I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:1. RPA:PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

Reported that RPA have intensified patrols in the prefecture with increased checkpoints. UN vehicles continue to be subjected to thorough searches on passing through these road blocks. Efforts being made by the Sector Commander to solve the problem.

PMT - CYANGUGU Prefecture:

Patrolled Cyimbogo, Gisuwa and Karengé Communes and disclosed that RPA had increased its strength in the area. No reason has been assigned for doing so. Investigation in progress.

PMT KIBUYE Prefecture:

A. Reported that on 21/5/95, a local was beaten by RPA for being a hostile witness against another local who had been accused of participating in last year's genocide. The team further disclosed that 4 locals were arrested by RPA in Rwamatamu Commune and have been detained in Kigaramé Cell. Reasons for arrest unknown. Investigation in progress. Human Rights informed.

I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. MILITIA:

PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

Reported that the main Transformer supplying electric power to Ruhengeri town was on 21/5/95 blown off by explosives suspected to have been planted by Interhamwe. Investigation in progress.

2. GNU/OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

In another incident, the team reported that about 200 IDPs suspected to have come from Gitarama Prefecture were found occupying 6 houses in Nemba Commune. The Prefect of Ruhengeri has given them up to 23/5/95 to leave for their communes or be forced out of the places. Human Rights informed.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

A. Visited Ndera Transit Camp and reported that 166 IDPs have been dispatched to their respective home communes today with 358 awaiting evacuation to their communes.

B. The team also visited Kigali Central Prison on 22 May 95 and reported that the number of inmates has risen to 9209 with poor sanitary conditions. Human Rights informed.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

A. The orientation course for the 5 newly arrived CIVPOL Observers from Chad ended on 22 May 95.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Visited the Bourgemestres of Nyamyumra and Rubavu Communes on 19/5/95. At Nyamyumra, the Bourgmestre disclosed to the team that the commune was peaceful. While in Rubaru Commune the Asst. Bourgmestre informed the team that there had been an increase in crime wave in the area. He revealed further that in the night of 19/5/95, 10 armed bandits attacked Murara sector in the commune. 3 of the culprits were arrested by the villagers and have been handed over to RPA. It was further revealed that the 3 suspects have been transferred to Kigali for further action. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

3. TRAINING:

The marking of examination papers by CIVPOL Observers attached to the Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School is still in progress.

IV. CRIME WAVE

UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in the prefectures have reported that criminal activities such as armed robbery and arbitrary arrest of locals are on the increase.

Reported that the strength of RPA has been reduced in the area. Also the number of check points along the Ruhengeri-Kigali main road have been reduced to one. Information has it that most of the RPA soldiers have been deployed on patrol missions outside the sector. Investigation in progress.

PMT-KIBUYE PREFECTURE:

A. Reported that RPA and Gendarmerie have intensified patrols within the sector and have arrested 5 locals who have landed in the area with a canoe. Investigation in progress.

B. The team further reported that 3 locals have been arrested by RPA on 19 May 95 at Rutuna village for taken part in last year's genocide. Human Rights informed.

C. In another development, the team visited Mpembe and was informed that the 5 locals who landed at the shores of the area with canoe from Zaire on 18 May 95 have been released by RPA on 20 May 95. Human Rights informed.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

Some of the IDPs disclosed that on 12/5/95 they discovered 13 bodies of IDPs suspected to have been killed by RPA and scattered along the banks of Nyabarongo River within Ndusu Commune. It was further reported that some IDPs who had left Ndusu Commune are hiding in the hills for fear of their lives. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

PMT-CYANGUGU Prefecture:

Patrolled Cyimbogo Commune and had discussions with the Bourgmestre about security situation in the area. The Bourgmestre disclosed that the area is calm.

3. TRAINING:

The final examination of students at the Ruhengeri Nationale Gendarmerie Training School ended on 19 May 1995.

- 1. Please find the attached report on a fatal road traffic accident which occurred on Tuesday 11th April 1995, along Gisenyi road about 800 meters behind the entrance of TUNBATT Headquarters.
2. This accident involved a UNAMIR vehicle driven by a desk officer of prison, working under Human Rights field operation Kigali and a Rwandan young girl.
3. The investigation report from Gisenyi CIVPOL Monitoring Team revealed that, the accident happened when the pedestrian girl suddenly ran across the road as a result she was knocked down.

COURSE OF THE ACCIDENT:

THE UNAMIR VEHICLE 1915 HR PASSED OVER THE MAIN ROAD COMING FROM GISENYI IN THE DIRECTION OF KIGALI. ABOUT 800 METERS BEHIND THE ENTRANCE OF THE TUNBATT HQ IN THE DIRECTION OF KIGALI THERE WAS AT THE SAME TIME A 15 YEARS OLD GIRL OBSERVED RUNNING ALONG THE LEFT SIDE OF THE VEHICLE AND SUDDENLY CROSSED THE MAIN ROAD WITHOUT LOOKING.

THE FINAL POSITION OF THE CAR AND THE BODY OF THE GIRL AND THE TRACES OF THE ACCIDENT ON THE VEHICLE AND THE BODY OF THE VICTIM INDICATE, THAT THE SPEED OF THE CAR IN THE MOMENT OF THE BOUNCE WAS ABOUT BETWEEN 50 AND 55 KM/H. THE SPEED IMMEDIATELY BEFORE THE ACCIDENT HAPPENED, COULD NOT BE HIGHER THAN ABOUT 60 KM/H.

FOR THE DRIVER OF THE UNAMIR VEHICLE THE ACCIDENT WAS UNDER THIS CIRCUMSTANCES INEVITABLE.

AT 1215 HOURS, 11 APR 95 WE (ASP ALHASAN MOHAMED/MAJOR ANTON BARZ -CIYPOL GISENYI-) HEARD OVER RADIO THE MESSAGE OF AN ACCIDENT ON THE ROAD TO KIGALI NEAR THE TUNBATT HQ IN THE MUTURA COMMUNE. WE WERE AT THIS MOMENT OFF ROAD IN THE COMMUNE KANAMA, SECTOR KANAMBE. WE ARRIVED THE SPOT OF THE ACCIDENT AT 1258 HOURS.

THE VICTIM, A 15 YEARS OLD GIRL, WAS LYING IN THE MIDDLE OF THE ROAD BEHIND THE VEHICLE UNAMIR 1915 HR, BLEEDING PROFUSELY FROM THE HEAD AREA. SHE WAS DEAD. THE VEHICLE WAS LOCATED ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ROAD, THE FRONT WAS 60 CENTIMETERS OUTSIDE, THE BACK EXACTLY ON THE ROAD EDGE.

THE SURFACE OF THE ROAD WAS WET, BUT TO THAT TIME IT WAS NOT RAINING. ON THE ROAD WE FOUND NONE SKID MARKS, NEITHER IN THE WET NOR IN THE DRY CONDITION.

ON THE SPOT OF THE ACCIDENT WERE A LOT OF RPA AND TUNBATT SOLDIERS AND ABOUT 200 ON-CURIOS. THE DRIVER OF THE UNAMIR VEHICLE AND THE TWO PASSENGERS WERE IN THE TUNBATT HQ.

AFTER OUR ARRIVAL AT THE SPOT WE STARTED WITH OUR INVESTIGATION. WE TOOK PHOTOS, MEASURED THE SPOT OF THE ACCIDENT AND ASKED FOR EYE-WITNESSES. WE COULD FIND ONE EYE-WHITENESS

VESTINO MUHIMPUNDU, 26 YEARS OLD, LIVING IN THE MUTURA COMMUNE, SECTOR NYAMIRANGO, CELLULE MARERO, BUT SHE HAD ONLY SEEN THE GIRL RUNNING FAST ON THE LEFT SIDE.

AFTER OUR FIRST INVESTIGATION ON THE SPOT, WE WENT TO THE TUNBATT HQ AND INTERVIEWED THE DRIVER AND THE CAR PASSENGERS. AFTER THAT WE WENT BACK TO THE SPOT. IN THE MEANTIME WERE ARRIVED FOUR GENDARMES OF THE GISENYI BRIGADE. WE ASSISTED THEM BY THEIR INVESTIGATIONS AT THE SPOT.

AT 1600 HOURS ARRIVED THE MILITARY POLICE FROM KIGALI (CORPORAL M.G. COLLET). WE ASSISTED HIM BY DOING HIS INVESTIGATIONS.

AT ABOUT 1700 HOURS THE BODY OF THE VICTIM WAS CARRIED TO THE PARENTS OF HOUSE BY A TUNBATT PICK UP.

AT ABOUT 1730 HOURS WE WENT WITH THE DRIVER OF THE UNAMIR VEHICLE TO THE GENDARMERIE BRIGADE OF GISINYI. THERE THE DRIVER WAS INTERROGATED BY THE GENDARMERIE. AFTER THAT, AT ABOUT 1900 HOURS, WE COULD LEAVE WITH HIM THE GENDARMERIE. THE VEHICLE WAS CONFISCATED BY THE GENDARMERIE. THE RESPONSIBLE OFFICER PROMISED US, THAT THE VEHICLE WILL BE GIVEN BACK

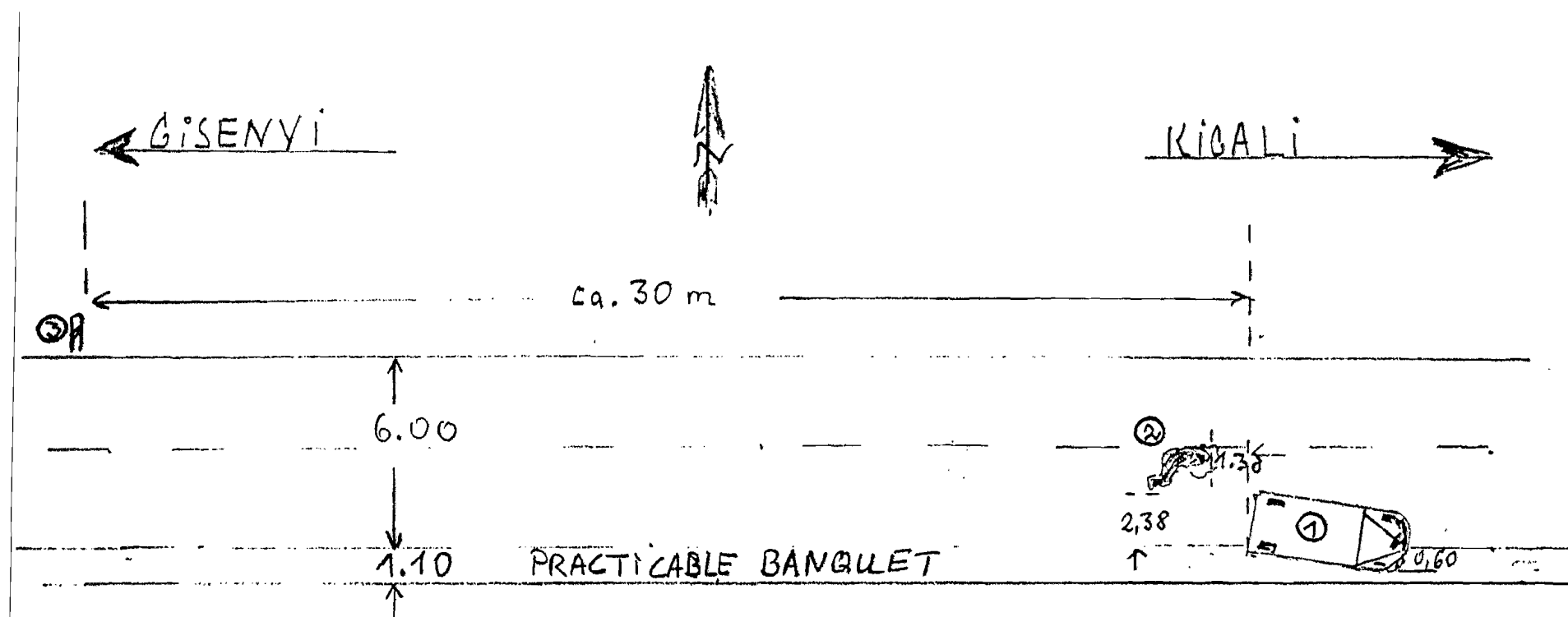
TOMORROW (12 APR 95) BEFORE 1200 HOURS.

REMARK:

THE SITUATION IN THE AFTERNOON AND IN THE EVENING WAS TENSE. THE GENDARMERIE WERE READY TO ARREST THE DRIVER. ONLY OUR COOPERATION WITH THEM AND THE CLEVER NEGOTIATION OF THE CORPORAL COLLET COULD CHANGE THEIR INTENTION. CORPORAL COLLET CONTINUED HIS INVESTIGATION AT THE CIVPOL-STATION BY INTERROGATION THE DRIVER AND THE PASSENGERS OF THE INVOLVED VEHICLE. THE INVESTIGATION WAS FINISHED AT 2030 HOURS.

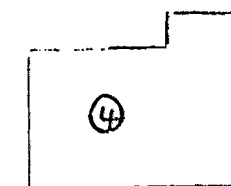

Among the demonstrators was Major Rose Kabuye, the Prefect of Kigali Prefecture. The demonstrators dispersed from UNAMIR FHQ building at about 18.40 hrs.



I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:1. POLITICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE:1.1 GNU/OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Visited the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs and was briefed by the Director of Cabinet that arrangements have been put in place to reduce the level of unemployment in the country. The Director further disclosed that direct employment of skilled labour and engagement of unskilled locals in areas of carpentry, masonry and electronics among others would soon take off all over the country.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

A joint team of CIVPOL and Human Rights visited Gitarama prison on 2 May 95 and reported that there are 7067 inmates in the prison. 95 of the number are minors between the ages of 9 - 16. The team further reported that the prison is overcrowded with poor sanitary conditions.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

2.1 PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that a meeting was held between CIVPOL Monitoring Team and the Commander of Gendarmerie in Gisenyi on 29 Apr. 95. Among the issues discussed are cooperation between CIVPOL and Gendarmerie in areas related to policing.

2.2 PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Visited Kigali prison and disclosed that 8,665 inmates have been detained. Prison authorities when contacted disclosed that most of the detainees are suspected to have taken part in the genocide. Human Rights informed.

3. TRAINING:

I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. POLITICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE:

1.1 GNU/OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Reported that locals organised a peaceful demonstration at Nyamirambo at about 13.30 hrs on 01 May 95. Vehicles including UNAMIR vehicles were not allowed to move around the area, therefore the agenda of the demonstration is unknown. Investigation in progress.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

A. Reported that 50 IDPs have been arrested in the area. 35 IDPs out of the number were arrested by the sector counselors together with 15 others who attempted to run away from Rwanda into Burundi but are supposed to be released as soon as possible.

B. The team further disclosed that 10 locals have been killed at Muhora in Runnyinya Commune on 24 Apr. 95. Reason for the killings is unknown. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

1.2 RPA:

PMT - CYANGUGU Prefecture:

Reported that on 28 Apr. 95 at about 18.30 hrs at Gafunzo Peninsular, within Nyamasheke area, RPA soldiers on patrols reported having observed a boat floating on Ijwe Island and suspected to be used by bandits. They therefore fired at it. The boat was seen floating on the lake in the morning of 29 Apr. 95 and was taken ashore. There was nobody inside it. RPA further reported that it was the second boat they have seized since they commenced night patrols on the lake. Investigation in progress.

1.3 MILITIA:

PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

A. A joint team of CIVPOL/MILOBS patrolled Kinigi Commune on 28 Apr. 95 and was informed by the Bourgmestre that locals in Kabwende, Bisate and Nyarugira sectors live in fear of eminent attack by FRGF as a result of rumours being circulated on the issue. As a result some of the locals have fled from their homes. Meanwhile, RPA have intensified patrolling in the commune.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

A. Patrolled Masango Commune and reported that 943 IDPs were registered at the commune. It was observed that many of the IDPs were nursing injuries and were in short supply of food and medical care. The commune authorities informed the team that none of the IDPs was under arrest since investigations into their activities during last year's genocide had not commenced.

B. The team further patrolled Murama Commune and was informed that 2830 IDPs and 8 locals who returned on their own, had arrived at the commune. Some of the IDPs interviewed complained of being in dire need of food, water and medicine.

C. The same team patrolled Ntongwe Commune and was informed by officials of Caritas that 805 IDPs had so far returned to the commune. Most of the IDPs were in confused/desperate conditions. The local authorities informed the team that none of them was under arrest.

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

Reported that in a response to a call that a local had sought refuge at Tunbatt a joint team of CIVPOL, MILOBS, Human Rights, and Red Cross visited Tunbatt on 28 Apr. 95 and observed that a local who is suspected to be involved in last year's genocide and was avoiding arrest by the commune police on warrant issued by the Judicial Office had made a report to Tunbatt that he was being chased by an RPA soldier. In the process he was handed-over to the Inspector de Police Judicial's office (IJPs) for further investigations. Human Rights to follow up.

The Director of Cabinet disclosed that teachers who embarked on strike action for non-payment of salaries have called off their strike following a meeting involving the Minister of Primary and Secondary Education on one hand and representatives of the teachers.

Patrolled Runda Commune on 26 Apr. 95 with the Prosecutor to investigate allegations levelled against a Spanish Roman Catholic Priest at Kabuga that Hutus in Taba Commune were being advised by the priest to flee the area since there were plans for Tutsis to attack them. The priest when contacted by the CIVPOL Team and the prosecutor denied the allegations against him and explained that counsellor of the sector made the false allegations to discredit him because he had made it difficult for the Counsellor to extort money from locals he had threatened to implicate in last year's genocide if they do not bribe him with money. The team thereafter interviewed 14 locals including the counsellor's mother. They all explained that the allegations against the priest were unfounded.

2.2 PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that on 25 Apr. 95 at about 23.00 hrs 9 men of which 3 were armed and wearing military uniforms with guns forced themselves into a house in a cellule in Mutura Commune. The house owner was shot and wounded seriously. Personal effects and an undisclosed amount of Rwandese FRS were stolen. Investigation in progress.

Visited the Public Prosecutor for Kigali on 25 April 1995. The Officer briefed the team that sitting of Tribunal on war crimes/genocide had been postponed indefinitely to allow lawyers/prosecutors study relevant dossiers and exhibits involved in the reported cases.

B. CIVPOL Monitoring Teams - BUTARE/GIKONGORO Prefectures

Reported that heavy gun shots were heard along Kibeho-Butare main road in the night of 23 April 1995 as IDPs from Kibeho Camp were moving to their home communes. Investigation in progress.

1.2 RPAPMT - BUTARE/GIKONGORO Prefectures:

A. Reported that RPA soldiers have blocked roads leading to some IDP camps to allow Humanitarian agencies attend to IDPs. Human Rights informed.

B. The teams further reported that RPA have started arresting some of the IDPs into their barracks at Butare. Also locals of NGOMA commune are reported not to have accepted IDPs sent to the area for resettlement. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

Reported that a decision had been taken by RPA at Ruhengeri on 25 April 1995 to allow UNAMIR officials to have records of locals crossing the Cyanika border into Rwanda from Uganda. This came about as a result of consultations between MILOBS/Battalion CO. on one hand and RPA on the other hand.

A. Reported that an estimated number of 6,000 IDPs have been killed when they attempted to break out of the RPA cordon around the Kibeho Camp.
