### EXPLANATORY NOTES

When the archives of the United Nations War Crimes Commission were transferred to the United Nations Archives in May 1949, they were accompanied by a "Preliminary Draft Index" and five supplements (not cumulated) which had been prepared by the Commission as guides to its minutes and documents. In order to facilitate reference to the records, the present index has been prepared by amalgamating the six earlier indexes. No additions or alterations have been made, and the entries have been listed chronologically under the same headings used in the original indexes.
