A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

I. IN SECTOR 3B MILOBS REPORTED THAT ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS SEEN WEARING A LIGHT BLUE BERET WITHOUT A BADGE, IN MBAZI (GR 7117). MATTER WILL BE INVESTIGATED AND DISCUSSED WITH LOCAL RPA CMD.

II. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT MAJ WILSON, THE KAMEMBE BATTALION CMD, HIS 2ND-IN COMMAND, AND SOME RPA SOLDIERS WERE MEETING WITH THE MALAWICOY ADVANCE PARTY AT THE SHAGASHA TEA FACTORY.

III. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT TWO RPA PLATOONS WERE SEEN OCCUPYING THE FORMER POSITION VACATED BY THE ETHIOBATT PLATOON AT KABAYEGO CELL (GR 791)7.

B. FRGE/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) FC VISITED GHANBATT AND MILOBS LOCATED IN KIBUNGO AND GHANBATT 'D' COMPANY LOCATED NEAR RUKIRA. BOTH LOCATIONS WERE WELL ORGANIZED WITH MINIMAL PROBLEMS. PLANS FOR THEIR SCALEDOWN AND REDEPLOYMENT TASKS HAVE BEEN PREPARED. MILOBS ARE MAINTAINING GOOD RELATIONS WITH LOCALS AND RPA. MUGESERA, WEST OF KIBUNGO, HAS ACCESS PROBLEM. MOVEMENT ACROSS IS SOMETIMES ONLY ALLOWED WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE BOURGEMESTRE.

(3) A COPY OF UN RESOLUTION 1005 (95) WAS RECEIVED BY THE FC AND AN INFORMAL DISCUSSION TOOK PLACE WITH SOME AMERICAN MILITARY OFFICIALS AS TO THE NATURE AND AMOUNT OF EQUIPMENT AND EXPLOSIVES THAT WOULD BE EXPECTED FOR USAGE BY THE DEMINING TEAM.

(4) AS FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION, THE FC HONOURED AN INVITATION FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AT A RECEPTION MARKING ITS FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF COMING TO POWER.

(2) MALICOY PROVIDED ONE BEDFORD TRUCK TO TRANSPORT TWO TONS OF MEDICINES FROM GITARAMA TO MUSHUBATI COMMUNE GR6973 AND ANOTHER BEDFORD TRUCK TO TRANSPORT FIREWOOD FROM GITARAMA TO THE SAME COMMUNE.

(6) 245 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI AND BUTARE. 77 IDPs WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO. A TOTAL OF 329 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

ONE MILOB TEAM, THE IN-COMING AND OUT-GOING SECTOR COMMANDERS WERE WITH THE FC AND HIS ENTOURAGE DURING HIS VISIT.

(8) IN SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO. MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 17 JUL 95 BETWEEN 2200 HRS AND 2300 HRS, A GROUP OF FOUR ARMED BANDITS, ONE WITH AN RPA UNIFORM, BROKE INTO THE PREMISES OF THE SECTOR LEADER OF BUHORO AND STOLE 13 COWS. THE RPA PURSUED AND ARRESTED THE BANDITS. 12 OF THE COWS WERE RECOVERED.

(2) BOTH KIGALI AND BUTARE DETACHMENTS CONTINUED TO PROVIDE PREVENTATIVE MOBILE PATROLS IN THEIR AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY.

L. 95 FLSG.

(1) CONTINGENT VEHS FROM ETHIOBATT ARRIVED IN KIGALI.

(2) RESUPPLY TO ZAMBATT, SENBATT AND MALAWICOY WAS CARRIED OUT.

(3) THE FM STATION IN BYUMBA WAS MOVED TO MILOB SECTOR HQ.

C. A JOINT TEAM OF CIVPOL/MILOBS PATROLLED KİYOMBE COMMUNE AND VISITED THE BOURGEMESTRE WHO INFORMED THEM THAT NGOS OPERATING IN THE AREA HAVE LEFT THE PLACE FOR UNKNOWN REASON. HE FURTHER HINTED THAT LOCALS ARE FINDING IT DIFFICULT TO MEET EXPENSES ON MEDICAL TREATMENT BEING CHARGED BY PRIVATE CLINICS.

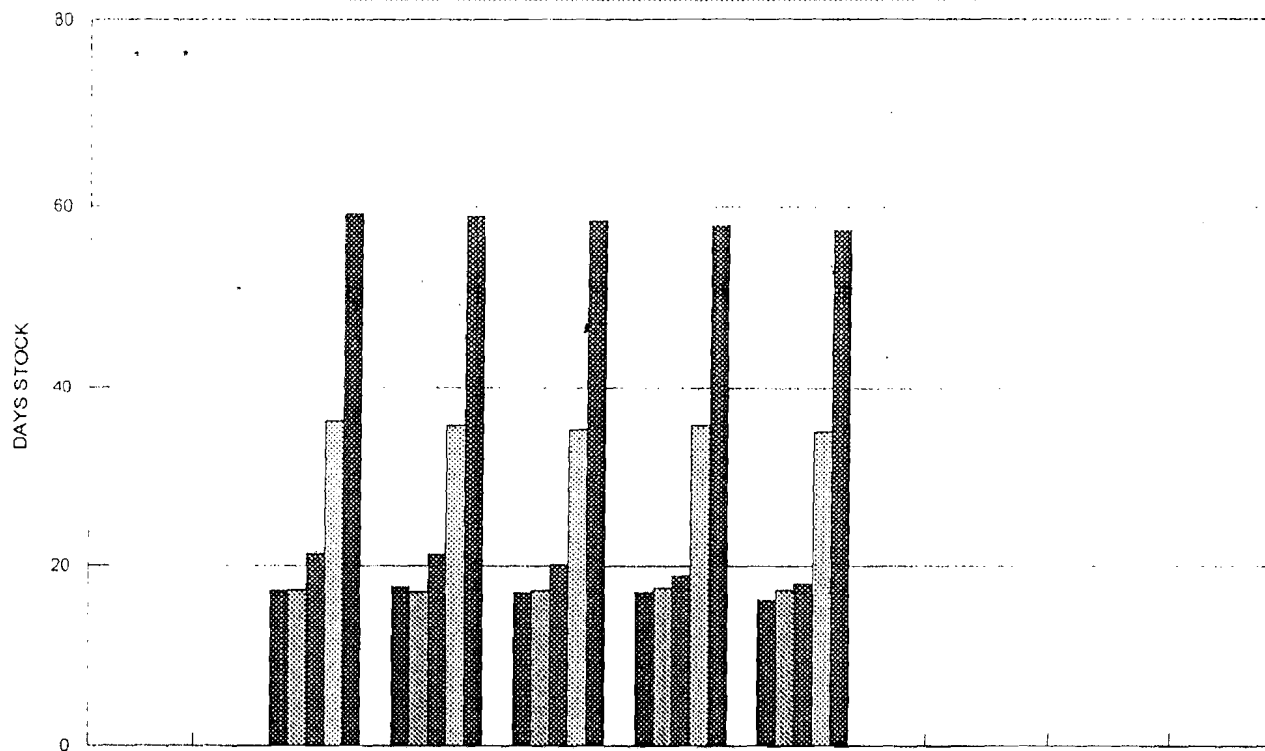

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. NTR

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

I. SECTOR 4 MILOBS REPORT THAT AT ABOUT 0042 HRS ON 18 JUL 95 A LARGE EXPLOSION WAS HEARD APPROX 2-3 KM FROM MILOB SECTOR HQ IN A SOUTH WESTERLY DIRECTION. THE EXPLOSION WAS BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY A GRENADE LAUNCHER FIRED BY RPA. A MILOB TEAM SENT TO THE AREA WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT THE EXPLOSION WAS FOLLOWED 10 MINUTES LATER BY SMALL ARMS FIRE BUT THEY COULD NOT AGREE ON THE EXACT LOCATION. IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE FOR MILOBS TO GO TO THE LOCATION INDICATED BY ONE OF THE INFORMANTS BECAUSE OF AN UNCONFIRMED RPA CAMP THERE. THE CAUSE OF THE FIRING IS NOT YET KNOWN BUT ONE LOCAL BELIEVED THE RPA ENGAGED BANDITS WHO WERE ATTEMPTING TO STEAL THREE COWS. MILOBS DID NOT SEE ANY VISIBLE SIGNS OF EXCHANGE OF FIRE. THE AREA OF THE INCIDENT IS EAST OF PANZI REFUGEE CAMP. MILOBS ARE STILL INVESTIGATING.

II. IN SECTOR 5A MILOBS, INVESTIGATING THE EXPLOSION THAT OCCURED ON 16 JUL, REPORTED THAT AN ATTEMPT, USING ABOUT 100 GRS OF UNDETERMINED EXPLOSIVE, WAS MADE TO FELL A POWER PYLON. IN DOING SO A TRANSFORMER WAS COMPLETELY DESTROYED. ONE PERSON HAS BEEN TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND CHARGED WITH HARBOURING THE SABOTEURS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) FC CONTINUED HIS DUTIES AS FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION DURING THE ABSENCE OF THE SRSG ON LEAVE. THE SRSG IS EXPECTED TO RETURN TO THE MISSION AREA APPROX ON 5 AUG 95.

(3) FC MET WITH THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR TO COORDINATE THE UPCOMING VISIT OF THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER. THE AMBASSADOR ALSO DISCUSSED WITH THE FC HIS CONCERNS OF THE MILITARY THREAT TO RWANDA FROM OUTSIDE.

(5) FC MET WITH THE NEWLY APPOINTED UNAMIR POLITICAL LIAISON OFFICER ASSIGNED TO ZAIRE. MR GAYE WILL INITIALLY BE STATIONED IN KINSHASA WHERE HE IS TO BEGIN TASKS OF FIRST HAND OBSERVATION OF THE GENERAL SITUATION IN ZAIRE.

(5) INDBATT REPORTED THAT 240 SOLDIERS OF ETHIOBATT DEPARTED FROM KIGALI AIRPORT. 1 OFFR AND 3 SOLDIERS OF TUNBATT REAR PARTY DEPARTED AS WELL.

(6) INDBATT REPORTED THAT 108 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI. 252 IDPs DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, NYAGATARE AND KIGALI. TOTAL OF 267 IDPs ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(7) INDBATT MED STAFF TREATED 46 MED AND 12 DENTAL PATIENTS AT OWN CLINICS.

(B) GISENYI AND RUSIZI I AND II BORDER POSTS WERE CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERS ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE.

(4) IN SECTOR 1A - KIGALI. MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE

RECCE PATROLS TO NEW PARTS OF THE SECTOR. AREAS PATROLLED WERE BICUMBI, GASHORA, NGENDA, KANZENZE, MUGANBANZI AND MBOGO COMMUNES. ALL AREAS WERE REPORTED CALM.

(5) IN SECTOR 1B GITARAMA.

(A) THE SECTOR COMD ATTENDED A CONFERENCE AT THE GITARAMA CULTURAL CENTER WHICH FOCUSED ON RECONCILIATION. THE MEETING WHICH WAS CHAIRED BY A HUMAN RIGHTS REPRESENTATIVE, MR ASSAIED WAS ALSO ATTENDED BY THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA, THE BISHOP OF KABGAYI, AND THE PRESIDENT OF HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION OF THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY. THERE WERE ALSO ABOUT 200 LOCALS IN ATTENDANCE. THERE WERE VARIOUS VERBAL PRESENTATIONS AND A FILM ON THE GENOCIDE WAS SHOWN. QUESTIONS ON THE UNAMIR MANDATE DURING THE WAR AND OTHER POLITICAL INTERVENTIONS WERE RECORDED DURING THE MEETING. THE CROWD WERE SAID TO HAVE BEEN VERY CRITICAL OF THE SLOW DEMOCRATISATION PROCESS.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (GR8274) WERE INFORMED BY A PRIEST THAT ON 7 JUL 95 AN RPA SOLDIER WHO KILLED ONE PERSON AND INJURED TWO OTHERS, CLAIMED THAT HE FIRED ACCIDENTALLY. HE WAS SAID TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND TRANSFERRED TO THE KIGALI PRISON. MILOBS WILL CONFIRM THIS REPORT. ALSO ON 12 JUL 95 AT 1000HRS THE DIRECTOR OF THE SECONDARY SCHOOL WAS ARRESTED BY RPA ON SUSPICION OF TAKING PART IN GENOCIDE AND ALSO PROVIDING TRANSPORT TO INTERHAMWE DURING THE WAR. THE PRIEST WAS CONVINCED THAT THE REASON OF THE ARREST WAS TO DO WITH THE FACT THAT RPA IS OCCUPYING THE HOUSE OWNED BY VICTIM IN KIGALI.

(6) IN SECTOR 2A BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(7) IN SECTOR 2B KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(8) IN SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO.

(A) PATROLS TO THE KIVU COMMUNE (GR4210) REPORTED THE RE-OPENING AT BIGUGU (GR 3705) OF THE TEACHERS TRAINING COLLEGE AND SECONDARY SCHOOL. ATTENDANCE WAS TO BE VERY POOR AND THE HEADMASTER REQUESTED MILOBS TO CONTACT THE SCHOOL SUPERVISOR TO MAKE ANNOUNCEMENTS OF THE RE-OPENING ON THE LOCAL RADIO. RADIO UNAMIR INFORMED.

(B) MILOB TEAM INVESTIGATING REPORTS OF ARRESTS AND ALLEGED FLEEING OF LOCALS FROM RWAMIKO COMMUNE (GR4914) TO BURUNDI CONFIRMED THAT AS A RESULT OF

RPA HARRASSMENT (INCLUDING AN ALLEGED KILLING OF TWO LOCALS TOWARDS THE END OF JUNE AND ARREST OF SEVEN LOCALS), ABOUT 25 LOCALS HAD FLED INTO BURUNDI ON 10 JUL 95.

(C) ANOTHER TEAM REPORTED THAT AT KIRARO (GR5135) ON 17 JUL 95 AT ABOUT 2000 HRS, THREE RPA SOLDIERS WENT TO THE HOUSE OF A LOCAL DOCTOR WORKING WITH TROCARE AT KIRARO SECTEUR CLINIC, BEAT UP THE FAMILY AND ROBBED THEM OF 260,000 AMAFRANCS. IT IS REPORTED THAT THE SAME GROUP ATTACKED THE HOUSE ON 21 JUNE 95 AND SHOT TO HE DOCTOR IN THE LEG WHO IS STILL RECEIVING TREATMENT.

(9) IN SECTOR 3B - BUTARE. NSTR.

(10) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

(A) MILOBS' ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE SECTOR INCLUDED KIRAMBO COMMUNE (GR 0444), KAGANO COMMUNE (GR 9840) AND ISHARA PENINSULA AND OTHER LOCATIONS IN THE CYANGUGU SUB-SECTOR. MILOBS REPORTED THAT ETHIOBATT HAD LEFT THEIR LOCATION AT GIHUNDWE AND AN ADVANCE PARTY FROM MALAWI COMPANY HAD ARRIVED AT SHAGASHA TEA FACTORY.

(B) ON 19 JUL AT 1107 HRS AN AIRCRAFT IDENTIFIED AS A BN2 ISLANDER WAS OBSERVED WEST OF KAMEMBE COMMUNE ALONG THE RWANDA ZAIRE BORDER FLYING NORTH TO SOUTH. AT 1330 HRS ANOTHER AIRCRAFT, ALSO BELIEVED TO BE A BN 2 ISLANDER WAS OBSERVED OVER KIRAMBO COMMUNE FLYING DIRECTLY NORTH TO SOUTH.

(11) IN SECTOR 5A - RUHENGARI. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. NSTR.

(12) IN SECTOR 5B-GISENYI. MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI PATROL ALONG SHORES OF THE LAKE KIVU TO DETERMINE THE ORIGIN OF THE 3 BODIES WHICH WASHED ASHORE ON 16/17 JUL 95. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT WAS OBSERVED.

(13) IN SECTOR 5C-KIBUYE.

(A) MILOBS PATROLLED GIKO (GR2253) AND NYAGAHIMA (GR1953) AND REPORTED THAT IN COMPLIANCE WITH RPA DIRECTIVES TUTSIS ARE ALLEGEDLY TAKING AWAY MONEY AND CATTLE FROM HUTUS IN THE COMMUNE. MILOBS WERE ALSO INFORMED OF THE ARRESTS IN NYAGAHIMA ABOUT TWO WEEKS AGO OF TWO LOCALS ACCUSED OF HAVING TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. ANOTHER LOCAL HAD BEEN ARRESTED ON 13 JUN 95 ON SUSPICION OF BEING INTERHAMWE. MILOBS COULD NOT CONFIRM WHEREABOUTS OF

THOSE THREE PERSONS, HOWEVER THEIR NAMES HAS BEEN PASSED ON TO HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS.

(B) MILOB TEAM WHICH PATOLLED KIVUMU (GR5573) COMMUNE REPORTED THE UNCOOPERATIVE ATTITUDE OF THE BOURGEMESTRE WHO DEMANDED TO KNOW FROM THE TEAM WHAT ASSISTANCE UNAMIR HAD RENDERED TO THE COMMUNE SO FAR. BOURGEMESTRE LATER REQUESTED TEAM FOR ASSISTANCE TO RECONSTRUCT KIBANDA SECONDARY SCHOOL (GR 528279).

B. BASED ON A REPORT RECEIVED THAT NEW ARRESTS OF GENOCIDE SUSPECTS WERE EFFECTED AT HUYE COMMUNE, CIVPOL IN BUTARE VISITED THE AREA TO FIND OUT THE SITUATION. THE BOURGMESTRE COULD NOT BE CONTACTED OWING TO PREVIOUS ENGAGEMENT IN KIGALI. THE ASSISTANT BOURGMESTRE WHO IS NEWLY POSTED TO THE AREA COULD NOT VERIFY THE STORY. HE HOWEVER INFORMED THE TEAM THAT THERE WERE 206 PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE BUT DID NOT HAVE DATES OF THEIR ARRESTS AND PARTICULARS OF THIER OFFENSES.

C. CIVPOL IN GIKONGORO PREFECTURE PATROLLED GIKONGORO TOWN AND REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION IS CALM. MEANWHILE, THERE IS INTENSIFICATION OF RPA/GENDARMERIE FOOT PATROLS. REASON OF DOING SO UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

D. CIVPOL IN KIGALI PREFECTURE PATROLLED KIGALI METROPOLIS AND REPORT THAT TRAFFIC GENDARMES WERE SEEN IN SOME STRATEGIC POINTS CONTROLLING TRAFFIC.

E. THE GRADUATED UNAMIR TRAINED GENDARMES AT RUHENGERI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED IN THE VARIOUS PREFECTURES. MEANWHILE, THE SCHOOL IS PREPARING GROUNDS FOR THE OPENING PROGRAMME. IN VIEW OF THIS, 200 STUDENTS FROM VARIOUS PREFECTURES HAVE ARRIVED AT THE SCHOOL

TO COMMENCE TRAINING.

F. EIGHTEEN (18) FRENCH SPEAKING CIVPOL OBSERVERS HAVE BEEN RE-DEPLOYED AT THE TRAINING SCHOOL TO SERVE AS INSTRUCTORS.

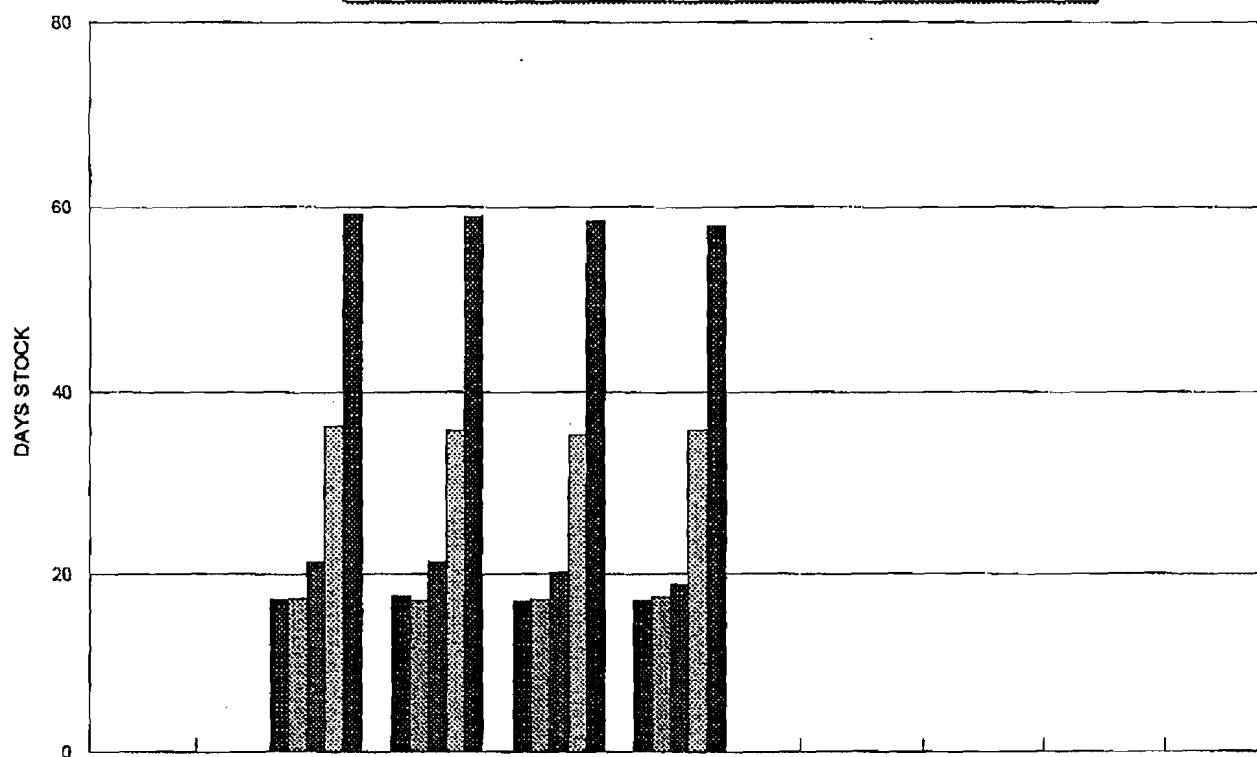

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED STABLE ALTHOUGH SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS ESPECIALLY ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE.

THE DOWN SCALING OF THE FORCE IS GOING ON WITH THE DEPARTURE FROM THE MISSION OF 184 NIGERIAN SOLDIERS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL'S VISIT TO RWANDA

(1) THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. BOUTROS BOUTROS-GHALI, PAID AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA FROM 13 TO 14 JULY. ON 13 JULY, HE MET WITH THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, AFTER WHICH HE ADDRESSED THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY. LATER IN THE SAME DAY, HE ATTENDED A DINNER GIVEN IN HIS HONOUR BY THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA, H.E. MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU.

(2) ON 14 JULY, THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL ATTENDED A MEDALS PARADE AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS FOLLOWING WHICH HE LAID A WREATH AT A MASSACRE SITE LOCATED IN SOUTHEASTERN RWANDA IN MEMORY OF THE VICTIMS OF THE RECENT GENOCIDE. LATER, HE MADE AN AERIAL INSPECTION OF KIGALI PRISON AND A PRISON IN SOUTHEASTERN RWANDA WHICH IS BEING RENOVATED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY. PRIOR TO HIS DEPARTURE, HE ALSO HELD JOINT TALKS ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA WITH THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT AND THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. FOLLOWING HIS DEPARTURE FROM KIGALI, THE SRSG MET WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY TO BRIEF THEM ON THE SECRETARY-GENERAL'S VISIT TO RWANDA.

(3) IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT STATED THAT HE WAS GRATEFUL FOR THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL'S VISIT TO RWANDA, BUT THAT RWANDA DID "NOT NEED LESSONS ON TALKS WITH RWANDESE REFUGEES. NEGOTIATIONS ON POWER-SHARING WITH CRIMINALS ARE OUT OF THE QUESTION. ALL WE CAN DO IS TO HAVE CONTACTS WITH REFUGEES." HE ADDED THAT THE SECRETARY-GENERAL DID NOT UNDERSTAND RWANDA'S DEMANDS, AND THAT "THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY SHOULD RATHER PRAISE THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FOR HAVING ALLOWED HUTUS AND TUTSIS TO WORK TOGETHER." HE ALSO STATED THAT THE DONOR FATIGUE REFERRED TO BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL WAS NOT JUSTIFIED AS RWANDA HAD NOT RECEIVED ENOUGH ASSISTANCE THUS FAR.

B. OTHER DEVELOPMENTS IN RWANDA

(1) THE SRSG, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, ON 11 JULY MET WITH THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT TO DISCUSS THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL'S PROGRAMME DURING HIS VISIT TO RWANDA. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED IMPLEMENTATION OF UNAMIR'S MANDATE WITHIN THE NEXT SIX MONTHS, THE IMPORTANCE OF ACTIVATING THE JUSTICE SYSTEM IN RWANDA, AS WELL AS THE DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS FOLLOWING THE RECENT MID-TERM DONORS CONFERENCE HELD IN KIGALI.

(2) RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY DECIDED ON 10 JULY THAT THE DRAFT LAW ON THE RECRUITMENT OF FOREIGN MAGISTRATES IN RWANDA WAS AN INFRINGEMENT OF NATIONAL SOVEREIGNTY. THE PARLIAMENTARIANS REPORTEDLY STATED THAT THE JUDICIAL POWER IN RWANDA WAS THE EXCLUSIVE PREROGATIVE OF

RWANDESE NATIONALS.

(3) THE SRSG HELD MEETINGS ON 11 AND 12 JULY WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM DONOR COUNTRIES TO DISCUSS MEASURES TO REVIVE THE REPATRIATION PROCESS OF RWANDESE REFUGEES. THEY DISCUSSED THE NECESSARY ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY RWANDA, NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY FOLLOWING THE BUJUMBURA CONFERENCE AND THE NAIROBI SUMMIT HELD EARLIER THIS YEAR.

(4) ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE TANZANIAN MINISTER OF DEFENCE, COLONEL ABDULHAMAN KINANA, STATED DURING THE COURSE OF HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF TANZANIA WOULD ASSIST THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY IN ITS EFFORTS TO BRING TO JUSTICE THE PERPETRATORS OF THE RECENT GENOCIDE IN RWANDA WHO ARE NOW SEEKING REFUGE ON TANZANIAN TERRITORY. HE ALSO REPORTEDLY STATED THAT THERE WAS NO REASON FOR RWANDESE REFUGEES IN TANZANIA NOT TO RETURN HOME AS PEACE HAD BEEN RESTORED TO RWANDA.

(5) RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE REPRESENTATIVE TO THE UNITED NATIONS, MR. MANZI BAKURAMUTSU, HAS WRITTEN TO THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL DEMANDING THE LIFTING OF THE U.N. ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA.

(6) RADIO RWANDA ANNOUNCED THAT, AT A PREFECTURAL CONFERENCE ON NATIONAL RECONCILIATION HELD IN GITARAMA IN CENTRAL RWANDA, THE POPULATION WAS ADVISED THAT THE ACTIVITIES OF POLITICAL PARTIES WERE TO BE BANNED AS THEY HAD BEEN A SOURCE OF SOCIAL DIVISIONS IN THE PAST.

(7) RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE EUROPEAN UNION, IN A COMMUNIQUE PUBLISHED IN BRUSSELS ON 13 JULY, HAS DECIDED TO RESUME ITS ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA WHICH WAS SUSPENDED FOLLOWING THE KIBEHO INCIDENT IN APRIL OF THIS YEAR.

(8) THE SRSG LEFT THE MISSION AREA ON 15 JULY TO GO ON HOME LEAVE. DURING HIS ABSENCE, THE FORCE COMMANDER, MAJOR-GENERAL GUY TOUSIGNANT, WILL BE ACTING AS HEAD OF MISSION.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(A) MALAWICOY PTL TO FUMBA GR 2255 REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE EXTORTING MONEY FROM LOCALS AND ANYONE WHO FAILED TO COMPLY, WAS ARRESTED. ON 8 JUL 95, ONE SUCH LOCAL WOMAN CONFIRMED THAT HER

HUSBAND ALONG WITH OTHER LOCALS WERE IMPRISONED AT GISOVU COMMUNE FOR THE SAME REASON.

(B) SECTOR 4, CYANGUGU MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA DEPLOYED A PLATOON IN THE AREA OF IBASHA AND TWO TO THREE SOLDIERS WERE MANNING NYANGE ENTRY POINT.

(C) IN SECTOR 2 KIBONGO MILOBS OBSERVED A TRUCK LOAD OF ARMED RPA SOLDIERS HEADING TOWARDS THE BUKOBA BORDER POST GR 8737.

(2) MILITIA/FRGF

(A) IN SECTOR 3B, MALAWICOY PTL TO MUSHUMBATI GR 3278 REPORTED THAT ON THE 7 JUL 95, A BUSINESSMAN WAS SHOT DEAD BY TWO ARMED MEN WHO TOOK AWAY 200,000 RWANDESE FRANCS AND 4 CRATES OF SOFT DRINKS. THE BANDITS WERE LATER CAUGHT BY THE LOCALS IN THE AREA AND IT WAS REPORTED THAT THEY WERE AT MABANZA PRISON GR 3474.

(B) IN SECTOR 4C, INTERHAMWE ROBBED CASH FROM TWO CIVILIAN AT MUGANZA AND MUHAHWE ON 08 JUL 95. IN THE SAME SECTOR, ON 10 JUL 95 RPA EXCHANGED FIRE WITH INTERHAMWE NEAR CYTE GR 7618. NO CAS WAS REPORTED.

(C) IN SECTOR 4A PATROL AT MUGOTE GR 5045 REPORTED THAT TWO LOCALS WERE ATTACKED BY BANDITS IN THEIR HOMES ON THE NIGHT OF 07 JUL 95. PERSONAL ITEMS AND MONEY WERE TAKEN BY BANDITS. ONE OF THEM WAS ARRESTED AND SENT TO MUSANGE COMMUNE PRISON.

(D) MILOBS REPORTED SHOOTING INCIDENTS IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS AT BUKAVU. SMALL ARMS FIRE WAS HEARD BETWEEN 1130 AND 1200 HRS FROM THE PANZI CAMP AND AROUND 1730 HRS IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD OF BUKAVU. IN THE EARLIER INCIDENT ZAIRIAN TROOPS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE SURROUNDED THE PANZI CAMP. IN THE SECOND INCIDENT, ZAIRIAN TROOPS IN BUKAVU WERE REPORTED TO HAVE RETURNED FIRE WHEN THE CAMP CAME UNDER FIRE FROM UNIDENTIFIED GUNMEN. WOMEN AND CHILDREN WERE SEEN FLEEING THE CAMP WITH THEIR PERSONAL BELONGINGS. THE EXACT CAUSE OF THE INCIDENTS ARE UNKNOWN. DETAILED REPORTED TO FOLLOW.

BELGIAN GOVERNMENT ISSUES.

(B) NEW RPA CHIEF LIAISON OFFICER, MAJOR KAMARADE KAYITARE, WAS INTRODUCED TO THE FC. THE NEW CHIEF LO WILL HAVE THE ABILITY TO PROVIDE A MORE REGULAR CONTACT WITH THE FHQ AND PLEDGED TO CONTINUE TO ASSIST IN MATTERS OF COOPERATION BETWEEN UNAMIR AND RPA.

(C) FC MET WITH SRSG AND SENIOR STAFF TO DISCUSS VISIT OF SECRETARY GENERAL 13-14 JUL 95. ITINERARY AND VISIT LOCATIONS HAVE BEEN FINALIZED AND COORDINATED.

(D) FC HAD COURTESY VISIT FROM CANADIAN EMBASSY REPRESENTATIVE FROM NAIROBI AND DISCUSSED CURRENT EMBASSY ISSUES AND GENERAL SITUATION WITH UNAMIR AND CANADIAN INVOLVEMENT.

(E) FC VISITED SENBATT AND MILOBS IN BUTARE AND SENBATT COMPANY POSITION IN KIGEMBE. UNITS APPEARED ORGANIZED AND FC COMMENTED ON THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE UNIT AND ITS RELATIONS SINCE IT FIRST ARRIVED IN THE AREA FROM KIBUYE PREFECTURE. SENBATT TROOPS ARE DUE FOR ROTATION DURING THE SECOND WEEK OF AUGUST. HE ALSO MET WITH NGOS AND UN AGENCY REPS. DURING THE MEETING HE RECEIVED AN UPDATE OF VARIOUS WORKS THAT ARE ONGOING AND DISCUSSED SOME OF THE CONCERNS CURRENTLY PRESENT. WITH THE DOWNSIZING, UNAMIR IS GOING TO ASSIGN RADIO FREQUENCIES FOR USE IN THE LOCAL AREA.

(F) BRIGADIER GENERAL BUCKLEY OF AUSTRALIA PAID A COURTESY VISIT TO THE FC DURING HIS VISIT TO THE AUSTRALIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT FORCES.

(G) ON 14 JUL A SPECIAL PARADE WAS HELD AT UNAMIR HQ WHERE THE SECRETARY GENERAL PRESENTED UNAMIR MEDALS TO CONTINGENT SOLDIERS, MILOBS AND STAFF. THE SG MET DURING HIS VISIT THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT AND THE VICE PRESIDENT BEFORE HE DEPARTED FOR ANGOLA.

(A) INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS DISTRIBUTED HOES, BLANKETS AND CONTAINERS TO LOCALS OF MUNINI GR 4799. FOUR ZAMBATT TRUCKS DELIVERED RELIEF FOOD ITEMS FROM WFP TO LOCALS OF KADUHA.

(B) PROVIDED TWO (2) TRUCKS TO FEED THE CHILDREN FOR TRANSPORTATION OF SCHOOL BUILDING MATERIAL FROM GIKONGORO TO RWAMIKO GR 4913.

(7) SECTOR 4B (SENBATT).

(A) CONTINUED PROVISION OF GUARDS FOR UN AGENCIES, NGOS AND TRANSIT CAMP NYAGATARE.

I. PATROLS TO GIKOMERO COMMUNE OBSERVED THAT THERE WERE 12 NEW PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE PRISONS. THE REASON FOR THEIR ARREST WAS NOT DISCLOSED.

(E) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO.

I. PTL TO RILIMA GR 2561, KABUGA GR 2581, RUGENDA GR 2784, MUREHE GR 3178, RUBONA GR 4474 REPORTED THAT AT RUBONA SECTOR, THERE WERE 50 PRISONERS OVERCROWDED IN TWO SMALL

ROOMS.

II. PATROL TO RILIMA GR 2561, GASHORA GR 2655, RUTETE GR 2242, NGENDA GR 0644 AND BRIDGE AT GR 0972 REPORTED THERE WAS LACK OF WATER AND UTENSILS FOR THE RETURNEES. LACK OF TRANSPORT WAS ALSO IMPEDING THE SMOOTH TRANSPORTATION OF RETURNEES TO THEIR COMMUNES.

(F) IN SECTOR 3 - KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

I. PATROL TO KIBUYE VISITED THE HOSPITAL. THE TEAM FOUND A SERIOUSLY WOUNDED MALE WHO HAD BEEN BEATEN BY THE POLICE OF MABANGA COMMUNE AFTER BEING ARRESTED LAST WEEK FOR HAVING ALLEGEDLY PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

II. ONE MILOB TEAM PATROLLED BUTEMBO SECTOR IN RWAMATAMU COMMUNE AND REPORTED ONE LOCAL REFUGEE FROM ZAIRE WAS ARRESTED FOR STOCK THEFT LAST WEEK, HOWEVER HIS PLACE OF DETENTION WAS NOT KNOWN. THE LOCALS OF BUNGO GR 1153 AND MUBUGA GR 1054 MET ON 11 JULY 95 TO DISCUSS A LAND DISPUTE. THERE WERE ALSO UNCONFIRMED REPORTS OF BANDITS COMING FROM ZAIRE AT MUSHUNGWE GR 0853, AN ISLAND SOUTH WEST OF GISHEKE GR 0953.

III. THE NEW SECTOR CDR ACCOMPANIED A MILOB/HR TEAM TO GIKOMA COMMUNE GR 7649 FOR A MEETING WITH THE BOURGMESTER AND A VISIT TO COMMUNE CAHOT. THE BURGOMESTER WAS COOPERATIVE. THE CACHOT HAD 28 PRISONERS, 25 OF WHICH WERE ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE AND 03 FOR COMMON CRIMES. FIVE OF THE PRISONERS WERE RETURNEES FROM KIBEHO CAMP.

IV. IN. GATAGARA MILOBS VISITED THE HANDICAPPED PERSONS CENTRE WHICH HAS 100 PEOPLE, 50 OF WHOM ARE BLIND. IT HAS A STAFF STRENGTH OF 80, INCLUDING DOCTORS, TEACHERS, NURSES AND OTHER STAFF MEMBERS. THE CENTRE HAS SHORTAGE OF TOOLS AND RAW MATERIALS FOR MAKING ARTIFICIAL LIMBS. THE LIST OF PRIORITIZED ITEMS WILL BE GIVEN TO MILOBS LATER. NGOS IN POSITION TO HELP SHALL BE APPROACHED BY UNAMIR. AT THE SAME LOCATION THE TEAM VISITED THE LABORATORY SCHOOL. IT HAS 12 TEACHERS, 24 STUDENTS IN FIRST AND SECOND GRADE. THEY HAVE A PROBLEM OF QUALIFIED TEACHERS TO OPEN THE THIRD AND FOURTH GRADE. SOME NGOS PROVIDED SUCH HELP IN THE PAST. THE HR INTERVIEWED THE LABORATORY SCHOOL DIRECTOR WHO SAID HIS

PERSONNELS WERE AT RISK DUE TO RUMOURS OF GENOCIDE ACCUSATION.

V. ANOTHER TEAM VISITED NYABIKENKE COMMUNE GR 7292 AND REPORTED THAT THE BIREME CLINIC WAS RUN BY MSF WHICH PROVIDED MEDICATION AND FOOD FOR MALNOURISHED PEOPLE. IT HAS 50 BEDS AND RECEIVES UP TO 60 TO 100 PATIENTS PER DAY. THIS CLINIC REQUESTED FOR GENERATOR REPAIRS, COMPLETION OF TWO BLOCKS OF THE BUILDING WHICH WERE LEFT UNCOMPLETED, AN AMBULANCE, STATIONERY, BEDS AND MATTRESSES. THE TEAM ALSO LEARNT THAT THERE WAS A DUTCH NGO WAGENSI ASSISTING IN HIRING OF LOCALS TO REBUILD THE DESTROYED HOUSES. IN KIBUYE THE TEAM FOUND CHILDREN BEING VACCINATED BY THE ICRC AGAINST USUAL DISEASES WHILST CARITAS DISTRIBUTED FOOD TO THE POOREST FAMILIES.

(G) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.

I. PATROL TO KIVU COMMUNE GR 4004 WAS INFORMED BY THE BOURGMESTER THAT BANDITS OPERATED FROM NYAKIZU GR 5796 AND RWAMIKO GR 4941 COMMUNES. ON 09 JULY 95 THEY ATTACKED AND KILLED A 50 YEAR OLD MAN AND STOLE ALL HIS CATTLE, MONEY AND OTHER ITEMS.

II. AT MUSANGE COMMUNE GR 5347 MILOBS OBSERVED A DEMONSTRATION, BY THE LOCALS WHO WERE DEMANDING THE RESIGNATION OF THE BOURGMESTER. THE BOURGMESTER AND RPA PLATOON CDR REFUSED TO COMMENT ON THE DEMONSTRATION.

III. AT NYAMIGINA GR 4523 ON THE NIGHT OF 07 JULY 95 A GROUP OF CIVILIANS AND SOME ARMED SOLDIERS ATTACKED A FAMILY. THEIR INTENTION WAS TO ARREST THE HEAD OF THE FAMILY. THE NEIGHBOURS STARTED SHOUTING AND MADE THE GROUP TO RUN AWAY BUT WERE PURSUED BY RPA PATROL AND ALL OF THEM WERE APPREHENDED AND SENT TO GIKONGORO PRISON.

(H) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE.

I. THE FC AND DCMO VISITED THE SECTOR AND HELD CONFERENCE WITH SECTOR HQ STAFF.

II. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGANZA COMMUNE (GR 8407) WAS FOUND PRESIDING OVER LAND DISPUTES IN THE COMMUNE.

(I) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU.

I. ON 110918B AN AIRCRAFT WAS SIGHTED

FLYING OVER BUGARAMA CITY IN A GENERAL DIRECTION SOUTH NORTH. THE AIRCRAFT CIRCLED THE CIMERWA CEMENT FACTORY COMPLEX ONCE, THEN PROCEEDED NORTH. IT LOOKED LIKE A CESSNA 212 TYPE.

II. MILOBS REPORTED A ROBBERY INCIDENT IN BUGARAMA COMMUNE AROUND 2200 HRS ON 11 JUNE 95. 6 BANDITS REPORTEDLY THREW GRENADES INTO A HOUSE INJURING 4 PERSONS TWO THEM BADLY.

(J) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. MILOBS PTL REPORTED THAT SECURITY SITUATION WAS NOT GOOD AT GASEKE GR 5004 COMMUNE AND IN AREAS BORDERING THE GISHWATI FOREST. IN RWILI GR 4299, MAGABA GR 4697, MUHANDA GR 4500 LOCALS WERE BEING HARASSED BY PEOPLE FROM GISHWATI. THEFTS AND INTIMIDATION HAD TAKEN PLACE THERE. THE CULPRITS WERE SAID TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN GENOCIDE AND BEING WELL ARMED. IN GICIYE COMMUNE GR 4312 SOME BANDITRY AND TWO MURDERS WERE REPORTED. THE RPA HAS INCREASED THEIR PRESENCE IN THE AREA AND ESTABLISHED A CAMP AT GAKAMBA GR 0134 WHICH APPEARED TO REDUCE THE INCIDENTS.

II. ANOTHER TEAM REPORTED THAT IN KAYOVE COMMUNE GR 2792 THE SITUATION WAS DETERIORATING AS A RESULT OF INCURSIONS FROM THE GISHWATI FOREST. ROBBERY OF A SHOP BY INTERAHAMWE WAS REPORTED AT MUSHNYI SECTOR GR 2794 AND RPA REPORTEDLY EXCHANGED FIRE WITH THE ROBBERS KILLING TWO OF THEM IN THE PROCESS. THE INTERAHAMWE HAD EARLIER TAKEN A HOSTAGE FROM THE VILLAGE WHOM THEY KILLED LATER. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT RPA CAPTURED SOME ARMS, GRENADES, MINES (INCLUDING TWO ANTI-TANK) AND SOME FORMER ARMY UNIFORMS. ON 29 JUNE 95 A GROUP OF FOUR BANDITS ENTERED THE HOUSE IN GISUNZU CELL, KIGEYO SECTOR GR 2399, AND DEMANDED FOOD. NEIGHBOURS REPORTED IT TO RPA WHO SURROUNDED THE HOUSE AND IN THE ENSUING FIGHT THREE BANDITS AND THE OWNER OF THE HOUSE WERE KILLED. THE FOURTH BANDIT WAS ARRESTED. ON 05 JULY 95, UNKNOWN PERSONS BURNT A VEHICLE AT THE SAME PLACE.

III. AT RWERERE GR 2622 THE SITUATION WAS DETERIORATING DUE TO INCREASED THEFTS AND ONE MURDER LAST WEEK.

IV. MILOBS REPORTED THAT SOME BURIED WEAPONS AND AMMO WERE FOUND BEHIND A HOUSE

IN GISENYI. WEAPONS WERE REPORTED TO BE RUSTY AND ESTIMATED TO BE HAVE BEEN BURIED FOR ABOUT A YEAR. MILOBS ASSESSED THAT SOME OTHER EXPLOSIVES MAY BE BURIED AROUND THE SAME SITE AND DID NOT DIG FURTHER. ONE BREN GUN AND SMALL QUANTITIES OF SMALL ARMS WERE ALSO FOUND. RPA AUTHORITIES IN THE AREA WERE INFORMED.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. NSTR.

(12) FORCE ENGR COY.

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR AND THE VARIOUS COMMUNES IN RWANDA.

(B) DEMINING CARRIED OUT IN LOG BASE.

(C) CARRIED OUT RECCE FOR FENCING WORK IN PRISON IN BUTARE.

(13) AUSMED

(C) MILOB SECTOR 1 REPORTED THEFT OF A MERCEDES TRUCK FROM UNHCR AT GITARAMA STATION BUS ON 12 JUL 95.

10. CONCLUSION. ALTHOUGH THE SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED UNDER CONTROL, THERE WAS A MARKED INCREASE IN THE BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ESPECIALLY IN SECTOR 4C. THE REPEATED REPORTS OF AN IMPENDING FRGF ATTACK FROM ZAIRE, HAS RESULTED IN THE LOCALS LIVING IN FEAR OF ANOTHER POSSIBLE GENOCIDE.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED JOINT PATROL WITH CIVPOL TO THE MUGINA COMMUNE (GR 9267). THE BOURGEMESTRE CONFIRMED AN EARLIER REPORT OF THE MURDER OF A MAN BY AN RPA SOLDIER IN AN APPARENT CASE OF SELF DEFENCE. THE BOURGEMESTRE REFUSED TO GIVE ANY FURTHER DETAILS WITH THE REASON THAT IT WAS A PURELY MILITARY CASE. A VISIT TO THE COMMUNE PRISON REVEALED 120 PRISONERS ON CHARGE OF PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE AND 27 OTHERS ON OTHER CRIMINAL CHARGES, FEMALE PRISONERS INCLUDED THREE WHO WERE PREGNANT. PRISON WAS CLEAN AND NOT OVERCROWDED.

(C) OTHER PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED IN THE TAMBWE (GR 7653), MUNINI (GR 7856) AND KAYENZI (GR 8389) COMMUNES TO MONITOR THE STATE OF HEALTH FACILITIES AND TO LIAISE WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES. THE SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL.

THREE ARMED, UNIFORMED MEN, SUSPECTED TO BE RPA SOLDIERS, RAIDED THE HOUSE OF A LOCAL AND STOLE 5 COWS AND 2,000 RFR. THE GANG WAS TRACED TO MATAZO MARKET IN BUTARE. THE VICTIM WAS SHOT IN THE LEG DURING THE INCIDENT. LOCALS IN THE VILLAGE PANICKED AND WENT INTO HIDING IN THE BUSHES AS A RESULT OF A GRENADE EXPLOSION DURING THE INCIDENT. LOCAL RPA COMD WAS INFORMED ABOUT THE INCIDENT.

(9) IN SECTOR 3B - BUTARE. MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE HUYE COMMUNE (GR 6714). LOCAL AUTHORITIES REPORTED THAT THERE WAS AN ONGOING FOOD SHORTAGE IN THE COMMUNE DUE TO A BAD HARVEST. PATROLS TO MUGANZA (GR 8407) ALSO REPORTED THE ARRIVAL OF 78 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI OVER THE WEEKEND. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS HOWEVER REPORTED NORMAL.

(10) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(11) IN SECTOR 5A - RUHENGERI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(A) MILOBS PATROLS TO MUTUVO WERE INFORMED BY RPA COY COMD IN THE LOCATION THAT 360 FAMILIES HAD BEEN MOVED FROM THE AREA OF THE BORDER TO OTHER AREAS CONSIDERED MORE SECURE. THE RPA COMD ALSO MENTIONED THAT THERE WAS A SEVERE FOOD SHORTAGE IN THE MUTURA COMMUNE AND IN THE TWO REFUGEE CAMPS ON THE EDGES OF THE GISHWATI FOREST. DETAILS WERE PASSED TO UNHCR REPS IN THE SECTOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED THE WASHING ASHORE OF A THIRD CORPSE ESTIMATED TO BE ABOUT 2 WEEKS OLD IN THE AREA OF GISENYI. DOCTOR AT GISENYI HOSPITAL TO PERFORM AUTOPSY TO DETERMINE CAUSE OF DEATH. SECTOR COMMANDER ASSESSES THAT THE DEATH MAY BE DUE TO AN INTERCEPTED WATER INCURSION OR THE SINKING OF A REFUGEE BOAT.

(C) MILOBS REPORTED A MINOR INTERRUPTION OF ELECTRICITY SUPPLY IN THE AREA OF NYUNDO DUE TO THE BLOWING UP OF A POWER TRANSFORMER AT THAT LOCATION ON 16 JUL 95 AROUND 2000HRS. THE LOCAL AUTHORITY WAS BLAMED FOR NOT SENDING PATROLS TO COVER THE AREA. THE SABOTAGE ATTEMPT WAS ASSESSED AS AMATEURISH IN ITS EXECUTION. DAMAGE WAS LIMITED AND LOCALISED.

(13) IN SECTOR 5C-KIBUYE.

(A) MILOBS PATROLLED THE RUTSIRO COMMUNE TO INVESTIGATE THE REFUGEE SITUATION. A REP OF THE SOCIAL REHABILITATION MINISTRY INFORMED THE PATROL ABOUT THE INCREASING RATE OF RETURN OF REFUGEES OF THE 1959/60 CASELOAD. A TOTAL OF 1284 REFUGEES HAD SO FAR BEEN REGISTERED OUT OF WHICH 466 HAD BEEN RESETTLED IN BWIZA (GR 3794). FOOD AND WARM CLOTHING WERE HOWEVER REPORTED TO BE IN SHORT SUPPLY. A MEDICAL CENTRE FOR THE AREA IS ALSO REQUIRED. HAC INFORMED.

B. 7 UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVERS FROM GERMANY DEPARTED FOR THEIR HOME COUNTRY ON 17 JUL 95 AFTER THE COMPLETION OF THEIR TOUR OF DUTY.

C. CIVPOL IN KIBUNGO PREFECTURE PATROLLED AOR ON 17 JUL 95 AND REPORTED THAT RPA AND GENDARMES WERE OBSERVED AT CHECK POINTS AND HAVE INTENSIFIED FOOT PATROLS IN THE AREA. MEANWHILE, THE SECURITY SITUATION IS CALM THROUGHOUT THE AREA. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED SAKA COMMUNE AND OBSERVED THAT IRC WAS DISTRIBUTING FARMING IMPLEMENTS TO THE LOCALS. ALSO 8 FAMILIES OF REFUGEES WERE FOUND AT THE TRANSIT CAMP AND THEY COMPLAINED OF LACK OF FOOD, WATER AND CLOTHING.

D. THE TEAM ALSO PATROLLED AOR ON 17 JUL 95 AND REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE CONTINUED TO MOUNT CHECK-POINTS AT STRATEGIC POINTS THROUGHOUT THE PREFECTURE. SEARCHES ON MOTORISTS EXCEPT UNAMIR VEHICLES HAVE BEEN INTENSIFIED. REASONS UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

E. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED KINIGI COMMUNE AND MET THE COMMUNE SECRETARY WHO INFORMED THEM THAT THE AREA WAS CALM. HE HOWEVER DISCLOSED THAT LOCALS IN THE COMMUNE TRAVEL LONG DISTANCES IN SEARCH OF WATER. HE APPEALED TO UNAMIR FOR ASSISTANCE.

F. THE SAME TEAM VISITED KIGALI PRISON ON 17 JUL 95 AND WAS INFORMED BY THE OFFICER-IN-CHARGE OF THE PRISON THAT THERE ARE 9758 PRISONERS INCLUDING 355 WOMEN AND 74 CHILDREN. THE OFFICER FURTHER DISCLOSED THAT ONE (1) PRISONER DIED ON 15 JUL 95 AS A RESULT OF ILLNESS.

G. THE TEAM AGAIN REPORTED THAT ON 17 JUL 95 A JOINT CIVPOL/MILOB/HR TEAM PATROLLED MUGINA COMMUNE AND MET THE BOURGMESTRE WHO INFORMED THEM THAT THE CRIME WAVE IN THE AREA WAS IN THE INCREASE. HE FURTHER DISCLOSED THAT ON 9 JUL 95 A LOCAL WAS SHOT AND KILLED BY RPA SOLDIER. THE DECEASED IS ALLEGED TO HAVE FOUGHT THE RPA SOLDIER WHO USED HIS RIFLE ALLEGEDLY IN SELF DEFENCE. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

H. THE GRADUATED UNAMIR TRAINED GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED IN THE VARIOUS PREFECTURES. MEANWHILE, THE SCHOOL IS PREPARING GROUNDS FOR THE OPENING PROGRAMME. IN VIEW OF THIS, 200

STUDENTS FROM VARIOUS PREFECTURE HAVE ARRIVED AT THE SCHOOL TO COMMENCE TRAINING.

I. EIGHTEEN (18) FRENCH SPEAKING CIVPOL OBSERVERS HAVE BEEN RE-DEPLOYED AT THE TRAINING SCHOOL TO SERVE AS INSTRUCTORS.

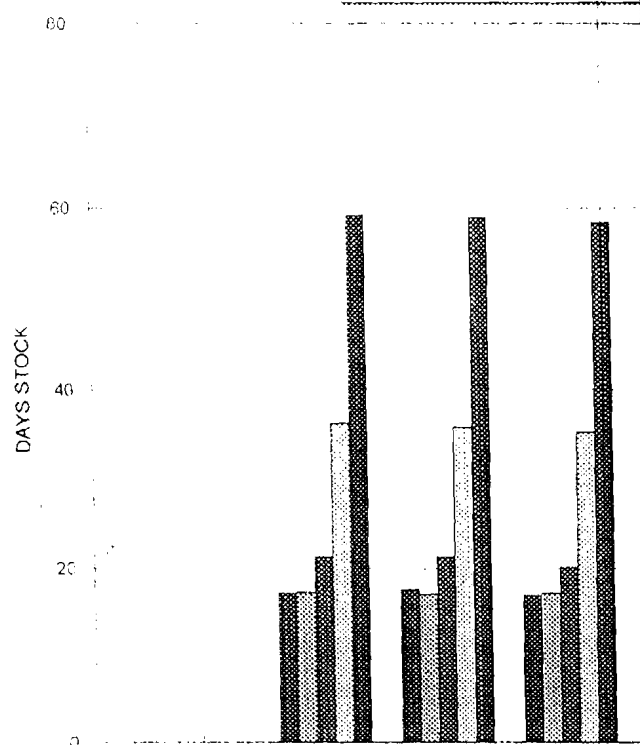

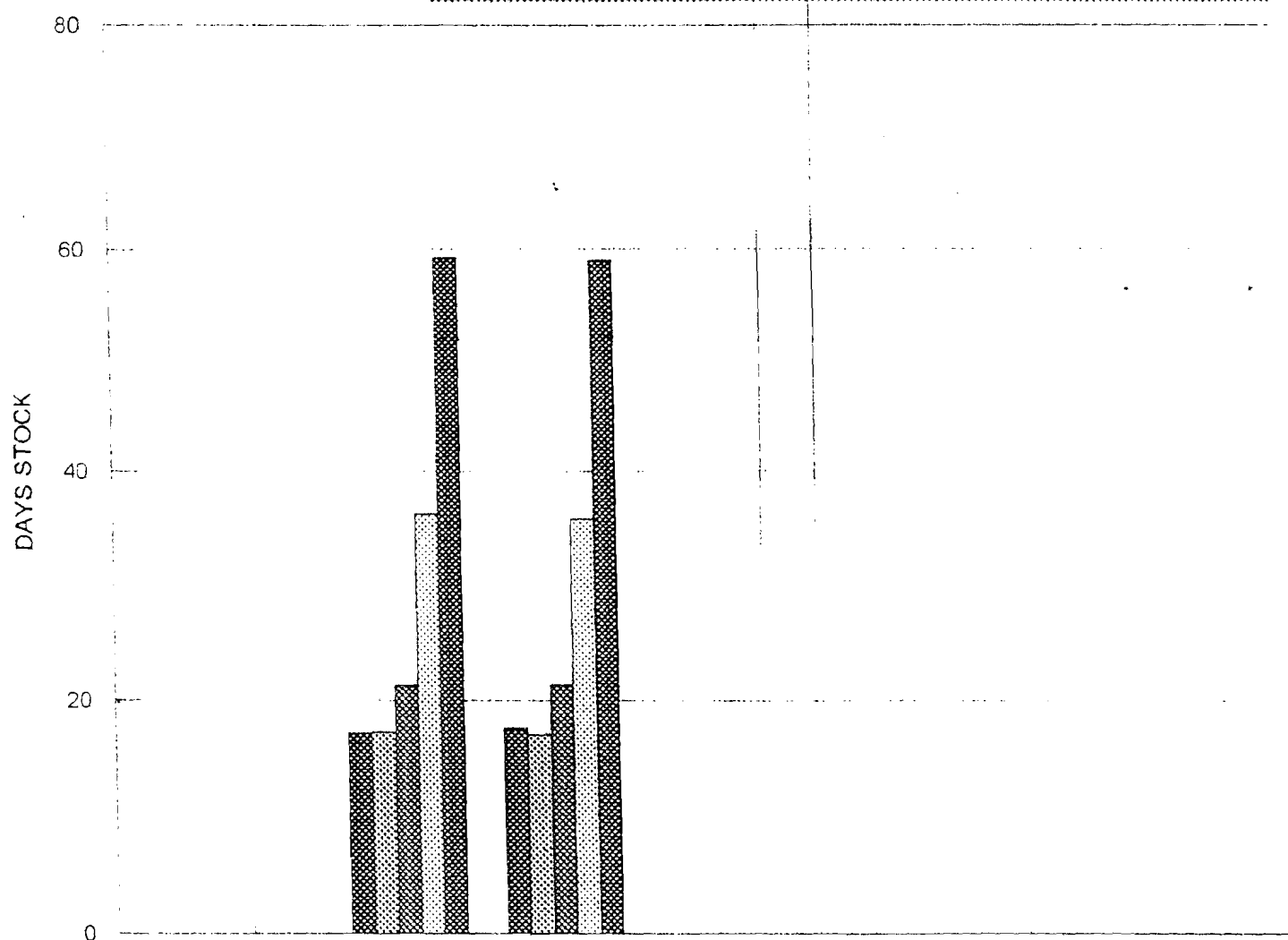

A. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, LEFT THE MISSION AREA ON 15 JUL 95 TO GO ON HOME LEAVE. DURING HIS ABSENCE, THE FORCE COMMANDER, MAJOR-GENERAL GUY TOUSIGNANT, WILL BE ACTING AS HEAD OF MISSION.

B. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT, HE MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU STATED THAT HE WAS GRATEFUL FOR THE UN SECRETARY-GENERAL'S VISIT TO RWANDA, BUT STATED THAT RWANDA DID "NOT NEED LESSONS ON TALKS WITH RWANDESE REFUGEES. NEGOTIATIONS ON POWER-SHARING WITH CRIMINALS ARE OUT OF THE QUESTION. ALL WE CAN DO IS TO HAVE CONTACTS WITH THE REFUGEES." HE ADDED THAT THE SECRETARY-GENERAL DID NOT UNDERSTAND RWANDA'S DEMANDS AND THAT "THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY SHOULD RATHER PRAISE THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FOR HAVING ALLOWED HUTUS AND TUTSIS TO WORK TOGETHER." HE ALSO STATED THAT THE DONOR FATIGUE REFERRED TO BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL WAS NOT JUSTIFIED AS RWANDA HAD NOT RECEIVED ENOUGH ASSISTANCE THUS FAR.

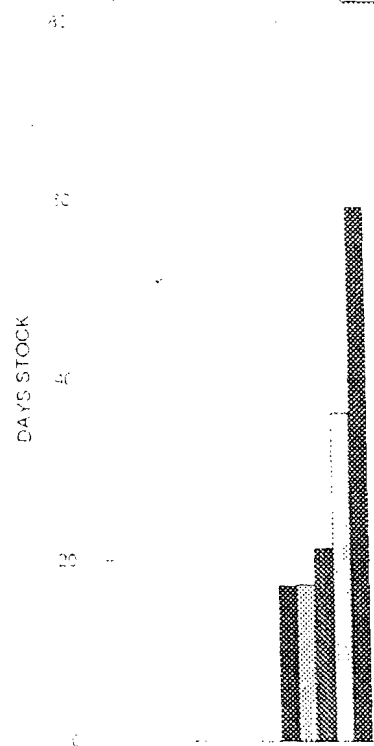

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE UNITED NATIONS. MR. BOUTROS BOUTROS GHALI, DEPARTED FROM KIGALI TODAY FOLLOWING AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA. ON 14 JUL 95 MORNING HE ATTENDED A MEDAL PARADE AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS AFTER LAYING A WREATH AT NYARUBUYE A MASSACRE SITE LOCATED IN SOUTH-EASTERN RWANDA IN MEMORY OF THE VICTIMS OF THE RECENT GENOCIDE. LATER, HE MADE AN AERIAL INSPECTION OF KIGALI PRISON AND NSINDA PRISON IN SOUTH-EASTERN RWANDA WHICH IS BEING RENOVATED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY. PRIOR TO HIS DEPARTURE, HE ALSO HELD JOINT TALKS ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA WITH THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT, H.E. MR PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, AND THE VICE-PRESIDENT, MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME.

B. THE SRSG, MR SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, MET WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY TO BRIEF THEM ON THE SECRETARY-GENERAL'S VISIT TO RWANDA.

C. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE TANZANIAN MINISTER OF DEFENCE, COLONEL ABDULHAMAN KINANA, STATED DURING THE COURSE OF HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA THAT THERE WAS NO REASON FOR RWANDESE REFUGEES IN TANZANIA NOT TO RETURN AS PEACE HAD BEEN RESTORED TO RWANDA.

THE SG SPOKE

OF THE GLOBAL FATIGUE OF THE UN AND AGREED THAT NO DIALOGUE SHOULD BE ENTERTAINED WITH ORGANIZERS OF THE GENOCIDE AND EXPLAINED THE DIFFICULTIES ASSOCIATED WITH DEPLOYMENT OF OBSERVERS IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

(2) A SPECIAL PARADE WAS CONDUCTED AT UNAMIR HQ WHERE THE SG PERSONALLY PRESENTED UNAMIR MEDALS TO MANY UNAMIR CONTINGENT SOLDIERS, OBSERVERS AND STAFF. THE SG REMINDED EVERYONE NOT TO FORGET THE ATROCITY OF THE GENOCIDE AND WHY UNAMIR IS HERE. HE EMPHASIZED THAT THE SOLDIERS AND STAFF OF UNAMIR HAVE INDEED MADE A DIFFERENCE IN THE COUNTRY'S REHABILITATION. THE PARADE WAS WELL ATTENDED BY CIVILIAN AND MILITARY STAFF AND INVITED GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

AFTER THE DEPARTURE OF THE SG, THE FC BOLDLY DEPARTED THE TERMINAL ON FOOT AMONGST SEVERAL PROTESTERS WITH PLACARDS WHO WERE SHOUTING FOR UNAMIR TO LEAVE RWANDA.

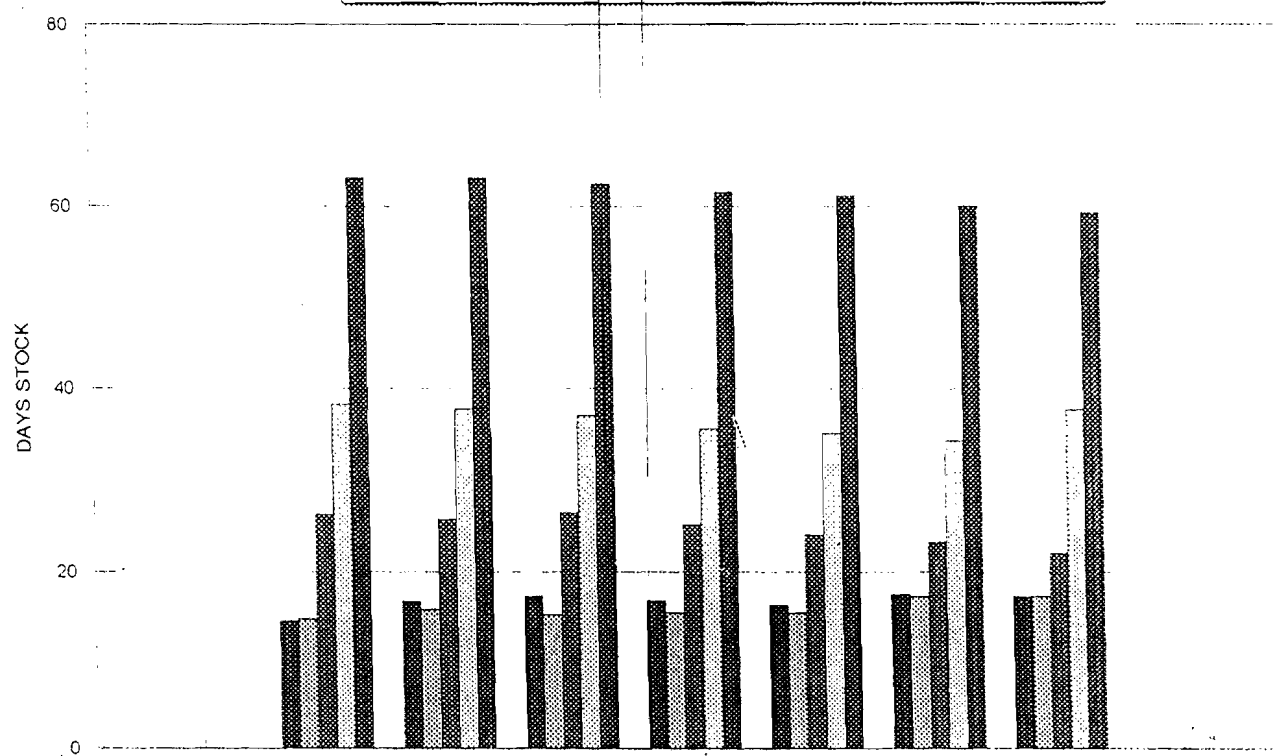

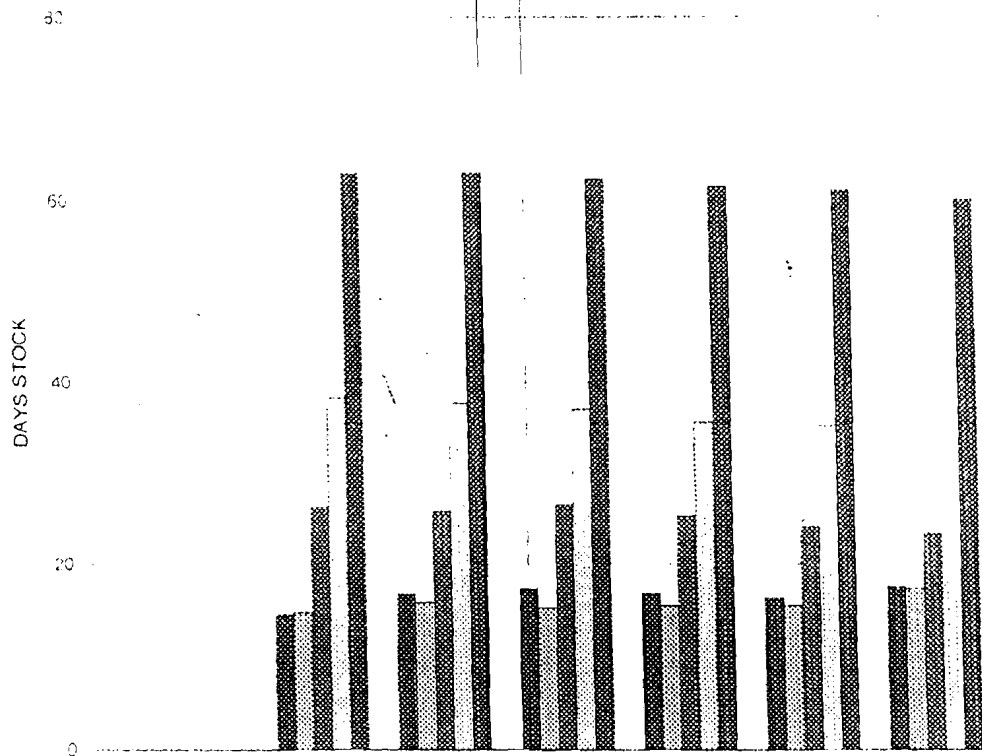

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, HELD MEETINGS YESTERDAY AND TODAY WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM DONOR COUNTRIES TO DISCUSS MEASURES TO REVIVE THE REPATRIATION PROCESS OF RWANDESE REFUGEES. THEY DISCUSSED THE NECESSARY ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN BY RWANDA, NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY FOLLOWING THE BUJUMBURA CONFERENCE AND THE NAIROBI SUMMIT HELD EARLIER THIS YEAR. THE SRSG ALSO ON 12 JUL 95 MET THE UNITED NATIONS HEADS AGENCIES TO DISCUSS THEIR OPERATIONS IN RWANDA.

B. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE TANZANIAN MINISTER OF DEFENCE, COLONEL ABDULHAMAN KINANA, STATED DURING AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF TANZANIA WOULD ASSIST THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY IN ITS EFFORTS TO BRING TO JUSTICE THE PERPETRATORS OF THE RECENT GENOCIDE IN RWANDA WHO ARE NOW SEEKING REFUGE ON TANZANIAN TERRITORY.

C. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE REPRESENTATIVE TO THE UNITED NATIONS, MR. MANZI BAKURAMUTSU, HAS WRITTEN TO THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL DEMANDING THE LIFTING OF THE UN ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA.

D. AS REPORTED BY RADIO RWANDA, AT A PREFECTURAL CONFERENCE ON NATIONAL RECONCILIATION HELD IN GITARAMA IN CENTRAL RWANDA YESTERDAY, THE POPULATION WAS ADVISED THAT THE ACTIVITIES OF POLITICAL PARTIES WERE TO BE BANNED AS THEY HAD BEEN A SOURCE OF SOCIAL DIVISIONS IN THE PAST.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWI COY REPORTED THAT AT NYARUTUNDURA GR 3189 RPA SOLDIERS ARRESTED ONE LOCAL WHO WAS PUT IN RUTSIRO PRISON. HE IS A HUTU SUSPECTED TO BE A FRGF MEMBER.

B. MILITIA/FRGF/BANDITRY. MILOBS REPORTED SHOOTING INCIDENTS IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS AT BUKAVU. SMALL ARMS FIRE WAS HEARD BETWEEN 1130 AND 1200 HRS FROM THE PANZI CAMP AND AROUND 1730 HRS IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD OF BUKAVU. IN THE EARLIER INCIDENT ZAIRIAN TROOPS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE SURROUNDED THE PANZI CAMP. IN THE SECOND INCIDENT, ZAIRIAN TROOPS IN BUKAVU WERE REPORTED TO HAVE RETURNED FIRE WHEN THE CAMP CAME UNDER FIRE FROM UNIDENTIFIED GUNMEN. WOMEN AND CHILDREN WERE SEEN FLEEING THE CAMP WITH THEIR PERSONAL BELONGINGS. THE EXACT CAUSE OF THE INCIDENTS ARE UNKNOWN. DETAILED REPORTS TO FOLLOW.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) FC VISITED SENBATT AND MILOBS IN BUTARE AND SENBATT

COMPANY POSITION IN KIGEMBE. UNITS APPEARED ORGANIZED AND FC COMMENTED ON THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE UNIT AND ITS RELATIONS SINCE IT FIRST ARRIVED IN THE AREA FROM KIBUYE PREFECTURE. SENBATT TROOPS ARE DUE FOR ROTATION DURING THE SECOND WEEK OF AUGUST. HE ALSO MET WITH NGOS AND UN AGENCY REPS. DURING THE MEETING HE RECEIVED AN UPDATE OF VARIOUS WORKS THAT ARE ONGOING AND DISCUSSED SOME OF THE CONCERNS CURRENTLY PRESENT. WITH THE DOWNSIZING, UNAMIR IS GOING TO ASSIGN RADIO FREQUENCIES FOR USE IN THE LOCAL AREA.

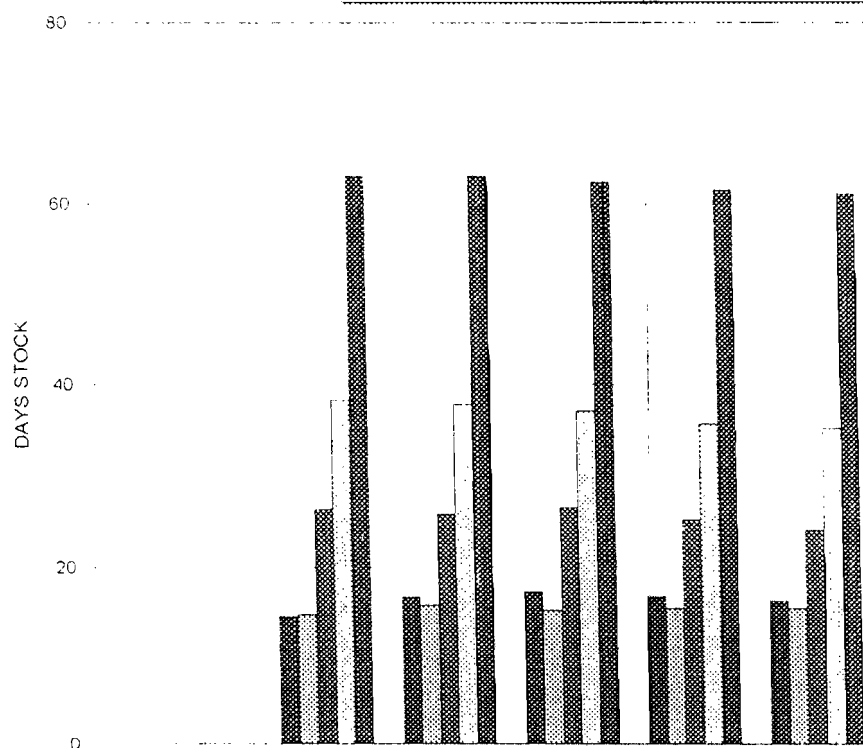

KHAN, MET TODAY WITH THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, TO DISCUSS THE UN SECRETARY-GENERAL'S PROGRAMME DURING HIS SCHEDULED VISIT TO RWANDA, INCLUDING AGENDA ITEMS FOR HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED IMPLEMENTATION OF UNAMIR'S MANDATE WITHIN THE NEXT SIX MONTH, THE IMPORTANCE OF ACTIVATING THE JUSTICE SYSTEM IN RWANDA, AS WELL AS THE DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS FOLLOWING THE RECENT MID-TERM DONORS CONFERENCE HELD IN KIGALI.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY DECIDED YESTERDAY THAT THE DRAFT LAW ON THE RECRUITMENT OF FOREIGN MAGISTRATES IN RWANDA WAS AN INFRINGEMENT OF NATIONAL SOVEREIGNTY. THE PARLIAMENTARIANS REPORTEDLY STATED THAT THE JUDICIAL POWER IN RWANDA WAS THE EXCLUSIVE PREROGATIVE OF RWANDESE NATIONALS, AND THAT RWANDESE PEOPLE SHOULD DEAL WITH THEIR OWN JUDICIAL CASES.

THE LOCALS OF BUNGO GR 1153 AND MUBUGA GR 1054 MET ON 11 JULY 95 TO DISCUSS A LAND DISPUTE. THERE WERE ALSO UNCONFIRMED REPORTS OF BANDITS COMING FROM ZAIRE AT MUSHUNGWE GR 0853, AN ISLAND SOUTH WEST OF GISHEKE GR 0953.

(C) MILOB TEAM WHICH ACCOMPANIED HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO GISOVU GR 2952, FOUND AN OVERTURNED RPA TRUCK AT MURAMBA GR 2056. THE MILOBS TRIED TO EVACUATE ONE INJURED LOCAL BUT UNFORTUNATELY HE DIED ON THE WAY TO NGOMA HOSPITAL.

(D) THE NEW SECTOR CDR ACCOMPANIED A MILOB/HR TEAM TO GIKOMA COMMUNE GR 7649 FOR A MEETING WITH THE BOURGMESTER AND A VISIT TO COMMUNE CAHOT. THE BURGOMESTER WAS COOPERATIVE. THE CACHOT HAD 28 PRISONERS, 25 OF WHICH WERE ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE AND 03 FOR COMMON CRIMES. FIVE OF THE PRISONERS WERE RETURNEES FROM KIBEHO CAMP.

(E) IN GATAGARA MILOBS VISITED THE HANDICAPPED PERSONS CENTRE WHICH HAS 100 PEOPLE, 50 OF WHOM ARE BLIND. IT HAS A STAFF STRENGTH OF 80, INCLUDING DOCTORS, TEACHERS, NURSES AND OTHER STAFF MEMBERS. THE CENTRE HAS SHORTAGE OF TOOLS AND RAW MATERIALS FOR MAKING ARTIFICIAL LIMBS. THE LIST OF PRIORITIZED ITEMS WILL BE GIVEN TO MILOBS LATER. NGOS IN POSITION TO HELP SHALL BE APPROACHED BY UNAMIR. AT THE SAME LOCATION THE TEAM VISITED THE LABORATORY SCHOOL. IT HAS 12 TEACHERS, 24 STUDENTS IN FIRST AND SECOND GRADE. THEY HAVE A PROBLEM OF QUALIFIED TEACHERS TO OPEN THE THIRD AND FOURTH GRADE. SOME NGOS PROVIDED SUCH HELP IN THE PAST. THE HR INTERVIEWED THE LABORATORY SCHOOL DIRECTOR WHO SAID HIS PERSONNELS WERE AT RISK DUE TO RUMOURS OF GENOCIDE ACCUSATION.

(F) ANOTHER TEAM VISITED NYABIKENKE COMMUNE GR 7292 AND REPORTED THAT THE BIREME CLINIC WAS RUN BY MSF WHICH PROVIDED MEDICATION AND FOOD FOR MALNOURISHED PEOPLE. IT HAS 50 BEDS AND RECEIVES UP TO 60 TO 100 PATIENTS PER DAY. THIS CLINIC REQUESTED FOR GENERATOR REPAIRS, COMPLETION OF TWO BLOCKS OF THE BUILDING WHICH WERE LEFT UNCOMPLETED, AN AMBULANCE, STATIONERY, BEDS AND MATTRESSES. THE TEAM ALSO LEARNT THAT THERE WAS A DUTCH NGO WAGENSENI ASSISTING IN HIRING OF LOCALS TO REBUILD THE DESTROYED HOUSES. IN KIBUYE THE TEAM FOUND CHILDREN BEING VACCINATED BY THE ICRC AGAINST USUAL

DISEASES WHILST CARITAS DISTRIBUTED FOOD TO THE POOREST FAMILIES.

(D) AT NYAMIGINA GR 4523 ON THE NIGHT OF 07 JULY 95 A GROUP OF CIVILIANS AND SOME ARMED SOLDIERS ATTACKED A FAMILY. THEIR INTENTION WAS TO ARREST THE HEAD OF THE FAMILY. THE NEIGHBOURS STARTED SHOUTING AND MADE THE GROUP TO RUN AWAY BUT WERE PURSUED BY RPA PATROL AND ALL OF THEM WERE APPREHENDED AND SENT TO GIKONGORO PRISON.

(B) ON 110918B AN AIRCRAFT WAS SIGHTED FLYING OVER BUGARAMA CITY IN A GENERAL DIRECTION SOUTH NORTH. THE AIRCRAFT CIRCLED THE CIMERWA CEMENT FACTORY COMPLEX ONCE, THEN PROCEEDED NORTH. IT LOOKED LIKE A CESSNA 212 TYPE.

(B) THE PREFECT OF RUHENGERI AND SOME NGOS HELD A SECURITY MEETING IN THE PREFECTURE. MILOBS WERE NOT INVITED.

THE RPA HAS INCREASED THEIR PRESENCE IN THE AREA AND ESTABLISHED A CAMP AT GAKAMBA GR 0134 WHICH APPEARED TO REDUCE THE INCIDENTS.

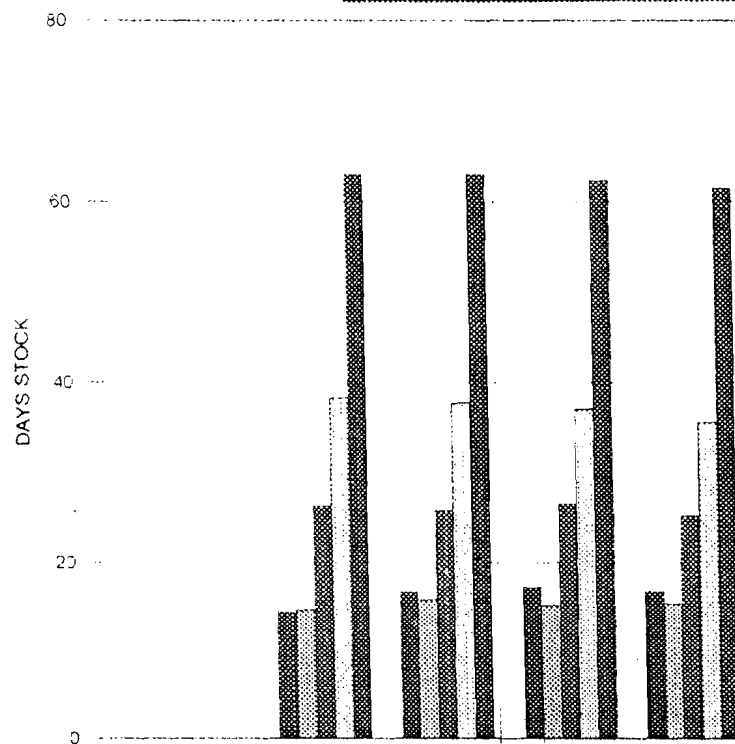

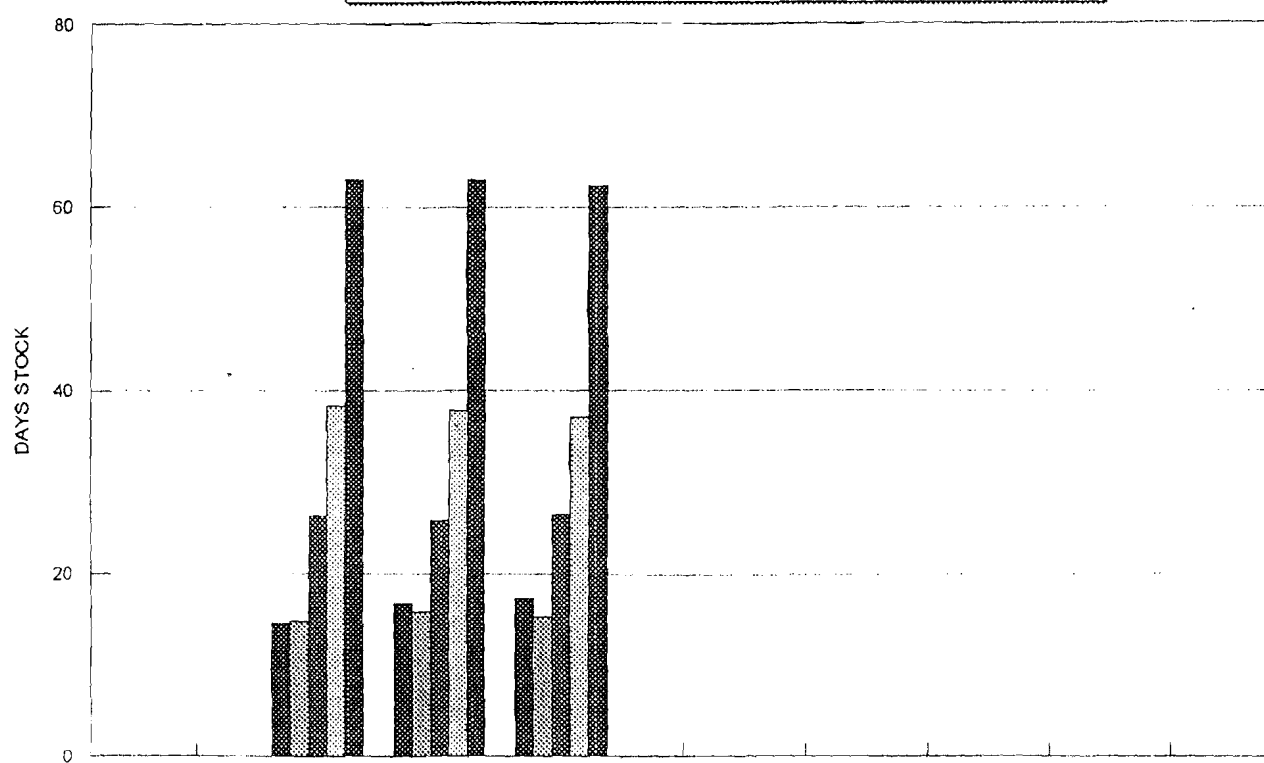

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. IN PREPARATION FOR THE DONOR'S MID-TERM REVIEW CONFERENCE FOR RWANDA HELD IN KIGALI FROM 6 TO 7 JULY, THE SRSG, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, HELD A MEETING ON 3 JULY WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM DONOR COUNTRIES AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS OPERATING IN RWANDA. HE ALSO MET WITH THE HEADS OF U.N. AGENCIES TO DISCUSS PREPARATIONS FOR THE SCHEDULED VISIT OF THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. BOUTROS BOUTROS-GHALI, TO KIGALI.

B. THE SRSG AND OTHER SENIOR UNAMIR OFFICIALS ATTENDED FESTIVITIES COMMEMORATING THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE RPA'S TAKEOVER OF KIGALI ON 4 JULY 1994. THE DAY WAS CELEBRATED AS RWANDA'S NEW NATIONAL DAY THEREBY REPLACING 1 JULY WHICH HAD FORMERLY BEEN REGARDED AS RWANDA'S INDEPENDENCE DAY.

C. REPRESENTATIVES FROM VARIOUS DONOR COUNTRIES, UNITED NATIONS AGENCIES, INTERGOVERNMENTAL ORGANISATIONS AND THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ATTENDED THE TWO-DAY MID-TERM DONORS CONFERENCE FOR RWANDA HELD ON 6 AND 7 JULY IN KIGALI. THE PURPOSE OF THE TWO-DAY EVENT WAS TO REVIEW THE EXTENT OF PROGRESS MADE IN THE DISBURSEMENT OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PLEDGED TO RWANDA AT THE GENEVA ROUND-TABLE CONFERENCE IN JANUARY OF THIS YEAR.

D. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT TWENTY DELEGATES FROM RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMPS LOCATED IN BURUNDI ARRIVED IN KIBUNGO IN SOUTHEASTERN RWANDA ON 5 JULY TO ASSESS CONDITIONS FOR THE RECEPTION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES SEEKING TO RETURN HOME.

E. ON 8 JULY, THE SRSG MET WITH THE UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. DAVID RAWSON, WHO WAS ACCOMPANIED BY H.E. MR. RICHARD BOGOSIAN, SPECIAL COORDINATOR FOR RWANDA AND BURUNDI FROM THE U.S. STATE DEPARTMENT, TO DISCUSS U.S.-RWANDA RELATIONS, COOPERATION BETWEEN RWANDA AND THE UNITED NATIONS, AND THE RECENT MID-TERM REVIEW OF THE DONORS ROUNDTABLE CONFERENCE HELD IN KIGALI. THE SRSG ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH SENIOR UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS PREPARATIONS FOR THE SECRETARY-GENERAL'S IMMINENT VISIT TO RWANDA.

F. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, STATED AT AN OFFICIAL RECEPTION HELD FOR REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DONOR COMMUNITY ON 7 JULY, THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA HAD DONE EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO FACILITATE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES AND TO ENSURE THEIR SECURITY BACK HOME. HE ALSO REPORTEDLY ADDED THAT THERE WAS NO LONGER ANY ETHNIC ANIMOSITY AMONG RWANDESE NATIONALS DUE TO THE CORRECTIVE POLICIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA.

(A) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS STOLE CATTLE FROM CIVILIANS AT MATA GR 517153 AND ABDUCTED A LOCAL.

(B) LOCALS OF GISHIYITA COMMUNE IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 02 JUL 95, 14 LOCALS OF MARA SECTOR GR 2068 WHO WERE TRYING TO FLEE TO ZAIRE BY BOAT, WERE SHOT AND KILLED BY RPA TROOPS AT KIBEHO CELLULE GR 1868. SEVEN OF THE VICTIMS WERE ALLEGEDLY BURIED WHILE THE OTHER SEVEN WERE MISSING. THE BOAT IS REPORTEDLY KEPT AT THE RPA CAMP AT MPEMBE.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS TO RWAMIKO COMMUNE GR 4914 WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF HARASSMENT BY THE RPA IN THE COMMUNE. LOCALS ALLEGED THAT THEIR LIVESTOCK WAS BEING SEIZED BY RPA SOLDIERS MOSTLY FROM BUTARE ACCOMPANIED BY TUTSI CIVILIANS WHO CLAIM THE CATTLE TO BE THEIRS. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(D) SECTOR 5 MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS MANNING A CHECK POINT ON GISENYI - RUHENGIERI ROAD THREW A HAND GRENADE AT A TRUCK WHICH FAILED TO STOP AT THE CHECK POINT. THE GRENADE FAILED TO EXPLODE. HOWEVER, SOME DAMAGE WAS DONE TO THE TRUCK BY THE SOLDIERS.

(E) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT THE RPA WAS OBSERVED ESCORTING A BURUNDI DELEGATION RETURNING HOME AFTER ATTENDING RPF LIBERATION DAY ON 04 JULY 95. HEAVY RPA PRESENCE WAS REPORTED IN BUTARE.

(F) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA EXCHANGED FIRE WITH INTERHAMWE ELEMENTS ON 08 JUL 95 AT ABOUT 1000 HRS AROUND CHITE GR 7168.

(2) FRGF/MILITIA

(A) ON 04 JUL 95, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT SOLDIERS FROM ZAIRE CROSSED INTO RWANDA AND KILLED ONE CIVILIAN AND WOUNDED ANOTHER AT MBILIZI. THE SOLDIERS ALSO STOLE CATTLE. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(B) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA EXCHANGED FIRE WITH SIX INTERHAMWE MEMBERS ON 04

JUL 95 WHO TRIED TO INFILTRATE INTO RWANDA USING TWO BOATS. THE INTERHAMWE MEMBERS ESCAPED BUT THE RPA CAPTURED THE TWO BOATS.

(C) ON 04 JUL 95, BANDITS ALLEGED TO BE FROM BURUNDI, KILLED A WOMAN AND HER CHILD AND WOUNDED ANOTHER LOCAL IN GIKUNDAMVIRA GR 9209 IN BUGARAMA COMMUNE.

(D) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 06 AND 07 JUL 95, INTERHAMWE KILLED TWO LOCALS AND STOLE CASH, HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND CATTLE AT GISAKARA.

(E) ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ARMED MEN COMING FROM ZAIRE KILLED THE ADMINISTRATOR OF MUHEWYE COMMUNE ON 07 JULY 95 AT ABOUT 1900 HRS.

(F) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 08 JUL 95, FRGF SOLDIERS SHOT AND WOUNDED A LOCAL AROUND MURURU GR 7521 AND STOLE CASH AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS FROM ANOTHER LOCAL AT SHARA GR 9111.

(G) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT TUTSI GANGS WERE ACCUSED BY LOCALS OF HAVING SUMMARILY ARRESTED PEOPLE AND DISPOSSESSED THEM OF PROPERTIES. ANYONE WHO COMPLAINED WAS IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED, TURNED OVER TO RPA AND ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE. RELEVANT AGENCIES INFORMED.

WITH THE DEPARTURE OF THE LAST BATCH OF TUNBATT FROM THE MISSION AREA, THE SCALING DOWN OF FORMED TROOPS AS PER THE NEW MANDATE AND REALLOTMENT OF SECTORS HAS COMMENCED.

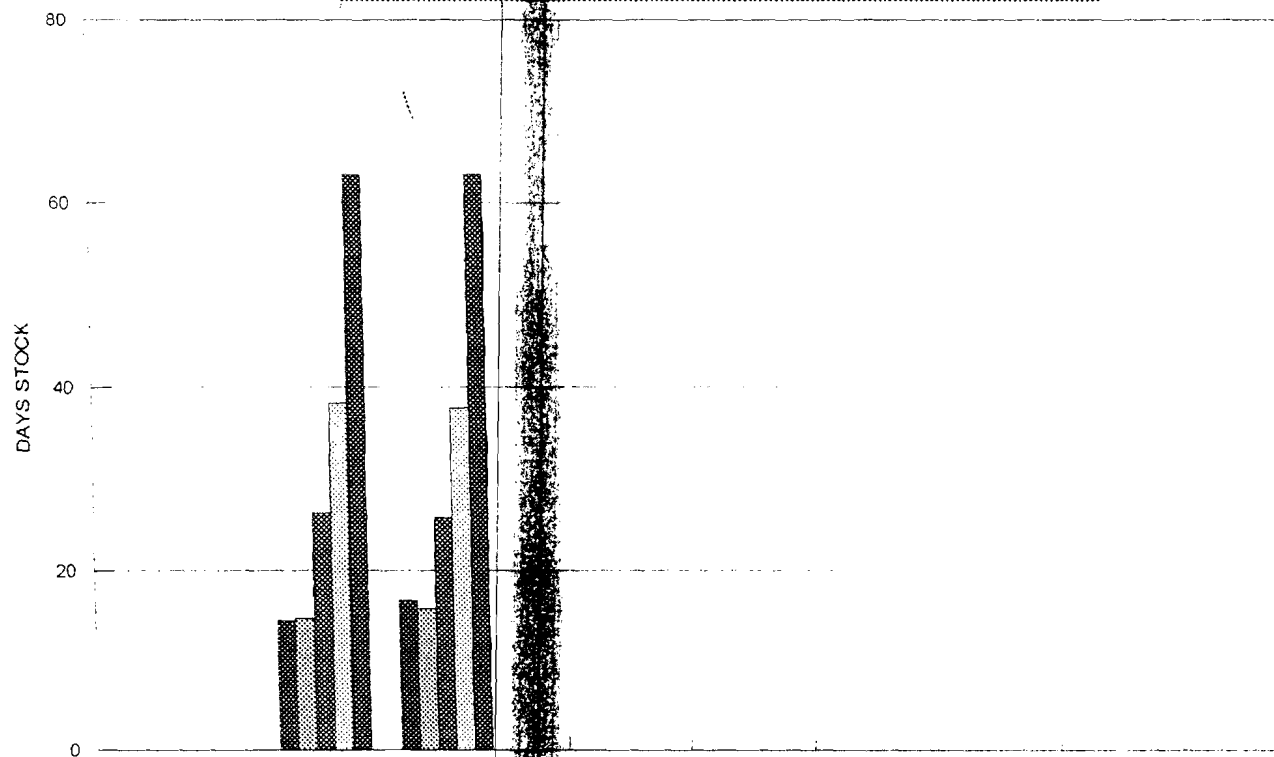
