BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE ON PROFESSOR RENE CASSIN,

Vice-President of the Conseil d'Etat.

- Professor at the Faculty of Law of Paris and at the Ecole Nationale d'Outre-Mer, delegate for France to the League of Nations (1924-38), honorary President of the French Ex-Service Men, the Professor René CASSIN has had, for a long time, a world renown for his works on Civil and International laws and for the part he took in International Conferences for Cooperation.
- Wounded in the 1914-19 war - decorated with the Military Medal, Croix de Guerre, Compagnon de l'Ordre de la Liberation and Commander of the Legion of Honour.
- He was the first civilian to leave Bordeaux to answer the appeal of General de Gaulle. Immediately after his arrival in London, on the 20th. of June 1940, he took an essential part in preparing the Churchill - de Gaulle Agreement, which maintained France in the Alliance and in the war, and which contained the promise of her integral restauration, of her grandeur and of her independence. This Agreement was the Chart of the Free French Forces. The Professor Cassin played an important part in the Republican orientation of Free France.
- Permanent Secretary of the Defense Council for the French Empire until 1941, he prepared or signed the first conventions concerning the Armies and the territories and he represented General de GAULLE in the Interallied Conferences held in London in 1941, namely in the Conference held for their adhesion to the Atlantic Chart.
- National Commissioner for Justice and Education in the first National Committee founded in London on 24th. September 1941, he took steps so that Republican laws in each of the freed Territories be respected or maintained. He took the initiative of creating, inside Fighting France, Commissions for the study of post-war problems, and he was one of the founders of the Interallied Conference of the Ministers for Education (now U.N.E.S.C.O.). He encouraged the French literature, the language, the culture, as well as French thought, chiefly in America, in the British Empire and in Orient. He visited all the French Establishments in the Levant, Palestine, Egypt, and Free French Africa.
- Ardent patriot and sincere democrat, he never ceased to keep contact by radio with the Ex-Service Men, the French Students, and the French Youth, in order to exalt their will to Resistance ... He was revoked, denationalized, and condemned to death by Vichy.

- President of the Juridical Committee of the Provisional Government

FERNAND DEHOUSSE

(Delegate of Belgium to the Economic and Social Council)

Fernand Dehousse, born at Liege in 1906, is Professor of International Law at the University of Liege and Principal Assistant to the Belgian Minister of Labor. He has also taught at the Academy of International Law at The Hague, and is the author of several books dealing with international law and other international problems.

A member of the Socialist Party and well-known for his activities in the Walloon movement, Professor Dehousse is one of the authors of the Socialist plan for the reorganization of Belgium on a federal basis. He was deprived of his functions during the German occupation, due to his attitude toward the invader, but became one of the editors of Le Monde du Travail (Labor World), an underground paper which was published throughout the occupation and has since become a daily newspaper.

Prof. Dehousse was a Delegate to the San Francisco Conference, the Preparatory Commission and the first session of the General Assembly and is today a member of the Belgian Commission on War Crimes and of the Conseil Culturel (Cultural Council) in Brussels.

BIOGRAPHY--DR. C. L. HSIA

Dr. C.L. Hsia (Hsia Ching-lin), as President and Director of Chinese News Service, is in charge of the Chinese Government information and publicity work in the United States ^{Canada and Mexico} and concurrently holds the position of Advisor to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Chinese Government.

Chinese News Service, organized by Dr. Hsia on his return to the United States from China in the fall of 1941, has its headquarters in Rockefeller Center in New York City, and has also established branch offices in San Francisco and Chicago.

Dr. Hsia studied in England and Scotland and received his B.S degree in Glasgow, and his MA and PhD degrees in Edinburgh. He is a specialist in international law, the subject of his doctoral thesis being "Treaty Relations Between China and Great Britain," which was published in 1923 under the title, "Studies in Chinese Diplomatic History."

On his return to China he combined academic work with Government service. He was dean of the Faculty of Southern University in Shanghai, Professor of International Law at Soochow Comparative Law School and professor of International Relations at National Chiao Tung University in Shanghai, and became President of Medhurst College in Shanghai in 1927 until he accepted the First Secretaryship of the Chinese Legation in London in 1931.

Among the Government posts, he was secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on the inauguration of the National Government at Nanking; he was a technical member of the first Chinese National Tariff Commission; he was for sometime editor of the Chinese Economic Journal. In the spring of 1932 he attended the World Disarmament Conference as China's technical delegate and was a technical expert to the two Extraordinary Assemblies of the League of Nations in connection with the Sino-Japanese Dispute. He was the First Secretary at the Chinese Legation in Washington in 1933.

Since 1934 Dr. Hsia has been a member of China's Legislative Yuan (Council) which compares with the United States Senate. In this position he took part in the drafting of China's permanent Constitution upon which China's future Government structure is to be based.

Dr. Hsia has also been active in social and religious work in China. He served for several years as a member of the Board of Managers of the Cheloo University, President of the Board of Directors of Ginling College in Nanking, a member of the Executive Committee and honorary treasurer of the National Christian Council of China, and attended an executive meeting of the International Missionary Council in Germany. He was twice member of the Chinese delegation to the Conference of the Institute of Pacific Relations.

Soon after the outbreak of war between China and Japan, he went to Moscow as a member of China's special diplomatic mission. He received a special assignment from his government first in England and later in the United States. In the summer of 1941 he accompanied Dr. Quo Tai-chi, then newly appointed Foreign Minister, from Washington to Chungking and travelled on the Burma Road. During his two months in Chungking he experienced some of the most terrific bombings that city has ever had.

He is the author of "Studies in Chinese Diplomatic History," "The Status of Shanghai," and a joint translation of "The Chinese Civil Code" and "The Chinese Criminal Code."

He also now serves:

1. As adviser to the Chinese Delegation to the Far Eastern Commission, of which he is the Chairman of the War Crimes Committee; and
2. As adviser and deputy to Dr. Quo Tai-chi, China's permanent representative on the Security Council of the United Nations.
