- German Foreign Minister Kinkel arrived in KIGALI for an official visit.
- Zaire denied accusations from Rwandans that it stopped refugees from going home.
- Ten Hutus were killed and three wounded in an ambush near BUJUMBURA.

On 25 July, German Foreign Minister Kinkel arrived in KIGALI for an official visit during which he was expected to hold talks with senior Government Officials, representatives of UNAMIR and the International Tribunal for Rwanda. He was also expected to visit the Benaco Camps housing Rwandese refugees in Tanzania.

On 25 July, MILOBs in Sector 4 reported six separate acts of armed robbery by uniformed men in GISAGARA, MUHEHWE and CYETE. All these incidents occurred from 14 to 23 July, and resulted in gunshot or machete wounds to five victims. The bandits were suspected to have come across the border from Zaire.

BURUNDI: On 25 July, a total of ten Hutus were killed and three wounded in an ambush by suspected Tutsi gunmen on the main road to the airport from BUJUMBURA. The attack took place at night as the victims travelled in a minibus. The gunmen opened fire on the bus, killing seven on the spot. The rest died in hospital. (REUTER)

On 25 July, in Sector 5B, KIBUYE local authorities informed UNAMIR that there were about 1,500 returnees in the commune and the number was increasing daily.

DPKO SITUATION CENTRE REPORT

UNAMIR - RWANDA

Time: 0800 Hours NYT 17 July 1995
(Covering the period from 14 July to 17 July 1995)

HIGHLIGHTS

- UN Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali visited UNAMIR headquarters and had talks with Rwandan President and Vice President.
- UN Secretary-General met Zaire President Mobutu during a refueling stop on his way from Angola to Burundi.
- UN Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali arrived in Burundi.
- Belgium restored aid to Rwanda.

POLITICAL

On 14 July, Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali visited UNAMIR headquarters. Before addressing the military and civilian staff, he requested a moment of silence be observed in memory of the victims of the genocide in Rwanda and those members of UNAMIR who had lost their lives in the exercise of their duties. The Secretary-General visited the office of the Deputy Prosecutor of the International Tribunal for Rwanda. During his visit, he stated that the international community should never forget the genocide committed in Rwanda and that justice would be carried out in a firm and transparent manner. He had talks, lasting an hour and a half, with Rwandan President Bizimungu, and Vice President Kagame. At the airport, the Secretary-General met a delegation of non-governmental organizations representing survivors of the genocide. The delegation was led by Jean Bosco Rutagengwa, legal representative of the Association des Rescapes du Genocide, and Francois Nduwumwe, President of the Association des Parents et Amis des Victimes du Genocide au Rwanda. The representatives claimed that UNAMIR had not done enough to stop the genocide, and that the UN had the moral authority to repair the resulting damages. The Secretary-General responded that there existed a moral duty to punish and condemn those responsible for the genocide, but there was also a necessity to work towards national reconciliation and reconstruction.



In an interview with *Radio Rwanda*, President Bizimungu stated that he was grateful for the UN Secretary-General's visit to Rwanda, but said Rwanda did "not need lessons on talks with Rwandese refugees. Negotiations on power-sharing with criminals are out of the question. All we can do is to have contacts with the refugees". He added that the Secretary-General did not understand Rwandan's demands and that "the international community should rather praise the Rwandan government for allowing Hutus and Tutsis to work together". He also stated that the Donor fatigue referred to by the Secretary-General was not justified as Rwanda had not received enough assistance thus far.

On 16 July, UN Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali flew to Zaire President Mobutu Sese Seko's jungle palace

of Gbadolite to discuss the refugee crisis before flying to Burundi. Boutros-Ghali will meet Mobutu during a refueling stop on his way from Angola to BUJUMBURA.

BURUNDI: On 14 July, a group of Burundian opposition parties said reconciliation talks to end the conflict in Burundi should take place in BUJUMBURA, and not in ADDIS ABABA as proposed by the OAU. The official radio *Burundi* quoted representatives of seven parties making the call as having said that the Burundian people would be more ready to accept messages from their own country rather than from abroad, and that there was a risk the move could be interpreted as an internationalization of the conflict, which was in fact inter-Burundian. An OAU delegation, which visited Burundi to arrange a meeting of Burundian leaders in ADDIS ABABA, proposed the meeting to be held on 26 and 27 July. (AFP)

On 15 July, a UN official said he "expected violence" to mark the arrival of UN Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali on 16 July for meetings with the country's civilian and political leaders. UN Special Envoy Abdallah said he expected unrest and could not rule out demonstrations by Tutsi extremists after Tutsi papers accused Boutros-Ghali of favoritism toward Hutus. Boutros-Ghali will meet Prime Minister Nduwayo, members of his government, and President Ntibantunganya. On 17 July, he will deliver a speech to parliament and meet deputies and civilian representatives. (AFP)

On 16 July, UN Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali arrived in Burundi, a few hours after at least seven people were killed and six wounded in renewed ethnic violence. Boutros-Ghali was met by Prime Minister Nduwayo, ministers from his government, President Ntibantunganya and UN Special Envoy Abdallah. (AFP)

MILITARY

On 15 July, in Sector 4C, MILOBS reported bandits from Zaire were planning to launch a campaign of terror to kill designated people in BUGARAMA and its environs. These acts were targeted against community leaders and intellectuals. In Sector 3, Kirambo Clinic Administrator confirmed reports of the arrests of 37 persons from the Gitetsi commune by RPA soldiers, but could not provide their names. CIVPOL reported all UNAMIR trained Gendarmeries were deployed to various prefectures. Two hundred recruits reported for training, and 18 French speaking CIVPOL observers were re-deployed to the Training School as instructors.

HUMANITARIAN

On 14 July, Belgium restored aid to Rwanda, saying it was satisfied the central African country's government would encourage national reconciliation and the return of refugees. "The Belgium government has decided to resume aid, in line with the European Union decision and considering steps the Rwandan Government has taken over confidence-building measures, the return of refugees, national reconciliation and an improvement in internal security," a government statement said. "The modalities of the resumption of this aid will be investigated further in cooperation with the Rwandan authorities," the statement said, adding that Belgium would observe closely that the aid reached the right people in Rwanda. (REUTER)

The same team visited Busogo health center where the Assistant Medical Officer disclosed that the centre is in dire need of beds and mattresses. He also appeared for sufficient drugs as the commune is infested with the Malaria disease.

PMT - BYUMBA PREFECTURE

Disclosed that CIVPOL MONITORS IN THE PREFECTURE WERE LED BY THE Prefect of Byumba to inspect a new building in Byumba intended to be used by International Committee of Red Cross to transfer some of the inmates in Kigali Central Prison to solve that problem of over crowding in Kigali Prison.

IV. TRAINING

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School have been deployed in the various Prefectures. Meanwhile, the school is preparing grounds for the opening programme. In view of this, 518 students from various prefectures including 5 females have arrived at the school to commence training.

Went on patrols to MUSEBEYA Commune and reported that the Bourgmestre complained of lack of electricity in the area. He also requested for establishment of agricultural projects in the Commune with the view of providing employment to the locals.

The same team patrolled KIVU Commune and reported that the locals complained of lack of potable drinking water and electricity.

Also in GITANDA Sector, 13 locals were arrested on 10/7/95 for an alleged banditry activities, but were later released on 23/7/95 after intensive interrogation.

Again, in the same Sector, on 23/7/95 an old local woman was seriously injured by unidentified bandits. She is now on admission at the commune hospital. Investigation in progress.

b. PMT-GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

CIVPOL Team patrolled KARAMBO Commune and was informed by locals that acts of banditry activities have been on the increase in recent times. Investigation in progress.

c. PMT- BYUMBA PREFECTURE

Visited the Bourgmestre of KINYAMI Commune who briefed the team that the situation is quiet in the area in respect of security and crime.

Visited MURAMBI Commune and met the Bourgmestre who reported that 75 refugees entered the commune from UGANDA AND TANZANIA ON 23/7/95 and have all been resettled.

The same team visited GAKONI Orphanage Camp in the MURAMBI Commune and reported that the living conditions of 213 orphans are very horrible. The officer-in-charge of orphanage disclosed that there was an outbreak of Meningitis disease last week which killed 4 orphans. He disclosed further that the situation has been put under control.

The team was also informed by Assistant Bourgmestre that refugees from neighbouring countries coming to the commune go straight to their respective homes to re-settle. He also complained of lack of relief supplies of food in the commune.

In another development, the team visited KABILIZI refugee camp in RUNYINYA Commune and was informed that there were 450 refugees awaiting evacuation to their respective home communes.

PMT-GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

Visited MUSEBEYA Commune on 20/7/95 and was informed that RPA are suspected to have been threatening locals with arbitrary arrests. The team was also informed that a week ago one local is suspected to have been arrested by RPA and detained in the Commune cells. Reasons unknown. Investigation in progress.

The team also visited NYAMAGABE Commune and met the Bourgmestre who informed the team that the crime wave in the area was on the increase. He also complained of bandits who are suspected to be coming from other communes to steal cattle from locals. Investigation in progress.

UN RESTRICTED

PMT- KIGALI PREFECTURE

Visited KIGALI prison on 21/7/95 and observed that a lot of locals had gathered at the prison to visit their relations in prison. The locals expressed their concern about the deteriorating living conditions in prison. Human Rights informed.

PMT- CYANGUGU PREFECTURE

Patrolled AOR on 20/7/95 and reported that locals were anxious to know when the programme of the communal police would commence.

IV. TRAINING

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School have been deployed in the various Prefectures. Meanwhile, the school is preparing grounds for the opening programme. In view of this, all the expected 500 students from various prefectures have arrived at the school to commence training.

The Commandant of the training school when contacted disclosed that 300 desks are so far available. Efforts to get the remaining 200 desks is being made in order to enable the formal opening of the school to commence.

Eighteen (18) French speaking CIVPOL observers have been re-deployed at the training school to serve as instructors.

Patrolled Runganza Commune on 27/6/95 and was informed that the commune has a population of 28,350 and 457 orphans who are living with other families. It was further revealed that the commune has no orphanage centre to keep the orphans.

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

A. The team patrolled Rwaniko Commune on 27/6/95 and was informed that the crime wave in the commune is on the increase.

B. The team also reported that bandits suspected to be RPA soldiers 2 weeks ago at Mata Sector in Rwamiko Commune robbed families of undisclosed amounts of money, cows and bicycles. In the process of the robberies, one local was killed. Investigation in progress.

C. In another development the team reported that most of the IDPs who returned from Kibeho Camp to the commune are reported to have fled to Burundi because of the security situation in the area.

PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

Visited Butare Commune MSF Medical Centre on 27/6/95 and was informed that for the past 3 weeks locals have stopped reporting to the centre for treatment because of rumours circulating among locals that the Govt. of Rwanda has distributed poisonous drugs to the health centres. Investigation in progress.

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

A. A joint CIVPOL/Human Rights team visited Rutobwe Commune on 27/6/95 and met the Bourgmestre who disclosed that the security situation in the area has been calm.

B. The team also reported that the FC visited the Sector and was briefed on the general situation in the Prefecture.

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Reported that there was an armed robbery incident on 27/6/95 at Kimihurura area involving UNAMIR personnel. A lot of valuables were stolen during the robbery. Military Police are already investigating the case.

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that the MSF (Medecins Sans Frontieres) in Gisenyi Prefecture had on 27/6/95 written a letter to Gendarmerie brigade of Gisenyi threatening to stop their activities over the impounding of their vehicle since 15/6/95. The team on 28/6/95 through its efforts has collected the said vehicle and handed it over to MSF.

3. TRAINING:

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Training School are now awaiting deployment. Also preparation of handout in English lessons is in progress. In the same vein the teaching documents for the take off of the Communal Police is in the pipeline.

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Conducted joint patrol with Human Rights team to Kabaya Commune on 25 June 95. At Rwili Sector, the team found 285 refugees comprising of 50 men, 50 women, 110 children and 75 herdsmen. The refugees were said to have crossed into Rwanda from Zaire since May 95. The refugees complained of lack of food and farm implements. The security situation was reported calm.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

Visited Rusatera Commune prison on 26/6/95 and reported that the prison is overcrowded with 165 inmates and with poor sanitary conditions. Human Rights informed.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

A. Patrolled Kinyamakara Commune on 25/6/95 and met the Bourgmestre who disclosed that out of 649 locals from the commune who took refuge at Kibeho Camp after the war, only 448 have so returned. The whereabouts of 201 is unknown. The Bourgmestre further revealed that 24 of the returnees were found to have taken part in last year's genocide and were arrested and detained in the commune cell by RPA. The team visited the detention centre and discovered that the suspects are detained in a small room with poor sanitary conditions. The Bourgmestre however attributes their continued detention in the cachot to lack of transport to transfer them to Gikongoro main prison. Human Rights informed.

B. The same team was informed that a grenade was found few meters away from the main gate of the Human Rights office and later picked by RPA soldiers. Investigation conducted revealed that an unidentified RPA soldier during a drinking spree got himself drunk and started indiscriminate firing. He was being pursued by fellow RPA soldiers when the hand grenade fell from his pocket. The BN. Commander has been contacted on the conduct of his soldier.

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

Patrolled Nyabinkenke Commune on 21 June 95 and visited the commune cell. During their interview with the inmates, the RPA in charge of the cachot arrived and ordered the team to stop further discussions and hand over their notes to him. The team did not oblige but after an hour and half deliberations, the team was allowed to leave the area. The RPA officer accused UNAMIR of spreading falsehood about the commune to his superiors. The attitude of the RPA soldiers is uncalled for as the team went to the cachot with a written permission from the Prefect of Kiyumbe. The matter has since been reported to BN. Commander.

PMT - CYANGUGU Prefecture:

Reported that on 24 June 95, between 20.30 hrs and 22.00 hrs, a group of bandits armed with automatic weapons robbed 2 locals of Mubumbano Sector of Kagano Commune of some unspecified amount of money and personal effects. In both incidents, the daughters of the victims who were present were forced by the bandits to carry the items robbed to their waiting boat on the shore of the lake. The bandits are suspected to have come from Zaire. Investigation in progress.

3. TRAINING:

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Training School are now awaiting deployment. Also preparation of handout in English lessons is in progress. In the same vein the teaching documents for the take off of the Communal Police is in the pipeline.

B. The team was informed on 23 June 95 while on patrol that a local teacher was arrested by RPA in March 95 and detained in Kibuye prison. No reason was given for the arrest. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

3. COMMERCIAL:

Visited Ndera Camp on 24/6/95 and reported that 130 refugees were dispatched to their home communes with 145 awaiting evacuation.

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

Patrolled AOR and reported that the security situation is calm. The team disclosed that investigation into the theft of a vehicle belonging to Goal Ireland personnel is in progress.

PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

Patrolled Kinigi Commune on 23 June 95 and met the bourgmestre who disclosed that the security situation in the area has been calm. The bourgmestre is however appealing to UNAMIR in areas of health care as inhabitants of the commune travel up to 25 km in search of medical centre.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

A. Disclosed that Burundi soldiers have been deployed to Kanyaro-BAS border post. The security situation in the area is however calm. >

B. The same team patrolled Miyaro Commune on 24/6/95 and was informed that during the night of the previous week gun shots suspected to have been fired by RPA soldiers were heard in the area. Reasons for the firing unknown. Investigation in progress.

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

Patrolled Bukinga, Nyakabanda, Nyabikenge and Kayenzi communes within Gitarama Prefecture on 24/6/95 and was informed that the security situation in the communes is calm. Locals were seen carrying out their businesses unimpeded.

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that the team is assisting RPA in the investigation of a murder case which took place in Rwerere Commune on 24/6/95. Investigation in progress.

3. TRAINING:

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Training School are now awaiting deployment. Also preparation of handout in English lessons is in progress. In the same vein the teaching documents for the take off of the Communal Police is in the pipeline.



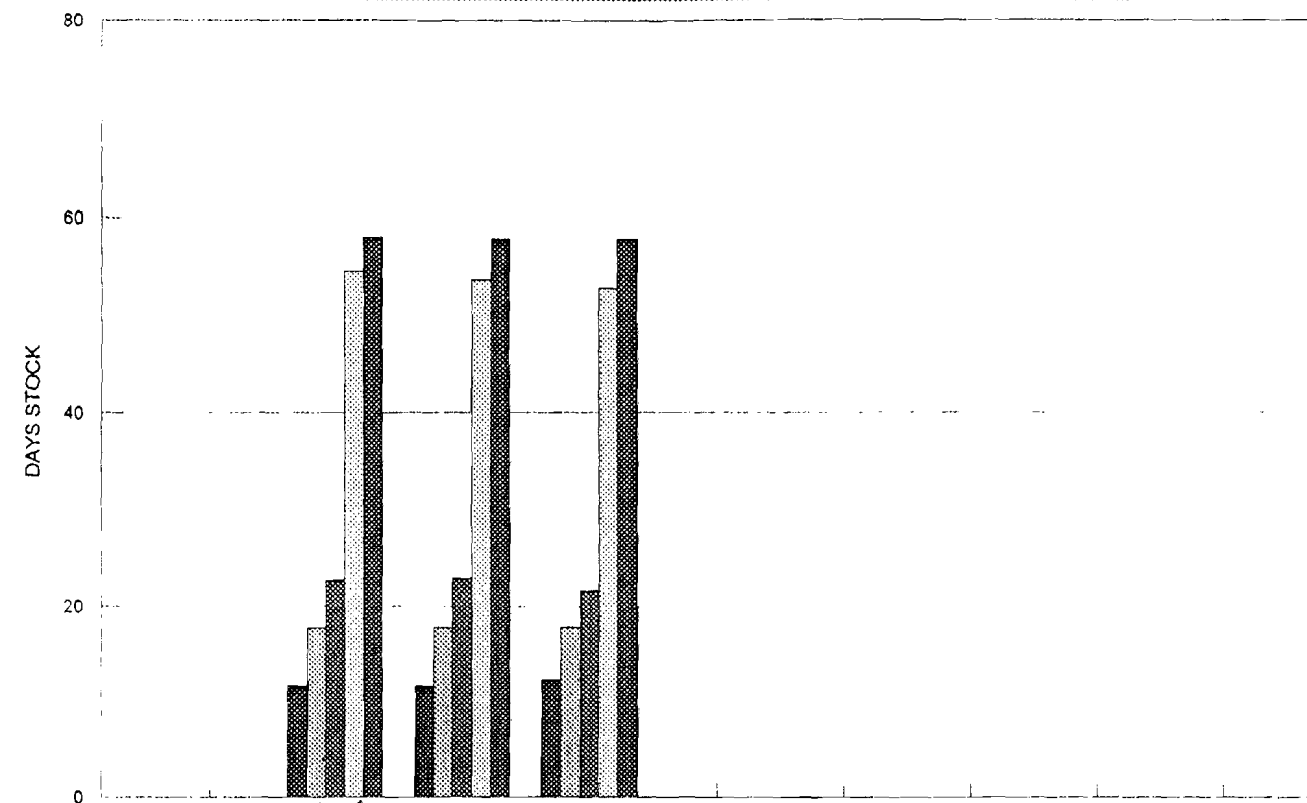

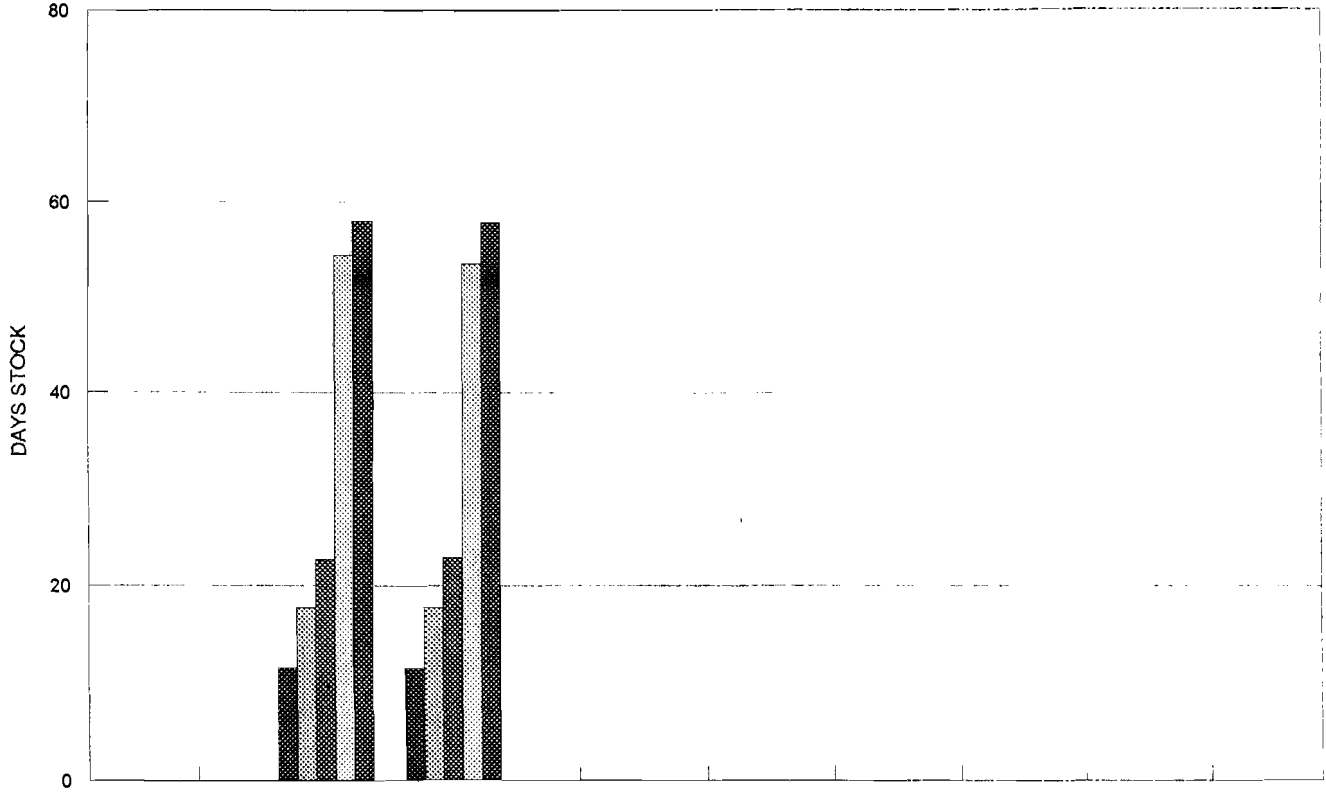
