No. 8348 POPOVICH PETER not available when medical officer called on two occasions. Has been asked by letter to call to camp here for medical examination.

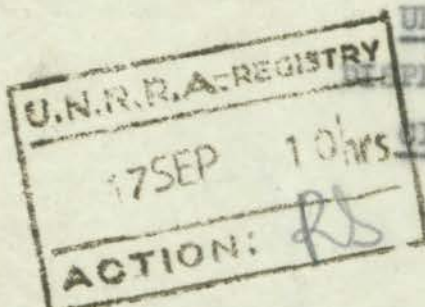

SUBJECT: Poswellewski Shabatai - resettlement in N. Rhodesia.

This is to inform you that Mr. Poswellewski Shabatai, born on 6 March 1912 at Bershai, Lithuania, and his wife Poswellewski Rifka, born 20 Nov. 1912 at Pakruojus, Lithuania, together with their 5 months old baby boy, are holding certificates of identity issued by H.M. Consul General in Milan, with entry visas for N. Rhodesia, transit visas for South Africa and transit visas for Beira (Zambesi). The British Consulate General at Milan is in possession of an authority to pay to Mr. Poswellewski an unlimited amount of money for his and his family's passage from Italy to N. Rhodesia, money that has been provided by the Government of N. Rhodesia itself.

Mr. Poswellewski received from the Consulate the attached letter addressed to UNRRA, which several months ago he showed to the Repatriation Branch of the Milan Camp Group where he was told that no help could be given to him by UNRRA. His difficulty is not documents or money as you see, but the impossibility to get transportation to the locality where he is bound for.

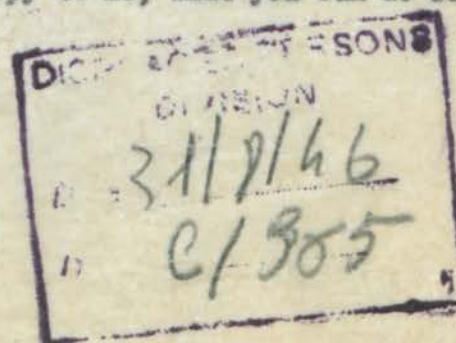
Apparently he approached several Travel offices and Shipping Agencies, who refused him because of the tender age of his baby. Now he wants to know whether UNRRA can in some way assist him in finding transport. He is prepared to go also air, and the funds are available here, or by some Thomas Carr steamer which sail regularly from Genoa and, if the applicants information is correct, there will be 2 or 3 such steamers sailing within the next 3 weeks.

Please let him know, with a copy to me, what you can do for him. His address is: 19 Via Guastalla, Milan.

SUBJECT: Eligibility for UNRRA care of persons in D.P. Camps.

Reference is made to a letter from Major Titov regarding the presence in UNRRA Camps of three persons alleged to have been soldiers in the Vlasoff Army.

1. DUDKIN, Petro. Now a Doctor at Di Bagni, whose biographical sketch in the medical file is attached.
2. ZUBOV at Cine Citta.
3. CHIBIRIAK, Cine Citta.

You will probably wish to have the respective Field Welfare Officers review these cases to determine if they are, in fact, eligible for UNRRA care. If ineligible, they should be removed from UNRRA employment and/or care at the earliest possible moment.

In the case of Dr. Dudkin, Medical Branch would wish to be informed in time to secure replacement, should he prove ineligible.

There has been some question raised as to the eligibility for UNRRA care of:

4. TRANKOWSKY, Dr. Boris, Chief Surgeon at the Leuca Hospital (Southern Camps Group).

Dr. Jones advises us that he has already been determined to be ineligible, and our Medical Branch would like this confirmed, so that they can take steps to replace him as well.



PARCEL FROM GERMANY FOR HEINRICH SKALLA

1. I have received from Heinrich and Hermine Skalla, residents of your Camp, a request that I trace for them a parcel posted from Germany by their son, who is ^{working with} ~~in~~ the U.S. Army.

2. The Mail Room at this H.Q. does not keep records of the many hundreds of unregistered parcels it receives for refugees and staff but, if properly addressed, forwards them promptly. They are unable to say whether or not this parcel has yet arrived. The parcel was posted on the 28th June and I think it probable that owing to poor postal communications with Germany, it has not been received here to date. All refugee mail the destination of which is in doubt, is checked first with the Tracing Section and then forwarded. Please explain this to Mr. & Mrs. Skalla.
