DAILY SITREP FOR 01 JUN 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE.

B. OVER THE PAST MONTH THERE HAVE BEEN INCREASING INDICATIONS TO SUGGEST INTENSIVE TRAINING AND CONCENTRATION OF FRGF TROOPS CLOSER TO RWANDAN BORDERS. REPORTS FROM ZAIRE INDICATE THAT THE ZAIRIAN PARLIAMENT ARE BECOMING IMPATIENT WITH THE CONTINUED EXISTENCE OF THE REFUGEE CAMPS ON THEIR BORDERS WITH RWANDA. FURTHERMORE, THE PROBABILITY OF DWINDLING AID TO THE CAMPS AND THE RESULTANT INCREASE IN CRIME AND THE PERSISTENT RUMOURS OF RWANDAN ACTION AGAINST THE REFUGEE CAMPS IF THERE IS NO RESOLUTION TO THEIR CONTINUED EXISTENCE HAS FURTHER INCREASED THE ANXIETY OF ZAIRIAN PARLIAMENTARIANS.

C. WITHIN RWANDA THE INCREASED INCURSIONS AND ACTS OF SABOTAGE BY FRGF PERSONNEL FROM ACROSS THE BORDERS IN SECTORS 3A, 4B, 4C AND 5 AND PERSISTENT RUMOURS OF AN IMMINENT ATTACK BY 50,000 FRGF MASSED ON THE BORDER IN THE JUN/JUL PERIOD HAVE RESULTED IN THE REDEPLOYMENT OF LARGE NUMBERS OF RPA TROOPS TO BORDER AREAS OVER THE LAST FEW WEEKS. THESE REDEPLOYMENTS COVER THE LIKELY FRGF APPROACHES.

ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, BELGIUM HAS ISSUED AN INTERNATIONAL ARREST WARRANT FOR THREE FORMER RWANDESE MILITARY OFFICERS FOR THEIR ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN GENOCIDE, INCLUDING A FORMER ARMY COLONEL ACCUSED OF ORDERING THE ASSASSINATION OF THE LATE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA AND TEN BELGIAN PEACEKEEPERS WHO WERE PROVIDING HER WITH PROTECTION, AND OF ORDERING THE SHOOTING DOWN OF A PLANE WHICH RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF THE FORMER PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND BURUNDI.
- B. RADIO RWANDA ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT IN A MEETING PRESIDED OVER BY THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO, THE PARTICIPANTS COMPLAINED ABOUT THE TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON RWANDESE NATIONALS BY TANZANIA AT ITS BORDER POST WITH RWANDA WHERE MANY RWANDESE ARE APPARENTLY DENIED VISAS TO ENTER TANZANIA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

(C) SECTOR COMD AND CO NIBATT MET WITH PREFECT, COMDS OF RPA AND GENDARMERIE AS WELL AS SECURITY COORDINATOR IN BYUMBA TO DISCUSS THE SY SIT WITHIN THE PREFECTURE.

(D) MILOBS PTLS TO MURAMA INTERVIEWED A FAMILY THAT RECENTLY RETURNED FROM ZAIRE WHO CONFIRMED THAT SOME MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE BEING CARRIED OUT BY FRGF TROOPS IN WALIKALI ABOUT 70KM FROM GOMA BUT MORE INTENSE ACTIVITIES WERE NOTICED AT MUSISI.

(E) A JOINT HUMAN RIGHTS/MILOB/CIVPOL TEAM INVESTIGATED REPORTS OF ATROCITIES BY RPA IN NYABIKENKE COMMUNE. THE TEAM WAS INFORMED THAT RPA SOLDIERS HAVE SUMMARILY EXECUTED SOME LOCALS FOR NO APPARENT REASON. MANY LOCALS HAVE MYSTERIOUSLY DISAPPEARED OVER THE PAST FEW WEEKS. THE RPA HAVE PREVENTED THE TEAM FROM CONTINUING ITS INVESTIGATIONS.

N. AIR OPS.

(1) NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. A TOTAL OF 10 FLIGHTS DEPARTED AND ARRIVED KIA.

(2) ON 01 JUN 95, A CASEVAC TO ETHIOBATT FOR FIVE PRI 3 WAS COMPLETED. RPA GUARDS AT PRESIDENTIAL HANGAR AND KIGALI AIRPORT PLUS KIGALI CONTROL TOWER COOPERATED IN AGREEMENT WITH THE NEWLY REVISED RPA/UNAMIR CASEVAC PROCEDURE. A PREVIOUS CASEVAC PRACTICE FAILED, 23 MAY 95, AS THE PREVIOUS MENTIONED AREAS DEMONSTRATED A LACK OF KNOWLEDGE/COOPERATION REGARDING THE CASEVAC PROCEDURE. THREE RECCE FLIGHTS (NO PASSENGERS DEPARTING FROM KIGALI) HAVE BEEN FLOWN THIS WEEK WITH VARYING DELAY TIMES ENCOUNTERED DURING AIRCRAFT DEPARTURES. HELICOPTER MAINTENANCE FLIGHTS HAVE RESUMED AS RPA AIRPORT SECURITY DO NOT REQUIRE AN RPA SOLDIER ON BOARD THESE FLIGHTS. UNAMIR AND RPA ARE NO FURTHER IN RESOLVING PASSENGER MANIFESTING AND BOARDING POINT DIFFERENCES. NO RESOLUTION IS EXPECTED UNTIL LATE NEXT WEEK.

(1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTD TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO THE NIBATT SLDR SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

B. PTL TO MUTUNTU COMMUNE WAS INFORMED THAT ONE LOCAL WAS ARRESTED BY RPA ON 30 MAY 95 IN PLACE OF HIS BROTHER WHO WAS WANTED FOR GENOCIDE. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT IT WAS REPORTED THAT A LOCAL WAS ROBBED BY RPA SOLDIERS IN THE SAME COMMUNE. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

C. CIVPOL PTL IN KIGALI VISITED MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND WAS BRIEFED BY THE SPOKESMAN THAT THE RWANDAN TRIBUNAL ON GENOCIDE AND WAR CRIMES MAY NOT RESUME TRIALS OF SUSPECTS TO GIVE MORE TIME FOR PROSECUTORS AND DEFENCE COUNSELS TO STUDY ALL RELEVANT DOSSIERS/EXHIBITS. THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE GOVT'S ACTION TO SUSPEND ARRESTS OF GENOCIDE SUSPECTS UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE FOLLOWED A REQUEST MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF INTERIOR THAT THE PRISONS WERE OVERCROWDED AND ARE IN A DEPLORABLE STATE.

D. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN GISENYI REPORTED THAT ON 29 MAY 95, A GREN EXPLODED IN NDORANYI SECTOR IN MUTURA COMMUNE RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF AN RPA SOLDIER AND COUNCILLOR FOR NYARUTEME SECTOR. ONE LOCAL WAS ALSO INJURED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.



1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE.

B. OVER THE PAST MONTH THERE HAVE BEEN INCREASING INDICATIONS TO SUGGEST INTENSIVE TRAINING AND CONCENTRATION OF FRGF TROOPS CLOSER TO RWANDAN BORDERS. REPORTS FROM ZAIRE INDICATE THAT THE ZAIRIAN PARLIAMENT ARE BECOMING IMPATIENT WITH THE CONTINUED EXISTENCE OF THE REFUGEE CAMPS ON THEIR BORDERS WITH RWANDA. FURTHERMORE, THE PROBABILITY OF DWINDLING AID TO THE CAMPS AND THE RESULTANT INCREASE IN CRIME AND THE PERSISTENT RUMOURS OF RWANDAN ACTION AGAINST THE REFUGEE CAMPS IF THERE IS NO RESOLUTION TO THEIR CONTINUED EXISTENCE HAS FURTHER INCREASED THE ANXIETY OF ZAIRIAN PARLIAMENTARIANS.

C. WITHIN RWANDA THE INCREASED INCURSIONS AND ACTS OF SABOTAGE BY FRGF PERSONNEL FROM ACROSS THE BORDERS IN SECTORS 3A, 4B, 4C AND 5 AND PERSISTENT RUMOURS OF AN IMMINENT ATTACK BY 50,000 FRGF MASSED ON THE BORDER IN THE JUN/JUL PERIOD HAVE RESULTED IN THE REDEPLOYMENT OF LARGE NUMBERS OF RPA TROOPS TO BORDER AREAS OVER THE LAST FEW WEEKS. THESE REDEPLOYMENTS COVER THE LIKELY FRGF APPROACHES.







1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINED TENSE.

B. IN SECTOR 4C, LOCALS REPORTED A CONCENTRATION OF FRGF SOLDIERS ALONG THE RWANDA-BURUNDI BORDER. THIS HAS NOT BEEN CONFIRMED. HOWEVER, AT 232153B MAY 95, MG FIRE DIRECTED AT KIRAMBO FROM IJWI ISLAND WAS RESPONDED TO BY THE RPA. THE EXCHANGE OF FIRE WAS REPORTED TO HAVE LASTED BETWEEN 35 - 40 MIN.

C. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO LIMIT FLYING ACTIVITIES DUE TO RPA INSISTENCE THAT KIGALI HELICOPTER PASSENGERS BE SEARCHED BEFORE BOARDING AND DISEMBARKING THROUGH KIGALI AIRPORT TERMINAL. ON 24 MAY 95, RPA ALSO INFORMED THE HELICOPTER CONTRACTOR THAT ALL MAINTENANCE AND CREW TRAINING FLIGHTS AT KIGALI AIRPORT WOULD REQUIRE AN RPA SOLDIER ON BOARD. DUE TO THE HAZARDOUS NATURE OF THESE FLIGHTS, PASSENGERS ARE NOT CARRIED.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(A) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT THREE RPA OFFICERS VISITED ITS COY LOC IN RURAMBA ON 21 MAY 95. THE PURPOSE OF THE VISIT WAS TO ACQUAINT THEMSELVES WITH ZAMBATT TROOPS.

(B) IN SECTOR 2, MILOBS RECEIVED A LETTER A FROM LOCAL DURING PTLs WHICH ALLEGED HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS IN NWOGO, 1671 IN THE KANZENZE COMMUNE. THE LETTER STATED THAT KILLINGS AND FORCED CONFESSIONS FOR COMPLICITY IN THE GENOCIDE WERE BEING CARRIED OUT BY THE RPA.

(C) IN SECTOR 5, THERE WERE TWO ATTEMPTS BY SABOTEURS TO DISRUPT ELECTRICITY SUPPLIES IN THE RUHENGARI AREA. THE LOCAL RPA BRIGADE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND A NUMBER OF PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED.

(D) RPA IN SECTOR 3, CONTINUED TO SEARCH ALL MILOBS AND NGO VEHICLES. ON 22 MAY 95 A MALICOY PATROL WAS STOPPED AT NTONGWE AND THE UN TROOPS WERE ASKED TO DISMOUNT AND HAVE THEIR WEAPONS, EQUIPMENT AND BELONGINGS CHECKED. THE SOLDIERS REFUSED AND THERE WAS A STAND OFF. THE MATTER WAS LATER RESOLVED BY THE RPA BN COMMANDER IN GITARAMA. THE RPA COMD LATER EXPLAINED THAT HE HAS RECEIVED SPECIFIC ORDERS FROM KIGALI TO CARRY OUT DETAILED SEARCHES ON ALL UNAMIR VEHs AND PERS. AT A MEETING WITH THE 31 RPA BN COMD, IT WAS AGREED THAT UNAMIR PERS IN UN VEHICLES WOULD ONLY BE ASKED TO SHOW THEIR IDENTITY CARDS IN FUTURE.

(E) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT THE RPA COMMANDER AT RWAMIKO HAS REQUESTED THAT ALL MATTERS CONCERNING SECURITY IN RWAMIKO AREA BE HANDLED BY BOTH RPA AND UNAMIR. THIS WAS AFTER RELATIONS BETWEEN RPA AND ZAMBATT TROOPS HAD GONE SOUR DUE TO ALLEGATIONS BY THE RPA THAT ZAMBATT HAD MISINFORMED THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY OVER RPA ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA.

(F) IN SECTOR 3B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT WITHIN

THE PAST 2 WEEKS, RPA HAVE ARRESTED 35 PERSONS FROM VILLAGES ALONG THE MARSHLANDS IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE RUNDA COMMUNE (GITARAMA). THE AREA IS REGARDED BY THE RPA AS A POSSIBLE INFILTRATION ROUTE FOR INSURGENTS.

(G) IN SECTOR 3A, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 30 PERSONS IN 10 BOATS LANDED AT BUTEMBO GR 1155 AND EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RPA TPS. THE ATTACK WAS SUCCESSFULLY REPELLED BY THE RPA AND NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED. LOCALS HOWEVER REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT AT LEAST 2 ATTACKS WERE BEING LAUNCHED WEEKLY IN THE AREA AND IN A FEW CASES, THE OCCUPANTS OF THE BOATS WERE IN UNIFORM.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) FC HAD DISCUSSIONS WITH SENIOR STAFF AND SRSG REGARDING MANDATE OPTIONS AND CONTINUED VIOLATIONS OF SOMA. THE FC CONTINUED HIS PERSISTENCE IN NON-COMPLIANCE WITH NEW RPA DEMANDS WHICH VIOLATED THE SOMA. A CODE CABLE WAS DESPATCHED TO UNHQ NEW YORK WITH DETAILS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

(B) THE FC MET WITH PROTOCOL OFFICERS OF RPA GOVT AND DISCUSSED CURRENT RELATIONS AND DIFFERING FACTORS BETWEEN RPA AND BROAD BASED GOVT. THE TWO ENTITIES HAD NOT ALWAYS NECESSARILY AGREE. IT WAS DISCUSSED THAT UNAMIR SHOULD DO MORE TO DISPEL WHAT IT FELT WAS PROPAGANDA, IN PARTICULAR ABOUT THE TWO INDIVIDUALS WHICH UNAMIR HAD TRANSPORTED FOR INTERVIEWS WITH THE KIBEHO COMMISSION. NOT ALL GOVT OFFICIALS AGREED WITH THE CURRENT SITUATION BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE RPA GOVT.

(C) CONDUCTED INTERVIEWS IN ENGLISH AND FRENCH FOR RADIO UNAMIR. IN GENERAL TERMS THE MANDATE SIT AND FUTURE ROLES OF UNAMIR WERE DISCUSSED. THE SECURITY SIT IN RWANDA WAS MENTIONED WITH FC REITERATING THAT HE FELT THE SECURITY SIT FOR THE GENERAL POPULACE WAS CONDUCIVE FOR RETURNING IDPs AND REFUGEES. HE EXPRESSED HIS CONCERN OVER THE RPA GOVT VIOLATIONS OF THE UN CHARTER AND THE SOMA. HE ACKNOWLEDGED THE SOVEREIGNTY OF THE GOVT, AND EMPHASIZED THAT THE GOVT NEEDED UNAMIR PRESENCE FOR IT TO BE EFFECTIVE. HE ALSO RESPONDED TO QUESTIONS TO SET THE RECORD STRAIGHT OVER THE INCIDENT OF THE TRANSPORTATION OF TWO PERSONS FROM KIBEHO TO MEET THE COMMISSION. THE FC REITERATED SOME OF THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF

UNAMIR AND GAVE EXAMPLES OF WHAT SERVICES AND GOODS IT COULD PROVIDE TO THE GOVERNMENT.

(D) THE FC MET WITH HUMAN RIGHTS CHIEF OF MISSION ALONG WITH THE SPECIAL RAPporteur. UPCOMING MANDATE ISSUE AND ITS POSSIBILITIES WERE DISCUSSED AND HOW IT WOULD AFFECT THE HUMAN RIGHTS MISSION. MR CLARENCE AND THE FC WERE CONCERNED THAT THE POTENTIAL OF TROOP REDUCTION IS UNFORTUNATE AT A TIME WHEN THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD TEAMS WERE JUST BEING BETTER DEPLOYED AND PRODUCTIVE IN A TASK THAT IS NOT YET COMPLETED.





A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA CONTINUED TO SEARCH VEHS AND PERS AT THEIR ROAD BLOCKS. MALICOY SOLDIERS AT NTONGWE CHECKPOINT WERE ACCUSED OF CARRYING RPA UNIFORMS IN THEIR TRUCK. THIS IS THE SECOND TIME RPA HAVED ACCUSED UN TROOPS IN SECTOR 3B OF TRANSPORTING RPA UNIFORMS IN A UN VEH. THE FACT IS THAT MALICOY TENTS LOOK LIKE RPA UNIFORMS. THIS HAS CREATED SOME MISUNDERSTANDING IN THE PAST WHICH WAS AMICABLY SETTLED AFTER THE LOCAL BDE COMD AND SECTOR COMD JOINTLY INSPECTED THE MALICOY TENTS AND RPA UNIFORMS. TODAY'S INCIDENT THREATENED TO ONCE AGAIN MAR RELATIONS BETWEEN RPA AND MALICOY.

(2) STILL IN SECTOR 3, THE SECTOR COMD MET THE 31 RPA BN COMD IN AN EFFORT TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE OF RPA SEARCHES OF UNAMIR VEHICLES AND PERS AT THEIR ROADBLOCKS. THE ATTITUDE OF THE RPA COMD WAS UNACCOMMODATING. THE BN COMD CONTINUED TO ACCUSE UNAMIR OF COLLABORATING WITH THE FRGF. THE SECTOR COMD EXPLAINED THAT IN A RECENT VISIT TO RUHENGIRI HE WAS NEVER ASKED TO EVEN STOP AT A CHECKPOINT LET ALONE SUBJECT HIMSELF TO A SEARCH. AS SUCH THERE WAS NO REASON FOR THE RPA IN GITARAMA TO SHOW SUCH INTRANSIGENCE. IT WAS HOWEVER, FINALLY AGREED THAT UNAMIR PERSONNEL TRAVELLING IN UN VEHICLES WOULD ONLY BE ASKED TO SHOW THEIR IDENTITY CARDS IN FUTURE. HOW MUCH THIS AGREEMENT WILL BE TRANSLATED ON GROUND BY THE RPA SOLDIERS IS YET TO BE SEEN.

(3) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA AT MASIGA GR 4489 HAVE DETAINED TWO LOCALS FOR ALLEGEDLY POSSESSING FIRE ARMS. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

OF TWO PERSONS FROM KIBEHO TO MEET THE COMMISSION. UNAMIR NEITHER GAVE UNIFORMS NOR ACCEDED TO ANY REQUEST FOR TPT OUT OF RWANDA. THE FC REITERATED SOME OF THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF UNAMIR AND GAVE EXAMPLES OF WHAT SERVICES AND GOODS IT COULD PROVIDE TO THE GOVERNMENT.




