Disposal of surplus foodstocks in Leopoldville

I refer to the conversation of today between Messrs. Nicolas, Carvin and Lezmi concerning the removal from the BOD of the surplus foodstocks donated to WHO.

I wish to confirm that the removal must be completed not later than Thursday 30 July 1964 at 14.00 hours as TAN/SF is cancelling the contract of the depot as of 31 July 1964. The Chief Transport Officer has provided six trucks to that effect.

If there are any remaining stocks after that date I shall assume that WHO is not interested in acquiring the stocks and I will dispose of them elsewhere.

1. I refer to your memorandum of 17 and 21 July 1964 ref. C/Agw/310/1/2/174/24 concerning the disposal of surplus foodstuffs held in Leopoldville.

2. I wish to inform you that the Technical Assistance Board is interested in acquiring these stores to utilize them for various Specialized Agencies' projects. It is understood that these foodstuffs have to be collected by 31st July at the latest and any transport charges should be borne by the Agency concerned.

3. I shall be grateful if your Section will secure the necessary authorization for the transfer of these stores to the following Specialized Agencies :

4. WHO

The items mentioned on the attached list (Annex I) are required by WHO which has undertaken to make a free distribution to various hospitals and charitable institutions in the provinces of Leopoldville, Kivu, Shaba, Congo Central and Walunda. A list of the receiving institutions will be submitted as soon as the distribution will be completed.

Mr. Pennecoucke will collect immediately these foodstuffs and will sign the appropriate Receipt Vouchers. The Chief Transport Officer has kindly given his assistance in providing 2 trucks for a couple of days.

5. UNESCO

The items mentioned on the attached list (Annex II) are required by the I.E.S. School (Institut Pédagogique National) for their boarding students. The I.E.S. Superintendent will collect immediately these stores and will store them in the I.E.S. warehouses.


