2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, MR SHAHARYAR M KHAN MET TODAY WITH THE UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E MR DAVID RAWSON. HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE U.S STATE DEPARTMENT, TO DISCUSS U.S RWANDA RELATIONS, COOPERATION BETWEEN RWANDA AND THE UNITED NATIONS, AND THE RECENT MID-TERM REVIEW OF THE DONOR ROUNDTABLE CONFERENCE HELD IN KIGALI. THE SRSG ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH SENIOR UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS PREPARATIONS FOR THE SECRETARY-GENERAL'S IMMINENT VISIT TO RWANDA.

B. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME, STATED YESTERDAY AT AN OFFICIAL RECEPTION HELD FOR REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DONOR COMMUNITY, THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA HAD DONE EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO FACILITATE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES AND TO ENSURE THEIR SECURITY BACK HOME. HE ALSO REPORTEDLY ADDED THAT THERE WAS NO LONGER ANY ETHNIC ANIMOSITY AMONG RWANDESE NATIONALS DUE TO THE CORRECTIVE POLICIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS TO GIHARA HEALTH CENTRE IN RUNDA COMMUNE GR 9882 . THE CLINIC IS RUN BY MEDICUS MUNDI .IT HAS 27 BEDS. AND ABOUT 80 -100 PATIENTS ARE TREATED DAILY. IT HAS 5 MEDICAL STAFF INCLUDING A DOCTOR AND 4 ASSISTANTS .ELECTRICITY WAS AVAILABLE THROUGH A LOCAL GENERATOR. PIPE-BORNE WATER WAS ALSO AVAILABLE. THE STAFF DID NOT COMPLAIN ABOUT ANY DEFICIENCY.

(C) THE SEC CDR AND THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM VISITED NYANZA PRISON IN KIGOMA COMMUNE 7649 WHERE THEY FOUND ALL PREMISES TO BE READY FOR ACCOMMODATION OF 400 PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA PRISON NEXT WEEK. ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE DIRECTOR OF THE PRISON AND ICRC REPRESENTATIVE WERE MADE TO MEET ON MONDAY 10 JULY , TO DEFINE FINALLY THE DETAILS OF TRANSFERRING THE PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA TO NYANZA.

(D) THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM ALSO VISITED THE NYANZA ORPHANAGE AND REPORTED IT'S STATE TO BE IN POOR CONDITION. THE ORPHANAGE NEEDS BEDS, AND REQUIRED CLEANING OF SEPTIC TANKS.

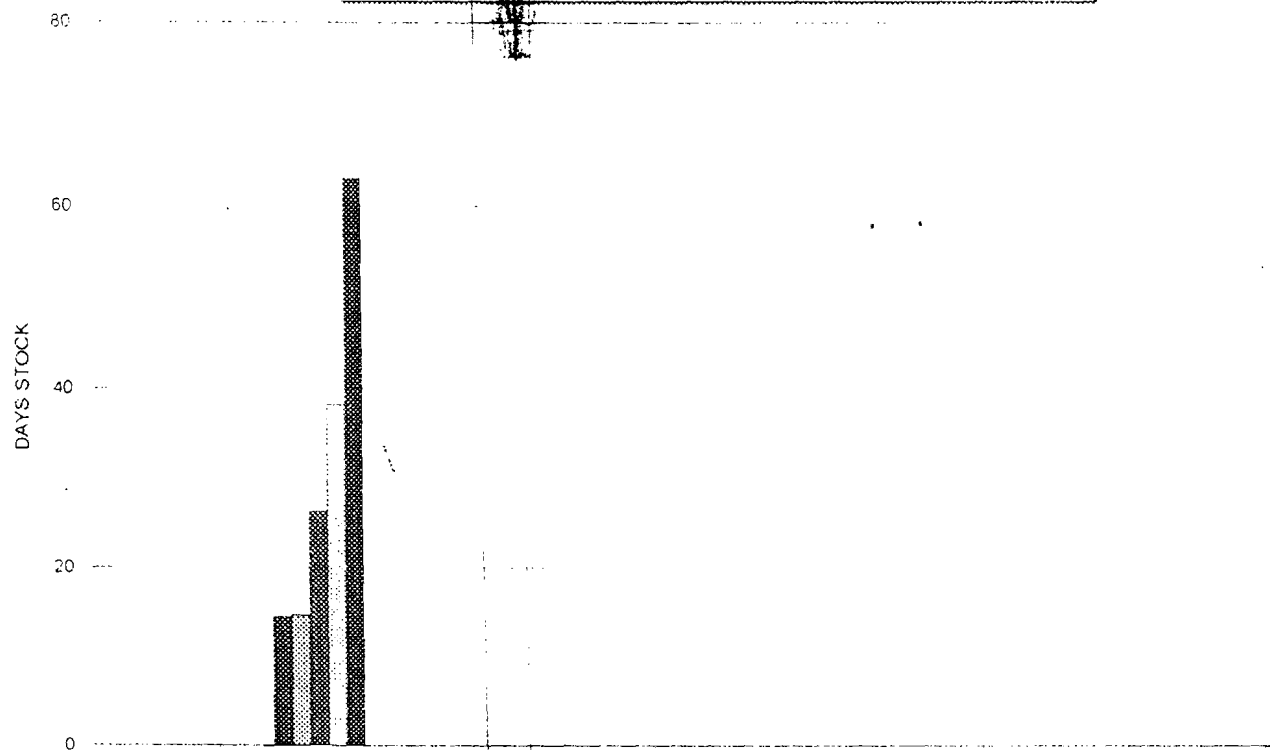

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. SECTOR 5 MILOBS (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS MANNED CHECKPOINT ALONG RUHENGIRI-GISENYI ROAD AT 0622 HRS. A HAND GRENADE WAS THROWN AT A TRUCK WHICH FAILED TO STOP AT THE CHECKPOINT. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED HOWEVER SOME DAMAGE WAS REPORTEDLY DONE TO THE TRUCK.

B. MILITIA/FRGF.

(1) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ARMED MEN COMING FROM ZAIRE KILLED ADMINISTRATOR OF MUHEWYE COMMUNE ON 7 JUL 95 AT ABOUT 1900HRS.

(2) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT TUTIS GANGS ARE REPORTED BY THE LOCALS TO HAVE SUMMARILY ARRESTED PEOPLE AND DISPOSSED THEM OF THEIR PROPERTY. ANYONE COMPLAINING OF THIS BEHAVIOUR IS IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED AND TURNED OVER TO RPA UNDER THE ACCUSATION OF GENOCIDE. APPROPRIATE AGENCIES INFORMED BY MILOBS FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATION.

(2) FC RECEIVED COURTESY VISIT FROM BGEN CHIZIKO OF MALAWI ON DEPARTURE AFTER HIS VISIT TO MALAWICOY ON OCCASION OF MALAWI NATIONAL DAY AND UNAMIR MEDAL PARADE. FC ALSO RECEIVED A COURTESY VISIT FROM BGEN ASHEI OF NIGERIA AFTER HIS VISIT TO NIBATT ON OCCASION OF THEIR NATIONAL ARMY DAY AND MEDAL PARADE. FC RECEIVED COURTESY VISIT FROM COL AIED OF TUNBATT ON HIS DEPARTURE FROM THE MISSION AREA.

(3) FC MET WITH SRSG TO DISCUSS UPCOMING SECRETARY GENERAL'S VISIT ON 13 TO 14 JULY. THEY DISCUSSED ALSO POINTS PRIORITIES FOR CONSIDERATION, INCLUDING UNAMIR MILOBS OUTSIDE AREA AND FORCE REDUCTION ISSUES.

(4) FC ATTENDED A WORKING LUNCH HOSTED BY UNDP ON THE ENHANCEMENT OF SECURITY FOR INTERNATIONAL VISITORS AND RWANDAN NATIONALS. THE GUEST SPEAKER WAS MR. SETH SENDASHONGA, MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT. A FIGURE OF 400,000 DOLLARS WAS PLEDGED BY UNDP TOWARD THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE CIVILIAN POLICE ACADEMY.

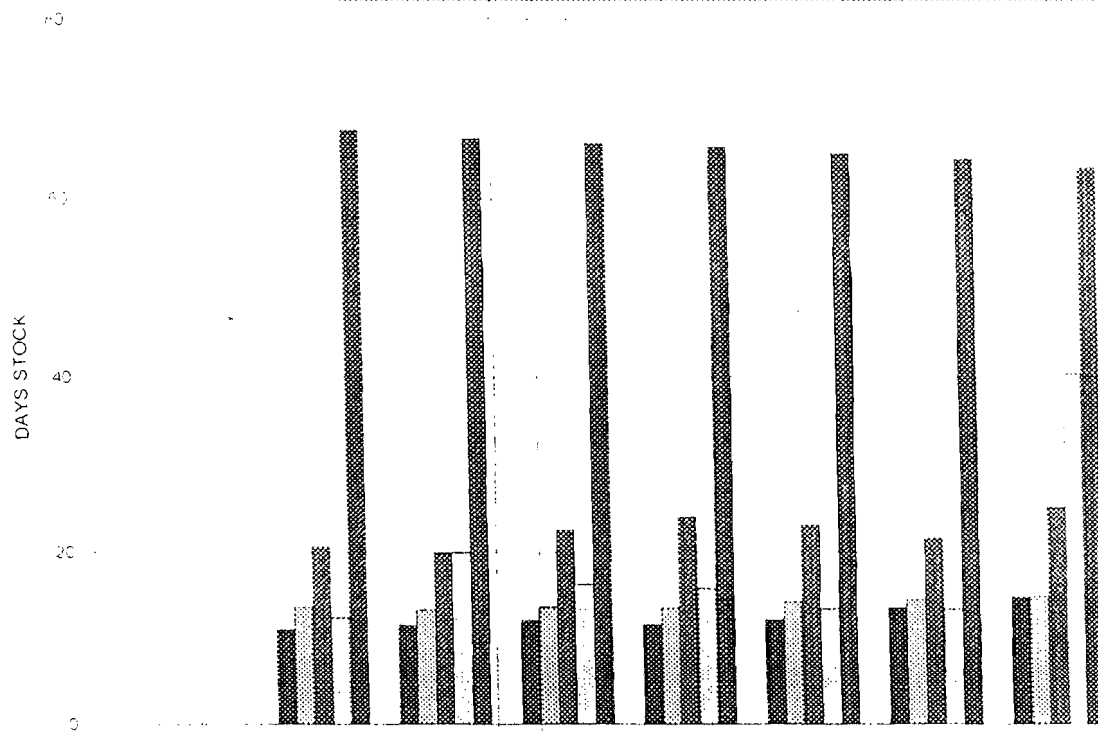

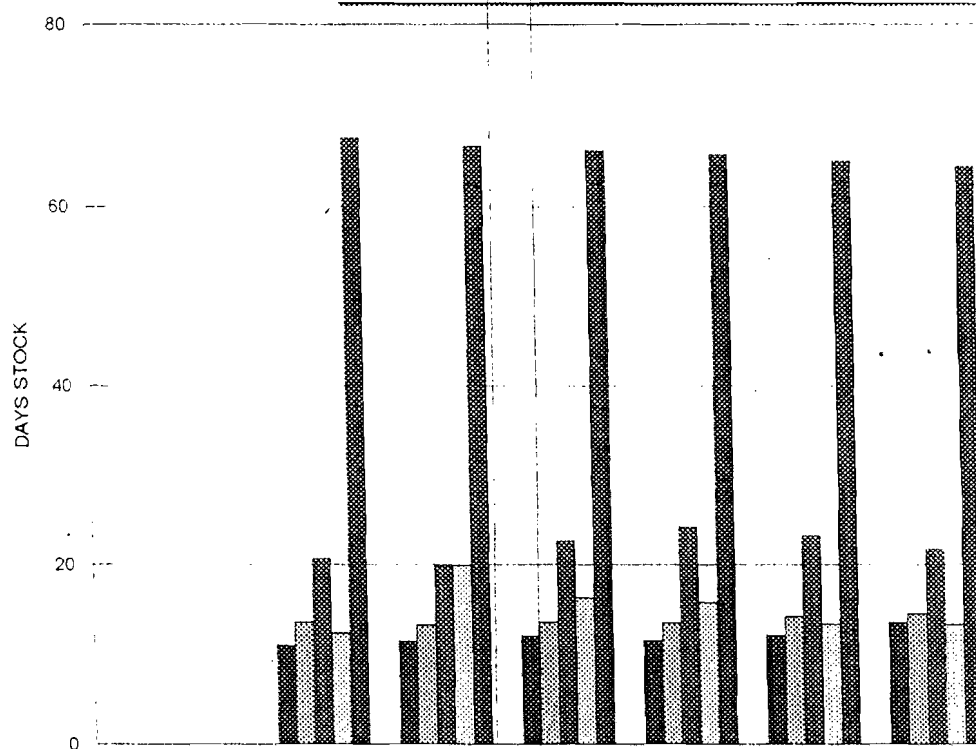

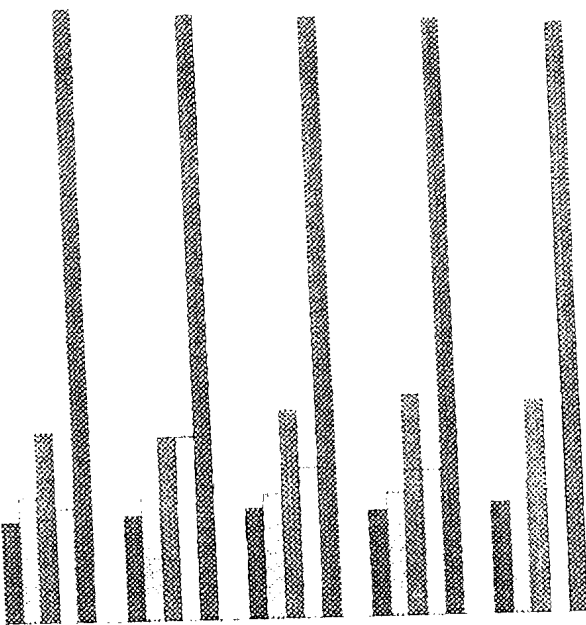

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, THE FC AND OTHER SENIOR UNAMIR OFFICIALS ATTENDED FESTIVITIES COMMEMORATING THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE RPA'S TAKEOVER OF KIGALI ON 04 JULY 95.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) LOCALS OF THE GISHYITA COMMUNE IN THE KIBUYE PREFECTURE INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 02 JUL 95, 14 PERSONS OF MARA SECTOR (GR 2068) TRYING TO ESCAPE TO ZAIRE BY BOAT WERE SHOT AND KILLED BY RPA TROOPS AT KIBEHO GISORO CELLULE (GR 1868). SEVEN OF THE VICTIMS HAVE ALLEGEDLY BEEN BURIED WHILE THE OTHER SEVEN WERE STILL MISSING. THE BOAT WHICH WAS INTENDED FOR THE CROSSING IS REPORTED TO BE KEPT BY THE RPA IN THEIR CAMP AT MPEMBE.

(2) MILOBS PATROL TO THE RWAMIKO COMMUNE (GR 4914) WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS ABOUT RPA HARASSMENT IN THE COMMUNE. LOCALS ALLEGED THAT THEIR LIVESTOCK AND CATTLE WERE BEING SEIZED BY RPA SOLDIERS MOSTLY FROM BUTARE ACCOMPANIED BY TUTSI CIVILIANS. THE NORMAL PRACTICE WAS FOR THE RPA SOLDIERS TO SEIZE THE CATTLE ONCE THE TUTSI CIVILIANS IDENTIFIED THE CATTLE AS THEIRS. THERE IS NO HOPE OF RECOVERY OR APPEAL. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

A. GENERAL DEVELOPMENTS

I. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR RWANDA, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, RETURNED TO KIGALI ON 26 JUNE FOLLOWING AN EXTENDED ABSENCE FROM THE

MISSION AREA.

II. THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA, H.E. MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, LEFT KIGALI ON 25 JUNE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 31ST SUMMIT CONFERENCE OF THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY (OAU) HELD IN ADDIS ABABA, ETHIOPIA FROM 26 TO 28 JUNE, 1995.

III. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, STATED AT THE 62ND MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE OF AFRICAN FOREIGN MINISTERS HELD IN ADDIS ABABA THAT THE NEWLY-FORMED RWANDESE POLITICAL PARTY, THE RALLY FOR RETURN AND FOR DEMOCRACY IN RWANDA (RDR), WAS COMPOSED OF FORMER MEMBERS OF THE MRND PARTY OF THE LATE PRESIDENT HABYARIMANA WHO INTENDED TO OFFER PROTECTION TO THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENOCIDE IN RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY URGED AFRICAN LEADERS TO IGNORE STATEMENTS MADE BY THE LEADERS OF THE RDR PARTY.

IV. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN AND MINISTER FOR INFORMATION, MR. JEAN BAPTISTE NKURIYINGOMA, STATED IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT DID NOT INTEND TO CONDUCT POLITICAL NEGOTIATIONS WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES AS NEGOTIATIONS IMPLIED THE SETTING OF CONDITIONS BETWEEN PARTIES. HE EXPLAINED THAT THE GOVERNMENT ONLY INTENDED TO CONTINUE CONTACTS WITH INNOCENT RWANDESE REFUGEES IN ORDER TO PERSUADE THEM TO RETURN HOME.

V. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT RWANDESE PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU DELIVERED A SPEECH AT THE 31ST OAU SUMMIT CONFERENCE ON 27 JUNE IN ADDIS ABABA IN WHICH HE SOUGHT THE LIFTING OF THE U.N. ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA BECAUSE, HE CLAIMED, FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FORCES IN EXILE WERE REARMING IN PREPARATION FOR AN ARMED ATTACK ON RWANDA.

VI. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE ZAIREAN PRIME MINISTER, MR. KENGO WA DONDO, IN A PUBLIC ADDRESS IN GOMA, ZAIRE, STATED THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE SOUGHT THE RETURN HOME OF ALL RWANDESE REFUGEES AS THEY WERE CREATING A CLIMATE OF INSECURITY. HE REPORTEDLY ADDED THAT THE PRESENCE OF RWANDESE REFUGEES IN ZAIRE POSED AN OBSTACLE TO THE ORGANISATION OF ELECTIONS TO BE HELD IN ZAIRE IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

**B. SIGNIFICANT MEETINGS OF SRSG**

I. THE SRSG MET THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, ON 29 JUNE TO DISCUSS UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE. THE PRIME MINISTER WELCOMED THE NEW MANDATE,

BUT ADDED THAT HE BELIEVED THE CURRENT DECEMBER 8TH DEADLINE SHOULD NOT BE CONSIDERED THE FINAL EXPIRATION DATE OF UNAMIR'S MANDATE, AND THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT WOULD CONTINUE TO SEEK UNAMIR'S ROLE IN THE COUNTRY'S ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED THE NEED FOR SWIFT JUSTICE IN RWANDA, THE FORTHCOMING DONOR'S ROUNDTABLE CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN KIGALI FROM 6 TO 7 JULY, AS WELL AS THE NEED FOR THE EARLY REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

II. THE SRSG EXCHANGED VIEWS WITH THE CHIEF OF THE U.N. HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION IN BURUNDI, MR. Drame Tiebele, ON 30 JUNE. THEY COMPARED THE SITUATION IN BURUNDI WITH THAT OF RWANDA AND DISCUSSED WAYS IN WHICH MR. TIEBELE COULD PERFORM HIS ROLE, ESPECIALLY IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT THERE WAS NO U.N. MILITARY BACKUP AVAILABLE TO THE HUMAN RIGHTS OPERATION IN BURUNDI.

III. THE AMBASSADOR OF BURUNDI TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. SALVATOR Ntihabose, PAID A COURTESY CALL TO THE SRSG THE SAME DAY DURING WHICH HE BRIEFED THE SRSG ON THE SITUATION IN BURUNDI AND THE NEED TO TAKE MEASURES TO PREVENT THE COUNTRY'S INTERNAL SITUATION FROM FURTHER DETERIORATING. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED THE POSSIBILITY OF CONVENING A REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT AS PROPOSED BY THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL.

IV. AT A MEETING WITH THE FOREIGN AMBASSADORS ACCREDITED TO RWANDA HELD ON 30 JUNE, THE SRSG DISCUSSED UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE AND BRIEFED THE PARTICIPANTS ON THE RECENT VISIT OF MR. ALDO AJELLO, THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL, TO THE REGION.

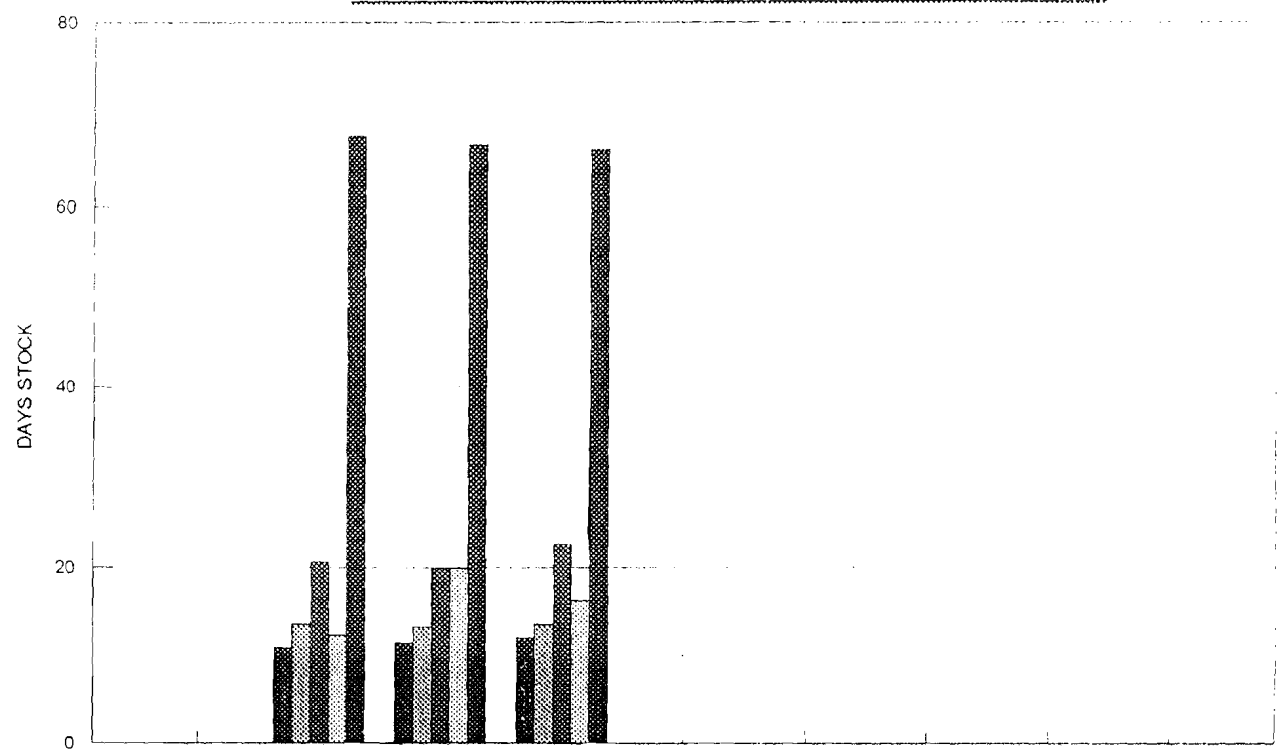

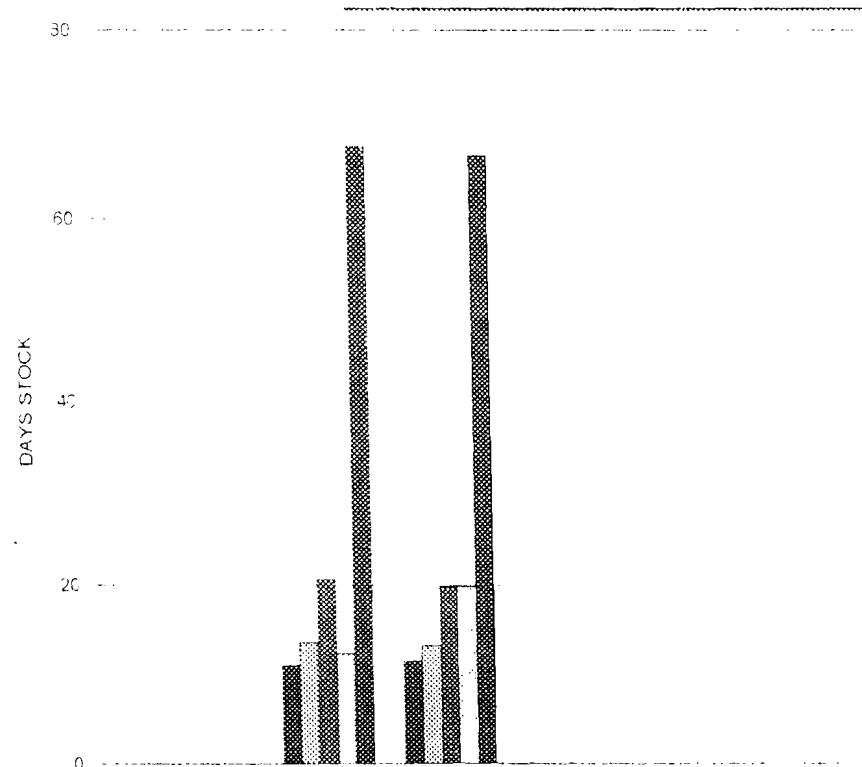

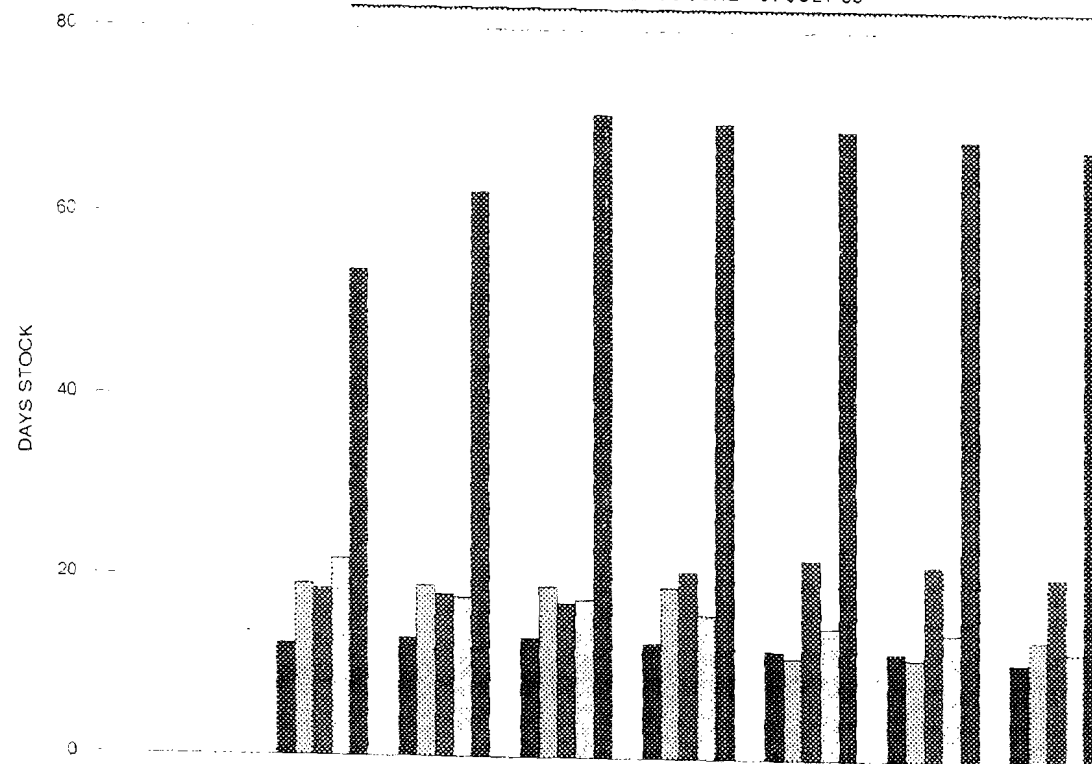
