





Under operative paragraph 6, the Secretary-General is requested to continue his efforts towards large-scale circulation and dissemination of the Declaration.

Offers by Member States of study and training facilities

8. By resolution 1849 (XVII) adopted on 19 December 1962 the General Assembly once more invites the co-operation of the Administering Members concerned to take all necessary measures to ensure that all scholarships and training facilities are utilized by inhabitants of the Non-Self-Governing Territories and to render effective assistance to those persons who have applied for, or have been granted scholarships or fellowships, particularly with regard to facilitating their travel formalities.

Racial discrimination in Non-Self-Governing Territories

9. By resolution 1850 (XVII) adopted on 19 December 1962 the General Assembly solemnly reaffirmed its resolute condemnation of the policy and practice of racial discrimination in the Non-Self-Governing Territories, and in operative paragraph 2 :

"Urges the Administering Members to give immediate effect to the Declaration on the granting of independence to colonial countries and peoples in the Territories under their administration so that an end will be put to racial discrimination in all forms and in all fields;"

10. By operative paragraph 3 of this resolution, the General Assembly refers the report of the Secretary-General on racial discrimination in the Non-Self-Governing Territories and the summary records of the discussion on that report to the attention of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples. Accordingly, the Secretary-General will transmit the documents concerned to that Special Committee.

Composition of the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories

11. With the seventeenth session of the General Assembly the terms of office of Argentina and Ceylon expired. At the same time, the Netherlands had withdrawn from the membership of the Committee as a result of the agreement reached between the Governments of Indonesia and the Netherlands. Therefore, the Fourth Committee was required to elect only one Member. As the result of the voting Honduras was elected. Accordingly, for the year 1963, the Committee is composed of seven Members responsible for transmission

of information under Article 73 e of the Charter, i.e., Australia, France, New Zealand, Portugal, Spain, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America; and of seven Members elected by the Fourth Committee on behalf of the General Assembly, i.e., Ecuador, Honduras, Liberia, Mexico, Pakistan, Philippines and Upper Volta.

Date and place of the 1963 session of the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories

12. It has been provisionally arranged that the fourteenth session of the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories should be convened to meet at Headquarters in New York on 15 April 1963. In the near future the Secretary-General will send a further communication to members of the Committee in connexion with the 1963 session.

PREPARATION AND TRAINING OF INDIGENOUS CIVIL AND TECHNICAL
CADRES IN NON-SELF-GOVERNING TERRITORIES

Note by the Secretary-General

1. By resolution 1697 (XVI) of 19 December 1961, the Secretary-General was requested to prepare a special report on the preparation and training of indigenous civil and technical cadres in Non-Self-Governing Territories for the consideration of the General Assembly at its seventeenth session. The resolution also requested that in such a report the information transmitted by the Administering Members should be taken into account, as well as the observations, recommendations and conclusions thereon of the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories.
2. In compliance with this request and in order to facilitate discussion of this subject at the seventeenth session of the General Assembly, the Secretariat submits the following brief survey of the documentation provided to the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories and to the General Assembly since 1961. The Secretariat has not prepared an extensive study on the substance of this matter in the belief that the recent documentation reviewed by the Committee on Information in May 1962 may serve the General Assembly as relevant documentation for its deliberations concerning the preparation and training of indigenous civil and technical cadres in the Non-Self-Governing Territories. Moreover, apart from the information referred to in this paper, only a small amount of new material has reached the Secretary-General. If desired, however, a more comprehensive analysis of the subject under review could be prepared for a future session of the General Assembly.

3. During the last two years, increasing attention has been paid by the Administering Members to the problem of accelerating the participation and training of indigenous civil and technical cadres in the Non-Self-Governing Territories. It has been recognized that the existence of these cadres is essential to the effective implementation of successful programmes of political, educational, social and economic development in the Non-Self-Governing Territories.
4. Information on the preparation and training of indigenous civil and technical cadres was transmitted for the first time in detail in 1961 by the Governments of Australia, the Netherlands, New Zealand, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America, in accordance with General Assembly resolution 1534 (XV) of 15 December 1960. Consequently, the documentation of the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories at its twelfth session (1961) included some data on the policies of the Governments concerned and an account of certain developments in this field.
5. During its twelfth session, the Committee on Information also had before it a preliminary note submitted by the Secretariat in the form of a sample study, setting out the available information on the preparation and training of indigenous civil and technical cadres in Kenya, Fiji and the Bahamas under the administration of the United Kingdom.^{1/}
6. As the information referred to in paragraph 4 above reached the Committee on Information too late for detailed consideration at its twelfth session, the Committee reported to the General Assembly that owing to the lack of information it had been unable to examine fully the question of the preparation and training of indigenous civil and technical cadres in the Non-Self-Governing Territories. The Committee annexed to its report to the General Assembly the information transmitted by the Administering Members and the texts of the oral statements they had made before the Committee.^{2/} It also directed the Secretariat to prepare an analysis of the information contained in the reports and comments of the Non-Administering Members. This analysis was submitted as a separate report to the sixteenth session of the General Assembly.^{3/}

7. After noting the observations of the Committee on Information, the General Assembly adopted resolution 1697 (XVI) on 19 December 1961. In this resolution, the General Assembly considered that, in the light of the Declaration on the granting of independence to colonial countries and peoples, contained in its resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960, immediate steps should be taken to transfer all powers to the peoples of the Non-Self-Governing Territories without any conditions or reservations, and that the rapid preparation and training of the indigenous personnel would help towards the achievement of the purposes of the said resolution. It again requested the Administering Members to transmit complete and detailed information concerning the training facilities for, and current strength, composition and state of preparation of civil and technical cadres in the Territories under their respective administrations to the Committee on Information at its thirteenth session.

8. At its thirteenth session (1962), the Committee had before it the summaries of information for 1960 transmitted under Article 73 e of the Charter,^{4/} and special studies on education prepared for that session.^{5/} The Committee also received separate reports from the Governments of Australia and New Zealand on the preparation and training of indigenous civil and technical cadres in the Territories under their administration which were intended to supplement their earlier reports on this subject to the previous session of the Committee.^{6/}

9. One of the studies prepared by the Secretariat^{7/} presented a survey of educational facilities and special training programmes in a number of Non-Self-Governing Territories in Africa and the Caribbean area, among them Kenya, Uganda, Nyasaland, Northern Rhodesia, Basutoland, Bechuanaland and Swaziland, Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago, and British Guiana. The Study found that, despite the efforts which have been made in African Territories to expand and improve the educational systems, the supply of qualified indigenous manpower has been

seriously impeded by the unsatisfactory quality and output of primary education and the limited opportunities for secondary and post-secondary education. According to the study, there were only two Territories, Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago, in which a stage had been reached where positions of high administrative and professional responsibility could be filled by indigenous personnel. It concluded that much remained to be done in most Territories by way of the expansion of educational facilities and training programmes so as to meet the need for qualified indigenous staff at the intermediate and top levels of the public services.

10. At the thirteenth session of the Committee on Information, a number of Administering Members also gave additional information on the preparation of indigenous civil and technical cadres in their statements to the Committee.^{8/} The Committee took note of the measures that were being taken by the Administering Members to train indigenous civil and technical cadres both within the framework of the general educational system of the Territories and by means of special systems of training. As the subject was closely related to the general educational advancement of the Territories, the Committee covered in detail the problems concerning the training of indigenous civil and technical cadres during its discussion of educational advancement in the Non-Self-Governing Territories.

11. In its comments on secondary and higher education, the Committee emphasized the urgent need for a rapid expansion of secondary and higher education facilities to meet the pressing shortage of qualified indigenous teachers, administrators and professional and technical personnel. The Committee urged the Administering Members to intensify their efforts to this end, and expressed the view that only with the co-operation of the Administering Members and concentrated effort on the part of the Territories themselves could such an expansion and improvement be achieved.

Noting the observation of the Committee that because of the lack of information it has not been able fully to examine the problem of the preparation and training of indigenous civil servants and technical personnel in Non-Self-Governing Territories,^{2/}

Considering that in the light of the Declaration on the granting of independence to colonial countries and peoples contained in its resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960 immediate steps shall be taken to transfer all powers to the peoples of the Non-Self-Governing Territories without any conditions or reservations,

Believing that the rapid preparation and training of indigenous, civil and technical cadres in Non-Self-Governing Territories will help towards the achievement of the purposes of resolution 1514 (XV),

1. Considers that the situation prevailing in various dependent territories in respect of the strength, composition and state of training of indigenous civil servants and technical personnel is unsatisfactory;
2. Regrets that due attention has not been paid to that problem;
3. Urges the Administering Members to take immediately all necessary measures to increase the strength of indigenous civil service and technical cadres and to accelerate their training in public administration and other essential technical skills;
4. Further urges the Administering Members to take more extensive and expeditious measures towards the replacement of expatriate personnel by indigenous officers, especially in positions of high administrative responsibility;
5. Invites once again the Administering Members to make fuller use of the United Nations technical assistance programme for training in public administration and related fields;
6. Requests the Administering Members to transmit complete and detailed information concerning the training facilities for, and current strength, composition and state of the preparation of, civil and technical services in the Territories under their respective administrations, in time for its careful examination and study by the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories at its next session;
7. Requests the Secretary-General to prepare a special report on that subject, for the consideration of the General Assembly at its seventeenth session, taking into account the information submitted by the Administering Members and the observations, recommendations and conclusions thereon of the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories.
