Subject: Meetings in Geneva on 16 June and transportation of the Delegations of the present Presidency meeting

1. There are two meetings scheduled in Geneva for Wednesday, 16 June. The first will be chaired by FC about a ceasefire between the Krajina Serbs and the Croatian army. The second is chaired by DCA about economical and related matters. It is expected, that the meetings will start at 12.00 hours and last until about 19.00 hours. Estimated landing time of the special flight would be 11.00 hours.

Not all the details are available yet, but as per telecon Major Karonen/Capt O'Neill, ADC to FC this morning the logistical support required is as follows.

- transportations between the airport and Palace des Nations both ways for FC, DCA and their party as well as the Serb delegation, which is arriving with the FC's special flight

✓ - two large meeting rooms and 4 - 6 retirement rooms for the delegations

✓ - a working lunch; the ADC thought sandwiches and a lot of coffee probably would do

- airport clearances in particular for the Serb delegation, who are not likely to be in possession of passports and visas

- should the meeting take longer than expected, some tentative arrangements for accommodation might be advisable

- security arrangements; in particular the Serb delegation may be quite strict on this matter

2. The question of transportation of the Bosnia-Hercegovina Government Delegation, Bihac Delegation, and Bosnian Croat Delegation of the presently ongoing meeting by a UN flight from Geneva to Zagreb is not an easy one and the FC's Office suggests, that all delegations should arrange their own transportations through their own channels. The only exception is the travelling of the Bihac Delegation from Zagreb to Bihac - this can be arranged with a UN helicopter, but even then the distance Geneva - Zagreb should be this Delegation's own responsibility. It should be borne in mind, that because of the flight clearances for the helicopter a 24 hour advance note is necessary.

NAGORNY-KARABAKH La guerre reprend

La rébellion militaire en Azerbaïdjan et la fronde des commandants du Nagorny-Karabakh contre leurs dirigeants politiques ont provoqué la rupture de la trêve précaire de plus de deux mois dans la région. Selon le Ministère azérien de la défense, les deux armées «ont eu des pertes importantes en hommes et en matériel». — (afp)

Week-end de feu et de sang en Bosnie-Herzégovine

Après quatorze mois de guerre, les combats ont redoublé d'intensité entre belligérants.
Un frêle espoir de dialogue subsiste à Genève.

Des combats meurtriers se sont produits durant tout le week-end en Bosnie-Herzégovine, alors que, sur le plan politique, les discussions de la présidence collégiale bosniaque ont repris hier à Genève.

Après quatorze mois de guerre, de violents combats continuaient d'opposer les trois camps belligérants sur plusieurs fronts de Bosnie-Herzégovine. Dans le centre, les forces croates du HVO ont lancé une attaque contre les Musulmans au nord de la rivière Neretva (40 kilomètres au sud-est de Sarajevo). De violents affrontements opposaient les mêmes forces à Mostar, chef-lieu de l'Herzégovine,

ont indiqué des sources militaires serbes bosniaques.

Hôpital touché

Quant aux Serbes, ils ont fait une percée dans deux lignes de défense à Gorazde, sur la rive droite de la Drina, samedi, a rapporté hier Radio-Sarajevo. Dans cette enclave musulmane de Bosnie orientale, des roquettes sont tombées sur un hôpital de fortune. L'attaque a probablement tué les 50 blessés qui y étaient soignés, a indiqué le vice-président du gouvernement de Gorazde.

A Sarajevo, l'aéroport a rouvert après une brève fermeture, a annoncé un porte-parole de la

Force de protection des Nations Unies (FORPRONU). Il avait été fermé hier matin après la chute de plusieurs obus tirés par les Serbes sur la piste.

Convoi rescapé

Sur le plan humanitaire, les Musulmans bosniaques ont enfin pu rallier Tuzla avec 78 véhicules du «Convoi de la joie», a indiqué Radio-Sarajevo. Ce convoi avait été intercepté à diverses reprises par les Croates qui ont tué plusieurs chauffeurs.

Le convoi de 503 camions avait quitté les côtes de l'Adriatique début juin, mais il avait été attaqué jeudi et vendredi derniers. La FORPRONU a indi-

qué hier que quelque 250 camions avaient échappé aux attaques.

De leur côté, les autorités civiles et militaires de la «République serbe» (RS, autoproclamée en Bosnie) ont «autorisé» un groupe de 903 combattants du HVO à gagner la Bosnie centrale, a annoncé Tanjug. Les soldats croates avaient été «placés provisoirement» dans le camp serbe de Manjaca, près de Banja Luka.

La partie serbe a autorisé les militaires à quitter le territoire de la République «avec leur armement personnel», ont encore indiqué ces sources. — (ats-afreuter)

«Dialogue» genevois

Les dirigeants de la présidence collégiale bosniaque ont repris leurs entretiens hier à Genève. Cette présidence, dirigée par Alija Izetbegovic, regroupe Musulmans, Serbes et Croates. C'est la première fois depuis plus d'un an que l'instance exécutive suprême de la Bosnie-Herzégovine se réunit. Cette rencontre est un prélude au sommet qui réunira, mercredi et jeudi à Genève, les présidents Slobodan Milosevic (Serbie), Franjo Tudjman (Croatie) et Alija Izetbegovic

(Bosnie), ainsi que les leaders serbe et croate de Bosnie, Radovan Karadzic et Mate Boban.

Les délibérations collégiales étaient surtout consacrées, selon le porte-parole de la conférence, Fred Eckhard, à «recoler les morceaux entre Croates et Musulmans». En outre, il a été question des mécanismes gouvernementaux transitoires (comité de coordination) à mettre en place dans le cadre d'une application progressive du plan de paix. — (ats-afreuter)







THE PRESIDENCY DELEGATION GOING TO GENEVA WILL BE TEN PEOPLE. THIS INCLUDES FOUR MEMBERS OF THE PRESIDENCY: IZETBEGOVIC, GANIC, TATJANA LJUJIC-MIJATOVIC, AND MIRKO PEJANOVIC. THE ONLY MEMBER OF THE PRESIDENCY FROM SARAJEVO NOT INCLUDED IS HALILOVIC. IZETBEGOVIC WANTS TO KNOW IF HE IS REQUIRED.

THE REMAINING MEMBERS OF THE PRESIDENCY ARE ABDIC (WHO IS INFORMED OF THE MEETING), FRANJO BORAS AND MIRO LASOVIC - BOTH CROATS WITH BOBAN. THEREFORE, BOBAN SHOULD BE INSTRUCTED TO BRING THESE TWO WITH HIM, AS WELL AS AKMADZIC OF COURSE.

THE PRESIDENCY HAS CONTACTED THE AMERICANS REGARDING A FLIGHT OUT OF SARAJEVO ON FRIDAY.

IZETBEGOVIC WOULD LIKE TO KNOW THE AGENDA FOR THE MEETING AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

NOW IZETBEGOVIC DOES NOT WANT A MEETING WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM BIHAC IN ZAGREB. HE WANTS ONLY TO SEE ABDIC AND LJUBIJANKIC AND WILL MEET THEM IN GENEVA. THEREFORE, UNPROFOR SHOULD BE TASKED TO EXTRACT ONLY THESE TWO FROM THE BIHAC POCKET ON FRIDAY MORNING AND ASSIST THEM TO REACH ZAGREB AIRPORT FOR A FLIGHT TO GENEVA.

DESPITE GREAT EFFORT IT HAS BEEN IMPOSSIBLE TO CONTACT KRAJISNIK IN PERSON. HOWEVER, HIS OFFICE IN PALE HAS BEEN INFORMED OF THE REQUIREMENT FOR HIM TO BE IN GENEVA ON SATURDAY. A RESPONSE WILL BE PURSUED AGAIN TOMORROW.

GANIC SPOKE TO ME BRIEFLY ON THE TELEPHONE. HE SAID THAT HE HAD DECIDED THAT THE PROPOSED 1:1:1 MEETING, OR ANY VARIATION, WOULD NOT BE APPROPRIATE.

INFORMATION FOR PARTICIPANTS IN THE DISCUSSIONS IN GENEVA, 2 - 5 JANUARY 1993

1. The following information is promulgated to assist participants taking part in the discussions to be chaired by the Co-Chairmen of the International Conference on the Former Yugoslavia.

Arrival

2. Cars should enter the Palais des Nations by the Main Gate and proceed to Door 4. Participants will be met on arrival from 10.00 onwards, Saturday 2 January.

Delegation Rooms

3. Delegations will be escorted to rooms as follows:

Salle I	-	President Cosic and party
Salon Francais	-	President Tudjman and party
Salon Tchèque	-	President Izetbegovic and party
Salle H3	-	Dr. Karadzic and party
Room 186	-	Mr. Boban and party

These rooms will be at the disposal of the respective participants throughout the discussions.

Meeting Rooms

4. The meetings will take place in Salle VIII, beginning at 11.00, Saturday, 2 January. The adjacent room, Salle IX, will also be available for use, as required.

Security

5. Each delegation will be limited to 2 security personnel inside the Palais des Nations. The names of the personnel, the numbers and types of firearms, should be communicated to the Chief of UN Security, Room 259 (Ext.7-2900). On first arrival, security personnel should contact the Chief of Security who will arrange for the issue of lapel-badges for the duration of the discussions.

6. One UN security officer will be assigned to each delegation to escort that delegation from one area to another.

7. Security personnel will not be allowed inside meeting rooms during the discussions. All appropriate security

measures will be take care of by UN Security personnel.

Interpretation

8. Both Salle VIII and Salle IX have interpretation facilities. In order to make the necessary arrangements, interpreters are asked to meet Mr. Derek Boothby in Salle VIII at 10.30, Saturday 2 January.

Press

9. There is likely to be considerable Press interest. Members of the Press will be present at Door 4 on arrival and they will also be offered a photo-opportunity in Salle VIII before the business of the meeting begins at 11.00 on Saturday, 2 January. Press Conference arrangements will be made, as required, in Salle III.

10. The Press will not be allowed access to any of the Delegation Rooms, nor the lobby area outside the Salon Tchèque, Salon Français or Salle I.

11. The principal contact for Press matters will be the Spokesman of the Co-Chairmen, Mr. Fred Eckhard (Ext.7-3028).

Refreshments

12. Coffee, tea, soft drinks, sandwiches, etc., will be available for purchase on Saturday and Sunday from the Press Bar from 09.00 to 18.00. During the weekend this will be the only facility open for refreshments in the Palais des Nations. From Monday, 4 January, the cafeteria will also be open. The restaurant on the 8th floor will remain closed throughout the period of the discussions.

13. Coffee and soft drinks will also be available, to participants only, in the lobby area outside Salon Tchèque between 10.00 and 11.30 and between 15.00 and 17.00 daily.

1. The meeting of the expanded Steering Committee of the International Conference on the Former Yugoslavia (ICFY) on Wednesday, 16 December, will be at ministerial level, i.e., at the level of Foreign Minister or Deputy Foreign Minister. Some 26 States are being invited plus 6 other delegations (e.g., OIC representatives, EC Commission, ICRC, Lord Carrington).

2. In brief, it is a major event - and we have only 9 days in which to organize it.

3. The purpose of this memorandum is to serve as the basis for an organizational meeting to plan the arrangements for the meeting. Questions are already being received from delegations and the Press about the arrangements for the meeting. Arrangements therefore need to be decided quickly so that administrative instructions can be prepared and provided to delegations and the Press.

4. Action Task Group. Within ICFY a small Action Task Group will be established to be responsible for the arrangements. The Group will be comprised of Mr. Boothby, assisted by Ms. Gadalla and Mr. Zobel, with Mr. Eckhard responsible for press arrangements. Ms. Osias and Ms. Tierney will provide support. Other ICFY staff will be asked to assist as necessary.

5. Place and time. The ministerial meeting will be held in the Salle du Conseil, 10.30 - 13.00 and 15.00 - 18.00 on Wednesday, 16 December. Mr. Vance and Lord Owen will host a lunch for ministers and invited guests in the Salon Geneve (restaurant 8th floor).

6. Agenda. The meeting will focus primarily on the situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina. After opening statements by the Co-Chairmen, there are likely to be presentations by Generals Nambiar and Morillon, by Mrs. Ogata and by Mr. Ahtisaari, followed by a general discussion. The order of presentations has yet to be finalized, after which an agenda will be prepared and issued to delegations. The agenda should be agreed no later than 12.00, Thursday 10 December for issuance to delegations.

7. Interpretation. The Steering Committee usually works in E, F and Serbo-Croat. On this occasion, Serbo-Croat will not be required. As this is a meeting at ministerial level partly sponsored by the UN, a specific decision will be taken as to whether A, C, R and S should also be provided. Two presentations

will be made, with vu-foils, by military personnel from UNPROFOR: interpreters should be able to deal with basic military terminology.

8. Sound/recording. Sound and cassette tapes (English) will be required. #G

9. Secretariat support. ICFY staff will provide 4 General Service secretaries and 2 messengers specifically to provide secretariat support for papers and photocopying during the meeting. The secretariat room adjacent to the Salon Francais should be provided with 2 word-processors, 2 printers and 2 photocopiers (some of this equipment is already in place). ICFY staff will check the availability of office supplies (paper, toner, staplers, staples, etc.). The availability of a separate photocopier for use by delegations should also be investigated. #G

10. Vu-graph Presentations. Presentations will be given by Lieutenant-General Nambiar (Force Commander UNPROFOR) and Major-General Morillon (Commander UNPROFOR Bosnia and Herzegovina Command). It is **ESSENTIAL** that these presentations be at the highest possible standard. An overhead vu-graph projector and screen will be needed, complete with spare bulbs, and a pointer. A back-up screen and projector should also be close at hand. All this equipment should be available and working in the Salle du Conseil by 09.30, Tuesday 15 December, and will be used for rehearsals throughout that day. An electrician familiar with the equipment will be needed throughout Tuesday and Wednesday to ensure that there are no electrical problems with the equipment, the house lights, etc.. In addition to the vu-graph presentation, there will be a mobile map stand provided by ICFY staff. (Interpreters present) FE/HG (Photocopy map)

11. Seating at the meeting. Delegations will be limited to three persons (minister plus two). Seating should be according to the normal practice of alphabetical by the English language spelling of the name, starting with the righthand floor seat from the podium. Discuss with M-H

12. Podium. The seating on the podium has yet to be decided. The maximum capacity is 11, with staff seated behind.

13. Access to the meeting. The meeting will be closed. The gallery doors should be locked. Access to the Salle du Conseil should be permitted only to those persons wearing special badges (see Security below). Press will not be permitted except for a photo-opportunity at the start of the meeting (see Press below). #G-badges

14. Security. The Chief of Security will be asked to provide such security as he considers appropriate. It is suggested that there should be two distinctive colours of security badge for access to the Salle du Conseil, one for delegations and the other #G-badges

for ICFY and support staff personnel. Delegations have been asked to provide the names of their representatives by 12.00, Friday 11 December. Arrangements need to be made between ICFY staff and Security for the preparation and issuance of clip-on badges which should then be worn at all times in the Salle du Conseil. No photographs will be needed on the badges.

15. Security escorts. A considerable number of security escorts will probably accompany the ministers. The Chief of Security will be asked to provide a plan to accommodate them while the meeting is taking place.

Discuss with Security

16. Vehicles. (and drivers) Special arrangements will be needed for access by vehicles to the Palais, dropping passengers at Door 4 or 6, parking, and subsequent departures. The Chief of Security will be asked to provide a plan for these arrangements.

Discuss with Security

17. Protocol. The Chief of Protocol will be asked to make arrangements for meeting the ministers on arrival at UNOG, guiding them to the appropriate gathering room before the meeting, and facilitating their departure after the meeting. Additional staff will be needed to assist in these tasks.

Discuss with Ulkamen

18. Assembly before the meeting. It is suggested that the Salon Francais be used as the gathering room before the meeting. It should be available to expect arrivals from 09.45. Coffee and tea for 130 persons should be available in the room no later than 09.40. A decision will be needed on whether the press should be allowed free (or controlled) access to the Salon Francais or whether the adjacent room, the Salon Czech, should be used for press opportunities (see Press below). The Salon Francais has direct access to the Salle du Conseil, the doors of which should be opened at 10.25.

Check possibility

19. Salle C.108 and Salle I. Salle C.108 will be reserved for use by the Co-Chairmen, Mr. Vance and Lord Owen. Salle I will be kept vacant, for use as decided only with the express permission of Mr. Boothby (ICFY Staff).

20. Other rooms. Other rooms will be set aside for use by delegations. A system for allocation of those rooms will have to be decided.

HQ to provide

21. Press. A large number of press and other media representatives can be expected and special arrangements will have to be made. Mr. Fred Eckhard (ICFY Spokesman) will be the contact point and will make the necessary arrangements with the UNOG Information staff. Salle III will be used for a Press Conference to be given by the Co-Chairmen at the conclusion of the meeting. Ministers wishing to give press remarks after the meeting should depart from Door 4 where there are appropriate facilities.

22. Telephones. Special arrangements will be needed to provide sufficient telephone, fax and modem lines for use by delegations and the Press. Ideally, at least some 50 temporary lines should be made available (20 for delegations, 30 for the Press). This aspect, and the extent to which services can be provided, needs to be investigated urgently. *Discuss with Brigier*

23. Medical. The UNOG Medical Service needs to be alerted to the possibility of a requirement for emergency assistance. *He to inform*

24. Catering. As noted above, coffee^e and tea for 130 persons should be provided in the Salle Francais by 09.40, and the Co-Chairmen will give a lunch for the ministers and other invited guests. Coffee and tea will not be provided in the afternoon. Consideration needs to be given as to whether any other special catering arrangements will be needed (e.g., coffee/tea on repayment for the Press and security escorts). *No*

25. Information for delegations and the Press. Arrangements and plans should be made quickly so that they may be approved no later than 15.00, Wednesday 9 December. This should permit the preparation of appropriate information by 12.00, Thursday 10 December for issuance to delegations and the Press.

Meeting Logistics

During the hectic period, Derreck Boothby used to prepare an entire summary of everyone's functions during the meeting, however, as this may be a shortlived (one or two day affair), I think it would be overkill.

If the meeting goes off...most immediate....

1. Contact Roland de Stickere (Security) and inform him of meeting times, participants, arrival times, entry doors and if any bodyguards are attending with weapons (most likely yes). We will need at least two security guards. (Possibly one for each party).
2. Contact Inspector Stuby of the Swiss Special Police (Harriet should know the number). Inform him a meeting will take place and let him know you'll inform him of estimated aircraft arrival times. (He will ensure that security escorts some of the parties and will have weapon permits for them at the airport).
3. Harriet will arrange for the meeting rooms. Should have assignments of which group will have which room prior to their arrival.
4. If the meeting is to be on a Saturday/Sunday...then request the press bar to remain open (specify the hours). The Co-Chairmen will probably request hospitatlity funds for this. If they don't need them on Sunday, cancel as early as possible, as the charge is about CHF 600 per day, just to remain open. The food charges are additional. May wish to go ahead and have so many sandwiches ordered.
5. Contact Mr. Dick and advise that there will be a high level meeting this weekend.
6. Press ?????? Do they want press coverage or not. Coordinate with Fred Eckhard and DPI. Should advise by Friday if the press should be invited and where they will hang out...
7. Ensure that Stoltenberg and Owen's chauffers are available this weekend.
8. Secretarial support....check which secretaries will be available this weekend. If not all here, you should ask Mrs. Frick if she can provide one or two...double check the requirements with Bertie.
9. Charles is willing to work this weekend and it would probably be a good idea to have him around to help out with logistics.
10. Ask if Anne Marie or John Wilson can provide details of arrival times for all the parties.

11. Usually, Derreck and I would meet the parties at the door (#4) and escort them up to the meeting room. We would call from downstairs and advise the Co-Chairmen which group had just arrived....etc...use your judgement.
12. Possibly you may need to assist with swiss visas. Speak with Harriet, she has a file on this and knows who to contact.
13. Lastly, possibly you should speak with Mr. Sebti and ask him if we can borrow Duque's old office for the weekend and possibly Mr. Dick (he has been helpful in this respect). As both Co-Chairmen will be here with everyone else we will be short of office space.. This is a rather immediate need...and very important.
14. On point of death, do not open the telephone exchange for the press...this has been a sticky and nasty issue. If the press want to make a phone call they go use a pay phone somewhere.....
15. Ask Bertie about the translators...this has to be done immediately. Conference service must arrange from outside of Geneva.
16. Khayam UI will be your best friend. Ask Harriet.
