SIGNAL INSTRUCTION ON OPERATION HARBOUR LIGHT

Introduction

1. Signal Instruction on OPERATION HARBOUR LIGHT outlines the comm to be provided during rapid evacuation of UNAMIR pers and eqpt by road in convoy form. In addition all essential comm eqpt will be carried in this mission. Each convoy will be provided with armed escort to tackle any unforeseen incident.

Aim

2. The aim of this Signal Instruction is to implement comm support for OPERATION HARBOUR LIGHT so that there is a smooth command control and comm for the operation and to make all personnel involved in the operation familiarise with the comm facilities which will be provided.

Gen Comm Layout

3. For Command Control and Comm, Senior Most will act as the Convoy Comd and will be full control of all comm means.

4. A mobile comm centre will be installed for OPERATION HARBOUR LIGHT under the arrangement of Force Signal Offr with the assistance of Comm Field Service Staff. This comm centre will be situated in the middle of the convoys. The fol comms will be provided:

a. Radio Comms. There will be VHF and HF comms for the operation.

(1) VHF NET. Depending on the number of convoys and number of vehicles per convoy VHF nets will be provided. Considering approx 400 vehicles with 50 vehicles per convoy VHF net will be provided as per the Radio Diagram. Each convoy will have its own net in Simplex Mode (without repeater station). Only the convoy comds will also maintain a different net in Duplex Mode (with repeater station). This will allow front convoy comd and rear convoy comd in constant comm covering a wide distances in between. As it will be a long convoy and due to the nature of the terrain there may be places where there may not be VHF comm. This matter is to be noted by all Convoy Comds.

(2) HF Net. A HF net will be installed in the mobile comm centre so as to have direct contact with Nairobi and Kabale maintaining a single freq.

b. Satellite Comm. The mobile comm centre will be equipped with satellite comm which will have voice and FAX facilities with rest of the world via New York.

Net Diagram

5. Net Diagram of OPERATION HARBOUR LIGHT is shown in appendix "A"

Channel Allocation

6. Each convoy will be allotted with a separate channel in Simplex Mode. All Convoy Cods only will maintain a common channel in Duplex Mode. As the net will be crowded with traffics, transmission should be bare minimum only ops matter.

Call Signs

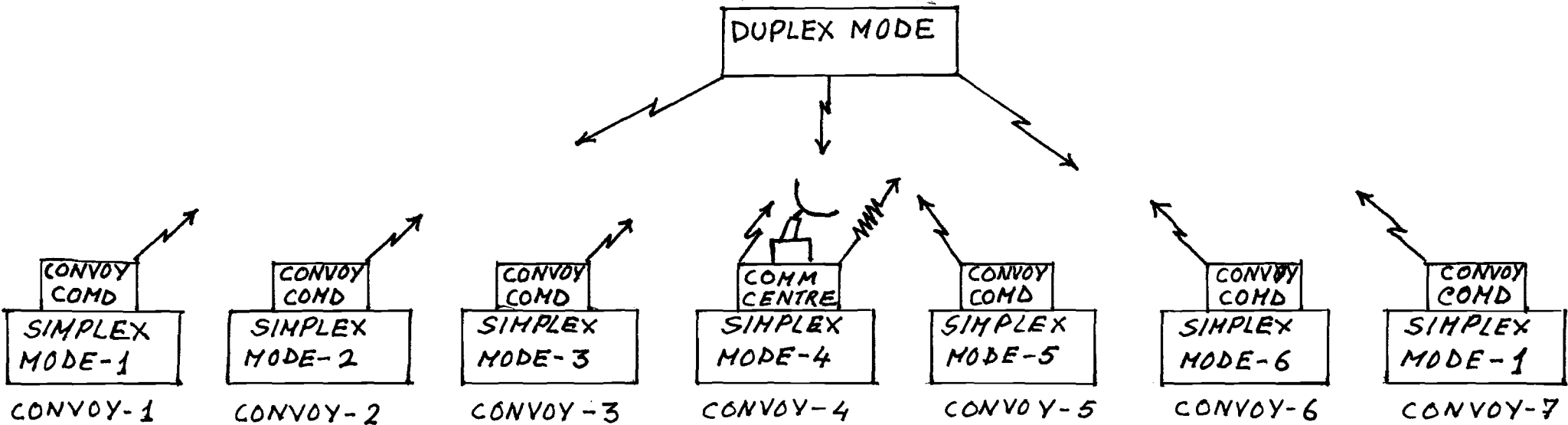
7. A fresh call signs will be issued later on depending on number of vehicles and number of convoys.

Other Information




8. To carry essential comm eqpt min 3 x truck will be required. To load these eqpt on truck min 10 x manpower will be required for min 3 hours. A list of essential comm eqpt will be issued later on. One of these trucks will act as the mobile comm centre which will provide all comm facilities as stated. It will have standby comm system and its own generator to provide power to comm centre.

9. Force Sig Offr is to be consulted for any clarification and confusion on sig matters of the operation.





2. UNAMIR is to assist in the security in Rwanda and is to support the humanitarian effort with a view to bringing about a rapid and effective end to the overall Rwandan crisis.

EXECUTION

3. Concept of Operation

a. Under such a variable, UNAMIR will need to re-adjust its modus-operandi and deployment along its borders in order to provide security and support to the Human Rights efforts and committee of experts to access, segregate and secure for future judicial process the suspected perpetrators of the genocide from the innocent refugees and displaced persons outside and within the HPZ and to also help prevent these perpetrators from returning in an organised military structure into Rwanda to destabilize the country. More and more information, including statements and actions by the COS of the RGF (MGen Bizimungu) indicate a near term willingness to return to Rwanda to conduct subversive military operations. UNAMIR troops including MILOBS and CIVPOLs will be deployed in Tanzania, Zaire, and Burundi if necessary and along the borders in overwhelming strength and in monitoring capabilities depending on the situation in order to demonstrate the determination to effectively use force once the need arises especially in separating the illegally armed elements among the millions of displaced persons in camps across the borders. Confidence building among the population, extensive assistance in carrying out humanitarian tasks by different agencies, provision of assistance of security for the continuation of the government of national unity and the ongoing transition to

peace in RWANDA is of paramount importance.

b. Formed units will be deployed accordingly to the following concept:

(1) Sectors 1 and 3 will have one independent infantry coy each deployed near the Sector HQ (between BUGARAMA - CYANGUGU and GISENYI - MUTOVU) and along the Eastern border (between MUGOGO - RURENGE). UNMOS will be deployed along the rest of the Rwandan borders.

(2) Sector 2 will maintain one coy deployed in the capital Kigali out of the motorized infantry battalion deployed along the Tanzania/Burundi border within boundaries with a capability of deploying up to three coys into the Tanzania/Burundi refugee camps on order.

(3) Sector 4 will have one mechanized battalion and two motorized battalions deployed in the three sub-sectors. The sub-sector 4C battalion must be able to deploy up to two coys into the Zaire refugee camps in the BUKAVU area. The capability of deploying up to one battalion into the Zaire or Tanzania refugee camps must be maintained. The Senegal/Chad Battalion must be ready for departure by Mid-September and replaced by a new motorized/mechanized battalion in sub-sector 4B.

(4) Sector 5 will have one independent infantry coy deployed near Sector HQ and one mechanized infantry battalion deploy along the Zaire border with the capability of moving up to three coys into the Zaire refugee camp areas.

c. The essential element that must be maintained under constant monitoring and prevented from happening is the

turning of the refugees camps across the borders into subversive camps from which EX-RGF, Gendarmerie and MILITIA/INTERHAMWE elements would be reorganized, re-equipped and receive training in guerilla operations and then infiltrate into RWANDA for underground subversive activities. This therefore calls for vigorous/intensive patrolling of the border areas, disarming as well as monitoring the activities of all potential illegal armed groups.

d. UNAMIR forces engaged in the cross-border operations in Zaire, Tanzania and Burundi will work under Chapter VII should the need arise.

b. Formed units will be deployed accordingly to the following concept:

(1) Sectors 1 and 3 will have one independent infantry coy each deployed near the Sector HQ (between BUGARAMA - CYANGUGU and GISENYI - MUTOVU) and along the Eastern border (between MUGOGO - RURENGE). UNMOS will be deployed along the rest of the Rwandan borders.

(2) Sector 2 will maintain one coy deployed in the capital Kigali out of the motorized infantry battalion deployed along the Tanzania/Burundi border within boundaries with a capability of deploying up to three coys into the Tanzania/Burundi refugee camps on order.

(3) Sector 4 will have one mechanized battalion and two motorized battalions deployed in the three sub-sectors. The sub-sector 4C battalion must be able to deploy up to two coys into the Zaire refugee camps in the BUKAVU area. The capability of deploying up to one battalion into the Zaire or Tanzania refugee camps must be maintained. The Senegal/Chad Battalion must be ready for departure by Mid-September and replaced by a new motorized/mechanized battalion in sub-sector 4B.

(4) Sector 5 will have one independent infantry coy deployed near Sector HQ and one mechanized infantry battalion deploy along the Zaire border with the capability of moving up to three coys into the Zaire refugee camp areas.

c. The essential element that must be maintained under constant monitoring and prevented from happening is the

turning of the refugees camps across the borders into subversive camps from which EX-RGF, Gendarmerie and MILITIA/INTERHAMWE elements would be reorganized, re-equipped and receive training in guerilla operations and then infiltrate into RWANDA for underground subversive activities. This therefore calls for vigorous/intensive patrolling of the border areas, disarming as well as monitoring the activities of all potential illegal armed groups.

d. UNAMIR forces engaged in the cross-border operations in Zaire, Tanzania and Burundi will work under Chapter VII should the need arise.

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
