment down with hot soapy water.
- b. Wash the cargo compartment a second time using hot water containing a disinfecting solution such as Dettol.
- c. As a pest control measure it is recommended to spray the cargo compartment with an aerosol knockdown insecticide such as Moxey which contains methoxychlor 2% , pyrethrin 0,2 % and piperonyl butoxide 1,25%.

3 Personnel tasked to clean and disinfect vehicles should wear a mask and rubber gloves.

4 Any questions concerning the cleaning and disinfecting of UN vehicles can be addressed to MWO Rankin , FHO Ext 11115.

c The 22 oz cans of minciment pie filling were past the expiry date


d. There are still indications of rat droppings in the Kitchen




