

Dear Mr. Hoffman,

The Council for Namibia has decided to visit Africa to discuss with certain governments some of the problems currently under consideration, such as the issue of travel documents, the signing of agreements regarding travel documents, refugees from Namibia, education and training programmes for Namibians and the formal opening of the Regional Office of the U.N. Commissioner for Namibia in Lusaka and others.

The Council will also take up contacts with the representatives of the Namibian people.

The capitals decided upon to be visited by the Council are Lagos, Lusaka, and Nairobi. The mission will leave New York for Lagos on 3 June and would take approximately three weeks. It will be chaired by the President of the Council, the representative of Nigeria.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS OF THE DECISION
BY THE COUNCIL TO VISIT AFRICA IN 1971

TR 120 (2)

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In accordance with the terms of regulation 13.1 of the Financial Regulations and Rules of the United Nations, the Secretary-General is required to submit to the United Nations Council for Namibia a report on the administrative and financial implications of a decision, made in principle by the Council at its 100th meeting on 25 February 1971, that the Council as a whole would visit Africa in 1971 in pursuance of the provisions of General Assembly resolution 2673 (XXV) of 9 December 1971.
2. In paragraph 13 of that resolution, the General Assembly requested the Council "to continue the functions entrusted to it in the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly, including consultations in Africa or at United Nations Headquarters, with the representatives of the Namibian people and of the Organization of African Unity".
3. The activities and itinerary of the visit to Africa were discussed at several meetings of the Council as well as meetings of the President with the Chairmen of the Council's two standing committees and the Ad Hoc Committee on Travel Documents. It was agreed that the Council as a whole should visit Nigeria, Kenya, Zambia and Stockholm, Sweden, starting on 3 June 1971. It was further agreed that the President, accompanied by one member of the Secretariat, would represent the Council at the ministerial and summit meetings of the Organization of African Unity (OAU), to be held at Addis Ababa during June. The duration of the visit would not exceed three weeks, including travel time. The minimum cost involved is estimated at \$34,000 under the following headings:

Travel and subsistence of the Acting United Nations Commissioner and of seven supporting staff (one principal secretary, three substantive officers, one administrative officer and two secretaries)	13,100
General expenses (including cables, local transportation, freight, rental of conference and office space and miscellaneous supplies)	2,500

4. The above expenses can be met from within the appropriations which were approved by the General Assembly at its twenty-fifth session, namely the sum of \$34,000,^{2/} if the Council decides to visit Africa with a view to implementing the provisions of paragraph 13 of resolution 2678 (XXV).

^{1/} The cost of air travel has been calculated on the basis of economy excursion fares, permitting transatlantic travel between Mondays and Thursdays and trips of seventeen to forty-five days' duration. It should be noted that only six stop-overs are allowed altogether.

^{2/} It has been possible to keep the cost of the visit within the appropriated amount of \$34,000 only by dispensing with such services as interpretation, summary records and sound transcription.

Having brought the Permanent Representative's Note to the attention of the members at an informal meeting held on 26 April, the President has the further honour to advise that the Council, appreciating the difficulties which would prevent Indonesia from assuming the presidency for the period in question, agreed with the Permanent Representative's suggestion that the office should be assumed by the representative of the member which would have followed Indonesia under normal circumstances, namely Nigeria. The agreement was reached after the Council had heard the representative of Nigeria express readiness to assume the duties of the office of President of the Council as of 1 May 1971.

In view of the importance of the procedural issue raised in the Permanent Representative's Note, the President of the Council has taken the liberty of circulating the Note as well as his own reply thereto among the members.

The President of the United Nations Council for Namibia avails himself of this opportunity to renew to the Permanent Representative of Indonesia to the United Nations the assurances of his highest consideration.

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Indonesia to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations and concurrently President of the Council for Namibia, and with reference to the next change of the Presidency of the Council due on the first of May 1971, has the honour, upon instruction of his Government, to convey the following message:

1. The visit of the Council for Namibia to Africa, which the Government of the Republic of Indonesia considers very important, and which is scheduled to start in the month of June 1971, will take place under the leadership of the next President; mindful of its significance, the Government of Indonesia is of the opinion, that the projected Council's mission should be headed by its President himself, which, according to the prevailing understanding should be the Permanent Representative or Deputy Permanent Representative of each Member-Mission to the United Nations;

2. Due to certain circumstances, which regretfully preclude the Government of Indonesia to send its Permanent Representative to the United Nations or anybody else with ambassadorial rank to assume the next Presidency, it feels that, to uphold the prestige of the Council's Mission and mindful of the sensitiveness of the respective recipient African Governments, it intends to relinquish its present turn to occupy the Presidency in favour of other Member of the Council.

3. The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Indonesia to the United Nations would therefore be very grateful, if the Permanent Representative of India, President of the Council, would accordingly inform other Members of the Council in the next Council's Meeting, in order to duly find an agreeable alternative.

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Indonesia avails himself of this opportunity to renew to the Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations, the assurances of his highest consideration.
