1. GENERAL SIT. CALM BUT REMAINS UNSTABLE. ACTS OF BANDITRY CONTINUE. IN NYAMASHEKE ON THE 28 FEB 95 AT 01:20 HRS SOME DRUNKEN RPA SOLDIERS FIRED THEIR WPNS IN THE AIR. NO ONE WAS INJURED/SHOT DURING THE FIRING.

DURING THE SAME NIGHT ALSO IN NYAMASHEKE, A GROUP OF BANDITS LOOTED A HOMESTEAD OF A MRS MUKABA HARARA ALTWENATE OF A SINGER SEWING MACHINE, COOKING UTENSILS, MATTRESSES, BEAN AND COTTON. NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE ROBBERY.

IN ISHARA GR 0245 ON THE 28 FEB AT ABOUT 02:00 HRS, A GROUP OF BANDITS LOOTED BEANS, 40,000 RF, TWO SHEEPS. NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE LOOTING.

ALSO IN ISHARA ON THE 27 AT 18:00 HRS A MAN BY THE NAME OF MUNSYASHEMA FEUSTUS WAS KILLED BY RPA. THEY CLAIM THAT THE DECEASED TRIED TO ESCAPE WHILST ENROUTE TO THE COMMUNE HQ. DECEASED HAS SINCE BURIED RELATIVE 28 FEB 95. ALSO AT KIRAMBO, AT 1000 HRS ON 28 FEB 95, RPA ACCIDENTALLY SHOT AND KILLED A LOCAL ADULT FEMALE NAMED JOSEPHINE NYIRASHUTI. THE DECEASED WAS IN CUSTODY WHEN THE ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGED OCCURRED.

INTELLIGENCE: A TEAM PATROLLED TO KIBEHO AND NDAGO DP_s CAMPS AND REPORTED THAT ALL IS CALM. THE TEAM ALSO OBSERVED THE LACK OF PRESENCE OF RPA SOLDIERS IN THE CAMP BUT WAS RELIABLY INFORMED THAT THE RPA HAVE NOW CONCENTRATED MORE ON NIGHT PATROLS. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 27 FEB 95, AT 0400HRS A SOUND OF GRENADE EXPLOSION WAS HEARD BY THE LOCALS. THE ZAMBATT HAVE INTENSIFIED THEIR PATROLS DAY AND NIGHT. OP RETOUR IS CURRENTLY GOING ON IN THE CAMP. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT 3 LOCALS WERE SHOT DEAD ON SUNDAY 26 FEB 95 BY THE RPA WHICH HAD GENERATED A LOT OF TENSION. THE TEAM ALSO MONITORED THE MOVEMENT OF DP_s FROM CHEMKA AND RWAMIKO CAMPS TO KIBEHO WHICH RESULTED THE ERECTION OF MORE NEW DP_s TENTS IN KIBEHO.

GENERAL ASSESSMENT: THE AREA IS RELATIVELY CALM.

1. ONE OF THE MOST PRESSING NEEDS FACED BY ALL CONTINGENTS IS THAT OF REPAIR PARTS AND TOOLS.

Operation Retour transported people from Kibeho, Nyamigina and Kanyinya camps. The total figure for today was 218.

This figure continues the pattern of relatively low transport figures seen over the past two weeks. In response, some UNAMIR vehicles have been released for other tasks in order not to tie up resources which for the time being are underused. The IOC is following up individual security incidents and addressing the overall security situation through the Ministry of Defence and the Ministry of Justice.

Periods of low figures were always anticipated. The fact remains that in many camps large numbers of people still indicate their wish to return home - but their doubts about security are holding them back. The key now is to address those concerns in a way that improves security and reduces the obstacles preventing people from going home. The transport schedule will constantly be reassessed and adjusted as the situation demands. Operation Retour stands by its principles of enabling voluntary return, in safety and dignity.

For this reason, all partners, including the government and RPA, have agreed that food distribution will continue in those camps where the ICRC is currently distributing. One of these camps, Rwamiko, has grown to around 22,000 people, in line with the expected redistribution of IDPs as more northern camps empty.

The operation transported people from Kibeho, Nyamigina, Ndago and Kanyinya camps. The total number of people transported was 171. This is low largely because of fears of insecurity, and particularly because of the following reported incident at Kibeho.

It was reported that between 0600 and 0700 on 21 Feb some IDPs left their shelters at Kibeho camp to collect firewood on the edge of the camp. They were reportedly met and beaten by an unknown number of RPA soldiers. Four people (2 men, one woman and one child) were admitted to Kibeho hospital as a result. Injuries sustained were mostly bruises except the woman who was stabbed on the face and feet.

Another report from the same camp claimed that in the evening of 21 Feb RPA soldiers entered the house of a local business man and beat his wife who was also hospitalised.

Attitudes of IDPs in Rwamiko camp (approx 15 km south of Gikongoro) are apparently very militant. The Bourgmestre of Muraba commune (Butare prefecture) is due to visit Rwamiko tomorrow.

Nyarusizu camp (7 km south-east of Gikongoro) is now empty, as is Mbuga camp (10 km west). Large proportions of the populations of these camps are thought to have walked to Kibeho or other southern camps. Kizi camp (4 km south-east of Gikongoro) has only 30 shelters remaining.

OPERATION RETOUR - DAILY SUMMARY 20.2.95

Numbers were slightly higher than Friday's low figure. This matches the pattern for high figures seen on previous Mondays, so does not in itself signify an overall improvement in willingness of IDPs to return home. The figure of 494 who left Kibeho camp by vehicle is nevertheless higher than for any day last week. Karambi and Mugano camps were not programmed for transport today, but 39 people were loaded into vehicles when they were found willing to leave.

Further resources - particularly personnel, but also vehicles - are urgently needed for the information campaign. IOM confirmed this morning that 5 of its local employees are available for the information campaign. NGOs and other organisations are requested to reconsider whether they could help. All interested parties should contact UNHCR or UNREO in Butare or Gikongoro, or the IOC coordinator in Kigali.

OPERATION RETOUR - WEEKLY REPORT
PERIOD 13 TO 19 FEBRUARY 1995

SUMMARY

Now in its eighth week, Operation Retour saw a drop in the numbers of internally displaced people (IDPs) boarding vehicles to go home. Reasons are complex, but include fears over security both in camps and in home communes. A number of security incidents were reported, including one that nearly emptied Mbuga camp. Two other camps emptied, their populations moving part to home communes, part to southern camps. A number of IDPs, however, continued to walk home.

As expected, the southern camps, particularly Kibeho, are growing as people move south from other camps. Some of those moving have no intention of returning home. Others have clearly expressed their wish to return but, still feeling insecure, are moving south for the time being with their commune groups.

The major priority now for Operation Retour is to increase its systematic knowledge of home communes in order to enable well-coordinated rehabilitation, good security monitoring. It will also enable accurate and timely information to be spread in the camps.

The Integrated Task Force, led by the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Reintegration, met for the second time to provide policy advice and guidance for Operation Retour.

NUMBERS

Numbers were down, with 1,950 IDPs being transported to their home communes against 4,262 for the previous week. As in previous weeks, many IDPs walked home without using the transport. Numbers are hard to quantify since most of these choose not to register with their communes on arrival.

Bad weather was one reason for lower figures: more important were worries about security at home and in the camps. As more IDPs return home, the proportions of hard-liners in the camps has increased. As camp populations move, so the hard core of one camp brings its influence to bear on another. The incident at Mbuga camp (see "Security" below) reduced figures further. Figures were as follows:

No transport was provided from camps on Saturday 18 February, because of consistently low figures on previous Saturdays. The

because of consistently low figures on previous Saturdays. The number of IDPs transported by vehicle from camps since Operation Retour began on 29 December now stands at 37,111.

TRANSPORT

Sufficient transport was available to move the IDPs who volunteered to do so. Problems with transport availability may arise if refugees from Goma cross the border en masse, drawing some transport assets away from the IDP movement operation.

CROSS-BORDER MOVEMENTS

Many people have crossed from Burundi to Rwanda - see under "Communes" below. There appears to be some movement still from Rwanda (area of the Gikongoro camps) to Burundi.

SECURITY

In the night of 14/15 February, RPA soldiers entered Mbuga camp (approx 10 km west of Gikongoro, population then about 2,500) and threw two smoke or tear gas grenades. Some chaos ensued, as a result of which a large number of people left the camp immediately. Most of them are likely to have walked to Kibeho or other southern camps. About 500 remained in Mbuga camp on 17 February. A man was robbed and abducted from his house, apparently by the same RPA soldiers, soon after the incident. The RPA and Milots are investigating.

A number of reports were received of other security incidents in the reporting period. Investigations are ongoing.

CAMPS

Murambi camp (approx 1.5 km north of Gikongoro) and Karambi camp (6 km south-west of Gikongoro) emptied during the reporting period. Some of their population walked home; others took advantage of vehicles supplied by Operation Retour. The remainder walked to other camps, particularly southern camps. A common practice is for entire commune groups to stay together as they move from one camp to another.

Rwamiko camp (15 km south of Gikongoro) has grown considerably from its reported size of 16,000 a week ago. Kibeho camp continued to grow as people arrived from camps further north. Ndago, Munini and Kamana camps also appeared to increase.

The attitude of IDPs in some camps appeared to harden. Intimidation is rife. This is particularly noticeable in Nyamigina, Rwamiko and Kibeho. A powerful anti-return and misinformation campaign has been ongoing in most of the camps for some time and has shown no sign of weakening. False rumours combine potently with some true reports of security incidents to reduce confidence and increase fear. The information campaign urgently needs strengthening for this reason.

COMMUNES

All border communes in Butare prefecture have reported substantial increases in population. Since September 1994 the populations of Kibayi, Muyira and Nyakizu have apparently more than doubled. Nyakizu, for example, has grown from over 8,000 in September 1994 to over 21,000 in February 1995. Those of Kigembe and Muyaga have nearly doubled, while Muganza and Ntyazo have increased by around 50 per cent. Those transported by vehicle to these communes under Operation Retour are only a fraction of the population. The population of the communes of Goma and Kibeho is also increasing. The remainder have walked, some from the camps in the Gikongoro area, with probably a larger number coming from Burundi.

A group of 350 refugees entered Rwanda from Burundi on 16 February, under UNHCR auspices. They moved to their home areas of Sake and Birenga, which are both home to a number of IDPs. The problem of shelter, and land and property tenure is becoming more pressing as IDPs and old and new caseload refugees return to the same areas. The Shelter Cell of the IOC is addressing the issues of new construction and the repair of damaged housing.

FOOD

The major source of food in camps is ICRC, who distribute to 8 southern camps. The Integrated Task Force, chaired by the government, has endorsed the continuation of this distribution. Most other camps receive no food. Food distribution in local communes, however, is taken advantage of by some IDPs, particularly those originating from those communes.

INFORMATION CAMPAIGN

A major priority of the IOC is accurate and timely information from the home communes of IDPs. This information is used by the Commune Rehabilitation Committee to prioritise rehabilitation needs in order to alert agencies and NGOs. It is also used in the information campaign, whose aim is to provide true, factual information on home communes to people still in the camps. Resources are very limited, with only 11 people (8 UNAMIR troops and 3 UNREO field officers) active in the campaign in the camps. More resources, particularly personnel and vehicles, are urgently needed. All interested NGOs or other organisations should contact the IOC coordinator.

COORDINATION

The Integrated Task Force, comprising four Ministries, a number of UN agencies and UNAMIR, met for the second time. Chaired by the Director-General of the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Reintegration, it focused on the clear communication of arrest policy as a priority need. The Task Force meets at 1600 hours every Monday.

Members of the National Assembly visited camps and prisons during the reporting period.

In the evening of 15 Feb, 350 refugees arrived from Burundi at the Bake (Open Relief Centre (ORC)). UNHCR were coordinating. About 150 of them were due to travel home to Birenga today, with the remainder staying in Bake, their home commune.

It is reported that between 1 and 7 Feb, 471 people crossed from Rwanda into Burundi. It is thought that the majority of these were coming from camps in the Gikongoro prefecture.

OVERVIEW Figures transported are still low, probably because of low numbers willing to move from Kibeho, the largest southern camp. Contributing factors include the fact that both the information campaign and the main transport effort are currently concentrated in the more northern camps, most of which no longer have food supplied. In addition, more "hard core" elements are filtering into Kibeho, having walked from the north. Today also saw very heavy rain a further discouragement to move.

TRANSPORT Kanyinya and Mugano camps were provided with transport for the first time today, but heavy rain prevented trucks from reaching the camps themselves. Soldiers walked to invite people to walk to the trucks, but no IDPs were willing to walk, in heavy rain, from the camps to the trucks waiting some distance away. Transport was provided from Musebeya camp for the first time, and met with a good response.

CAMPS Several camps are reducing in size, including Nyamigina, Cisunzu, Mbuga, Kanyinya and Mugano. Many people are believed to have walked from these to the southern camps.

MEDICAL SCREENING The Australian Medical Battalion will no longer be doing medical screening in the camps. We now need more NOCs to come forward to take on this important task. All interested NOCs should contact UNHCR or the UNREO field officer at Butare or Gikongoro, or the IOC coordinator in Kigali.

OPEN RELIEF CENTRES (ORCs) In general these are working well as light structures which assist bourgmestres and can reassure returning IDPs, providing shelter if necessary. The ORCs in Ntyazo and Nyakizu (Butare prefecture) have yet to be used, but remain as a safety net for the time being.

Looting of World Food Program Vehicles

KIGALI, RWANDA -- At approximately 2 p.m., February 18, a convoy of World Food Program (WFP) trucks carrying humanitarian supplies to refugee camps in Goma, Zaire, were stopped near the border at Gisenyi for inspection by border officials. When stopped, a crowd of about 50 people from the Gisenyi area transit camp surrounded the trucks and began looting them. Government troops on the scene in an attempt to control the situation, opened fire on the crowd, killing two people. At this point, the crowd grew to 400-500 people. Three WFP trucks were looted during this incident.

UNAMIR troops were called to assist and three Armoured Personnel Carriers from the Tunisian Battalion in Mutura were dispatched.

The trucks were stopped at the site until the evening, at which point they were allowed to turn back from the border to drive to the security of the Tunisian Battalion compound at Mutura.

On the way to the compound, seven of the trucks were detained until the morning of February 19. The trucks were then released, but on the way to Mutura, were stopped at the Gisenyi area transit camp where looting of these remaining vehicles took place.

"The looting of humanitarian relief supplies is unacceptable," stated Maj.-Gen. Guy Tousignant, UNAMIR Force Commander. "Steps are being taken to determine who hindered the situation by preventing the WFP from withdrawing to a safe location and by delaying the arrival of UN troops on the scene."

INVESTIGATION :

2. STATEMENTS FROM INJURED PERS INDICATES THAT THERE WERE SEVERAL BANDITS ARMED WITH RIFLES AND SOME OF THEM DRESSED IN UNIFORMS. AT ABOUT 23:00 HRS ON 18 FEB 95 THE BANDITS ATTACKED MAKUNZA IN HIS HOUSE AND WHEN HE SHOUTED FOR HELP, THE BANDITS GOT AFRAID AND SHOT HIM DEAD. MAKUNZA DIED ON THAT SPOT. THE BANDITS THEN MACHETTED THE OTHER TWO PERS THAT WERE WITH MKUNZA IN THE HOUSE. WHILE FLEEING., THE BANDITS TOOK WITH THEM 8,000 FRANCS, A MATRESS AND FEW CLOTHES. THE INJURED PERS WERE TREATED AT KIRAMBO HOSPITAL AND LATER DISCHARGED SINCE THEY HAD BOTH ONLY MINOR HEAD INJURIES. THE DECEASED WAS BURIED BY HIS RELATIVES.

THE WAS FURTHER LEARNT FROM THE LOCALS THAT THE BANDITS WERE ACTUALL AFTER AN OTHER PERS BY THE NAME OF MR. RUSANGE PATROL WHO IS SUPPOSED TO BE RICH AND ANY THEY WOULD HAVE LIKED MAKUNZA BY MISTAKE.

1. GENERAL SITUATION: CALM. THE CONFLICT IS STILL IN EFFECT AND NORMAL DAYTIME ACTIVITIES CONTINUE. FROM APPROX 2200 TO 0100 HRS A UNAMIN VET BELONGING TO HUMAN RIGHTS FID TM WAS KILLED AT A POINT NEAR THE RAMEMBE AIRPORT WHILE THEY WERE TAKING A RWANDAN STAFF MEMBER HOME FROM HIS DUTIES. AFTER SEVERAL HOURS OF ON SITE NEGOTIATION, NPA INSISTED THAT THE LOCAL REMAIN WITH THEM AND THE VET AND UNAMIN TM MEMBER MUST GO BACK TO TM LOC. EVENTUALLY, WITH UNAMIN/MILOB ASSISTANCE, BOTH THE LMI TOTE AND THE TM MEMBER WERE ALLOWED TO DEPART BUT HAD TO RETURN TO TM LOC.

OPERATION RETOUR - DAILY SUMMARY 17.2.95

OVERVIEW - Figures transported are still low, probably because of low numbers willing to move from Kibeho, the largest southern camp. Contributing factors include the fact that both the information campaign and the main transport effort are currently concentrated in the more northern camps, most of which no longer have food supplied. In addition, more "hard core" elements are filtering into Kibeho, having walked from the north. Today also saw very heavy rain - a further discouragement to move.

TRANSPORT - Kanyinya and Mugano camps were provided with transport for the first time today, but heavy rain prevented trucks from reaching the camps themselves. Soldiers walked to invite people to walk to the trucks, but no IDPs were willing to walk, in heavy rain, from the camps to the trucks waiting some distance away. Transport was provided from Musebeya camp for the first time, and met with a good response.

CAMPS - Several camps are reducing in size, including Nyamigina, Gisunzu, Mbuga, Kanyinya and Mugano. Many people are believed to have walked from these to the southern camps.

MEDICAL SCREENING - The Australian Medical Battalion will no longer be doing medical screening in the camps. We now need more NGOs to come forward to take on this important task. All interested NGOs should contact UNHCR or the UNREO field officer at Butare or Gikongoro, or the IOC coordinator in Kigali.

OPEN RELIEF CENTRES (ORCs) - In general these are working well as light structures which assist bourgmestres and can reassure returning IDPs, providing shelter if necessary. The ORCs in Ntyazo and Nyakizu (Butare prefecture) have yet to be used, but remain as a safety net for the time being.
