DAILY SITREP FOR 05 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 212. 207 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 05 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 6154 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT FORMER TANZANIAN PRESIDENT JULIUS NYERERE ARRIVED IN KIGALI IN THE EVENING OF 05 FEB 96 FOR A TWO DAY VISIT AND MET WITH THE VICE-PRESIDENT MAJOR GEN PAUL KAGAME. MWALIMU NYERERE IS ONE OF THE FACILITATORS WHO ARE TO OVER SEE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF CAIRO SUMMIT RESOLUTIONS ON RWANDA AND BURUNDI REFUGEES REPATRIATION. THE RADIO FURTHER REPORTED THAT WITH THE CLOSURE OF BYUMBA PRISON, THE PROCESS OF JUSTICE IN THE PREFECTURE FACES MANY DIFFICULTIES. CRIMINAL SUSPECTS ARE DETAINED IN COMMUNAL LOCK-UPS AND POLICE STATIONS WHICH IS AGAINST THE LAW. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA HAD EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND GUARDS FOR THE DETAINEES.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE MILOBS SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA) REPORTED THAT RPA RECOVERED THREE GRENADES FROM A PERSON ARRESTED ON 30 JAN 96 IN MAHEBWE SECTOR (GR 7292). ANOTHER PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA IN NGOMA SECTOR (GR 7448) ON 03 FEB 96 FOR ILLEGAL POSSESSION OF A RIFLE.

B. ERGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) FURTHER TO THE EXPLOSION INCIDENT REPORTED (IN SECTOR 5) IN THE SITREP OF 04 FEB, MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT AS PER RPA THE NO OF PERSONS KILLED DUE TO SPLINTER/BULLET WOUNDS IS 10 AND NOT 13 AS REPORTED EARLIER AND EXPLOSIVE USED WAS TNT. ALSO REPORTEDLY RPA HAS ARRESTED SEVEN PERSONS FOR INVESTIGATIONS.

JAN 96 SOME INFILTRATORS ATTACKED A CIVILIAN IN GAKURABWENGE SECTOR (GR 2625) AND STOLE CATTLE AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS. THREE PERSONS WERE APPREHENDED BY LOCALS AND HANDED OVER TO RPA. SAME DAY ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED IN GABIRO SECTOR (GR 2423) WHILE TRYING TO CROSS OVER TO ZAIRE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. INDBATT CONTINUES TO PROVIDE SECURITY TO AMMUNITION AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS OF 95 CMSG LEFT AT AIRPORT WAREHOUSE, AS ALSO TO GENERATOR AND VEHICLE AT GITARAMA, IMPOUNDED BY THE DIOCESE.

B. GHANCOY (ITR) CONTINUES TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR ITR TEAM IN KIBUYE.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 376 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM NKAMIRA TODAY. 413 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO BUTARE, KIGALI TOWN, KIBUNGO, NYAGATARE, GITARAMA AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 308 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. NICOY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO NGO "FOOD FOR HUNGRY" TO TRANSPORT CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL FROM GISENYI TO MUTURA COMMUNE.

C. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER EACH IN TRANSIT CAMP CYANGUGU AND A CHURCH IN KIGALI. CHURCH WORK COMPLETED. DEPLOYED A TEAM FOR ELECTRIFICATION OF KABUGA DETENTION CENTRE AND A EOD TEAM IN KIGALI. IT ALSO HELD A MINE AWARENESS LECTURE FOR "OXFAM" AND PROVIDED A VEHICLE TO ARDEC.

D. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FUEL WOOD.

E. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 97 MEDICAL AND 22 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 0800 TODAY A CIVILIAN VISITING KINHIRA RESETTLEMENT CAMP (GR 2896) LOST HIS LEG WHEN HE STEPPED ON A ANTI PERSONAL MINE.

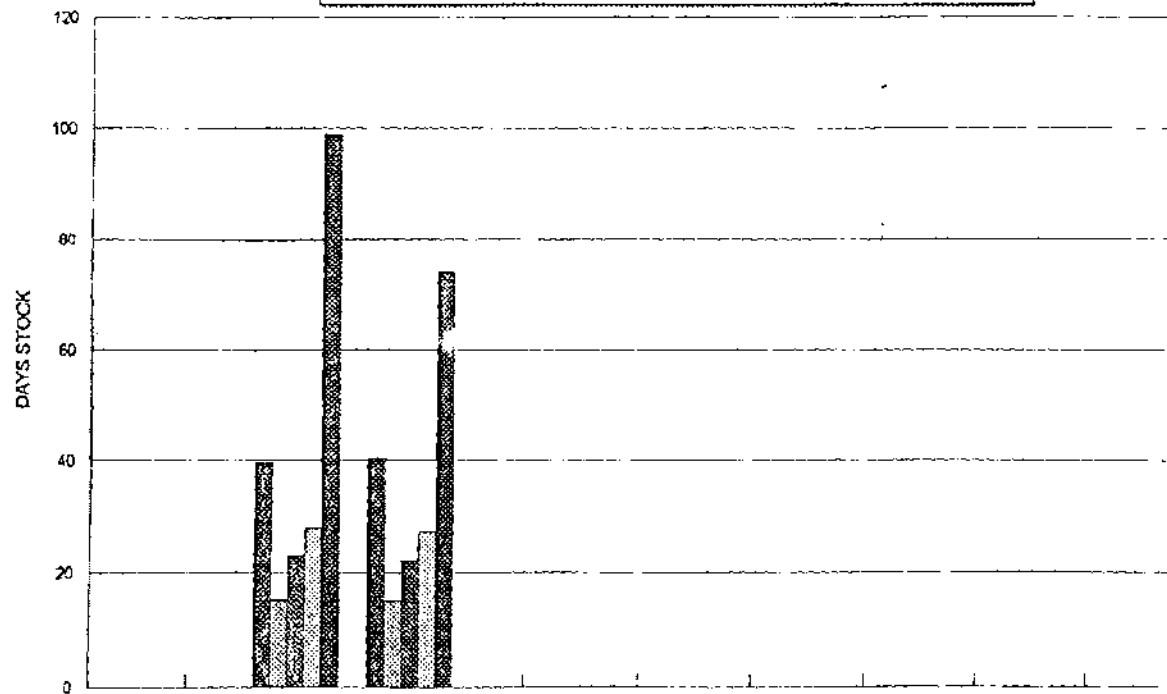

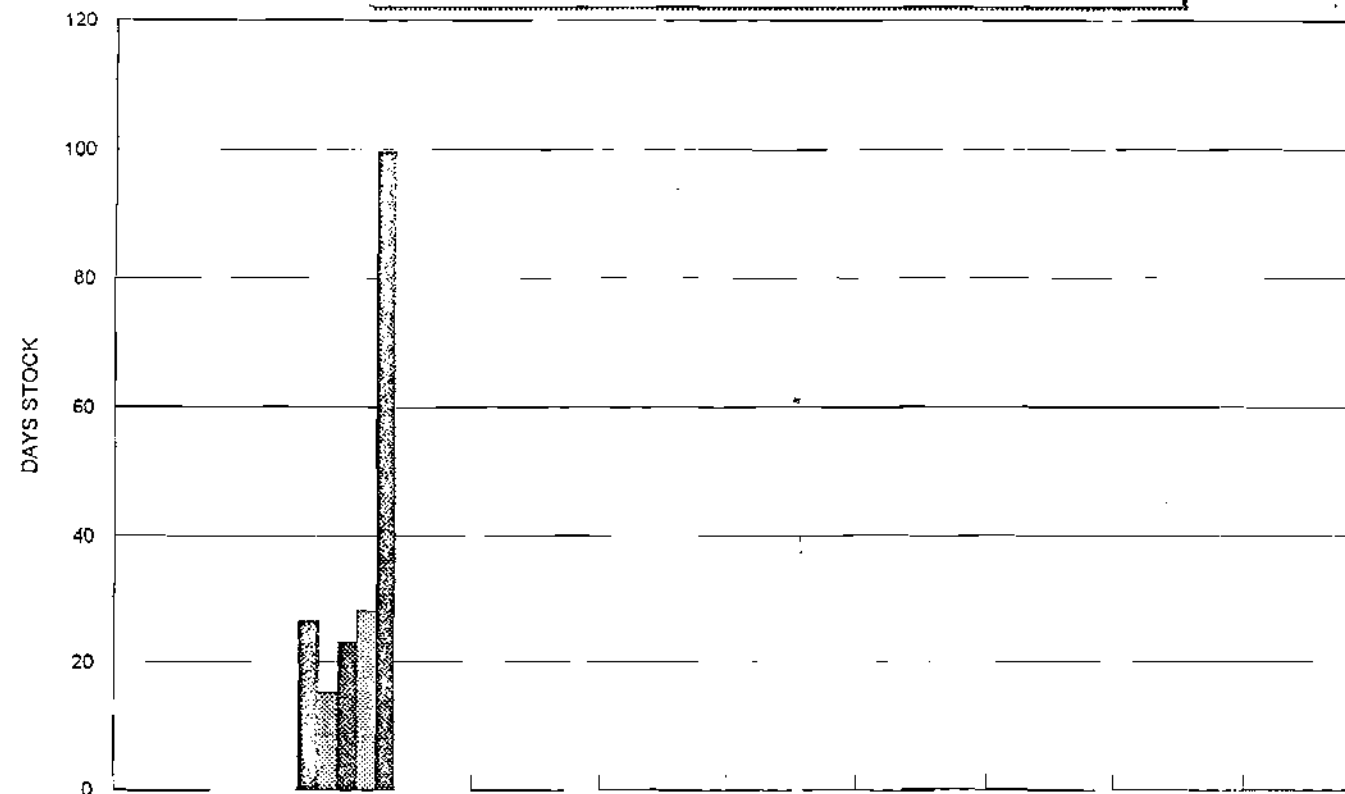



1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 1578. 233 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 1243 FROM BURUNDI AND 102 FROM TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 5738 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA THAT MR CLAUDE DUSAIDI, THE VICE-PRESIDENT'S ADVISOR, EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE ALLEGED DISBANDING OF THE COMMISSION OF INQUIRY, INVESTIGATING THE ILLEGAL ARMS TRAFFIC IN GREAT LAKES REGION. HE SAID THAT MILITIAS FROM BURUNDI AND RWANDA ARE IN ZAIRE GETTING READY TO ATTACK RWANDA. IF THE COMMISSION IS DISBANDED THEN THERE WILL BE NO ONE TO CHECK THE ARMS SUPPLY TO MILITIA AND EX-FAR.

C. HE FURTHER ADDED THAT HE FINDS IT WISE TO ENFORCE AND EQUIP THE COMMISSION SO THAT IT CAN ACHIEVE ITS GOALS RATHER THAN DISBAND IT. HE CONCLUDED THAT, IF NECESSARY, THE UN WOULD HAVE TO TAKE SOME FORMAL SANCTIONS OR FORCEFUL MEASURES TO FORCE ZAIRE TO COMPLY WITH ITS RESOLUTIONS, SINCE THE REPORT SHOWS THAT THE TRAINING OF FORMER FAR IS STILL GOING ON.

A COMBINED MILOB AND HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM VISITED THE INCIDENT SITE AND REPORTED THAT THE PYLON LOCATED IN [GR 1908] ON THE ROAD TO THE BREWERY FROM GISENYI TOWN WAS BLOWN AND IT APPEARS PLASTIC EXPLOSIVE HAD BEEN USED. SEVEN BODIES WERE FOUND CLOSE TO THE PYLONS SOME OF THEM WERE WITH SPLINTER WOUNDS. SIX OTHER BODIES WERE ALSO FOUND A SHORT DISTANCE AWAY IN THE BUSH WITH BULLET WOUNDS. 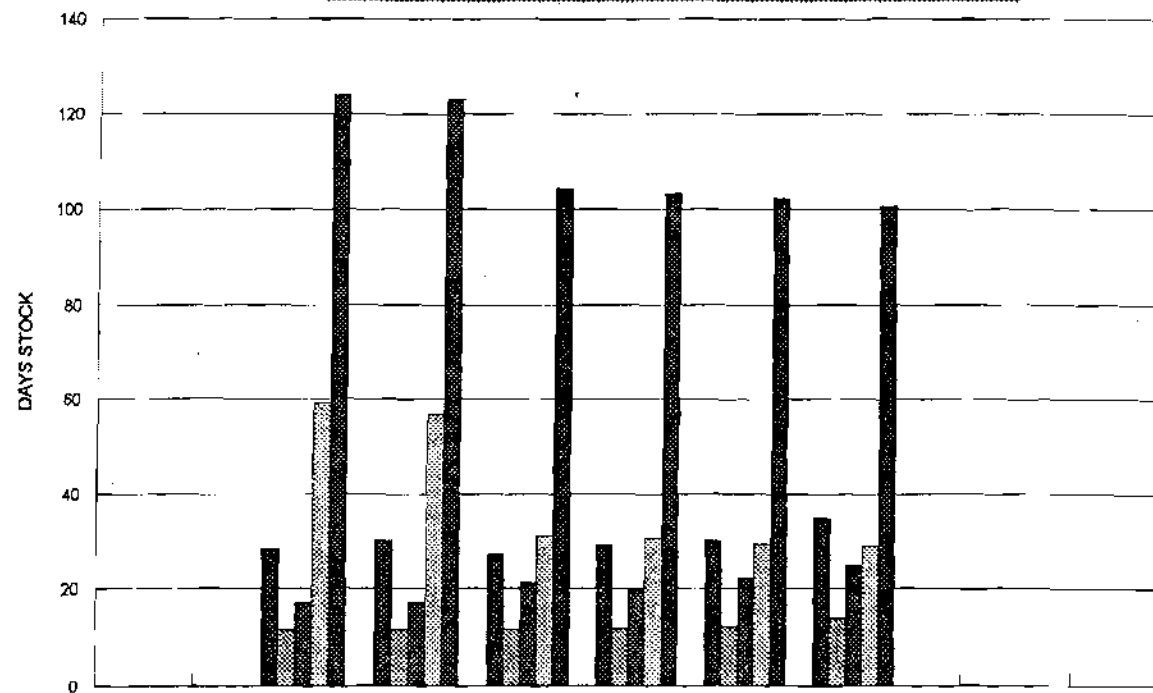



1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 2673. 157 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 2386 FROM BURUNDI AND 130 FROM TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 4160 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE NTAMBA REFUGEE CAMP IN BURUNDI MIGHT BE CLOSED WITHIN TWO DAYS. OUT OF 8000 REFUGEES, IN THE CAMP, ONLY 2000 WERE TRANSPORTED BY UNHCR TRUCKS TO BUTARE, GIKONGORO, KIBUNGO AND KIGALI RURAL.

B. IT FURTHER REPORTED THAT THE TRIPARTITE COMMISSION RECOMMENDED THE SEPARATION OF INTIMIDATORS FROM GENUINE REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS AND BE TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER LOCATION IN BURUNDI, WHICH WOULD BE COMMUNICATED TO UNHCR BY BURUNDIAN AUTHORITIES.

MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE ON THE NIGHT OF 01/02 FEB 96, AN RPA UNIT ENCOUNTERED A GROUP OF MEN AT RUGERERO (GR 2113) IN WHICH ONE OF THE INFILTRATORS WAS KILLED AND ANOTHER INJURED. THE INTERROGATION REVEALED THAT THE INJURED PERSON WAS REPORTEDLY A "ZAIREAN SOLDIER" AND THEY WERE GIVEN REFUGE BY A LOCAL WOMAN. THE WOMAN WAS ARRESTED AND ON SEARCHING THE PREMISES, NINE RIFLES AND A GRENADE WERE RECOVERED. FURTHER DETAILS BEING INVESTIGATED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY THE BRIDGE WHICH WAS BLOWN AT PFUNDA (GR 2211) HAS BEEN REPAIRED BY LOCALS. MEANWHILE, THE RPA HAS INTENSIFIED PATROLS IN THE AREA.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER BADE FAREWELL TO ALL MEMBERS OF 95 CMSG AND THE CANADIAN MILOBS, WHO DEPARTED FOR CANADA ON COMPLETION OF THEIR TOUR OF DUTY ON 02 FEB 96.

B. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED THE SIGNALS DETACHMENT AT MT KARONGI AND INSPECTED THE REPEATER STATION THERE.

C. GHANCOY REPATRIATING TROOPS STILL CONCENTRATED IN KIGALI AWAITING AIRCRAFT FOR THEIR MOVE TO GHANA.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 241 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM BUTARE AND NKAMIRA. 182 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL NO OF 326 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO PRISON PROJECT FOR TRANSPORTATION OF PLYWOOD AND OTHER MATERIALS, TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN INTERNATIONAL" FOR TRANSPORTATION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFFS FROM BUTARE TO COMMUNES WITHIN BUTARE AND ANOTHER SEVEN TRUCKS WERE PROVIDED TO UNHCR/IOM TO TRANSPORT REFUGEES FROM DIHIRO TRANSIT CENTRE TO KIBUNGO.

C. NICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO NGO "FOOD FOR HUNGRY" AND TRANSPORTED BURNT BRICKS FROM NYUNDO TO MUTURA COMMUNE.

D. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER EACH AT ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMP BUTARE AND TRANSIT CAMP CYANGUGU. IT ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK EACH TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD/BRICKS AND KIGALI PRISON FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ACTIVATION OF RWANDATEL LOCAL LINES. IT ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK EACH TO ARDEC AND THE PRISON PROJECT FOR TRANSPORTATION OF SAND FROM RUNDA TO BISENYI AND FOR TRANSPORTATION OF PLYWOOD RESPECTIVELY.

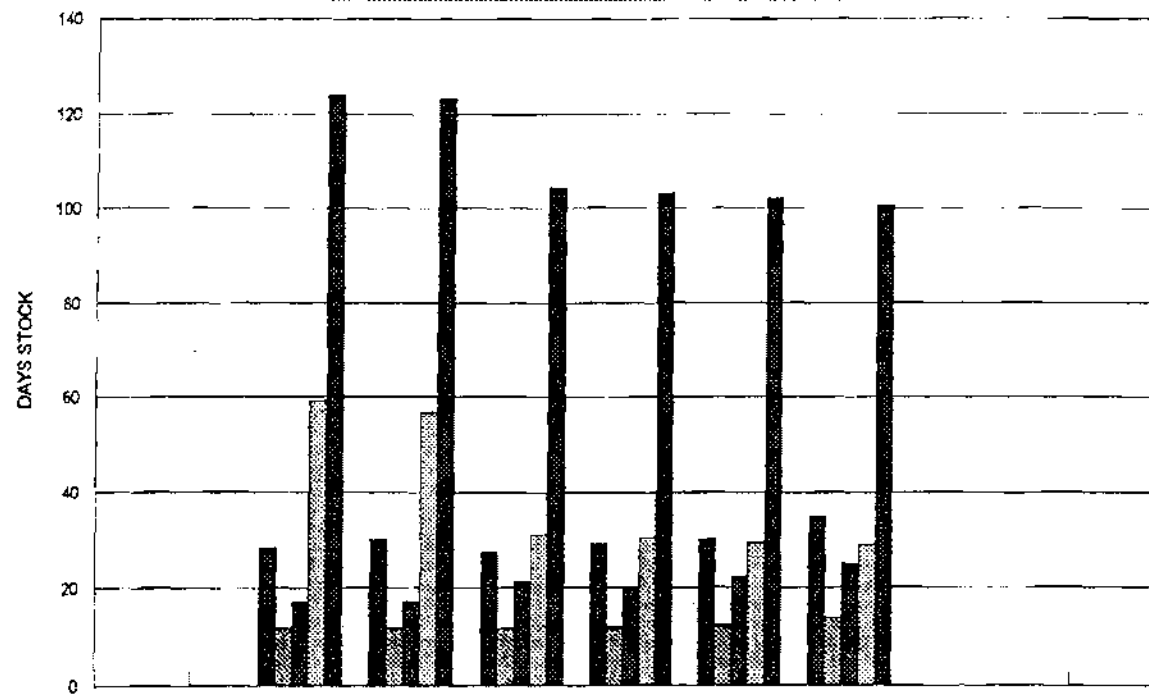

DAILY SITREP FOR 02 FEB 961. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 2673. 157 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 2386 FROM BURUNDI AND 130 FROM TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 4160 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE NTAMBA REFUGEE CAMP IN BURUNDI MIGHT BE CLOSED WITHIN TWO DAYS. OUT OF 8000 REFUGEES, IN THE CAMP, ONLY 2000 WERE TRANSPORTED BY UNHCR TRUCKS TO BUTARE, GIKONGORO, KIBUNGO AND KIGALI RURAL.

B. IT FURTHER REPORTED THAT THE TRIPARTITE COMMISSION RECOMMENDED THE SEPARATION OF INTIMIDATORS FROM GENUINE REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS AND BE TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER LOCATION IN BURUNDI, WHICH WOULD BE COMMUNICATED TO UNHCR BY BURUNDIAN AUTHORITIES.

MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE ON THE NIGHT OF 01/02 FEB 96, AN RPA UNIT ENCOUNTERED A GROUP OF MEN AT RUGERERO (GR 2113) IN WHICH ONE OF THE INFILTRATORS WAS KILLED AND ANOTHER INJURED. THE INTERROGATION REVEALED THAT THE INJURED PERSON WAS REPORTEDLY A "ZAIREAN SOLDIER" AND THEY WERE GIVEN REFUGE BY A LOCAL WOMAN. THE WOMAN WAS ARRESTED AND ON SEARCHING THE PREMISES, NINE RIFLES AND A GRENADE WERE RECOVERED. FURTHER DETAILS BEING INVESTIGATED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY THE BRIDGE WHICH WAS BLOWN AT PFUNDA (GR 2211) HAS BEEN REPAIRED BY LOCALS. MEANWHILE, THE RPA HAS INTENSIFIED PATROLS IN THE AREA.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER BADE FAREWELL TO ALL MEMBERS OF 95 CMSG AND THE CANADIAN MILOBS, WHO DEPARTED FOR CANADA ON COMPLETION OF THEIR TOUR OF DUTY ON 02 FEB 96.

B. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED THE SIGNALS DETACHMENT AT MT KARONGI AND INSPECTED THE REPEATER STATION THERE.

C. GHANCOY REPATRIATING TROOPS STILL CONCENTRATED IN KIGALI AWAITING AIRCRAFT FOR THEIR MOVE TO GHANA.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 241 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM BUTARE AND NKAMIRA. 182 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL NO OF 326 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO PRISON PROJECT FOR TRANSPORTATION OF PLYWOOD AND OTHER MATERIALS, TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN INTERNATIONAL" FOR TRANSPORTATION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFFS FROM BUTARE TO COMMUNES WITHIN BUTARE AND ANOTHER SEVEN TRUCKS WERE PROVIDED TO UNHCR/IOM TO TRANSPORT REFUGEES FROM DIHIRO TRANSIT CENTRE TO KIBUNGO.

C. NICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO NGO "FOOD FOR HUNGRY" AND TRANSPORTED BURNT BRICKS FROM NYUNDO TO MUTURA COMMUNE.

D. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER EACH AT ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMP BUTARE AND TRANSIT CAMP CYANGUGU. IT ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK EACH TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD/BRICKS AND KIGALI PRISON FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ACTIVATION OF RWANDATEL LOCAL LINES. IT ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK EACH TO ARDEC AND THE PRISON PROJECT FOR TRANSPORTATION OF SAND FROM RUNDA TO BISENYI AND FOR TRANSPORTATION OF PLYWOOD RESPECTIVELY.

F. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 157 MEDICAL AND 16 DENTAL PATIENTS.

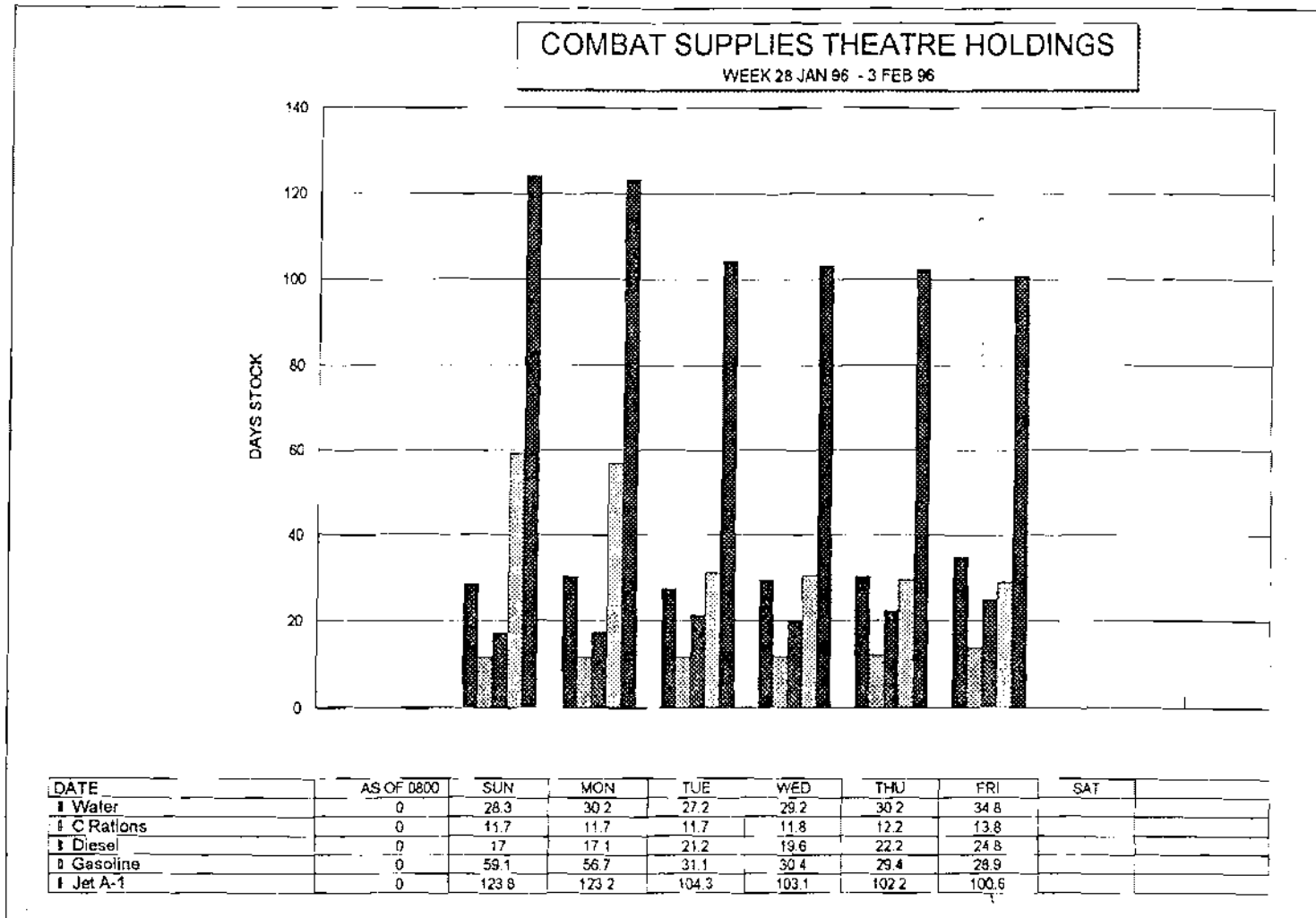

DAILY SITREP FOR 01 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 1487. 413 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 1035 FROM BURUNDI AND 39 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 14867 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, A DELEGATION CONSISTING OF DELEGATES FROM UNHCR, THE GOVERNMENT OF BURUNDI AND THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA VISITED RWANDAN REFUGEES CAMPS IN BURUNDI AND PERSUADED THE REFUGEES TO RETURN TO RWANDA. THEY WERE TOLD THAT THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM IN RWANDA WAS BEING RESTORED AND ONCE A REFUGEE IS REPATRIATED, HE CAN CLAIM HIS PROPERTY BY APPROACHING THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES INSTEAD OF GOING STRAIGHT TO THE ILLEGAL OCCUPANT.

B. RWANDAN RADIO ALSO REPORTED THAT ZAIRE IS ABOUT TO CLOSE KIBUMBA AND GASHYUSHYA REFUGEE CAMPS AND REFUGEES INFLUX WILL COMMENCE FROM TODAY ONWARDS.

MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE NSTR.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT THE CHIEF OF THE CHILDREN DEPT OF THE HEALTH CENTER OF KIVUMU (2303) AND HIS WIFE WERE BEATEN BY ABOUT TEN TO TWELVE UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM ON THE NIGHT OF 30 JAN 96 AT HIS HOUSE AT TARASI CELLULE 2304 AND MADE AWAY WITH THEIR PERSONAL BELONGINGS.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IT WAS REPORTED THAT A WOODEN LOG BRIDGE ACROSS THE PFUND RIVER (2106) WAS DEMOLISHED

ON 31 JAN 96. THE BLAST OF THE EXPLOSION IS BELIEVED TO HAVE AFFECTED DOORS, WINDOWS AND ROOFING OF NEARBY HOUSES. FURTHER INFORMATION BEING FORWARDED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. THE INVESTIGATION OFFICER AND THE SECURITY CO-ORDINATOR FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, MR BORDEWIJK, CALLED ON THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER AND DISCUSSED SECURITY RELATED ISSUES.

B. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH CHIEF OF STAFF RPA, COL SAM KAKA, IN THE RPA HEAD QUARTERS. DURING THE MEETING THE CHIEF OF STAFF REGRETTED THE INCIDENT OF 29 JAN 96 IN WHICH THREE PERSONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL WERE ILL-TREATED BY THE RPA SOLDIERS. HE STRESSED THAT THE DEFAULTERS HAVE SINCE BEEN ARRESTED AND WOULD BE PUNISHED. HE ALSO ASSURED THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER THAT NECESSARY STEPS HAVE BEEN TAKEN TO AVOID FUTURE OCCURRENCES.

C. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH AMBASSADORS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AT THE EU OFFICE KIGALI. HE ALSO MET SPANISH AMBASSADOR TO TANZANIA, MR JOSE MARIA SANZ-PASTOR, DURING THE MEETING, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER BRIEFED THEM ON THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION, THE INCIDENT OF 29 JAN 96 IN WHICH THREE PERSONS FROM THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL WERE MANHANDLED BY RPA AND ISSUES REGARDING THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES.

D. DURING THE MEETING AT THE EUROPEAN UNION, THE ED ALSO BRIEFED THEM ABOUT THE DISCUSSION HELD WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA ON THE PAYMENT OF TAXES BY THE CONTRACTORS AND OTHER RELATED ISSUES.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 196 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM NKAMIRA, 356 RETURNEES DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, KIBUYE, KIGALI RURAL AND KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL NO OF 267 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED ESCORTS TO ESKO INTERNATIONAL FOOD CONVOY CARRYING RATIONS TO NICOY FROM KIGALI TO SHAGASHA.

C. PROVIDED TRUCKS TO KIGALI PREFECTURE FOR DISTRIBUTION OF 12 TONNES OF FOOD TO VARIOUS SECTEURS IN KIGALI.

D. NICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO NGO "FOOD FOR HUNGRY" AND TRANSPORTED 4000 BURNT BRICKS FROM NYUNDO TO MUTURA COMMUNE.

E. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER EACH AT ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMP BUTARE AND TRANSIT CAMP CYANGUGU. IT ALSO

PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC AND CARRIED OUT ELECTRIFICATION IN KABUGA DETENTION CENTRE.

F. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ACTIVATION OF RWANDATEL LOCAL LINES.

F. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 239 MEDICAL AND 14 DENTAL PATIENTS.

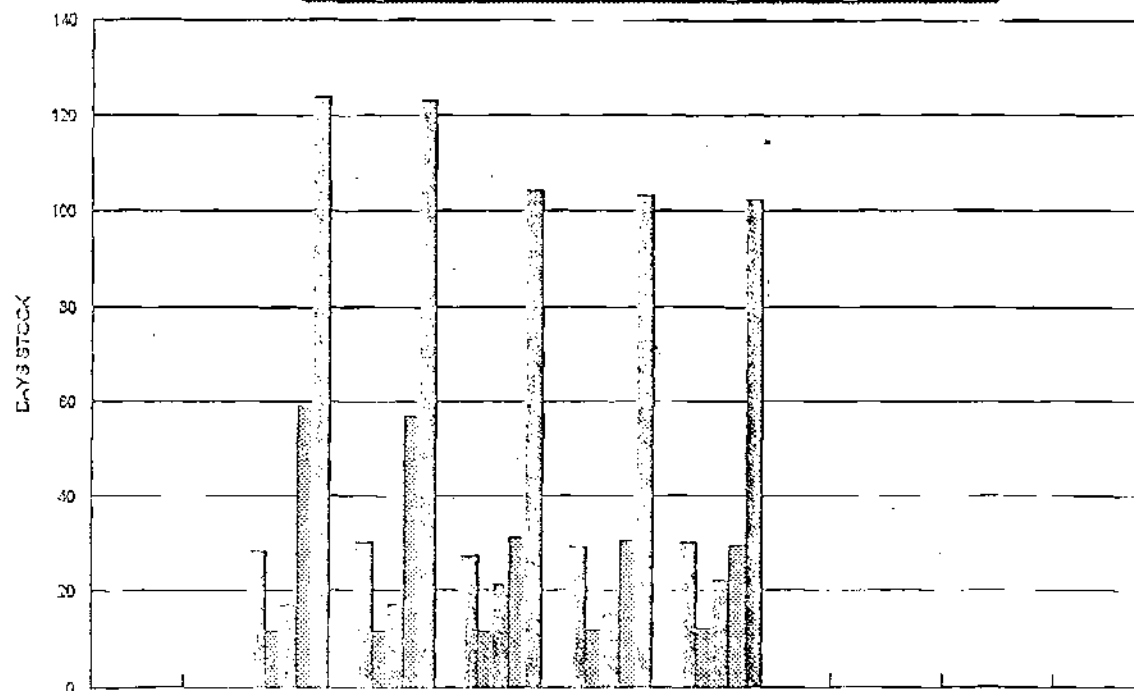



1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 1487. 413 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 1035 FROM BURUNDI AND 39 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 14867 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, A DELEGATION CONSISTING OF DELEGATES FROM UNHCR, THE GOVERNMENT OF BURUNDI AND THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA VISITED RWANDAN REFUGEES CAMPS IN BURUNDI AND PERSUADED THE REFUGEES TO RETURN TO RWANDA. THEY WERE TOLD THAT THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM IN RWANDA WAS BEING RESTORED AND ONCE A REFUGEE IS REPATRIATED, HE CAN CLAIM HIS PROPERTY BY APPROACHING THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES INSTEAD OF GOING STRAIGHT TO THE ILLEGAL OCCUPANT.

B. RWANDAN RADIO ALSO REPORTED THAT ZAIRE IS ABOUT TO CLOSE KIBUMBA AND GASHYUSHYA REFUGEE CAMPS AND REFUGEES INFUX WILL COMMENCE FROM TODAY ONWARDS.

ON 31 JAN 96. THE BLAST OF THE EXPLOSION IS BELIEVED TO HAVE AFFECTED DOORS, WINDOWS AND ROOFING OF NEARBY HOUSES. FURTHER INFORMATION BEING FORWARDED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. THE INVESTIGATION OFFICER AND THE SECURITY CO-ORDINATOR FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, MR BORDEWIJK, CALLED ON THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER AND DISCUSSED SECURITY RELATED ISSUES.

B. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH CHIEF OF STAFF RPA, COL SAM KAKA, IN THE RPA HEAD QUARTERS. DURING THE MEETING THE CHIEF OF STAFF REGRETTED THE INCIDENT OF 29 JAN 96 IN WHICH THREE PERSONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL WERE ILL-TREATED BY THE RPA SOLDIERS. 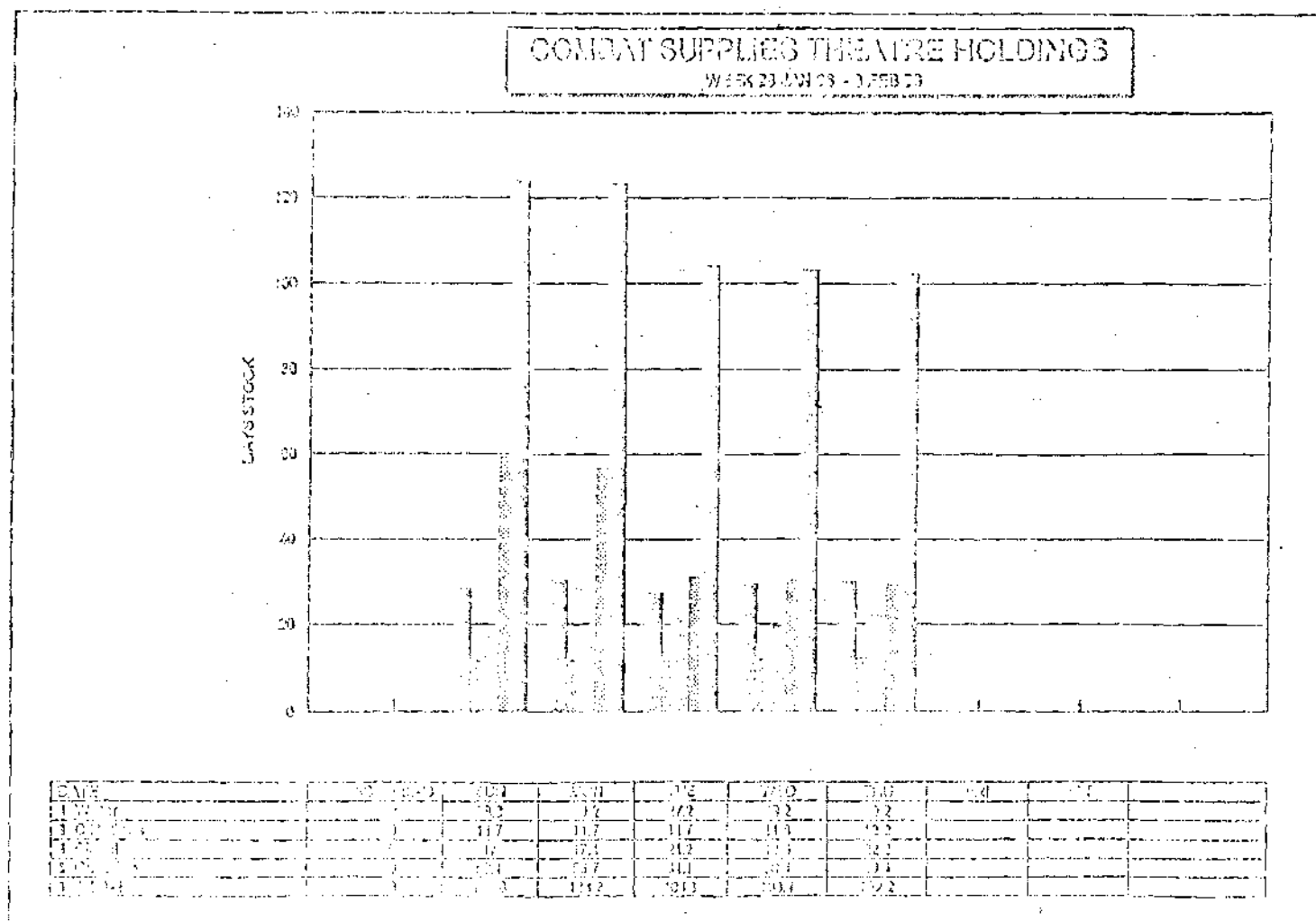

DAILY SITREP FOR 31 JAN 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 409 . 248 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 83 FROM BURUNDI AND 78 FROM TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 13264 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. HEAD OF AGENCIES MEETING WAS HELD IN UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM. MATTERS CONCERNING REFUGEE REPATRIATION, SECURITY SITUATION AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE TRIPARTITE MEETINGS WERE DISCUSSED. ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE FORTHCOMING ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE WERE ALSO DELIBERATED UPON.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, ACCOMPANIED BY THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, THE PRIME MINISTER P CLESTTIN RWIGEMA, AND SOME OTHER DIGNITARIES, VISITED CYANGUGU PREFECTURE ON 30 JANUARY 1996 AND DISCUSSED THE PROBLEMS FACING THE POPULATION OF THAT PREFECTURE. IN PARTICULAR THE ISSUE OF OLD CURRENCY NOTES BROUGHT BY PEOPLE COMING BACK FROM BUKAVU CAMPS IN ZAIRE WAS DISCUSSED.

C. THE RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE UNITED NATIONS IS TRYING TO FIND A REPLACEMENT FOR THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, WHO HAS BEEN APPOINTED TO HEAD THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT IN HIS COUNTRY SOUTH AFRICA.

D. IT FURTHER REPORTED, THAT THE REPLACEMENT WOULD NOT COME FROM ANY AFRICAN COUNTRY NOR FROM FRANCE OR BELGIUM, BECAUSE RWANDA WOULD NOT AGREE. THE RADIO ALSO QUOTED RELIABLE SOURCES, AS HAVING INDICATED THAT THE REPLACEMENT FOR JUDGE GOLDSTONE WOULD COME FROM CANADA.

MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT TWO FRGF SOLDIERS (MUHUZA JEAN AND NTAKIYIMANA GERALD) WERE ARRESTED AND ONE (SGT SINDIKUBWABO FROM TARE COMMUNE, GR 9010,) WAS SHOT AND INJURED WHILE TRYING TO ESCAPE ON THE NIGHT 29/30 JAN 96 BY RPA. ONE RIFLE, A GRENADE AND EXPLOSIVE HAVE BEEN RECOVERED FROM THEM. THE INJURED PERSON IS DETAINED WITHOUT ANY MEDICAL TREATMENT .

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT A CIVILIAN MR NTAGUNGIRA SALATIERE AND HIS WIFE WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED BY SUSPECTED BANDITS AT CYATO (GR 0934) AT ABOUT 2100 HRS. THE BANDITS LOOTED VALUABLES AND FIRED IN THE AIR BEFORE FLEEING.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 27 JAN 96 IN BIREMBO SECTOR (GR 0934) TWO PERSONS (MR RUTERANA AND NVUNABANDI) WERE KILLED BY A GROUP OF FOUR PERSONS WHO WERE DEMANDING MONEY .

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 27 JAN 96 TWO PERSONS, (MR NTONDWE AND MR RUZITATIRA) WERE KILLED IN THE GIHIRA SECTOR (GR 4612). TWO PERSONS (MR SIMBIZI AND NTAWUKAMENYA) WERE KILLED BY RPA WHEN THEY ATTACKED THE RPA TEAM WHICH HAD GONE TO INVESTIGATE THE INCIDENT.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 23 JAN 96 THAT SOME PERSONS DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORMS STOLE 30,000 RWF, RADIO AND OTHER ITEMS FROM THE HOUSE OF MR HABAMENSHI IN GASIZA CENTRE (GR 5408) .

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED INDBATT AND RUYENZI OWS CAMP AND MET THE REPRESENTATIVES FROM MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION, UNHCR AND CONCERN. LATER, HE MET MR URASA, UNHCR REP, AND MR MUHIGA, UNHCR COORDINATOR FOR AFRICA REGION, AND DISCUSSED ISSUES RELATING TO REFUGEE REPATRIATION AND UNAMIR'S ASSISTANCE.

B. GHANBATT SY PARTIES LEFT KIBUNGO FOR KIGALI. TEN MAN NICOY TEAM CONTINUES TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT GHANBATT LOCATION KIBUNGO FOR UNAMIR PROPERTY STILL LEFT BEHIND.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 462 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM BUTARE, NKAMIRA, AND GASHORA. 136 RETURNEES DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO GITARAMA, KIBUNGO AND KIGALI RURAL . A TOTAL OF 427 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT EVACUATED TWO CIVILIAN CASUALTIES TO KIGALI FROM ACCIDENT SITE ABOUT 25 KM FROM KIGALI ON ROAD KIGALI-GITARAMA, PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO NGO "CONCERN WORLD WIDE" AND PROVIDED TRANSPORT TO KIGALI PREFECTURE FOR DISTRIBUTION OF 14 TONS OF FOOD STUFF.

C. NICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO NGO "FOOD FOR HUNGRY" FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL.

D. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER EACH AT ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMP BUTARE AND TRANSIT CAMP CYANGUGU. IT ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC AND CARRIED OUT ELECTRIFICATION IN KABUGA DETENTION CENTRE.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ACTIVATION OF RWANDATEL LOCAL LINES AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FUEL WOOD.

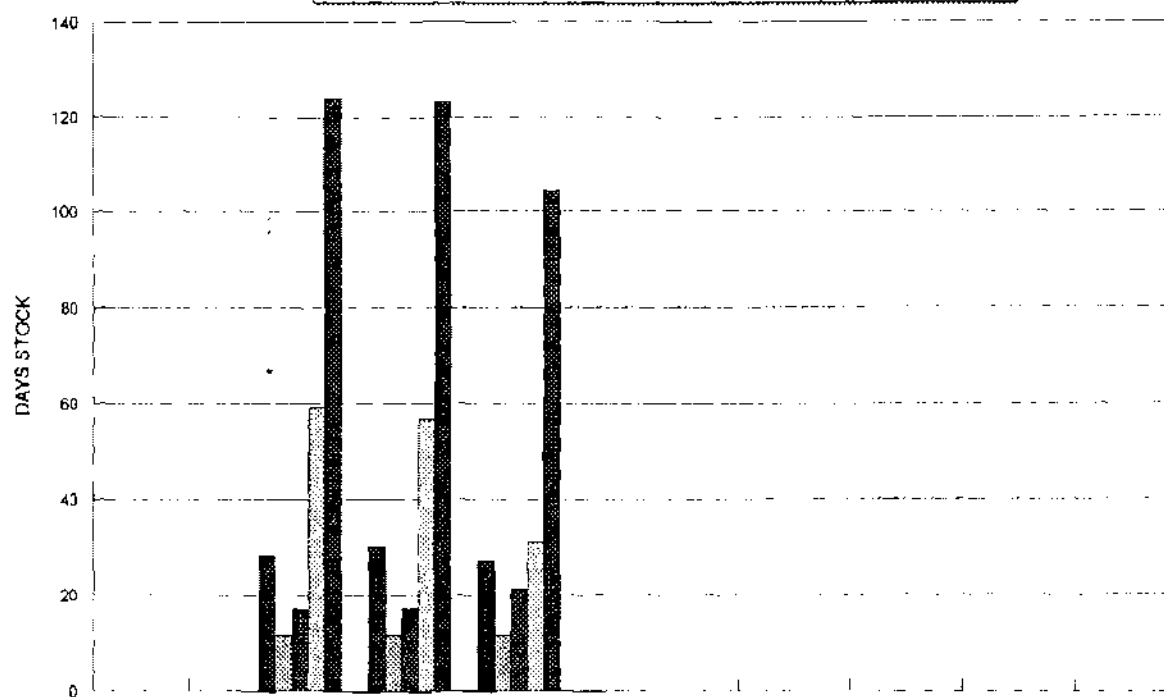

ONE RIFLE, A GRENADE AND EXPLOSIVE HAVE BEEN RECOVERED FROM THEM. THE INJURED PERSON IS DETAINED WITHOUT ANY MEDICAL TREATMENT .

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT A CIVILIAN MR NTAGUNGIRA SALATIERE AND HIS WIFE WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED BY SUSPECTED BANDITS AT CYATO (GR 0934) AT ABOUT 2100 HRS. THE BANDITS LOOTED VALUABLES AND FIRED IN THE AIR BEFORE FLEEING.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 27 JAN 96 IN BIREMBO SECTOR (GR 0934) TWO PERSONS (MR RUTERANA AND NVUNABANDI) WERE KILLED BY A GROUP OF FOUR PERSONS WHO WERE DEMANDING MONEY .

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 27 JAN 96 TWO PERSONS, (MR NTONDWE AND MR RUZITATIRA) WERE KILLED IN THE GIHIRA SECTOR (GR 4612). TWO PERSONS (MR SIMBIZI AND N'AWUKAMENYA) WERE KILLED BY RPA WHEN THEY ATTACKED THE RPA TEAM WHICH HAD GONE TO INVESTIGATE THE INCIDENT.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 23 JAN 96 THAT SOME PERSONS DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORMS STOLE 30,000 RWF, RADIO AND OTHER ITEMS FROM THE HOUSE OF MR HABAMENSHI IN GASIZA CENTRE (GR 5408) .

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED INDBATT AND RUYENZI OWS CAMP AND MET THE REPRESENTATIVES FROM MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION, UNHCR AND CONCERN. LATER, HE MET MR URASA, UNHCR REP, AND MR MUHIGA, UNHCR COORDINATOR FOR AFRICA REGION, AND DISCUSSED ISSUES RELATING TO REFUGEE REPATRIATION AND UNAMIR'S ASSISTANCE.

B. GHANBATT SY PARTIES LEFT KIBUNGO FOR KIGALI. TEN MAN NICOY TEAM CONTINUES TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT GHANBATT LOCATION KIBUNGO FOR UNAMIR PROPERTY STILL LEFT BEHIND.

A. 462 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM BUTARE, NKAMIRA, AND GASHORA. 136 RETURNEES DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO GITARAMA, KIBUNGO AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 427 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

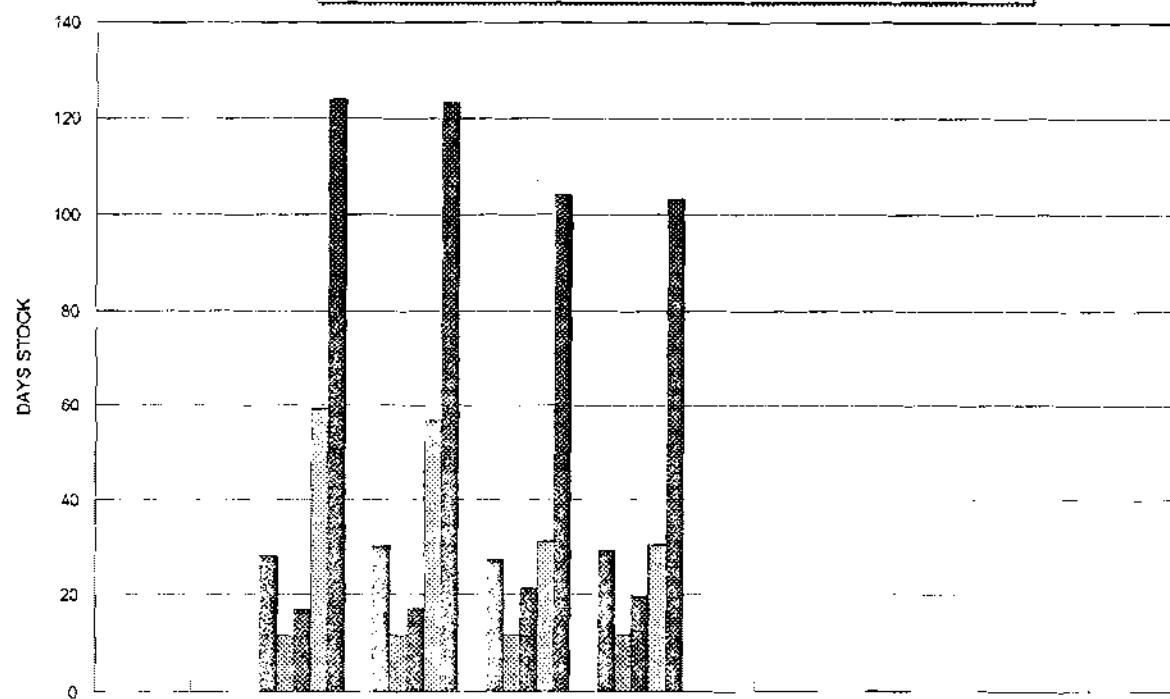




1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 634 . 200 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 434 FROM BURUNDI. IN ADDITION 305 CAME FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 12855 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECT 5, GISENYI, ON 28 JAN 96 SIX PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4893) IN CONNECTION WITH THE ANTI-TANK MINE EXPLOSION ON 25 JAN 96. SUSPECTS ARE BEING HELD AT THE COMMUNE CELL FOR INVESTIGATION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(B) PAIR OF BINOCULARS.

(C) MILITARY UNIFORMS.

THE WOMAN IS BEING HELD AT THE COMMUNE CELL. IN THE COURSE OF INVESTIGATION SHE MENTIONED THAT THE ABOVE ITEMS WERE KEPT IN HER BROTHERS HOUSE BY FIVE MEN SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF WHO VISITED HIM AROUND 17 JAN 96. THE BROTHER HAS SINCE FLED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. 151 GHANBATT PERSONNEL CONTINUED TO BE CONCENTRATED AT TRANSIT CAMP IN KIGALI PENDING ARRIVAL OF AIRCRAFT FOR THEIR FINAL REPATRIATION.

D. MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 226 MEDICAL AND 16 DENTAL PATIENTS

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. NSTR.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

A. IN KIGALI ON 29 JAN 96 AT 1815 HRS, THREE PERS OF THE ITR WERE MANHANDLED BY RPA SOLDIERS WHEN THEY UNKNOWINGLY ENTERED A "NO ENTRY AREA ". MATTER TAKEN UP WITH RWANDAN GOVT AND RPA AUTHORITIES. 

(B) PAIR OF BINOCULARS.

(C) MILITARY UNIFORMS.

THE WOMAN IS BEING HELD AT THE COMMUNE CELL. IN THE COURSE OF INVESTIGATION SHE MENTIONED THAT THE ABOVE ITEMS WERE KEPT IN HER BROTHERS HOUSE BY FIVE MEN SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF WHO VISITED HIM AROUND 17 JAN 96. THE BROTHER HAS SINCE FLED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. 151 GHANBATT PERSONNEL CONTINUED TO BE CONCENTRATED AT TRANSIT CAMP IN KIGALI PENDING ARRIVAL OF AIRCRAFT FOR THEIR FINAL REPATRIATION.



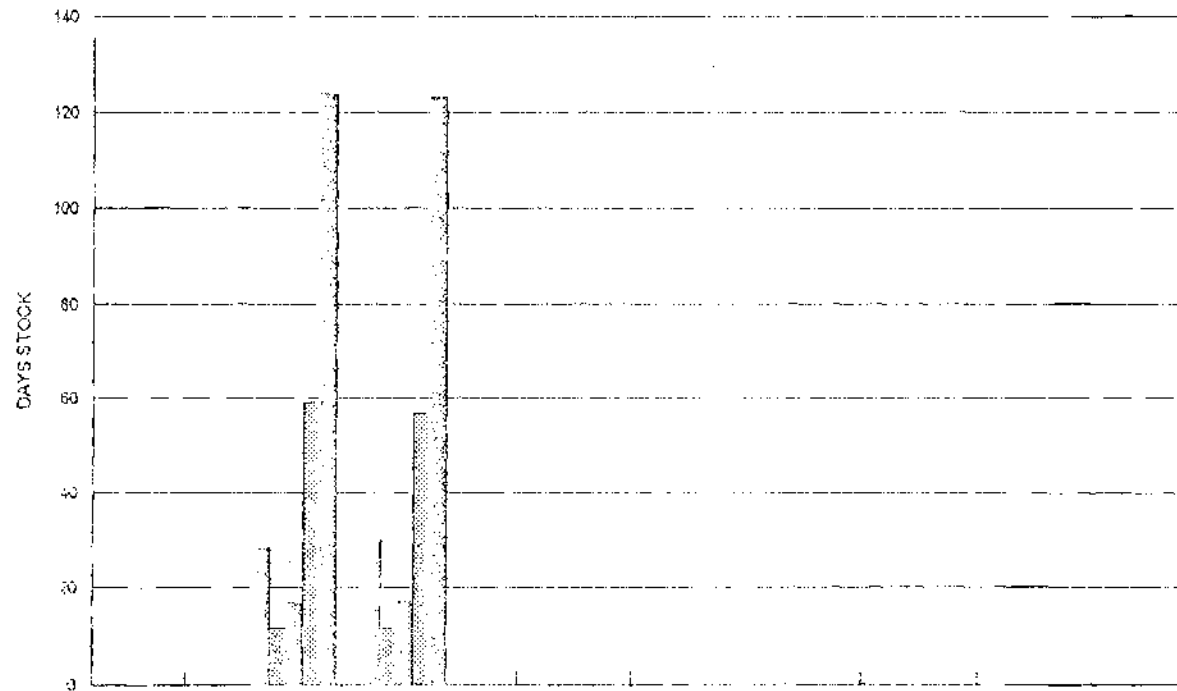

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING: TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 1270. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. FORMER MALIAN PRESIDENT GENERAL AMADOU TOUMANJI TOURE VISTED RWANDA BETWEEN 21-23 JANUARY 1996 AND DISCUSSED WITH COLLEAGUES THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CAIRO SUMMIT RESOLUTIONS. HE STATED THAT THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CAIRO SUMMIT WERE IMPORTANT AND MEDIATORS HAD THE ROLE OF ASSURING ITS FOLLOW-UP.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE MINISTER FOR REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION MR. PATRICK MAZIMPAKA HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE ON WEDNESDAY, 24 JAN 96 IN WHICH HE REAFFIRMED HIS GOVERNMENT'S COMMITMENT TO WELCOME ALL REFUGEES BACK HOME UNCONDITIONALLY. HE SAID THAT RWANDA APPEALS TO ALL AGENCIES, ORGANISATIONS AND GOVERNMENTS TO EXERCISE REASONABLE INFLUENCE IN FACILITATING THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW IN EXILE IN THE NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE MINISTER STATED THAT SINCE 1994 RWANDA HAS RECEIVED 130,000 REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI INCLUDING 10,000 THAT RETURNED IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER AND JANUARY. HE ALSO STATED THAT NECESSARY MECHANISMS HAVE BEEN ACTIVATED TO TAKE ALL REFUGEES IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLOSURE OF NTAMBA CAMP. FURTHER, THE GOVERNMENT WAS TO DESPATCH A HIGH RANKING DELEGATION TO BUJUMBURA ON 28 JAN 96 TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE BURUNDIAN GOVERNMENT AND UNHCR ON THE WAYS OF ENHANCING A QUICK RETURN OF ALL REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI. THE ABOVE STATEMENT IS IN RESPONSE TO THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL'S CONCERN REPORTED BY RADIO RWANDA THAT THE RWANDESE IS NOT PURSUING A POLICY OF RECONCILIATION SO VITALLY LINKED TO THE PROCESS OF REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW BASED IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

C. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO UNAMIR ON 25 JANUARY 96, THE

RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DR. ANASTASE GASSANA TOOK STRONG EXCEPTION TO THE REMARKS OF THE UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING RWANDA. HE STATED THAT THE POLICY OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION IS BEING DULY FOLLOWED AND FAIRLY EVIDENT BY WAY REINTEGRATION OF 4000 SOLDIERS OF EX-RGF AND RECEPTION OF 15000 REFUGEES EXPELLED FROM ZAIRE LAST YEAR. HE FURTHER SAID THAT THE UNITED NATIONS PRESENCE AFTER THE EXPIRY OF THE UNAMIR MANDATE COULD BE WELL FELT WITH WORKING OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL, UNDP, UNICEF AND UNHCR. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE MONEY BEING SPENT ON UNAMIR MUST HENCEFORTH BE MADE AVAILABLE TO INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL, FOR IT TO BE MUCH MORE OPERATIONAL THAN IT HAS BEEN UNTIL NOW AND UNITED NATIONS MAY CONTRIBUTE IN THE FUTURE BY WAY OF DEVELOPMENT AID. ACCORDING TO DR. GASANA 70,000 PUPILS ARE WAITING TO ENTER SECONDARY SCHOOL, WHEREAS THE GOVERNMENT CAN HARDLY TAKE 10 PERCENT OF THEM. INSTEAD OF MAINTAINING UNAMIR, CONCLUDED THE MINISTER THE UNITED NATIONS SHOULD BUILD SCHOOLS FOR PUPILS. THAT IS WHAT THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IS WAITING FOR.

D. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA NEWS OF 26 JANUARY 1996, THE MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS DR. NANATASE GASAN AND THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE MRS. MARTHE MUKAMURENZI DURING THEIR VISIT TO ZAMBIA MET WITH THE PRESIDENT AND REQUESTED TO EXAMINE POSSIBILITIES OF EXTRADITING GENOCIDE SUSPECTS TO RWANDAN TRIBUNALS AS THE CRIME WAS COMMITTED IN RWANDA BY RWANDANS AND THE VICTIMS WERE RWANDANS.

E. THE CHINESE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS R. JI PEI DING ARRIVED RWANDA ON 26 JANUARY 96 AND SIGNED AN ACCORD IN WHICH CHINA IS TO BUILD TWO TAILORING WORKSHOP IN RWANDA. THE CHINESE DEPUTY MINISTER SAID HIS GOVERNMENT INTENDED TO STRENGTHEN RELATIONS ALREADY EXISTING BETWEEN CHINA AND RWANDA, AND ADDED THAT CHINA WOULD RESUME ALL THE RWANDAN PROJECTS IT USED TO SUPPORT BEFORE THE WAR.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), IN MUGINA COMMUNE, A MILOB TEAM WAS TOLD BY THE IPJ THAT 26 PEOPLE HAD BEEN ARRESTED SINCE 01 JAN 96, AMONG THEM 16 FOR GENOCIDE. HR INFORMED.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AN RPA FOOT PATROL FIRED ON SUSPECTED FORMER MILITIA ON THE NIGHT OF 10/11 JAN IN NDORMA SECTOR (GR 4717) AND KILLED TWO OF THE SUSPECTS WHILE THE REST MANAGED TO ESCAPE.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), DURING THE SEARCH CARRIED OUT BY RPA IN KABERE 1 AND KABERE 2 SECTORS ON 22 JAN 96, 27 PERSONS WERE ARRESTED ON CHARGE OF COLLABORATING WITH THE FRGF.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 24 JAN 96 AT NKOTSI SECTOR (GR 6025) RPA NIGHT PATROL SHOT DEAD A MAN FOR VIOLATING THE NIGHT CURFEW AND FAILING TO STOP WHEN CHALLENGED.

(5) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 16 JAN 96 TWO RPA SOLDIERS DIED AND 16 WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED WHEN AN RPA TRUCK DETONATED AN ANTI TANK MINE IN NANGA SECTOR (GR 4218) IN KARAGO COMMUNE.

(6) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), FOUR FRGF SOLDIERS WERE ARRESTED BY RPA AFTER AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE IN DOMAINE MILITARY FOREST (GR 3718) OF KORA SECTOR (GR 3821) ON 19 JAN 96. THEY ALSO REPORTED THAT LOCAL RPA COMMANDERS MET EX-FRGF SOLDIERS IN NYAMYUMBA COMMUNE (GR 2007) AND DISCUSSED THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COMMUNE.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 22 JAN 96 IN BAADA SECTEUR (GR 0031) THE RPA CONFIRMED TO LOCALS THAT THEY HAD KILLED SIX MEN WHOM THEY HAD ARRESTED EARLIER IN THE AREA. THEY CLAIMED THAT THESE PEOPLE WERE FRGF MEN.

(8) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 22 JAN 96 IN THE CELLULE OF RWUMBA(1333), AN 18 YEAR OLD BOY WAS ACCIDENTLY SHOT DEAD BY RPA SOLDIERIS. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT ON 23 JAN 96, SIX PERSONS SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF ELEMENTS WERE ALSO SHOT DEAD BY RPA.

(9) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 28 JAN 96 AN RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI PERS MINE IN KAMATSIRA (GR 0734).

(10) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 28 JAN 96 TWO RPA SOLDIERS BELIEVED TO HAVE ATTEMPTED STEALING FROM A HOUSE AT BONDE TOWN (1714) WERE ARRESTED AND SENT TO RPA DETENTION CAMP FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), ON THE NIGHT OF 23 JAN AN ARMED GROUP FIRED AT THE HEALTH CENTRE AT MUGANZA SECTOR BUT NO ONE WAS INJURED. THE SAME GROUP THEN THREW EXPLOSIVE SUSPECTED TO BE GRENADE IN ONE OF THE HOUSES, SERIOUSLY WOUNDING ONE MAN AND THREE CHILDREN.

(2) IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), AT 2330H ON 23 JAN 96 SOME STUDENTS OF KIVU SECONDARY SCHOOL WERE FOUND IN POSSESSION OF KNIVES. THE DIRECTOR SOUGHT THE HELP OF RPA. JUST WHEN THE RPA ARRIVED GUN SHOTS WERE HEARD FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE SCHOOL DORMITORY AND LATER FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE DIRECTOR'S RESIDENCE. IT WAS LATER FOUND AT ABOUT 0400 HRS OF 24 JAN THAT TWO STUDENTS AND THE WIFE OF THE DIRECTOR HAD BEEN SHOT. THE TOYOTA PICK UP

DONATED BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION WAS ALSO FOUND BURNT.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 11 JAN 96 A FARMER FROM RAMBURA SECTOR (GR 4514) DIED WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE ON THE TRACK USED BY SCHOOL CHILDREN. TWO SUSPECTS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INCIDENT. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT A STUDENT OF SECONDARY SCHOOL OF KAYOVE SECTOR (GR 2790) ALSO LOST HIS LEG IN THE MINE BLAST.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ONE HE HAND GRENADE WAS FOUND IN NKOTSI SECTOR (GR 6024) OF NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) ALONG A FOOT PATH ON 24 JAN 96.

(5) IN SECTOR 5(GISENYI), LOCALS CONFIRMED THE RE-EMERGENCE OF FRGF ACTIVITIES AT GACURABWZENGE SECTOR[GR 2625]. SOURCE DISCLOSED THAT ONE MR. SAMUEL NYANKINDI WAS ABDUCTED TO ZAIRE ON THE 22 JAN 96. HE WAS RELEASED THE NEXT DAY. DETAILS BEING OBTAINED.

(6) IN SECTOR 5(GISENYI),ON THE NIGHT OF 25 JAN 96 THERE WAS EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN RPA AND FRGF WHEN ABOUT 10 FRGF RAIDED GACURABWZENGE SECTOR [GR2625] TO STEAL GOATS. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

(7) IN SECTOR 5(GISENYI), AT MUKINGO COMMUNE A BOX CONTAINING MILITARY UNIFORMS AND MINE WIRES WERE DISCOVERED AT RWINZOVI SECTOR[4830] IN A BUSH ON 23 JAN 96. NO ARREST HAS BEEN MADE.

(8) SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) - IN CYABINGO COMMUNE ONE FRGF WAS ARRESTED ON 16 JAN 96 AND KEPT IN THE COMMUNE CELL BUT ESCAPED. BOTH THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND BURGOMASTER CONFIRMED THAT HE CAME FROM ZAIRE WITH A SABOTAGE MISSION.

(9) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), FOUR PERSONS WERE STABBED WITH KNIVES IN A BAR ON 28 JAN 96, BY POSSIBLY FRGF ELEMENTS. DURING A FOLLOW UP OPERATION BY THE RPA, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE RESULTED IN THE KILLING OF TWO FRGF AND ONE RPA SOLDIER. ON SEARCHING THE AREA THE RPA FOUND ONE GRENADE AND ONE MACHINE GUN.

A. FORMER MALIAN PRESIDENT GENERAL AMADOU TOUMANJI TOURE VISTED RWANDA BETWEEN 21-23 JANUARY 1996 AND DISCUSSED WITH COLLEAGUES THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CAIRO SUMMIT RESOLUTIONS. HE STATED THAT THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CAIRO SUMMIT WERE IMPORTANT AND MEDIATORS HAD THE ROLE OF ASSURING ITS FOLLOW-UP.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE MINISTER FOR REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION MR. PATRICK MAZIMPAKA HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE ON WEDNESDAY, 24 JAN 96 IN WHICH HE REAFFIRMED HIS GOVERNMENT'S COMMITMENT TO WELCOME ALL REFUGEES BACK HOME UNCONDITIONALLY. HE SAID THAT RWANDA APPEALS TO ALL AGENCIES, ORGANISATIONS AND GOVERNMENTS TO EXERCISE REASONABLE INFLUENCE IN FACILITATING THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW IN EXILE IN THE NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE MINISTER STATED THAT SINCE 1994 RWANDA HAS RECEIVED 130,000 REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI INCLUDING 10,000 THAT RETURNED IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER AND JANUARY. HE ALSO STATED THAT NECESSARY MECHANISMS HAVE BEEN ACTIVATED TO TAKE ALL REFUGEES IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLOSURE OF NTAMBA CAMP. FURTHER, THE GOVERNMENT WAS TO DESPATCH A HIGH RANKING DELEGATION TO BUJUMBURA ON 28 JAN 96 TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE BURUNDIAN GOVERNMENT AND UNHCR ON THE WAYS OF ENHANCING A QUICK RETURN OF ALL REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI. THE ABOVE STATEMENT IS IN RESPONSE TO THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL'S CONCERN REPORTED BY RADIO RWANDA THAT THE RWANDESE IS NOT PURSUING A POLICY OF RECONCILIATION SO VITALLY LINKED TO THE PROCESS OF REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW BASED IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

C. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO UNAMIR ON 25 JANUARY 96, THE

RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DR. ANASTASE GASSANA TOOK STRONG EXCEPTION TO THE REMARKS OF THE UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING RWANDA. HE STATED THAT THE POLICY OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION IS BEING DULY FOLLOWED AND FAIRLY EVIDENT BY WAY REINTEGRATION OF 4000 SOLDIERS OF EX-RGF AND RECEPTION OF 15000 REFUGEES EXPELLED FROM ZAIRE LAST YEAR. HE FURTHER SAID THAT THE UNITED NATIONS PRESENCE AFTER THE EXPIRY OF THE UNAMIR MANDATE COULD BE WELL FELT WITH WORKING OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL, UNDP, UNICEF AND UNHCR. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE MONEY BEING SPENT ON UNAMIR MUST HENCEFORTH BE MADE AVAILABLE TO INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL, FOR IT TO BE MUCH MORE OPERATIONAL THAN IT HAS BEEN UNTIL NOW AND UNITED NATIONS MAY CONTRIBUTE IN THE FUTURE BY WAY OF DEVELOPMENT AID. ACCORDING TO DR. GASANA 70,000 PUPILS ARE WAITING TO ENTER SECONDARY SCHOOL, WHEREAS THE GOVERNMENT CAN HARDLY TAKE 10 PERCENT OF THEM. INSTEAD OF MAINTAINING UNAMIR, CONCLUDED THE MINISTER THE UNITED NATIONS SHOULD BUILD SCHOOLS FOR PUPILS. THAT IS WHAT THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IS WAITING FOR.

D. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA NEWS OF 26 JANUARY 1996, THE MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS DR NANATASE GASAN AND THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE MRS MARTHE MUKAMURENZI DURING THEIR VISIT TO ZAMBIA MET WITH THE PRESIDENT AND REQUESTED TO EXAMINE POSSIBILITIES OF EXTRADITING GENOCIDE SUSPECTS TO RWANDAN TRIBUNALS AS THE CRIME WAS COMMITTED IN RWANDA BY RWANDANS AND THE VICTIMS WERE RWANDANS.

E. THE CHINESE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS R. JI PEI DING ARRIVED RWANDA ON 26 JANUARY 96 AND SIGNED AN ACCORD IN WHICH CHINA IS TO BUILD TWO TAILORING WORKSHOP IN RWANDA. THE CHINESE DEPUTY MINISTER SAID HIS GOVERNMENT INTNEDED TO STRENGTHEN RELATIONS ALREADY EXISTING BETWEEN CHINA AND RWANDA, AND ADDED THAT CHINA WOULD RESUME ALL THE RWANDAN PROJECTS IT USED TO SUPPORT BEFORE THE WAR.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), IN MUGINA COMMUNE, A MILOB TEAM WAS TOLD BY THE IPJ THAT 26 PEOPLE HAD BEEN ARRESTED SINCE 01 JAN 96, AMONG THEM 16 FOR GENOCIDE. HR INFORMED.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AN RPA FOOT PATROL FIRED ON SUSPECTED FORMER MILITIA ON THE NIGHT OF 10/11 JAN IN NDORMA SECTOR (GR 4717) AND KILLED TWO OF THE SUSPECTS WHILE THE REST MANAGED TO ESCAPE.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), DURING THE SEARCH CARRIED OUT BY RPA IN KABERE 1 AND KABERE 2 SECTORS ON 22 JAN 96, 27 PERSONS WERE ARRESTED ON CHARGE OF COLLABORATING WITH THE FRGF.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 24 JAN 96 AT NKOTSI SECTOR (GR 6025) RPA NIGHT PATROL SHOT DEAD A MAN FOR VIOLATING THE NIGHT CURFEW AND FAILING TO STOP WHEN CHALLENGED.

(5) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 16 JAN 96 TWO RPA SOLDIERS DIED AND 16 WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED WHEN AN RPA TRUCK DETONATED AN ANTI TANK MINE IN NANGA SECTOR (GR 4218) IN KARAGO COMMUNE.

(6) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), FOUR FRGF SOLDIERS WERE ARRESTED BY RPA AFTER AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE IN DOMAINE MILITARY FOREST (GR 3718) OF KORA SECTOR (GR 3821) ON 19 JAN 96. THEY ALSO REPORTED THAT LOCAL RPA COMMANDERS MET EX-FRGF SOLDIERS IN NYAMYUMBA COMMUNE (GR 2007) AND DISCUSSED THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COMMUNE.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 22 JAN 96 IN BAADA SECTEUR (GR 0031) THE RPA CONFIRMED TO LOCALS THAT THEY HAD KILLED SIX MEN WHOM THEY HAD ARRESTED EARLIER IN THE AREA. THEY CLAIMED THAT THESE PEOPLE WERE FRGF MEN.

(8) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 22 JAN 96 IN THE CELLULE OF RWUMBA(1333), AN 18 YEAR OLD BOY WAS ACCIDENTLY SHOT DEAD BY RPA SOLDIERIS. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT ON 23 JAN 96, SIX PERSONS SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF ELEMENTS WERE ALSO SHOT DEAD BY RPA.

(9) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 28 JAN 96 AN RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI PERS MINE IN KAMATSIRA (GR 0734).

(10) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 28 JAN 96 TWO RPA SOLDIERS BELIEVED TO HAVE ATTEMPTED STEALING FROM A HOUSE AT BONDE TOWN (1714) WERE ARRESTED AND SENT TO RPA DETENTION CAMP FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), ON THE NIGHT OF 23 JAN AN ARMED GROUP FIRED AT THE HEALTH CENTRE AT MUGANZA SECTOR BUT NO ONE WAS INJURED. THE SAME GROUP THEN THREW EXPLOSIVE SUSPECTED TO BE GRENADE IN ONE OF THE HOUSES, SERIOUSLY WOUNDING ONE MAN AND THREE CHILDREN.

(2) IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), AT 2330H ON 23 JAN 96 SOME STUDENTS OF KIVU SECONDARY SCHOOL WERE FOUND IN POSSESSION OF KNIVES. THE DIRECTOR SOUGHT THE HELP OF RPA. JUST WHEN THE RPA ARRIVED GUN SHOTS WERE HEARD FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE SCHOOL DORMITORY AND LATER FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE DIRECTOR'S RESIDENCE. IT WAS LATER FOUND AT ABOUT 0400 HRS OF 24 JAN THAT TWO STUDENTS AND THE WIFE OF THE DIRECTOR HAD BEEN SHOT. THE TOYOTA PICK UP

DONATED BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION WAS ALSO FOUND BURNT.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 11 JAN 96 A FARMER FROM RAMBURA SECTOR (GR 4514) DIED WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE ON THE TRACK USED BY SCHOOL CHILDREN. TWO SUSPECTS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INCIDENT. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT A STUDENT OF SECONDARY SCHOOL OF KAYOVE SECTOR (GR 2790) ALSO LOST HIS LEG IN THE MINE BLAST.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ONE HE HAND GRENADE WAS FOUND IN NKOTSI SECTOR (GR 6024) OF NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) ALONG A FOOT PATH ON 24 JAN 96.

(5) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), LOCALS CONFIRMED THE RE-EMERGENCE OF FRGF ACTIVITIES AT GACURABWZENGE SECTOR [GR 2625]. SOURCE DISCLOSED THAT ONE MR. SAMUEL NYANKINDI WAS ABDUCTED TO ZAIRE ON THE 22 JAN 96. HE WAS RELEASED THE NEXT DAY. DETAILS BEING OBTAINED.

(6) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON THE NIGHT OF 25 JAN 96 THERE WAS EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN RPA AND FRGF WHEN ABOUT 10 FRGF RAIDED GACURABWZENGE SECTOR [GR 2625] TO STEAL GOATS. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

(7) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AT MUKINGO COMMUNE A BOX CONTAINING MILITARY UNIFORMS AND MINE WIRES WERE DISCOVERED AT RWINZOVI SECTOR [4830] IN A BUSH ON 23 JAN 96. NO ARREST HAS BEEN MADE.

(8) SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) - IN CYABINGO COMMUNE ONE FRGF WAS ARRESTED ON 16 JAN 96 AND KEPT IN THE COMMUNE CELL BUT ESCAPED. BOTH THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND BURGOMASTER CONFIRMED THAT HE CAME FROM ZAIRE WITH A SABOTAGE MISSION.

(9) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), FOUR PERSONS WERE STABBED WITH KNIVES IN A BAR ON 28 JAN 96, BY POSSIBLY FRGF ELEMENTS. DURING A FOLLOW UP OPERATION BY THE RPA, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE RESULTED IN THE KILLING OF TWO FRGF AND ONE RPA SOLDIER. ON SEARCHING THE AREA THE RPA FOUND ONE GRENADE AND ONE MACHINE GUN.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ON 23 JAN 96, THE A/FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO MILOB SECT 2 (GITARAMA).

(3) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER ADDRESSED ALL MEMBERS OF THE INDIAN CONTINGENT IN KIGALI 25 JAN 96 ON THE EVE OF THEIR NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS.

(4) 48 & 35 PERSONNEL OF INDBATT AND FORCE SIG COY, RESPECTIVELY, REPATRIATED TO INDIA ON 26 JAN 96.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 23 VEHs WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 107 REFUGEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 929 MEDICAL AND 60 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY MED CENTRES IN VARIOUS SECTORS.

D. GHANBATT DONATED 100 X STEEL BEDS CMM 40 X FOAM MATTRESSES 100 X STEEL JERRICANS TO RPA 201 BDE HQ. 50 X STEEL BEDS, 40 X FOAM MATTRESSES AND 50 X PLASTIC JERRICANS WERE ALSO DONATED TO KIBUNGO ORPHANAGE.

E. NICOY DONATED 12,800 RWF TO NYUNDO PENTECOSTAL CHURCH FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SITTING BENCHES.

F. INDBATT DISTRIBUTED 100 PACKETS OF SWEETS TO MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY (MOTHER TERESA'S GROUP) ORPHANAGE AT KIGALI AND KIBUNGO ON THE OCCASION OF INDIAN REPUBLIC DAY.

B. IN SECTOR 5, AT RUGANDA VILLAGE [5192] IN RAMA COMMUNE THREE PERSONS WERE REPORTEDLY KILLED AND 18 OTHERS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED WHEN THEIR VEH DETONATED ANTI-TANK MINES ON 25 JAN 96.

A. IN SECTOR 2 (KIBUYE), AN RPA SOLDIER BROKE INTO THE ROOM OF A SGT OF GHANA PL AT KIBUYE AND ATTEMPTED STEALING A RADIO CASSETTE PLAYER, TWO PAIRS OF UNIFORM AND SOME AUDIO CASSETTES. THE SOLDIER WAS CAUGHT IN THE ACT AND HANDED OVER TO THE RPA BN HQ. THE ITEMS WERE TAKEN TO THE CAMP AS

EXHIBITS. THE RPA ARE INVESTIGATING.

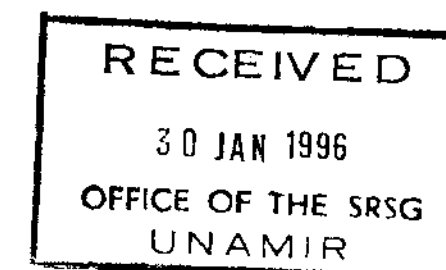

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 378 . 376 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 2 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1). IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA) EIGHT PERSONS WERE ARRESTED LAST WEEK IN MUGINA (9267) OUT OF WHICH FIVE ARE BELIEVED TO BE CONNECTED WITH THE GENOCIDE.

(2). IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 22 JAN 96 IN THE CELLULE OF RWUMBA(1333), AN 18 YEAR OLD BOY DIED WHEN HE TOGETHER WITH SOME OTHERS FOLLOWED SOME RPA SOLDIERS ACCUSING THEM OF KILLING THEIR CONSEILLER TWO WEEKS AGO. HE LOST HIS LIFE WHEN THE SOLDIERS STARTED FIRING. ON 23 JAN 96, SIX PERSONS SUSPECTED BY THE RPA TO BE FRGF ELEMENTS WERE ALSO SHOT DEAD IN THE SAME CELLULE OF RWUMBA (1333).

(3). ON 28 JAN 96 AN RPA SOLDIER WAS REPORTED TO HAVE HAD HIS LEG AMPUTATED WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI PERS MINE IN KAMATSIRA 0734 IN SECT 4, CYANGUGU.

(4) SECTOR 5 - (GISENYI) ON 28 JAN 96, TWO RPA SOLDIERS BELIEVED TO HAVE ATTEMPTED STEALING FROM A HOUSE AT BONDE TOWN (1714) IN GISENYI (1712) WERE ARRESTED AND SENT TO RPA DETENTION CAMP FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY IN SECTOR 5, (GISENYI) FOUR PERSONS WERE STABBED WITH KNIVES IN A DRINKING BAR ON 28 JAN 96, 300 METRES AWAY FROM NKAMIRA TRANSIT CAMP(3219) BY

POSSIBLY FRGF ELEMENTS. DURING A FOLLOW UP OPERATION BY THE RPA, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE RESULTED IN WHICH TWO FRGF AND ONE RPA SOLDIER WERE KILLED. DURING A SEARCH IN THE AREA THE RPA FOUND ONE GRENADE AND ONE MACHINE GUN. IN RWERERE COMMUNE (2722), PERSONS BELIEVED TO BE FORMER MILITIA MEN ATTACKED AND STOLE VALUABLES SUCH AS CLOTHING, BICYCLES AND MONEY IN THE SECTOR OF KINYANZOVU (2318) ON THE NIGHT OF 28/29 JAN 96.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. 151 GHANBATT PERSONNEL CONTINUED TO BE CONCENTRATED AT TRANSIT CAMP IN KIGALI PENDING ARRIVAL OF AIRCRAFT FOR THEIR FINAL REPATRIATION.

A. 27 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI CAMP FROM NKAMIRA. 87 RETURNEES DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, KIBUYE, KIGALI RURAL AND KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL OF 107 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. NICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO KARANGERA COMMUNE TO TRANSPORT OFFICE EQPT FROM CYANGUGU TO KARANGERA.

C. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER EACH AT TRANSIT CAMPS IN BUTARE AND CYANGUGU, ONE DOZER TO RPA IN KIGALI FOR LEVELLING AND A TRUCK TO A LOCAL ORGANISATION ARDEC FOR WOOD TRANSPORTATION.

D. FORCE SIG COY CONTINUED ASSISTING IN THE ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES OF RWANDATEL. ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO A LOCAL ORGANISATION ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD.

E. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 163 MEDICAL AND 5 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. NSTR.

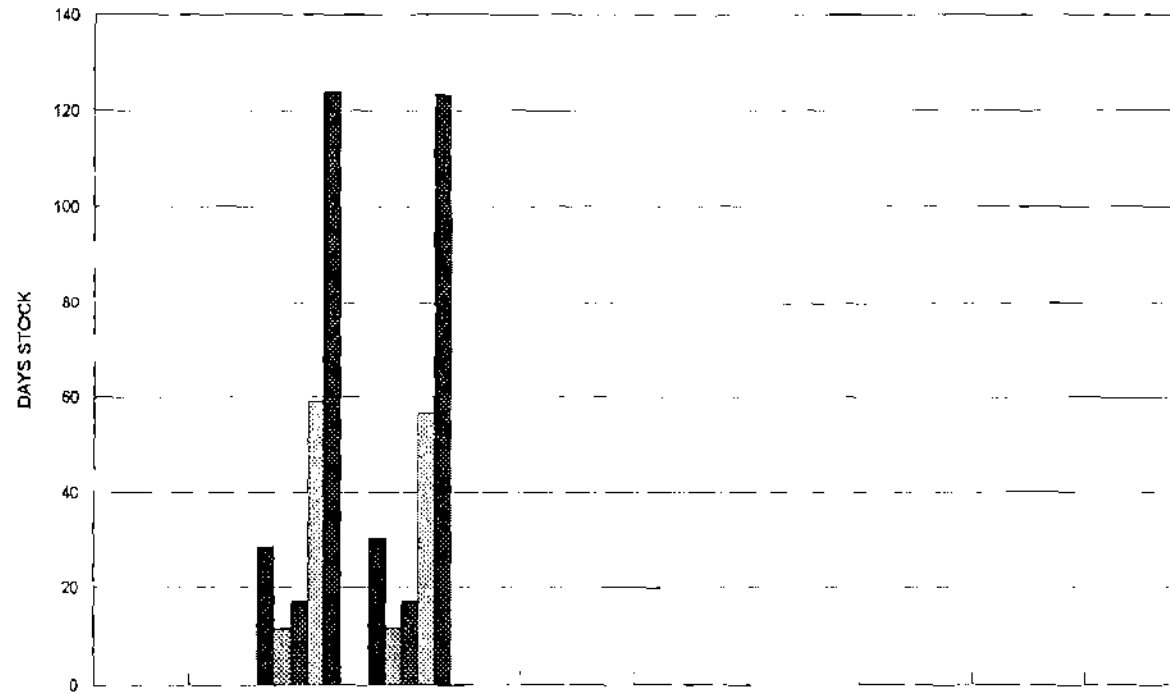
