My dear Mr. Secretary General:


In regard to the matter of Full Powers, I have the honor to inform you that the Chinese Delegation has received a telegram from the National Government under date of May 24, 1945, which reads as follows:

"Dr. TV Soong Dr. Wellington Koo Dr. Chwang Dr. Wei Tao-ming Dr. Hu Shih Miss Wu Yi-fang Mr. Li Hwang Mr. Carson Chang Mr. Tung Pi-wu Mr. Hu Lin as Delegates Plenipotentiary to the United Nations Conference comma you are hereby given full power to conclude and sign the Charter of the General International Organization stop Signed Chiang Kai-shek President of the National Government of the Republic of China Countersigned KC Wu Political Viceminister of Foreign Affairs in Charge of Ministerial Affairs"

Formal Full Powers will be transmitted when they are received by mail from Chungking for deposit in the archives of the United Nations Conference on International Organization.


MEMORANDUM

TO: Dr. Warren Kelchner
FROM: Philip D. Sprouse
SUBJECT: Members of Chinese Delegation Authorized to Sign Final Documents Approved by the Conference

Mr. T. L. Tsui, Executive Secretary of the Chinese Delegation, informed me on May 28 that telegraphic authorization had been received by the Chinese Embassy in Washington for the ten Chinese Delegates to sign the final documents approved by the Conference. He explained that this information was being communicated by the Chinese Embassy to the Department and that Dr. Soong would address a formal note to the Secretary General confirming this authorization. According to Mr. Tsui, Dr. Hu Shih, one of the Chinese Delegates, may not return to San Francisco from Cambridge for the signing of the documents.

During the past two weeks I have approached Mr. Tsui on several occasions regarding the question of Full Powers for the Chinese Delegates to sign the documents, and have pointed out the desire of the International Secretariat to receive the necessary credentials as soon as possible.

In reply to my inquiry regarding the question of whether the Chinese Delegates would sign the documents on behalf of the Chinese Government or on behalf of the Chief of State, Mr. Tsui stated that the Delegates would sign on behalf of the Government, a practice customarily followed by Chinese representatives to international conferences.

Credentials

May 1, 1945

My dear Mr. Chairman:

I refer to the action of the Conference at the Sixth Plenary Session today in approving the Report of the Credentials Committee. It will be recalled that the Credentials Committee directed the attention of those governments which had not yet deposited their Full Powers for the signature of the final documents of the Conference to the necessity of submitting these Powers to the Secretary General as soon as possible.

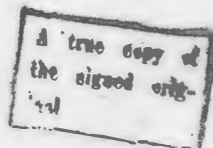
Since the records of the Conference do not at present indicate that Full Powers have been received from your Government, I am taking the liberty of bringing the matter to your attention with the thought that you may wish to take the necessary steps to expedite the delivery of these Powers to the Secretariat. As you of course know, Full Powers customarily are in the form of a document issued by the Chief of State authorizing the plenipotentiary or plenipotentiaries to conclude and sign agreements or other international instruments on behalf of the State concerned.

Should the exercise of Full Powers to sign international instruments be inherent in the office of a Chairman of Delegation or of other members of a delegation, I believe it would be desirable for the Chief of the Diplomatic Mission at Washington or the Chairman of the Delegation, if he is so empowered, to submit, in lieu of Full Powers, a statement to this effect for the consideration of the Credentials Committee.

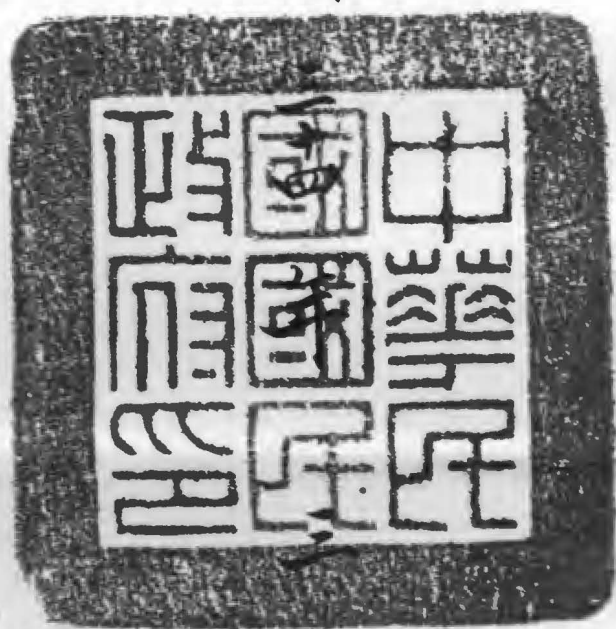
