Dear Mr. Cooper:

The Public Safety Division, USAID, is engaged in a program of aiding the Congolese Police, as is the UN itself. One of the major portions of this program is concerned with reopening the National Police School at Matete, Leopoldville. One of the major needs of this school is for refrigeration for foodstuffs.

Through UN contacts, it was learned that several large institutional-type vertical freezers are available for sale as UN surplus. Personnel of this Division examined them together with Mr. Mommessin of the UN and determined that one could be adapted to the needs of the school.

In accordance with what I am informed is the price set by your office, I offer on behalf of USAID the sum of 90,000 Congolese francs for one of these freezers.

Please advise me as soon as possible if this bid is acceptable and when delivery might be obtained.

I would also be interested in other items of institutional kitchenware that might become available in the future, such as large cooking pots, pans, and so forth.

1. Further to my memorandum of 4 April 1964, ref CivOps 592/64, concerning the disposal of 1307 kgs of fresh potatoes unfit for human consumption, I wish to point out the following facts:

(a) your Section issued an authority to Mr. Spatrizano to collect these stores on 6 April 1964. Mr. Spatrizano went on Thursday, 9 April 1964 to the Supply Depot, Fresh Unit, Kalina, and the officer in charge refused to hand over to him these supplies saying that no instructions were received for such an issue;

(b) immediately, Mr. Spatrizano contacted Mr. Lazmi and the latter gave him copy of your memorandum to the Senior Supply and Transport Officer (ref C/AGM/2/5 of 6 April 1964). A truck was put at Mr. Spatrizano's disposal on Friday, 10 April 1964, so he went again to the Depot, and after waiting for more than an hour, was again refused.

2. In the circumstances, we do not wish to pursue the question and you may dispose of the potatoes elsewhere.
