Subject: Report on dead bodies found in Rushita Prison

Following your instructions at the morning's briefing on 27 Apr. 95, I have to inform you that UNAMIR Sitrep draft to New York stated that UNHCR and CIVPOL have reported that 28 dead bodies were found in Rustita prison GR 7431 while about 10 others were too weak even to stand without assistance.

2. It is unfortunate to mention that CIVPOL has not submitted any report about the above-stated incident. However, enquires made on the issue revealed as follows:
 - a. CIVPOL HQ nor any of our monitoring teams deployed in the Prefectures have no knowledge about the incident.
 - b. The procedure for submission of my sitrep is: confirmed reports are first submitted to COS/Operations for the Sitrep to UN HQ NY and details to the SRSG and FC.
 - c. Based on the mentioned report, further enquires were made from G3 Oprs./UNAMIR HQ and it has been established that the source of the information is from TAC HQ/Butare.
 - d. CIVPOL Monitoring Team - Butare that works closely with TAC HQ has no knowledge about the report.
3. I would therefore appreciate it in future if UNAMIR HQ Oprs will only report about articles submitted by CIVPOL HQ in the UNAMIR Sitrep to UN HQ NY.

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:1. POLITICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE:GNU/OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:1.1 PMT - RUHENGHERI PREFECTURE

Reported that on 9/5/95 at 10:15 hrs, a meeting comprised of all Bourgmestres in the communes and NGOs in the prefecture was held and presided over by the prefect of Ruhengeri. The prefect during his brief urged the NGOs to change their emergency programme to long-term development programme and also to report to the prefect their activities on monthly basis. He further reiterated that IDPs who had recently returned to the communes should leave to their original communes.

1.2. RPA :

The team also reported that RPA continued mounting of checkpoints at several points in and outside Ruhengeri where UN vehicles are subjected to thorough search.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:1. POLITICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE:GNU/OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:PMT - RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

Reported that the Prefect of Ruhengeri on 5/5/95 at about 1200 hours, addressed about 3,000 locals at Ndusu commune. 900 IDPs who had just returned to the communes from Gitarama were also in attendance.

The Prefect during the address expressed fear of insecurity due to the presence of the IDPs whom he said were ex-criminals and warned them to leave the commune within one week or be forced to do so. He also warned the locals to be law abiding and dispel the rumors of revenge killings which have been lingering in the commune.

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Reported that the Archbishop of Canterbury Dr. George arrived in Kigali on 9/5/95 on a five day mission.

Rwanda. The visit is to reassure the Anglican community in Rwanda after the unfortunate war that claimed a number of Christians in Rwanda.

The Team visited Nyamirambo Brigade where the commandant expressed regret over the upsurge in armed robbery and car hijacking, he blamed the situation to poor logistics of the force. The officer however disclosed that a number of crime prevention strategies have been put in place to address the menace of armed robbers. He also appeals to UNAMIR to make local police motorised so as to respond rapidly to distress calls.

Reported that the Assistant Bourgmestre of Muganza Commune has directed that UNAMIR vehicles must produce a permit from the Prefect of Butare before they would be allowed to move in the area.

1.2 RPA:PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

A. Reported that 26 vehicles belonging to 3 Tanzanian nationals have been impounded by RPA at Gisenyi Airport since 8 Apr. 95. The vehicles which include trucks and tankers were from Tanzania and were passing through the country to Zaire through Gisenyi border post. No reason has been given by RPA for the incident. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

A. Patrolled Tambwe Commune on 4 May 95 and reported that 47 locals have been confined under RPA guard in the Commune HQ. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:1. POLITICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE:1.1 MILITIA:PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that there was an infiltration attempt in the border belt of the Mutovo area on 26 Apr. 95. In the process, one of the infiltrators was killed and an unknown number of them were injured. While withdrawing, they reportedly threw grenades into the tents of the Leopard Battalion (Zairian Forces employed by UNHCR) in the vicinity of Kibumba Camp.

PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

Reported of intensification of patrols in the Volcanic forests in the northern part of the area where there is a suspected attack by FRGF. The RPA 2nd Battalion Commander when contacted by the team on 3 May 95 confirmed that there have been exchange of fire incidents between RPA and FRGF militia men in recent times hence heavy deployment of RPA soldiers in the area.

The team thereafter interviewed 14 locals including the counsellor's mother. They all explained that the allegations against the priest were unfounded.

2.2 PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that on 25 Apr. 95 at about 23.00 hrs 9 men of which 3 were armed and wearing military uniforms with guns forced themselves into a house in a cellule in Mutura Commune.
