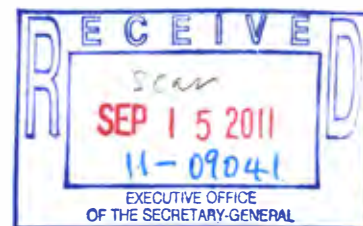

*Dear Mr. Secretary General,*

I would like to thank you for your letter dated 30 August 2011, in which you provide an account of the prospective key challenges which Libya will have to face and the proposed response of the international community.

Cyprus fully shares your assessment of the situation in Libya and of the key challenges to be addressed, and underlines the urgent need for the provision of humanitarian assistance to Libya. Also, the establishment of the right conditions which will lead to its safe access into the country is essential. Libya and its people are entering into a new era. Sincere, effective, well-coordinated international support remains essential for building a stable and democratic nation and for the future progress of the country.

We stand ready to provide, both bilaterally and within the context of the European Union, all possible assistance to the people of Libya at this time of transition. 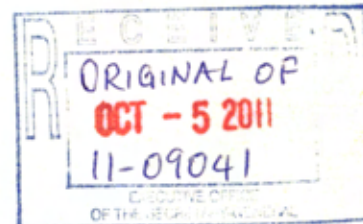

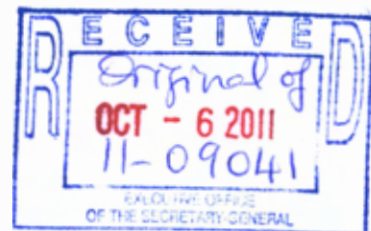
