PART ONE. OVERVIEW OF THE MAIN THEATRE EVENTS OF THE PAST 24 HRS.

1. BRITCON. BRITCON went non operational at 1930 hrs local today. All troops less that those involved in the UNAMIR boat training at GISENYI are now based in KIGALI. The training at GISENYI will continue until midday tomorrow and the demolition of the UNAMIR ammunition will continue for as long as possible. The advance party for the move to KAMPALA will deploy tomorrow with the main body due to depart on 19 Nov 94.



PART ONE. OVERVIEW OF THE MAIN THEATRE EVENTS OF THE PAST 24 HRS.

1. BRITCON. NSTR.

PART TWO. LAND OPERATIONS.

2. ACTIVITY FOR THE PAST 24 HRS:

a. 9 PARA SQN RE.

(1) Worked at the CONCERN clinic in KIGALI and carried out maintainance work on the electricity and water supplies at KITABI. Carried out recce at KABARONDO (grid 6278) to assess repair work required at a clinic in that location.

(2) With the departure of the BRITCON engineer elements, there is not yet an agency to replace them for route maintenance within sector 4. To address this problem, there was an NGO meeting in GIKONGORO today where 9 PARA Sqn were able to provided valuable advice; the short term problem has been resolved.

(3) The boat training at GISENYI has started although not all the equipment was delivered by B&R and so only a limited amount of "dry" training has taken place so far. With the provision of the missing pieces, it is anticipated that the training on the water will start tomorrow.

(4) EOD. The provision of explosives continues to be a sticking point in the disposal of unwanted UNAMIR ammunition. It is becoming unlikely that BRITCON will be able to finish the task before 19 Nov 94.

b. 23 PFA. 23 PFA continue to provide medical advice to the treatment facility in KIBEHO. Surgeons continue to work at the MSF hospital in KIGALI but no surgical procedures were performed today. The contingent's psychiatrist has continued to work in the NDERA psychiatric hospital in KIGALI.

1. BRITCON. NSTR.

PART TWO. LAND OPERATIONS.

2. ACTIVITY FOR THE PAST 24 HRS:

a. 9 PARA SQN RE.

(1) 1 TP - KIGALI, The Tp returned to the clinic at MUKONO to follow up the work performed so far and to ensure that things were working well. Minor vandalism was repaired and a block in the pipe was cleared.

(2) 3 TP - KITABI/KIGALI, The site at KITABI is now stripped out and the bulk of the Tp is now in KIGALI, leaving a small rear party to assist 23 PFA Gp in the final days of operations. The water supply at the Belgian Village site has now been finished and running water will be available to the UNAMIR staff officers once the bladder is filled by B&R tomorrow.

(3) SP TP - KIGALI, All plant equipment borrowed/loaned from within RWANDA has now been returned. A team has deployed to GISENYI to start boat training for ETHIOBATT, FRAFBATT and TUNBATT on Lake KIVU on 15 Nov 94. The training will go on until 18 Nov 94 after which, AUSCON will continue with ~~the~~ it.

(4) EOD. The disposal of UNAMIR ammunition continues.

(1) Advisory work only, continues at KIBEHO. Surgical work continues at the MSF hospital in KIGALI and 4 procedures were carried out today. It is believed that currently, the only surgical team at the MSF hospital is being provided by BRITCON. In addition, the contingent's psychiatrist has been working in the NDERA psychiatric hospital in KIGALI.

PART ONE. OVERVIEW OF THE MAIN THEATRE EVENTS OF THE PAST 24 HRS.

1. BRITCON. NSTR

PART TWO. LAND OPERATIONS.

2. ACTIVITY FOR THE PAST 72 HRS:

a. 9 PARA SQN RE.

(1) 1 TP - BYUMBA, NICOY were escorted around a number of engineering projects for the NGO GOAL which it is hoped that they will be able to take on. Work at the BYUMBA clinic is now complete. With the work within the Prefecture now complete, the Tp has been withdrawn to KIGALI and the accommodation has been handed over to the sector MILOBs.

(2) 3 TP - KITABI/KIGALI. The work to dismantle the facilities at KITABI continue and will be 75% complete by 15 Nov 94. The concern clinic still requires considerable work which will keep the Tp busy for the next 5 days. In addition, another clinic in the east of the city has been stated and will provide work until 17 Nov 94.

(3) SP TP - KIGALI. The boats intended for patrolling Lake KIVU have been inspected and are in a good state of repair. The training is due to start on 15 Nov 94 and AUSCON have agreed to continue the training if it is not finished by 18 Nov 94. A recce of the site at GISENYI has confirmed its suitability for the training.

(4) MWF. The water bladder which will provide the Belgian Village complex with potable water is now in place. It will be filled once minor plumbing work has been completed within the complex.

(5) EOD. A limited amount of explosives have now been provided by UNAMIR for the disposal of the BELGIAN/BANGLADESHI ammunition. Although, it is hoped that the airport will be cleared which will release the troops currently guarding it. The problem over the use of the demolition ground has been resolved with the intervention of the RPA LO.

1. BRITCON. NSTR.

PART TWO. LAND OPERATIONS.

2. ACTIVITY FOR THE PAST 24 HRS:

a. 9 PARA SQN RE.

(1) 1 TP - BYUMBA, NICOY were escorted around a number of engineering projects for the NGO GOAL which it is hoped that they will be able to take on. Work at the BYUMBA clinic is now complete. With the work in the BYUMBA prefecture now complete, the Tp has been withdrawn to KIGALI and the accommodation has been handed over to the sector MILOBs.

(2) 3 TP - KITABI/KIGALI. The work to dismantle the facilities at KITABI continues and will be 75% complete by 15 Nov 94. The CONCERN clinic within KIGALI still requires considerable work which will keep the Tp busy for the next 6 days. Another clinic to the east of KIGALI will be started for the NGO AFRICARE tomorrow. Signs saying "beware mines" were placed at both ends of the KANZENZE bridge grid 0792.

(3) SP TP - KIGALI, The boats intended for patrolling Lake KIVU were inspected today and are in a good state of repair. The training is due to start on 15 Nov 94 and AUSCON have agreed to continue the training if it is not completed by 18 Nov 94. A recce of the site in GISENYI tomorrow will confirm the suitability of the location.

(4) MWF. The water bladder which will provide the Belgian Village complex with potable water is now in place. Once work to pipe the water around the complex is complete, then the bladder can be filled and there will be running water for the first time since May 94.

(5) EOD. Although time is running out to dispose of the BELGIAN/BANGLADSHI ammunition held within 3CSG and at the airport, work has begun with the limited amount of ammunition provided by CANCON. It is hoped that all the ammunition at the airfield will be disposed off which will negate the requirement for the GHANBATT guard.

d. 23 PFA.

(1) Today saw the final day of treatment by BRITCON in the camp a KIBEHO. Future involvement will be purely advisory. MSF continue to run the dysentery clinic within KIBEHO and CARE AUSTRALIA continue to provide support at the 2 satellite locations and the main treatment facility until CARITAS are able to provide assistance. The field surgical team will deploy to the central hospital in KIGALI to assist AUSMED throughout the coming week. Surgeons/anaesthetists continue to provide assistance at the MSF hospital in KIGALI.



PART ONE. OVERVIEW OF THE MAIN THEATRE EVENTS OF THE PAST 24 HRS.

1. BRITCON.

a. In addition to the work detailed below, all BRITCON personnel not on essential duty attended the UNAMIR act of remembrance in the AMAHORO stadium. In the afternoon, there was a friendly rugby match against AUSCON to foster inter contingent relations. After a well fought match, AUSCON won by 20 points to 16.

b. A significant incident within camp 4A/22 was reported by 23 PFA at 1900 hours, local, today. Although not all the facts are known yet, it appears that there was an incident involving grenades and small arms ammunition within the camp, reason not yet known. The NGOs working within the camp have now withdrawn and BRITCON MILINFO personnel are trying to obtain more information on the incident by interviewing eye witnesses. HQ UNAMIR and TAC HQ were given these initial details at approximately 1930 hours.

5. ACTIVITY FOR THE PAST 24 HRS:

a. 63 AB CS SQN RLC.

c. 9 PARA SQN RE.

(1) 1 TP - BYUMBA, The tasks at the MUKONO clinic are now complete and the recce report from the RUSHADI is still awaited; it is hoped that what BRITCON start in this clinic with NICOY will continue after 17 Nov 94.

(2) 3 TP - KITABI/KIGALI. Work continues with the dismantling of facilities at KITABI to ensure that it will be left in a better state than when we arrived. The work on the CONCERN clinic continues with electrical, plumbing, plastering and brickwork.

(3) SP TP - KIGALI, The plan to train the 3 contingents with coasts on lake KIVU continues. BRITCON are able to commence training on 15 Nov 94 with tests being held on 18 Nov 94. The training will take place at the maritime school in GISENYI unless a more appropriate location is found. The primary concern remains the question of the maintenance of the engines once BRITCON depart.

(4) MWF. The work continues to provide bulk water to the Belgian Village complex.

(5) EOD. With insufficient serviceable explosives being provided through the UN procurement system, the planned disposal of BELGIAN/BANGLADESHI ammunition has not begun. The explosives which have been requested, have not yet

been provided and there is now insufficient time to accomplish the task before BRITCON become non operational on 17 Nov 94.

(1) Treatment continued at the main treatment facility at KIBEHO with CARE AUSTRALIA treating IDPs at the 2 satellite locations under BRITCON guidance. 




